2 College Vote **Bills Conflict**

A Senate bill proposing at-large trustee elections for Schoolcraft College and a House bill giving community college districts a choice in having at-large or district elections were both reported out of committees last week.

Sen. Carl Pursell's (R-Plymouth) bill calling for at-large elections was narrowly reported out of the Senate Education Committee Thursday by a 3-2 vote. Co-sponsor Sen. William Faust (D-Westland)' opposed it until possible amendments to the bill could be investigated.

Rep. Marvin Stempien(D-Livonia)won a compromise on his bill calling for trustee elections from single-member districts. The Stempien bill would affect nearly all community colleges in the state, including Oakland Community College. The House Committee on Colleges and Universities unanimously backed the compromise version, which would give each of the 20 college districts the option to have at-large or district elections.

Addition For Ward Starts Despite Protest

Despite a protesting voice from inner city Detroit, work is underway on construction that will make Ward United Presbyterian Church the largest in Livonia and the denomination's largest in the metropolitan area.

The church will make it official with a groundbreaking scheduled at 12:30 p.m. Sunday, May 16.

The \$850,000 addition to the church at Farmington Road and Six Mile - designed to provide a sanctuary that seats 1,000 worshipers and 80 choir members -- was subject of controversy in the Detroit Presbytery meeting in March.

Dr. Bartlett L. Hess, Ward's senior minister, said that there were motions from Dr. Horace L. Thomas, pastor of the inner-city Woodward Avenue Presbyterian Church, that the Livonia church's request for a loan of \$1,100,000 be denied or delayed. The moves were voted down 3-1.

"HIS POINT was that money of that amount should not be invested in church buildings, but rather used for the poor and to finance social action programs," Dr. Hess

He added that the minister, whose church numbers 456 members, had told the Presbytery that "if we needed more facilities, we should rent a hall or have several services on Sunday."



Trade Is Ecological

About 250 seedling trees for some 10,000 glass containers for recycling made a good trade, members of the Church of the Holy Spirit Episcopal Church in Westland decided after a day of collecting May

The church had offered a seedling - blue spruce or autumn olive - for a bag of bottles to be taken to Livonia's glass collection center.

About 250 people came to the church, located at 34645 Cowan, to make the trade, and it took three trucks to cart off the bottles they brought.

THE REV. JACK SAVAGE, pastor of the church, said about 35 members participated, and there was enough interest shown by other churches in the area to indicated a follow-up effort in the fall -- perhapse an ecumenical one.

"The ecological issue," Fr. Savage said of the church's project, "is one of the most important issues facing our society, and indeed the world, today.

"It's not the only pressing problem, to be sure, and we as Christians and as a society must not dwell solely on one issue to the exclusion of others.

"NEVERTHELESS, good ecological practices can and should begin at the individual and family levels. We as individual Christians cannot profess to love our Lord God without at the same time loving our neighbors and the creation in which He has placed us.

"So our project is an effort in a small way to serve the community in which we are located by bringing before it our concern for God's creation."







Can Drugs Aid Your Driving?

Questions should be sent to the Community Commission on Drug Abuse, P.O. Box Drugs, Livonia, Mich. 48151.

Q. In one of your columns you talked about the possible dangers of driving under the influence of drugs. But isn't it true that some drugs like dexedrine help to keep you alert and make you drive S.R., Westland

A. Dexedrine and other amphetamines (known variously as "uppers," speed, crystal, meth, etc.) are well recognized for their ability to keep one awake. However, they scarcely qualify as driver aids. To the contrary. A study was done in Toronto in 1969 on the crash rates per 10,000 miles of drug users:

"The psychoactive drug abusers had accident rates about twice as high as expected for their age, sex, and driving exposure. Most of the excess was contributed by those addicted to amphetamines (alone or in combination).

"(Amphetamine users) often claimed to have used amphetamines prior to their accident. Large doses of amphetamines may ...create irritability, impatience and aggressiveness, together with delusions of persecutions and hallucinations. Of course, any of these effects could make the

The authors of this article depressant drugs and marijuana are apt to become AMONG OTHER projects inactive and just sit around,

> One should remember also that use of stimulants such as indication of rebelliousness or aggressiveness that can also dangerously. There may be underlying psychological causes that compel both the use of drugs and reckless

> In any event, it's becoming more and more clear that "speed" and driving are a dangerous combination in more than one sense.

Q. I heard from a very good source that I could get treated by a doctor for a drug problem without my parents finding out. So far I've called three different doctors and none of them will handle my case. What's the deal?

M.M., Livonia

A. What the law says (and we'll go into the details in a later column) is that if you as a minor so request, a physician may treat you for a drug problem and not advise your parents. What the law does not say is that any physician must accept you on
