The word "Yoga" is probably one of the most misunderstood terms we hear today. Some think it is a religion, like Buddhism, or a philosophy, such as Hinduism. Others think it is a kind of magic, with snakecharming, fire-eating or sitting on a bed of nails. It is often confused with the term "Yogi" which means a disciple or teacher of Yoga.

Actually, it is none of these. Yoga is a science or method of good posture. physical, mental and spiritual development. It originated in here by JoAnn, is one of the India 6.000 years ago, accord-

ing to German Professor Max Mueller. It was first put in written form in 200 B.C. by Patanjali, called the Father of

There are Ten Yamas in the science of Yoga, similar to the Ten Commandments of the Christian religion. This one, I think, is very apt for our times - "Cleanse your heart of malice and cherish no hatred, not even against your enemies, but embrace all living beings with kind-

Yoga has several branches or divisions. The Raja Yoga (Royal Yoga) is the highest form and deals with the consciousness. The Hatha Yoga, which now for the first time is being taught in Plymouth through the Adult Education Program, is the Yoga of physical well-being.

This class, which started in late January, is a 10-week course taught by Ruth Gill. It meets each Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. in the Gallimore School Gym. It has an enrollment of 12, ranging in age from 21 to 50-



Wiebeck Breaks More Records

It's not without reason they are calling Thurston High School's Ken Wiebeck the greatest prep swimmer ever to perform in the state of Michigan.

His three-year achievement as a varsity performer for Thurston reads like a storybook. No Michigan schoolboy swimmer ever has matched his accomplishments - or likely will in the future.

This was what the 18-yearold Wiebeck did:

As a sophomore he won two state Class A events and set Michigan records in each. He duplicated the same thing Saturday night at the University of Michigan as he ended his prep career in a blaze of glory. What's more, young Mr.

Wiebeck currently holds four of the state's individual Class A records - a 22.1second clecking in the 50yard freestyle, a 49.3-second time in the 100-yard free; a 2:03.8 in the individual medley and a 55.6-second in the backstroke.

This, too, is a FIRST as far as Michigan prep swimmer is concerned.

All the experts watching the state championships pulled out all superlatives in talking about Wiebeck after he captured the individual medley and back stroke races in record times last Saturday evening.

"There's no question . . . he's the greatest," said Joe Mracna, the Thurston coach. What's ahead now for Wie-

At the moment, he's think-

ing about the National AAU meet at Bartlesville, Okla., in two weeks. But, there are other major

items confronting Wiebeck.
There's the bid he'll make to land on the U.S. Olympic team. Next, Wiebeck must decide where he will attend

According to Coach Mracna, Wiebeck can write his own ticket on where to attend college.

"Ken has heard from schools all over the country," says Mracna. "Naturally, Michigan and Michigan State want him. So do the Military and Naval academies, Wisconsin, Washington and other

As for the Olympics, Mraena figures Wiebeck has a good chance to make the team.

"Ken now can specialize in one or two events," added his coach, "I'd say his best bet would be the backstroke." Getting back to last Satur-
