



Only one upcoming fete on Plymouth's social Plymouth Township for a calendar looms as having enough self - entertaining characters present to make political chatter on the sidelines unnecessary. 





For this soda bread, one uses 4 cups of sifted flour. 1 tsp. salt, 1 tsp. sugar, 1 tsp. baking sods, and enough buttermilk to make a fairly firm but not dry dough.
