# Student Shift To Ease Two Crowded Schools

High school "driver training" has become a standard feature of "education" throughout this area in recent years, without almost nobody apparently interested in questioning its value or analyzing the results since the program was launched.

Yet Facts and Opinions has encountered elsewhere an unusual amount of thoughtful criticism of "driver education" in recent weeks and would seriously urge that local parents and educators step into the subject right now and make conclusions of their own.

Much is involved. As a starting point, one can bring up the subject of money.

• Approximately \$50 is spent by the taxpayers of the local area, and of the State, for each student who takes "driver education" through the public schools. This same money applied elsewhere—say to raising teacher salaries—could avert some financial "emergencies" in Michigan education.

• One of the original arguments for driver education was that it would reduce car insurance rates. It has done no such thing; insurance rates for youthful drivers are at an all-time high, and more teenagers are driving.

• And despite the dollar cost, there is absolutely nothing in the bulk of accident statistics to indicate any improvement in safety.

One possible conclusion is that "driver education" has turned into one of those safe and sanitary ideas that sounds like virtue itself but really without much value and costing a lot of money.

It also has been another key link in the chain which has seen parents relinquishing what used to be family responsibility to public authority. Not everyone believes this trend has improved our American society.

Two publications are close at hand. In the September, 1963 "American Legion Magazine" is an article, "Is School Driver Education a Success? . . . Founder of High School Program Discovers Truth . . . An AAA Survey Showed Unexpected Accident Records to Accompany Teenage Driver Education." The author is Frank T. Tinker.

Appearing on the market also at this time is a full-length book, "The Highway Jungle" by Edward A. Tenney. The latter is an educator, currently professor emeritus at Indiana State College, who also has taught at Michigan State, Oberlin and Cornell. For seven years he was dean of the faculty at Ripon.

The Observer will publish a comprehensive review of this book in the near future, because of the extreme significance of the car-driving subject in our suburban area. Suffice it to say today that Facts and Opinions is persuaded by the book's statistics detailing the lack of safety progress and by the author's belief (which is also ours) that driving of a car should be authorized on a basis of maturity and not on classroom lectures.

Alone, or as the author reports . . . if a person is going to use a car as an expression of his ego, the chances are he is going to be a rather poor driver, and too many youngsters handle a car as an expression of immature ego . . .

Our own belief is that some youngsters are fully capable of the responsibilities of handling an automobile at age 15, and others not until 19, and some not at all, and that "driver education courses" are strictly beside the point.

Here are some thoughts offered by the magazine article:

"In Michigan it is claimed that 100 percent of all eligible students take driver training, and in the nation (Continued on Page 24)

In other holiday activity, the 30-voice Kenneth Jewel Choral and the Plymouth Symphony joined with four area choirs for a Christmas concert featuring the three-part Christmas Oratorio by Bach at Plymouth High School auditorium Sunday afternoon.

Plymouth stores will stay open evenings between now and Christmas.

## Christmas Religious Displays Set Up Too Early, Jaycees Say

Plymouth's Jaycees passed a resolution and circulated it through the area condemning the earliness of the date on which the Christmas religious displays were placed in Kellogg Park this year.

It said: "1. Whereas: The Plymouth Jaycees have, for a number of years, supported a policy

of keeping Christ in Christmas.

"2. Whereas: The City of Plymouth decorations, including the Manger Scene, were erected starting November 1, 1963.

"3. Whereas: We, the Plymouth Jaycees, strongly suggest to the City of Plymouth, that the display of Christmas decorations at such an early date

is in bad taste and not in the spirit of Christmas.

"4. Be it resolved, that we, the Plymouth Jaycees, suggest that these decorations not be placed in the park prior to Thanksgiving Day.

"Therefore we are submitting the prior resolution to you and pray that you will take appropriate action in the future."

## West Indies 'Port of Call' Saturday Eve

"The West Indies," second film in the Plymouth Lions Club Annual Travel Series, will be offered to the community on Saturday, Dec. 14 at 8 p.m. in the Junior High—East gymnasium.

Featuring brilliant color film and on-the-spot recorded musical backgrounds, the motion picture will take viewers to what is perhaps the most interesting and colorful area of the Western Hemisphere.

Tickets for the remaining five films are available from any Plymouth Lion at a reduced season ticket rate of \$4.25 for adults and \$2.50 for students. In addition, individual performance tickets may be purchased at the door for \$1.25 (adults) and 50 cents for students.

The West Indies, which was produced and will be narrated by James Metcalf, includes picturesque visits to Antigua, Martinique, Guadeloupe, St. Lucia, Grand Cayman, Barbados, Grenada, Tobago and Trinidad.

Strung out like pearls on a string of beads, the West Indian Islands stretch across the Caribbean in a huge semicircle. Starting with Jamaica, the necklace runs for four thousand miles and ends up in the curious "A.B.C." Islands of the Netherlands Antilles, Aruba, Bonaire and Curacao.

# 'Night High School' Is Successful

Plymouth School Board's initial venture into night school courses, with credit given towards high school graduation, finds students taking classes that will total to 44 half-credits at the end of the first semester.

That was the report of Night

School Principal Philip Johnson as he announced plans for registration for the second semester which will start the final week of January.

"We feel the first night school with credit has taken on well," said Johnson. "When one

considers that there was less than a month from the time the courses were announced until the classes started last fall.

"A great deal of the initial impetus for the first registrations came from the Youth Employment Service and Director

Mike Hoben who was in constant touch with high school dropouts and urged each and all to take as many of the night school courses as possible.

"The aim of the night school is to give all former high school students a chance to return and take definite steps towards getting the necessary credits for graduation and also to prepare dropouts for work situations."

Johnson pointed out that of the present enrollments, students will receive 10 credits in occupational shop, 20 in business training and 14 in occupational English.

"We think this is an excellent step in the right direction," he said. "But we still feel that we aren't reaching as many of the youths and young men as we should.

"For that reason we are adding courses in the second semester that we believe will be attractive to this group. We are planning a class in welding and another in woodworking along with the basic math and power mechanics courses in the occupational shop division."

The second semester classes will be held on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesday and Thursdays at the senior high beginning the last week in January.

The curriculum will include: Occupational shop — basic math, 20 hours; work mechanics, 20-hours and woodworking, 24 hours. The welding course may be substituted for any of the above. A student must take a combination of 64 hours work during the semester to receive high school credit.

In addition, school officials are thinking in terms of a full semester of drafting with a total of 64 hours work. This course will depend upon the interest shown at the time of registration.

The occupational English course will include classes in Business English, Speech II and related English for a total of 64 hours.

The business training course will offer business machines,

bookkeeping and typing for a total of 64 hours.

Johnson indicated the school is willing to offer a full semester course in either American History or American Government or both if enough registrations are secured. These classes would be taught by Wil-

liam Raisch and require a minimum of 10 students.

With registration already underway, Johnson anticipates an enrollment of more than 65 for the winter and spring term — almost 50 per cent more than the total for the initial venture last September.

# Christmas Cheer Depends on Being Careful About Fire, Chief Warns

Christmas can be merry for everyone this holiday season if ordinary care is taken to avoid fires, suburban citizens are reminded by their fire chiefs.

Americans during December will buy and decorate around 45 million natural Christmas trees cut from the nation's tree farms and forests.

The National Board of Fire Underwriters today asked that care be taken in erecting and decorating these trees. A tree contains natural resins which ignite easily and burn readily. If proper precautions are taken, however, fire may be avoided.

1. When you choose your Christmas tree this year, select one which appears freshly cut. Feel the needles to make sure they are firmly attached.
2. Keep the tree out of doors until just before Christmas. And keep it standing in a pail of water so that it will remain fresh.
3. Trees should not be set up close to stairways because in case of fire the stairway as an exit from upper floors would be blocked.
4. When you put the tree up, place it in the coolest part of the room. It should be as far as possible from radiators, heaters and as far away as possible from the fireplace. This will reduce the chances of fire, and keep the tree from drying.
5. Use a tree stand which has a water container in which the trunk can rest. Most trees "drink" water fairly fast, so fill the water container daily.
6. Christmas tree decorations should be flameproof. Use only decorations made of glass, metal or fire-resistant material.
7. Electric trains should be set up away from the tree. A spark from the train could ignite dry pine needles.
8. Use only electric lights to decorate the tree — never candles. Be sure to check lighting sets before placing them on the tree. Those with frayed wires should be discarded. When you buy a new set look for the UL tag or label of Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc.
9. When you open presents on Christmas morning, put away gift wrappings you intend to keep. Gather up other wrappings and throw them away immediately after presents are opened.
10. The lights on Christmas trees should be turned off when everyone is away from home.
11. Check the tree for dryness from time to time. If needles near lights have started to turn brown, change the position of the lights.
12. When the needles start falling, take the tree down immediately and discard it outdoors.
13. Even if the tree is still fresh, plan now to dismantle it the day after New Year's.
14. Make sure your decorative lighting does not overload electrical circuits.
15. Wiring and electrical equipment used out-of-doors should be designed for the purpose.

USE OFF-THE-TREE LIGHTING ON METAL TREES

If you are using a metal Christmas tree this year, the National Board of Fire Underwriters recommends that you use off-the-tree lighting with colored lights to give a softer and more beautiful illumination.

Placing strings of Christmas lights upon any metal tree sets up the possibility of electric shock if the cord becomes frayed or the interior of a light socket comes in contact with the tree.

Play it safe and use off-the-tree lighting with any metal tree.

### CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

Enclosed with the Newsletter from the First Baptist Church of Plymouth which we received last week was a folder entitled: "Christmas Service for the Home." As I was reading it I wondered about the various Christmas traditions that were carried on in Plymouth homes from year to year.

I called on my neighbors, Mr. and Mrs. Alan Scherer, who live in the former home of Miss Edna Allen on Arthur St. to learn if they celebrated Christmas with any particular German customs.

Mrs. Scherer (Edith) was born in Wiesbaden, Germany and has in the United States seven years. She told me they receive their gifts on Christmas Eve and always have roast goose with a good wine for their Christmas dinner. On Christmas Eve they always serve hot spiced wine, and even the children are allowed a small amount diluted with tea.

In Germany everyone, whether Protestant, Catholic or Jew, celebrate the Advent whereas in this country only the Lutherans observe the lighting of candles on the four Sundays preceding Christmas.

The Scherer's five-year old son, Walter, explained to me that last Sunday (Dec. 1) they had lighted one candle and tonight (Dec. 8) they would light two candles, three the next Sunday and four the Sunday before Christmas.

Mrs. Scherer said she really missed not being able to have real candles burning on their Christmas tree, as is still the custom in Germany.

Mrs. Scherer is employed in the office of the C. L. Finlan & Son Insurance Agency and has a background in insurance work, having operated an insurance agency with her father in Wiesbaden, where the family home overlooks the Rhine River.

Her husband, Al, a toolmaker, has made two trips to Germany with Edith and their son. He told me about the health spas for which Wiesbaden is so famous, where on the lower floor the steam baths are located and on the next floor a wonderful dining room where one gains back any weight he may have lost in the baths.

Edith is most proud of having become an American citizen last September.

## Plymouth Youth Job Bureau Adds To Area's Economy

Plymouth's Youth Employment Service, sponsored by the Y.M.C.A. with Mike Hoben, high school football coach and a member of the counseling staff as director, has made tremendous strides in its five months of operation with only 18 known failures in filling 263 jobs.

That was the report from Hoben in a recap of the Employment Service's activities since he took over the post last June.

The agency reached a high point a week ago when it received a request for 40 full-time women workers—for a 10-day period—from a Plymouth plant and managed to fill all situations within a span of 48 hours.

Hoben estimated the agency has added from \$7,000 to \$8,000 to the weekly payroll of the community for a total of between \$50,000 and \$90,000 in the five months.

The weekly average is expected to soar during the

next month with an anticipated demand for workers during the holiday season. The 40-women request was due directly to the Christmas rush.

The salaries have a wide range, going from 65 cents

# Post Office Extends Hours; Advises on Holiday Rush

The advent of December marked the start of one of the biggest races in town—the annual race against time at the

Livonia Post Office as its Christmas mail rush went into high gear. Postmaster Arthur G. Jenkins noted today.

New reports from Postmaster General John A. Gronouski in Washington to Mr. Jenkins indicate an anticipated nation-

wide record mail volume for this Christmas season of nearly 12 billion pieces during December. Locally, Postmaster Jen-

kins expects December's mail volume to total 8 1/4 million pieces, exceeding last December's total of 8 million pieces.

"Our 135 employees need public help to run this race against time—and patrons of the Livonia Post Office

can assist us by shopping and mailing right now and by using ZIP Code in both return and destination addresses."

commented Mr. Jenkins. The Post Office Department is getting together with Santa Claus this year to make sure that children who write to the North Pole get an answer from the best-known citizen up there. Postmaster Jenkins stated.

"Part of the Post Office efforts to encourage a wider use of ZIP coded addresses assures children that they will receive a message from Santa Claus if they write to him by December 15 at 'North Pole 99701', and use their own ZIP Codes in their return addresses," Mr. Jenkins explained.

The enlistment of Mr. Zip as Santa Claus' newest helper became a familiar fact to children everywhere on Thanksgiving Day when TV network viewers saw the familiar cartoon character in the traditional Macy's Christmas parade in New York City. Postmaster Jenkins pointed out.

"Actually, we in the Post Office have been Santa's biggest helper for many years, and I think it is very appropriate that we extend our lines of communication a little at Christmas for the youngsters."

Today, Americans send far more Christmas cards than citizens of any other nation. The greeting card industry has estimated 6 billion cards of all kinds are sent annually, and, of course, the bulk of them are at Christmas.

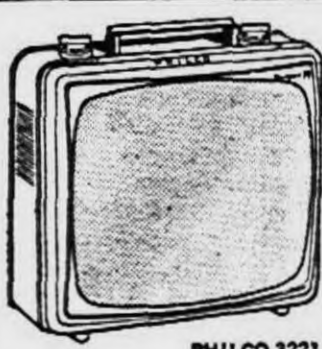

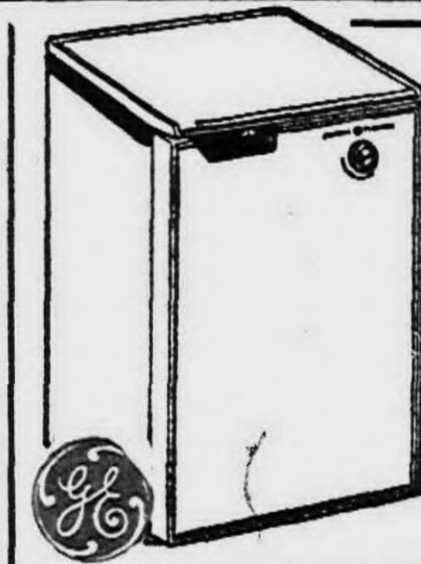

A happy start! That was the story last Friday night for the basketball teams of Bentley, Plymouth and Redford Union High Schools.

Now the three coaches and their supporters are hopeful that the story will be the same this Friday night when each team plunges into its bid for the 1963-64 Suburban Six League crown.

Here's the story, blow-by-blow for each of the area's Suburban Six League teams in last Friday night's action.

Coach George Fefles was very satisfied with the work of his cagers under pressure. "We still have to tighten up on our rebounding, but all in all I was very satisfied with the way the boys worked against Farmington," the coach declared.

A big third period turned the tide heavily in Bentley's favor. At the intermission, the Livonians clung to only a 30-27 edge. But in the third stanza, Mike O'Hara and Scott McIntyre helped Bentley to erupt with three quick baskets and by the time the quarter ended, Bentley had upped its advantage to 47-36.

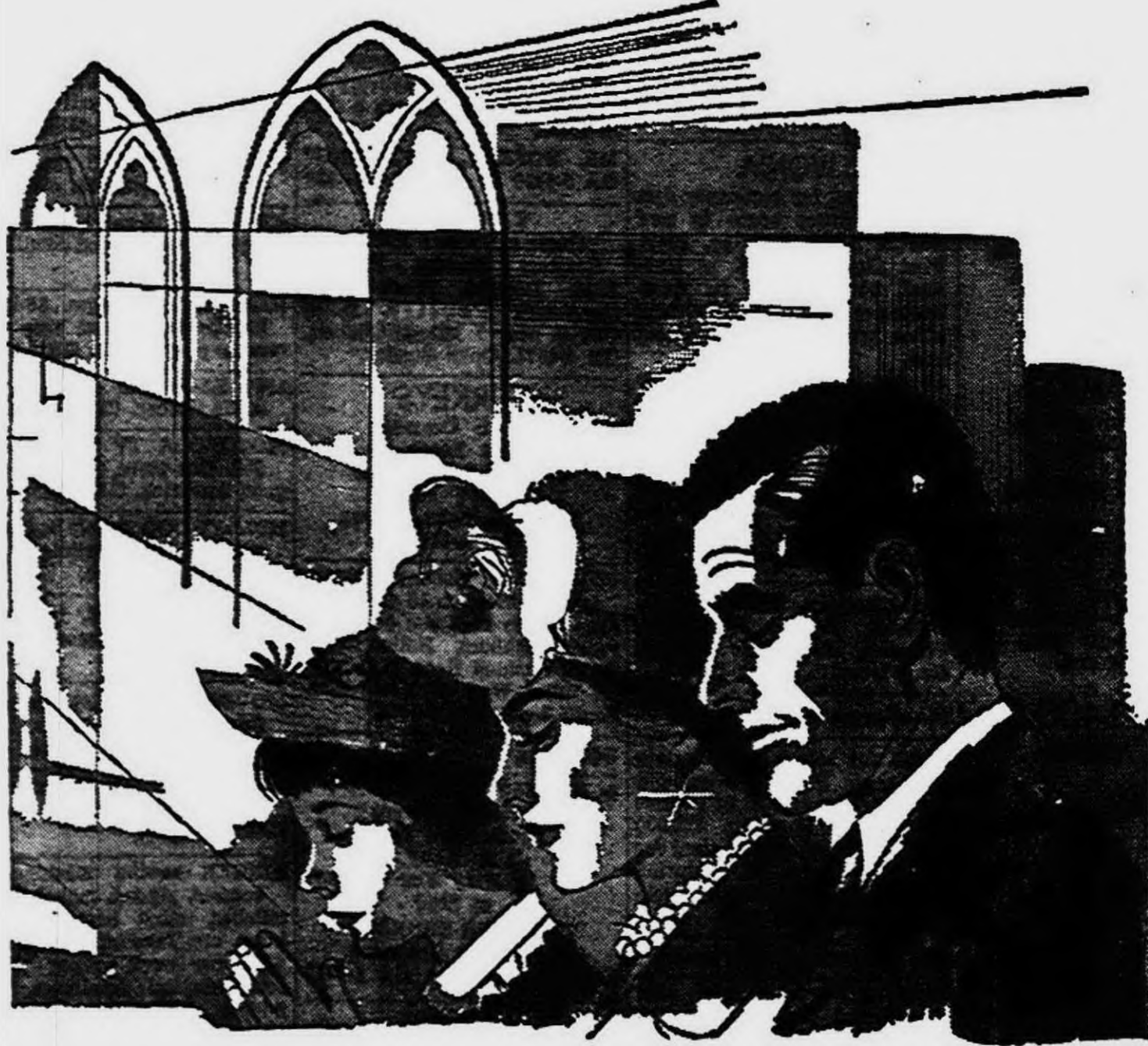

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE ERECTION, CONSTRUCTION, HEIGHT AND LOCATION OF ALL FENCES IN THE CITY OF LIVONIA
THE CITY OF LIVONIA ORDAINS:
ARTICLE I
TITLE, PURPOSE, CONSTRUCTION AND ENABLING AUTHORITY
Section 1.01. Title. This ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Fence Ordinance of the City of Livonia."
Section 1.02. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to promote and protect the public health, safety and welfare.
Section 1.03. Construction. This ordinance shall be liberally construed in such manner as to best effectuate its purpose. The provisions of this ordinance shall be construed, if possible, in such manner as to make such provisions compatible and consistent with the provisions of all existing and future zoning and other ordinances of the City of Livonia, and all amendments thereto; provided, however, that where any inconsistency or conflict cannot be avoided, then the most restrictive of such inconsistent or conflicting provisions shall control and prevail. The provisions of this ordinance shall be applied to all existing, outdoor swimming pools and other related recreational facilities.
Section 1.04. Enabling Authority. This ordinance is adopted pursuant to Section 3 of Act 297, Public Acts of Michigan, 1909, as amended; Section 1 of Chapter II, and Sections 11 and 26 of Chapter IX of the Charter of the City of Livonia.

ARTICLE II
FENCES
Section 2.01. Fences. The respective owners of adjacent residential lots or residential properties may construct and maintain partition fences between their own and the next adjoining residential lots or properties, in such manner and subject to the limitations stated in the following sections, all owners of lots and adjoining residential properties shall hereafter be or bordering upon streets and alleys.
Section 2.02. "Residential Properties" Defined. The term "residential lots" or "residential properties" as used in this article means property in the residential districts as shown on the Zoning Map of the City of Livonia which is actually developed and used for residential dwelling purposes.
Section 2.03. Residential Partition Fences; Types. All fences between residential properties shall be of the "cyclone" type where the adjoining property owners have mutually agreed to share the expense of such fence, except that such parties may by mutual consent agree to any other type of fence which is of safe construction which does not violate the provisions of this article. Where the entire cost of the fence is to be borne entirely by one owner, a fence other than the "cyclone" type may be constructed but it shall be built wholly upon the builder's property except with the consent of the adjoining property owner or owners it may be constructed on the dividing line. In no case, however, shall any fence violate any of the provisions of this article.
Section 2.04. Residential Partition Fences; Location. Fences which divide residential lots or properties shall be constructed on the dividing lot lines where the abutting property owners consent to its location or mutually agree to such location. Where one property owner builds a fence entirely at his own expense the fence shall be constructed wholly on the builder's property. In every case the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Livonia, as amended, shall be observed in the location of fences.
Section 2.05. General Conditions Regarding the Construction of Fences.
(a) Height. All fences constructed between residential properties shall be to a height above the average grade of the two (2) adjoining lots of not more than six (6) feet; provided, however, that no fence shall be constructed in any front yard except as may be specifically authorized by the Zoning Ordinance; the maximum height for fences in or around industrial or manufacturing areas and school properties shall be eight (8) feet above grade.
(b) Depth of Posts. All fences constructed or reconstructed within the limits of the City of Livonia shall be constructed on posts sunk at least three (3) feet below grade.
(c) Barbed Wire; Prohibited; Exception. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation or the lessee or agent to either construct or maintain a barbed wire fence, partially or wholly, between or abutting any residential properties, or in or along any street or in front of any public utility space, or to nail or cause to be nailed wire to be nailed or fastened in any form, shape, or manner upon such fences; provided, however, that barbed wire fences may be permitted around manufacturing plants where such property does not abut residential property and according to such rules and regulations as may be promulgated by the building official; provided, however, that notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, barbed wire fences may be placed on top of fences enclosing public utility installation in any zoning use district, which fences shall be constructed to a height of not more than eight (8) feet nor less than six (6) feet.

ARTICLE III
ADMINISTRATION
Section 3.01. Enforcement. The enforcement of this ordinance is hereby delegated to the Building Official.
ARTICLE IV
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
Section 4.01. Penalty. Any violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.
Section 4.02. Repeal. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this ordinance full force and effect.
Section 4.03. Severability. If any part or parts of this ordinance are for any reason held to be invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

8 million students now have undergone this training, and nearly a billion dollars would have been saved in accidents, if the original claims were correct . . . but this is certainly not reflected in the payments of insurance companies or the accident rates in the states covered.

" . . . those states which had the highest percentage of enrollment in driving courses also had the highest percentage of teen-age accidents . . .

" . . . in Utah, which was one of the high-education states selected, the local director of the AAA was criticized by Salt Lake City's education directors, apparently for even releasing the findings of his organization's survey. I'm sorry if it offends anyone," he said, "but we're only trying to get at the truth—and I think we have a right to. The fact is that something is very wrong with the program here. Before 1957 only a few students were enrolled in any kind of a driver class. Then we helped pass the law that added a dollar to each license fee and gave it to the schools for this purpose. Since that time we have had the highest percentage of eligible students taking the course of any state but Michigan—yet every year we also had the highest percentage of youth accidents!"

" . . . parents have already blamed schools for not delivering what was promised, schools blame traffic officials for not enforcing the laws, traffic officials complain that juvenile courts hand out unreasonably soft penalties, and the courts complete the circle of confusion by blaming parents for neglecting their responsibilities . . ."
