College Board OKs New Library Plans

Preliminary plans for the redesigned library were approved by the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees last week when they also awarded alternate bids for a radio and television tower on the campus at the intersection of Haggerty and Seven Mile Roads. The one-story library building will have all of the features originally planned for the two-story structure which was abandoned when the bids were higher than the budget for the first four campus buildings. The redesigned Library will include seating space for 350 students, stock facilities for 35,000 books, eight classrooms and faculty offices. Architects estimated the cost at between \$408,000 and \$427,000. It is designed so that the classrooms can be converted at a minimum expense into an added wing as the college enrollment increases. 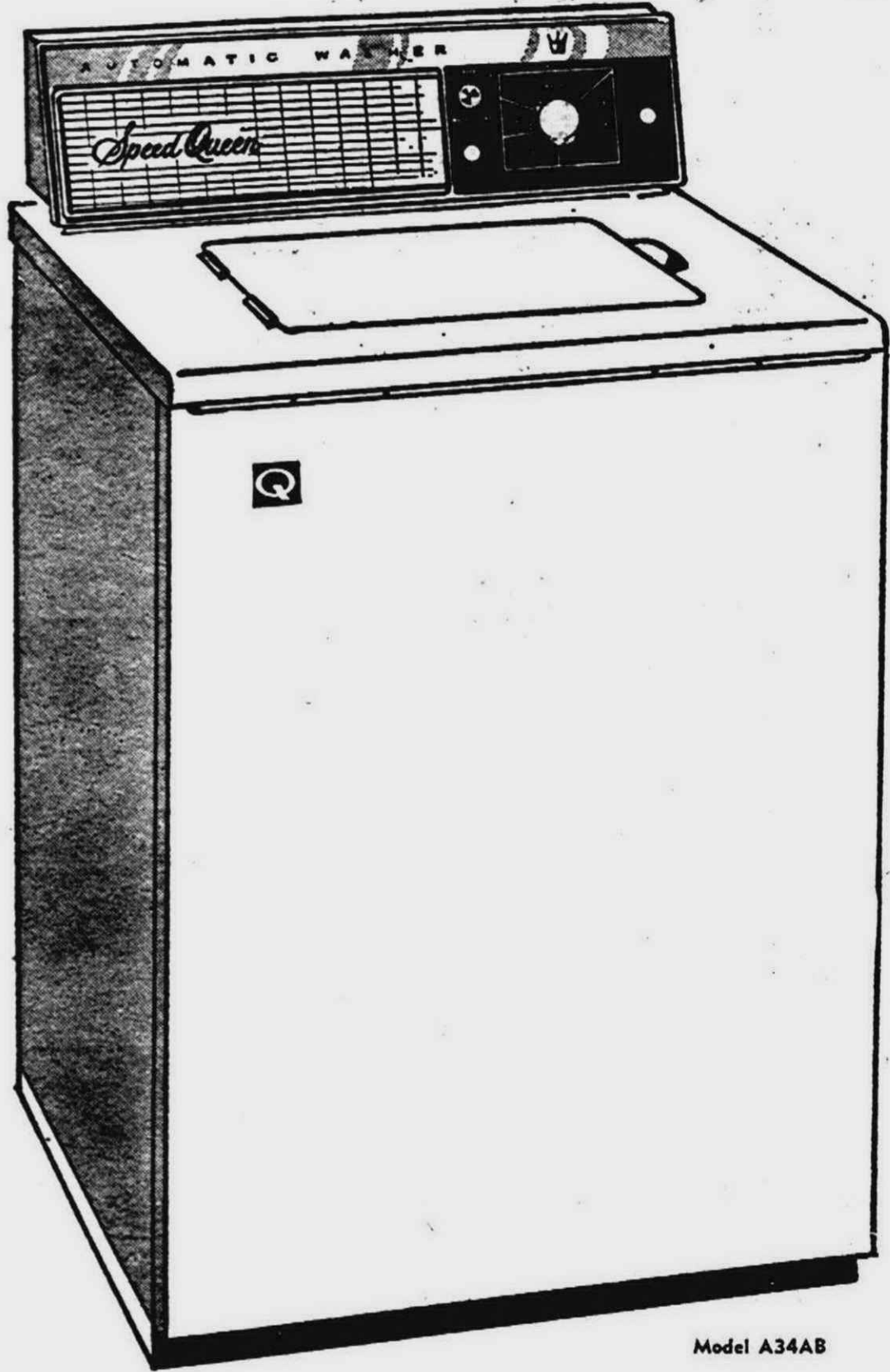



Plymouth DPW News And Notes

During the storm last week the water pumps at the well field were knocked out of commission, by lightning. Streets were flooded because many people have put seed pods, grass cuttings and various other things into the streets. As a result when it rains this is washed into the sewer.

Following the storms of last week the department spent a great deal of time cleaning up branches and limbs and cleaning up debris.

Two service leaks were dug up and repaired.

Streets were swept in the business area, Main Street to the West City limits, Penniman Avenue south to M-14, Main to Sheldon, Junction and south, the South East Section and the North end of the City.

Two funerals were conducted at Riverside Cemetery and mowing and trimming were continued. A tree stump was removed from 1395 Elm Street. Parks and Playgrounds were mowed and cleaned.

Bumper stops were installed in the Central Parking Lot and flower beds were planted. Catch Basin Tops were cleaned throughout the city. An old storm sewer was dug up on Spring Street east of Starkweather.

Dye tests were taken at several homes to determine whether or not the houses were properly connected to the sanitary sewer. A 3/4-inch Water Tap was installed at 1542 Nantucket. Sanitary Sewers were flushed on William and Pacific and Forest from Wing to Sutherland. Intersections were cut out and replaced along S. Harvey. Work was continued at the Salem Refuse Site.

Plymouth Twp. Hikes Water Tap Rates

Builders, subdividers and homeowners will pay \$15 more for water taps in Plymouth Township. That was the decision of the Township Board on recommendation of Treasurer Mrs. Elizabeth Holmes who also heads the Water Dept.

Mrs. Holmes recommended the hike to compensate for the increased cost of meters and to take care of the costs of a new system of outside meter reading.

The Board concurred in the recommendation.

The tap charge is made and must be paid when making an application to connect to the Township water system. The amount varies according to the width of the road.

The current schedule, which will be increased by the \$15 at the end of 30 days, is as follows:

A 204-foot road, Schoolcraft between Eckles and Wilcox, \$190; 120-foot, \$165; 86-foot, \$145; and 50-foot, \$125.

The rates are for 3/4-inch residential service only.

Picketing Firemen Ring City Hall

Livonia firemen threw up a 26-man picket line around City Hall Monday and threatened to keep it there until their wage demands were satisfied.

Spokesman for the demonstrating off-duty firemen charged administrators with "breaking faith" by proposing a major pay hike for policemen while leaving out firemen. "We haven't received a raise in 4 1/2 years," Donald Donnelly, president of the Livonia Firefighters Association, said.

Mayor Harvey Moelke justified the proposed raises. "It's my understanding that pay rates for police departments are generally higher than for fire departments in Michigan," he said. "We feel," he added, "that the police department is greatly undermanned and we need the best possible people we can get. We've already lost some patrolmen to Detroit. I particularly feel this way after the experience at the Bank of Livonia. We need to pay a higher scale to the people who are needed during our community's growing days."

The firemen's complaint boils down to the fact that the Civil Service Commission has proposed a raise to \$6,385 for policemen and to \$6,011 for firemen. The City Council meets Wednesday to consider the recommendation.

The proposed scale for firemen, beginning at \$5,262 and going to a maximum of \$6,011, compares with the average of other nearby communities for firemen of from \$5,152 to \$6,012.

"We were promised that one department wouldn't be singled out for a pay increase," Donnelly said, "but now they've done it. In 1961, we were offered a raise of \$90 a year which we rejected as inadequate. Now a recommendation has been made to raise our pay by \$101, but at the same time to take away three vacation days. The total pay increase thus amounts to only \$28.40 a year, even with increased benefits."

The average for policemen among nearby communities is from \$5,876 to \$6,214. The new maximum, \$6,385, would bring Livonia above this. The firefighters said they would take their fight to the State Labor Mediation Board unless action couldn't be achieved on a local level.

Here Are Important Tips for Pool Safety

Throughout inland America, more and more families are flooding their lawn areas instead of mowing them, for the latest solution for family leisure has proved to be an aqueous one.

Some two hundred thousand families own swimming pools; about two million more homeowners will have pools before the next ten years have passed. Like every new blessing, however, a pool brings with it new responsibilities. Even before the concrete is poured, you'll discover that there are certain sanitary and safety regulations set by municipal or state authorities regarding residential pools. Make certain that your builder is acquainted with these regulations and follows them.

Pool safety is largely a matter of common sense. Just to be on the safe side, however, it is wise to post several simple recommendations which have been drafted by the National Safety Council:
Bathers lying on the outside of a pool should leave a clear passageway for bathers walking around. Everyone should learn to swim, but even good child swimmers require the attention of adults.
"Rough play," shallow diving, running around the outside of the pool, and running on a diving board should be forbidden—a fair punishment for the infraction of this rule might be exclusion from the pool for a week.

Learn how to give mouth-to-mouth respiration, or better yet, invite the Red Cross or other demonstration teams to visit your pool and instruct your family in safety practices. The area in front of the diving board should be watched and swimmers cautioned against the danger of being dived on. No swimming soon after a meal or during the hottest part of the day; both can cause cramps and illness.

Amalgamate the water are kept out.
An open-mesh cover is easy to fit to a pool and easy to fold and carry. If it's made of high-density polyethylene, it will not be affected by chemicals used in pool hygiene. It will not rot or mildew.
Even stronger are covers made of vinyl—or rubber-coated solid fabrics. These are preferred in treeless areas where winds may coat pool surfaces with dust and dirt.

Don't Forget Cover
Many communities require owners to erect adequate enclosures around pools that are at least four feet high and which can be securely closed. For greater security, many owners prefer to cover the pool when it is not in use.

\$30,000 Pledged For Clinic Operation

More than \$30,000 has been pledged to put the new Northwestern Child Guidance Clinic into operation by September 1, and a search for the Clinic's first full-time social work employee is underway.

160 Teams Start Play On Livonia Diamonds

If you're in the nine to 90 age bracket and not playing baseball or softball this summer in Livonia, the only person you can blame is yourself.

"We have a spot for everybody, boys and girls, ladies and men," says Al Roscoe, who directs the vast sports recreation program in Livonia.

Starting the week, Roscoe said, there were 160 baseball teams operating in Livonia and something like 60 more in softball.

"We should add about 20 more in the next few days," the Recreation Department's bossman said.

Most of the baseball is for boys. For example, there are 60 teams in what is tabbed the minor division for boys nine and ten years old. And there are 57 more "minor" clubs for boys 11-13.

There's a 12-team major category for boys 11-13. They're split into two divisions, the American and National, of six teams each.

Players for the major teams come from the minors, just as they do in pro baseball. If a boy can't stick with a major club, he's farmed back to the minors from where his replacement comes.

Class E for boys 14 and 15 has a seven-team league already going and another group of 10 teams to be co-sponsored by the Teen Athletic League of Livonia and the Recreation Department ready to swing into action.

Then there's the strong Class D League for boys 16-18. This circuit actually is a Northwest Wayne County endeavor, instead of just all Livonia.

Livonia has two representatives. There also are two from Plymouth and Nankin and one each from Redford Union, South Redford, Northville and Dearborn Heights.

The 16-18-year-olds are playing in two leagues each week. One category is the Connie Mack Division, the other the Recreation Department of Michigan.

Just to keep the older boys busy, they also will vie in a special district tournament in connection with the statewide Detroit Free Press program.

The tourney, as far as Livonia is concerned, will begin on July 13 and run for about eight weeks. The winning team will move on to Ann Arbor for the outstate finals, then on to Detroit for the grand state championships and the right to go to Johnstown, Pa.

The Free Press tourney is the successor to the old Detroit Times-Hearst baseball program. From the Times program each

year two or more great Michigan sandlotters were sent to New York for the Hearst all-star game.

Bill Freehan, Al Moran, Reno Bertola, Hobie Landrith and many more all went to New York and not only received big bonuses, but also would up in the major leagues.

The Livonia recreation department also sponsors a five-team senior Class A team. Livonia has one entry, sponsored by the race track. Other teams come from South Lyons, Ypsilanti, Wayne and Inkster.

When it comes to softball, Livonia has a four-team fast-pitch league for men and one of similar size for the girls.

There also is an 18-team modified, slo pitch league and a 16-team Church League circuit. Another slo-pitch league for teen age girls is in the process of being formed.

In sports, as in other endeavours of entertainment, there come from time to time those very special events.

Baseball has its world series and all-star game . . . football its championship game . . . hockey the Stanley Cup playoffs . . . pro basketball its title windup . . . auto racing the "500" at Indianapolis . . . golf the National Open, National Amateur, the Masters and PGA.

Horse racing likewise offers its super-duper attractions . . . the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and the Belmont . . . and hereabouts it's the annual Michigan Mile which comes up this Saturday in our midst at the Detroit Race Course over on Middlebelt Road.

The Michigan Mile, as our old and departed boss, Bob Murphy, used to say, falls in the category of a prestige and class production.

"When these events come up in sports, you always want to be there," Murphy frequently would write in The Detroit Times, which followed Murphy in death.

Then Bob would add: "You don't necessarily have to love the particular sport. But if you have any interest in sports—and who doesn't?—then you should make it your business to attend. You'll thrill to the spectacle of just being among the thousands on the scene."

How true Murphy's words are at this moment with the Michigan Mile less than 72 hours away.

Actually, the "Mile" isn't a mile race. It used to be. But, officials have stretched the length an extra sixteenth so that the horses can come pounding down in front of the grand stand at the start and also at the finish. There's also less chance of a crush at the first turn under the expanded distance.

Whatever the distance, that's hardly the important item. What has to thrill every sports enthusiast is the calibre of the field attracted for this year's Mile.

Right off the bat, the big name is Greek Money from the Brandywine Stable. Greek Money won the Preakness a year ago.

He's the first Preakness winner since 1933 when Head Play came here to step foot on a Detroit-area track.

The indications are that Greek Money probably will parade to the post as the favorite on Saturday. But, don't forget another horse, Crimson Satan, owned by Livonia's own Bill Salmen.

Crimson Satan shapes up as far more than a sentimental choice running in his own back yard. He'll bring quite a record for money winning into the Michigan Mile. At last count the horse had won upwards of \$600,000.

In all, 10 or 12 horses will race in the "Mile." The year's biggest gathering is expected at the DEC. It shapes up as a MUST on every true sportsman's calendar.
