ment heads and principals the curriculum for both junior and senior high schools.
4. Assume responsibility, with the advice of the principals, for recommending to the Superintendent and, or the Assistant Superintendent for Business

Affairs the purchase of instructional supplies, equipment, textbooks and other instructional materials to be used in the secondary schools.

5. Promote research projects which will lead to instructional improvement.
6. Keep abreast of new developments in secondary education and recommend local adaptations of the successful ones.
7. Recommend to the Superintendent with the advice of

the principals the appointment and assignment of teachers in the secondary schools.
8. Provide leadership in establishing in-service programs for secondary school teachers.

9. Promote and establish parent organizations and, or advisory groups in the secondary schools.
10. Assist the Superintendent in establishing liaison relationships with organized Community groups and in developing the community relations program.

11. Attend regular and special meetings of the Board of Education upon the request of the Superintendent.

As in April, the vaccine will be given in sugar cubes. It's pleasant tasting and children take it easily. A donation of 50 cents per dose is requested, but no one will be turned away for lack of funds.

The vaccine stations in Plymouth will be the same as on April 10 in the six elementary schools.

The stations will open at 11 a.m. and remain open until 4 p.m. or until all have taken care of that are still in line at that time.

Plymouth officials were amazed at the turnout in the first drive when a total of 14,565 received sugar cubes.

the school board. There isn't anything about this proposed offer that meets with our approval and we want to go on record as opposing it.

“Board members have told us more than once that they wish to maintain a competitive stand with other school systems in the area in order to hold employees. We say this proposal is not competitive and that the Board should make further study.”

President Gerald Fischer informed the group that the Board has a strong feeling for the contributions made to the school system by the maintenance men. We feel that we have always tried to make a wage proposal on a competitive basis.”

“However,” he said, “We are a bit disturbed by the feeling expressed here that we are not competitive with neighboring communities. You must understand that the Plymouth system is not a leader in the total financial picture, we aren't that big, but it has never been our intent to ask for more work with less pay as has been charged here.”

After considerable discussion, pro and con, Utter and Board Member John MacLaren recommended that the salary matter be tabled pending further study—that study to be made as early as Wednesday night in a committee of the whole meeting.

The administration was instructed to come up with as many area comparisons as possible so that the Board can sit down and evaluate the entire salary picture for all non-classified employees and make recommendations accordingly.

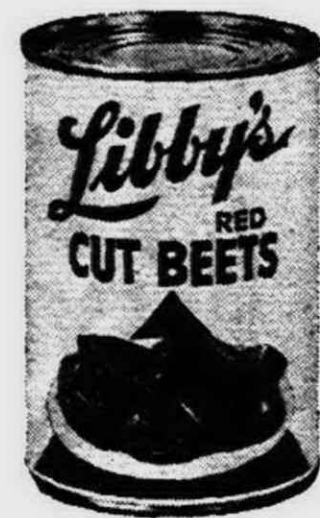

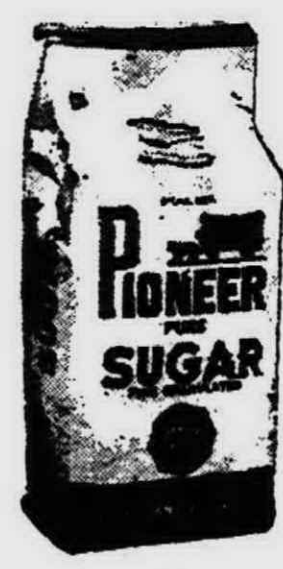

Mich. Bell Starts 1/2 Million Expansion

An expansion project on its telephone exchange building in Livonia to cost more than a half million dollars was started Monday by the Michigan Bell Telephone Co.

Work began on enlarging the telephone building at 11770 Merriman Road with a 20-by-82-foot addition. The new portion will house added switching equipment to meet telephone demand in the city, and the total cost of the enlargement represents an expenditure of

about \$600,000, according to Hazen J. Wilson, manager here for Michigan Bell.

Wilson said the added central office equipment will provide about 3,500 more lines to serve new customers in Livonia.

The building addition, which is scheduled for completion early next year, is the second required by growth since the original structure was completed in 1954. Michigan Bell

added a service wing in 1961, providing a new two-story area measuring 40 by 76 feet.

The new portion will be added to the rear of the present two-story building, and will be of matching brick veneer exterior. Smith Hinckman & Grylls Associates, Inc., of Detroit, furnished the architectural design.

General contractor on the project is the James & Savage Corp., of Detroit.

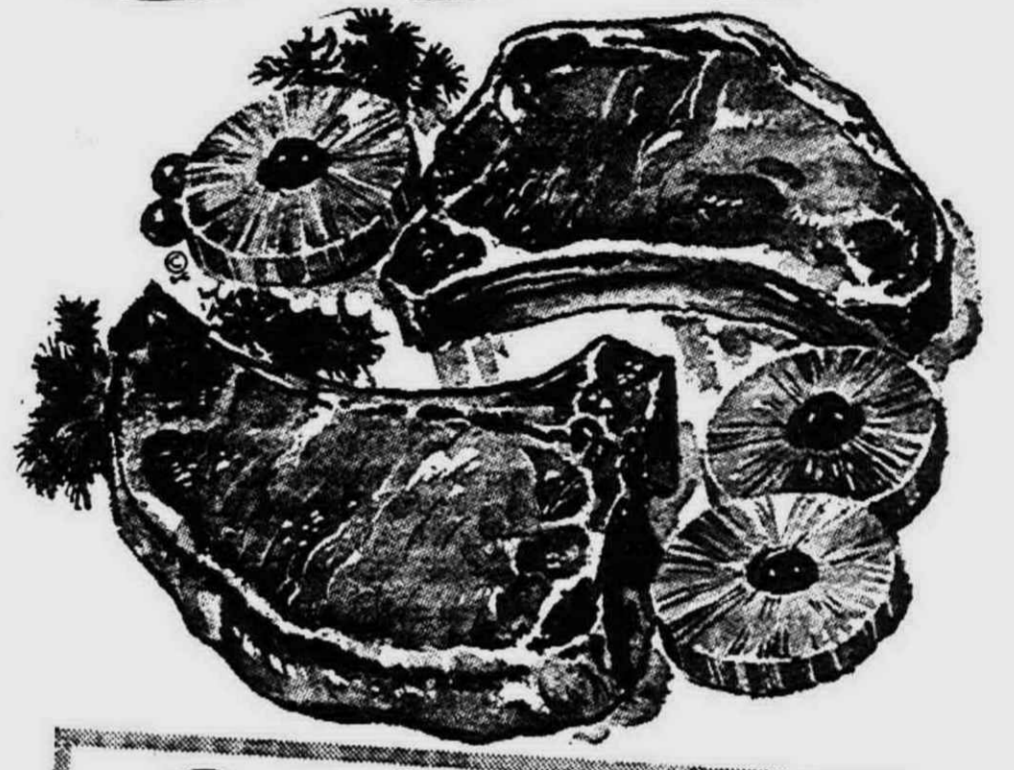
