# 20% of Plymouth Voters To Lose Rights... Unless

Unless they register again soon, approximately 18 percent of all the voters in this area are going to walk into the polls the next time and discover ineligible.

They can't vote if they haven't voted during the past

two years—they can't, this is, unless they register again. The next elections in most cases will be school finance elections soon after Jan. 1.

Clerks of the cities and townships hereabouts have been examining the voter records and

almost without exception they have been surprised the high percentage of those who have failed to appear at the polls within the past two years.

"We knew that there were some voters who showed up only for presidential elections," ob-

served City Clerk Richard Shafer of the City of Plymouth, "but frankly I never expected to have to pull the cords of 15 percent of the total registration file."

"We have thousands of new registrations from new resi-

dents," said city clerk Marie Clark of Livonia. "But we find a high percentage of 'inactive' voters among the old-timers who seem to make it to the polls only in Presidential years. They'll all be hearing from our office next month."

In Plymouth Township, Supervisor Roy Lindsay estimated that the "ineligibles" would number about 600 out of a total registration of 3,600.

What's causing the startling discovery is a law passed by the Michigan Legislature last Spring. Effective on Nov. 1, the new law declares:

"During the month of December in each year, the clerk shall examine the registration records and shall suspend the registration for all electors who have not voted, continued their registration, reinstated their

registration, or recorded a change of address on their registration within a period of two years."

The new bill was bitterly fought in the legislature in Lansing, being opposed by Democrats who insisted it was intended to make political life difficult for their party among the poor and less literate areas of interior Detroit. Republicans, who hold a majority in both houses, passed the bill on a vote which traveled along almost straight party lines.

Those whom the clerk finds in default of registration will receive a notice through the mails from the clerk. Enclosed will be a form which can be signed and returned. If it is not returned after 30 days, the names will be purged from the voter rolls.

## Campus Strip On Haggerty Goes for Road

The Board of Trustees of Schoolcraft College have decided to the County Road Commission 27 feet of College property along Haggerty Road, to make possible a 120-foot road for college traffic.

In return the Road Commission will widen the road but also provide necessary culverts to give suitable access to the College. Since this will be a heavily trafficked area, the Board of Trustees and the County Road Commission are making plans for satisfactory and safe driving conditions.

Registrar of the College Norman Dunn, reported that 395 applications had been received for full-time students and 52 for part-time students, making a total of 447 applications to date. The break-down from the various communities is as follows: Clarenceville, 19; Garden City, 129; Livonia, 199; Northville, 21; Plymouth, 57; non-resident, 22.

## SCHOOL BOARD RULES:

# All Sixth Graders in Junior High by Fall

A plan to enroll only sixth and seventh grade students in West Junior High while placing all eighth and ninth graders in East Junior High will permit "maximum use of classroom space," Plymouth Board of Education members told a group of parents who appeared at Monday's Board session to object to the plan.

"The elementary schools are full and overflowing," Board president Gerald C. Fischer told the parents. "But there is an excess of space in the junior high schools available."

"We can hold off building an elementary school and get by with 4.5 mills," Fischer said, "by using this plan."

Parents, however, criticized what they termed the "long bus rides" which sixth grade students had to take from their near-to-home elementary school building to the junior high.

"It wastes students' time," said one parent. "It makes them unhappy. I think we should consider the needs of the pupils when planning these things."

Next year, more than 445 sixth grade students will attend classes at West Junior High, Fischer said. "If we did not

adopt this plan," he said, "voters would be faced with a higher millage issue, or we might have to utilize bonding to build enough elementary school space for sixth graders, while junior high classrooms would lie vacant. This plan permits optimum use of the classrooms." He indicated the arrangement would be temporary—perhaps two years—until the boom in elementary school population levels off.

In other business, during a

skelter of parent complaints, Board members were asked why seventh graders were permitted to dance during lunch hours at the junior highs.

A principal told the Board meeting that the "closed campus" plan, whereby most students stayed in school during lunch hours, included lunch hour time for club meetings, for athletic activities, and other extra-curricular interests, including use of the library, and that dancing was only one small segment of the lunchtime program, optional for all.

Appointment of Daniel J. Hines of Plymouth to supervise construction of the \$25 million Rouge River Bridge in Detroit was announced today by State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie.

Mackie said Hines, 34, will be Assistant District Bridge Engineer in charge of construction of the span which is the highest, longest and most costly project ever built by the Highway Department.

The bridge will have eight traffic lanes, plus two refuge lanes, and will rise 100 feet over the Rouge River. With its approaches, it will be two miles long. The structure will connect I-75 and the Seaway Freeway near downtown Detroit.

Work will start on the sub-structures later this month. The bridge is expected to be completed in three years.

Hines has been transferred from Kalamazoo, where he was Assistant District Bridge Engineer for Southwestern Michigan. He will live in Livonia.

Hines is well equipped for his new assignment. He worked as a bridge construction engineer on the approaches to the Mackinac Bridge and was project engineer on the approaches to the new International Bridge at Sault Ste. Marie.

Hines has been employed by the Highway Department since his graduation from Wayne State University in 1951 with a degree in Civil Engineering.

He also worked for the Highway Department on a part-time basis during summer vacations while he attended the University.

He completed the Highway Department's 18-month engineering training program, assigned to various divisions and construction projects throughout the state.

His first permanent assignment was to Newberry on bridge construction projects in the eastern half of the Upper Peninsula.

He was assigned to work on the Mackinac Bridge in 1957 and in 1961 to the International Bridge.

Hines is a native of Plymouth. He and his wife, Janice, will live in Livonia during construction of the bridge.

Hines has been assigned four project engineers to help with supervision of construction and inspection work on the bridge. They include: Donald L. Kero, who also worked on the International Bridge; John R. Rice, Jose Sanchez and Norbert Totcke.

## 'Human Relations Assembly' Meets 1st Time Sunday

A newly-formed Plymouth Community Human Relations Assembly will hold its first open meeting in the cafeteria of the Senior High School Sunday, Nov. 17, at 8 p.m.

The Assembly is a citizen's group with community-wide representation, drawing its membership from both the City of Plymouth and Plymouth Township as well as neighboring areas. The stated objectives of the Assembly are as follows: "We believe that true freedom is possible in any community only when it is made available to all."

"Following the lead of the City Commission in its establishment of a Human Relations Commission for Plymouth, we resolve individually and collectively:

"1. To support the Human Relations Commission and its objectives as stated in the City Commission's resolution of Oct. 7, 1963.

"2. To be an active influ-

ence for peaceful and orderly solutions to local human relations problems.

"To collect and provide information relative to the basic issues involved in human relations.

"4. To commit ourselves openly by word and example to inter-racial harmony.

Working committees have been formed and, led by the respective chairmen, have made plans to work in the following areas: Housing, Richard McGinn; Information, Ray Maly; Business and Industry, Ann Blackman; Schools, Dick Braun; and Community Organizations (chairman to be named). Chairman of the Assembly is Norman Thoburn with Ann Spencer as secretary, Glenn Wilson as treasurer, and Kathleen Dodds as Publicity Chairman.

The public is invited to Sunday's meeting and to successive meetings which will be held on the second Sunday of each month.

## Plymouth Youth Programs, Facilities, Called Sufficient

If there is a deficiency in "activities for youth" in the Plymouth community, it comes from a shortage of volunteer leaders rather than from lack of physical facilities, a committee has concluded.

The Committee was appointed in connection with a bigger study regarding a proposed Plymouth Community Building, or "civic center building." Educators, churchmen and businessmen met together and Supt. of Schools Russell L. Isbister was commissioned to convey the summary of their findings.

Isbister this week issued a condensed set of "committee observations" which declared:

1. A wide variety of educational, cultural, recreational and religious programs is available to the children and youth of Plymouth.

2. Participation is relatively high in the age groups 9 through 15. The numbers of participants begin to taper off in the upper high school and post high school years.

3. Present facilities appear

to be adequate for programming this age group.

4. A shortage of volunteer leaders is evident in a number of organizations doing youth work.

5. A number of teen-agers is not identified with any of the existing programs. They float around in the community and for the most part identify themselves with unorganized and unchaperoned groups.

6. Most of all the organizations extend to the "non-joiners" a hearty welcome to become active in one or more of the existing programs.

7. Some overlap and duplication exists among the organizations and their respective programs.

# Grants To Ford "Sons"

Ford Motor Company Fund today announced its 14th competition for approximately 70 four-year college scholarships.

Benson Ford, president of the Fund, said that students eligible to apply for the scholarships are sons and daughters of Ford Motor Company, certain of its affiliated corporations, and the Fund. Step-children and children of deceased or retired employees are included.

Applicants must be graduated from high school between Sept. 1, 1963, and Aug. 31, 1964, and be in the upper one-third of the class scholastically. Completed applications will be accepted until Dec. 1, 1963.

Candidates for scholarships will take the College Entrance Examination Board's scholastic aptitude test in major cities on Jan. 11, 1964. Winners will be announced in the spring of 1964 following selection by the Ford Motor Company Scholarship Board composed of the presidents of nine universities.

"The winners will be those academic records and personal qualifications indicate to the Scholarship Board most clearly that they will benefit from college education and will develop into well-rounded adults, capable of constructive work and responsible citizenship," Mr. Ford said.

Since the scholarship program began in 1951, approximately 70 scholarships have been awarded by the Ford Fund each year. This fall, 262 winners are enrolled at 85 colleges and universities.

Scholarship recipients may attend any approved college or university in the United States. The award covers full tuition and up to 80 per cent of normal living costs, depending upon whether the student lives at home or resides on campus. To provide assistance to privately endowed colleges and universities, the Fund will contribute an annual grant of \$500 for each Ford Fund scholarship holder in attendance.

Ford Motor Company Fund is a non-profit corporation operated for charitable, educational and scientific purposes. It is supported by contributions from Ford Motor Company and is not related to the Ford Foundation.

## Evans Shows Device Aimed to Boost Load

Evans Products Company's exhibit in booth 541 of the Truck Body and Equipment Association convention in Cobo Hall, Nov. 11 through 13 will feature a new lightweight device designed to increase payload and reduce chance of damage in transit.

This lightweight device, known as Evans Truck DF equipment, is especially designed for use in trucks and trailers. It permits use of all the available space in the vehicle by providing for safe, stable double-decking. In some cases, the company reports, carriers have been able to double their load through use of the device.

The DF system consists of aluminum belt rails and crossmembers of aluminum or steel. These crossmembers prevent the load from shifting and becoming damaged in transit. In addition, they act as bearing members to support that portion of the load which is double decked.

Although the equipment is light in weight, Evans says that it is designed for heavy duty protection. It saves

space because the newly designed belt rails hug the body walls and, in use in lined bodies, can be installed flush with the walls. All component parts have smoothly rounded edges to protect the lading from cutting or puncturing.

DF systems have been specially designed for easy installation by truckers and fleet operators for highway or piggy-back service. The aluminum belt rails can be easily bolted or riveted to the interior walls of trucks or trailers and act to stiffen and reinforce the body.

Lightweight aluminum or steel crossmembers available in standard truck and trailer widths lock positively in place at one-inch intervals throughout the length of the vehicle to secure cargo.

One end of each crossmember telescopes to compensate for irregularities in inside width of truck or trailer and in addition accommodates for any body wall flexing in transit.

The truck DF device is a product of Evans' Transportation Equipment and Industrial Division located in Plymouth. The division has been manufacturing damage-prevention devices since 1915.

It also produces heating and ventilating systems for trucks; automotive stampings; and material handling racks. Through its Building Materials Division, Evans is also a major producer

and distributor of plywood, hardboard and related building products.

## Evans Names U of M Expert As Consultant

Appointment of Herbert H. Alvord, professor of mechanical engineering at the University of Michigan, to the engineering staff of Evans Products Company's Transportation Equipment and Industrial Division has been announced by John P. Moorhead, the division's director of transportation equipment engineering and patents.

Professor Alvord, whose specialty is mechanical design, will serve as a part time consulting engineer to the division in its research and development efforts in problems involving dynamic forces and stress analysis. The division's headquarters is at Plymouth.

Professor Alvord, who lives at 304 Sumac Lane, Ann Arbor, is a graduate of Michigan College of Mining & Technology, and has a Master of Science degree from the University of Michigan. He has been a staff member of the University of Michigan since 1947. He has served as a consultant with a number of industrial concerns, and recently returned from a two-year tour of duty in India where he was USAID guest professor at the University of Roorkee. Moorhead said that Professor Alvord had been added to the engineering staff as part of the division's plan to further its technical penetration in the railroad equipment field. Evans is the leading producer of damage-prevention equipment for use in railroad freight cars.

## PHS Seniors Eligible to Seek GM Scholarships

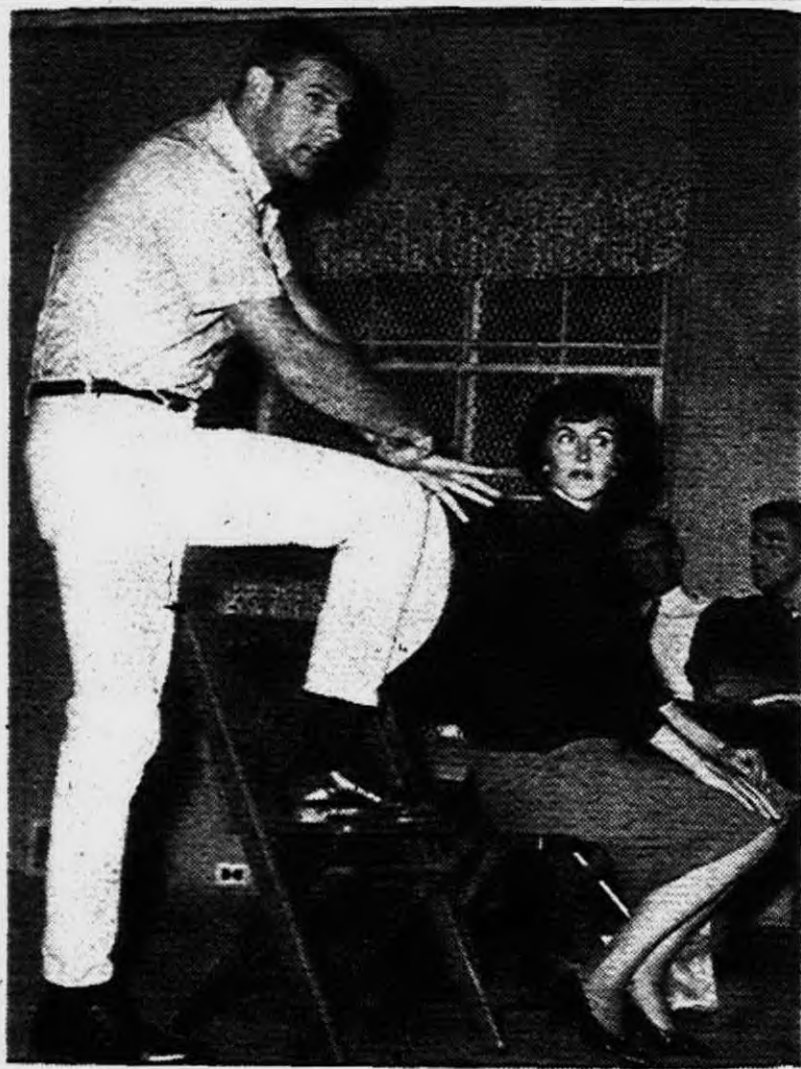

### 'Curtain Going Up'

"Now where is your truth?" Paul Sparer looks out at the audience, the corners of his mouth show the slight trace of a smile, his eyes dance with delight, and suddenly the theater is filled with sardonic laughter as the lights dim on a truly magnificent production of Pigrandello's "Right You Are (If You Think You Are!)" Sidney Walker, Joanna Roos, and Nancy March and provide a series of characterizations that mesh perfectly and give "Right You Are" a brilliant quality.

The Professional Theater Program of the University of Michigan can be more than proud that they have retained the services of the A.P.S. Repertory Company. "Right You Are" entered the repertory schedule last week and will now alternate with "Scapin" until Gorki's "Lower Depths" comes into the repertory late in November.

Mr. Stephen Porter, director of "Right You Are," moved his gossipping, gesticulating Italians around the stage so competently that their actions helped divert attention from the basic weirdness of the script. Pigrandello is never one to over-load a script with a great deal of action. Consequently, the director has to find ways in which to keep the audience responsive during the long speeches. Mr. Porter's bag of tricks is deep and devious. The munching of cookies, candy, and other goodies made old Wally hungry but it did provide a wonderful bit of stage business. Paul Sparer's mirror bit was a show stopper. If you have yet to see a Pigrandello play, make every effort to see this outstanding production as done by the A.P.A.

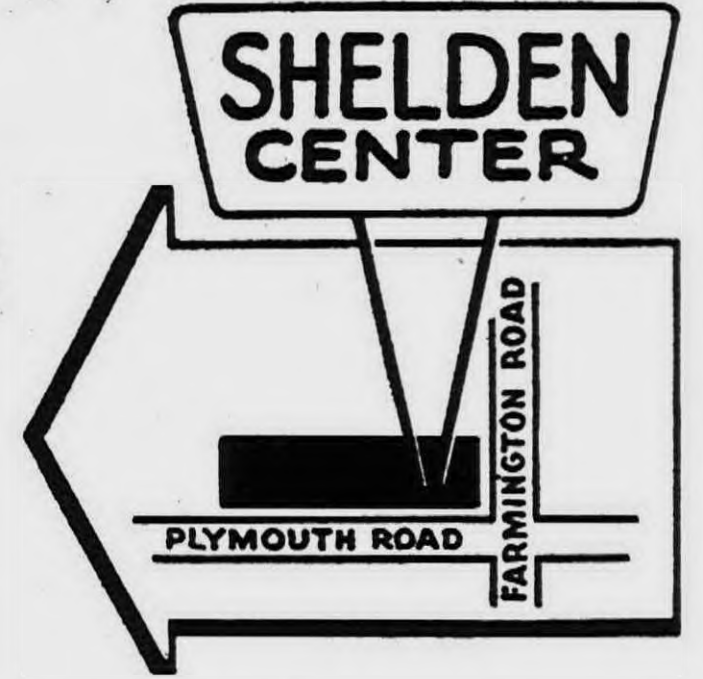

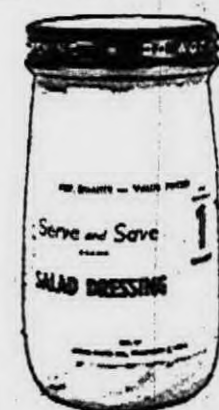

# Young Retires as Thurston Coach

There was no denying the Thurston High School football team in its final game of the 1963 season last Saturday afternoon.

And Thurston wasn't denied. The gentlemen from Redford Township's youth end high school were more determined than ever that they had to beat Riverside High, the champion in the Mid-Wayne League for 1963.

The reason for the determination in the hearts of every Thurston player was obvious—this was to be the last game for Head Coach Gordon Young.

Young had announced a pep rally just the day before that he was stepping down as Thurston's football coach. He had handed the job for ten years ... and in essence was the only mentor Thurston ever had

known. Joe Rzepka, now the South Redford assistant superintendent, actually coached a South Redford eleven for one year before Young came to the Township. But at the time, there was no Thurston High. Rzepka operated out of what is now the Fisher school.

To get back to Saturday's football meeting with Riverside, the final score read Thurston 34, Riverside 0.

This meant that Thurston had climaxed what had the ear marks of its most disastrous season in history by winning its final three games. In order, at the end, Oak Park, Redford Union and Riverside had fallen to the might of Thurston.

Earlier Thurston had won only one out of six. "What can you say about

these kids?" Young declared after the game. "They came from the bottom to the top, as far as I was concerned. And they learned so much ... which really is the most important thing of all ... more than winning games and championships."

The coach was especially grateful to the job turned in by his two assistants, Ron Lectka and Emil Majeski.

"They turned in masterful efforts," added Young.

What happens now to Young? "He'll remain as Thurston's athletic director. His successor won't be named for a while, according to school officials.

In Young's ten seasons, only twice did his teams fail to boast better than a .500 record. The '63 team was one of the exceptions, but the team's comeback

made it one of the best Young had handled. Riverside came to Thurston as the favorite. But once the game started, it was only a matter of minutes before all the fans could see that Thurston would dominate the proceedings in a big way.

The Thurston touchdown parade started when Paul Lawson, again a terror at quarterback with his passing, running and kicking, slipped across from the one on a sneak.

The score capped a march of some 60 yards in which Steve Dolan and Pete Marsalese had ripped away at the Riverside line and Lawson had fired a couple of neat passes to Bob (Skip) Kilnert.

Not too many minutes later, Thurston was on the scoreboard again. This time the result of

a fumble recovered by Mike Shaner.

Lawson again went across and from about two yards out.

Thurston kept on rolling. Next it was Pete Marsalese's turn to score. He zoomed in from around 25 yards out.

Dolan made it TD No. 4 on a dive up the middle after Thurston had recovered around 60 yards on the ground and through the air.

Shaner was the hero of the final TD. He picked up a blocked kick and dashed 50 yards to pay land.

Lawson booted four of the extra points. He also drilled his kickoffs so far and so deep that his coach described him "as another Lou Groza."

There were some defensive heroes, too, for Thurston. Players like Gary Nida, Jerry Szolstak, Dick Stefani and

Marsalese. When it was all over, many of the Thurston players wept. They hated to see their coach step out.

More than half the squad will return from '63.

The players gave the game ball to their coach. Each signed his name.

The gift will be something Young will treasure for many years to come.

Each time he looks at the ball, he'll have to say to himself:

"This was presented to me by a wonderful group of kids who refused to be knocked out. They came back—and they came back with road to make everybody proud of them."

It's just a shame the season couldn't have started in late October for Thurston.

# Franklin Impresses Although 12-7 Loser

Although the 1963 season ended with a defeat, for Franklin High School's football team, Coach Jack Hudnut talked with pride about his young men.

"These kids went down giving everything they had," said Hudnut after Franklin lost to Wayne, 12-7, last Friday night to end the campaign with a record of four wins, three defeats and two ties in their second year of operations.

"Our fellows were up against the best opponent we faced all season," added Hudnut.

"We gave a tremendous team effort, just as we did against Bentley in winning the previous Friday night. And we came close ... very close to pulling out another triumph."

Franklin had a first down on the Wayne 13-yard line midway through the final period. A Bill Black pass acme within inches of paying off. And when the ball dropped to the ground, Franklin's last hope had been killed.

But the more experienced Wayne team knew it had been through a vicious struggle.

Franklin bounced in front early. Starting from its own nine-yard line, the Livonians paraded all the way.

The first excitement came when Fullback Larry Yonish broke away on a 51-yard run. Then Black followed up with a 26-yard screen pass to Sam Antonazzo, who was chased out on the Wayne five.

Yonish then cracked for two and on the next play it was Antonazzo going over for the touchdown. Antonazzo booted the extra point and Franklin led, 7-0.

Late in the second quarter, Franklin appeared on its way again. The Livonia fans went wild when Ken Bratherton slipped away on a 25-yard run to the Wayne 33.

However, what Hudnut described as a "needle clip" nullified Bratherton's run. Franklin was pushed back to its own 35 and had to punt.

Less than two minutes remained before the intermission, but it was all the time ace passer Al Newman of Wayne needed.

He first uncorked a perfect strike to Ron Manshardt on the Franklin 15. Then, with only some four seconds showing on the clock, Ray Swegles caught another Newman pass in the end zone for the touchdown.

With the Wayne team missing the conversion try, Franklin carried a 7-6 lead to the locker room for the intermission rest.

To start the third quarter, Franklin kicked off. Wayne promptly took off and gained the lead when Ken Woodside broke loose on a 35-yard scoring run.

The running of Antonazzo and the passing of Black to Varty sparked Franklin's drive to the Wayne 13 in the fourth period. Here the Franklin attack stalled and never was to come back alive again for 1963.

But, when the action was over, Hudnut raved about the play of several of his students. Black and Varty drew bouquets. So did Antonazzo and Yonish ... also Jim Glynn, Len Buckingham, George Whitton, Bob Ekonen and Hugh Vaughn.

"The kids will look like big leaguers," he says. "That's a rather costly outfit from my pocket and I'm just wondering if somewhere in the area there isn't an enterprise which wouldn't like to take over the sponsorship of our team."

MacDonald points out that the older boys among the 40 now in training will form a team which will compete against teams from Wheatley, Tilbury and other Canadian cities near the border. The younger boys will stick closer to home and perform in a league which may be comprised of teams from Plymouth, Garden City, Nankin Township and Livonia.

What about the hundreds of other Livonia boys who would like to play hockey?

"Well, it looks like they'll just have to sit around and wait until it gets cold and the outdoor rinks freeze up," declares MacDonald. "Last year we had 400 boys playing in Livonia when there was ice available. If we should happen to have a warm winter, well, there won't be any hockey for most of our kids."

All of which offers more reasons why steps shouldn't be taken as soon as possible to make available an artificial ice rink. The benefactors would swell into the thousands, because boys and girls, mothers and fathers, and everybody else who likes to skate would get the chance to do so regularly ... and it wouldn't be necessary to wait for the weatherman to cooperate.

Maybe some hollering from those of you who are interested to the proper parties would help to speed the issue. This paper has pleaded for artificial rinks for some time. Patience can wear just a little thin ... you know.

# Plymouth Marshals Support for Millage Renewal Drive

Board of Education members, PTA presidents and school principals were marshaled for activity this week to help push Plymouth's November 25 school millage issue to victory.

The three groups met together Monday night during the regular Board of Education session to make plans for an extensive telephone campaign, canvassing at the polls and public appearances.

"The election is two weeks from tonight," Board President Gerald C. Fischer, told the assembled group. "Our concern is that there must be a recognition of the importance of this vote by the public. We want you to help us."

"We have to get across the idea that our school system depends on this renewal. Without it, schools can't plan our operating budget for next spring nor can we plan our building program for July."

His ideas were echoed by Superintendent of Schools Russell Isbister who, predicting a 25 to 40 per cent turnout at the polls, said, "The problem is one of apathy. Many people think the millage renewal can carry without their efforts."

Sought in the special election are eight mills for school purposes, all of them on renewal. Proposal one provides 3.5 mills for operation of schools over five years; proposal two provides for a 4.5 mill building and site sinking

fund for five years; and proposal three provides authority for short term borrowing against building and site monies enabling facilities to be constructed as needed. In other business, the Board accepted a transportation grant of \$98.33 from the Firemen's Association.

Perk Lid

If you want to put your signature on your home, which happens to be a row house, here's an idea. Set four or more posts of western red cedar along either side of the walkway and then build a perk shade screen above of 1x6 cedar boards spaced at six inch intervals. You can stain or paint the installation to add charm.

Rough Sawn Paneling Does Not Show Scuff & Kick Marks

Does your lively, growing family leave dents, scuff marks and evidence of boisterous energy on your home walls? Are you faced with the problem of constant repair, painting and redecorating?

Then, maybe Robert C. Douglas, Portland architect, has the answer to your problem.

"Use a durable wall," says Douglas, "which will not show the marks of the younger members of the family."

"I have decided," Douglas reports, "that the best possible wall for children's rooms, family rooms or play rooms, is a wall of rough sawn lumber. The rough texture absorbs most blows, knocks and kicks without showing a mark on the rough texture."

"Actually," he suggests, "you need very little maintenance on such a wall, once you have installed it. I generally apply a serviceable stain at time of installation and this seldom needs any further attention for several years, or unless the family wants a different color stain."

One thing you get in this durable, rough sawn wall texture, Douglas pointed out, is a charming elegance usually associated with very high priced construction. Actually, wood paneled walls, he said, are among the least expensive surfaces.

"I generally use either rough sawn western red cedar," he pointed out, "or rough sawn Douglas fir center matched panel boards for my walls. I like to use narrow widths generally six and eight inch wide because they form an interesting pattern."

Another feature of the rough sawn walls, he points out, is the ease with which storage cabinets can be concealed in the walls. This is very important in the modern family room where storage is needed to house all the indoor play gear of the present generation family.

Behind wood paneled walls can be hidden hi-fi equipment and record players as well as storage space for toys, games, books, projection machines and screens, Douglas observed.

Many homes today are designed for maximum outdoor living, the architect said, and a studied effort is made by the designer to tie the indoors and the outdoors together as often as possible. By using the rough sawn cedar and fir paneling, this tie between indoors and outdoors is developed to an intriguing degree.

Reader Speaks Up

This would be identical to a student trying to bluff his way through and assume he can teach a professor. Eventually this is found out, but in the mean time, much damage has been done! Is it any wonder that City employees' morale is at its lowest ebb in years? Wake up, old timers and new comers! Don't let this condition continue, or we'll have nothing but temporary political heads of our government. Mayor Moelke's idea of having a commissioner appointed by the Mayor, and then relieved of his duties at the "whim" of the Mayor, is a very poor foundation for good government, and this is a factual situation here in Livonia. Also to Mayor Moelke: It is not "conflict of interest" for you to sell top soil bonds through your private business office for removal of top soil, especially when you lead the public to believe that you are against top soil removal? It was also Mayor Moelke's "idea" to change the ruling for property owners of 40-ft. lots—refusing them the right to do as they wish with their property. And yet, each property owner must now go before the Zoning Board of Appeals, and pay a minimum of \$25.00, plus lawyer and court fees, to protect a right which is theirs in the first place!

## Consumers Increases Gas Supply

More natural gas to meet the future needs of outstate Michigan is provided through a contract announced today by Consumers Power Company and Trunkline Gas Company. The contract provides that natural gas deliveries to Consumers Power Company by Trunkline, a Transmission Pipeline Company with Headquarters in Houston, Texas, will be increased by 25,000,000 cubic feet per day April 1, 1964. Additional increases of 25,000,000 cubic feet per day will be made in 1964 and 1965. In 1966 and 1967 there will be further increases of 50,000,000 cubic feet in daily deliveries. By late 1967, daily deliveries will be increased to a total of 350,000,000 cubic feet. This will represent a 35 percent increase in the total amount of natural gas available for distribution by Consumers.
