

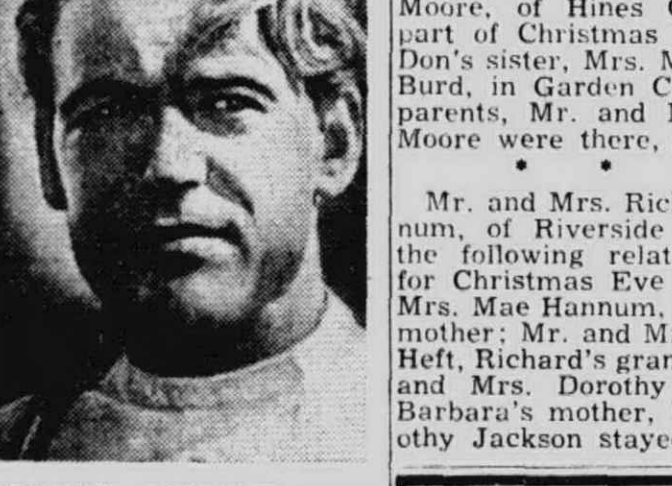

549 in Township To Lose Voting Rights Shortly

Some 549 voters in Plymouth Township stand to lose their voting rights — at least temporarily — if they don't notify Clerk John D. McEwen before Jan. 10. That was the indication from McEwen, who reported only 225 voters have returned their "re-registration" cards since the Township clerk sent them out Dec. 3. In all, there were 774 voters in Plymouth Township who had not voted in an election in the past two years. A new state law requires municipal clerks to "purge" these voters from the rolls if they don't re-register by means of special cards McEwen sent out last month.

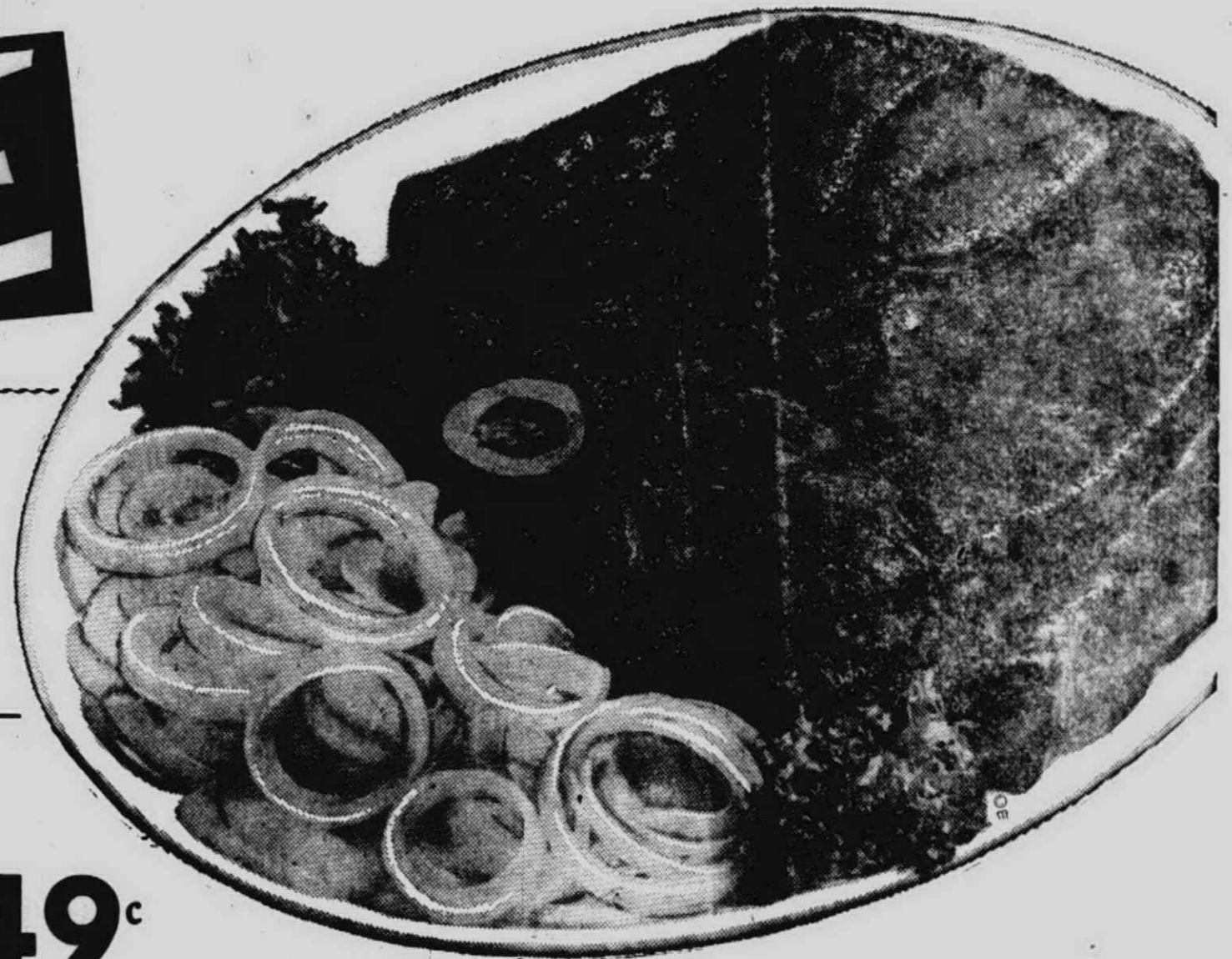
