# candidates file in school board race

Nine people, including two incumbents, two fundamentalists, a former school trustee and a former private investigator are seeking seats on the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Monday was filing deadline for the June 8 election, in which two four-year terms will

Candidates have until today to withdraw. Plymouth-Canton voters also may be asked to decide on a ballot issue to authorize the distict's full operating levy - a proposal defeated in February.

School board members Roland Thomas and Dean Swartzwelter are seeking their third and second full terms, respectively.

THOMAS, in business planning at Ford Motor, said he is "going to invest whatever is necessary to win, particularly in time and

"I think we have something good going, and I'd like to see it continue," said the Plymouth resident.

SWARTZWELTER, 52, a finance manager for Ford Motor, is running again because "there are several things that need to be completed that were started in the last 21/2 years.

The district recently has been bombarded with complaints filed by resident Diane Daskalakis. Daskalakis, formerly an unsuccessful school board candidate, objects to instructors' use of R-rated films and materials dealing with witchcraft and the occult.

Swartzwelter, also a Plymouth resident, says the issue can be resolved by allowing parents to decide whether their children should be exposed to controversial subject

The trustee wants "to continue the communication I think we've had with the public, administration and staff" and "to continue to have good working relationships with all employee groups.

Improving test scores and keeping buildings in good condition are other Swartzwelter priorities.

The trustee has two daughters who graduated from Plymouth Canton High School and a son attending Canton.

THE CANDIDACIES of Canton residents Mary Dahn and Robert E. Anderson are being backed by Daskalakis and Citizens for Better Education.

The 1,000-member, pro-Christian group was founded by Daskalakis and seeks to upgrade district curricula.

"Bob Anderson and Mary Dahn will represent the same goals as CBE. I will be assisting them financially to whatever extent is necessary," said Daskalakis, a local mer-

Dahn is running because "I want to make sure that citizens that graduate, in addition to intellectual competence, also have the

moral standards of our forefathers," she

A part-time manufacturer's representative for an automotive supplier, Dahn is the

mother of four school-age children. She ran unsuccessfully on the Republican ticket for the Wayne State University Board

of Governors last year. Saying the pledge of allegiance should be

# Skateboarding out in downtown area

Youngsters caught skateboarding or rollerskating in Plymouth's central business district - now illegal activities - can be dealt with in several ways, said Police Chief Richard

Children younger than 17 can be ticketed and referred to Wayne County Juvenile Court. Those 17 and older can be ticketed and referred to 35th District Court.

A fine ranging from \$10 to \$100 is in effect for those convicted.

Police also will look at diverting some offenders into Growth Works, a youth counseling program, Myers

"I'D ANTICIPATE regardless of whether or not a ticket is issued, we will confiscate many skateboards," Myers said. "That results in parental involvement and that's the key to the program."

Parents must appear at the station to retrieve skateboards confiscated by police, the chief said.

The city commission Monday approved an outright ban on skateboarding and rollerskating on public sidewalks in an area roughly bounded by Church, Wing, Harvey and Union streets.

Concerns about the safety of pedestrians, motorists and skateboarders prompted the measure.

The ordinance also requires prior written permission to skateboard or rollerskate on private property. That provision would tend to keep kids out of business parking lots.

The ordinance takes effect imme-

Karl Gansler was the only commissioner to vote against the measure. "Are children in Plymouth allowed to do anything?" he asked during a pre-meeting discussion of the

"IT LOOKS like we're picking on kids but this should have been done a long time ago when problems didn't exist so severely," said city manager Henry Graper.

The first big test of the ordinance probably will arise the week of April 19, Easter break for the schools.


"We'll do the best job we can to enforce the ordinance," Myers said. "It's just going to be part of the

"I don't know why it is. Is it because of the auto industry here or what? The schools don't touch on it pearly enough.

"I taught high school boys. It was a shame. They didn't want anything to do with it. It was too late in their life."

Koliba is delighted by the curiousity of youngsters age 6 to 10 when she gives demonstrations during Art-inthe-Park shows.

"They're so interested. They stand there and ask questions. Their parents are embarrassed. They say don't bother me. I say I want them to bother me.'

KOLIBA WORKS with watercolors and oils and specializes in animals and flowers. That interest in nature was sparked when she accompanied her husband into the fields during deer hunting season with a camera.

The Three Cities Art Club, at least 30 years old, was the first organization Koliba joined when she moved here a dozen years ago.

The three cities originally referred to were Livonia, Plymouth and Northville. Most members, seasoned painters, now live in the Plymouth-Canton community.

# Part-time cops talked

GRAPER SAID Monday he doesn't know yet how many parttimers would be hired immediately and exactly when they'd be scheduled if the union were to agree to the plan. "I could use 20."

Graper said he wouldn't recommend raising taxes to expand the police department. "I propose to handle this with the resources we have."

The department currently has 18 officers, all fulltime, 13 of whom are represented by the union. All union members except the ordinance officer work a 12-hour day, 84 hours

every two weeks.

The cycle is three days on, two days off, two days on, three days off, two days on and two days off.

Police this year plan to take a less confrontational stance initially in dealing with cruisers and young people congregating downtown, said Police Chief Richard Myers.

Putting more officers on the stre 't wouldn't necessarily prove to be more confrontational, Graper said.

"It depends on how you use them. Five or six policemen on foot on sidewalks isn't going to cause escalation. When you line up 30 across the street is when you get escalation."

Some 90 percent of Michigan homeowners would get \$100 rebates on their property taxes if Gov. James Blanchard gets his newest plan through the Legislature.

Some businesses, military personnel and Lottery winners would be asked to pay the \$200 million difference to the state treasury through "closing loopholes." Blanchard told a Monday news conference, adding:

"I am able to look them in the eye and say 'this is only fair.'

"Chances are much better now for passage, for three reasons," said the governor, whose similar 1985 proposal was passed in the Democraticrun House but stalled in the Republican-run Senate.

"First, this is not an election year. Second, the income tax rate (4.4 percent) is below what it was for years before I became governor (4.6 percent). Third, we've got the time to do tax. I frankly don't see a lot of relief

Blanchard's plan amounts to an expansion of the current program, under which households get an income tax rebate when their local property taxes exceed 3.5 percent of

Unlike rival property tax cut plans in both the House and Senate, Blanchard would not pay for the \$200 million in rebates through an increase in the voter-approved sales tax. Rather, the Democratic governor would close what he calls "loopholes," chiefly:

• On insurance companies -"domestic" (resident) insurance companies pay the single business tax but not a 2 percent tax on premiums that "foreign" companies pay. Estimated new revenue from taxing domestic premiums: \$55 million.

# Real estate values on rise

By Diane Gale staff writer

Used homes in Canton are selling for an average \$93,281 - a 25 percent increase from last year.

Last year at this time, the average selling price for used homes in Canton was \$74,556.

"I can't remember seeing anything like that," said Jerome A. Delaney, president of Western Wayne/ Oakland County Board of Realtors. Most good selling areas have shown increases ranging from 18 to 20 percent.

Average selling prices in surrounding communities are: city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township, \$113,189; Livonia, \$84,700; Farmington, \$118,256; West Bloomfield, \$151,000; Novi, \$109,800; and Northville, \$130,000.

"Different people are attracted to different communities for different reasons," Delaney said. "Twelve Oaks Mall has a different attraction than downtown Plymouth."

THE REASONS Delaney gives for the good selling market in Canton are:

- Homes are well kept and are in a good area.
  - Schools get high marks.
- · Shopping is available in nice surroundings.

· Canton is a family oriented community.

• There is easy access to Detroit, Ann Arbor, Metropolitan Airport and Southfield via I-275.

e Major streets recently have been paved.

BEYOND THE surroundings and statistics, Delaney says, the people in the community are a major at-

"It's a place to show homes that are occupied and introduce buyers, because of the people who make up the community. It's a delightful community and a young community," said Delaney, manager of Weir, Manuel, Snyder & Ranke Inc. Realtors in Plymouth.

"I characterize Canton as being an ideal example of Middle America," Delaney said. "It captures the best of the middle price ranges."

He added that Canton may not have a lot of doctors and judges living in its limits, but it has drawn a lot of management people and ex-

This year the average time it takes to sell a home in Canton is 29 days. On Tuesday Canton had 107 homes for sale.

Home listings are down 12 percent compared to April 1986.

"The number of available homes in Canton is very low, and the selection is limited for buyers," Dela-

But that means more money if you're selling a home.

"It's the old supply and demand law of economics. People are will-ing to pay more for homes because the availability is selected."

Plymouth and Plymouth Township also have an average 29-day selling period. In other top selling communities, Delaney said, the average selling time is 50 days.

Canton Sunflower, Mayfair Village, Windsor Park and Carriage Hills subdivisions and areas near the Centennial Education Park on Canton Center and Joy are the most popular areas, Delaney said. Parks are a major attraction.

IT HASN'T always been so good for Canton.

When the economy was suffering across the U.S. in the early 1980s, prices were "terribly low, and Canton suffered more than in other communities," Delaney said.

"Canton was growing very, very quickly at that time. Canton was caught in a period of over accelerated development.

"Now all the advantages and real attractions to Canton are paying off in terms of home values for people."

PRICE INCREASES now in evidence are similar to the market in 1978 and 1979, when yearly fluctuations rose 15 to 20 percent.

Delaney predicts the market will level off because mortgage interest rates are beginning to creep back

"I would be shocked if they went back down any further," Delaney said. "There's an insignificant in-crease in interest rates, but it's yet to be seen whether it indicates a

Since January, 67 new single home building permits have best issued, according to Canton's building department. In 1986, there were 291 permits issued — 33 of those were issued during the first three months. And in 1985, 294 permits were issued — 56 of those were issued during the first three months. months.

IN THE five-county metropoli-tan area there will be an estimated 15,000 new single family home per; mits issued this year, said Dennis P. Dickstein, owner/president of Ralph Manuel Realtors and president of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan.

In 1986 there were 26,973 single family permits issued in the state; in 1985 there were 21,379 permits

"It's unfortunate that it occurred," he said. "It hasn't changed my mind about going to Jackson. I will still

At Scott, deputy warden Jim Stegall will fill in for Jabe until a permanent successor is named.

Jackson's size and prison popula-tion make it a difficult facility to manage, Jabe said.

"There is no comparison (to Scott). There is none. Jackson's a very large, very difficult institution to

Jackson has about 5,500 prisoners and some 1,800 staff members.

"That's a large institution. But I look forward to it. It is going to be a challenge. Jabe plans to meet with staff

members and prisoners at Jackson. "There's probably a number of things I'm going to do. I'll be looking at all the staffing patterns at Jack-



He'll try to determine if additional staffing is needed to guarantee safe-ty at the prison. Mechanical aids, uch as cameras, monitors or persenal protection systems, also are

ection 18-186. Definitions - For the purpose of this Ordinance certain items and

words are hereby defined:
(a) "Roller Skates and Street Skates" mean small wheels near the toe and the sel of a shoe of frame that would attach to a shoe which are used for gliding on

a hard surface such as a floor, sidewalk, etc.

(b) "Ekateboards" refers to an item consisting of a short, oblong board with small wheels at each end, ridden on a hard surface such as a floor or sidewalk.

(c) "To roller skate" means to skate on any type of roller skates or street skates. Section 10-107. ROLLER SKATES, STREET SKATES AND SKATEBOARDS REGULATED - No person shall roller skate or ride a skateboard within the City of Plymouth without complying with the terms of this Ordinance. Section 10-106, SKATING OR RIDING ON SIDEWALKS - Whenever any person is roller skating or riding a skate board upon a sidewalk or other paved surface intended for use by pedestrians, such person shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall not approach, overtake or pass such pedestrian in a reckless or careless manner, and shall not pess such pedestrian except in a single file if such person is roller skating or riding a skateboard with other such skaters or riders.







# ome candidates I minimum test

Plymouth have submitted nominating petitions for election to the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Unless one or more withdraws by the and of the day today, all will be on the Ballot June 8 for two seats.

As the Observer Newspaper begins its considerations of the candidates and their qualifications, the very first element we examine is voting record at school elections.

We always have maintained that the minimum responsibility of any citizen is to vote in all elections — presidential, congressional, state, city or township, school district and community college. Every time an election is held,

whether general or special, a responsible citizen will be at the polls. Voter apathy is such a major, obvious problem In this country that we view not voting as an irresponsible act.

A RECORD OF voting in school elections is a minimum qualification for candidates who wish to serve on the school board.

While it may not be possible to vote in every election — personal crises sometimes arise — the ease of obtaining an absentee ballot makes it simple to vote in at least two-thirds of elections.

Voting is so easy that we view the practice as an indicator of commitment To community. Anyone who doesn't have time to vote certainly lacks time to serve on the school board. Anyone who cares so little about the community that the or she doesn't vote certainly does not care enough to deserve a seat of service

Over the years we have heard all the excuses on why people don't vote, and most just don't wash. Anyone who canpot vote in at least half the elections held has no business serving in public tife. That, pure and simple, is our editorial platform.

OF THE NINE candidates, these hree have admirable voting records:

Nancy Quinn has voted in 88 percent of the 26 school elections held since sne first registered to vote in December 1971; Roland J. Thomas Jr. has voted in 68 percent of the 17 elections held since egistering in February 1978; and Dean wartzwelter has voted in 94 percent of the 17 elections held since he registered

An August 1977.
We commend all three for the con-

cern and commitment demonstrated by their steady turnout at the polls over

One other candidate, William L. Brown, has a mixed record. Brown has voted in only 50 percent of the 24 school elections held since registering in August 1973, but has maintained an 80 percent voting record since casting his first school ballot in 1979. As a late bloomer, Brown has performed well.

THE OTHER five candidates have rather dismal records. One has voted in only three of the 13 elections held since she registered in October 1979, a mark of only 23 percent. Four candidates have not voted in a single election.

Of the four who have not voted, three are relative newcomers. One candidate registered four years ago and has missed all seven elections since then. The other three are recent residents who have had two or less opportunities to vote. Two missed both chances; one missed her only chance.

Not much can be said about the commitment of the three newcomers, but we do have to question their concern for the community at large. If they filed nominating petitions in early April to run for the board in June, why did they miss voting in the Feb. 17, 1987, election? That election was held one month before nominating petitions were circu-

We can only conclude that a candidate is apathetic and unconcerned for the public welfare when he or she fails to vote in a school election at the same time considering running for the school board.

As things stand now, the Observer sees three viable candidates - possibly

The other five candidates ought to give serious thought to withdrawing today. Seeking public offices is not a joke or something to be done on a whim. Some who filed Monday simply do not possess even the minimum qualifications for public office.

We do not wish to embarrass people who show an interest in govern But voter apathy is so important that we do publish voting records of candidates. We will publish the voting performance of those who remain on the ballot after the withdrawal deadline. The level of voter apathy cannot be improved by electing apathetic citizens to

# 'Funnies'-no laughing matter

OVER THE past 20 years or so, some really strange people and movements have come and gone - Richard Nixon and his Watergate crew, Bert Lance and his banking friends, the Hippies, the Yippies - and now we have Yuppies, Boomers and Funnies.

Funnies?

That's what I call Fundamentalist Christians, at least those associated with the likes of Jim and Tammy Bakker, Oral Roberts, Pat Robertson. (And this is not some distant TV-land joke: Local Republicans recently helped "Smiling Pat" and his pals take control of the Michigan Republican Party state

But they are funny because so many of the things they decry - situation ethics readily comes to mind - they are up to their necks in.

FUNDAMENTALISTS believe in the Bible as the literal word of God. The Bible says there was a flood that inundated the world several thousand years ago, therefore there was a flood. OK, that's a relatively harmless concept.

Where we part company is in their use of situation ethics. For instance, one of the 10 Commandments says, "Thou shalt not kill." It doesn't say "Thou shalt not kill, except for Russkies, murderers and Sandinistas." It says, "Thou shalt not kill."

Of course, if you point this out to a Funny, he/she will say, "Yes, but the Bible also says 'An eye for an eye.'

That's true. The Old Testament does say that. But didn't the New Testament, which tells of Christ's life and death on earth, basically supplant the Old Testament as the Bible for true believers? Wasn't that the whole point of Christ's life, to bring a message of love - "Love thy neighbor as thyself"?

BY USING this retort about the eye, Funnies also demonstrate a lack of knowledge about the intent of the eyefor-an-eye law.

Rather than part of a harsh system of punishment, it exemplified man's attempt to come up with a set of laws that did away with arbitrary and often unfair laws. If a man stole a loaf of bread, you didn't kill him. Instead he might have to pay a fine of 50 cents.

If Christ came to earth today, I think he would feel more at home with Mother Teresa than Oral Roberts. Christ would be a civil rights marcher, an anti-nuke demonstrator. He would support Save the Children and the World Wildlife Fund.

**CHRIST WOULD tell Tammy to wipe** the makeup off her face and use the money she would save to support a Catherine **Trainor** 

starving Ethiopian family. He would tell Jim to sell the posh mansions and move to a ghetto where he might be able to do some real Christian work.

I don't think Unrist would reel real comfortable in Oral Roberts' prayer tower, and I think he would tell Pat Robertson that sharp, slippery con men who try to ride the backs of real combat veterans to the White House will never make it past St. Peter.

And, yes, Christ would be an antiabortionist because surely when Roe vs. Wade was handed down, "Jesus wept."

Most of all, I think Christ would tell the Funnies that they and their children cannot affect the world at all if they stay in their own little worlds, teaching their children their narrow little views. Surely true Christians should move as Christ did. into all walks of life, not preaching and moralizing but as living examples of real love.

Perhaps they could all apprentice with Mother Teresa to see how that is



So there you have it. Three of the biggest reasons that people die in car accidents are speed drinking and failure to wear and belts. And they are three things that could be solved in a minute if we wanted to.

# U-M president's other dream LAST WEEK I took president Harold Shapiro to task for making promises

that he couldn't deliver - aiming for a black enrollment at the University of Michigan of 12 percent. That was only half the story. Under enormous pressure, Shapiro

also agreed to try to raise black representation on the faculty to the same 12 percent, the proportion of blacks in the total state population.

If Shapiro succeeds, according to the Rev. Jesse Jackson, U-M will be righer for it. I won't quarrel with Jackson. But again it appears improbable Shapiro

"IN 1976 Michigan had 2,200 faculty members, but only 63 blacks on the tenure track," Jackson was quoted as saying. "It's beneath that now."

My calculator says that amounts to

2.9 percent black faculty. Memorize that number.

Last week David Adamany, president of Wayne State University, shed light on the sitution when he answered a ques-tion from the Economic Club of Detroit. Of 31,400 doctorate degrees granted last year, he said, 909 went to blacks.

Let's see, 909 divided by 31,400 is (hm-m-m-m) 2.9 percent.

Furthermore, said Adamany, 52 percent of the doctorates granted to blacks

could become principals and superintendents.

That leaves 436 black doctorates -1.3 percent of the total — available for recruitment as college teachers of history, literature, economics, biology, chemistry, physics, math, engineering, architecture, design, library science, law, medicine, business administration, pharmacy and dentistry, to mention only a few U-M programs.

"It's simply not able to be done," Adamany said.

JACKSON'S SOLUTION is that U-M should recruit nationally for scholars and faculty, the same way it recruits basketball players.

That would work if a) other major institutions weren't doing the same thing, b) there were no United Negro College Fund keeping black institutions alive and c) corporations weren't recruiting greater numbers of people with doctorates, particularly in math and the sciences.

The state of Michigan has a new budget item called the Martin Luther King Jr./Rosa Parks Fund that I just learned about.





# Baby deals: prohibit, regulate, ignore?

Michigan lawmakers are in no rush to regulate surrogate parent contracts now that a New Jersey court has upheld their validity in the Baby M case

"The Baby M case vividly points to the need for legislation regulating surrogate parenting arrangements, said Noel P. Keane, the Dearborn attorney who pioneered such arrangements, including Baby M's.

But three legislators typified three different moods in Lansing last

• Sen. Connie Binsfeld, R-Maple City, again will seek to declare surrogate contracts as null and void. "It's a nightmare," she said.


• Sen. R. Robert Geake, R-Northville, would prefer to legalize the contracts as "a way for couples to have a child who is the biological child of at least the father.

• Rep. Perry Bullard, D-Ann Arbor, sees "no chance of a resonable regulatory approach" as long as "the Senate is controlled by ultra rightwing fanatics." The chairman of the House Judiciary Committee sees action."

IN THE BABY M case, a New Jersey judge ruled that a surrogate contract airanged by Keane was enforceable and that the mother gave up all her rights to the child.

William and Elizabeth Stern contracted with Mary Beth Whitehead to bear a child through artificial insemination by William's sperm. Whitehead sought to keep the baby. The Sterns won custody of the girl they named Melissa.

This is the best result we could have hoped for," said Keane, whose statement was issued through a Detroit public relations agency.

babies by 1) funding Medicaid abortions, 2) failing to counsel single mothers on the availability of adoption and 3) setting up young mothers in their own apartments through welfare payments.

In 1983 the Senate passed a Binsfeld bill, but it died in House committee.

GEAKE, A child psychologist, said the state should legalize surrogate contracts. "Public policy should assure the child of a stable home and guarantee the enforceability of the contract," he said.

Geake would not require psychological testing of the surrogate mother or parents. "There should be no more state regulation of this than of parents who conceive children naturally,"he said.

"Emotional stability is a transient thing. There is no guarantee that one who is stable now will be stable later. And a person under stress now

Nor would be limit payments to the surrogate mother, as some have suggested. Standard fee to a surrogate mother is about \$10,000.

"Unfortunately, under our welfare laws, unwed mothers are encouraged to keep their children," he said, echoing Binsfeld.

"State government could adopt a policy of encouraging children to be adopted. Our social workers are, at best, neutral (on advising adoption). Three is a natural tendency for a woman to keep it, and we subsidize keeping it through ADC (welfare)."

BULLARD RECALLED that a regulatory bill sponsored by Rep. Richard Fitzpatrick, D-Battle Creek, was reported out of his House Judiciary Committee several years ago, but was sent back to committee and thus killed.

He predicted a regulatory bill will be introduced "by somebody. No, not by me." He characterized the Republican-held Senate as "ultra rightwing fanatics. These folks are there until 1990, and apportionment is there until 1994."

He doubted a regulatory bill could be adopted, later adding, "It's not a

hot current issue for us."

Bullard's own view: "I personally am not in favor of prohbiting surrogate parenting, though society may eventually conclude we want to

prohibit it. There is an archaic need for males for genetic replication. But there are plenty of children all over the world ready for adoption.

"Some feminists groups are saying it is intrinsically an exploitation of lower-income women."

Asked if he wanted to limit fees paid to women, Bullard hesitated then said no.

DON MERENGERE, a Bloomfield Hills man involved with an adoption group, said that if adoption became more common, "Noel Keane would be down to tens and twenties instead of hundreds of clients.

"The losers were Mary Beth Whitehead, the Sterns and Baby M. The winner was Noel Keane, who is marketing his services. They know where to find him.

"Whitehead has had her face plastered all over the country. The Sterns didn't get what they wanted - anonymity for their child."







Artrain began operating in 1971. Its last visit to Plymouth was in


"I wasn't here before, but it's a great place to be," Krueger said.

# The reaction to AIDS could test our values

the United States has recently announced that the next five years are going to bring a catastrophic medical condition in the United States that is termed the AIDS Epidemic.

In the course of the last six years, 30,000 cases have been reported with a total of 17,000 deaths. By 1991, there will be 270,000 cases of AIDS, 75,000 of which will have been diagnosed in that year, and 50,000 deaths. The Secretary of Health and Human Services has declared that the AIDS Epidemic may dwarf all the epidemics of history, including the Black Death, in terms of numbers who become sick and die.

The seriousness of this disease arises from the fact that a very large population has been infected with the virus that causes AIDS, a number that is estimated between 1 million and 2 million people. Every-one infected is potentially infectious, even if they are asymptomatic.

THE FUNDAMENTAL clinical fact that makes the control of AIDS so difficult is that the disease is spread in the most private and intimate of settings. Therefore, halting. its spread requires an intrusion upon privacy in some form or another.

The question our society now faces is how will we respond to the control of this disease? The measures that are being proposed can have a transforming effect on the political and social institutions of the United States.

For more than two decades, the courts have followed a jurisprudence of privacy which is almost the same as a jurisprudence of sexuality. They have declared in essence that the state may not intervene in the sexual activity between heterosexual adults who have made a decision to have a relationship of intimacy.

It is also important to note that virtually all of the jurisprudence surrounding the legality of search and seizure in this country developed around cases related to drug abuse and efforts to control it.

THESE TWO fundamentals of liberal jurisprudence now must be viewed in relationship with the disease spread primarily by intrave-

THE PUBLIC HEALTH service of nous drug use and promiscuous sext al activity. How can we alter the course of this illness and limit its,

spread? The only effective strategy we have for limiting the tragedy of 1991. and subsequent years is a dramatic and unprecedented alteration in the sexual behavior of millions of men and women in this country and an' unprecedented change iff the pattern of drug use in this country.

We shall be required to confront the deepest biological and psycho-logical drives. Our society will be forced to ask for behavior modifica-tion of millions, not for the moment, but for their entire lives. Thus, wom en who are infected must be told that for their own sakes as well as for the welfare of any child they might wish to bring into the world,

child bearing is not permissible.

Teenagers and adolescents beginning to experiment with sexuality need to be restrained. Homosexual men will have to alter the entire nature of their sexual culture. Indeed, if the AIDS epidemic is to be stopped, our society requires a fundamental revolution in sexuality. One journal presented an extreme

solution: "At this point, the only way to prevent the spread of this disease is by making it physically impossible. This implies strict quarantine as has always been the case in the past with serious, not necessarily lethal, infectious disease that had been spreading. Quarantine implies accurate universal testing in turn."

In short, it is being proposed that between 1 million and 2 million individuals be subjected to lifelong incarceration, a medical version of preventative detention. Consider screening would ultimately involve

most of the entire U.S. population.

For our society to undertake these measures would, at the same time shake the very foundations of our constitutional liberties and the moral values that we cherish. Other approaches are required to effectively address this grave concern now be







With its low profile you may not have heard of it, but the Dietz Organization is well known by investors in million-dollar income property.

What we do is sell any existing property that is improved, meaning it has a building on it that is more than \$1 million and that is being held for income pur-poses as an investment," said Paul Dietz, founder and sole owner of the Dietz Organization.

Founded in late 1979 as a three-person company, Dietz had sales in 1980 through 1982 of \$15 million to \$30 million. Sales in 1983-84 jumped to \$70 million and were up to \$125 million in 1985.

"Sales for 1986 were \$200 million and we expect to reach the quarter-billion-dollar level by 1988," Dietz

The firm has grown to more than 30 employees and occupies 3,500 square feet of office space at 50 W. Big Beaver, Birmingham. Plans are under way to expand its office quarters to 5,000 square feet in April.

Dietz said the company's sales include apartment and office buildings, shopping centers and industrial buildings that are investor-owned.

'We are selling people's large income properties," he said. "We have a low profile because unlike a home, people don't put a for sale sign on their properties and frequently don't advertise."

DURING THE FOURTH quarter in 1986, the firm served as broker for the sale of 22 properties worth about \$80 million.

The sales included the Holiday Inn in Hazel Park for \$6.5 million, the 30100 Northwestern Highway Building in Farmington Hills for \$4.5 million, Southfield Industrial Park in Southfield, Ind., for \$22.5 million, Towers Medical Building in Grand Rapids for \$6.2 million and Huron View Commercial Park in Ann Arbor for \$2 million.

Other sales in the final quarter included Oakwood Villa Apartments in Royal Oak for \$3 million, Cavalier Manor Apartments in East Detroit for \$2.4 million, the Hyform Building in Livonia for \$2.5 million and Connecticut Corners Office Building in Northville for \$2.2 million.

Dietz said many of the properties sold during the final quarter were the result of sellers and buyers wanting certain tax benefits before the new tax law

"Sellers were seeking capital gains benefits while buyers wanted to take advantage of existing depreciation schedules," Dietz said.

DIETZ SAYS he thinks commercial real estate will continue to sell at a brisk pace because of low interest rates and a surplus of available capital for investors to

place in commercial property.

"Also, owners who have held their properties for many years are starting to recognize that the market is at a peak and that 1987 will be an opportune time to sell," he said.

The Dietz Organization is expanding its business bevond Michigan to include St. Louis, Indianapolis, Cincinnati and other major markets in the region, Dietz

Dietz said last year when Prudential Insurance Co. was looking for a broker to sell a \$7 million project in Grand Rapids it interviewed other commercial brokerage firms along with Dietz and found there was no company that came within "one-third of what we are doing in the commercial brokerage area."

Dietz also did a survey on his own, calling other brokerage firms and asking how large the sales force that dealt strictly with income property brokerage was. The most any other company has was four compared to his sales staff of 17, he said.

BUT DIETZ NOTED that the other firms were also involved in other activities like land sales and leasing

"There are no other firms that are exclusively doing income property brokering," he said. "We have a profile that is fairly unusual.

Each sales person in the company has a specialty such as shopping centers or apartment buildings and works within a certain geographic territory. Each sales person is also part of a team, for instance a shopping center team, and information is shared with other members of the team.

"The sales staff ranges in age from 26 to 32 years and they are dealing with sophisticated properties worth \$2 million or \$3 million and fees in excess of \$80,000 to \$90,000," he said. "They become extremely knowledgeable extremely fast."

The firm is heavily computerized with a 7,000-property data base. Pictures are available of each property along with its vital statistics. About 5,000 to 6,000 mailers are put out each month listing available prop-

Dietz said Michigan and the Midwest are probably the best markets in the nation for investment proper-

"This area of the country underwent a severe recession several years ago, and thus had been more conservative then other regions in investing in new commercial properties," he said.

"The result is that there is less overbuilding here than in the East and Southwest, and that properties are maintaining a high value."

Other properties handled by Dietz in 1986 included Hampton Court Apartments in Westland for \$5.9 million, Roxbury Apartments in Sterling Heights for \$4.5 million, Innsbrook Apartments in Northville for \$7.8 million. Civic Center Plaza in Livonia for 2.5 million. Square Lake Hills Apartments in Bloomfield Hills for \$4.5 million, Village Professional Building in Bloomfield Hills for \$5.9 million and Lincoln Park Industrial Building in Lincol Park for \$5.7 million.

Out-of-state sales included Hickory Creek Apartments in Columbus, Ohio for \$8 million and Sierra Vista Apartments and Whispering Lakes Apartments in St. Louis, Mo., for \$29.2 million.

Dietz graduated from University of Detroit Law School in 1967 and had a two-year fellowship specializing in urban law at the University of Pennsylvania law

He was with The Hartman Group Realtors, one of Michigan's largest commercial Realtors from 1969 to 1975 where he was a minority stockholder and vice president in charge of investment properties.

He was a principal and stockholder from 1976 to 1979 in Atlantic Associates, which both brokered and syndicated income properties.





# Grand weekend accents mystery

AT THE URDER GRAND." It's all in fun and such a great getaway that many who have attended a murder-mystery weekend at the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island return again and again, every six months, to solve new crimes.

Among those who go back for more are Roger Willis of Southfield and his fiancee, Stacey Chrusciel of Dearborn Heights, who have attended three "Murder at the Grand" four-day fantasy trips.

'I'm rather a mystery buff," said Willis. "I've got rather a vast collection at home."

In this, he may be the exception, rather than the rule. Most of the guests who sign up for this special . travel package with ATS Travel of Huntington Woods are not big mystery-book readers.

Area residents, reached by phone and asked about their participation in "Murder at the Grand," agreed the pleasure is a combination of dressing up in costume, acting out their parts, enjoying social activities in the re-created setting of the historical period where the crime occurs, and working on teams that put together the clues in an effort to solve the murder. ..

The first weekend Roger Willis attended, the scene at the Grand Hotel was the 20-year reunion of Mackinac High School in the 1940s. He got hooked on these weekends.

"A guy made a toast and keeled over during the reception drinking a glass of poisoned champagne," he said, recalling an exciting moment from a weekend. "I've always wanted to play the role of the sleuth. The guy fell right at my feet."







# Michigan travel business begins at home

It is amazing how much good travel information you can collect by just hanging out for a day or two with people in the tourism industry. That's what I did last week at the Fourth Annual Governor's Conference on Tourism, which unveiled the recommendations of the state's Task Force on the Future of Tourism.

The conference was held in three locations: at the Westin-Renaissance, which celebrates the tenth anniversary of the Renaissance Center this year; at Cobo Hall, which is in the middle of a \$135 million expansion; and at Henry Ford Museum, which is undergoing the most dramatic overhaul of its exhibit space since the museum began more than half a century ago.

The two most important words in a conference like this are "marketing strategy." The state is working to increase its share of money spent by domestic and foreign travelers. Michigan cities and major attractions are working for their share of the state tourism pie. And hundreds of entrepreneurs, people in the hotel, restaurant and attractions business, are fighting to be seen and heard by travelers to Michigan.

The most important conclusion you reach after listening for a few days is that you, the Michigan traveler, are the customer most in demand. As Gov. James J. Blanchard said at the windup luncheon:

"THE PEOPLE of Michigan and our closest neighbors are our best customers. Forty three percent of the travel in Michigan is by Michigan travelers. Business starts at home."

Don Adams, director of public affairs for Henry Ford Museum/ Greenfield Village, is looking for more of those Michigan travelers. "Less than 25 percent of our visitors are from Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties. We are perceived by local people to be an unchanging product.'

Some of you may still think that tourism money is just play money. Think again. Tourism is among the top three industries in almost every state and in many countries of the world. It is either second or third, after the auto industry, in Michigan; it depends whether you talk to the peoism offices in Lansing.

Tourism creates an impact in tax revenue to state coffers; that's know that jet service has been lost to

try sustains 300,000 jobs in Michigan. It's big bucks.

The Governor's Task Force on the Future of Tourism was asked to create a plan to increase those figures, so that Michigan would have a \$200 billion tourism industry and 450,000 travel-related workers within five

THEY RECOMMENDED that the state create an Interagency Coordinating Council on Tourism, chaired by the state travel director, and that the director be upgraded to a deputy director within the Department of Commerce, so that all state travelrelated programs are coordinated under the Travel Bureau instead of being scattered all over Lansing.

They also recommended that we upgrade the infrastructure of air service, highways, trails, marinas, etc., within the state; spend more money promoting travel to Michigan and nearby states; increase our travel research and increase the state promotion budget to \$20 million.

I can attest that Michigan has really been getting its tourism act together since John Savich became became travel director in 1984. Al Sandner, communications director of the Michigan Travel Bureau, tells me that the bureau saw a real network of Michigan tourism businesses created while the state was organizing the annual convention of the Society of American Travel Writers in 1985, and that the network is getting

I also talked to all kinds of people from around the state who are trying to make it in the travel industry. Michigan has a lot of Mom and Pop travel businesses that need help communicating with the traveling

HE WAS attending a workshop given by Circle Michigan, an organization of Michigan travel businesses organized with the sole purpose of bringing more motorcoach tours to its members.

Other workshops were led by the Michigan Regional Tourist Associations, Michigan Boating Industries Association, Michigan Association of Recreational Vehicles and Campgrounds and other groups that are a wonderful source of travel informa-

While wandering through a travel marketplace in Cobo Hall, I picked up pamphlets from other sources: the Commuter Transportation Co., which runs buses and limos from hotels to the airport; the Michigan Horse Council, which published a Campground and Trails Directory (P.O. Box 12074, Lansing 48901); the Sesqui Train '87, which invites you to drive a wagon, ride a horse, volunteer time or sponsor part of the June 15027 wagon train (contact the Off-300 S. Washington, Suite 201, Lansing 48933).

# Canton opens title defense

Surprise, surprise.

It happened a year ago. Plymouth Canton, never before renowned for its boys track program, emerged as the best in a very good Western Lakes Activities Association (WLAA).

That was surprise enough. After all, Canton had to beat perennial power Livonia Churchill to pull it off, and the Chiefs had never done that before. Not in the WLAA, and not in the old Western Six League.

However, that wasn't the end of surprises generating from CEP. At the WLAA finals, Plymouth Salem shocked everyone by not only finishing second, but nearly upsetting Canton. The Chiefs won the title by just

"I think we surprised everybody," said Salem coach Gary Balconi. "I think people thought Canton would win, but no one thought we would come that close. It was one of those things where everyone had a good day for us."

AND THAT made it a doubly good day for the CEP - a one-two finish in the WLAA meet. Neither coach -Balconi or Canton's Rob Neu - is predicting anything similar this year. But they both have the talent. And they definitely have the num-

A"I think it's going to be a dograce. "Farmington has state championship material in its distance events, Canton is the defending champion so they'll be tough, and Churchill - you can't count (coach) Fred Price out. He's always going to have his people ready.'

And Neu's view? "We have a good nucleus back. We'll be competitive. I hope we can challenge for the division championship."

Both the Chiefs and the Rocks will do more than merely challenge. Their depth alone - Salem has more

comparable numbers make both formidable in dual meets. Here's an in-depth look at each.

#### CANTON

"It was outstanding," said Neu of last season's success. "The key to last year was depth. We had a ton of seniors with track experience.'



'That really irked me," said Baker of the call. "That just killed our chances.'


So upset by the penalty call, general manager Hugh Melvin of Hennesssey was tossed from the arena after hurling water bottles out on the ice.



# Diver grabs NCAA gold

Mike Wantuck has what he sought for so long - an

It took the Ohio State diver and Bloomfield Hills Andover graduate a long time to get it — right up until his final collegiate event, the three-meter board. But Wantuck made no mistakes; he piled up 641.45 points, easily outdistancing second-place Jose Rocha of Auburn, who totaled 614.20, in Saturday's finals at the University of

"When my coach (Vince Panzano) came up to me and said, 'Congratulations, Mike,' I just sighed and said to myself, 'Finally — I am so glad,' " said Wantuck. "I have waited so long for this. I definitely dove well."

IT WAS NOT an easy meet for Wantuck. He was favored to win the one-meter board, but Rocha put together a tremendous 11-dive routine and edged Wantuck, 549.20 to 545.85 Thursday.

"I ended up second and very disappointed," said Wantuck. "I went there really hoping to win both. My (onemeter) score was very good. Jose just dove very well, he had a lot of good dives.'

What bothered Wantuck was that he led from the preliminaries until the ninth dive of the finals. He was ahead by 10 points entering that round, but he didn't hit his dive well. That gave Rocha an opening, and he took advantage of it to take the lead. Wantuck executed his final two good dives with precision, but it wasn't enough to overtake Rocha.

"I shouldn't have been so upset, but I was," said Wantuck. "I was confident, even going into the last dive, that I could beat him."

He didn't. Wantuck was safely ahead throughout Saturday's three-meter finals. He said he wasn't feeling any overwhelming pressure to succeed, even though it was his last chance to capture an NCAA title (a first-year law student at OSU, Wantuck is in his fourth and last season of NCAA elisibility).

"I wasn't really looking at it that way, that it's my last chance, I HAD to win," he said. "I kept on thinking about all the other performances I've put together, the improvement I've made. I wanted to go out in style, and

"I didn't want even a glimmer of doubt in any of the judges' minds that I won the event."

HE LEFT NONE. By the end of Friday's prelims, Wantuck led by 12 points. In Saturday's finals, he built a

cushion early and kept it throughout the competition.
His score was the highest in recent NCAA meet history.
It was a gratifying and long-sought victory. But triumph is fleeting, a fact Wantuck knows well. He travels to Baton Rouge, La., Saturday for the U.S. Diving Championships, which are April 14-18. The top finishers at that meet will make the U.S. team to compete in the World FINA Cup in Amersfoort, Holland, April 22-25.

In between, Wantuck has his law degree to pursue, so he has little time to savor his NCAA three-meter title. Which hardly seems fair, after chasing it for so long.

Late in the season, "senioritis" then takes hold. The ADs have even a harder time scheduling because of graduations, proms and skip

With reduced practice time, players will be more susceptible to injuries.

Pields, already skinned from last year's fall rains, will be reduced to dust and mud bowls by the time

things dry out.
These conditions lend themselves

to poor quality of play.
So it's easy to see why this sports writer can't get serious sheet spring sports until summertime weather sets in.

And normally summer wes doesn't take hold until the state tournaments are well underway.

THE SOLUTION to these problems are complex.

Some ADs cracked that we could introduce some new sports in the spring, maybe along the lines of canceing, mud wrestling or water

The MHSAA needs to revise its calendar so football doesn't start. before Labor Day and soccer doesn't start before basketball ends. We don't need another "dea'd week" as we had during the recent basketball season. District tournaments didn't start until March 9. That's ridiculous.





Ahh, the rites of spring. Groundhogs look for shadows, baseball fans look for scarce tickets to opening day, and runners throughout southeastern Michigan look toward West Bloomfield, where the annual half-marathon race serves as the unofficial start of the local rac-

ing season.
This year's 13.1-mile race will be held Sunday, a week earlier than usual to avoid a conflict with Easter

Whether it was the mild winter, which allowed runners to keep their mileage up, or a resurgence by a sport that some skeptics said was dying, a record field of 1,000 could take off from the West Bloomfield High School parking lot when the starting gun sounds at 12:30 p.m.

More than 600 had entered by Tuesday morning and race director Sally Slater Pierce said that raceday registration was more than 200 last year.

Thus, with a solid final week of registration by mail or drop-ins at the West Bloomfield Parks and Recreation office on Middlebelt, the allrunning

# Trout make Clinton River home

outdoors

HE CLINTON trout stream. Sounds kinda weird to me. But according to Ron Spitler, fisheries biologist of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, "the Clinton River is the newest trout stream in Southeastern Michigan."

After thorough testing of the water the DNR actually proclaimed the river dead in 1968, stating that pollution had caused the oxygen levels to drop so low that no fish could possibly survive.

Many people, especially anglers, simply forgot all about the filthy Clinton River.

But in the early 1970s a sewer system came through the neighboring communities of the river. Around the same time the Warren and Pontiac waste water plants, which were dumping their effluent (exit) water directly into the Clinton, upgraded their facilities top the tertiary level.

With these changes intact the quality of the water began to improve almost overnight. By 1975 the water was looking so good the DNR began to speculate on restocking the river with trout.

IN 1984, with the release of some 4.000 brown trout, those speculations turned into reality and for the first time in nearly 20 years the Clinton River was thriving with some of

Michigan's finest gamefish. Since that timwe the DNR has been releasing about 4,000 browns a year. Over the past three years they have also released steelhead into the Clinton at a rate of about 15,000 per

The browns stay right in the river after being stocked. They are usually under seven inches long when re-leased but reach legal size — eight inches on streams in lower Michigan - by midsummer.

"There's been a lot of activity in the past and a lot of fish have been caught," said Spitler. "The best time

morning before a lot of fishermen are at the river and the trout become spooked. By midsummer the fishermen are using spinners and small spoons and most of the fish they catch are keepers."

THERE HAS BEEN a problem, however, with anglers fishing for browns immediately after the fish are release into the river.

"The fish take a few days to orient themselves to the water and move on," said Spitler. "Fishermen use small hooks and the fish can swallow these hooks which then become caught in their gullets. This can cause severe problems and even kill some fish. It isn't a good practice, and we really don't like to see people going after the smaller fish just for the fun of it. If there is too much damage and a lot of fish are being wasted we could even be forced to planting. Hopefully it that bad."

In mid-April the DNR will plant of approximately 1,000 browns at each of three road crossings; Crooks, Avon and Dequinder. Anglers are asked to stay clear of these areas or use bait large enough so that it won't be appealing to the smaller fish.

THE STEELHEAD, meanwhile, retreat to the open lakes after being planted until they are ready to spawn which usually takes about three years. Then they return to their parent stream, in this case the Clinton River.

This past fall there were some steelhead reported in the Clinton River but no major runs. There were even some reports of a few salmon straying up the river.

The spring runs should be a little stronger since the first fish that were planted, have had three full years to mature. The runs should continue to get stronger each year from here on out.

The steelhead only advance up the river as far as the dam at the Rochester/Utica Recreation Area, near Yates Cider Mill. Browns have been caught from Pontiac to the mouth of the river.

Reports from Belleville Lake indicate that nice bluegill, averaging eight inches in length and up to three-quarters of a pound in weight, are not an uncommon catch. Kent Lake has also produced some seven and eight inch bluegill and an occasional large pike or walleye.

# You need not lose health care coverage

I received some literature in the mail recently from OWL (Older nen's League) about the Health rance Continuation Law. With the status of women - and men frequently changing in our society, this information may become important to you at some point in your life.

Most Americans participate in the group health coverage provided by their employers. You and your family members are covered as long as the employee continues to work for the company.

However, if your work or family status changes, you often lose your group health coverage. Most group surance also terminates for individuals or families when there is a divorce, death of the employee or the employee loses the job or retires.

effect last July, provides help for many individuals to retain their health care coverage when one of

these changes occurs.

If you are protected under this law, you will be able to continue this health coverage for up to a maximum of three years depending on your situation if you pay the prem-

While group coverage is not cheap, the group premiums are usually considerably less than individual coverage premiums. No medical examination is required. Just notify your health plan of the change and pay the premium (both the employee and employer portions) plus a 2 percent administrative fee.

PL 99-272 is only for health plans beginning after July 1, 1986, and takes effect in your specific case when the company's next health plan begins, whether that is June 1987 or

THOSE COVERED by this law in

your insurance coverage was through your spouse's employer, you can continue coverage for three years if your spouse dies after the group health insurance continuation law takes effect.

 Divorced/separated spouses and dependent children — If you were covered under your spouse's plan, you can continue coverage for three years if the divorce or legal separation takes place after the group health insurance continuation law takes effect. The details for this

You can continue your group insurance coverage for a maximum of 18 months after the employee quits, takes a leave, is laid off, fired (except for gross misconduct) or reduces work hours (voluntarily or not) after the law takes effect for you. If your family status changes during this 18 months through death or divorce, the spouse and dependent children can continue coverage for a total of 36 months.

• Retiring workers — The employee, spouse and any dependent children can continue coverage for up to 18 months or until Medicare begins after retirement. The employee's spouse may continue coverage for up to 36 months if the employee is eligible for Medicare but the spouse is not.

 Other eligible children — If your health insurance is through your parent's employer, coverage can be continued for a maximum of three years if you become ineligible





# 1st garden? Don't be too ambitious

By EARL ARONSON

RE YOU THINKING about your first vegetable garden? Don't be too ambitious. Keep it small enough so that you can tend it properly.

Here are some tips from National Gardening Association experts to help you get started:

- Early season soils tend to be moist and cool, which delays the release of natural nitrogen in the soil. Add a synthetic fertilizer (5-10-10 or 8-8-8). After the soil has warmed, organic fertilizers such as dehydrated or composted cow or horse manure are suitable.

- Mulch cabbage, lettuce and broccoli early in the gardening season with a 4- to 6-inch layer of organic materials such as hay, composted leaves or straw. These materials will help keep soil temperatures low, which is favorable for vegetables planted early in the spring. Don't mulch tomatoes, peppers, beans or okra until four to five weeks after planting. When temperatures warm, mulch will stop weeds and hold moisture rather

- Transplants purchased at a greenhouse should be "hardened" for six to seven days before planting. "Hardening" means getting the plants accustomed to outdoor weather. Start by setting plants in a shady, protected area for a few hours the first day and then add more time and sun on succeeding days.

- Transplants need to be protected against the wind, which can whip and dry them. If the garden site is exposed and windy, set up cardboard, wooden shingles or other wind blocks around plants, or put these protections on the prevailing wind side for several weeks.

- If it hasn't been done for several years, have your soil tested. Early testing gives you time to plan what organic materials, lime or sulfur you might have to spread. Testing may also alert you to a nutrient deficiency that could be corrected by summer.

WHAT TO GROW IN your first garden?

Beans: Snap and lima beans need little care, grow rapidly even in weak soil, and produce abundantly. They are a good source of vitamins A. Bl

and C, riboflavin, calcium and iron. Bush beans are compact, low plants that mature in 50-60 days and grow only 1-2 feet tall. Pole beans climb 8-10 feet and can be planted along a fence. They mature more slowly than bush beans but produce longer

Wait until after the last frost to plant beans. Soak seeds overnight in a jar of water to aid sprouting. Beans like light, well-drained soil. Plant bush varieties 1 inch deep, 3 inches apart, in rows, removing seeds carefully since bean roots are not deep. Set pole beans on north side of the garden to protect other vegetables from the wind. Pick pole beans every four to seven days so that the vine will keep flowering. Water beans often, especially the pole

Beets: Beets grow rapidly, 60 days from seed, in almost any soil. They contain vitamins B and C. Plant early varieties in cool spring weather; late varieties in late spring or early summer. Sow seeds 11/4 -inch deep in light soil. When seedlings reach 5 inches, thin to 3 inches apart.

Lettuce: Iceberg lettuce prefers cool weather. Romaine and loose leaf lettuce can be grown successfully in

summer. Any well-drained soil is suitable. Sow 11/4 -inch deep in loose soil. From seed, leaf lettuce matures in about 45 days; romaine and head lettuce in 60-85 days. Thin leafy types to 1 foot apart. Thin iceberg lettuce 2 feet. Water well in hot weather.

Peppers: Peppers don't like cold weather so sow seeds inside about nine to 10 weeks before the last frost. Transplant to permanent, warm soil when plants are 5-6 inches tall. Soil should be moist, light and welldrained. Plants will mature 65-80 days after transplanting. Water every eight to nine days unless rain helps. To facilitate growth, buy seedlings instead of seeds.

Tomatoes: Tomatoes are another rewarding plant. For the new gardener, seedlings are easier than seeds. Treat tomatoes much the same as peppers. However, tomatoes need much more gardening space, especially if you don't stake them

A good way to start the planning process is with a critical inventory of the furniture in each room of your home. Pretend you're a stranger entering the house for the first time. # Keeping a clear view on thermal windows

Thermal insulated windows long have have been recognized for their superior energy conservation. They also are sometimes known for "looking dirty" or fogging between the two panes of glass. These problems are caused by seal failure, according to Martin Peck of Artic Window Replacement Industries, Westland.

Insulated glass consists of two pieces of glass that are separated by a spacer bar and completely sealed. The spacer bar contains a dessicant that insures complete dryness once the glass is sealed. Insulation is obtained from the laver of air that separates the window panes.

Problems begin when the seal is broken and air and moisture penetrate between the panes of glass. Peck said seal failure can be caused when one of the window panes is accidentally cracked or when the fitting of the unit doesn't allow for normal expansion and contraction and too much pressure is put on the unit's seal.

MOST OFTEN, however, seal failimproper glazing, or age, Peck said. On the manufacturing level, errors occur when skips occur in the seals, when the small hole in the spacer bar that is used to blow the air between the panes is not plugged, or when a unit is out of


Improper glazing causes premature deterioration of the sealant, Peck explained. This is avoided when the insulated glass unit is properly fitted into the frame to avoid gaps that allow water to sit inside the sash frame.

When properly sealed, glazed and

maintained, the unit's seal should last for at least 10 years, depending on climate conditions, Peck said. "The sealant will eventually dry out and shrink, which can cause fogging," he

Homeowners faced with broken seals in their insulated windows have various options, depending on the cause of seal failure. New replacement windows may be covered by a warranty. Windows can also be replaced, but cost can be substantial (to replace a single 3-by-4-foot window, including glass frame and installation, costs about \$320.)

A LESS EXPENSIVE option is replacing only the insulated glass unit, Peck said. He warned against home-



owners trying to fix the broken seal problem themselves. "People sometimes take the insulated panes apart, try to clean them, and then try to put them back together. Then they usually end up calling us."



# All-America Selections names

Early to color, early to harvest best describes the 1967 vegetable winner Pumpkin Autumn Gold. Gardeners need not wade through the pumpkin patch, possibly injuring vision or leaves white searching for their humature pumpkins. The bright yellow immeture pumpkins "stand out" amidet grand foliane.




Five All-America Selections award winners — three flower varieties, a pumpkin and an herb — will be available to gardeners in 1987.

The award-winning flower varieties are a double grandiflora petunia, "Purple Pirouette"; the first orange-flowered sanvitalia (creeping zinnia), "Mandarin Orange"; and a bicolored snapdragon, "Princess White with Purple Eye." The new pumpkin is "Autumn Gold" and the herb is basil "Purple Ruffles."

Extension horticulturists at Michigan State University point out that AAS award winners have been judged the top varieties at 60 official trial gardens across North America, including the flower trail garden at MSU. To win an award, the new varieties must show superior garden performance in side-by-side trials with proven varieties.

"PURPLE PIROUETTE" is a double petunia with a purple center and a white edge on each ruffled petal. Blossoms measure 3½ to 4 inches across. Plants form compact mounds. This petunia grows well in hanging baskets, patio urns, window boxes or sunny flower beds. Full sun is best, but "Purple Pirouette" will also flower abundantly in half-day shade.

"Mandarin Orange" sanvitalia has a spreading growth habit similar to that of more familiar ground covers. Each plant will spread to 12 to 15 inches. On a slope or in a hot, sunny garden spot, use it as a ground cover. Planted in containers or hanging baskets, sanvitalia will cascade over the edge. The 1inch, semidouble, orange flowers look like miniature sunflowers.

# 5 winners for '87

THE NEW SNAPDRAGON "Princess White with Purple Eye" is a semidwarf variety (14 to 16 inches) that thrives in either a full- or a half-day's sun. The 6-8-inch spikes of white florets with purple centers can be cut and used for floral arrangements. Many snapdragons lose their spikes in midsummer as seed capsules ripen, but "Princess White and Purple Eye" continues to flower prolifically.



Pumpkin 'Autumn Gold' matures only 90 days after sowing. Each vine bears three to five pumpkins weighing 7 to 10 pounds. They can be carved or cooked and the seeds roasted for snacks. Pumpkins turn yellow while still immature, changing to a rich gold-

en orange as they approach harvest.

Basil 'Purple Ruffles' is an annual ornamental herb that can also be used in cooking. The foliage is deep, reddish black and glossy, and it gives off a strong fragrance when leaves are lightly crushed. 'Purple Ruffles' thrives in full sun and a well drained, organic soil. Late in the gardening season, the plants bear attractive lavender flowers.

Home gardeners with facilities for producing their own transplants from seed should find seeds for these varieties listed in 1987 seed catalogs. Others can look for started plants at garden centers, greenhouses and other places where bedding plants are sold.

# **Decked out**

#### This entertainment center doesn't need any furniture

700D DECKS are wonderful entertainment centers for family and friends.

The warm, natural look of real wood coupled with easy maintenance add up to a lot of carefree living. But imagine a beautiful deck without furniture. No place to sit, no tables, no planters - in short, none of the amenities that make a deck truly livable.

What should top the list of accessories you want for your outdoor deck? Benches, small tables, perhaps a planter or two? Eventually, most people want to add these accessories, but don't want to spend the summer building them. The answer is to build all your deck accessories from a basic modular unit. This way, you can get a supply of the same sized western lumber and build your accessories when you want them or have time for con-


ALL THE DECK furniture pictured is easily built from a basic unit of four two by sixes, each 121/2 inches long. When the ends are glued and nailed together in an overlapping butt joint, the pieces form a 14-inch square.

Depending on how this basic unit is combined with other lumber, the 14inch square can be a planter, table, bench, stool, or even a wall sculpture. For example, a row of four 1-by-4 western boards nailed along the square's bottom turns the module into a shallow planter.

Stack a second square on top of the first, tie the two together with a 2-by-4 collar, and you have a deeper planter. Flip the shallow planter over, add 2by-2 or 4-by-4 legs, and you have a small table or stool. Grouped together, four or more modular tables form a larger table for outdoor entertaining.

Other deck accessories developed from the basic 2-by-6 square include a bench support, a shelf to hold potted plants, or a striking three-dimensional wall sculpture.



In the last 10 years, sales of artificial plants and flowers have more than tripled, winning acceptance of homemakers, and overcoming the negative image of that plastic geranium stuck into a white pot.

A wide variety of single flowers, arrangements, trees, plants and hanging plants are flooding the marketplace, many of them coming from the Far East, Italy and Honolulu.

Jimmy Reeves, design coordinator for Ethan Allen's plant and flower program, said the breakthrough came in the evolution of quality materials... silk for flowers and polyester for plants and trees... and in the technological developments resulting in better design and colors.

"The key word," he said, "is quality.

STILL, QUESTIONS ARISE. Are these artificial flowers a "breed" unto themselves, or should they simply simulate the real thing?

Reeves feels they should be considered as accessories for the home, and not as an imitation for real flowers, or a substitute for them.

"Any home benefits inside and out by combining the best of real and artificial plants and flowers," he believes, adding that, with both, it's the skill of decorating with them that counts. Some tips:

• Buy first with color in mind, using the flowers to pick up the accent color in the room, just as would be done with an accessory. Scale, too, is important, using the bigger plants and trees as verticals.

• Do not mix fresh and artificial flowers. If you put water in the vase, you ruin the stems of the artificial flowers, and the rust hurts the real flowers. However artificial and real plants can be mixed, creating the impression that all are real.

#### **Keeping Cool**

A room air conditioner can keep you comfortable at less cost than central house air conditioning, reports the Better Heating Cooling Council.

A cooling unit, either in the window or through the wall, can cool just the room being occupied, rather than the whole house. In very hot weather, it may be desirable to precool some rooms even before using them, a bedroom, for example. In milder weather however, turning on the room unit only when needed can bring the temperature down to comfort level quick-

# impression with plants and flowers

- If you cannot afford an entire arrangement of silk flowers, buy what you can, and gradually add to the arrangement, taking them back to the store or florist for help with the arranging.
- Change the flower arrangements or plants in your rooms from time to time, to keep the element of freshness and surprise.
- Clean the flowers and plants with a cool hair dryer, or a vacuum. For silk flowers that go limp, hold the flowers in your hand, giving some form to the petals with your fingers, and then lightly spray a good quality of hair spray to adequately saturate the petals, and follow this with a hair dryer — from a distance.

WHAT FLOWERS AND plants are the most popular?

According to Reeves, the plants that work particularly well in artificial interpretations are the ficus, English ivy, maple leaf ivy and philodendrons. Favorites in flowers are the cyclamen, cabbage roses, iris, bearded iris, lilies, clematis and orchids.
