Co-Ordinator Asks All To Register

Plymouth Seeks Young Adult Jobs

Mike Hoben, who serves full-time as football coach and counselor at Plymouth Senior High during the fall, winter and spring, is a man with a big job now.

As coordinator of a Young Adult employment program, sponsored by the YMCA, he is

looking for jobs. But first he has the task of learning just how acute the problem is and of determining how many in the 16 to 25 age group in the Plymouth Community fall in the category of those needing assistance.

That's why he is setting up

offices in the Plymouth Community Credit Union to accept registrations. He is asking all in the 16 to 25 age group who need assistance to register for jobs and counseling. He will be in the office daily from 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday for interviews

and registrations.

"We know that a problem exists in the community in the age group we're working with," he said, "but at the moment we don't know how extensive it is and won't have an accurate picture until we sift through the registrations."

"We are asking all persons in the Plymouth Community in the 16-25 age group to register. We hope all do and then we'll have some idea of what we face in our program."

Hoben's plan is to secure temporary or permanent jobs with the thought of enrolling

many of the unemployed in training programs in which they will acquire some kind of skill. He believes many in the group are high school dropouts who have been unable to secure steady employment.

Hoben points to figures which show there were 85 dropouts

in the high school in the past year in grades nine through 12, making up about 5.8 per cent of the high school enrollment.

The statistics show that two boys drop out for every one girl and the biggest problem comes in the 10th grade.

He has a three-pronged

plan for the employment program which he believes will work for the betterment of conditions throughout the community.

Hoben plans to encourage many of the younger dropouts to go back to vocational training to acquire skill in some type of work.

He plans to contact and to ask businessmen and potential employers to contact him personally so that each can work out a mutual agreement on job possibilities and training programs.

He hopes to inaugurate a pilot training program in which the workers will be tested for two weeks of training and schooling after which the employer and Hoben will confer on the future possibilities of the worker.

But most of all, he plans to get out and hustle as many jobs as possible for registrants—he needs registrations at once to get the ball rolling and is asking all in the age group to register at once.

"We can't delay in getting started," he emphasized, "the problem is here right now and we have to begin the program at once to alleviate a situation that appears acute on the surface from what we have learned to date."

Jarvis replaces Tom Notebaert and Mrs. Mather takes over for Mrs. Reva Barber.

Phil Scott will handle advertising and William Nelson will direct publicity and special events.

Richard Waga is chairman of the report luncheon committee and will be aided by Earl Merriman.

Treasurer Mrs. Helyn Coplin reported the 1962 campaign total had soared to \$65,622 on March 1.

Other Driver Still Sought

While two youths, injured in an alleged drag racing mishap on Plymouth Road a week ago, are in critical condition in St. Mary Hospital, Livonia Police are still seeking the driver of the second car involved in the race.

Patrolman Ron Butcher of the Livonia Traffic Bureau and members of the Plymouth Police Department have questioned scores of youths.

Robert Daley, of Plymouth, owner of the car, was killed when the speeding vehicle skidded on Plymouth Road near Eckles, sideswiped a second car, careened off a telephone pole and all three occupants were thrown through the roof of the convertible onto the road.

In critical condition are Barry Carter, 26527 Student, Redford Township, and Doug Mullins, 15720 Wormer, Redford Township. Each sustained serious head injuries and Carter has a broken right arm and other injuries.

The Livonia Police reports allege that Mullins was the driver with Daley in the middle and Carter on the outside seat of the sports car.

It is believed by Police that the drag race started near the Burroughs plant and reportedly was to have continued through Eckles Road—but a driver had made a left turn from Eckles onto Plymouth in front of the racers who allegedly were coming with such speed that the collision resulted.

Plymouth Jaycees Plan Biggest Fourth Celebration In History

Following the Plymouth tradition of making every event bigger and better than the previous one, the Plymouth Jaycees predict the July 4 parade will be the largest and most spectacular in history.

The hour long march will highlight the Jaycees annual week-long July 4 celebration

which opens Tuesday with a carnival on the Mill Street grounds and lists events every day and night through Sunday.

Parade Chairman Wendell Smith indicated this year's procession will include 42 floats, five drill teams, including both state champion units from the Mayflower Post, four bands and

21 Jaycee clowns along with all of the traditional items.

The bands will include three from Canada, one from London and two from Windsor along with the Plymouth Community organization.

The drill teams will include The Grosse Ile Tars and Rifles, Selfridge Air Force Base pre-

cision unit, the Detroit unit of the Marines and the V.F.W. championship men's color guard and women's auxiliary teams.

In addition the Air Force has promised to have planes zooming over the line of march and the Marines expect to have one or two helicopters in the air.

The parade is scheduled to start at 11 a.m. on July 4 from the City Hall, going south on Main to Hartsough and east to the Junior High East athletic field where awards will be made.

Chairman Smith indicated awards will be made to the best float, best marching unit and best band.

Following the parade, a horse show will be held on the carnival grounds at 12:30 p.m. and then the peanut drop for the youngsters at 3 on the junior high athletic field.

The peanuts will be dropped from a plane piloted by Dr. Gerald Fitch with Dr. Robert Evans as bombardier. Prizes and free carnival rides are the prizes for youngsters finding the properly colored peanuts.

Firemen teams from Plymouth Township and the City of Plymouth will stage a water fight with firefighters from Canton Township and DeHoCo at 4 p.m. at the carnival grounds.

The Chamber of Commerce will award the prize Angus steer to some lucky member of the audience at 9 p.m. and then the crowd will settle down for the greatest fireworks display ever in Plymouth at 9:30 p.m.

The Jaycees know that the fireworks will be the best ever for they have spent more money than ever before, thanks to donations of more than \$700 from businessmen, civic clubs, service clubs and governmental units in the community.

The Fourth is the biggest day and night of the entire celebration but Wednesday, July 3 will have more than a bit of interest due to the crowning of Miss Plymouth of 1963 at the teen hop in the senior high gym.

The hop is sponsored by the Plymouth Firemen's Association and the feature of the evening will be the presentation of the 20 queen candidates who will parade before the panel of three judges—then the grand climax when the Queen is named and crowned.

The entire week is filled with better than average attractions and this year's July 4 celebration promises to be and should be Plymouth's best.

ZIP To Speed Plymouth P.O.

Quicker, better and faster mail services will be available to patrons of the Plymouth Post Office if they co-operate fully in the Post Office Department's new ZIP code, slated to go into effect nationally on July 1.

That was the statement of Plymouth Postmaster George Timpona as he announced that Plymouth's five-digit ZIP Code will be 48170.

"Everyone receiving or sending mail out of the Plymouth Post Office will use this ZIP Code," he said, "it should be placed on all correspondence to speed deliveries and reduce the chance of mail getting lost or mis-sent."

Timpona stressed the importance of all patrons learning Plymouth's ZIP code and using that in answering mail, ZIP codes taken from incoming correspondence should be used.

He cited the following as an example of the proper use of the ZIP Code:

Timpona pointed out that the new ZIP Code system will permit the Post Office Department to short cut repeated address reading for the first time.

"The address of mail sometimes is read as many as eight or 10 times to get it to the proper destination," Timpona said. "Each handling slows the process of mail dispatch and adds to the opportunity for error."

"With the ZIP Code, a clerk needs only to glance at the code to know immediately to which national area, state and post office the letter is destined and to speed it on its way, cutting as much as 24 hours off the time between deposit and delivery."

The Postmaster said that when the Code is in full swing, the United States will have the most modern system of mail distribution and delivery in the world.

Four Jaycees Join Caravan To Louisville

Headed by President James Garber, a delegation of four members of the Plymouth Junior Chamber of Commerce and their wives Sunday joined a 110-car caravan from Michigan en route to the national convention in Louisville.

The Plymouth group included: Garber, External Vice President and Mrs. Maurice Breen, Mr. and Mrs. Terry West and Mr. and Mrs. Douglas Vincent.

More than 500 joined in the Michigan caravan which included representatives from practically every chapter in the Lower Peninsula.

The caravan formed at Coldwater and had a police escort across Indiana to the Kentucky line and into Louisville.

Plymouth Warns Property Owners: Cut Grass Or Pay

Property owners in the City of Plymouth are warned that weeds and grass on vacant lots must be cut—or the city will take care of the chores and bill the owners for the service.

City Clerk Joseph Near issued the warning in compliance with Ordinance 222.

The Ordinance provides that the city will wait until July 1 and then will begin mowing all unmowed lots without further notice to owners.

FACTS and OPINIONS by Paul Chandler



Today we pass along to the reader some of our current correspondence on familiar matters.

The first letter is a report to the Governor on the ground-breaking ceremonies last week for the big Sears-Crowley shopping centers, one of which will go up at Seven Mile and Middlebelt roads in Livonia. The Governor asked me to stand-in for him at the luncheon ceremonies.

Dear Governor Romney: This is to report on the assignment of representing your office at the ground-breaking ceremonies for two huge new metropolitan shopping centers, one in Livonia and the other in Roseville.

These projects are more significant than many citizens perhaps realize.

In the first place, the estimated cost of the twin centers is \$50 million. When they are completed in 1964, this valuation will contribute a hefty boost to Michigan's tax base. In the case of Livonia, for example, the Center by itself will provide something like five percent new tax revenue to continue on with that City's job of building schools, sewers and roads.

Then there is the matter of jobs. For the next few months, Michigan's building tradesmen have a \$50 million project of work on their hands.

When the Centers open next year, at least 2,500 new jobs will be filled by Michigan citizens. They in turn will pour \$10 million of fresh payroll money into the State's economy annually.

I told the group that it was news like this which made the job of Governor a satisfying one, and rubbed out thoughts of lesser discouragements.

Here in plain view is a case of the nation's largest and most successful retailers—plus some far-sighted Michigan developers and financiers—placing their bet on Michigan's future. In so doing, they create new jobs, new revenues, new capital assets for their State; and new confidence within its residents.

I delivered your warmest congratulations and thanks on behalf of all the citizens of Michigan.

Dear Paul: Almost every year there is discussion in the Legislature concerning water, and the cost of water, in the Detroit metropolitan area.

Enclosed is an article clipped from today's issue of the Detroit Free Press. The article gives a clear and concise explanation of water cost to communities supplied by the Detroit water system.

My purpose in forwarding this explanation to each Legislator is to provide a common starting point for future discussion on this subject (if such discussions are again necessary); and to provide factual background for Legislators living outside of the Detroit metropolitan area.

Dear E. D.: Your letter on the subject of Detroit water was welcome. The subject is one of long-term irritation to myself and my fellow suburbanites.

As you undoubtedly know, the Detroit water system probably is the most solvent governmental agency in the State of Michigan. Its depreciation reserves are fabulous and its net annual earnings are huge.

Because it is a monopoly operation—and must inevitably so be—it is in fact a genuine public utility. In my belief, it should be subject to all the restraints and privileges of other public utilities, as say, Consumers Power or Michigan Bell.

Out here in the suburbs our water bills are substantially higher than those of residents of Detroit; and there are great differences among suburban customers.

There is no appeal, no review and no relief. The non-Detroit customers have no vote on the controlling Board. It's a pure take-it-or-leave-it monopoly.

If one is to regard the Detroit water system as an authentic metropolitan system—and I do—then the total costs should be pooled and a common rate charged for water among all customers.

Our sports community continues to buzz about the firing of Bob Scheffing as manager of the Tigers.

From what we have read and heard, just about everybody except fellows like Nestor Chylak, Jim Honochick, Hank Soar and Ed Hurley (they're American League umpires) are to blame for what's happened to the Tigers this season.

"Scheffing was too lenient with his players," according to one headline on a story authored by Watson Spoetra in the Detroit News.

"Wrong-guys fired," decried Lyall Smith, the Free Press Sports Editor.

Unquestionably all of these factors have had something to do with the fall of the Tigers from their run for the pennant in 1961 (when they challenged the Yanks until the final month), to their fourth-place finish last season and their current struggle to rise out of ninth slot.

But maybe all of us—and this includes the Tiger management, the team itself, the sports writers (this one, too) and the fans—wouldn't find ourselves so stunned over the team's standing had we not perhaps overrated the Tigers from the start.

When the season started, each of us looked optimistically into the Tiger's immediate future.

Still vivid in our memories was the club's great rush of '61 and we were writing off last year's slide on the injuries of Al Kaline and Frank Lary.

What we overlooked as the Tigers plunged into '63 were such salient facts as:

- 1—Scheffing still was confronted with some serious problems in the infield . . . notably at short, second and third.
- 2—Could Norm Cash regain his hitting majesty of '61?
- 3—Could Rocky Colavito deliver with greater regularity in a clutch?
- 4—Was Gus Triandos the answer to the catching miseries of the past?
- 5—Could Frank Lary come back? And what about the relief pitching situation . . . would it be stronger?

We took the positive approach to most of these points. As long as Kaline again was healthy, the Tigers appeared mighty again . . . so we thought.

Now with the team mired deep in the standings we all are shocked. Maybe we should expect less from the Tigers, Lions and Pistons and all other teams that interest us. In that way we would cheer anything they accomplished.

While on the subject of the Tigers, we'd like to spell a few words in defense of the players.

We disagree with those who would have you believe that Colavito hasn't hit his hat because he is still angry and sulking over the salary battle he had with G. M. Campbell back in March.

Nor do we think there is a Tiger, or any other pro athlete, who isn't giving everything he has everytime he gets the call to perform.

Just keep in mind that baseball players are paid this year for what they did last season; also that while the game in which they engage is a team affair, the salary negotiations are carried on strictly on an individual basis.

Also remember that while many of us can get by with a minimum effort in our regular work and still land a pay hike at the year's close, because our union has negotiated a general salary boost, things don't work that way for the pro athlete.

The men who decide what a pro players shall be paid keep very close tab on the efforts of their hired hands. For example the Tiger front office has detailed statistics to throw at any players to show him how many times he failed to deliver with men on base or how many times he erred in a clutch, etc.

There's also another factor which behooves the pro athlete to make "hay" as long as he can. At best, the average career of the big leaguer—in any sport—is short; less than seven years.

And, when you talk about big money in athletics, it comes only to those in the big leagues!

Now to change subjects.

Let's doff our hats to the gentlemen who guide the destinies of the Detroit Race Course in Livonia.

These men have worked strenuously to achieve their goal: "Better racing for Detroit area fans."

It hasn't been easy, as this chronicler has reported for the Observer papers. But when you look back at last Saturday's Mile . . . and the greatest contingent which made up the field . . . you are left with only one comment:

"The DRC has arrived."

In every endeavour there comes a point when you finally attain "status." That the DRC now has.

In years to come, the track is assured of luring the cream of the racing stables. The Michigan Mile will join the other great classic events run annually in the United States.

So a salute again to the DRC. It's been a battle . . . but a very happy one, indeed.

With a field of 10 or more, headed by A.C.'s Viking, the Hambletonian king and three-year-old trotter of 1962, Michigan and Detroit area harness racing fans will be treated to one of the greatest events of the season Friday night in the third renewal of the fabled HTA trotting series at Northville Downs.

Practically all of the standout three-year-olds of last year are listed in the probable starters for the \$12,300 stake for four-year-olds. The Northville leg is the first of five qualifiers for the series which culminates on Aug. 1 with a \$50,000 finale at Yonkers Raceway in New York City.

It will be the only appearance of the HTA pacers and trotters in the Motor City this season inasmuch as the Hazel Park pace was cancelled due to the virus epidemic at the time.

And that to Northville's official family means one of the largest crowds of the three-week-old season and perhaps the best turnout in history. At least the 'Downs believes the current record of 11,256 in 1948 may go by the boards.

At the moment, A.C.'s Viking has to be considered the logical favorite on the basis of his 1:59.3 of last year and his winning performances in his last two starts when he was caught in 2:02 and 2:02.3. The big colt earned \$235,184 in 1962, most of it in the Hambletonian.

bletonian, as he finished in the money on 20 of 22 starts and won 15 times. However, he faces plenty of competition this time, more than in any test to date.

Others in the field are: Terrel (1:59.1), Sophia Hanover (2:02.3), Pro Hanover (2:02), Spry Rodney (2:01.1), Apex Hanover (2:06), Happy Newport (2:04.3), Lord Gordon (2:02.3) and Lord Valentine (2:04.3).

Lord Valentine, owned by C & M Stable in Archbold, O., will bring diminutive George Sholty back to the scenes of some of his early triumphs. It was at Northville four years ago that Sholty first gained prominence as a driver and he now ranks as one of the tops in the Metropolitan New York City sector.

The HTA will go off as the eighth race on Friday's program with post time on the first at 8:15 p.m.

The MAYOR'S CORNER

THE LIVONIA MALL GROUND BREAKING . . . June 19, 1963, was another "red-letter" day for our City! I had the honor of setting off the dynamite blast at the ground breaking ceremonies at our new \$25 million dollar shopping center at Middlebelt and Seven Mile Roads.

George Klein, one of the developers and myself, then flew to Detroit at approximately 500 feet in a helicopter. The effects of good planning and zoning are really apparent from the air.

Particularly noticeable were the larger lot areas of our City vs. the crowded, jammed areas of Detroit. The outskirts of Detroit proper showed some backyard-green areas, however, as we approached the downtown area, it was just one roof top after another, practically covering the entire area.

If only Detroit had made an effort to control its density in the 30's, it wouldn't have the problems it faces today.

Livonia's Youth Employment Service (Y.E.S.) can help you out!!

FISCAL TAX REFORM . . . I was invited to attend Governor Romney's Regional Meeting on Tax Reform held at the Statler Hotel in Downtown Detroit.

It was a very informative meeting.

A 20-page report covering Michigan's present revenue structure and six (6) possible alternate methods of taxation were presented.

One thing stood out in all of them: that all called for additional State revenues. The only question was "who" was to pay it?? Most plans called for reductions in business taxes with an increase to provide individuals resulting from a State-Wide Income Tax.

The alternative of increased personal taxes is a reduction in State services. A vote of those present indicated that the majority (and I voted with the majority), wanted fewer State services with local communities deciding for themselves whether they wanted to pay for more governmental services.

School Districts receive substantial grants from the State . . . \$330 million dollars will be paid by the State in 1963-64 . . . This includes half of the total sales tax collections and on all proceeds of several other taxes amounting to \$64 million dollars plus an additional State General Fund supplement of about \$82 million dollars.

Cities, and counties received revenue from the State too. For example, the Livonia Public School District will receive \$4 million 65 thousand in State aid in 63-64. The City of Livonia will receive \$1,568,000 which includes \$500,000 race track money.

ASSESSMENT METHODS . . . were also discussed.

The personal property tax on business and industry is in my opinion a very unfair and unjust tax. It is one that is hurting our economy, greatly in Michigan!

In Livonia, we reduced personal property assessments last year \$7,800,000. We are trying to give industry a fair break in Livonia and it is the only way we can attract them to our community!!
