### Plymouth Library Board chooses Farmer Jacks as temporary site to town

The 28-month lease will cost the library board \$150,000

Months of uncertainty came to an end Tuesday when the Plymouth District Library Board signed a lease agreement with the Farmer Jack Corporation to rent the vacant Farmer Jack building on Main

The 17,000 square foot facility will serve as the temporary home for the

Dunning-Hough Library, while the new library is being built.

Library board member Bev McAninch said that the facility was really the only option the library had.

"It's a lot better than no place to go," said McAninch. "There was nothing more accessible to the community.

"It has the space we need and the parking we need."

According to Library Director Pat Thomas, the agreement allows the library to lease the space for 28 months at an overall cost of \$150,000. The library will also have the option of extending the lease for up to four additional months.

Board member Jim Jabara said that although the agreement was a long time in coming, the Farmer Jack people were

"This has been going on for months and months," he said. "It started last spring and we couldn't find even ground.

"The Farmer Jack people working on this (agreement) were extremely coopera-

Jabara added that Farmer Jack donated \$12,000 to help with needed repairs to the air conditioning in the building.

Although the agreement would allow the library to occupy the building as of Dec. 1, some work will be needed to make the vacant facility habitable.

"It will probably take between \$25,000 to \$30,000 dollars," said Jabara. "It was part of the agreement that we would seal the parking lot."

According to Thomas the library won't be moving right away.

"We won't move until the spring," said Thomas. "You know, it's a relief to know that we have someplace to go that is big enough, and that we won't have to cut back any of our services.

"Keeping the services has been so important to our customers.



# Will Hanford Road be site for new P-C school?

The Plymouth-Canton School Board listened to the impact of a possible extension of Hanford Road that would require the school district to surrender a small piece of the property it owns in the area, which may be the home of a new P-C school.

The school district owns approximately 18 acres of land, located at the west end of Hanford Road, just east of Canton Center Road, between Warren and Ford roads.

Canton has expressed its desire to extend Hanford westward to Canton Center Road, said Don Morgan, who made the presentation and who serves as the school board's representative on property issues. "It's the only segment of Hanford Road that's not paved," Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack said yesterday. "It's a half mile road, so it's part of the whole road system envisioned for Canton. It's like a missing piece to the puzzle."

The extension is important to the school board because it would move Hanford Road slightly to the south to make room for houses. This would take a small piece of property away from the school district's land. Treasurer Michael Maloney inquired about the difficulty of building a school in a commercial and residential district. He said, "So we would have no problem building a school there with commercial zoning?"

Said Morgan: "No, and we'd have no problem selling it."

The school board members also inquired about its resale value and what the cost of the extension would be to the district. "There's not going to be any future cost to the district," said Don Morgan, referring to extension of the road.

Yack said the the cost of completing the road would be shared

by Canton and the subdivision's developer, with traffic lights — if needed — to be installed by Wayne County. Morgan said the school district would have to share the cost for a special assessment district, like any other private party.

"What the township supervisor has proposed is that the developer of the subdivision (located north of the school's land) can obtain some additional lots," Morgan said. "That developer would in turn construct, at the developer's expense, Hanford Road."

Morgan and Yack said the Hanford Road extension would provide several benefits to the school district. "It's a benefit in two respects," Morgan said. "If there is a school directed there, then we've got the access. Secondly, if there is no school there, you pick up the benefit of having much more frontage so that... market value would appreciate because now there's a variety of means of accessing this property for potential single family development."

Yack said, "The benefit is their property increases with no cost out of pocket. They would lose a little bit of property."

Trustee Carrie Blamer said, "Are there any other proposed uses for the land?

Morgan said he did not know of any. Superintendent Charles Little reminded school board members of the several interests involved and that, "We could want to do this, and one or two parties could not."

Yack said a decision would be needed no later than next summer. "The developer is probably looking at something this spring, this summer," Yack said. "It's getting tight."

### Dec. 8 hearing set for man charged in death of Canton teen, police suspect alcohol involved

Suspect held on \$750,000 bond following accident on Cherry Hill

A 38-year-old Walled Lake man was charged with manslaughter in the death of a 17-

According to Canton Police reports, Jerome Larente allegedly drove his 1993 Dodge Shadow across the centerline on Cherry Hill Road near Denton Road Nov. 16th and hit

The victim, her nine-year-old sister and Larente were all transported to St. Joseph's Hospital in Ann Arbor, where the victim died Nov. 18. Both Larente and the sister have been released from the hospital.

According to Detective Bill Keppen, Larente submitted to a blood sample while at the hospital. His Blood Alcohol Content was .17 (.10 is the legal level in the State of

According to Keppen, in addition to the manslaughter charge, Larente is facing a charge of operating under the influence (OUIL) causing death; OUIL, third offense; and driving with license suspended, second offense.

"He has a long history of having a bad driving record," said Keppen.

Larente is being held in the Wayne County Jail on \$750,000 bond awaiting his Dec. 8 preliminary examination at the 35th District Court.



## School board discusses class changes

The Plymouth-Canton School Board got a close up look of high school curriculum changes and impact presented by Executive Director for K-12 Education Tom Tattan.

Graduation requirements for the Class of 1999 and beyond, and course additions and deletions were discussed during the report. But the center of attention was over proposed name changes and course descriptions. School board President David Artley protested at length over the Close Up class title and description.

Close Up, which will be replace Civics as a social studies requirement during the sophomore year for the Class of 1999, is a "hands-on" government class. It includes an optional trip to Washington D.C. Artley said there should be a clear distinction of sophomore social studies student who are and are not going on the trip. "I think its an issue of the pressure implied of the trip to Washington D.C.," Artley said.

"I want a different name."

Artley said he would be satisfied with Superintendent Charles Little's suggestion to keep students in the same class, but to distinguish the students choosing not to go as Civics students and those choosing to go as Close Up students. "I don't have a problem with same curriculum," Artley said. "I don't have a problem with Close

Artley was concerned about the students who do not have the money to go, and what they would be doing while their classmates are in Washington D.C. "There's always going to be kid who can't go, that's unfortunate," said Trustee Barbara Graham, who suggested the school district search for lower rates to continue the trip.

"In the near future, unless the parents foot the bill, there aren't going to be many students who can go at all," she said.

Artley said, "My intent is that they had all the advantages the other students have with one exception: They don't have to go to

Graham said, "I just don't want to see anything happen to the

Other changes recommended in high school curriculum include: •A fifth year of foreign language, which did not have the supnort of Little.

·A new advanced Calculus class.

•Biology II being replaced by Zoology.

•Deleting Geometry A and B, replacing it with college-preferred Algeostat I and II.

Seven course name changes.

·Adding more skills to the Swim/Fit course, which Treasurer Michael Maloney wanted to investigate further. "I think, at some point, on some of this the board should have a discussion," he said.

•Increasing graduation requirements by one unit in math and science, and adding a new requirement in human relations.

•In 1996-97, the school district would spend approximately \$150,000 on high school text books and instructional material.

# Protect and serve

Local police try to shake public misconceptions

Ask most police officers how they would like to be viewed and the answer you're likely to get is — a person who's just trying to get their job done.

Ask 10 different people how they view the police and you'll most likely get 10 different answers that run the gamut from — "they're jerks" to "I don't know any" to "there are some good ones."

"Some people think we have this mission to make people's lives miserable and that we're jerks," said Plymouth Township police officer Denny Wilson. "We're just people who are trying to do our jobs the best way we know how.

"We have families, friends and neighbors just like everybody else. We're human."

Wilson, who along with 17 other officers and four sergeants, patrol Plymouth. He is a 10-year veteran of the department.

"I love this job," said Wilson. "For the most part, it's an interesting job and I have fun doing it."

Canton police officer Jim Harrison echoed Wilson's words.

"It's a lot of fun catching the bad guys," he said. "And it's fun helping people out of jams."

What's the worst part of the job? It must be the danger, the fact that as a police officer one never knows when a

situation may turn ugly --- wrong.

"The paperwork is the worst part of this job," said Harrison. "There are forms for everything. You have to write a report for pretty much everything you do."

Wilson used the example of a driving while license suspended (DWLS) arrest he made.

"It took about 15 minutes to run his

information, arrest him, impound his car and transport him to the station," said Wilson. "It took more than an hour to do the paperwork."

Both officers seemed to have the same philosophy on dealing with the people they come in contact with.

"They don't pay me any extra for being a jerk," said Harrison. "If I can be nice and get my job done, I will."

Does the rest of the department (there are 63 officers) agree with Harrison?

"No one wants to make this job anymore confrontational than it already is," he said.

Wilson said that people react, for the most part, to the way you treat them.

"It's all in the presentation," he said.
"I've been here 10 years and I can honestly say that I haven't really had to struggle with anyone."

Wilson said that the hours of the job are sometimes hard, but well worth it.

"The hours are hard on my family sometimes," he said. "But I think the fact that I enjoy my job and I'm not constantly complaining about it at home helps."

Harrison, who is single, said that he's happy now, but can foresee how having a family one day might make it a little tougher.

"Maybe in a few years, if I have a wife and kids, I won't be so excited to be working the 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. shift. But right now this is where I want to be," said Harrison

Next time you get pulled over for speeding or get in a fender bender and you meet up with one of your community's police officers, remember that behind the badge is a father, mother, husband, wife, friend and a neighbor.

### Ward heads to Supreme Court for forfeiture case

It is probably not the case Wayne County Chief Assistant Prosecutor George Ward thought would get him to the United States Supreme Court — but it did.

And the Plymouth resident is exhilarated over his first opportunity to argue a case — albeit a strange one — in front of the most famous and, perhaps, the most powerful court in the world. "I'm happy," said Ward, who has held his position since 1986. "You don't get too many chances to get up that far."

Ward and Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor Larry Roberts left for Washington D.C. yesterday, are in court today, and will appear on CNN tomorrow at 12:30 p.m.

All this attention is the result of a woman's attempt to claim about \$200 worth of interest from an impounded car. "It's a \$200 case that the United States Supreme Court is taking time to rule on," Ward said. "It's a little strange."

The scenario began to unfold in 1988 when a man was arrested in north central Detroit for soliciting a prostitute. The 1977 car the man was driving, valued at \$600, was impounded as part of the "Save Our Neighborhoods" program. "In the case of prostitution, we have a state abatement statute, which means property used to carry a vice activity is subject to seizure and abatement," said Ward,

"which is another word for forfeiture."

Usually, the accused pay a \$650 settlement. "I think we've seized about 9,000 cars, most of them have settled, almost all of them have settled," Ward said. "This is very rare"

The man's wife wants half of the interest gained from the car, which is now valued at about \$400. She insists she is entitled to the money because she was not in the car with her husband at the time of the incident. Ward argued that since the women is an owner of the vehicle, she is responsible. "The buck stops with ownership," Ward said.

He successfully argued that in the Wayne County Circuit Court, lost in the Michigan Court of Appeals and won again in the Michigan Supreme Court. "Our Michigan Supreme Court has ruled for us," Ward said. "Then, the United Supreme Court surprised us."

Ward said the case made it to United States Supreme Court because of its current interest in property cases and forfeiture as a crime remedy, a tactic the Ward wants to protect by winning this case. "It works like the textbook tells you a deterrence program is suppose to work: It stings the buyer. It really stings them. But it doesn't ruin them," Ward said, who helped designed the program eight years ago.

Ward said a decision on the case would not be revealed for some time.

### Local Meijer workers approve contract

Members of the United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW) Local 951 working at Meijer overwhelmingly recently approved a new three-and-a-half year contract.

More than 60 percent of the approximately 31,000 eligible voters participated, with 13,037 voting yes and 5,349 voting no in favor of the agreement. The acceptance of this package comes just one month after the membership rejected a similar contract offer from the Grand Rapids-based retailer.

Locally, 885 people are employed at Meijer stores located in Canton and Northville.

"We believe this is a tremendous victory for the membership, resulting from the aggressive posture of UFCW Local 951 throughout the entire bargaining process," said Robert Potter, president and chief negotiator of Local 951. "We worked very hard during the second ratification period to convey the importance of voting to members, with the goal of having

increased voter turnout during the second ratification."

More than 5,300 more voters turned out in the second election than the first.

Under the new contract, workers in every job classification will receive immediate wage increases of up to \$1.80 per hour. They will also receive raises for every 700 hour worked, until they reach the top wage rates, which were also increased in the new contract.

In addition, members will also receive annual wage increases in 1997 and 1998.

"We worked very hard throughout the bargaining process to ensure that the focus of the negotiations was on base rate wage increases," Potter said. "The wage improvements averaged more than \$1 per hour over the term of the contract, with approximately 40 percent of a member's increase taking effect upon ratification."

# Canton resident dies in Willow Run plane crash

A plane crash near Willow Run Airport claimed the life of a Canton man last Wednesday.

Allen Duane Krugler, Jr., 53, was flying a home-built or experimental plane, when he crashed at approximately 11:58 a.m., according to airport spokesman Michael Conway.

"He lifted off from Willow Run," said Conway. "He had two people with him at the airport who said they saw the plane disappear over a berm."

The Wayne County Medical Examiner was called to the Van Buren Township crash site to remove the victim from the wreckage, according to Conway.

"It was a little, one-person plane. It looked like it was made out of fiber-glass," said Conway.

The Federal Aviation Administration is investigating the crash.

Thomann was pleased with the way his team entered every game believing they'd win. "We really competed well with every team we played against. Every game we lost we made it close right to the end," Thomann said. "My main goal this year was to play in the

# Building a program

Johnson is a soccer legend in Plymouth-Canton Community

He came to the community with soccer in his blood. He helped it grow and thrive and is now leaving with a Salem boys state championship under his belt.

Ken Johnson is retiring as the coach of the Salem boys and girls soccer team after 15 years at the helm. His record of 203-65-27 with the boys and 158-56-37 with the girls is sure to be longstanding for many years to come.

I have had the privilege of playing for Johnson for all of my years in high school soccer. I experienced reaching the state finals with him my freshman year in 1992 and earlier this month as a senior. But I was only one of the hundreds of youths who Johnson has touched through his unique style of coaching.

His first contact with local soccer came in 1975 when he helped start the Plymouth Soccer League out of the Plymouth Cultural Center. Johnson then moved his residency to Canton and noticed that the community didn't have any organized youth leagues, so for his next order of business, he helped get a Canton program together.

The Canton Soccer Club — which Johnson and Art Monk helped form in 1977 — has since branched out into the Great Lakes and Western Suburban Soccer League with hundreds of youths participating.

"We started small with some goals and nets at Griffin Park and a few elementary Sure Shot By Matt Hucal

schools and it just grew," Johnson said.

The annual Canton Memorial Invitational Tournament was started in 1981 and has grown into one of the largest tournaments in the country.

That was only the beginning. The high schools decided to add soccer to their list of athletics in 1981 and picked Johnson to run the Salem team opposite Tony Lonigro at Canton.

"Tony and I had to start from scratch those first couple of years," Johnson said. "We couldn't play at the football stadium so we had to play on a pretty poor field. But with the talent coming in, we were getting better."

Johnson's program really didn't get rolling until 1987 when he took his girls team to the state finals and won, 2-1.

"The 1987 girls were my first power-house team, then the first strong boys team came along in 1989," Johnson said.

The 1989 team was comprised of many individual stars, but came up short in the final to Troy Athens by one goal. That was the first of two shortcomings for Johnson's teams. In 1992 the boys

reached the finals again and again lost by one goal.

That brings us to this year.

"This year and my career has ended almost like a fairytale," Johnson said. "After the girls lost, we were upset, but I said, 'I still have one more shot'."

That girls loss was last spring in the state finals.

Johnson would then lead the boys team through this season, where he has finally enjoyed the championship that's evaded him until now.

Speaking for myself and the rest of my teammates this season and of seasons past, our thanks and congratulations go out to Mr. Johnson for all he's done. We—along with Johnson—would also like to thank the retiring athletic directors Gary Balconi and Paul Cummings for all they've done for the program.

As for Johnson's future plans, he'll be moving to Deland, FL in January. There he hopes to stay connected to soccer in some way and, "Who knows, maybe I'll help start another youth league."

Coach Ken Johnson helped build the soccer programs in The Plymouth-Canton Community. His Salem girls' and boys' soccer teams have grown from their infancy to becoming state powerhouses. He found a horrific scene.


Two cars had collided up Ridge Road — one of them was Brandt's bright red pickup truck.

"They're trapped in there," he was told.

For the next hour, the scene grew more and more intense as additional anedical, police and fire personnel arrived to work in the frigid air. With their clouds of warm breath, the rescue workers looked like players in a movie.

By this time, Ken's wife, Laurel was at the scene too. She sobbed as she leaned against Ken's back, peering over his shoulder to watch as they cut into the upside-down truck to free their son. Ken believes

his son was drinking.

But to complicate things, the other car, police say, was stopped on the wrong side of the road. The driver of that car was delivering The Detroit Free Press-Detroit

A passenger (according to police) with Brandt, a young man from Plymouth Township, was able to crawl out and the driver of the other car escaped as well.

There are still questions remaining about the crash, since Plymouth Township Police are still investigating. Was Brandt driving? Was he drinking? Did the other car have its lights on? Was the other car moving or parked? Will tickets be issued?

Those questions will be answered at some point — perhaps in court.

But the important lessons are already known.

Brandt was operated on yesterday to repair torn tendons in his right arm. He also suffered a broken shoulder blade. Otherwise, he's going to be fine. The other two in the crash were not injured seriously.

That was fortunate. It was such a wreck, that it was clearly lucky no one was killed. "Maybe this was bad enough that he will learn," said Ken Blair of his son.

Hopefully, as no one was seriously injured, this accident serves as a lesson of "what could have been" for all parents and young drivers. Tell this yarn to a young driver.

sister were struck by an alleged drunk driver.


