Stories about lost dogs and stray cats don't phase Mr. and Mrs. Edward O'Brien 17191 Ridge Rd. In fact, today the Northville Township couple find themselves in sort of a "Can You Top This" situation after a 650-pound Black Angus steer of theirs got lost last Sunday. It was enough to try the patience of even the calmest person. Mrs. O'Brien explained it this way: She and her husband, better known as "Bill," were hosting some 75 to 100 people at a "cutting" party Sunday. It's where men on horseback attempt to "cut" a steer out of a herd. Defroiter Bill Bingaman, on his prize quarter horse, was cutting this one Angus steer and was "driving a little too hard," as Mrs. O'Brien put it. The steer crashed through a wooden fence and two other horsemen gave chase. The Angus took off across fields, into a nearby gravel pit, loped across Six Mile Rd. and "simply disappeared." The O'Briens are offering a reward. The animal is worth about \$175.

(Continued from page 1) square feet of unused space that could be turned into storage area for the School District. So far, she's had little success. "We've got to find an equal amount of storage space before we could ever get permission to occupy 'Hough School,'" Mrs. Olson explained. In its present location at the former K of C Hall (now described as the Community Center building), the nursery is cramped for space. To make matters worse, the nursery shares the building with the Plymouth rifle club. And this means that mothers who administer the nursery must each day haul out the nursery equipment for use by the children, and then shove it back out of the way at the end of the day. It's a lot of unnecessary, hard work, Mrs. Olson maintains. "If we had our own permanent quarters," she said, "we wouldn't have to be bothered by this." There are about 40 Plymouth children between the ages of three and five who take part in the nursery activities each week-day during the school year, Mrs. Olson explained. The present fee for children to attend the nursery is 85 cents a day, with a possibility this may go to \$1 a day before the 1963-64 year begins. At any rate, Mrs. Olson would like to know if anyone in Plymouth has an extra 1,200 square feet of storage space lying around unused. She may be reached at GL 3-1438.

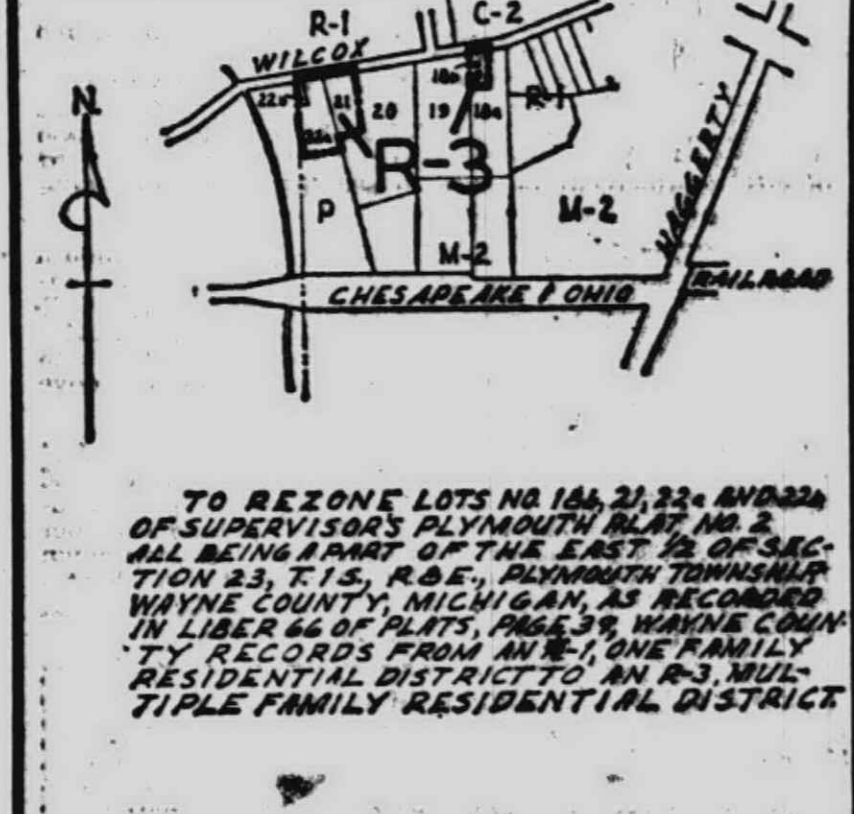

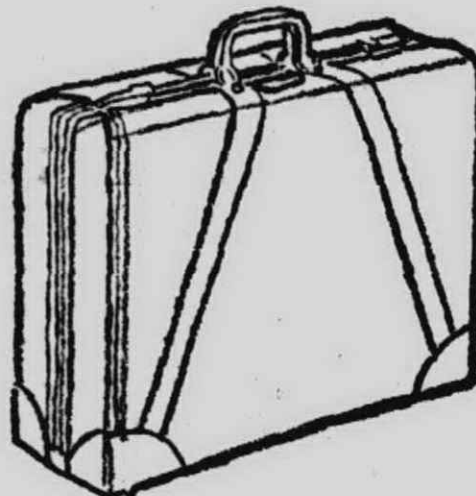
time administrative assistant to Isbister. This post will be filled shortly, Isbister indicated. It will remain a part-time assignment.

For the third straight year, Plymouth High School's popular 75-member marching band will be off to a pre-season "training camp" at Interlochen shortly.

The week-long stay at the famed National Music Camp will provide members of the band with a chance to brush up on basic marching maneuvers as well as practice their combined musical skills.

Headed by director James Griffith and his wife, together with a contingent of parents, the band will depart at 8 a.m. next Monday morning on a six-hour journey by bus to Interlochen in the northern part of the Lower Peninsula.

of the high school choir and is a band parent as well.

With Nelson directing, the 75 members of the band will briefly become a choir and sing during an interdenominational church service Sunday, Sept. 1.

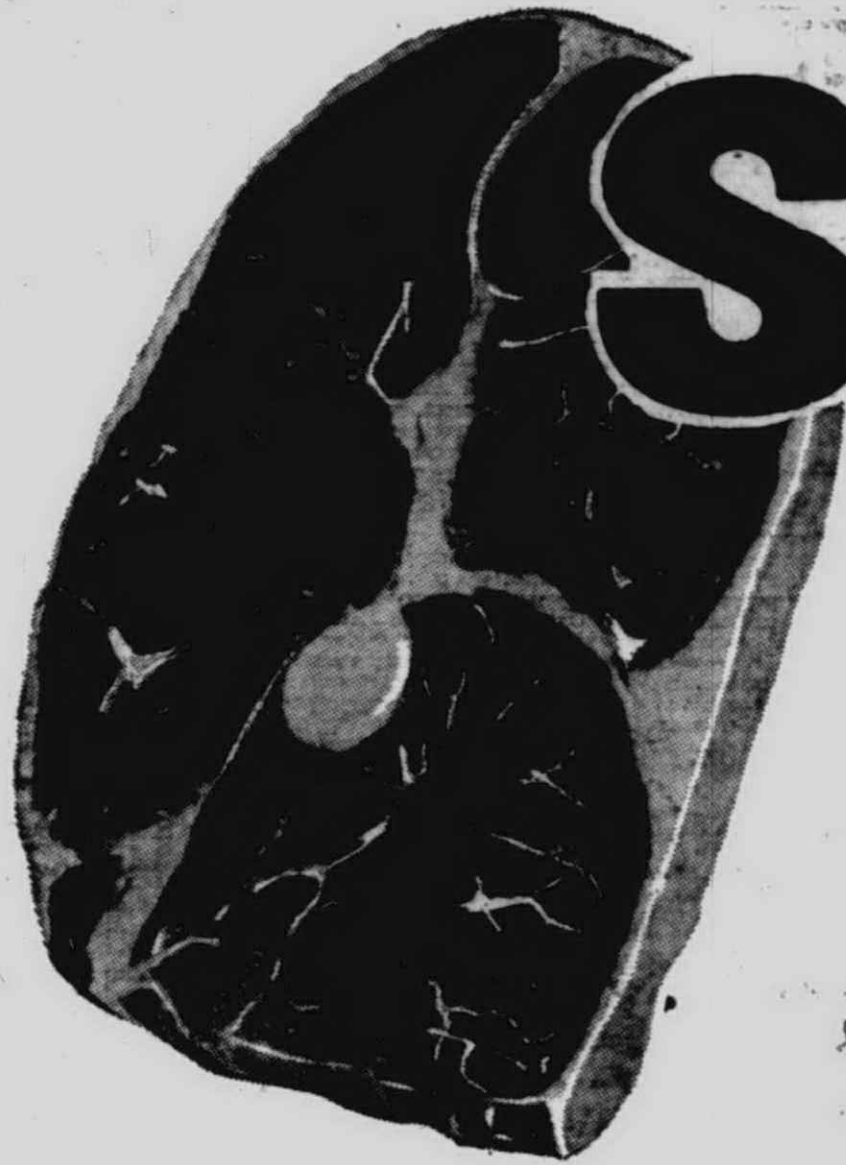

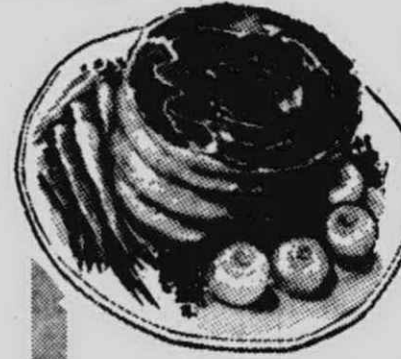

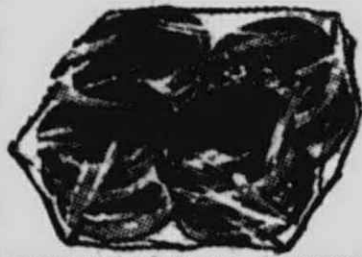
