982 In First Six Months

Traffic Accidents Show Increase

Livonia has had 982 traffic accidents in the first six months of 1962 compared with only 765 for the same period a year ago according to reports from the Traffic Bureau of the Police Dept.

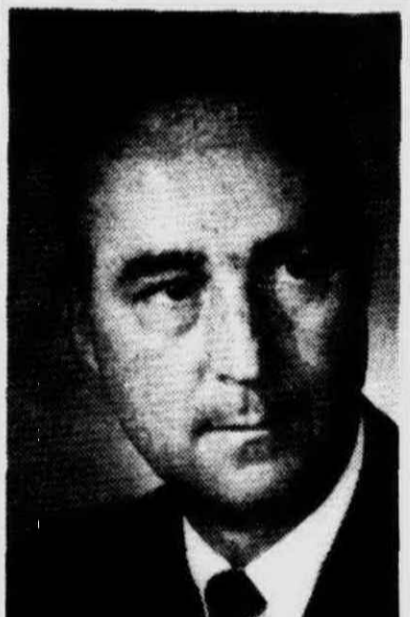
Fatal accidents and persons killed in accidents are identical to 1961 with five in the first category and seven in the latter.

But there's a tremendous increase in all divisions from that point. A total of 508 persons have been injured this year against 403 a year ago. There have been 312 injury accidents contrasted to 240.

Property damage accidents totaled 665 in 1962 against 520 in 1961 for the six-month period.

The city has had a total of 19 pedestrian accidents in which one was killed and 17 injured. A year ago it had 13 accidents with no fatalities and 11 injured.

Bicycle riders have been involved in 16 mishaps this year with 12 injuries. There were 11 accidents a year ago with eight injured.

Livonian Strikes Gold With 2 Pacers

Bill Eggers' Rusty Range Hailed As State's Best Ever

An unusual success story in harness racing is being written this season by a Livonian—William Eggers, 15644 Hubbard—who has the state's greatest three-year-old and may have the 1962 juvenile champion pacer in his comparatively small stable.

Eggers, a retired construction superintendent, and his wife, Thelma, decided to try harness racing as a hobby shortly after his retirement.

So they bought a small farm near South Lyon and a couple of brood mares, one being Rangeway, a King's Counsel mare, who had shown some signs of speed during her racing career.

Today, Rangeway is the mother of Rusty Range, the Silky Sullivan of Michigan's harness racing, and generally rated the greatest homebred pacer in history, and Relco, a two-year-old who already has shown signs of greatness.

But it is Rusty Range who has won the attention of Michigan's enthusiasts in the past two years, but more especially this year since he boasts of nine straight victories after losing by a nose in his first start. A

year ago, he captured Michigan's two-year-old pacing championship with 18 victories in 25 starts.

And it isn't particularly the number of triumphs but the manner in which Rusty does it that has won the hearts of fans in all sections of the state—principally in the Detroit area this spring.

PLEDGE PROGRAM

The International Professional Business Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi (Gamma Rho Chapter) of the University of Detroit Evening College of Commerce and Finance, held its pledge program during the months of March and April. Sixteen of the men who went through the pledge program became brothers on May 5, 1962, the day of initiation. This was one of the largest classes ever to pledge in the Gamma Rho Chapter. One of the sixteen new members is Charles J. Bauer of 9949 Marion in Redford Township.

Rusty practically walks away from the starting gate—then just like Silky Sullivan, the famed west coast thoroughbred of a few years back, he falls as many as 20 lengths behind the leaders in the first half-mile.

Then and only then does Rusty seem to take a new lease on life. From the halfway point on, there isn't any question as to the fastest in the race, he's Rusty Range who generally flies by the others like they are standing still.

Of course, that is far from the truth for he has been clocked in such sensational time as :58.1 and :58.2 for the final half—that's as fast as any pacer in the land. And that brilliant spurt usually has Rusty well in front at the finish—at least it has for the past six races.

Strangely enough, Eggers has one of the fastest sophomores in the land but Rusty is staked only in Michigan's season long colt stake series. He has won in 2:02, 2:02.2 and 2:03.1 and still hasn't hit his top form.

Then there's Relco, a full brother of Rusty, who could

be the state's best two-year-old. The son of Russet Hal and Rangeway turned in a spectacular performance a week ago when he won in 2:08.3 over a slow track.

That's one of the fastest clockings of the season for a Michigan-bred and stamps the colt as one to watch in the juvenile events during the remainder of the year.

And Mrs. Eggers has to have some of the credit for the suc-

cess of the two colts. She personally took charge of the feeding and handling of the colts until they were ready for early training. Then she turned the job over to Driver-Trainer Wilford Niles.

Meanwhile, Livonians will be watching the two colts—they could be the best ever produced in Michigan—and wishing the Eggers all the luck in the world. It couldn't happen to two nicer people.

Former Bentley Student Reports On Korean Life

A modern "Oriental adventure" is being lived by one of Livonia's original traveling students in several eastern countries this month.

Rhea Hill, who represented this city as Bentley High School's first foreign exchange student 10 years ago, is currently on tour in

is stationed as a medical officer; Japan, Hong Kong, Thailand and other far eastern countries.

Letters to her family in Livonia, Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Raymond of Oak Drive, detail her experiences.

"The farmers," she writes, "are starting to plow the fields, and they do it with such crude instruments here in Korea —

hand plow and sometimes an oxen."

"I had a Korean national dress made. The material is a pale blue, Hong Kong silk.

"Every time I turn around I see something new and interesting. Our 'mama san' gave me a pair of Korean shoes to match my Korean dress. We bought a Korean record with a lot of their folk songs and almost all of the people we meet teach us more about this country. In order to get a pig to market they first get him drunk and then tie him to a bicycle and away they go. Since the pig is stone drunk he is very easy to manage.

"I have eaten enough rice here to last me a lifetime but I still like it. Since the student revolution in 1960 when General Park took over Korea they have had a military government. One of the things proclaimed is that the people must mix barley with the rice to make it more nutritious. They can't sell cosmetics in Korean stores and any Korean caught smoking American cigarettes goes to jail.

"The present government is making compulsory education up to the ninth grade instead of sixth grade and they are also cleaning up a lot of the slums. Apparently this regime is a turn for the better."

Mrs. Hill concluded her impressions with a description of a typical Korean dinner. "Sunday," she writes, "we had dinner at the home of a Korean man. The style was completely oriental from taking off our shoes upon entering, eating with chop sticks. We had candied oriental nuts, pressed dried shrimp, deep fried oysters, fried shrimp, clams. Sea food is an oriental specialty. We also had chicken, rice, a chicken soup with vegetables, rice tea and for desert rice cooked with dates and chestnuts—needless to say this meal took three hours to eat."

Mrs. Hill, who is a registered nurse, will return to the United States later this summer.

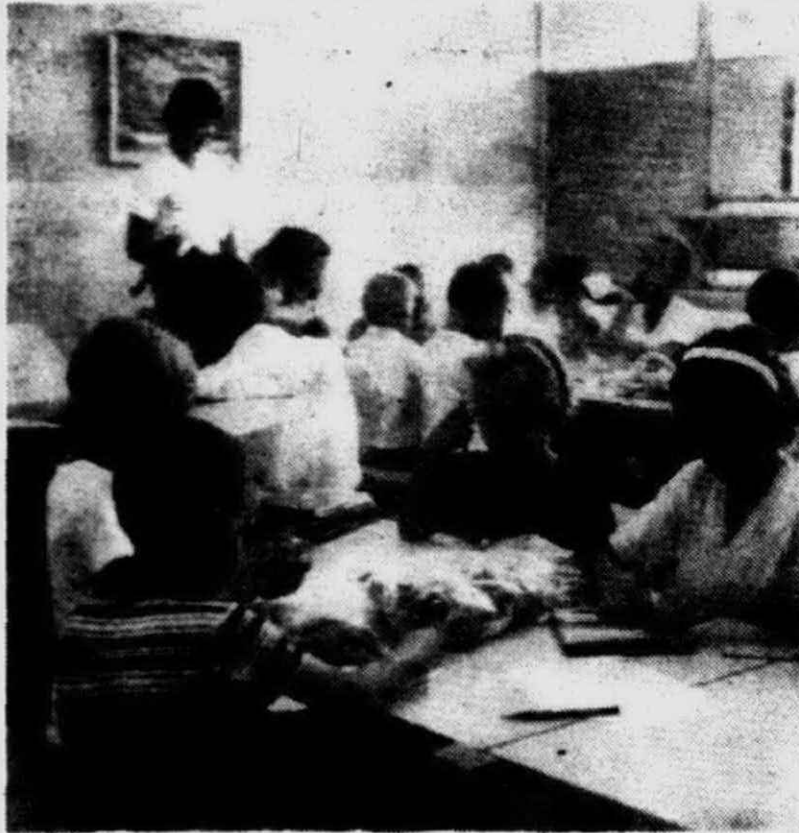
ROBERT PRAY
