Library shelves expansion vote

A vote on whether the public wants a bigger library downtown is being put off until 1993.

The Plymouth District Library Board originally talked of scheduling a vote in August. But the board wants to show voters a model of the proposed building before an election, said Pat Thomas, library director.

"The architect requires 18 weeks to do a model of the building. We would have had 12 weeks if we started immediately" to be ready for an August election, she said.

There are other benefits to waiting. A delay gives the board more time to buy or lease the

property it is going to use, Thomas said.

ALSO, THE LIBRARY board can spend more time fine-tuning the \$7.5 million budget for the new library. And it's been suggested

that having the vote next year gives the economy more time to recover — and that could make voters more agreeable to paying more tax money for a library.

Meanwhile, a scale model of the proposed library could be finished by late June, Thomas said.

In voting to accept recommendations of a library board building committee, the board Feb. 17 agreed to "support the central business district with a facility which is responsive to the scale and architectural themes of its surroundings."

Also, the new library could be expanded "if necessary, at some time beyond the 15-year period that this concept is planned to accom-

modate," according to the library board.

The building committee recommended that the facility house 48,000 usable square feet and be designed to have one level at grade and one lower level with natural light.

"The building will be designed architecturally and structurally to accommodate a second floor above grade if additional space is required at some time beyond our 15-year planning horizon," according to a statement released by the board.

The current Dunning Hough Library houses 12,000 square feet.

To allow construction of a new library, voters would have to approve an increase in the library millage.

Supervisor Law: Shared services are in trouble

Are shared services talks ending, or just starting over?

Talks on merging fire and police dispatch operations in the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township are over, in favor of talks on merging those operations in four communities: Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township.

And while Plymouth city and township officials and union representatives were scheduled to meet this morning to discuss joint fire department operations, township Supervisor Gerald Law said if an agreement isn't reached soon, that effort will also fail.

"WE'VE GOT TO get on with our program. We've got to buy a pumper," Law said.

While the township recently opened a third fire station to better serve the west side of the township, a pumper truck is needed to equip the station and make it operational.

"The city continues to have reservations about the financial viability

of the police dispatch merger as proposed," according to a Feb. 19 letter to Law from city manager Steve Walters.

Walters said the city's cost of the merged two-way dispatch operation is projected at \$234,488, possibly higher than the city's cost to operate its fire and police dispatch operations separately.

"If the costs of dispatch merger are actually higher than our present costs, we must weigh the benefits of the computerized system against the disadvantages of losing the 24-hour staffing of our city hall and jail facility," Walters said.

Walters said the merging of police dispatching with Northville, Northville Township and Plymouth Township "would be more financially feasible on a four-community basis than it appears to be with two communities only."

Merging of the Plymouth and Plymouth Township fire departments would be cheaper than operating two separate departments, officials say.

But some officials have said that

Help's on the way for any failing firm

City government and business leaders are putting together plans to help businesses that need it.

Downtown development authority member Larry Bird proposed that the DDA appropriate up to \$2,500 for a program to offer technical assistance "to a few local businesses that are currently showing signs of distress," Bird said.

"The assistance would be in the form of a one-time one-on-one consultation with an expert in an area which the business feels that it needs help in," he said.

While the DDA has yet to act on the proposal, Bird said, "It'll happen

— It's just a matter of time."

ACCORDING TO HIS proposal, the process by which businesses are selected and offered help would be kept confidential, to avoid possible embarrassment.

On Tuesday at the Mayflower Meeting House, a seminar headed by marketing guru Jay Levinson is scheduled, to help the city's small businesses.

Bird said additional seminars for businesses are planned, on automating a small business and better planning of store layout and lighting.

The DDA has also been working on a development strategy to "help

Drifter is suspected in series of rapes

Police in Washtenaw County and Pontiac are still looking at David Buhnerkemper as a suspect in four sexual assaults.

Buhnerkemper, 35, was arrested in Canton two weeks ago. He is a suspect in a series of rapes that span three counties and four years.

He is charged with eight counts of first-degree criminal sexual assault, five in Canton and three in Washtenaw County's Superior Township. He is also charged with armed robbery.

BUHNERKEMPER, DESCRIBED as a drifter who lived for a while in his car, was arraigned on the Canton charges last week in Plymouth's 35th District Court. Buhnerkemper is a suspect in the sexual assault of two women in Novi's Knollwood Cemetery in 1988 and 1989.

His pre-trial examination on those charges is Friday before Judge John MacDonald. He is being held in Washtenaw County Jail.

where his brother lives. Police said he was tracked down using information provided by a woman who had been raped repeatedly that day in Washtenaw County's Superior Township.

Buhnerkemper is a suspect in at least two other cases there, Detective P.C. Williams of the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department said. One rape occurred in 1988, the other in October 1991.

JUST BEFORE the latest victim turned up, detective Williams had met with a Canton detective to discuss unsolved rape cases.

Buhnerkemper wasn't living at any fixed address but had visited his brother's house occasionally, Canton

Police Officer Tammie Colling said.

"He's pretty transient, but he does have ties here, so he had come here from time to time," Colling said.

Buhnerkemper had lived for a time in a 1982 Chevette, another investigator said.

Buhnerkemper is not suspected in any other Canton rape cases, Colling said. Police are asking any victims who may not have reported a rape to come forward.

THE FIRST Knollwood incident occurred Aug. 27, 1988, the second Jan. 25, 1989.

The cases, according to police reports at the time, are similar. Both women accepted rides from a man. One was waiting for a bus in Dearborn, the other had run out of gas in Dearborn Heights.

The man promised the first woman a ride home, and the second a ride to a gas station. Instead, he drove them to the cemetery in southwest Canton, where he raped them repeatedly.

BOTH VICTIMS are expected to testify against Buhnerkemper, Colling said. They were called to identify him in a lineup.

At his arraignment Wednesday before 35th District Judge James Garber, Buhnerkemper said he had worked for a temporary employment agency and had been laid off after nine years at General Motors Corp.

He told Garber he didn't have enough money to pay for an attorney. Garber ordered Buhnerkemper held on \$100,000 cash bond.

focus our activities so that we move steadily and deliberately toward a thriving downtown," said DDA chairman Lee Harrison.

"It should send a message that the DDA has a plan, based on input from many sources, to redevelop the downtown area," he said.

Among the elements proposed in the plan are formation of a business recruitment committee, coordinated advertising, improved maintenance and implementing the streetscape improvement plan, and better communication with the chamber of commerce and Old Village Association.

Also, a downtown study recently completed by consultants Hyett Palma Inc. has recently been finished, and a public presentation of

the study is scheduled for March 12 at city hall.

Mayor Robert Jones and mayor pro tem Doug Miller recently announced a series of steps to help business.

Among them are implementation of a business liaison plan to assure personal contact between city government and business.

THEY'VE ALSO proposed sending letters to troubled businesses to ask what the city can do to help them survive troubled economic times, and forming a parking committee to modify on-site parking requirements downtown.

The city commission has also approved in principle the DDA-proposed elimination of some downtown loading zones to provide more customer on-street parking.

70-year-old house says to owner: 'Fix me'

Shari West of Canton says that her 70-year-old house talks to her. "It says things like, 'I need help over here. Fix me.'"

Shari and her husband, Michael, have spent hours renovating and restoring their home in the small, Canton community of Cherry Hill. The house sits on South Ridge Road, which was named for the natural ridge that was formed by the beach of an ancient lake.

The two-story, gable end, vernacular cottage is also home to Kelly, 15, and David, 13, along with Michael's mother, Dorothy (May) West.

The land surrounding the house was part of a grant to Hugh R. Clyde from the state of Michigan in 1827. The present home was built in 1924 by W. Elliott on the stone foundation of an earlier house (circa 1850) that had burned.

The West house still has the 1850 Michigan basement with dirt floor. Victor and Grace May (Michael's grandparents) acquired the house in the early 1930s, and their daughter, Dorothy, married Stanley West in the front parlor in 1935. Michael has lived in the family home all of his life.

"I GREW UP IN the city," Shari said. "And it's nothing like living here. This house has a personality of its own. You can feel the warmth when you come in, and I'm very comfortable here. I feel like Michael's dad is here, and now there's a part of me in the house, too."

Daughter Kelly echoed her mother's sentiments. "I like to visit my friends in their new, subdivision houses, but I like coming home the best."

The work the Wests have put into their house is apparent throughout. They removed carpeting to expose the original oak floors. The foot-and-a-half high baseboards were also refinished. Shari created a small recess in the front parlor for displaying family photographs by opening a section of wall. You can see the back of the lathe boards where the excess plaster ran through the cracks.

"It's hard to put up shelves on these plaster walls," Shari said. "So I simply opened it up." Another interesting feature of the front room is a leaded glass window that used to be part of a box bay in the 1850s house that burned. "You can still see the black in the glass from the fire," Shari said.

Furniture and wallpaper were

chosen with care to preserve the country character of the home. Window treatments consist of simple lace valances.

Shari put a lot of work into the kitchen. "The back door had to be removed. There was an old cistern just outside and it was caving in." The old back porch was enclosed and the windows over the kitchen sink removed, leaving a pass-through between the two rooms. Shari painted the wooden cupboards Wedgewood blue with white knobs.

Cookware hangs on the wall next to the stove and a long row of glass jars above the counter holds various staples. A collection of old mugs is displayed on a strip of molding near the ceiling.

"Michael and his brother did the plumbing throughout the house," Shari said. "They replaced all the old

pipes with new copper lines."

THE DOWNSTAIRS BATH was enlarged by incorporating a small storage room off the kitchen. Shari stripped and refinished an antique ice chest that she uses as a towel cabinet.

The Wests have had plenty of adventures while working on restoring the house. There was the time that Shari took down several pieces of molding and thought she would never get them to fit back together again and the bolts that held them to the walls were 5 inch spikes.

There was also the problem of replacing broken or damaged woodwork. "You need wood from the

same era, so it is aged the same," Shari said.

When a nearby farmhouse was razed, the Wests managed to salvage some usable pieces. "Then there was the problem of lead paint. A lot of salvaged wood has layer upon layer of lead paint which has to be stripped before reuse, and it is a time-consuming process," she said.

The walls of the West home have also given up some interesting finds such as old newspapers, a 1924 license plate and a piece of wood with the name W. Elliott carved in it.

Shari said, "I've learned how to sand and varnish and cut. Michael says I can't have an electric saw yet, but maybe someday."

Part of the charm of the West home is the Cherry Hill neighborhood. The family likes the sense of community. Michael is a member of the fifth generation of the West family to live in Canton. Most of the other homes in the area are owned by descendants of the original settlers, and Cherry Hill is listed as a local historic district.

Neighbor, Melissa McLaughlin, summed up the feeling of community when she said, "Everybody here has known everybody else for years. When it snows, somebody comes along and plows your driveway."

Said Shari, "This house is my niche. I have no inkling to go anywhere else."

Tax freeze warms hearts

Assessment notices mailed to Canton property owners last week should read about the same as last year.

That's because a one-year freeze in property assessments at 1991 levels, approved by the state legislature last year, has taken effect.

It doesn't necessarily mean that land owners will pay less property tax this year, but it does mean it's an unusual year for property assessors.

"This is the first time, to my knowledge, this has happened," said Tom Monchak, an administrator in the Wayne County Assessment and Equalization Department.

Home sales studies determine assessments, and in Canton in recent years, the numbers have risen steadily.

Values rose 6 percent in 1991, 15 percent in 1990, and 17.5 percent in 1989, said John Spencer, the township's chief financial officer.

John McLenaghan, the township's appraiser, estimated the average price of an existing Canton house at \$122,000, and for a new home "\$175,000 and up."

He added that more than 400 new homes were built in the township.

That's not bad," he said.

STATE LAW PROVIDES that, with certain excep-

tions, 1992 state equal valuation or SEV, equal to half a property's market value, remain frozen at 1991 levels. A house's SEV, multiplied by the tax rate, determines an owner's property tax bill.

For example, the owner of a \$122,000 Canton home in the Plymouth Canton School District would pay \$3,600 in property taxes in 1991. That's based on Canton's tax rate of 59.03 mills.

The 1992 tax levy has not been set, Spencer said. While SEV are frozen this year, market values are not.

"From what we've seen, the evidence is that market values continue to rise," Monchak said.

Once unfrozen, SEVs will bounce back to reflect market values, McLenaghan said.

"Next year may be business as usual," he said.

While a higher assessment could mean a higher property tax bill, it also means a house's value has appreciated and the homeowner's investment is worth more.

Homes that changed hands last year or had additions or other changes are not affected by the freeze.

Anyone with questions can call the Canton Township Assessor's office at 981-1211.

The township's Board of Review, which hears property owner challenges to assessments, meets 10 a.m. to noon and 1-5 p.m. March 3, and 1-4 p.m. and 5-9 p.m. March 9.

McLenaghan said the assessment freeze is expected to reduce the number of complaints to the board.

Dealership turns lemon to lemonade for buyer

Nick Selimi of Canton says he doesn't bear grudges. To prove it, he bought another Plymouth Voyager mini-van.

"I forgive and forget," he says. Last week, Selimi drove home a 1992 Voyager from Fox Hills Chrysler Plymouth. His purchase of the vehicle appears to have ended his dispute with Chrysler Corporation over the performance of the 1990 Voyager he owned. He says that vehicle was a lemon.

Selimi says Chrysler and Fox Hills representatives encouraged him to buy another Voyager.

He paid \$18,000 for the new van, and Chrysler bought back the old one for \$15,700.

"We can't wait to take it for a long ride, maybe this weekend to Toronto," he says, speaking from Selimi's Salon, the Canton business he has owned for five years.

DAVE GALDES, Fox Hills' general sales manager, was clearly pleased with Selimi's purchase. Chrysler, Fox Hills and the Voyager all took some heat from earlier news reports about Selimi's van woes.

Galdes says Selimi had bad luck the first time. "The Voyager is the finest motor vehicle in the world," says Galdes, sounding like the car salesman he is.

"It is a great, great vehicle. Not all of them are, but 99 percent are."

Galdes' boss, the owner of Fox Hills Chrysler Plym-

outh, Jim Schebil, says Selimi's story had a happy ending.

"Hopefully, we took something negative and made it a positive," Schebil says.

He denied Selimi's claim that Chrysler and the dealership weren't motivated to satisfy Selimi's complaints because of the state's lemon law.

"The reason why we did it is I wanted Chrysler to do it because we wanted to keep him as a customer," Schebil says.

SELEMI SAYS that even if the first Voyager went bad — the transmission stuck in second gear requiring five trips to the service shop — he was impressed by the Voyager nonetheless. That's why he bought another one. He said earlier he wouldn't buy another Chrysler. He says he was also impressed by the offer of an extended warranty made by Chrysler representative Dave Crawford, who worked with Selimi. Crawford could not be reached for comment.

Selimi says his wife, Kathy, drives the mini-van mostly, doing errands and transporting the couple's three children. He says he hopes to have the vehicle for 10 years.

Crawford and Fox Hills came through, Selimi says.

"I was frustrated. I was upset. My time is money. I had not time to run around trying to fix this."

"I wish it wouldn't take long as it did, but I'm happy. I'm very happy to have a new car."

Store opening could start 'home improvement war'

A big, new Builder's Square store will open next week on Ford Road, right next to Mans Do-It Center, a locally owned competitor.

It may be home improvement war. Still, Doug Mans says he isn't worried.

"We're excited about it," says Mans, whose family owns four stores. The Canton store opened nine years ago.

"Obviously, it's competition, but I'd much rather have them next door than two miles down the road."

Builders Square, a national chain with discount prices, has "deep pockets," to buy more advertising and afford more purchasing power, Mans says. But the Do-it stores have more knowledgeable staff, better selection of lumber and comparable prices on many items, he said.

"PEOPLE WHO WORK here have been in the business 15 or 20 years,"

said Mans.

"It's putting one concept against another," said Hazen Hiller, Canton Chamber of Commerce president and Ford Road business owner.

There are plans to open an Olive Garden restaurant adjacent Builders Square. The Italian restaurant chain could provide competition for the Roman Forum, the venerable Italian eatery located nearby, said Hiller.

Linda Shapona, director of the Canton Chamber of Commerce, who met with the Builders Square manager, sees the store's move to Canton as good news for the township and retailers.

"Canton is in a (residential) building binge right now. I think Builders Square fits in very well with Canton's growth," said Shapona.

"I'm sure they did market research. They wouldn't be in Canton if they didn't think they could make it here."

It's been a tough two years for many businesses in Canton, and across the country. There's still plen-

ty of vacant retail space in strip malls along Ford Road.

Mans said Canton's Do-it Center is weathering the recession well and has seen increased sales annually.

Employees in the 80,000-square-foot Builder's Square are working hard now to prepare for the Feb. 27 opening.

"We're just getting things all set," said assistant manager John Novak. The store emphasizes big selection and discount prices. There are other outlets in Novi, Livonia and Ypsilanti.

The Canton store has about 120 employees, and Shapona said more than a thousand people applied for jobs.

Builders Square is owned by Kmart Corp. The Canton store will have lumber, hardware, paint, plumbing and electrical, garden and building departments.

Canton officials are expected to be on hand for a ribbon cutting ceremony Feb. 27.

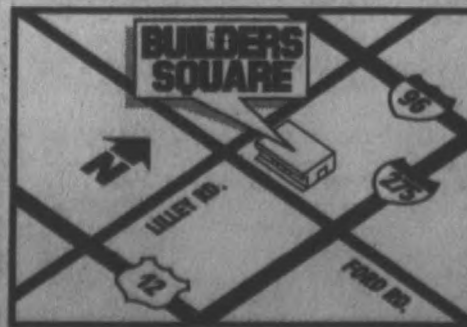

Districts pair incumbents but races unlikely

State Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-Livonia, said she's considering moving "eight blocks down the street" if recently drafted state House districts stand.

Bankes would face fellow GOP incumbent Georgina Goss in one new district. But she could also move into a neighboring district left without an incumbent.

Bankes isn't the only area state representative with a decision to make.

State Rep. John Bennett, D-Redford, was placed in a district with fellow Democratic veteran Richard Young of Dearborn Heights.

Bankes, who lives in northern Livonia, would face Goss of Northville Township in a new 20th District that would include a large portion of northwest Livonia as well as Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

But she's considering moving to an apartment in a nearby open district that includes Livonia neighborhoods south of Five Mile and east of Merriam, as well as Redford north of Five Mile.

"I've talked it over with my husband, and he's very supportive," Bankes said, of the potential move.

While saying she had "utmost respect" for her colleague, Goss said she definitely planned to run in the new district.

Here is how current representatives and local communities would be affected under the proposed state Senate districts:

● Faust, in the new 8th District, would retain Westland and pick up a section of Canton — primarily neighborhoods south of Michigan Avenue.

● R. Robert Geake, R-Northville, in the new 9th District, retains Livonia, Redford, Plymouth, Plymouth Township and most of northern Canton.

● George Hart, D-Dearborn, in the new 6th District, retains Garden City.

Here is how they would be affected under the new House districts:

● James Kosteva, D-Canton, appears safe in the new 21st District. The district retains part of Canton and all of Belleville and Van Buren Township, while losing Wayne and Romulus.

● Justine Barns, D-Westland, also appears safe in the new 18th. The district includes most of Westland and a portion of northeast Canton.

● William Keith, D-Garden City, appears safe in the new 17th District. The district retains Garden City and Inkster, picks up Wayne and part of southeast Westland, between Inkster and Wayne.

"I THINK it's a shame they put the only two (state House) women Republicans from Wayne County in the same district," said Goss, who is serving her first year in the Legislature.

Bennett, a state House member since 1964, said he hasn't made a decision on his future.

"I don't like what they did, but they did it," he said of the new district. "I haven't seen everything, but it looks to me like the plan favors Republicans."

The new 16th District includes southern Redford and Dearborn Heights.

While there was speculation state Sens. William Faust, D-Westland, and Christopher Dingell, D-Trenton, would face each other, that probably won't happen, either.

"He lives in what would be the district, but it would only be a short move into what would be his old district," Faust said, adding Dingell told him he was considering a move.

Dingell staff members agreed a showdown most likely wouldn't occur.

"There's some overlapping (between their old districts), but I don't think they'll be in the same district," Dingell legislative aide Joe O'Reilly said.

Other area senators and representatives face only minor changes under the plan issued Thursday by a Michigan Supreme Court-appointed panel.

New state House districts go into effect for this year's elections. Senate districts won't go into effect until 1994.

Urban legislators are already threatening to challenge the plan under federal voting rights law because opponents claim it lacks an adequate number of minority-dominated districts.

A Michigan Supreme Court hearing is scheduled for Wednesday, March 4. Written comments may be submitted to the court by Monday, March 2.

Business, conservation groups back anti-pollution bills

An industry group and the state's biggest conservation organization are calling on the Michigan Senate to pass a seven-bill anti-pollution proposal. One part would go on the Nov. 3 ballot.

"This package is a win-win proposition for Michigan," said Robert Patzer, executive director of the Associated Underground Contractors, Inc. (AUC). "It will improve the quality of our great fresh-water lakes and rivers, it will provide more state land for future genera-

tions to enjoy, and it will create 14,000 jobs."

The House passed the package Jan. 29. It is now in the Senate Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs Committee.

THE LEGISLATION would create a special account within the Michigan Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund. It would get \$20 million a year from the Natural Resources Trust Fund. Currently the money goes to the Michigan Strategic Fund,

a Commerce Department program.

The account would reduce communities' costs to finance construction to end their combined sewer overflows. It would enable many of the nearly 70 Michigan communities with outdated combined sewer systems to finally afford the construction necessary to end their CSOs, which occur during rain and snow melts.

CSOs dump between 16 and 20 million gallons of raw sewage and contaminated wastewater into lakes,

rivers and streams from Detroit to Sault Ste. Marie each year, a 1990 study found.

Cost of ending CSOs is estimated more than \$1 billion. Annual allocations of up to \$20 million would continue until the CSO account reaches \$200 million.

THE BILLS also would:
● Remove a \$200 million cap on the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund, which uses revenues from oil and gas development on

state land to buy land for public use and preservation.

● Protect the NRTF by preventing the Department of Commerce from extending the annual Strategic Fund diversion past 1993.

● Prevent any future raids on the trust fund for non-environmental purposes.

● Assure that the NRTF receives the first \$2 million in oil and gas revenues each year, with the next \$20 million received annually going into the CSO correction account.

MUCC, which helped create the NRTF, warns that the fund's tax payments on land acquired after Oct. 1, 1987, will consume that entire \$16 million by 2018, ending the NRTF's buying power.

"THIS PROPOSAL would assure that revenue from one natural resource — oil, gas and minerals — will be used to improve and preserve two finite resources, our fresh water and natural land," Patzer said.

Children's Trust seeks donors

Area social service agencies are asking taxpayers to make a contribution to the state Children's Trust Fund by checking off a box on this year's state income tax return form.

Half the money contributed to CTF each year goes to child abuse prevention programs throughout the

state. The remainder is held in trust. State support for anti-abuse programs will become self-sustaining once the trust reaches \$20 million.

Contributors can either check off the box themselves, or have their tax preparer do it.

CTF-supported programs are con-

sidered unique because they work with families before abuse occurs.

Programs for latch key children, parents of newborn infants and teenage parents are among those sponsored by CTF.

ORDINANCE NO. 92-1
AN ORDINANCE TO DELETE CHAPTER 98 OF TITLE VIII-BUILDING REGULATIONS OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH AND REPLACE WITH A NEW CHAPTER 98, BUILDING REGULATIONS.
THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:
Section 1. Chapter 98, all sections, are hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor:
ARTICLE VIII
Section 8.1. Adoption of Building Code By Reference.
That a certain document, copies of which are on file in the office of the Building Department of the City of Plymouth being marked and designated as "The BOCA National Building Code, Eleventh Edition, 1990" and any accumulative supplements thereto, as published by The Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc. be and is hereby adopted as the Building Code of the City of Plymouth in the State of Michigan, for the control of buildings and structures as herein provided, and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said BOCA National Building Code, are hereby referred to, adopted and made part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance, with the addition, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 8.2 of this Ordinance.
Section 8.2 National Building Code, Additions, Insertions and Changes.
The following sections are hereby revised as follows:
Section 190.1 Title: These regulations shall be known as the Building Code of the City of Plymouth.
Section 193.4 Rehabilitation: Buildings existing prior to January 1, 1973, in which there is work involving repairs, alterations, additions or changes of use, shall be made to conform to the code by applying the requirements of Article 32 or the provisions of Articles 2 through 31.
Section 114.3.1 Fee Schedule: Fees for plan examinations, permits, inspections and registration shall be as determined by resolution of the City Commission. In applying the provisions of this Code in respect to new work, existing buildings, alterations and repairs, the physical value of the work shall be determined by the Building Official on the basis of current costs.
Section 117.4 Violation Penalties: Any person who shall violate a provision of this code or shall fail to comply with any of the requirements thereof or who shall erect, construct, alter or repair a building or structure in violation of an approved plan or directive of the code official, or of a permit or certificate issued under the provisions of this code, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.
Section 118.2 Unlawful continuance: Any person who shall continue any work in or about the structure after having been served with a stop work order, except such work as that person is directed to perform to remove a violation or unsafe conditions, shall be liable to a fine of not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars.
Section 123.3 Compensation of Board of Survey: The third member of the board shall receive for services a fee of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) per day or fraction thereof, to be paid by the appellant.
Section 2906 Bonds and Liability Insurance: (for private signs on public property). Delete
ARTICLE IX
Section 9.1. Adoption of Plumbing Code By Reference.
That a certain document, copies of which are on file in the office of the Building Department of the City of Plymouth being marked and designated as "The BOCA National Plumbing Code, Eighth Edition, 1990" and any accumulative supplements thereto, as published by The Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc. be and is hereby adopted as the Plumbing Code of the City of Plymouth in the State of Michigan, for the control of buildings and structures as herein provided, and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said BOCA National Plumbing Code, are hereby referred to, adopted and made part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance, with the addition, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 9.2 of this Ordinance.
Section 9.2 National Plumbing Code, Additions, Insertions and Changes.
That the following sections are hereby revised as follows:
Section P-109.1 Title: These regulations shall be known as the Plumbing Code of the City of Plymouth hereinafter referred to as "this code."
Section P-104.1 Continuation: The legal use and occupancy of any structure existing on (date of adoption of this Code), or for which it had been heretofore approved, shall be continued without change except as shall be specifically covered in this code.
Section P-114.3 Fee Schedule: Fees for all plumbing permits, inspections and registrations shall be as determined by resolution of the City Commission.
Section P-117.4 Penalty: Any person who shall violate a provision of this code or shall fail to comply with any of the requirements thereof or who shall install plumbing work in violation of an approved plan or directive of the code official, or of a permit or certificate issued under the provisions of this code, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.
Section P-118.2 Unlawful continuance: Any person who shall continue any plumbing work in or about the structure after having been served with a stop work order, except such work as that person is directed to perform to remove a violation or unsafe conditions, shall be liable to a fine of not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars.
Section P-301.2 Public systems available: A public water main or public sewer system shall be considered available to a building when the building is located within 250 feet of the public water main or sewer.
Section P-308.3 Freezing: Water service piping shall be installed below ground frost penetration but not less than five (5) feet, zero (0) inches below grade. In climates with freezing temperatures, plumbing piping in exterior walls or areas subject to freezing temperatures shall be protected against freezing by insulation or heat or both.
Section P-308.4 Sewer depth: Building sewers that connect to private sewage disposal systems shall be a minimum of forty-two (42) inches below finished grade at the point of septic tank connection. Building sewers shall be a minimum of forty-two (42) inches below grade.
ARTICLE X
Section 10.1 Adoption of Mechanical Code By Reference.
That a certain document, copies of which are on file in the office of the Building Department of the City of Plymouth being marked and designated as "The BOCA National Mechanical Code, Seventh Edition, 1990" and any accumulative supplements thereto, as published by The Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc. be and is hereby adopted as the Mechanical Code of the City of Plymouth in the State of Michigan, for the control of buildings and structures as herein provided, and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said BOCA National Mechanical Code, are hereby referred to, adopted and made part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance, with the addition, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 10.2 of this Ordinance.
Section 10.2 National Mechanical Code, Additions, Insertions and Changes.
Section M-109.1 Title: These regulations shall be known as the Mechanical Code of the City of Plymouth hereinafter referred to as the mechanical code or "this code."
Section M-114.3 Periodic Inspections: Fees for all periodic mechanical inspections shall be as determined by resolution of the City Commission.
Section M-114.3 Fee schedule: Fees for all Mechanical permits, inspections and registrations shall be as determined by resolution of the City Commission.
Section M-117.4 Penalty: Any person who shall violate a provision of this code or shall fail to comply with any of the requirements thereof or who shall erect, construct, alter or repair mechanical equipment or systems in violation of an approved plan or directive of the code official, or of a permit or certificate issued under the provisions of this code, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.
Section M-118.2 Unlawful continuance: Any person who shall continue any work in or about the structure after having been served with a stop work order, except such work as that person is directed to perform to remove a violation or unsafe conditions, shall be liable to a fine of not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) dollars or more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) dollars.
ARTICLE XI
Section 11.1 Adoption of Electrical Code By Reference.
That certain documents, copies of which are on file in the office of the Building Department of the City of Plymouth being marked and designated as "The National Electrical Code, Seventh Edition, 1990" and any accumulative supplements thereto, as published by The National Fire Protection Association, and the NECI Manual, published by the Reciprocal Electrical Council, Inc. be and are hereby adopted as the Electrical Code of the City of Plymouth in the State of Michigan, for the control of buildings and structures as herein provided, and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said National Electrical Code and NECI Manual are hereby referred to, adopted and made part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance.
Section 11.2 Fees
Fees for plan examinations, permits, inspections, licenses and registration shall be as determined by resolution of the City Commission.
ARTICLE XII
Section 12.1 Adoption of Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Rules By Reference.
That certain documents, copies of which are on file in the office of the Building Department of the City of Plymouth being marked and designated as "Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control, General Rules and Regulations" as promulgated by The State of Michigan, Water Resources Commission, relative to Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Act 547 of P.A. 1973 as amended by Act 197 P.A. 1974 be and are hereby adopted as the rules and regulations of the City of Plymouth in the State of Michigan, for the control of soil erosion and sedimentation as herein provided, and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said Rules and Regulations are hereby referred to, adopted and made part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance.
Section 12.3 Local Enforcing Agency
The Building Department of the City of Plymouth shall become the local enforcing agency in regard to implementing Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Act 547 of P.A. 1973, as amended by Act 197 P.A. 1974 within the Municipal limits of the City.
ARTICLE XIII
Section 13.1 Fees and Bonds.
Fees and plan examinations, permits and inspections and required bond amounts shall be as determined by resolution of the City Commission.
ARTICLE XIII
Section 13.1. Moving and Demolition Permit.
It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm, company, or corporation to move or cause to be moved or assist in the moving of any building or structure from any location to another, whether on the same or on different lots, or to raise or, demolish the same, without first obtaining a permit therefor from the Building Department.
No permit shall be issued for the moving of any building or structure along, on or through any street, alley or over any public property where such removal shall cause damage to the streets, trees on or along said street, alley or public property; nor shall it be permissible to raise any building or other structure over or along any street paved with asphalt except by special permission of the City Engineer. Good, sound and adequate planing, to be approved by the Engineer, shall be kept under and between the rollers of the truck carrying such building or other structure and the roadway at all times during such moving, for the distribution of the load over the base of such roadway.
No building shall be moved over any street, alley or public place on skids.
No permit shall be issued, nor shall it be lawful to move or cause to be moved any such building or other structure that has been damaged by wear and tear or other causes, over fifty (50%) per cent of its present value as estimated by the Building Inspector.
Permission to move any building or structure from one location to another is contingent upon compliance with the Building and Zoning regulations of the Code of the City of Plymouth and, in the case of a dwelling, with the State Housing Act of Michigan as amended.
Section 13.3. Taxes.
Before such a permit is issued, the owner of the property shall present to the Building Inspector, for filing, sufficient evidence that the property is free of any encumbrances and that all taxes, water bills, assessments and any other City charges against the same are paid in full.
Section 13.4. Bill of Sale.
The applicant, if other than the owner, shall present a written statement or bill of sale signed by the owner that he is entitled to move or raise the building or structure. The statement or bill of sale shall be filed with the permit in the office of the Building Inspector.
Section 13.5. Bond Deposit.
Before a permit to move or raise a structure is issued, the owner or applicant shall make a bond deposit in sufficient amount (schedule of required deposit and permit fees to be determined by resolution of the City Commission) to protect the City against any claim of damage to public or private property and to reimburse the City for any expense incurred by any of its departments in connection with such moving or raising and to guarantee that all rubbish and materials will be removed from the premises, and walls and excavations will be filled and leveled to the existing grade and left in a safe and sanitary condition, and that sewer leads will be bulkheaded, and if such conditions are not complied with within a specific time period as determined by the Building Inspector, the City will proceed to do the necessary work and charge the cost thereof against the cash deposit.
Section 13.6. Balance of Deposit.
Within fourteen (14) days after all work is completed and after deducting all expenses for supervision and inspection of moving operations and any expenses incurred by any of the departments of the City, the balance of monies remaining in the cash deposit shall be returned to the party who shall have made said deposit.
Section 13.7. Insurance.
A liability insurance policy in the amount of \$100,000 shall be provided, with certificates of insurance provided prior to issuance of the permit. Additional insurance may be required as determined by the Building Department and the City Risk Management Consultant.
Section 13.8. Discontinuance of Utilities.
Before moving or raising any building it shall be the duty of the mover or installer to see that the sewer line is plugged with a concrete stopper, and inspected by the Building Inspector before backfilling, the water shut off, and disconnected, and the meter returned to the City Water Office. The electric and gas services shall be removed in accordance with the regulations of the respective service companies. Applicant shall obtain releases from gas, water, phone, cable television and electric utilities, and provide same in written form with permit application.
Section 13.9. Notice to Public Utilities.
The applicant shall notify any person or persons, firm, company, or corporation owning or controlling any telegraph, telephone, cable television, electric light or power, fire or police alarm, or others owning or controlling personal property on public property by giving two (2) days notice thereof that building or structure will come in contact with such personal property. The applicant shall pay for the cost of moving such structure as may be affected by such moving.
Section 13.10. Moving Permit.
Before moving a building or structure upon any street, alley or place, the mover, in addition to approval of the Building Inspector, shall secure a permit as required by Chapter 41 (OTHERS) prescribing the time allowed for moving and the route to be used.
Section 13.11. Cancellation of Permit.
If the time for moving exceeds the time allowed, then the Building Inspector shall cancel the permit unless the delay is deemed reasonable. The Building Inspector may cause dismantling of the structure in a location specified by him for failure of the permit holder to comply with the provisions of this Chapter or reasonable instructions to refrain from destruction or injury to public or private property or unreasonable delay causing obstruction of public thoroughfares.
Section 13.12. Application.
Application for permit must be accompanied by the following written information:
(a) Extreme length, width and height when mounted, of the structure to be moved.
(b) Present location.
(c) Proposed location.
(d) Route of proposed moving.
(e) Complete information, and plat if required, showing location of building at the proposed site with reference to lot lines and to surrounding buildings within 20 feet of the proposed building.
(f) Date when such moving is to commence, and the probable time required for its completion.
(g) Certificate of Insurance.
(h) Required Bonds.
(i) Utility releases.
Section 13.13. Schedule of Permit Fees and Deposits.
Permit fees and Deposits shall be as determined by resolution of the City Commission.
ARTICLE XIV
Section 14.1. Adoption of Property Maintenance Code By Reference.
That a certain document, copies of which are on file in the office of the Building Department of the City of Plymouth being marked and designated as "The BOCA National Property Maintenance Code, Third Edition, 1990" as published by The Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc. be and is hereby adopted as the Property Maintenance Code of the City of Plymouth in the State of Michigan, for the control of buildings and structures as herein provided, and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said BOCA National Property Maintenance Code, are hereby referred to, adopted and made part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance, with the addition, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 14.2 of this Ordinance.
Section 14.2. National Property Maintenance Code, Additions, Insertions and Changes.
The BOCA National Property Maintenance Code is amended and revised in the following respects:
Section PM-109.1 Title: These regulations shall be known as the Property Maintenance Code of the City of Plymouth hereinafter referred to as the property maintenance code or "this code."
Section PM-109.2 Penalty: Any person firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this code shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) dollars or more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) dollars or imprisonment for a term not to exceed 90 days, or both, at the discretion of the court. Each day that violation continues after due notice has been served, is continuance with the same and provisions hereof, shall be deemed a separate offense.
Section PM-302.13 Insect abatement: During the period from April 1st to October 1st, every door, window and other outside opening used or required for ventilation purposes serving any building containing habitable rooms, food preparation areas, food serving areas, or any other areas where products used in food for human consumption are produced, manufactured, packaged or stored, shall be supplied with approved tightly fitting screens of not less than 16 mesh per inch and every window shall have a self-closing device in good working condition.
Section MP-601.1 Heating facilities, Residential buildings: Permits shall be required by this section from October 1st to May 1st.
Section PM 601.3 Heating facilities, Non-Residential buildings: Permits shall be required by this section from October 1st to May 1st.
Section 2. Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed.
That Title VIII-Building Regulations Chapter 98, General Building Regulations of the City of Plymouth and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
Section 2. Saving Clause.
That nothing in this Ordinance or in the Building, Plumbing, Mechanical, Electrical or Property Maintenance Codes hereby adopted shall be construed to nullify any act or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or buildings heretofore, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 2 of this Ordinance, nor shall any act or right acquired or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.
Section 4. Date of Effect: March 11, 1992.
That the City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and when the same is published as required by law, and this Ordinance shall take full force and effect twenty-one days after this date of final passage and approval.

less a student can verbally and clearly articulate back to another person what has been learned, I doubt they understand."

These simple concepts have been known for years and those parents who follow them have the A students. This is a way of life, not a topic for your son/daughter's endless discussion and debate until the child manipulates the environment for the child's own pleasure.

OBVIOUSLY there must be some flexibility such as if a critical phone call comes in. However, don't buy the "I don't have any homework" routine unless your child is an all-A student.

By tradition, the Japanese set aside two hours a night for homework monitored by the mother.

Nothing comes easily. However, clearly established goals, a specific work plan followed consistently is the only road I know for the future scholarship candidate. Learning, simply said, does not come via osmosis.

QUESTION: My daughter just received her social studies term paper back. There was a grade on the front cover but not a comment throughout the 20 page paper. Some of the things my daughter wrote are

not even fact. What should I do?

ANSWER: On the high side, the teacher thoroughly read the term paper and gave a grade based on his experience. On the low side, he breezed through the paper, took into consideration your daughter's over all grade average for the year and put that grade on the paper. Maybe he had a golf match that afternoon.

The worst I ever saw was the English teacher years ago, when I was an assistant high school principal. Near the end of her career, she was worn out and should have retired but didn't.

THE KIDS knew she only read the introduction and the conclusion of term papers. So one of our very bright and clever students wrote a beautiful introduction and a brilliant conclusion in his term paper on students' rights. However, on the 10 pages in the body of his paper, he quoted word for word from writings by John Donne, the great English poet. He received an A.

Most teachers commit themselves to the task of thoroughly reading and commenting on term papers. A few cheat on kids.

What should you do? Meet with the teacher and tell him of your concerns. If you are right and your daughter's facts were totally wrong in the paper, he may take responsibility or rationalize away responsibility and feel comfortable knowing he has tenure.

Accused throat slasher ordered to stand trial

A 42-year-old man accused of slashing an 18-year-old Garden City girl's throat and threatening her Livonia friend at a Westland party has been ordered to stand trial on assault charges.

Mark Aird, whom police said had been staying at an Inkster motel, has been bound over for trial in Detroit Recorder's Court amid charges he slashed Kristina Roy's throat with a knife during a 2:46 a.m. Feb. 8 party in the 8700 block of Oxbow, near Joy and Middlebelt.

Roy was taken to Garden City Hospital, where she was treated and released.

Aird also has been ordered to stand trial on a felonious assault charge amid accusations he threat-

ened Roy's 18-year-old friend, Krystal Smith of Livonia, at knife-point. Smith wasn't cut, police said.

Judge Thomas Smith ordered Aird to stand trial after hearing testimony from the women on Thursday, during a preliminary examination in Westland's 18th District Court.

Aird, who has pleaded not guilty, could face up to 10 years in prison if convicted of slashing Roy's throat. He could be sentenced up to four years if convicted of threatening Smith. Aird remained in the county jail Friday on a \$100,000 cash bond.

AIRD HAD initially been charged with assault with intent to murder, which carries a maximum penalty of life in prison.

But Judge Smith reduced the charge on Thursday to assault with intent to do great bodily harm.

Westland police arrested Aird

shortly after he clashed with Roy and Smith at the Feb. 8 party in northeast Westland.

Police said he fled the scene but was captured about 30 minutes later, hiding in a back yard of a residence on a nearby street.

Witnesses told police that Roy and Smith had taken an intoxicated friend to an upstairs bedroom of the Oxbow Street house so that she could rest.

Roy and Smith accused Aird of following them upstairs and saying he would watch her, police said.

Fearing for their friend's safety, the women refused to leave the room, prompting Aird to pull a knife, slash Roy's throat and threaten Smith, Sgt. Don Haigh said.

Aird then fled the house, eluding police who had been called to the scene. He was captured and arrested about 30 minutes later.

Bill would criminalize 'stalking'

A bill to make "stalking" a felony punishable by prison time and fines has been introduced by state Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, whose 6th Senate District includes Livonia.

The bill seeks to punish those who follow, harass and threaten another person. It would provide severe penalties for those who are already under restraining orders but under existing law cannot be arrested because they technically haven't broken the law.

"This bill will put some teeth into court-ordered injunctions and restraining orders so that persons can be arrested for violating such orders," said Geake, a member of the senate's family law, criminal law and corrections committee.

"Two often in the past, these individuals could get away with harass-

ment because they weren't technically violating existing laws. This bill will put a stop to that type of behavior."

The bill defines stalking as "a willful and malicious course of conduct involving repeated following and harassment of another person" and includes the making of threats to a person or to a person's family.

Those breaking the proposed law will be guilty of a felony (second-degree stalking) and would face imprisonment of up to two years or a fine of up to \$5,000, or both.

Anyone convicted of stalking while under an injunction or restraining order will be guilty of first-degree stalking and would face up to four years in prison or a fine of up to \$10,000, or both.

"We hope this sends a strong sig-

nal to those who harass others that their behavior will not be tolerated," said Geake. "It will also give some peace of mind to those individuals who seek and receive restraining orders against someone."

ORDINANCE No. 92-2

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 9.203 AND ADD SECTIONS 9.203.1, AND 9.203.2 OF CHAPTER 112 OF TITLE IX-FIRE PREVENTION REGULATIONS OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH.

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Section 1. Section 9.203 of Chapter 112 of Title IX, Fire Prevention Regulations of the Code of the City of Plymouth is hereby amended by deletion of the existing section 9.203 and the following substituted therefor, and the addition of sections 9.203.1, and 9.203.2:

Section 9.203 Adoption of Fire Prevention Code By Reference.

That a certain document, copies of which are on file in the office of the Fire Department of the City of Plymouth being marked and designated as "The BOCA National Fire Prevention Code, Eighth Edition, 1990", as published by The Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc. is hereby adopted as the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Plymouth in the State of Michigan; for the control of buildings and structures as herein provided; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said BOCA National Fire Prevention Code, are hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance, with the addition, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 9.203.1 of this Ordinance.

Section 9.203.1 National Fire Code, Additions, Insertions and Changes.

Section F-100.1 Title: These regulations shall be known as the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Plymouth.

Section F-106.7 A permit shall not be issued until the designated fees have been paid. Fees for all permits, and inspections shall be as determined by resolution of the City Commission.

Section F-404.4 Each dwelling unit within buildings of multi-dwelling houses, buildings with two (2) or more dwelling units in residential occupancies, single family dwellings, hotels, motels, lodging houses and boarding houses, regardless of height, number of stories, construction or age, shall be equipped with a minimum of one 110 volt UL approved smoke detector, sensing visible or invisible particles of combustion, installed on each floor, including the basement, in a manner and location approved by the Fire Marshal.

In addition to the smoke detectors, a heat detector system shall be installed throughout each dwelling unit, including attached garages. This system will be interfaced so as to provide an audible warning bell/horn for each unit within a multi-family complex, including apartments or condominiums.

Section 9.203.2 Establishment of Limits.

That the limits referred to in Section F-2001.3 of the BOCA National Fire Prevention Code in which the storage of explosives, ammunition and blasting agents is prohibited are hereby established as follows: The limits shall be the Corporate Limits of the City of Plymouth.

Section 2. Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed:

That Title IX-Fire Prevention Regulations Chapter 112, Police Regulations of the City of Plymouth is hereby amended and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Saving Clause:

That nothing in this Ordinance or in the Fire Prevention Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 2 of this Ordinance, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 4. Date of Effect: Upon adoption of this Ordinance.

That the City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be published as required by law; and this Ordinance shall take full force and effect twenty one (21) days after this date of final passage, approval and publication.

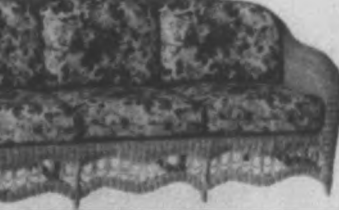

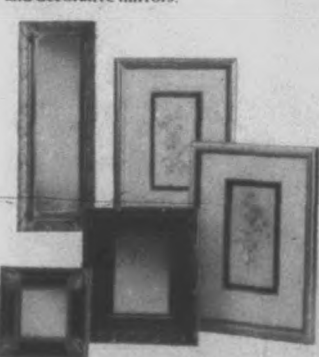

Rocks prevail in 4th quarter over Falcons

Anybody looking only at the score of Plymouth Salem's 71-56 victory over Farmington would think the Rocks were easy winners in boys basketball Friday night.

Salem did dominate the last 6 1/2 minutes of the game, during which time it created the eventual 15-point difference.

The Rocks clinched a share of the Lakes Division championship in the Western Lakes Activities Association with the victory. Salem, Westland John Glenn and Walled Lake Central finished 4-1.

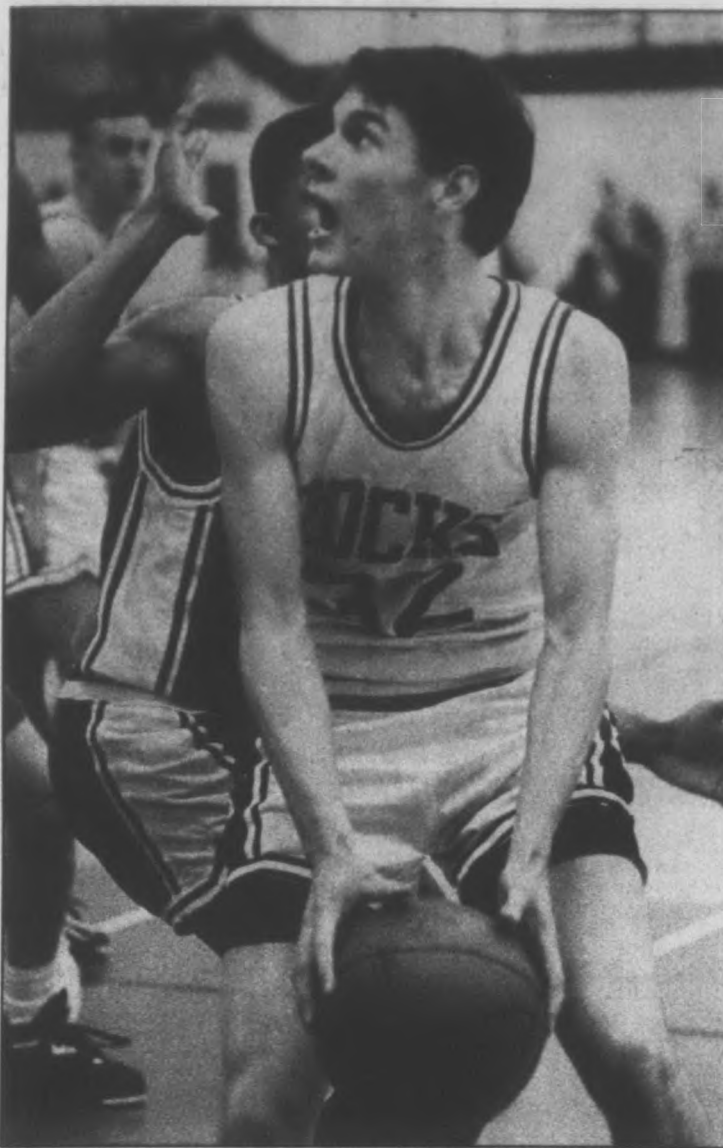
Salem, 8-3 in the WLAA and 11-5 overall, is seeded fourth in the league tournament and plays host to Glenn on Friday night. Farmington, 1-10 and 3-13, has a makeup game at home Wednesday with Birmingham Groves and plays at Livonia Churchill on Thursday.

"We're not going to be one of the teams picked to win the championship," Brodie said, "but now that our kids have tasted a share of the division title, maybe they'll be hungry to go back and defend their (league) crown."

Sophomore James Head was the key player for Salem in the second half when he scored 21 of his game-high 24 points. He made nine of 14 free throws as the Rocks gained their decisive margin at the line. Salem was 22-of-34, Farmington 6-of-12.

rebounds or hard-earned layups.

It was with mixed emotions that Tom Teeters reported the signings of three of his top players at Schoolcraft College with four-year universities.

Jandasek, a 5-8 outside hitter from Brighton whose father, Joe, coached SC before Teeters, is another solid all-around talent who figures to help another GLIAC team — Grand Valley State.

"I've known her since she was 4 years old," said Teeters. Jandasek received all-region team honors and was winner of SC's coaches' award.

Stack up classy snack

The trouble with sandwiches is that they are so easy. Hardly anyone has any respect for them, which is too bad. Given a little attention, they can be not only inexpensive and quick to make, but really delicious and unique.

When you want to make a serious sandwich, one that commands respect, start with good bread.

With all due respect to store bought white bread, you can stuff it with the rarest roast beef, the tangiest mustard, but it's still just a sandwich!

PERSONALLY SPEAKING, a baguette or mini loaf of French bread with a crust that is hard, dark brown and covered with seeds or herbs, and a center that is chewy and perfectly flavored is just what this doctor ordered.

To locate one of these delectable loaves, find a bakery that specializes in European baking. Even the thrift bakeries are opting for healthier breads with more grain choices than ever before.

Specialty bakeries abound in Observer & Eccentricland with many featuring fresh baked baguettes, crusty pumpernickles and multi-grain wheats. Of course, if you're serving domestic beer and Fritos, any store bought loaf of dark Russian rye or a coarse cracked wheat will suffice.

When it comes to fillings, everyone has their own ritual of stacking overly flavored luncheon meats and pre-packaged sliced cheeses.

Yours truly has a personal favorite sandwich which is stuffed with grilled andouille sausage (hearty, robust and with just the right spiciness) and grilled red peppers.

DON'T TRY to brown whole sausages and expect them to sit placidly between the bread. Take the sausage and cut it crossways into thin slices, and lay the slices in a hot skillet. That way, you get the flavor from the fat, of which most of it will melt away.

Meanwhile, place a red pepper under the broiler and blister the skin. You will have to turn the pepper every few minutes or so. The entire process will take about 10 minutes.

When the skin is blistered all over, drop the pepper into a paper bag and twist the bag shut so that no air can get in. Leave the pepper there for 5 minutes and shake gently. The skin should just peel off.

Cut the pepper into pieces about 2 inches wide, being sure to remove all the seeds and white membrane inside. Cut through any curves in the pepper so that the pieces are absolutely flat.

Next, boil some water in a saucepan. Core a large fresh tomato and drop it into the boiling water for a second, then drain and run it under cold water while peeling the skin off.

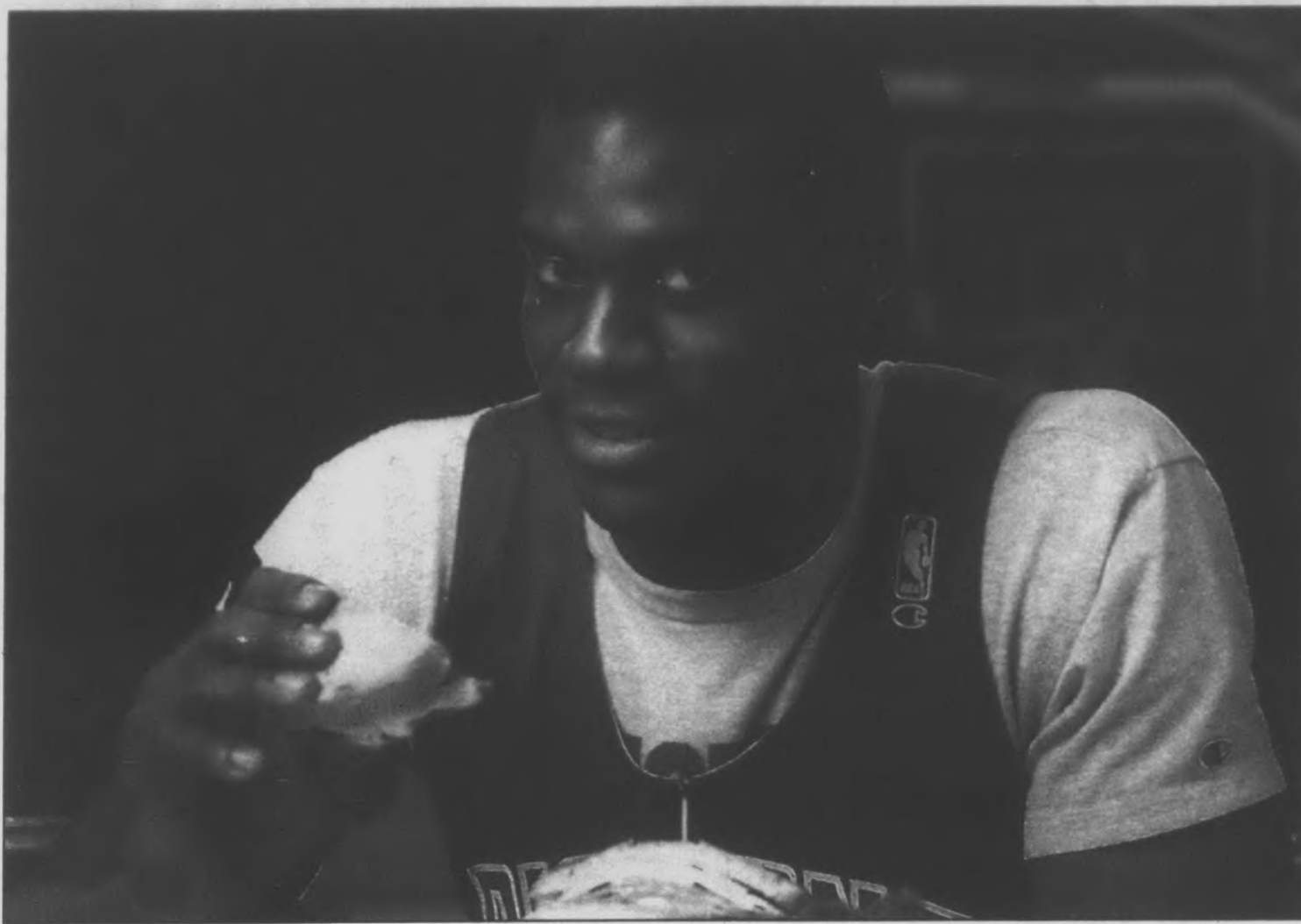
SINCE WINTER "hot house" tomatoes tend to have tough skins, this will ensure a tender bite every time. Cut the tomato into the thinnest slices you can unless you want to imitate Dagwood Busted when you eat the sandwich. The tomato will lend moisture as well as flavor. The main flavor, however, will emanate from the sausage and the contrasting sweetness of the pepper.

Now, for the most important addition, drizzle a little good olive oil (something imported and extra virgin would be nice) into a bowl or deep plate. Using a small brush, coat the cut side of each piece of bread with the oil.

Lay the ingredients on one slice, top with the other slice. Slather on a hefty dollop of honey mustard or something other than plain old yellow mustard and you'll think you've died and gone to heaven!

So forget the same old baloney and try something different, with a little class.

Recipes

Great for a crowd and easy to make, this delicious chicken casserole can also be made with leftover turkey. Serves six to eight.

CHICKEN TETRAZZINI

¼ cup margarine or butter, softened
6 tablespoons flour
½ teaspoon garlic powder
½ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon black pepper
1 ¼ cups, divided, sharp cheddar cheese, grated
2 cups milk
1 can cream of mushroom soup, 10 ½ ounce size
1 can chopped mushrooms, drained, 4 ounce size
1 jar chopped pimentos, drained, 4 ounce size
¾ cup chopped green pepper or to taste
6-8 ounces cooked spaghetti
4 cups cooked and diced boneless chicken breasts
In a medium-sized saucepan, melt the butter or margarine and add the flour, stirring to prevent lumps.
Cooking over medium heat, add the milk gradually and stir until sauce is made. Add ¾ cup of cheese, stirring until it is melted and well-blended and then add the remaining ingredients.
Stir gently until all the ingredients are combined and then pour into a greased 2 quart casserole dish or a 9 by 13 baking dish.

Top with the remaining ¼ cup of cheddar cheese and bake at 350 degrees for 30-45 minutes.

SWEET AND SOUR SALAD

This recipe can be varied by using spinach in addition to or instead of romaine lettuce.

Sliced water chestnuts and hard boiled eggs can also be added, if desired.

1-2 heads of romaine lettuce, washed, rinsed and torn into pieces
1 can mandarin oranges, 11 ounce size

½ cup sliced or sliced almonds
1 medium purple onion, sliced thinly
¼ cup crisp cooked, crumbled bacon, optional

Dressing

¼ cup oil
½ cup white vinegar
½ cup sugar
salt to taste

Mix the ingredients together and toss with the salad.

BROWNIE A LA MODE SUNDAE

One 3 inch by 3 inch chocolate brownie, per person
1 jar caramel topping or hot fudge sauce, warmed in microwave or in saucepan
French vanilla ice cream or frozen vanilla yogurt
Whipping cream

On separate plates, top each brownie with desired amount of ice cream or yogurt. Spoon caramel topping or hot fudge sauce over ice cream or yogurt and top with whipping cream.

If desired, garnish whipping cream with mini chocolate chips, chopped nuts, sprinkles or a cherry.

Sliced turkey, generous amount freshly roasted
Whole avocado, sliced (not too firm, but not mushy)

American cheese, 2 slices
Whole wheat bread
Mayonnaise

SUPER HERO

- 1 hero roll (6-8 inches long)
 - 2 tablespoons olive oil
 - 1 small clove garlic, crushed
 - 1/2 teaspoon crushed oregano
 - dash fresh ground black pepper
 - 1/2 cup shredded romaine lettuce
 - 1 large tomato, thinly sliced
 - 1 small onion, thinly sliced
 - 1/2 green pepper, cut thin
 - 1/2 sweet red pepper, sliced thin
 - 4 thin slices cooked smoked turkey or chicken
 - 4 thin slices provolone cheese
- Slice the hero roll and set aside. Combine oil with garlic, oregano and

black pepper. Mix well. Toss in lettuce and toss to coat. Place on hero roll and top with remaining ingredients. Enjoy.

VEGETARIAN PITA

- 1 whole wheat pita bread
- 1 8-ounce can red kidney beans, drained
- 1/4 cup thin sliced green beans
- 1/4 cup crumbled feta cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped parsley
- 2 tablespoons pine nuts or toasted sesame seeds
- 2 tablespoons chopped onion
- 1 8-ounce can garbanzo beans, drained and crushed
- 4 tablespoons olive oil

SHRIMP BUNS

- 4 fresh, large crusty rolls
 - 1/2 cup Hollandaise sauce
 - 1/4 cup sour cream
 - 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 3 tablespoons red wine vinegar
1 clove garlic, crushed
1/2 teaspoon thyme, crushed
- Cut the edge off the pita so it can be stuffed. Set aside. Blend together the kidney beans, green beans, cheese, parsley, nuts and onion. Set aside.

 - 1/2 cup finely chopped celery

CURRIED CHICKEN SALAD SANDWICHES

- 3 cups cubed, cooked chicken
- 1 cup celery, diced
- 1 tart apple, diced
- 1 can (11 oz.) mandarin oranges, drained

- 1/2 cup macadamia nuts, chopped
 - 1 cup mayonnaise
 - 2 teaspoons curry powder
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1/4 cup crumbled blue cheese
- Combine all ingredients and mix well. Chill, then stuff between bread or rolls and garnish with a kosher dill.

Ruffino known for chianti

For well over 100 years, the House of Ruffino has maintained and nurtured its position at the forefront of the Italian wine industry. Founded by cousins Ilario and Leopoldo Ruffino in 1877, the young company set up headquarters in the Tuscan village of Pontassieve, 10 miles from the city of Florence.

Ruffino grew rapidly, acquiring vineyards yielding top quality grapes and expanding throughout Italy and other parts of Europe. They became official purveyors to the Italian and Swedish Royal Houses as well as the Vatican.

In 1913, the Ruffino name and wineries were purchased by the Folonari family. From the beginning, they had a 20th century approach to both viticulture and marketing. Ruffino was the first firm to market chianti worldwide before World War I.

Today, third generation Ambrogio Folonari oversees all facets of the family's wine business. In fact, the Folonaris are largely responsible for a proactive role in seeking a deservedly serious image for chianti, the wine many Americans still equate with old-style pizza parlors.

As a wine-producing company, Ruffino realized that the picturesque straw-covered bottle detracted from perception of chianti as a well-made, serious yet versatile wine. In 1975, they were the first producer to introduce chianti in a new, stylish Florentine bottle.

Production and warehouse facilities are thoroughly modern. However, original 18th century cellars are still in use since they offer optimum wine aging conditions.

With 3,000 vineyard acres in the Tuscan hills, the heart of Chianti Classico, Ruffino is one of the largest land holders within this appellation. Here they have their Montemasso and Zano estates, the origin of most of the limited supply of Ruffino.

fino's flagship brand Chianti Classico Reserve Ducale.

PRIOR TO 1957, when it was first launched in the U.S. wine market, it was the wine reserved for the private use of the Duke of Aosta who, during his frequent journeys to visit the pope, would travel through the Ruffino estates. The wine became his favorite, hence the name Riserva Ducale, the "Duke's Reserve."

This classically made Chianti Classico with its handsome gold label is produced only in the finest vineyards and showcases elegant fruit maturity with a soft, appealing finish. It is 90 percent sangiovese, seven percent canaiolo and three percent trebbiano.

Some Chianti prices have gone through the roof, but priced at \$14.50, the 1987 Chianti Classico Riserva Ducale is a price winner highlighted by dark cherry aromas and flavors.

To produce this wine, Ruffino uses the traditional "governo" method which involves adding juice obtained from selected grapes previously dried on racks. This addition produces a secondary fermentation which adds not only softness, but enhanced body to the wine which is complexed

WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

1990 Ruffino Chianti (\$9) presents a younger, fruitier bottling than the Riserva Ducale. It's produced from the three traditional chianti grapes in roughly the same percentages as the Riserva Ducale. It's stylish, with spicy, red berry characters and a hint of violets in the aroma. The soft tannins in the finish make it an ideal accompaniment to any red meat, game birds or medium-flavored cheeses.

by a nine-month oak aging period. With its substantial body, it is excellent with dry and medium range cheeses, such as Parmesan or sharp, aged cheddar. Rabbit in wine sauce, stewed veal preparations and lamb or light beef dishes pair deliciously.

Following a tasting of this wine, it's easy to understand that after chianti, Ambrogio Folonari's favorite wine is red Burgundy.

"I attempt to emulate the velvety softness of Burgundian pinot noir in the Chianti Classico Riserva Ducale," he said.

Devil of a way to sing the blues

A listen to Keri Leigh and the Blue Devils' "Blue Devil Blues" reveals a resonant voice steeped in the blues tradition. Keri Leigh is a singer, but the 23-year old Austin, Texas, resident is also quite the student.

Her quest for blues knowledge remains insatiable.

Leigh is an author and is writing two books, one on late blues guitarist Stevie Ray Vaughan. The other book is on Elvis Presley through the words of bodyguard Lamar Fike.

Just the mere mention of her wide range of influences — Etta James, Bessie Smith, Big Mama Thornton and Billie Holiday — produces a coo of delight from her over the phone.

This reverence for past masters serves as a catalyst, sparking a hue throughout the outfit's burning up-tempo blues debut on Amazing Records. Leigh's throaty howls are at the forefront of an unrelenting R&B guitar attack.

On the opening track, Leigh covers Willie Dixon's "I'm Ready" in raucous fashion — showcasing one aspect of her wide vocal range that draws comparisons from Janis Joplin to Etta James.

Leigh and her musical collaborator (and husband) Mark Lyons also rekindle numbers associated with Robert Johnson, Muddy Waters and Slim Harpo.

"WE ARE sort of revisionists in that sense," said Leigh, whose Blue Devils perform Thursday,

Feb. 27, at Sully's. "I think what it's called is the new tradition. We're trying to keep this tradition alive because I don't think there's enough folks out there who are interested in preserving the traditional forms of the blues — the Delta, acoustic Texas blues and the Chicago style.

"Everything you hear today is contemporary, which is good because blues has to change with the times. Then again, it's hard to know to where you are going unless you've been there."

Leigh has been there, though her youthful 23 year age belies that.

Leigh began singing at 13, performing in night clubs while still going to high school. An ardent archivist of the blues, she formed the Blues Society in Oklahoma.

Much like the masters she revered, though, Leigh indulged in ancillary aspects of business. She would belt out sets and abuse her throat with cigarettes and drink. In the process she developed nodes, which required surgery and made her leave the business for four years.

Her biggest hero, Stevie Ray Vaughan, a person whom Leigh had interviewed several times, became her mentor. And, later, the guitarist

served as an inspiration to stop her in a path of self-destruction.

"I WAS sinking fast," she said. "I went through a bout with cocaine to just about everything: pills, alcohol and all that stuff. I really had to calm that down. I was going nowhere fast and killing myself.

"When I saw Stevie go clean... it all of sudden made sense to me. It was sort of like finding the steering wheel of a car."

When Leigh and Blue Devils guitarist Mark Lyons transplanted to Austin, Vaughan helped in the process. He showed her what places to live, where to play.

Austin served as the perfect springboard for Leigh and the Blue Devils. The competition is fierce as the Texas city is a haven for musical talent.

Leigh and the Blue Devils also signed with Austin-based Amazing Records, promptly releasing "Blue Devil Blues."

There is a dynamic on the LP, mainly the result of Leigh's traditional blues purism and the rest of the band's contemporary influences.

"Everybody gets along. There is a little bit of tension in that most of player in the band were raised in rock backgrounds and one of them has a country background. I'm always preaching the blues. Blues, blues, blues... Sometimes, I'm sure they'd like to try something else."

Sue Summers brings Chaos to the music scene

Amid the discord and fragmentation of any local music scene, one thing can at least be counted on here — Chaos.

The label operated out of the Detroit home of area promoter Sue Summers has turned confusion into collaboration and has quickly become this community's most viable and productive source for creative music.

Since its informal start in 1990, the Chaos Network & Records has released two stellar compilation efforts — the most recent being "A Fist Full of Chaos." Also, LPs by The Generals ("You'll Eat What We're Cookin'") and by Blue Nimbus'

("Jaded") have been issued by the local label.

More so, Chaos Network & Records has become a sterling example of what an aggregate effort by several bands can accomplish.

"She (Summers) has made things move a lot faster," said Ken Haas of Livonia, a member of the Culture Bandits. "Instead of having bands chasing each other's tails, she's pulled us together."

Chaos grew as an extension of Summers' unshakable belief in local music and of Detroit itself.

A 1984 graduate of Detroit Dominican High School, Summers became enamored in the hardcore punk scene of the early '80s when bands such as Negative Approach, Reputations and Mutants ruled and clubs such as the Red Carpet and the Punch and Judy were popular haunts.

SUMMERS LATER operated a clothing and record store, also named Chaos, inside Todd's nightclub in Detroit.

Three years ago, she began booking bands into the cozy confines of Finney's Pub in Detroit. In retrospective, her efforts became something of a catalyst.

As the club's popularity increased, so did the fortunes of the bands who regularly performed there. Summers and the handful of groups de-

cid to take things a step further.

"Everyone was keeping secrets and not helping each other," Summers said. "Bands are all in the same boat. They should be helping each other out."

Chaos Network & Records became an epicenter of movement, taking care of bookings, accounting, promoting bands and releasing albums.

Chaos Network & Records has evolved into a support system. Each month, Summers and members of Grady Hazy or Skinhorse congregate at the home of Generals member Tony Cole to share their insights and their frustrations.

"Up until Sue put this together," Cole said, "everybody was so suspicious of one another. I'm not going to tell you how to get booked into

Paychecks because you'll cut into my piece of the pie." That's backwards thinking.

"(Instead) it's my buddy owes me a favor. You've got a contact and you let them in on it. Then they say, 'Hey I've got this cool club in Pittsburgh.' Now you're doing two clubs. It's straight out of kindergarten. Share your toys."

Chaos Records & Network will present a record release party for "A Fist Full of Chaos" on Saturday, Feb. 29, at St. Andrew's Hall, 431 E. Congress, Detroit. The show will feature The Generals, Blue Nimbus, Grady Hazy, Watershed, Culture Bandits and Skinhorse along with special guests Flyin' Saucers and Vavoom. For information, call 981-MELT.

"Mississippi Masala" isn't wild, or outrageous. Its director doesn't possess an over-abundance of...

...there's something irresistible about Mira Nair's love for about the controversial relationship between a black man and an Indian woman in the deep South.

...he previously directed the acclaimed "Salaam Bombay," the story of a poverty-stricken boy on the streets of India.

...Mississippi Masala", currently at Maple Theatre, opens with an Indian family fleeing Idi Amin's government in Uganda for London and then the United States.

...years later, the father (Roshan Seth) writes countless letters to the Ugandan government in the hope of reclaiming his property. His wife, and especially daughter (Sarita Choudhury), have no interest in re-

Demetrius, an ambitious Mississippi native who runs his own carpet-cleaning business. He first dates Mina to make an old girlfriend jealous and then finds himself falling in love with her.

The relationship doesn't sit well with the Indians, who claim to profess a kinship to African Americans because they're both people of color. Inter-racial dating is another story.

The black community, meanwhile, chastises Demetrius for sleeping with what they term a white woman.

Where Spike Lee's "Jungle Fever" was a topical, almost cliched, statement about black-and-white relations, the message here is more

cleverly shaded and sincere.

The understated performance by Denzel Washington makes you forget he's a star. He looks appropriately straight arrow in his spiffy blue carpet-cleaning uniform. He proudly displays his business motto, "Your dirt is our bread and butter," on his van and in his sales pitch.

ROSHAN SETH, so effective in "My Beautiful Laundrette," brings a wonderfully obsessed quality to the father who longs for home. He adds another touch of professionalism to what is often an uneven production.

Sarita Choudhury, likable enough as Mina, seems uncomfortable next

to a powerhouse like Washington. You can almost sense him trying to tone down his performance so he won't overshadow her.

Writer Sooni Taraporevala, meanwhile, creates black characters who remain just that — black characters. There is considerably more insight into the complexities of the families who work and reside in a growing number of Indian-owned motels.

At almost two hours, "Mississippi Masala" unfolds so leisurely that it almost drags. Director Nair is lucky to have Ed Lachman behind the camera, whose obvious love of the wild colors in the Indian clothing and homemade shrines gives "Masala" its true flavor.

'Matewan:' It's a must see

In an era when labor unions can be broken down for granted by their members are accused of being counterproductive to commerce, the 1987 film "Matewan" should be required viewing.

This outstanding film gives a vivid picture of the conditions that assited the rise in trade union organization. In 1920, the film looks at the escalating tensions between coal miners in Matewan, W.Va., and the coal barons and spies sent in by the company that runs the area like a private kingdom.

The grime-covered face of a coal miner appears out of the darkness as the light on his hat is turned on. He wheezes and coughs as he works. The company pays for coal for the workers.

As the workers pass the news that the company has once again reduced the price it will pay for coal, a group of black workers is brought to join in replacing the miners. It doesn't take long for the new workers to realize they're not much better than slaves. As a company man explains, they're paid only in company scrip, which will be spent at the company store and to reimburse the company for transportation, tools, lodging and about anything conceivable.

AFTER A run-in with the supported miners, Few Clothes Johnson played robustly by James Earl Ray, and other black workers realize they are being used as scab work-

Johnson will overlook a racial slur, noting "that's the way white men are," but he is indignant at being labeled a scab.

Chris Cooper gives a wonderful performance as the gentle union organizer who tries to unite the workers against their common opponent, the mining company. A former Woban and a pacifist, Cooper shyly admits to "being a Red" when questioned about his beliefs.

The company enforcers are cretins and thugs who display contempt for the workers and displeasure at being stuck in a Southern backwater town. The film never shows the ownership of the mining company, although the situation is broader than a labor dispute. It's the class struggle of working people trying to get out from under people who grow rich off their efforts.

Like the union organizer, the town is played by David Strathairn, who is to avoid violence in the growing confrontation. The difference is the town is a quiet war veteran, who will take action to protect his townspeople and to resolve the crisis in an un- predictable way.

WRITER/DIRECTOR John Monaghan makes it clear where he stands as workers rebel against a

company that treats them as highly expendable parts of their highly profitable operation.

In an ironic turn, Sayles appears in "Matewan" as a Bible-thumping preacher who rallies against unions as the devil incarnate. In a one-company town, there is no being neutral when a labor war begins.

"Matewan" is a rich textured film with uniformly good performances

and well drawn characters. The struggle for decent wages and working conditions affects a wider circle than the workers. It affects their families and often widows and children.

Sayles has made a compelling heartfelt film about what might be expected to be a rather predictable story.

Tampa's a fair city in winter

Each winter Tampa, Fla., revels in a round of tropical festivals and fairs, complete with booming cannons, rollicking parades and dress balls.

And each year it seems more and more events pop up to tempt visitors: street parties with the scent of Cuban coffee hanging in the air, a vibrant art show that festoons the walkway along the Hillsborough River, open-air concerts that send a thumping beat across the bay and end in showers of fireworks and confetti.

Tampa's treasure is its diversity, an intermingling of Cuban, Italian, Spanish, Indian and Afro-American cultures that began in 1824, when Col. George Mercer Brooke built a post at the mouth of the Hillsborough River alongside a little Cuban settlement.

Although Tampa and the surrounding towns of Hillsborough County, Fla., have grown into a metropolis of almost a million people, the area has managed to maintain the friendliness of a small Southern town.

Beyond the parties and festivals there is great opportunity for silence and solitude on white sand beaches and nature trails.

Of course Tampa Bay's most obvious asset is the weather: day after day of sunshine, mild temperatures and big puffy clouds.

A cadre of new skyscrapers downtown glistens across blue water. The city's signature Bayshore Boulevard — 7.2 miles of uninterrupted sidewalk along the bay — teems with walkers, joggers and cyclists, and the pace of life can be as fast or as slow as you want it to be.

ATTRACTIONS

The premier tourist attraction is Busch Gardens, at 3000 East Busch Blvd. It is a 300-acre park 10 minutes from downtown.

The park, with an African theme, has a splendid array of rides, trains and trams set among gardens. The food is good and the scale more manageable than Walt Disney World (85 miles east).

Busch Gardens is also one of the nation's largest zoos, with more than 3,700 animals. Admission, which includes all rides, shows and attractions, is \$26.95; \$22.95 for children 3 to 9; those 2 and younger free. Parking costs another \$3.

Special areas for children have kid-sized rides, tree houses for climbing and fairy-tale sculptures. For more information call 987-5082.

Just a 10-minute drive from Busch Gardens is Lowry Park Zoological Garden, at 7530 North Blvd., and the newly renovated amusement park and new children's museum adjacent to it.

Admission to the Lowry Park Zoo is \$5.50; \$3.50 for children 4 to 12 and \$4.50 for the elderly; children 3 and younger free.

The newly built zoo has 1,600 animals in enclosures designed to resemble native habitats; attractions include a 175-bird aviary and an underwater view of a manatee — a gentle mammal similar to a large seal

that is one of Florida's official state animals.

Children love the petting zoo and the fountain at the entrance where they can wade. For more information call (913) 932-0245.

Tampa's homegrown festival, Gasparilla, is back again by popular demand after a one-year lapse, during which the main sponsoring organization — Ye Mystic Krewe of Gasparilla — became integrated, admitting black men to what was once an all-white men's group.

Gasparilla began in 1904, when a Tampa Tribune columnist established a carnival based on the antics of the legendary pirate Jose Gaspar, whose band supposedly pillaged 36 ships during the late 18th and early 19th centuries.

The latest incarnation of Gasparilla, a monthlong celebration that began Feb. 2, has parades, street parties, concerts and, on Feb. 29, the 12th annual Artists and Writers Ball in Ybor City, a costume party and dance held as an alternative to Tampa's society balls.

Need a treat on a trip? Rent a luxury car

Not every traveler wants the most economical rental car around. A small but dedicated cadre of consumers wants an exciting, exotic car to drive.

For example, how about a Ferrari 328 to cruise the streets of Beverly Hills or an all-American Ford Mustang convertible to drive to the Florida Keys?

All the major U.S. rental-car firms offer at least one luxury car and several convertibles. Many also rent luxury cars in Europe.

What does it cost to drive a fantasy car and leave the recession behind for seven days?

It depends on the car and where and when it's rented. In general, drivers must be age 25 and over, except at Alamo Rent A Car, which allows drivers age 21 and over to rent exotic cars.

Reservations are usually required at least 48 hours in advance. But to get the best deal, it's wise to have a travel agent do the legwork.

Here is a sampling of current rates. All prices quoted are for February and are very much subject to change.

Hertz Rent A Car offers two luxury cars in the United States at identical rental rates: the Lincoln Conti-

mental and the slightly larger Lincoln Town Car.

Hertz offers seven-day rentals of convertibles such as the Ford Mustang for \$183.99 in Orlando and \$188.99 in Miami; the same car rents for \$248.99 in California and \$246.99 in Hawaii.

General Rent A Car offers the 1992 Chrysler Imperial in Florida at \$189.95 per week and in California at \$187.95 per week. For convertible fans, the Chrysler Le Baron rents in Florida at \$189.95 per week.

Mileage charges run from 75 cents to 95 cents per mile. Clients between age 18 and age 25 pay higher rates for rentals.

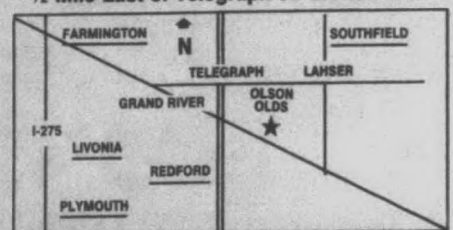

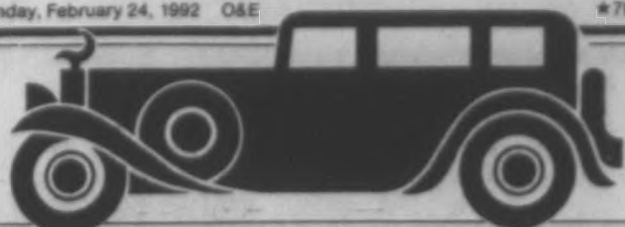

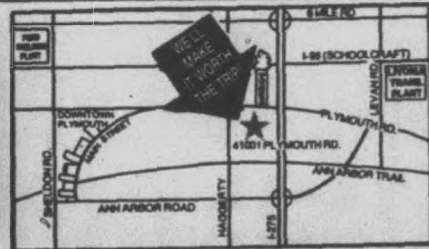

'Young Indy' is rich, rewarding viewing

Once upon a time, some 40 years ago in the sleepy California farm town of Modesto, there lived a boy named George and his dog, Indiana. George loved history, and he had a complete collection of Landmark Books, a series of young readers. It's easy to imagine him engrossed in the pages of "Custer's Last Stand," "Teddy Roosevelt and the Rough Riders," "Sequoyah: Leader of the Cherokees" or "Napoleon and the Battle of Waterloo," filling his mind with tales of romance and adventure.

Easy, too, to imagine how those stories would return to fuel the creative fire of a grown-up George Lucas, Oscar-winning filmmaker and motive force behind the "Star Wars" and "Indiana Jones" sagas.

Beginning Wednesday, March 4, Lucas hopes to bring his love of history to another generation with "The Young Indiana Jones Chronicles." It is not, he says, "an action-adventure series like the features are. I've burned out on writing action-adventure. This is more of a personal, coming-of-age kind of project.

"It's a series designed to ask questions. It will bring up subjects and introduce certain kinds of characters and make them come alive. I hope it will be helpful to young people, to introduce them to the fascination of history."

Viewers should be prepared for a few changes in Jones' own history as well. For those who make the leap, there are rich rewards to be claimed in the currency of possibilities.

Three actors star as Indiana Jones: Corey Carrier as the youngest Indy traveling the globe with his parents; Sean Patrick Flanery as the teenage Indiana; and George Hall as the 93-year-old archaeologist and adventurer looking back on his life. This oldest Indy could easily be relegated to voice-over status or dropped altogether. After all, it's "Young Indy" we've tuned in to see.

The stories take place on four continents during a period from 1908 to 1917. The two-hour pilot and 15 episodes that follow have been shot on locations from the Great Wall of China to the pyramids of

Egypt. This season, Indy will meet T.E. Lawrence (Lawrence of Arabia), Teddy Roosevelt, Sigmund Freud, Winston Churchill, Mata Hari, Albert Schweitzer, Pancho Villa and a 14-year-old Norman Rockwell. (Lucas has 29 more story ideas already percolating.)

The project boasts top-notch writers and directors including Rosemary Ann Sisson ("Upstairs, Downstairs") and Gavin Scott ("Ragtime"); Jim O'Brien ("The Jewel in the Crown"); Simon Wincer ("Lonesome Dove"); Billie August ("Pelle the Conqueror") and Terry Jones ("Monty Python").

Vanessa Redgrave guest stars as a suffragette and Margaret Tyzack

(Claudius' mother in "I, Claudius") plays young Indy's tutor.

Having done his logistical homework, Lucas makes the most of every location, shooting scenes for two or more episodes at each stop. Every penny of the \$1.5 million-per-episode budget seems to be on the screen.

The stories involving 10-year-old Indy are the most engaging, capturing the wonder of childhood at its best, a glorious gift of opportunity and a bookish boy's dream come true.

"You can't create a character," Lucas reflects, "and then not have it be your alter ego. I would like to have had a boyhood like this one. I guess I did, in part."

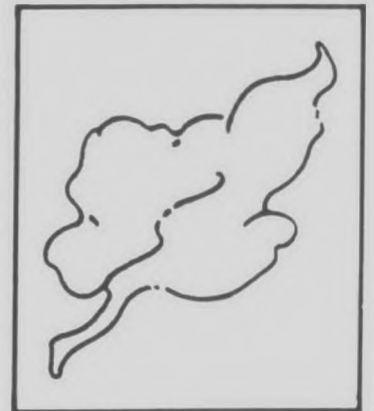
Paint a leaf and 'Save the Earth'

Virginia's Staley rules the court

In her three years at Virginia, Dawn Staley's just about done it all. The Cavalier guard is a three-time All-American who two years ago led her school to its first final-four appearance and, last year, took them to within three points of a national championship.

Staley was already being heralded as the most exciting women's basketball player ever when she arrived on the Virginia campus in 1988. She immediately began living up to expectations, thrilling fans with her no-look passes and near-magical ball handling as much as her 18 points per game scoring average. Last year, Staley's scoring dropped by more than three points a game, but her seven assists and six steals per game made her arguably the nation's most complete player.

If Virginia is, as many preseason publications predicted, on a collision course for a championship-game repeat with Tennessee, it will be far from a one-woman effort. Not only does Tammi Reiss combine with Staley to give Virginia one of the nation's top backcourts, but the trio of center Melanie Wagener and 6'5" twins Heidi and Heather Burge gives the Cavaliers a dominating inside game.

Fans at home will see Staley in action when Virginia and North Carolina State clash Saturday, Feb. 29.

Q: Can you provide me with an address for actress Ann Jillian?

A: I received quite a few letters asking about Jillian this week. So, for you and the others who wanted to know, you can write her in care of the William Morris Agency, 151 El Camino Drive, Beverly Hills, Calif. 90212.

Q: Could you give me an address for Oliver Stone? I am very impressed with his films and admire people who have the courage to examine controversial issues. I often want to write to movie stars or authors and am wondering if there are any directories available to the public so I can do this. —Betty Hawkins, Silver City, N.M.

A: You can write Stone care of CAA, 9820 Wilshire Blvd., Beverly Hills, Calif. 90212.

There are many books available with addresses of authors, actors, directors, etc. but they are not always accurate or up-to-date, so I always call the appropriate guild or agency to check my facts. Reference books can cost anywhere from \$5 to \$500; periodicals such as *Entertainment Weekly*, *Hollywood Reporter* and *Variety* can offer needed background information, too.

If you are trying to reach an author, you might contact the publisher for information. Sometimes, it can be like Sherlock Holmes looking for clues, and you'll seldom find the information you need on the first try, but most research just takes common sense. You might begin by checking at a local library or bookstore for reference books already on the shelves, then ask for more help at the counter. If you have the name of a book, its author or publisher and want more information, check a copy of *Books in Print*. Happy hunting!

Q: My friends and I would love it if you would give us the address where we could write to Edward Furlong. —Sophia Theresa, Ridge Crest, Calif.

A: You can write the young star of *Terminator 2: Judgment Day* in care of Susan Smith and Associates, 121 North San Vicente Blvd., Beverly Hills, Calif., 90211. Incidentally, his agency reports that the volume of fan mail for Furlong has been phenomenal.

Q: I am a big fan of MacGyver and want to know if there is any way to bring

the series back. Also, are there any Richard Dean Anderson fan clubs? He is a great actor and MacGyver is a wonderful series and shouldn't have been canceled without real cause. We fans were never given a chance to give our say-so. I would like to know where I can get a hold of photos and information about Anderson and the rest of the MacGyver crew. —C.M., Greenville, Texas.

A: After debuting on Sept. 29, 1985, *MacGyver* aired on ABC for seven seasons. While never an out-and-out hit, it certainly had a loyal viewer following. What viewers may not know is that any series will become more and more expensive to produce the longer it airs, chiefly because of a built-in system of annual raises for the stars. A series like NBC's *Cheers*, for instance, which is now in its 10th season and has a large cast, will at some point become too costly to produce in comparison to the revenue expected in return. In an interview last summer, *MacGyver* creator Lee Zlotoff said he had been surprised each year to find the series was renewed, not the reverse.

I know of no *MacGyver* fan clubs, but fortunately for fans, the series is still available in reruns on cable's USA network. Write to Anderson care of Paramount Domestic Television, 5555 Melrose Ave., Los Angeles, Calif. 90038. The letters will be forwarded to him.
