"These people are practically without water," he stated, Their wells have gone dry and Northville Township doesn't have a water system or any way to solve their problem.

"These homeowners need help as quickly as possible and that's why we are making the appeals to Plymouth Township and City to see what can be done about tapping in on their lines to lines we intend installing as soon as we get water."

Plymouth Township has a main on the intersection of Five Mile and Bradner Roads -an ideal spot to tap in-while the City has a main at Five Mile and Northville that could be used, provided the pressure is assured

Northville Township, Merriam told each group that his Board wished to install a master meter and set up its own meter reading and billing department.

Thus he asked both the City and Plymouth Township to think in terms of wholesale rates on the basis of furnishing water to a municipality.

The City has a policy of charging a double rate for all water services outside the city limits. Mayor Richard Wernette indicated to Merriam that this was one of the reasons why the Commission could not set a rate until it had made a more careful

Wernette appointed a committee composed of Commissioners James Jabara and Arch Vallier and City Manager Albert Glassford to make a study and report back to the Commission at the Sept. 9 session.

Vallier made the motion for the resolution to furnish the owners in such a crisis as this." The resolution passed by a 7-0 vote.

The situation was a bit different when brought to the attention of the Plymouth Township Board last week.

Supervisor Roy Lindsay expressed a serious doubt the Township's contract with the Detroit Water Board would permit it to sell water to another municipality except on an emergency basis to a comparatively small group.

Merriam told the Board that Northville Township would like to have a quotation of price for furnishing water to some 18 to Bradner Road district.

However, during the conference it was brought out that the total could go as high as 300 - something Plymouth Township felt wasn't quite feasible under its contract.

Lindsay pointed out that the Township could furnish water at the same rate as other customers but couldn't wholesale it and definitely didn't want to the water business.

Working separately, the Plymouth and Livonia youth employment agencies found jobs for more than 375 young men and women! Many of them

Board and the School Board in carrying on the job service. It was started this summer by

the very near future. The biggest snarl is whether a school system can afford to go into a program of this nature when the equipment and machinery needed becomes obsolete so

Isbister admits that the vocational and technical training program has been neglected in most school systems due to the stress placed on science and college preparatory courses after the advent of the first Sputnik in

At that time, the emphasis was placed on science and math-stressed so much that there was a tendency to forget those who dropped out of school

and their problems. The thinking has changed in recent months, swinging away from the college-aimed program to a new program designed for the dropouts and those students who have

no desire to attend college. The School Boards have finally learned that the curriculum should take care of all-not that limited few who go on for additional studies and for the very, very few who finally receive degrees.

'Curtain Going Up'

By Wally Roberts

From the shady, idyllic banks of the Avon river in Stratford, State Fair on Saturday, August Ontario, to the sweeping elegant lines of the new Tyrone Guthrie Theater behind the Walker Art Center in downtown Minneapolis, Minnesota, would seem physically like a great distance. Believe me, artistically, it's but a short step.

> The Stratford Shakespearean Festival has been in operation for ten years presenting the finest classical works. Some years the Statford folks present Greek drama, new works by Canadian authors, or a classic like "Cyrano" by Rostand.

The Minnesota Theater Company performing in repertory at the two million dollar Tyrone Guthrie Theater in Minneapolis adds another exciting theatrical mecca for those who find the theater so exhilarating. For 22 weeks four brilliant works of dramatic art will be given alternately: "The Miser," "Death of A Salesman," "Three Sisters," and "Hamlet." Season began on May 7 and will continue until September 22.

Old Wally decided to take a "busman's holiday" and visit each of these citadels of fine dramatic entertainment in the short space of a week. My adventure started with Stratford and "Timon of Athens." A quick review hardly does justice to such a major effort on the part of Mr. Michael Langham who staged such a scathing, scintillating commentary on our modern times so aptly and expertly.

Dozens of beautifully detailed performances by veteran Stratford players such as Tony Van Bridge, Leo Ciceri, Douglas Rain, Hugh Webster, William Hutt made "Timon of Athens" a joy to behold. It's not often that you have the opportunity to see this seldom-produced Shakespearean work. And for this reason many of the critics who found fault with Stratford's modernistic clever contemporary touches should have taken them with a few grains of salt. Old Wally loved the modern dress approach. The Duke Ellington score, while not outstanding, added the right note of cynical syncopation.

Many a purist viewing such a spiced-up "Timon" might well leave the auditorium muttering "sacrilegious," or words to that effect. Dispensing with togas for the sharp cut of the business suit did not disturb me. I felt such placing of the play more directly in the context of our greedy, materialistic age gave the production added bite and substance. Indeed, the only reason members of the audience might come to hate "Timon of Athens" would be that it delineates so accurate a picture of our rapacious world. The sickness of our society becomes increasingly apparent as "Timon" dramatically lets the leading character, Lord Timon. issue his damaging denunciation of man's ingratitude to man riage-Go-Round" and a decision the beginning of Act II.

Michael Langham can be happy that John Colicos was available for the most difficult role of Timon. The second act centers on Mr. Colicos. Had he not the ability to vary his many tirades vocally and physically "Timon" could become a bit of a bore. Mr. Colicos alternately showed pity and terror with the sureness season. "Marriage-Go-Round" of a brilliant performer. To counter Mr. Colicos nicely was is scheduled to open October Douglas Rain doing a top job as Apemantus, the cynical, chulish 18. philosopher. Mr. Rain spit his sneering lines out competently covered with vocal venom. His characterization of a world-weary newspaper man that observes the corruption of the world so readily gave all of us moments of pause to reflect.

In fact, all of "Timon of Athens" contains too many messages for a better world by painting such a true, bitter portrait of our present cancerous era. Check with the Stratford box office for tickets to this terrific "Timon." If any memory serves me correctly, "Timon" will be given twice a week for the final three weeks of the Festival. The Stratford box office will gladly inform you as to the exact dates.

If you can work your schedule out, try and stay for "Comedy of Errors," "Troilus and Cressida," or "Cyrano" also. As always the four presentations at Stratford rate an "excellent" from old Wally. You can't go wrong at Stratford.

Next week I'll inform you on the Minnesota Theater company and what they are doing to bring back theater on a regional basis. Many of the Stratford people have merely transferred their attention from Ontario to Minnesota. Douglas Campbell (Assistant Artistic Director), Tanya Moiseiwitsh (Designer), and Tyrone Guthrie form the artistic trio that defected from the East to the new theatrical oasis in the Wes.

The Wayne State University Theatre announces that it has renamed its theatre at 3424 Woodward the Bonstelle Theatre. Starting with the 1963-64 play season, the theatre will be known again by the name of the woman who made the building a historic landmark of the American theatre.

In this theatre, the University has followed a production plan similar to the one used by Miss Bonstelle. It annually presents a subscription series of both classic and modern plays. The 1963-64 series opens with "Purlie Victorious," Ossie Davis' recent Broadway comedy success, with performances October 4, 5 and 10 through 13. This will be followed by Moliere's classic comedy, "The Imaginary Invalid," two modern continental plays: Ugo Betti's "The Queen and the Rebels" and Samuel Beckett's "Walting for Godot," "Summer and Smoke" by American dramatist Tennessee Williams and finally G. B. Shaw's "Caesar and Cleopatra."

Legal Aid Bureau attorneys point with pride to 172 families reconciled without court action as a result of their advice. Another 307, however, were taken into court for settlement Information was secured in 1,257 additional cases.

No practical legal remedy

brought before the bureau. These included that of a mother of nine children who wanted to divorce the father of her first two children and marry her present commonlaw husband. She hadn't the faintest idea where her first husband was, nor whether he had divorced her.

The Legal Aid Bureau was set up by the Detroit Bar Association in 1908 with the idea of placing the benefits of the law at the disposal of the poor as well as the rich. At first it was' supported by members of the legal profession. For many years its budget has been included in those supported by contributions to a common fund. Currently, Legal Aid is operating on an allocation of Torch Drive funds.
