Laurel Park's gain is Plymouth's loss

Viability struggle hits city

When the Mayflower Hotel announced it was filing for Chapter 11 earlier this month, co-owner Scott Lorenz cited competition from Livonia's Laurel Park Place as a factor in the economic plight Plymouth is experiencing.

Fred Hill, who recently closed his Main Street haberdashery and one of his women's clothing stores in Plymouth, said he doesn't know how one could say Laurel Park isn't affecting

Opened about two years ago just east of I-275 at Six Mile, Laurel Park is a mid-sized, upscale mall anchored by Jacobson's, a Marriott Hotel, AMC theaters, offices and res-

MARY HIGGINS, OWNER of Land & Seas Gifts, closed her flagship Plymouth store last week. She relocated next door to Jacobson's at Laurel Park.

The owner of five Land & Seas outlets in New York; Tampa, Fla.; Niagara Falls and Ohio, Higgins said traffic at her Plymouth store dropped 30 percent over the last year. Since opening Thanksgiving week in Livonia, business has doubled, she said.

Higgins didn't want to leave Plymouth but had no choice, she

"Of my five stores, Plymouth was doing the lowest volume of all," she "At first I was willing to do that because I wanted a cute, fun little place to work. After a while, you have enough of that. You're in business to make money, not to have a cute place.'

Part of Plymouth's problem is its retail mix, she said.

"There just aren't enough choices here," said Higgins. "Do you come to Plymouth because you need a pair of jeans or a sweater? People go to the malls because there are choices. I think that's what's hurt Plymouth. Also, women are working outside the home. They don't have time to browse in little shops."
Higgins said she doesn't think the

economy or parking have affected business.

"We have five stores, and some of our stores are up," she said. "I think parking is the least of our prob-

Location, however, has been a concern, she said. "I'd been in Plymouth 10 years in the same location, and I wanted to move to Ann Arbor Trail or Main Street. Landlords wouldn't give me the time of day.

"I also wasn't allowed to participate in Art in the Park for nine years. The person in charge of it didn't want local stores in it so I lost a lot of business that weekend. Those

were losses I couldn't make up."
Higgins said she felt she "didn't have the support or any reason to

stay, and I really did want to stay in Plymouth."

Things in Plymouth have changed over the last few years, she said. When the ice festivals began and we used to have Scott Lorenz and people like that pushing the Canadian promotions we had, things were better. It seems like people used to work together more. Now, for whatever reason, people aren't willing to.

It's like they're already giving up Despite its high rents, Laurel Park will continue to be a formidable force in local retailing, said Higgins. Not only is it ideally located, but it's anchored by Jacobson's, and "it's

Schools compete for high-tech funds

With students in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools confronting a world in which knowledge is doubling every 30 months, the district is one step closer to receiving \$6 million in federal funds for instructional

high technology.

A bill containing a high tech program initiated by U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, was approved last month by the House Appropria-tions Committee and signed by President Bush. It's now in the hands of the U.S. Department of Education,

funding goes.

Superintendent John Hoben testified before Congress last year, petitioning for a matching grant to equip Plymouth-Canton with interactive television and computer video, satellites, fiberoptics, laser and video discs, and other technology that would enable the district to become a national demonstration site.

Of the \$59 million in bond money approved by Plymouth-Canton voters last year, \$12 million is earmarked for high technology.

How soon the district will get an answer from the education depart-

spokesman for Pursell.

"The Department of Education has to write regulations so they can accept proposals for the grant. That's currently where it is. We haven't been given a timetable. It could take six months, or it could take a year," said Cates. While appropriations funds can't be earmarked for individual recipients, funding, it is hoped, will be dispersed in such a way that some of it goes to Plymouth-Canton. "Plymouth-Canton is a lead applicant, but it is a

competitive grant," Cates said.
Ray Hoedel, associate superin-

tendent for business, said the district must submit a written proposal to the Department of Education.

IN THE MEANTIME, the district has hired a high technology consultant who will recommend to school officials a plan to revamp media centers in elementary, middle and high schools.

It's possible that the high tech media centers may be available for public use. "We are taking a look at how we can best serve the community in all ways," said Dick Egli, com-munity relations director.

Even if the district doesn't receive federal funding, Plymouth-Canton will do what it can to equip K-12 classrooms with advanced technolo-

"We will go ahead, regardless," said Egli. "We can work with whatever funds we have. We can provide considerable technology obviously with the \$12 million.

Keeping local flavor called key for downtowns

Despite tough economic times and etition from places such as Livonia's Laurel Park, small downtowns can survive. Not as we've

known them perhaps, but survive they will, local business people say.

Fred Hill, who closed his Plymouth haberdashery after 25 years due to sagging sales, looks to the past to understand the present.

"Plymouth is in a transitional he said. "Customers' shoping habits may have changed, and lose habits dictate a mall. But look how different Plymouth is today from when I opened."

HILL SEES PLYMOUTH thriving as a commercial district catering to 'narrow specialty shops and home accessory shops . . . what I would call office, retail interior decorator types. They're all good uses, just dif-ferent uses," Hill said.

Wendy Strip-Sittsamer is executive director of the Farmington Downtown Development Authority.
"One of the things we know from

research we've conducted is that while people shop while in downtown Farmington, often their primary purpose for being downtown is to duct business other than retail business," she said.

"In other words, they're coming to the post office, the library or to see their doctor, lawyer or banker. That's one of the things downtowns, especially older downtowns, offer that the Laurel Park Places of the

"I SEE A DIFFICULT future. I'm not sure downtowns can continue to survive in the ways they have traditionally. I'm not sure they can con-tinue to be the sole center of commerce as they once were.

"And there's no such thing as a universal answer. What may work for downtown Farmington may not work for downtown Plymouth, Birmingham, Rochester or Detroit, for that matter. We have to keep the local character of our downtowns in

"I think in Plymouth, as in other communities, we're seeing some of that disappear. The question is, how do we redevelop the downtown so that it is in keeping with that charac-ter in recognition of the changing marketplace and the changes in people's living patterns?"

GREG GOODMAN, owner of Plymouth's Cafe Bon Homme and former chairman of the city's Downtown Development Authority, offers some solutions, but says busine people need to be aggressive to make them work.

He saw several of the ideas meet with success in Northville during the recession in the early 1980s, when he owned and operated MacKinnon's

Here are some tactics Goodman says can help bolster business:

• Greater cooperation among merchants "so that they can compete on a more effective basis with the malls. When I say coordination, I'm talking about hours of operation

and architectural complements so that there is a kind of continuum and a theme that everyone tries to

• "Marketing the town, and in turn, developing Plymouth and in-creasing commerce." Northville was threatened by the opening of Twelve Oaks mall, but is thriving. "Our Twelve Oaks is now named Laurel Park.

• Stick-to-it-iveness. "When it opened, Laurel Park was pretty vacant and it looked rather bleak for several months," said Goodman. "But they apparently knew what they were after and they went about their business in a very deliberate fashion to anchor their stores and to bring in the theaters, restaurants and health spas as complements to the retail sector."

 Accepting the advantages malls offer and fighting back. Malls can dictate who their tenants are and what their can do, he said.

In downtowns, landlords are concerned "first and foremost with a positive cash flow. A secondary concern is how well the business mix complements the retail downtown."

· Going ahead with the Downtown Development Authority's "streetscape" plan. What better time to rip up the sidewalks than during a recesssion so that when it's over, 'Plymouth can hit the ground run-

The streetscape plan would make shopping "far more pedestrian friendly. You can really lay out, through different paving mechanisms, whether they be cobblestones or bricks, paths for pedestrians. You

can also segregate them from motorized traffic with plantings, trees and that sort of thing. That's better for motorized traffic, and infinitely better for pedestrian traffic."

The streetscape plan also calls for uniform, aesthetically pleasing

"You have to be completely aware

of the importance of convenience to the shopper. That's how you compete. You make it as easy as possible for people to do business with you. Don't make it difficult — that's in-

Goodman's not ready to accept "totally that Plymouth is in dire straits. Granted it needs help, and it needs some coordinated effort that will help it compete, but it is in the throes of transition, and I think the marketplace has an uncanny way of letting people know when and where money can be made and when, and where it can't.

'Laurel Park stayed with their game plan, and ultimately things came around. The same thing has to happen here. We have to lock into a game plan and stick with it until it bears fruit. Ultimately, we will win or lose based on our ability to come together and dismiss all the petty bickering and get to the greater good," he said.

Plymouth has pluses going for it that Laurel Park never will, he added. No matter what they do, Laurel Park will never have a downtown park or tree-lined streets.

chips are down, "people like to put the blame on someone else's shoulders.

While Plymouth is feeling the effects of Laurel Park and other competitors, it will survive because it offers pluses that malls don't, Daniels

"How do you fight the competition? You can fight it because some people don't like to go to the malls. They prefer shopping in small towns.

"Also, the service you get in places like Plymouth is second to none," Daniels said. "Shoppers like dealing with hands-on owners who offer personalized service and the personal touch."

There is a need for business to work together more and to commu-nicate its needs to over-zealous gov-

ernment regulators, Daniels added.

Small business owners are the major employers in this country and ought to use their clout, he said. "Government needs to get out of business's way a little bit more. I think we need to open the door and communicate with our local, state and federal officials."

JOANNE HICKSON, SUPERVI-SOR at Little Professor on the Park, said Plymouth merchants can help themselves by accommodating people who work during the day.

Since the bookstore extended its hours to 9 p.m. weekdays and opened on Sundays, "that's all we hear from other customers. They keep asking, Why aren't the other stores open?

Hickson said the store's extended hours weren't necessarily a response to competition from new bookstores at Laurel Park and elsewhere. "We found the need for it, and we accommodated the customer."

Robert Sher is executive director the Southfield-based Schostak Brothers and Co., developers of Laurel Park Place.

Sher said the mall's success can be attributed to its "very good tenant

"It's convenient from a lot of areas, and the tenants are working

very hard to retain their customers," Sher said. "Also, it's not as complicated to shop in as some of the bigger, more complicated shopping centers. We're an upscale, smaller scale center with good road patterns, wonderful road patterns.

"You can get all around the entire area with I-275, I-696 and M-14." Sher said he's not sure Laurel Park is drawing customers from

small downtowns like Plymouth and Farmington. "I don't know that. I think we are

really getting more of our business from other shopping centers as opposed to downtown areas," he said. Downtowns that have an established clientele are still going to be doing business."

Prayers are answered for kids, mother

Just as one prayer seemed to go unanswered, Rev. Bill Myers, pastor of Faith Moravian Church in Canton, spotted four "miracles" in its wake.

For months the congregation prayed for Karen Barnett, a 33-yearold widow with three children, 14, 6 and 5, to recover from her serious

When she died earlier this month their hopes were dashed. But only for awhile

Technically speaking our prayers for her life were not answered," My-

But looking back, the story of Barnett's illness and death gave birth to miracles, he said

Less than two months before Barnett's died. Canton resident Christine Mattiello's two children, Angela, 10, and Nikolaus, 5, died in a Livonia house fire.

Mattiello heard the Barnett children needed a place to stay while services were held for their mother. She offered to watch them for a while, calling it "no big deal."

MYERS SAID in a sermon last week: "Chris has not even touched a child since (the death of her children), and she was miserable.

'All that love to give, a mother of 10 years, suddenly without her children, and nobody to give all that love And three children without a mother. They spent about six hours together that day. I think that is a

Mattiello became involved with Faith Moravian when she volunteered for a vacation bible school program her children were enrolled in last summer

She thought she might be of special help to the Barnett children, whom she imagined were suffering in much the same way she was.

"I thought by watching them there would be a connection, because they had so recently lost they're mother. I thought I could help them, because of the recent deaths of my children. I thought they might want to talk about death," Mattiello said adding that she also hoped it would be help-

She learned it was difficult hearing children's voices in the house

"IT WASN'T a bad experience, but it was very sad, because there's no children like your own children. But in some way she felt better after

"I can't put my finger on what happened," she said adding that she was happy to help them in their time

Myers said the miracles didn't end

He told his congregation how Barnett's plight galvanized a campaign to establish the long awaited local counseling service, Canton Family Services, which opened its doors last week. The organization has received about 40 calls for help.

Last October Myers tried to obtain help for Barnett's oldest child who was having behavioral problems. There were no services in Canton and when he was turned away from a United Way organization in Plymouth, Myers began his drive to get a local program.

United Way officials saw a story about the Barnett's plight and agreed to establish Canton Family

"CANTON FAMILY Services came into being from her efforts," Myers said.

Another miracle realized, he said. But what about miracles? Well, they have been happening. Her children were already into the homes of Karen's brother and sister," Myers

"There was never a question as to whether they would be taken care of or not," he said.

And then during a wake for Barnett at the church, her daught wandered into a YMCA preschool

"She just saw kids and the teacher and wanted to be with them instead of all the adults at the luncheon, Myers said.

Mingling a bit with the other children, the young girl shared their snacks and found a place to talk about her pain when she blurted out to the other children that her mom

'House Calls' gets word out

You're not alone if you've ever shuddered at the thought of being hooked up to life support when there's little chance you'll live.

Folks at Canton United Home Health Services offered some options last week on a radio show the company broadcasts weekly. The show deals

They want to get the word out about the durable power of attorney for health care form, according to Penny Rhein, a registered nurse and clinical director at health services.

THE FORM not only allows you to resist extra treatment, but you may also indicate that you want every medical technique possible, Rhein said during a WCAR broadcast of House Calls,

Emphasizing that this option shouldn't be confused with assisted suicide or euthanasia, Rhein said: "If you want everything done, you can indicate that you want as much treatment as

United Home Health Services, like all facilities aided by Medicare are required, as of Dec. 1, 1991, to make patients aware of DPOA and the rights it offers. The seven page form is simple and has detailed explanations of how to fill it out. But you're not obligated to have a DPOA.

"It's an optional form," Rhein said. "You don't have to fill them out."

Where living wills aren't legal in Michigan Rhein said, DPOAs are considered a legal document and let patients name another person who would make medical decisions if they're unable.

You must be at least 18 years old and mentally

competent to be named a patient advocate.

The form can be changed at anytime if you've designated someone, like a husband you've since divorced, as your patient advocate and you don't feel comfortable having that person speak on your behalf anymore, according to Helen Levan-dovsky who hosted the broadcast with Gloria

Bruhowzki, health services executive director. Copies of the form should be sent to your attorney, physicians and the patient advocate you've chosen. The forms are available at hospi-



Matt Whittaker of Canton soared last week Matt Whittaker of Canton soared last week when he entered the last chapter of an Eagle Scout project he's been working on for months. He turned in 1,524 pounds of pop and beer tabs to the scrap yard, that was about 1,463,040 metal loops. "The guy at the scrap yard said what a party," Matt's mother, Donna Whittaker, said. They gave him 27 cents a pound for the tabs. Add 288 pounds of scrap metal that included vacuum cleaner parts, engine parts, aluminum doors and all sorts of refuge. When all was counted, Whittaker had a check for \$463.50, which he added to a \$312 check from previous collections. Whittaker, 14, put the money together and gave \$775 to the Kidney Foundation. He plans to continue to save table until May.

"We're looking basically at things like students having instructional television options," he added.

Debate continues

State liquor agents oppose privatization

Gov. John Engler wants to get Michigan out of the wholesale liquor business - and that makes Michael Bacon nervous.

Bacon, manager of the State Liquor Store on Levan south of I-96 in Livonia, is responsible for distributing hard liquor to all party stores, bars and restaurants in such area communities as Livonia, Redford, Plymouth and Westland.

"I try to be fair, but when your job is on the line it's hard to be absolutely neutral," said Bacon, a 20-year veteran of state employment.

He's concerned about proposed legislation call-ing for the privatization or deregulation of the state's liquor traffic and Gov. John Engler's instruction to the Michigan Department of Commerce to devise a plan for private wholesaling beginning Jan. 1, 1993.

"Over the past 10 years, the state has spent \$500,000 on studies for privatization. Every three or four years the issue comes up. But this is the most serious threat since I've been here," Bacon

THE MOST recent study, commissioned in 1990 by the state Commerce Department and conduct-ed by Price Waterhouse, concluded that under privatization the state could not impose enough new liquor taxes to replace revenue it gets as the state's monopoly wholesaler.

"Privatization doesn't make sense. It doesn't make more money. It's an idealogical thing,'

Since prohibition, the Michigan Liquor Control Commission has been the sole wholesaler of liquor in the state, issuing licenses, setting prices and earning money from taxes as well as a markup on distillery prices.

The operation nets some \$95 million amually which helps fund education, fire protection, tour-ism and the housing authority.

Under privatization, an estimated 500 state employees at 72 statewide liquor stores will likely loose jobs, including the 12 who are employed in Livonia. The number does not include additional

Bacon's assistant manager John Fisher asks, We're such a big revenue-maker for the state. The money trickles down to everyone, including school kids. Why monkey with the system?"

THE PRICE Waterhouse study also concluded prices of liquor would jump under privatization, up some 36 percent based on markups from distillers to private wholesalers to retailers.

This point is of grave concern to Romeo Hesano, who for six years has operated a family-owned business called the Pilgrim Party Shoppe

'We'd probably go out of business. It's a tough industry as it is and when you do something like privatization, the bigger stores with bigger buying power can get better wholesale prices. They have the money behind them."

RICHARD GEORGE of the Wine Barrel in Redford Township shares Hesano's concern. George serves on the executive committee of the Associated Food Dealers of Michigan, a trade association that represents 300 dealers.

"I've been in the liquor industry for 30 years. I've seen Meijer's come into the state. Right now,

you can buy vodka for the same price from me or Meijer's, but ask consumers where it's cheaper

Meijer's, but ask consumers where it's cheaper and 95 percent will say Meijers.

"Don't get me wrong. I like Meijer's. I shop at Meijer's. But with privatization, I estimate they will take over probably 50 percent of the existing

(liquor) market. "This is the second largest revenue maker in the state. Why fix something if it isn't broken. If the state wants to increase revenue, why not hire someone like me, whose been in the business my

entire life, to tighten up the existing system. "There's too much inventory, too many distribution centers. I could fine tune the system and make the state an additional 25 percent."

Until recently, state Sen. Robert Geake, R-

Northville, whose 6th District includes Livonia, Redford, Plymouth and Canton, supported privatization. He now "questions the wisdom" of such a

We need to do a great deal of research before we jump on this."

A PRIMARY issue, Geake said, is money.

Present state income from liquor wholesaling could not be matched under privatization, even with increased taxes. And, he added, an estimated \$30 million windfall from the sale of current liquor stock owned by the state is misleading. The stock has yet to be paid for.

He also fears privatization means heightened marketing and advertising strategies by private companies. The state currently does no advertis-

ing whatsoever.

'I would be very concerned about any state initiative that leads to more advertising of liquor. More advertising could be the result of privatiza-

To vote in the Democratic primary, you can declare yourself a Demo-crat March 17.

"It's an absolute mess," said Re-publican state Rep. Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills. But it's the best advice the Grand Old Party can give

its followers at this point. Meanwhile, Michigan voters, accustomed to open primaries, continue to gripe about the party declara-

Why the difference between par-

DEMOCRATIC Party national

convention must come from a Demo-crats-only system — either caucuses or a closed primary.

The party says its rules take pre-cedence over state law, and the U.S. Supreme Court says the Democrats are right. "The National Democratic Party and its adherents enjoy a constitutionally protected right of political association," said the higest

Michigan Attorney General Frank Kelley ruled, "Where a political par-ty rule of general application contradicts a state statute, the rule pre-

After the Michigan Legislature passed a 30-day party declaration law to accommodate the Democrats, the state Democratic Party adopted same-day declaration rule. Said Kelley: "The rule also prohibits individuals who have previously filed a different party preference from de-claring their Democratic party pref-

As usual, people must be regis-tered to vote 30 days before the primary, but Democrats can declare their affiliation at the polls.

REPUBLICAN national rules say state law takes precedence. Michigan law says they must declare party preference by Feb. 18.

Dolan said House Republicans last week tried to force a bill out of committee to allow an open primary. The discharge effort failed on party

"A number of Democrats chose not to vote so they're not on record as voting for an open primary," she

It's possible that the Republican State Committee could adopt a rule allowing same-day declaration, she

said. But that would put the state party rule in conflict with the national rule.

So for now the official Republican advice is: "If you plan on voting, you'd better declare."

THE DEMOCRATIC ballot will have the names of Sen. Tom Harkin of Iowa, Gov. Bill Clinton of Arkansas, former Gov. Jerry Brown of California, former Sen. Paul Tsongas of Massachusetts and Sen. Bob Kerrey of Nebraska.

The Republican ballot will have the names of President George Bush columnist Patrick Buchanan and state Rep. David Duke of Louisiana.

A Republican strategy may be to stick with the 30-day declaration rule, however unpopular, because it might hold down the turnout for former Ku Klux Klansman Duke.

ARTHRITIS MEDICATION & "BLOOD THINNERS"

Many people hold that taking arthritis medication is dangerous because the medication: "thins the blood."

The basis for this feeling likely comes from the fact that aspirin stops blood platelets from clumping and this action in turn keeps blood from clotting.

This feature of aspirin is valuable if you need to prevent a heart attack, but the same attribute of the medication creates a hazard if you are to undergo operation.

Aspirin is in a chemical group called, "salicylates." Other members of this group differ from aspirin by only one chemical consitutent - the acetyl radical. Omission of this radical eliminates the ability of salicylates to stop blood from clotting.

Thus if you are taking a salicylates, that is not aspirin, you are taking a medication that will not "thin your blood."

Other anti-inflammatory drugs also decrease the ability of platelets to clump, but this effect is weak and rarely contributes to a bleeding problem. However, to be safe, surgeons and eye doctors often request that you refrain from all anti-arthritic drugs for 14 days before operation to prevent any possibility of platelet related bleeding. Treating pain and injecting swollen joints generally suffices to bring you through this period until you can return to your usual therapy.



Improvements needed in malpractice

To the editor:

I would like to offer an addendum Jeff Stewart's article/editorial that appeared in the Jan. 9 edition of

the O & E newspapers:

Myth 5: Attorney Stewart is fairly representing all the facts when he claims, "Medical liability costs add (only) about 1 percent to the cost of medical care.

The facts: Any analysis of the impact of medical liability on the overall cost of health care must include not only the costs of malpractice insurance and litigation but also the costs incurred in an attempt to defend against possible future malpractice claims (i.e., the cost of per-forming tests and procedures that would otherwise not be necessary).

Approximately 3 percent of the average Michigan hospital's opera-ting expense is related to malpractice insurance and litigation (about twice the national average). This amounts to more than \$500 million annually in our state. In addition, it is estimated that as many as 15-25 percent of laboratory tests are done for the sole purpose of defending against possible future claims of malpractice. In the U.S., this ints to more than \$3 billion in

amounts to more than 40 added expense each year.

Only 37 cents out of each dollar paid in a malpractice judgment in Michigan ever gets to the injured party. The rest is used to support the

Contrary to Mr. Stewart's asser-

tion, I believe there is room for improvement in our system.





munities, but some communities are treating it like it's the back door," said Bogdan, a member of Farming-ton Hills-based McKenna Associates.

Eight Mile use patterns are chang-ing in the wake of the 1989 expansion of I-696. Daily traffic is down as much as 50 percent along some stretches and businesses are concerned, Bogdan said.

Longtime Farmington Hills resident George Roberts said he wished planners well, but remained skeptical about bringing all communities

You're not going to get anything until the mayor of Livonia marries the daughter of the mayor of Farmington Hills," Roberts said. "Plain and simple, it's a turf battle, Farmington Hills goes its way, Livonia goes its way."

Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara, Detroit Mayor Coleman Young, Oakland County Executive Daniel Murphy and representatives of all 13 communities - including Farmington, Farmington Hills, Redford and Southfield - have been at least peripherally involved in the revitalization plan.

The plan's success, Bogdan added, involves bringing Wayne, Oakland and Macomb communities together in a single coalition. The coalition would not only seek newly available federal road grants, but also conduct regional planning.

'Most communities have done planning, but almost no community has done any planning with any other community," he said. "If we put out a report and it goes on a shelf, then we've obviously failed."

Communities aren't the only ones involved. Jurisdiction varies among the state and counties over the road. Eight Mile is a state road through Macomb County, an Oakland County road to Halsted and a Wayne County Road from western Livonia to the county line, Bogdan said.

Canton swimmers gain momentous win

Chiefs earn 1st win over Rocks

It would be an understatement to say Plymouth Canton's 104-82 victory over Plymouth Salem in boys swimming was a long time coming.

The Chiefs had never beaten their

arch-rival until Thursday night when they finally accomplished the feat in the Salem pool.

"It feels good to get the monkey off our back," Canton coach Hooker Wellman said, adding the Chiefs (2-1) were the last Canton team in any sport to beat the Rocks (0-4-1) in a dual-meet competition.

'The hype for this meet is incredible. I got here an hour and a half early, because I couldn't stand sitting at home. But it will be just another dual meet by next week.

Wellman observed the victory involved a twist of irony, too.

When the Chiefs previously made their strongest bid for a victory in 1989, Salem thwarted the attempt (89-83) in large part due to an outstanding individual talent - high school All-America Ron Orris.

CANTON HAD to wait three more years for its win but did so with the help of another Orris — Mike, the younger brother of the former Salem

'We've had better teams than this - back when we had (Jeff) Homan, (Scott) Swartzwelter, (Jimmy Hartnett) and (Mike) Helmstader - but they had Ron Orris and we couldn't

stop them," Wellman said.

When we lost that real close one to them, it was probably the best team they have ever had, and it was the best team we have ever had.

Orris was the leadoff man on Canton's winning 200-yard medley relay team and anchored the first-place 400 freestyle relay. In between those events, he won the 200 freestyle (1:54.19) and the 500 freestyle

"He's incredible," Wellman said.
"He comes out of the backstroke in the medley relay and goes right into the 200 freestyle. There aren't many kids who can do that. I learned that from (Salem coach) Chuck (Olson), because he used to do it with Ron

Olson suspected the Rocks were underdogs because of people like Mike Orris, whom Wellman could place in nearly any event and still expect to win.

"I HAD A GUT feeling there might not be an event we could win," he said. "That tells you we might be in trouble. As it was, we only won

"But it's probably the best we swam this year. To win only one event and keep it that close was pretty good." Wellman was a little skeptical of

his team's pre-meet status as the favorite, given Salem's long winning streak and apparent invincibility in

"I had a funny feeling," he said.

"We've gone into meets with them before and felt we had a chance. This meet was different. It looked like we had better than a chance, and they looked like the underdog.

"To me that's the kiss of death, especially against them. They've done that before - not swim well in their first three or four meets and then come up against us and swim out of

"But the kids were real confident.

They felt they could put it together and, with the times we had, you can see why they were confident.

CANTON WON every event but the backstroke, finished one-two in three events and recorded a number of personal-best times.

The Chiefs also had double winners in Craig Steshetz and Jeff Clark. Steshetz won the individual medley (2:13.58) and breaststroke (1:07.14), Clark the 50 freestyle (23.32) and 100 freestyle (51.77).

Canton's Mark Ealovega won the butterfly (58.39), and Scott Helmstader had Salem's only first place in the backstroke (1:00.45).

Steshetz, Ealovega and Clark fol-lowed Orris in the medley relay, and the Chiefs qualified for the state meet with their time of 1:42.96.

Pat Lancaster, Steshetz, Matt Tertel and Clark comprised the 200 freestyle relay team (1:34.65), and Lancaster, Ealovega and Tertel pre-ceded Orris in the 400 freestyle relay (3:34.18).

We had three of our four seniors on that (last) relay with Orris on the end," Wellman said. "That was a great way to finish off the meet."





'Evil Dead III:' Sam's baaack with his army

ANS OF the "EVIL DEAD" films anxiously awaiting the sequel to the two previous thrillers, rest assured that director Sam Raimi is hard at work. Raimi has be shooting "Army of Darkness" "Evil Dead III") on Warner Bros." special effects lot. But a warning for those with less than iron nerves: this realistic confrontation with the dark side may cause nerves to melt as it transforms nightmares into

Part three continues where part two left off. After reciting a phrase from the ancient book, bound in human flesh and inked in blood, Ash (Bruce Campbell), the hero and sole survivor of the "Evil Dead" saga has been transported back

through time.

He passes into another dimension — medieval England — when this Great Evil Force last stalked the earth in its search for human souls on which to prey.

King Arthur has his Excalibur. Ash has his chain saw, double-barrelled shotgun and a 1973 Olds Delta 88. A blacksmith later assists Ash in replacing his severed hand with a gauntiet. Working together, they make modifications to the Olds, creating the "death coaster." Move over Batmobile!

The movie doesn't depend on gruesome special effects; Raimi gives us more. He deals with themes that relate to Good versus Evil — power, succession, revenge and decention. To this Raimi adds.

FORMER MICHIGAN writer/ director Raimi has come a long way. His earliest film production days began at age 12, making Super-8 movies to entertain friends in his home. Recently, Raimi reached success with last summer's box office smash, "Dark-

Raimi's lugubrious wit and unique cinematic style is having an increasing influence on Holly-

wood's new movies.

Having seen Raimi at work, both in the past and the present, I recall a time, when he filmed a scene in my father's West Bloomfield store. He was instructing one of his friends in the art of properly hanging home a most book.

Even back then, Raimi — like Dracula prototype Vlad the Impaler — knew there was an art to inflicting terror. Vlad inflicted terror physically, Raimi psychologically.

cally.

Raimi wanted to slither into the darkest corners of the mind, that sacred, unthinkable spot where, under lock and key, we try to forget our scarlest nightmares. This technique can't be learned in school. It must be experienced in the mind, by searching our deepest fears and opening those doors of darkness.

WHEN "EVIL Dead" was re-leased in 1983, its innovative cam-era angles, gushing blood and ex-ploding limbs helped Raimi gain recognition at film festivals in Chi-cago, New York and Ann Arbor. Acclaimed at the Cannes Film Fes-tival, the movie won awards for both special effects and horror. Stephen King called it "the most feroclously original horror film of the year."

J.C. Whitelaw: A life after Car

In the dust of fractured dreams, disintegrated love and the dissolu-tion of a band, John Campbell Whitelaw has made a rather buoyant al-

Which in itself is remarkable feat, considering the Birmingham resident completed "Out of the Ash Can," in a time when most couldn't lift their heads from the pillows in

despair.

Not only did his group, Ash Can VanGogh, break up last year, the three-year engagement to his fiance also dissolved. When conducting his personal inventory, Whitelaw even marvels at it all.

"Here I'd lost my best friends, I'd lost my band and I lost my fiance," said Whitelaw, 25, who was one of the leaders of Ash Can VanGogh. "It was a real emotional time for me. It was like going into the studio with-out these (his two hands).

"But I realized not only did I still have my two hands, they were two very big hands."

The composure of "Out of the Ash Can" certainly belies the personal turmoil Whitelaw endured during its recording. Most of the vibrant folkrock numbers possess an upbeat tingle, relying on a mantel of catchy riffs and indelible hooks.

Upon closer inspection beneath the veneer of Whitelaw's pop sensibilities, though, the hurt is revealed. He carries no torches, nor does he wallow in his misery.

BUT THROUGH lyrical references to abandonment ("Don't Wake Me Up"), broken hearts ("Without It") and stolen souls ("Autumn Has My Heart"), the shards of unfulfillment cut against the rosy soundscape.

Whitelaw said "Out of the Ash Can" is not so much a testament of his pain, but a cathartic exercise. Though so emotional were some of the numbers, he found himself crying when recording them in his Birmingham studio, "The Barn."

More so, Whitelaw sees the 12song effort as furthering the musical

vision he shared with Ash Can Van-Gogh, whose folk-rock sound had made considerable inroads in this

"We were three writers (Billy Brandt, Mary McGuire and Whitelaw) who worked really well together," he said. "When it came down to choosing material is where we had problems. I wanted to go for the big enchilada.

"Folk rock is definitely in my heart. I always wanted to make this record with Ash Can . . . I needed to make this record. I needed to close the door."

Some of the songs were written while Whitelaw was with Ash Can given songwriting credits on "Under the Sun," "Twilight's Witch" and "Let it Shine" as well as perform on some of the numbers.

WHITELAW SAID band members still communicate after the break-

up, which occurred Jan. 11, 1991.
"There's a weirdness," he said, "but no bitterness.

In the realization he could do it alone, Whitelaw found a new support cast. He credits the production work of Dennis Forbes and mixing done by Gerard Smerek for turning the eighttrack production into a viable, seem-

ingly effortless release. Whitelaw admits there was a bit of trepidation entering the studio a few weeks after the band's demise. Once he cut "Without It" with Jill Jack on back-up vocals, the worries

quickly disappeared.

He's always had unshakable faith in his songwriting, which is inspired largely by emotion and somewhat by

the peculiar. On what was behind the soft acoustic instrumental "Rosolo," Whitelaw describes a red, cooperlike sunset he saw once looking out a window in Scotland. Thinking that was the sole inspiration for the number, he adds that it was the same shade as friend's pasta sauce. The jaunty, hopeful "Rainbows (The Telegram Song)" came about while sitting in LaGuardia Airport in New

THESE LIGHTHEARTED numbers are designed to provide balance to "Out of the Ash Can," which is available at some area record outlets including Sam's Jams.

Whitelaw intends to market the independent release to major labels for wider distribution.

"I went through a ton of realization, not only on a personal level, but a musical level and a spiritual level," Whitelaw said. "It was very enlightening. It's like I put a lid on it, put a bow on the package."

A FIST FULL OF CHAOS various artists

When coming in contact with a compilation release, there are three things certain to authenticate the effort: A. There will be at least one remarkably produced number that alone will make e worthwhile; B. Bands will unknowingly betray a wide variety of mainline influences.

"A Fist Full of Chaos" connects on both counts. Some 15 groups burn through 16 songs with unfettered zeal (The Generals get the honors of having two tracks "Goodbye" and "Rock N' Roll All Nite" here).

Although the groups are quite diverse in musical styles (Midwest power pop, rockabilly and techno are among those represented), they almost all share the bond of having their sounds reverberate off the red brick walls of Finney's Pub - a haven for some of the Midwest's more-motivated, creative outfits. Sue Summers of Chaos Network deserves a heap of overdue credit for making it one of the most vibrant scenes in the area.

Where to begin? How about the sensually languid offering from Vavoom, "Detroit"? Angie Hanna's voice oozes with indifference.

"It's a cool place/but it's not as cool as Detroit. It's a scary place/but it's not as scary as Detroit," sings Hanna, a model of apathy. This feeling of corresponds with some scraping guitar and hyp-notic bass lines that drip closely to the luring realm of Iggy and the Stoogies' "I Wanna Be Your

Dog."
While Vavoom exercise some restraint, others here plonder away with laudable amounts of passion. The Culture Bandits, a formidable trio, tear through their track "You're Someone Else" with enough unbridled energy to construct a railroad.

Another threesome by way of Alma, Mich., Instant Zoo checks in with another example of pure rawness succeeding with the alluring "Mile Marker 92."

Those taking a shine to immaculate pop sensibilities will find Trust Fund's contribution, "Try Again," an indelible, compact piece of songwriting while the immediacy of Bigger Than Mass' "White Rice on Demand" wants to burst through the speakers - a definite highlight in the pack-

Of the techno outfits who contribute cuts here, Skinhorse's "Souls At Zero (Water into Wine Mix)" manages to find a happy median between modern gadgetry and emotional rendering. By contrast, Wrath of Christian delves more towards the darker, ominous realm with "Thrill Me."

If a particular number doesn't impress you, at least the way the band tackle its craft will. - Larry O'Connor

Cronenberg's 'Lunch': It's not for every taste

Chances are William Burroughs never dreamed of cutting a movie deal when he dredged up his novel 'Naked Lunch" in the middle 1950s. His crazy quilt of sometimes incoherent tales relies heavily on detailed descriptions of everything from flatulation to homosexual practices to drug use.

Over the years, however, several directors have toyed with the idea of bringing the book to the screen. David Cronenberg has taken the challenge by using the text as a jumping board for his own fantastic account in which a Burroughs-type writer serves as the main character.

In 1952, Bill Lee works as a New York exterminator and as "Naked Lunch" opens, we watch him spray yellow powder into cracks and floorboards, sending roaches scurrying.

When he runs out of insecticide on the job, his friends (based on Burroughs' "Beat" buddies Ginsberg and Kerouac) suggest it may be a "do-mestic problem."

Arriving home, Bill discovers what they mean. His wife, Joan, is pumping the yellow powder into her veins. Bill's subsequent addiction to the stuff sends him and his typewriter on a one-way trip to Interzone, a mythical Turkish city where he composes what will become "Naked

CRONENBERG, THE Canadianbased director of "Dead Ringers"

The movie is partially about writing and communication. In one of the more unusual ideas, Bill's typewriter sprouts legs and wings, transforming into a cockroach which speaks through a suggestively-shaped opening on its back.

Later, a rival writer will communicate with Bill telepathically. In the style of Japanese monster movies, his lips don't move in sync with the words coming from his mouth.

"Robocop's" Peter Weller is perfectly cast as Bill. With his long, sunken cheekbones and monotone delivery, he's the perfect embodi-ment of Burrough's signature look and style. It's vital that he remain interesting to watch, since he's featured in every scene

'Naked Lunch" had me hooked right from the opening credits, with garishly colored rectangles intersecting on the screen. Add to it a jazz score by Howard Shore, with Ornette Coleman sax solos, and it looks and sounds like something out of an old

Otto Preminger movie.

Like-minded viewers will also feast on the ingeniously-designed monsters, including alien mugwumps who dispense intoxicating liquids from hot dog-shaped appendages on their head. Sit back and drink it all in and "Naked Lunch" can be a most satisfying trip.



Gateway to Olympics

Games turn off-season on in this Swiss city

Ordinarily, half of Geneva's hotel rooms are empty in February, the off-off-season for this cosmopolitan city's thriving tourist business. Not so this year.

The Winter Olympic Games in Albertville and 12 other venues in France, Feb. 8 to Feb. 23, will cast the Swiss city in the role of a major gateway to the international snow circus and as a center for logistical support and after-ski recreation

Geneva's efficient Cointrin Airport is indeed only 52 miles by road, a 90-minute drive, from Albertville: the nearest French airport, Lyon Satolas, is 83 miles

Two-thirds of Geneva's 13,000 hotel beds are in deluxe or firstclass houses, awarded five or four stars respectively by the Swiss hotel association.

Visitors wanting to stay in lessexpensive places ought to reserve fast. Count on \$90 to \$130 for a double room with private bath and breakfast in a three-star (good second-class) establishment. The conversion rate is 1.40 Swiss francs to \$1.

International and Swiss travel organizations offer package deals including transportation from Geneva to Albertville or other Olympic sites, along with tickets to events.

Travel agencies in Geneva also perate bus services to Albertville;

operate bus services to Albertville; the one-way fare is around \$55.

You can board the regular bus to Albertville, leaving from the Coach Terminal (Gare Routiere) in the Place Dorciere near the Quai du Mont-Blanc on Lake Geneva's north shore, at 9:45 a.m., 2:30 p.m. and 5:10 p.m. daily. The fare is \$36 one way, \$64 round trip. During the Winter Olympics the bus also will pick up passengers at the Cointrin Airport and extra runs may be added. For more information call 7320230.

If you have watched enough winter sports live or on television, Geneva's attractions will while away the long, chilly nights.

The Grand Theatre, at Place Neuve, presents a new production of Berlioz's opera "Benvenuto Cellini," conducted by John Nelson, with Thomas Moser in the title part. It may be hard to get tickets to the subscription performances on Feb. 10, 13, 16, 22 and 25 but easier for the nonsubscription evening, Feb. 19.

On Feb. 11. Margaret Price will be heard in a recital at the Grand Theatre, with Graham Johnson at the piano. The theater's production of Mozart's "Cosi Fan Tutte," conducted by Friedemann Layer, with Renee Fleming and Jennifer Lermore in the female leads, will be reprised on March 13, 16, 18, 21, 23, 26 and 29. Ticket prices at the Grand Theatre range from \$13.60 in the top gallery to \$146 in the dress circle on some nights. For more information call 212318.

The Grand Casino, at 19 Quai du Mont-Blanc, is the setting for frequent jazz, pop-music and dance shows as well as theatrical sketches. Highlights: Ballet de Mexico of Amalia Hernandez with its mariachi orchestra, Feb. 1; National Ballet of South Korea, Feb. 20. For more information call

Visits to several important public collections are free as of early January, but this is bound to change soon. The city government plans to begin charging admission to its museums and may offer a ticket valid for three different

institutions. Details are still to be announced.

Not to be missed: Museum of Art and History, at 2 Rue Charles-Galland, a five-minute walk from the cathedral, near the 125-yearold Russian Church with its six golden domes. The huge collection contains half a million objects from prehistoric artifacts to French Impressionist and early-20th-century paintings. It is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday to day. Maison Travel, at 6 Rue de Puits-St.-Pierre, near the cathedral, is a restored medieval dwelling of wealthy families, said to be the city's oldest residential building. It contains period furniture, a completely equipped ancient kitchen, painted business signs and an 1850 scale model of Geneva, house by house, in an attic hall. It is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday to Sunday. For more information call 282900.

OLD CITY TOUR: A stroll around the sloping, neltered streets of the Vieille

Ville (Old Town) is rewarding despite la bise, Geneva's redoubtable cold north wind there are enough cafes and taverns for rest stops

The main artery of the historic quarter is the narrow Grand-Rue, which is lined with art galleries and old-book shops, and leads up to the massive 15th-century city hall.

The Cathedral of St. Peter (St. Pierre), is a Gothic edifice that goes back to the 12th century and was built over early Christian sanctuaries. Impressive remains of the ancient structures can be

seen in the archaeological site below the cathedral.

The entrance is at the right of the portico that became the main entrance to the church in the 18th century. Access to the excavations is permitted from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2-6 p.m. Tuesday to Sunda Admission is \$3.60; children \$2.15.

Admission is free to the cathedral from 9 a.m. to noon and 2-5 p.m. (6 p.m. from March 1), but no sightseeing is allowed during services, beginning 10 a.m. on Sundays

The French Protestant reformer Calvin preached in the cathedral, 1536 to 1564, and virtually ruled Geneva as a theocracy. The Gothic interior of the church is sober, the large organ in its rear modern.

A side chapel on the right, in flamboyant Gothic style and with stained-glass windows, is a graceful contrast to the austerity of the main nave. In clear weather an ascent of the north tower permits a panoramic view of the city, the lake and the snow-

covered Alps.

Tower visits are permitted from 9-11 a.m. and 2-4:30 p.m. Monday to Saturday. Admission is \$1.80; children 70 cents.

The colossal Reformation Monument, with the 20-foot-high statues of Calvin, the Scottish divine John Knox and other Protestant leaders, erected 1909 to 1917 by an international committee, occupies 320 feet of a rampart at the foot of the Old City's southern slope (Parc des Bastions).

GETTING AROUND: Trains from Cointrin Airport to the Cornavin Terminal near the city center run at intervals of 10 minutes to 15 minutes, the trip taking just six minutes. The fare is

Fares on Geneva's mass-transit network of trams, trolley cars and buses are about to go up, probably to \$1.10 for short trips (up to three stops); \$1.45 for longer trips. Tickets must be bought at the vending machines at the stops.

All-day network passes, \$4.30 at the time of writing, are also expected to become more expensive; they are bought at the Transports Publics Genevois window in the underground mall close to the rail terminal.

dent. If you are one of the tho who travel to trace your family roots, you depend on happy acci-

I thought of that this week when I got mailings about "homecoming" events in both Ireland and Finland I've been trying for 10 years without success to trace the roots of the McNamee family to some specific place in Northern Ireland, and my est clue so far came by happy acci-

Ireland is a large island off the coast of England. Singapore is a tiny island half a world away at the southern tip of southeast Asia. It had not occurred to me to do any geneal-

My serendipity occurred among the food stalls of Newton Circus. Until recent years, the food vendors of Singapore sold their goodies on the street, but they are now officially gathered in food courts around this beautiful modern city.

I had stayed in hotels and ridden subways that put our hotels and transportation systems to shame but on that particular evening I was eating my way through fresh prawns and other delicacies at the Newton Circus food stalls.

When I was barely able to waddle, I wandered around the court waiting for the bus that would take me 'home" and found myself talking to a couple of traveling Americans. I don't remember where they were from, but I remember the moment that they waved toward an adjoining table and introduced me to a couple from Northern Ireland.

"I've been there several times trying to trace my ancestors," I said. "Do you happen to know any McNamees?"

"I know two of them," the man re-

McNamees are not exactly a multitude, like many Irish clans. There were only 12 of them in the entire Northern Ireland telephone book, and most of them are Catholic. Any genealogist will tell you to follow your religious line first in Ireland and my McNamees were Presbyteri-

"Are they Protestant?" I said

Two Protestant McNamees constituted a windfall. At that very moment, of course, Micky came running across the court to say the bus

was leaving without me.

my new-found Irish friend and ran. A year later, after a business trip to England, I had a chance to spend a few days in Belfast. The business card led me to a McNamee who may very well be one of my family.



Oriental cuisine **Um Goi!**

Um Goi! (That's Good!) That's what a group of Oriental cuisine afficiandos will be proclaiming Feb. 4 as the Year of the Monkey is rung in in typically grand New Year's style.

The metro Detroit Oriental dining scene is blessed with an abundant number of restaurants featuring the food from the Far East. Cantonese, Hunan, Szechuan, Thai, Vietnamese, you name it and there's a place certainly within driving distance.

MANY OF these "mom and pop" type establishments where the entire family gets involved in the day-to-day operations will be featuring a special menu for the Chinese New Year. Pot stickers, Princess shrimps, Peking duck, sesame beef and crispy fish will share the spotlight with dragon and lion dances, fireworks and toasts of good cheer for the new year.

ONE ESTABLISHMENT that's betting on a booming Chinese New Year is the Hunan Palace in Farmington Hills. Linda Parker and newfound associate executive Chef Jack Dai are planning three straight days of partying beginning Feb. 2 and continuing through Feb. 4.

No stranger to gourmet Szechuan and other northern regional Chinese dishes, Parker has been in the restaurant business going on five years while Chef Dai has been wielding razor sharp cleavers for more than 20 years. Parker supplies the bubbles and hospitality for the front of the house while Chef Dai, a four-star rated chef for his famed General Tso's Chicken fires up the woks with grace, aplomb and of course, excellent

When it comes to making great Oriental food at home, Chef Dai claims that unfortunately. homemade wok set-ups just can't cut the heat like 50,000 BTU's of fire at local eateries. Chef Dai claims that electric woks are about as useful as electric donut makers.

The secret to good stir frying is in the heat and the quality of ingredients, both of which can be found in abundance at the Hunan Palace.

With the international appeal of Oriental food constantly gaining momentum with new tastes, many large scale grocery stores are expanding their shelf space for more far eastern goodies.

WITH ALL due respects to the grocery stores, Linda Parker says that for a truly unique far eastern shopping experience, readers should check out the Evergreen Supply Company located at Lahser and 8 Mile road in Southfield. Parker calls it "The K mart of Oriental stores that features everything for the kitchen." I remember shopping there when I was a kid, especially when we needed some exotic mushrooms with magical names like "cloud ears."

Momma was never proficient and to this day wouldn't know what to do with a wok, but has turned up many a satisfying beef chop suey dinner in her Farberware skillet.

A random survey of friends found that most folks who dine at Oriental establishments stick with pretty much the basic Moo-Shu's and stir frys. Restaurants like the Hunan

Palace are proud of their effort to subtly bring around a change offering a scale of heat and spiciness to match the diner's preference. Many establishments offer on-premises catering and private party rooms that can handle an intimate dinner for two, or dinner for 200.

If there's an Oriental restaurant in your neighborhood or you wish to try the New Year's 10 course dinner at the Hunan Palace, call for reservations. Trust me. You won't be disappointed.

Additionally, celebration of the Chinese New Year has become the "in" way to cure mid-winter blahs.

THE CHINESE lunar year has a month of 29 or 30 days. The 15th of the month was always a full moon. Twelve months totaled 357 days, less exact than the solar calendar. Accordingly, leap years were given an extra month to compensate. The western calendar has

been used in China only since 1910.

According to the Chinese Zodiac, each successive year is named after one of 12 animals, in this order: rat, ox, tiger, rabbit, dragon, snake, horse, sheep (or goat), monkey, rooster, dog, boar (or pig). The Chinese believe that the year a person is born influences personality.

FEB. 4 ushers in the year of the monkey. Chinese astrology describes people born under this sign as achievers, clever, intelligent and even genius. According to Shen Yu, proprietor of New Peking restaurant in Garden City, "Chinese people regard the monkey as smart. In this year, people should follow the monkey's lead and develop ingenious ideas to make money.

Sounds like good advice in a recessionary economy! Chinese New Year holiday customs go back thousands of years when people celebrated for five days or more.
Traditionally, Chinese families prepare for the New
Year by cleaning house, settling quarrels and paying
debts. Parents and children shop together for special foods.

STORE ROOMS of Chinese pastry shops are bursting with ingredients for special holiday delights that will carry the "fu" or happiness stamp. Children practice an ancient custom of decorating the house with red paper, a symbol of good luck. Parents give red-wrapped "lucky money" to their children.

Guests come bearing gifts of sweet lotus seed, preserved ginger or the holiday's special red "luck

We've also been confident recommending an Alsace gewurztraminer or dry California gewurztraminer to accompany Chinese cuisine. "Currently, there's no better California Dry Gewurztraminer than the 1989 Z-Moore," said Chin. "With appetizers, I recommend the 1990 Coldridge Semillon-Chardonnay from Austra-lia. It's sturdy and refreshing — just what's needed as a first wine with spring rolls, Chinese ravioli or sushi.

"FOR A highly stylized fish or

chicken entree such as Cantonese Roasted Cornish Game Hen that's honey-roasted with Chinese herbs and spices topped with shredded scallions and cilantro, a bigger, fuller Chardonnay is needed. My current favorite is 1989 Newton. This wine also pairs handsomely with shrimp, sea scallops and pickerel fillet in taro's nest."

EGG DROP SOUP 4 cups chicken broth 1 tablespoon soy sauce 1 egg, beaten 1½ tablespoons cornstarch dissolved in 1 ½ tablespoons water 2 green onions, chopped a few drops sesame oil

Bring broth to a rolling boil. Lower heat and stir in soy sauce and cornstarch mixture. Cook. stirring frequently for 3 minutes. Hold egg high and slowly pour into swirling soup. Add green onions and a few drops of sesame oil. Ladle into bowls and serve immediately.

HOMEMADE EGG ROLLS ½ pound lean pork, chopped fine % cup dried black mushrooms 2 cups shredded cabbage 1/4 teaspoon salt

1 tablespoon soy sauce 2 tablespoons chinese rice wine dash five spice powder cornstarch egg roll wrappers

Report shows need for seafood regulation

Some area fish market owners and managers are reeling over a Consumers Union study of fish in February's Consumer Reports magazine. A few have noticed a drop in business and fear some of their customers are assuming bad things about

The article focused on the bacteria counts of 113 samples of seven different kinds of seafood - bought at 40 randomly selected stores in New York and Chicago. Consumer Reports said their analysis showed 30 percent of the fish was "already spoiled" and "9 percent was on the verge of spoiling.

IN CONCLUSION, the report said there were abuses in handling seafood, which is largely unregulated by the federal government.

Brad Vargo, manager of Jack's Seafood Market in Farmington Hills said some of his customers were talking about the article. Anna Georgiou, owner of Anna's Fresh Seafood Market in Redford, said the same thing.

Vargo, Georgiou and other people I talked to said they were upset with the article in Consumer Reports because the conclusions were based on a small sampling of markets. Fish markets in Michigan were not test-

On the positive side, Roy Phillips, vice president purchasing for Salasnek Fisheries, Inc., Detroit, which supplies fish to Jack's Seafood Market and other area grocery



cle brought out the need for mandatory seafood inspection.

FISH MARKETS in Michigan are inspected by the Michigan Department of Agriculture Food Inspection Divison at least once every four months. If violations are found, the markets are inspected more fre-

Here are some tips from the National Fisheries Institute Incfor buying and handling seafood.

When purchasing whole fish, look for eyes that bulge a little and are


When buying frozen fish, whole fish should be clear of ice crystals with no discoloration

After shopping, get seafood home and into the refrigerator as soon as possible. Eat it within 24 hours or freeze it. Use frozen fish within one to six months.

Fish is done when the flesh is opaque and begins to flake easily when tested with a fork at the thickest part. You can also check with a thermometer. Fish is ready when its internal temperature reaches 145 degrees F.

Winter Olympics: CBS has it covered

By Suzanne Gill

January 27-February 2

Roughly 1,500 of the world's best amateur athletes will gather in Albertville, France, for the 1992 Winter Olympic Games, which begin on Saturday, Feb. 8. Following them will be hundreds more reporters, many with radio and television production crews in

CBS, which has not covered a Winter Olympics since Squaw Valley in 1960, has dispatched an army of news and sports personnel to cover these Games, offering 116 hours of coverage over 17 days. The network has sold an additional 50 hours of weekday coverage to TNT, marking the first time an Olympics has been carried on cable TV.

Anchoring CBS' prime-time coverage of the Games are Paula Zahn and Tim McCarver. Highlights of the evening coverage will include a pre-Olympics special on Thursday, Feb. 6, the opening ceremonies on Saturday, Feb. 8, a variety of skiing and skating events, including pairs figure skating on Tuesday, Feb. 11, and ice dancing finals on Monday, Feb. 17.

Coverage begins each weekday during the "CBS Morning News, with Harry Smith and Greg Gumbel at the International Broadcast Center in Moutiers, France. Live events during these hours will include ice hockey, alpine skiing, speed skating and biathlon. In addition, half-hour wrap-up shows will air each weekday at noon (Eastern time) and once again after the late news. Correspondent Pat O'Brien anchors the late-night show, while announcer James Brown holds forth at midday.

Reporting and feature stories will be done by CBS stalwarts Mike Wallace and Morley Safer, Charles Kuralt and Charles Osgood, Andy Reoney, John Madden and former Olympic gold medalist Scott Hamilton. Their stories range from the sublime (French cuisine) to the insidious (the doping of athletes) and include dozens of athlete profiles, plus stories of tragedy and triumph in Games past.






