

SC District Residents Get News of Admission Procedures

Each of the approximately 40,000 families in the North-west Wayne County College District will receive a communication this week from the college giving important information concerning admission.

Although Schoolcraft College will not hold its first classes until Aug. 31, 1964, those interested in attending either part-time or full-time will want to read this booklet carefully.

It is the hope of the board of trustees and the college officials that no one will be de-

prived of admission to the college because he does not understand the necessity of early application and the admission procedures.

In the brochure details will be given on how, where and when to secure application blanks and all curricula which will be available.

Seniors attending high schools of the College District will receive information and applications through the high schools. Seniors attending other high schools and those resi-

dents not in school, whether interested in full or part-time programs will find the pamphlet particularly helpful.

If through a mailing error any resident should fail to receive this folder by Oct. 10, he may secure one by calling Schoolcraft College.

James Dotseth, assistant dean in charge of technical education at Schoolcraft College, met with the industrial technical consulting committee recently to discuss further the development of the college

training program.

The committee, composed of approximately 25 personnel directors and others interested in technical programs and employment problems in the community, made an analysis of proposed technical curricula for the college.

The question of apprenticeship courses also was explored. Plans were made for the formation of three advisory committees in the areas of drafting, electronics and manufacturing processes.

Dotseth explained the need for continuing interest and support from industry and reported that approximately \$100,000 in equipment has been do-

nated to date. It also is hoped that a large number of scholarships and loan funds will be established to assist students preparing for employment.

Plans for further meetings of the industrial technical consulting committee will be developed under the leadership of Dotseth and the newly elected committee co-chairman, Lewis L. Knickerbocker, employment and personnel research department of Detroit Edison Company.

The present system, we might warn, has many defenders; particularly those who today hold assessing power and would be belligerently reluctant to release it to any "County Office of Assessment."

H.B. 21 has no easy pathway to passage in the Legislature. As one member of the House, I'd like to hear from the public on this specific, little-known plank within the Romney tax package.

'Y' Job Bureau Busy

"Busier than ever," is the way Mike Hoben, director of the Y.M.C.A. Young Adult Employment Bureau, describes the situation after a brief lull during the period when the start of the school term had the attention of the community.

A report of the four-months activity of the program shows that 327 between the ages of 16 and 34 enrolled and were interviewed for jobs.

Of this total, the Bureau had 203 in status to which 287 were sent for interviews by

the prospective employers. Many of the stations had openings for several employees.

The Bureau found work for 198 during the summer, 98 of which were permanent situations. It was unable to fill 67 posts for various reasons—perhaps the biggest one, lack of skilled applicants.

The report indicates Hoben handled a total of 387 interviews in the four-month period, most for employment but many for counsel on problems that developed as a result of high school dropouts.

"At the moment," Hoben said, "we still have many baby sitting situations open, some for evenings and some for in the home full time. We are still accepting applications for part-time work during the holiday season."

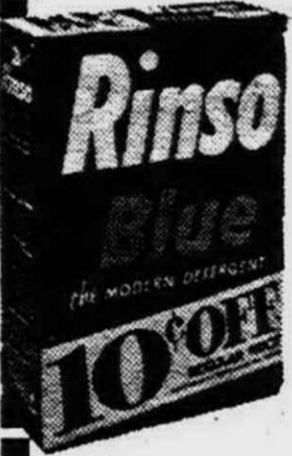

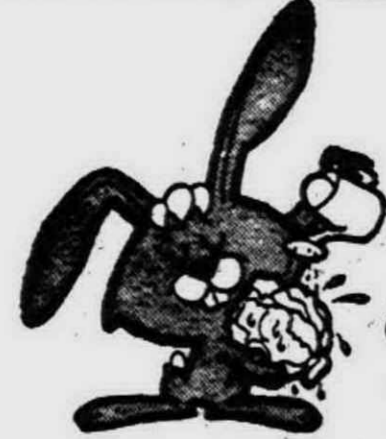

BEAT THURSTON FOR 1ST VICTORY

History at Franklin

Football history for Franklin High School!
It was achieved last Saturday afternoon when Franklin conquered Thurston, 7-0, in the first North West Suburban League game for both schools.

This was history in itself. But more important for Franklin, the conquest marked the first ever fashioned in a varsity grid contest by the south-side Livonia school.

A season ago, in its debut campaign on the interscholastic scene, Franklin lost seven and tied one. For 1963, prior to last Saturday's trek to Thurston, Franklin's record read one defeat and one tie.

"What else can you say, but wonderful," declared Jack Hudnut, who coached many a champion at Bentley High before moving to Franklin when the latter school's doors opened in

1962. "You could just sense the pressure mounting on our kids to win that first one," added Hudnut. "The kids were nervous and jittery. Actually, it's no different for collegiate or pro teams when they are struggling to end a long string in which they haven't won."

A 35-yard pass from Dennis Wagner to Sam Antonazzo in the second period produced the biggest touchdown Franklin has fashioned in football so far.

However, as far as Hudnut was concerned, the biggest orchiids belonged to Franklin's defense.

"I wouldn't want to single out one kid over another," he said. "I'm sure I'd miss somebody and that would be unfair."

"It was the best defensive work I've seen at Franklin in our two years there. I was reminded a lot of the fine jobs our teams used to turn in at Bentley."

For some time the Board of Education has been studying various plans for increased facilities to provide for the increasing number of pupils that will be attending Clarenceville Schools. It is anticipated that the number of additional pupils who will be enrolling in the next two school years will approximate 650. The plans that have been under study for several years take into consideration the satisfying of the urgent needs which will develop as a result of this increase. During the past several years Clarenceville has had approximately 375 youngsters enroll in kindergarten and approximately 100 pupils graduate from high school. Projections for the future indicate that the number in kindergarten in 1963-64 will be over 400 pupils. The same will be true in 1964-65.

Financially, the position of the district is sound. Both the 1952 and 1954 Debt Fund obligations were paid in full with the calling of bonds for payment during the 1962-63 fiscal year. The electorate on September 27, 1962 authorized additional bonding in the amount of \$1,500,000.00. This has been accomplished without an increase in the tax rate. The total tax rate in 1963-64 will be the same as in the last several years.

Study, research, and evaluations of existing programs must be continued to provide the greatest educational opportunities for children. By constant consideration of our changing society, we will endeavor to develop the type of program the electors of the district can and will provide for children. During the past several years, there had been under consideration a re-evaluation of the high school curriculum. As a result of the study, a number of changes were made at the high school level. There were increased subject offerings in many areas such as science, mathematics, social studies, industrial arts, and commercial. With increased requirements for graduation, and lengthened class periods, more pupil time was spent in classroom activities.

In 1963-64 a cooperative training program will start. This will involve various amounts of in-school-on-the-job training. It is anticipated that the curriculum additions, changes, and training programs will allow for a broadening of the educational experiences for high school pupils and provide a better program of instruction for the future.

Board of Education approval has been given to a program which it is hoped will provide for increasing of reading skills at all levels. Special attention is to be given in 1963-64 in the Junior and Senior High Schools. The staff have plans underway and will receive assistance from various outside consultants.

The Board of Education will continue its studies of future curriculum and building needs of the school district in order to continue providing for the potential increases in enrollment.
