They are a dedicated, non-partisan, national organization whose purpose is to promote political responsibility through informed and active participation of citizens in government.

They do not endorse or oppose candidates or parties, but make a mountain-sized effort to obtain information on candidates and views and issues. The research is distributed to the public and to the 3,775 League members in Michigan.

It is a real service to the communities.

The League of Women Voters of Livonia, who recently received their charter, have sent a Questionnaire to all of the candidates running for state offices in the 17th Congressional, 18th State Senatorial, and 21st State Representative districts for the Aug. 7 primary election.

The Livonia League is asking two important questions besides routine information. (1) What course of action is needed to improve the financial situation of Michigan? (2) Do you feel the proposed Constitution should or should not be adopted? Why?

The Observer newspapers will publish a special voters guide containing the League of Women Voters information about the candidates.

They have absolutely no ulterior motive. The ladies want to become better informed citizens and to help their community to do the same.

This was pointed out to me as I was about to retire from the human race after the activity of the week. Guess I'll give the world another chance.

Ross-Craft Objects Apartment Re-Zoning

2,000 New Jobs Is Forecast For 7 Mile Shopping Center

"This is a momentous announcement because it shows how much confidence our big merchants have in the economy of the greater Detroit area."

That was the opening remark by leasing agent Louis Schostak as he told a press luncheon last week of a new giant shopping center which would be opening in Detroit late in 1964.

Anchored by a Sears store of 250,000 square feet and a Crowley Milner store of 125,000 square feet, the new facility will employ 2,000 people.

It will include some 50 different stores and services and will have a total cost of approximately \$20 million. All the shopping will be done "indoors". The pedestrian malls will be covered and the interior air-conditioned and heated.

George R. Klein and Jack Shenkman are the developers, and it's been more than three years since they first started the long road which required signing tenants, arranging financing, obtaining proper zoning for the area, being sure of sewer and water facilities, and much else.

James H. Chamberlain of Crowley's revealed that his store was combining with Sears in all three of the new developments, and he said this would make for "the best rounded

centers in the area, and the most modern that exist today." He said the Crowley's in Livonia would be similar to the Crowley's in Westborn Center. Klein added: "We will have the most modern, most com-

fortable Center in the midwest and possibly the whole United States."

King and Lewis, Inc., architects, are now in the process of preparing plans and specifications for this project.

Schostak Brothers and Company, Inc., Realtors, are the exclusive leasing agent for the Livonia project.

A date for the Livonia ground breaking will be announced in the near future.

E. S. Janes, Group Manager for Sears, said the Livonia store would compare in size to the highly-successful Sears outlet in Lincoln Park.

"The Detroit area has been unusually kind to the Sears Company," said Janes. "In rank, the Detroit area is behind only Los Angeles and Chicago. We believe the strategic location of the Livonia store is tops, both for its north-south and east-west junctions."

Janes disclosed that Sears simultaneously was planning two other local outlets, one in Roseville and the other in Warren.

Fisher's Displays New Type Shoe

A Florida podiatrist who would prefer everyone to go barefoot for their feet's sake has designed a new style baby shoe that he believes will prevent unhealthy foot growth.

"Wearing these new shoes is like going barefoot because they allow the toes to spread within the shoe," Dr. Simon Wikler says. He has spent 13 years experimenting with the shoe.

"A fan-shaped toe will approximate the overall shape of normal toes. The inner foot can be placed on the sole rather than riding on the upper."

Most notable change in these shoes is the wide toe portion extending outward at both the outer and inner edges. This provides room for the spreading of the middle toes and the outward movement of the great and little toes.

The heel positions the foot firmly and naturally without cramping. A decided inward contour on the inner side of the shoe from the point where the toes flare out to a point near the arch also helps position the foot.

Dr. Wikler says that he realizes styles won't permit a youngster to wear this type of shoe throughout childhood. But, he maintains that if a child wears this shoe in his younger days his feet will be provided with a good foundation.

The reason for ducking the first heart is that when the club finesse is taken and loses North cannot lead a small heart to South who in turn can return the diamond for the setting trick.
