Manager Government Growing

The council-manager form f local government continued its rapid growth in 1963 as 82 additional communities in the United States and Canada adopted the plan. This plan is now used by 1,954 communi-ties in North America and it is the most popular form of local government in American cities between 25,000 to 250,000 population.

Over one-half of all American cities in this population group are council-manager cities, according to the "1964 Directory of Council-Manager soon to be published by the International City Managers' Association.

Leading the states with additions to the Council-Manager Directory in 1963 was California with 16 communi ties followed by Pennsylvania with 12. Nine communities were added in Michigan, and four cities and one county in North Carolina. Five new council-manager communities were reported from Canada.

Among the larger councilmanager communities added in 1963 are Huntington Beach. California (42,300); Westmin-ster, California (40,500); Enfield, Connecticut (31,464) Wayne Co., Georgia (18,000); and Alma, Quebec, Canada Grand Island, Nebraska
