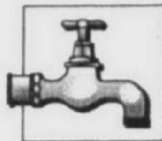

## State probe clears WTUA



Allegations of cronyism have plagued the WTUA sewer project in Canton and Plymouth, but a state investigation has found no violations of state law. State Rep. Jim Kosteva, who sought the probe, says new legislation could prevent problems in the future.

A state review found no evidence that the Western Township Utilities Authority broke state law, said the legislator who sought the study.

But state Rep. Jim Kosteva, a Canton Democrat, said he plans to introduce legislation to tighten standards for business practices of agencies like WTUA, which has been accused of cronyism.

The review by the state treasury department's municipal finance division "found no violation of existing state laws," said Kosteva, who will provide more details in coming weeks.

#### Legislation wanted

Kosteva said he sees the need for legislation to ensure that "WTUA and other quasi-governmental agencies across Michigan" operate in a more fair

and open manner.

"WTUA has been irresponsible when it comes to the letting of professional service contracts," he said.

Ties have been found between the WTUA's original board members and the law firm, public relations firm and engineering company that were hired to do work for the agency.

WTUA was formed in 1986 and is overseeing the \$90 million project of building a sewer system to run from Canton, Plymouth and Northville townships to an Ypsilanti treatment plant.

Canton Supervisor Tom Yack, chairman of the three-member WTUA board, said some changes have already been made. Proposals have been taken from

newspapers to print WTUA's legal notices and from law firms interested in providing legal service. Another proposal, to expand WTUA's board beyond the three current members, was rejected.

"In the first part of July, we should be considering the proposals from law firms," Yack said.

WTUA hired the law firm of Nora, Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk without seeking bids or proposals in 1987. The firm represents Plymouth, Northville and Canton townships and one of its partners is Robert Law, brother of current Plymouth Township Supervisor Gerald Law, who was a state representative when the firm was selected.

## Administrators moved to cut costs

There'll be a changing of the guard this fall among area coordinators at Centennial Educational Park, due to budget cuts and expiring internships.

The number of area coordinators, or assistant principals, at Canton and Salem high schools will be reduced from nine to eight, with vocational education director Harold Gaertner picking up additional responsibilities.

"This will mean there will be some things people will have to pick up and continue to do, but that is a very capable group of people, and they will perform well," said assistant superintendent for instruction Michael Homes.

The aim of the realignment is to cover the student population of 4,400, while capitalizing on administrators' strengths, said executive director of secondary education Dr. Tom Tattan.

#### Unfilled jobs

The job of retired assistant superintendent for elementary education Shirley Spaniel will not be filled. Being pink-slipped are high school athletic manager James Finn and Field Elementary assistant principal Karen Zokas.

Jeff Fordell's administrative internship is expiring. He will go back to the classroom. Lynne Lonigro, who served an administrative internship as a high school area coordinator, also will return to teaching.

Canton area coordinators Ethie Hazelwood and Dick Bearup will handle areas including attendance, disci-

pline, and student issues. Both earn \$67,909.

Ken Jacobs will serve as associate principal, handling among other things discipline, substance abuse issues, expulsion hearings, driver education, graduation and school improvement. Jacobs also will act as police liaison. His salary is \$70,927.

Responsible for instruction and teachers will be Dr. Jerry Morris and Gaertner. Gaertner, director of vocational and technical education, earns \$68,708. Morris earns \$67,909.

At Salem, area coordinators Joan Claeys and Pat Fitzpatrick will oversee attendance, discipline and student issues. Their duties range from student supervision to fund raising, student/parent orientations, scheduling and graduation.

Fitzpatrick is paid \$67,909. Claeys earns \$66,311.

Salem area coordinators Sharon Strean and Ted Wybrecht will be responsible for instruction and teachers. Their duties will range from language arts and alternative education, to special education, student registration, staff evaluations and guidance and counseling.

Strean and Wybrecht each earn \$67,909.

The job of Roy Anderson, who resigned as the school district's chief security officer, is posted. The position pays between \$29,635 and \$48,784.

## Bar owner goes all out for commission

Box Bar owner Chip Falcusan provided some laughs last week while the city's planning commission considered his proposal to build an outdoor cafe.

Falcusan and six helpers set flowers on the commission's desk. Nearby, they placed six-foot trees and cloud and sun cardboard cutouts. Each commissioner got a virgin strawberry daiquiri drink, oversized sunglasses and copies of the Box's plans. Of course, there was theme music: The Beatles "We Can Work it Out" and Petula Clark (remember her?) singing "Downtown."

"I never had so much fun at a planning commission meeting," said Ken West, who, as city building and engineering director, has attended plenty of them.

The commission approved Falcusan's plan on the condition that he resolve the Box's parking shortage, which may not be easy.

His plans call for a waterfall, ponds, gazebo and wrought iron fencing around a courtyard in what is now the Box parking lot.

The improvements would leave the popular bar 29 parking places short of city requirements. Falcusan said he

hopes to resolve the issue so the project can be built this year.

"I'm not ruling it out. I'm not giving up hope," he said.

Falcusan's outdoor expansion is one of several sidewalk cafes planned for downtown. The Cozy Cafe has served patrons outside for nearly 10 years, the Penniman Deli is planning to expand its sidewalk service and the Cafe Bon Homme may do the same.

Construction of the planned courtyard would take 5-8 weeks, putting the project into mid-summer already. Falcusan was hoping to have it in place this summer.

David Pugh, a planning commissioner, former mayor and member of the committee studying city parking ordinances, said downtown parking requirements have been discussed before.

"Our ordinances are not very friendly to businesses. They've been maybe a bit too inhibitive. Plymouth is changing and uses (of property) are changing."

Falcusan, who has taken a creative approach in his recent dealings with the city, said the idea of the props at the planning commission meeting was to give them a feel for his plans.

"The idea was to try to turn a dull, drab room into what you might think a cafe could be."

The police department will screen and supervise the workers and the Rotary will provide a list of people who need work done. These chores will include outdoor work like painting, yard work and snow shoveling.

# 5 local scouts win derby awards

St. Robert Bellarmine Catholic School in Redford was the scene of the 14th annual Gemini District Pinewood Derby race recently for 127 Cub Scouts from 44 packs from six communities.

The boys were winners from their local packs' Pinewood Derby races and qualified to compete in one of three age classes (Wolf, Bear, or Webebo) for the top honors in the district-wide competition on May 2.

A total of 24 awards were presented to the top six finishers and additional runners-up in each class.

The boys had built their mini-race cars from a block of wood with the assistance from a family adult for the race.

No two car designs were alike, with some of the car designs borrowed from actual race cars. One car design was borrowed from the U.S. Olympic team four-man bobsled design.

The races were raced on a three-lane wooden

track with gravity providing the only means of propulsion.

Some 450 parents and friends were present to cheer their favorite entries on to victory. A total of 17 Cub Scout packs were rewarded with 24 trophies.

The awards went to seven boys from Livonia, five from Plymouth, four from Northville, three from Redford, three from Canton, and two from Westland.

The Redford winners were Adam Jeziorowski, fifth in Wolf, Jeffrey Thompson runner-up in Wolf and Christopher Thompson, fourth in Webebo.

Westland winners were Aaron Whitworth, sixth in Bear class, and Stephen Totten, sixth in Wolf.

Canton winners were David Brandes, fifth in Bear, Cameron Allan, runner-up in Wolf, and Ben Cool, second in Webebo.

Brandon Wells of Plymouth Pack 781 was the

only 1991 winner to repeat as a winner this year by topping the Bear Class. The second-place finisher to Brandon was the same second-place finisher from 1991, Andrew Wells of Northville Pack 903.

Joshua Gregg of Livonia Pack 870 topped the most experienced Webebo class and was a previous winner of the Wolf class in 1990. Second place went to Ben Cool of Canton Pack 854 who was fourth place Wolf finisher in 1990. Joshua's brother Gregg had been a two-time winner in 1990 and 1991.

Yack said Newell was promoted last year from WTUA administra-

tive assistant to executive director after Anne Bollin resigned for health reasons. The \$35,000 job was not posted.

"We gave Deloris the job because we wanted someone who was familiar with WTUA operations," said Law.

Newell is a strong administrator and became executive director after a successful 3-4 month probation period, Yack said.

"I was pleased with the job she did and recommended she be hired permanently. I think she's done a fine job in the most adverse circumstances. She's very organized."

Newell notes that project is running under budget, according to the auditor. She said WTUA has gotten only a handful of complaints since December.

Still, Larry Thatcher of Canton was moved to write to the state attorney general's office asking for an investigation of WTUA.

Cos., to build an \$8.5 million structure in the Plymouth Commerce Center. Diversy is planning a "corporate technology

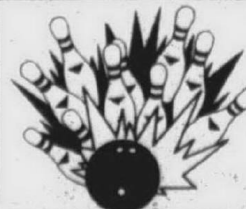
center" for the site, to do research and development and small scale manufacturing of cleaners and sanitizers.

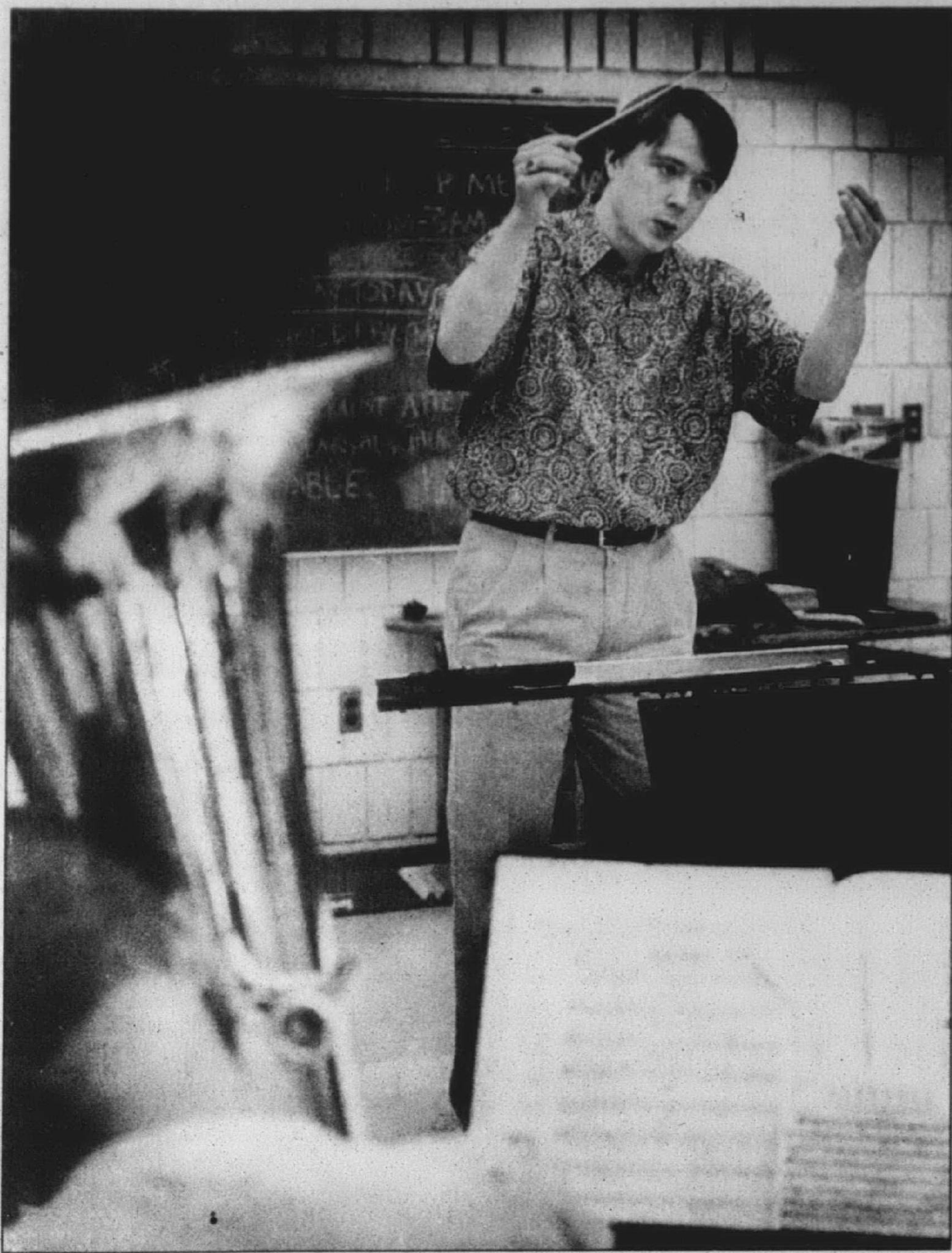

# School layoffs ring sour note

In class Friday morning, members of the varsity band were rehearsing the Grundman's "American Folk Rhapsody No. 3" for a special concert Friday, May 29. Gary Hill, a Plymouth-Canton graduate with the Kansas City conservatory of Music, will be guest conductor at the 8 p.m. performance in the Salem auditorium.

In a band room bedecked with national champion banners and enough trophies and plaques to destroy a metal detector, the sounds of trombonists, flutists, french horn players and drums filled the air. All eyes were on an animated Glen Adsit, the music teacher who with light strokes of his baton gracefully led the group through the arrangement. That is until he brought the piece to a halt midway through.

"Mr. Grundman didn't say in the music, 'Stop, talk about it, and then go on,' he said.

With the attention of more than 100 young musicians, Adsit conducted "American Folk Rhapsody No. 3" one more time. This time there was no hesitation.

"You have to convince kids that what you are doing you truly love and is truly important to your life. Only then are kids going to be excited too," said Adsit.

## Pink slipped

Adsit's marching band, two-time national champions, are anything but excited about the future. Adsit is among the 156 teachers recently pink-slipped by the school board in an effort to stave off a projected deficit of up to \$5.6 million in 1992-93.

Adsit, a 1982 graduate of Plymouth Salem, has decided to stay on this fall as marching band director. But he won't be around to teach during the day. He's been accepted in a selective master's program in conducting at the University of Michigan, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in music education and trombone performance in 1986.

"It was the toughest decision I've ever had to make, bar none," said Adsit. "It would be a lot easier if I knew I'd be called back to teaching (in the same job). My love is instrumental music, and that's what I do best."

It's likely Adsit will teach choir if called back next year.

Adsit likens his situation to a double-edged sword. "It's really hard. The program I've been accepted into is pretty selective and I feel real good about that. The person I'm studying with there is the best in the country at what he does. I will continue to grow as a conductor and a person.

"My goal is to some day be able to have the skills and ability to conduct a college ensemble. That's my goal; that's my dream. But the satisfaction I get at the high school is really wonderful. You trade a whole set of positives when you go on to the college route."

## Leaving friends

Making it all the tougher is the fact Adsit will be leaving his mentor, former teacher and friend, band director Jim Griffith.

"Jim's been quoted as saying I was one of the worst trombone players he'd ever heard. He worked with me for three years before I was anything. So this place means a lot to me," said Adsit.

Students are looking forward to accompanying Adsit to the Fiesta Bowl in Arizona in December.

"I'm really, really angry about it," said Jenny Nagy, a Salem ninth-grader who plays mellophone.

"You feel you can do anything with him as you teacher," said Kathleen Barker, a French horn player and Salem senior. "He could get the worst player to get into symphony band. He doesn't just teach you, he can motivate you."

## Parents sad

Band boosters are crushed. "I never cease to be amazed at how he can inspire and motivate the kids," said band parent and booster Beth Myers. "He's wise beyond his years. He looks like a kid, but has the wisdom of a much older person. And he keeps improving with age."

Pat Liljestrand, president of the Plymouth-Canton Music Boosters, said, "You can't believe a person who has won two national championships would be pink-slipped in the first place. But we're delighted he still will be working with the marching band and all that that entails up through December of this year at least."

Adsit, who is working out a salary arrangement with administration, is unsure what will happen after December.

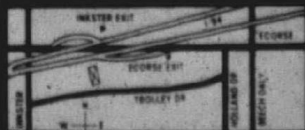

# Consumers pushes kite safety

With spring weather finally here and youngsters turning their thoughts toward the fun of kite flying, Consumers Power Company reminds that kites and electric power lines don't mix.

Carl L. English, Consumers Power's vice president of energy distribution services, said young people should be warned to remember to fly their kites only in an open area well removed from trees and the potential hazard of overhead power lines.

"Each year the majority of kite-flying accidents occur when a child tries to untangle a kite from a tree or power line," said English. "To avoid an accident, children and parents should be aware of these basic safety rules:"

- Fly your kite in an open area, away from electrical lines, trees and busy streets.

- Never climb utility poles, trees or broadcasting towers in pursuit of a snagged kite. Electric current from materials or moisture can

cause severe burns.

- Use wood, paper or plastic in making your kite, not wire or metal. Avoid using any materials that could conduct electricity.

- Don't try to repeat Benjamin Franklin's experiment by flying your kite in the rain. Lightning can cause injury much more severe than the minor shock Franklin experienced.

- If a kite gets caught on an electric line, call the utility company for help. Never pull on an elec-

tric line. If a power line falls, stand clear. Never touch downed power lines. Instead call the utility.

**CHAPTER 60 (UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE) AMENDMENT CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDINANCE NO. C-92-05 SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE FOR MICHIGAN CITIES, TOWNSHIPS, AND VILLAGES (CHAPTER 60); PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENTS TO AND ADDITIONS TO, IN SECTIONS 2.5, 2.5a, 2.5b, 2.5c, 2.5d, 2.5e, 2.5f, 2.5g, 5.82, 5.83 AND 5.97; PROVIDING FOR ABANDONED VEHICLE AND ABANDONED SCRAP VEHICLE PROCEDURES; REMOVING VEHICLES REMOVED FROM PRIVATE PROPERTY AND VEHICLES REMOVED BY POLICE; PROVIDING FOR THE JURISDICTION AND DUTIES OF THE COURT; PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLIC SALE OF ABANDONED VEHICLES; PROVIDING FOR MANDATORY CHILD RESTRAINTS; PROVIDING FOR THE REQUIREMENT AND ENFORCEMENT OF SAFETY BELTS; PROVIDING FOR THE OVERTAKING, MEETING OR PASSING OF SCHOOL BUSES; PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL OTHER ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT WITH THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF THIS ORDINANCE AND THE PRESERVATION OF ALL PENDING PROSECUTION; PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION REQUIREMENTS AND THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENTS TO THE CODE.**

The following sections or subsections are hereby amended and/or added to the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships and Villages of the Charter Township of Plymouth, being Chapter No. 60. The subsequent section and subsection numbers used in this code shall refer to the like numbered sections and subsections of Chapter 60, the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships and Villages:

These sections and subsections provide for reports of stolen and recovered vehicles, abandoned vehicle procedures for removal, contacting the registered owner, redemption, abandoned scrap vehicle procedures, vehicle removal from private property, vehicle removal by police, duties of the court, public sale, mandatory child restraints and safety belt requirements and enforcement, as well as overtaking, meeting or passing school buses.

**Section 2. Severability:**  
 This Section provides that any unenforceable section can be severed from the remainder of the Ordinance.

**Section 3. Repeal:**  
 This Section provides that all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of the Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 4. Savings Clause:**  
 This Section provides that the adoption of this Ordinance does not affect proceedings or prosecutions for violations of the laws, penalties and matured rights and duties in effect before the effective date of this Ordinance.

**Section 5. Penalty:**  
 This Section provides for penalties for violations of this Ordinance.

**Section 6. Publication:**  
 This Section provides for publication of this Ordinance.

**Section 7. Effective Date:**  
 This Section provides that this Ordinance shall become effective upon its publication.

# Senators reduce school aid damage

In a quiet revolt, suburban state senators last week upset Sen. Dan DeGrow's apocalyptic, reducing the damage his school aid bill will do to out-of-formula districts.

The revolt against DeGrow, R-Port Huron, chair of the Senate Appropriations subcommittee on school aid, occurred in the Republican caucus and behind the scenes.

Instead of taking away \$107 million in state aid for retirement and Social Security, DeGrow's bill takes back \$72 million, the same as last year. The amendment occurred during general orders when roll calls aren't recorded.

Out-of-formula districts are typically suburban areas with healthy business tax bases. They get no general state aid but draw "categorical" aid for retirement, special education and state-mandated programs.

"Tax base sharing is still intact," said Michael Bouchard, an Oakland County Republican, referring to the provision in the 1991 bill requiring

out-of-formula schools to share half the growth in their business property taxes with the rest of the state.

"But I have an agreement we'll seek an expedited ruling from the Supreme Court on both tax base sharing and recapture," he said in an interview outside the Senate chamber. Tax base sharing has been halted by circuit court order, though affected schools still must put the money in an escrow account.

The \$3.1 billion school aid bill goes to the House, where the DeGrow version has a champion in Rep. James O'Neill Jr., D-Saginaw, chair of the House school aid subcommittee. O'Neill, like DeGrow, wants to deduct as much categorical aid as possible from out-of-formula districts — mainly in Oakland, western Wayne and Macomb counties — to help poorer districts.

The amended version won 24-12 Senate approval.

Voting yes: Republicans Mat Dunaskiss of Lake Orion, Robert Geake of Northville and David Honigman of West Bloomfield, and

Democrats Faxon and George Hart of Dearborn.

Voting no: Bouchard and Democrat William Faust of Westland.

It was the first major defeat for DeGrow, O'Neill and their allies, a bipartisan group from farm areas and older cities whose stated goal is to reduce the funding disparity of \$2,500 to \$8,000 between the poorest and richest districts.

Bouchard circulated memos to his 37 colleagues detailing their schools' loss of revenue if DeGrow's "equity correction" bill had passed.

## Area districts:

- Birmingham \$5.2 million.
- Bloomfield Hills \$4.4 million.
- Clarenceville \$265,000.
- Farmington \$5.5 million.
- West Bloomfield \$2.1 million.
- Livonia \$4.6 million.
- Plymouth-Canton \$1.6 million.
- South Redford \$565,000.

In contrast, all the schools in DeGrow's Thumb area would have lost only a combined \$1.7 million.

In other amendments, the Senate stripped from the aid bill:

• \$13 million for "schools of choice" transportation, rejecting Gov. John Engler's recommendation. "Let the money go into the formula, and let the school districts decide how to spend it," said Faxon, voting no.

• \$6.3 million for a dozen districts to operate 200 class days a year instead of the required 180. "What's to say the 20 (added) days will yield results?" said Faxon.

• \$2 million for "charter schools," under which a school board would let groups of teachers set up specialized schools.

But the Senate retained \$2 million for training teachers in the Michigan Model for Comprehensive Health Education, an elementary school program that the political right calls anti-religion and anti-family.

Senators also retained a section taking 1-180th of a district's school aid for every day lost to a strike. Democrats barely lost on two tie votes.

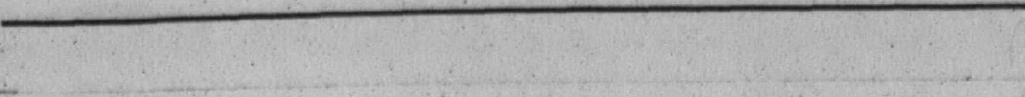

## Hancock: Lone Star state of mind

Butch Hancock is one of the most prolific of the Texas songwriters, writing passionate songs. Yet fame continues to elude him, but it may be more of a case of him eluding it.

A simple, Texas style greeting initiates the telephone conversation. "Hi," says the voice on the other end, "This is Butch."

It's geniality almost seems to mock the shroud of mystique perpetually surrounding Butch Hancock and his fellow Lone Star songwriting brethren.

The aura of which is puzzling to Hancock himself, whose songs are steeped (ironically) in the forthright tradition forged in a guitar-harmonica style. He's not sure as to what his role is in this pervading myth whipped up like a detached shrub on a desolate road, and the best explanation he's heard for it came from a Finnish woman on a bus while on tour in Europe.

"Someone asked approximately the same question . . . the guide sort of looked off in the distance and thought heavy like and said, 'It's the image of the lone rider under the free skies,'" said Hancock, a native of Lubbock, Texas. "It was a real poignant thing.

"I don't know if I've contributed to it or detracted from it because I've been on both sides of it."

In Hancock's case, it was a tractor rather than a horse. The image of a solitary figure contemplating life's complexities amid the vast openness of the Texas plane is still vivid and indeed romantic.

When Hancock would toil behind the wheel in the West Texas fields, he'd finish a row of crops and jot down a few words.

The result of which became "West Texas Waltzes (and Dust Blown Tractor Tunes)," Hancock's first solo effort that launched a prolific songwriting career spanning two decades and 12 albums. Emmylou Harris recorded Hancock's "If You Were a Bluebird" as did Texas songwriting compatriot Joe Ely.

The grainy image of the Texas songwriter, though, was perhaps cast when Hancock and friends Jimmie Dale Gilmore, Steve Wesson, Tony Pearson and Ely performed in a short-lived, long-vaunted Flatlanders.

The outfit born out of friendship and inspired by having a good time produced one album, the critically-acclaimed "More a Legend Than a Band" in 1971. The lost treasure wasn't released domestically until 20 years after the fact.

Other career moves may deem Hancock something an oddity. He releases his own albums inde-

pendently, including the latest masterpiece "No 2 Alike" that features 140 songs recorded during a six-night stand in at the Cactus Cafe in Austin, Texas.

The effort is available by subscription through a series of 14 hour-long tapes.

Hancock said these will be the last released on his label, working in the meantime on scoring a record deal. "We're hoping to push the right buttons here and there and somebody will pick me up as an artiste," he said.

The collection undoubtedly displays the full breadth of Hancock's songwriting talents, which

is largely influenced by Woody Guthrie and Bob Dylan. His numbers are very visual, dabbling at times into complicated wordplay.

"I've always liked to play with the language," he said. "That's the tool I use. At an extreme, I'm a little more apt at getting beserk with wordplay at times. Ultimately, whether the song works or not, whether it's complicated or simple words, if the theme comes across that's most important."

Butch Hancock will perform with Julian Dawson Friday, May 22, at Birmingham Unitarian Church, 651 Woodward. Tickets are \$12 at the door.

## Singer turns stories into personal songs

With Alex Lumelsky, a.k.a. Mooshka, every story concludes with a song title.

The Southfield resident and lead guitarist of the since disbanded local band Phineas Gage recalls without prompting how he had to go down to Texas to fetch his girlfriend. On the way back, they pulled over to the side of the road and Lumelsky began marveling at the star-filled sky above.

The story should have a happy ending but it doesn't. Not long afterward, he and his girl broke up.

"And that's how the song, 'Stars,' came about," Lumelsky said.

Lumelsky's voice cracks with emotion as he sings in plaintive, but heartfelt narrative about the sudden realization his relationship is doomed under the illumination of the night time sky. "And I'll never forget the night I gazed out at the stars/I was moved to tears while you stayed back at the car/Couldn't recognize you, whoever you are."

Such raw emotion spills over into many of Mooshka's songs, which are captured on the EP "Sketch."

Some numbers focus on the aforementioned relationship. Another, "Great Divide," speaks to the emptiness he feels about the demise of Phineas Gage, a young and promising group who split up last year.

His songs may be labeled a cathartic exercise. Yet Mooshka doesn't appear scarred or bitter. He's a rather jovial sort sitting at a table at Griff's Grill in Pontiac, wearing a red beret that looks more like a shower cap.

"A lot of people are like 'Alex, your songs are depressing,'" Lumelsky said. "But I'm not a

depressing person. I ride my bike and everything. I'm just like everyone else.

"Some songs are like that. I don't write about tangent things. I write about my reaction to things."

His reaction to the breakup of both his band and relationship with his girlfriend was to take a respite from performing for awhile. That didn't last long as he found himself picking up an acoustic guitar and writing songs.

The transformation from a lead guitarist in a rock band to a solo performer hasn't been difficult.

# Flames only flicker in film 'Fires Within'

The price that is exacted for political beliefs that defy a dictatorship, in this case Fidel Castro's regime in Cuba, are at the heart of the 1991 film "Fires Within."

This is a film that fairly drips with earnestness, its opening frames noting the Cuban government denies the existence of political prisoners. This is juxtaposed by the strange casting of usually blonde British actress Greta Scacchi as the Cuban wife of a political prisoner. It's to her credit that she doesn't do that badly with the little she has been given in the script.

"Fires Within" begins with Scacchi, who has fled to Miami, receiving a marriage proposal from her boyfriend, played by Vincent D'Onofrio. He was the fisherman who rescued her and her small daughter from the barely floating craft they used to slip out of Cuba. D'Onofrio has become a surrogate father for the girl, whose father was arrested as a political prisoner. He wants a family and family traditions.

As luck and movies would have it, almost simultaneously the Cuban government has decided to release a group of political prisoners and send them off to Miami. Scacchi's husband, played by Jimmy Smits, is among the arriving prisoners after serving eight years of a 20-year sentence.

The film uses flashbacks to illustrate the couple's life in Cuba, where Scacchi argued with Smits and tried to convince him not to pass out the political leaflets which lead to his arrest. Despite her arguments, Smits refuses a "rehabilitation" which would have led to his release and ends privileges, such as visitations.

The script raises a lot of issues that it never pursues. After eight years on her own, the wife has made a new life and isn't the

same person her husband knew before.

After hearing that her goal is to buy a house, Smits comments with a tinge of envy on how well his wife has done without him. It wasn't much of a struggle based on what you see in the film. Rescued, she finds a boyfriend and a factory job that must pay pretty darn well.

The husband and boyfriend argue but the husband and wife don't seem to have much to say to one another. She doesn't ask and he doesn't volunteer anything about his experiences in prison or anything else about the intervening eight years. Or the wife and her boyfriend.

Hailed as a hero as he arrives from Cuba, Smits is immediately being wooed by the exile community to work on "La Causa." In the best performance in the film, Smits balks at arming would-be liberation fighters. Freedom of speech is the weapon which will free Cuba.

The whole film really is summed up in a speech Smits gives at a political rally when he says he isn't a hero, just a survivor who spoke out for what he believed in. By this point he has come to see the scars his choice inflicted on his wife and daughter.

This is a film I really wanted to like. How can you not sympathize with someone imprisoned for exercising free speech, separated from their family and forced to leave their home? Even with that stacked deck, Cynthia Cidre's script lacks real emotion and depth.

I was particularly disappointed since director Gillian Armstrong is responsible for one of my all time favorite movies, "My Brilliant Career." I expected a lot more fire and life in a film she directed.

Oh, and another small thing that I found irritating about this movie is you cannot quite figure what year it is taking place. Sometimes there is a very '60s look and feel, other times it seems contemporary.

# 'Daughters' sacrifices plot for emotion

practicing ritual magic and carrying what she calls "scraps of memo-

ries" in an old tin can.

Eulah (Alva Rogers) shares her great-grandmother's concern for preserving the family at all costs. Her pregnancy, however, causes some rifts at home, because there is some doubt as to whether the child was conceived by her husband or a white rapist.

Yellow Mary (Barbara-O), meanwhile, returns to the community after a prosperous life as a prostitute. Though scorned by many of her relatives, she returns to the island to participate in the family's elaborate

farewell celebration.

Emotion and beauty resonate throughout the film. You can sense insecurity of leaving the island. They have an almost idyllic existence here, with the freedom, community, and standard of living in complete contrast to the family's years of slavery just a few decades before.

In a sense, they are also cut off from the outside world. The emotional crux of the film is the idea that these people must put the past behind them and enjoy the freedom

that they have won by forging new lives up north.

Director Dash and cinematographer Arthur Jaffa compose a number of lyrical montages that find the characters playing or lazily talking in the crook of a tree. They give the film an almost surreal beauty.

The lack of plot may frustrate many viewers, but "Daughters of the Dust" will leave a strong impression. It creates a bold and intelligent departure from the contemporary social problems that infuse the films of other black American directors.

"It doesn't feel that weird for me," he said. "There's less pressure before the show. In a band, there's more variables that can go wrong. It's just you."

Therein lies Mooshka's greatest asset and liability. His acoustic guitar playing is intense and riveting. His voice is sincere, but drowned out at times by the din of the nightclub crowd such as this evening at Griff's Grill.

A majority of Mooshka's shows have been an opening act for other local bands at clubs such as Lili's and Griff's Grill. His set list includes 15 to 17 songs, including a few Phineas Gage numbers "Honesty" and "In the Mirror" done acoustically.

The songs Mooshka's most proud of are the ones he's written since

last summer. "I feel they're better songs," he said. "I can relate to them on a deeper level. The reasons why I wrote them were very personal."

"When I was writing them for Phineas Gage, I was writing them for (the lead vocalist) to sing. I think they were a bit more general."

Then there's the matter of the name Mooshka, which Lumelsky has decided to perform under. Of course, there is another story.

A friend lent him a T-shirt with the word Mooshka on it, which became Lumelsky's nickname. He adds he never did return the shirt.

# Suits and secrecy are new plots of government

Liberals of the 1960s and '70s had the same answer for every problem, real or imagined: Throw money at it. Since the mid-'80s, the new answer has been hide 'n' sneak: Hide the public records, close the public meetings. Sen. William Van Regenmorter, a Republican from Ottawa County, learned the hard way that eventually the public wises up. Van Regenmorter chairs the Senate Judiciary Committee, and last week he scheduled a hearing on his SB 908 — blandly labeled "general amendments to the Crime Victim's Rights Act."

Some amendments! Currently victims of serious crimes may ask to have their names withheld from the police records. Van Regenmorter would reverse centuries of law and custom, mandating that nearly all IDs be automatically closed, letting police work in secret. He led with his jugular by scheduling the

hearing just as a federal jury nailed Detroit's ex-police chief William Hart for embezzling \$1 million from secret drug funds. For years Detroit officials strove to hide those records from the public. To their shame, Detroit police picked up two Detroit News reporters trying to track down the wrongdoing. To police, the badguys were the expositors, not the thieves. Well, Van Regenmorter's bill ran into a storm of protest. "Grossly unconstitutional," said attorneys for the Free Press and Michigan Press Association. A national press group noted that Oakland, Calif., police had been caught sloughing off rape complaints from the social underclass, suggesting the true reason cops want to shut the records. Van Regenmorter canceled the hearing. There's a familiar pattern in Michigan. • The Potato Commission, appointed by the governor, is an official body which can assess and fine growers. Last month

the Senate voted to exempt assessments and fines from the Freedom of Information Act. • The Senate passed a bill to "reform" medical professionals' discipline. Two key "reforms" would shut down records under the Freedom of Information Act and procedures under the Open Meetings Act. • The Legislature last year updated the 87-year-old Telecommunications Act by yanking many of Ma Bell's filings from the Freedom of Information Act. • In 1990 then-Sen. Doug Cruce, R-Troy, sponsored Oakland Prosecutor Richard Thompson's crime fighting bills. Their notion of fighting crime was to exempt prosecutors' appeal briefs from FOIA, not just to prisoners but to everyone. • State Rep. Burton Leland, D-Detroit, won House approval in 1991 of a bill to shut down certain motor vehicle records from FOIA. The Detroit News found Leland didn't really live in his district but

in a Lansing suburb. Guess what tool was partly responsible for tracking down Leland. That's only at the state level. Suburban police departments are notorious in covering up their inability to solve crime by denying information requests with a sneer and a "Sue us." The city of Detroit is so embarrassed at being sued so often and successfully that it attempted to hide its payouts. A Free Press reporter who lives in Oakland County used the circuit court there to pry the numbers out of the Young administration. I'm uncertain whether this flood of legislation in Lansing is a piecemeal and unthinking response, or a bipartisan plot to kick sand in the public's eyes. Right now I suspect it's a plot and that "privacy" is a code word for "secrecy."

# Resist racial gulf with confrontation, not fears

Hey, Jeffrey!" The security gate attendant at Detroit Metro Airport called to me as I hustled through a metal detector on the way to an early morning flight. "What are you going to be talking about today?" I looked up startled, located the face talking to me and focused on the speaker. A young man, approximately 25 to 28 years old, was smiling at me with an eager, expectant look in his eyes. I remembered that it was Saturday and that my show, "Transition," would be on later that morning at 8:30. My mind raced as it moved from crack of dawn travel mode to television programming. I told him what our focus would be on the show, thanked him for watching and started on down the terminal. He wouldn't let me go through, matching me stride for stride as I ran for the plane. He was going on duty in just a few minutes, he said, and looked forward to his break two hours later so he could watch "Transition." He never missed it, he said, and seemed prepared to recall show after show for me: what worked and what didn't.

He was talking so fast and seemed so intense that I stopped still in the middle of the concourse, oblivious to the fact that my plane was boarding and just listened to him. "What I like about 'Transition,'" he went on, "is that it's real. You show black people like they really are. You're not just another media-hype type show, dwelling only on the negative aspects of the black community. I like the even handed way your show deals with the major issues and the way you tell it like it is in your commentaries. You make me feel proud to be black. Keep it up." The security guard stuck out his hand, grinned his goodbye, turned and moved back the way we had come, ready to assume his post. I took my aisle seat deep in thought on the young man's comments, opened my newspaper and proceeded to read the umpteenth analysis of the Rodney King verdict and its aftermath. By the time the plane had broken through the clouds, the paper

had been thrown to the floor in disgust and sadness. Disgust at the senseless, wanton death and destruction; sadness as the realization was underscored that the gulf between the races appeared too wide to bridge. What is the problem, I wondered for the millionth time. What is the root cause that is contributing to the sickness infecting the health of our country? To me it is clear as glass that if we don't heal or excise this particular root, the entire tree will succumb to the ravages of this particular disease. Didn't anyone see that? Fear of the unknown, the experts say. Birds of a feather flock together. "White guilt," say black liberals. "Black crime," say white conservatives. Whites fear competition from African-Americans, some folks whisper. Blacks are inferior and immortal, others say quietly. My thoughts were in turmoil as we bumped through turbulent skies, 450 miles per hour, 33,000 feet above ground. If this feat was possible, why couldn't we fix the race problem?

We started our descent and as the landing gear locked into place, so did my thought. It centered around the young security man. A glance at my watch indicated we had been airborne over two hours and I took comfort in the fact that he was watching "Transition," feeling proud, discovering the black experience as it really is. The racial gulf we appear unable to close is one we fear to confront. It takes guts to put aside prejudices and get down to know the other group. We might be rejected, misunderstood or in some way harmed. It becomes easier to do nothing. It becomes easier to believe the stereotype. If you, like me, are tired of being scared; if you, like me, are scared for the future; if you, like me, are saddened at the waste of our collective lost potential, there is something you can do. SoHo bookstore has lock on Irish Culture

New York's SoHo neighborhood is known for its art galleries, flashy boutiques and trendy gift stores.

So it's a bit of a surprise to discover a bastion of Irish language and literature in this world of leather jackets, portfolios and attitude.

Irish Books and Graphics is the name of a small shop owned by Angela Carter, a soft-spoken Irish woman with fierce opinions about the way the Irish have been portrayed in books and on film.

"They come in here from Madison Avenue, these young kids looking for books about Ireland, and then they go out and perpetuate this 'Quiet Man' imagery," she says with disdain.

"The Quiet Man" (1952) is a classic film, with John Wayne and Maureen O'Hara, about a boxer who returns to his native Ireland, wins over the townsfolk and falls in love with a strong-willed Irish beauty.

"They never portray the Irish middle class or talk about the real problems of people finding work in Ireland. They never talk about emigration, which is the country's biggest problem."

Carter, a native of Keshkerrigan, County Leitrim, came to America in 1963. She has been quietly changing the way people think about Ireland since she opened her first shop, Keshkerrigan Books, on lower Broadway in Manhattan in 1978.

"I was looking for Irish books and finding that I had great difficulty in getting them," she said.

Two years ago she moved to the present location because of a rent increase. At that time she also renamed the shop "because it's easier for people to know what it's about."

Carter's stock is impressive — especially crammed into such a small space. There are photography books such as "The Forgotten Hermitage of Skellig" by Michael Waiver Horn (University of California, 1990).

The whole city of Indianapolis seems to swathe itself in black-and-white bunting for the entire month of May in preparation for the Indianapolis 500-Mile Race. In addition to race day, Sunday, May 24, there is a full calendar of other activities that make up the 500 Festival.

The theme of this year's festival is the 20th anniversary of Disney World. Mickey Mouse and costumed pals will cavort at many of the festival events.

As for the race, begun in 1911, it still lays claim to being the biggest single-day sporting event in the world, with most estimates placing attendance at about 400,000.

The start is a remarkable experience: the crowds, the bands, the thousands of balloons, the celebrity singer delivering "Back Home Again in Indiana." All of this is enveloped in the throbbing roar of 33 straining-to-go Cosworth, Chevy, Buick and Ford fuel-injected, high-compression engines.

Possibly no other event draws such a wildly divergent group of people, from the tattooed, T-shirted bunch in some parts of the infield to the elegantly dressed viewers in the penthouse boxes and corporate suites.

Of course, most people show up in regular sports clothes and sneakers, hoping they've brought along enough sun block and sandwiches to last the day.

to \$100 for penthouse seats on the front straightaway. A good, medium-priced seat in the covered section on the outside of the front straightaway costs \$55.

The bad news is that since the Speedway begins filling orders the day after one year's race for the next year's event, all tickets for this year's race are long gone — at

least at the Speedway ticket office.

Some may still be available from ticket brokers or from classified ads in local newspapers, though usually at a considerable premium. One ticket broker, for instance, sells \$18 infield bleacher seats for \$55 and penthouse seats for \$300 to \$550.

The Indianapolis City Center, at 201 South Capitol Ave., Indianapolis, Ind., 46225, has a short list of ticket brokers, some of whom also offer packages with race tickets and hotel. For more information call (800) 323-4639.

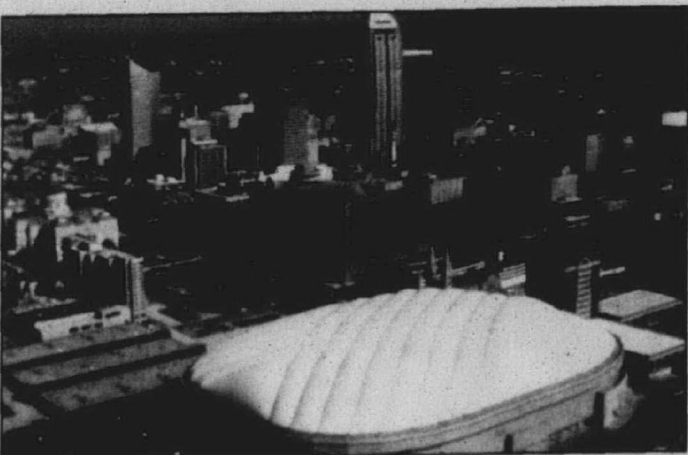
Ticket-order forms for the 1993 race will be available in mid-May from the Indianapolis Motor Speedway ticket office, P.O. Box 24152, Speedway, Ind. 46224. Current ticket holders get one week after the race to renew or upgrade their tickets before new orders are filled. For more information call (317) 248-6700.

General admission to the infield on race day costs \$15 a person, but this entitles you only to parking. Ad hoc camping takes place by the lines of cars that begin forming outside the track several days before the race. Traditionally, many in the infield come to party rather than to watch racing.

The race begins at 11 a.m. (Eastern Standard Time; most of Indiana does not go on daylight time), but there is prerace activity from about 9 a.m. Gates into the Speedway grounds open at 5 a.m.

Also open to the public is Carburetion Day, May 21, beginning at 11 a.m., when drivers and crews do last-minute fine-tuning. This is followed by the Mechanic's Recognition Party, a chicken picnic supper and ceremonies honoring the chief mechanics.

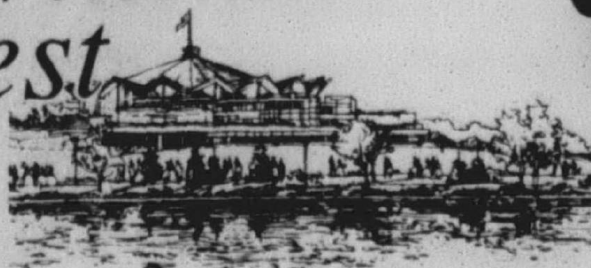

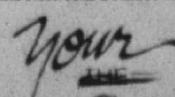

# S'craft takes time to honor its own for graduation



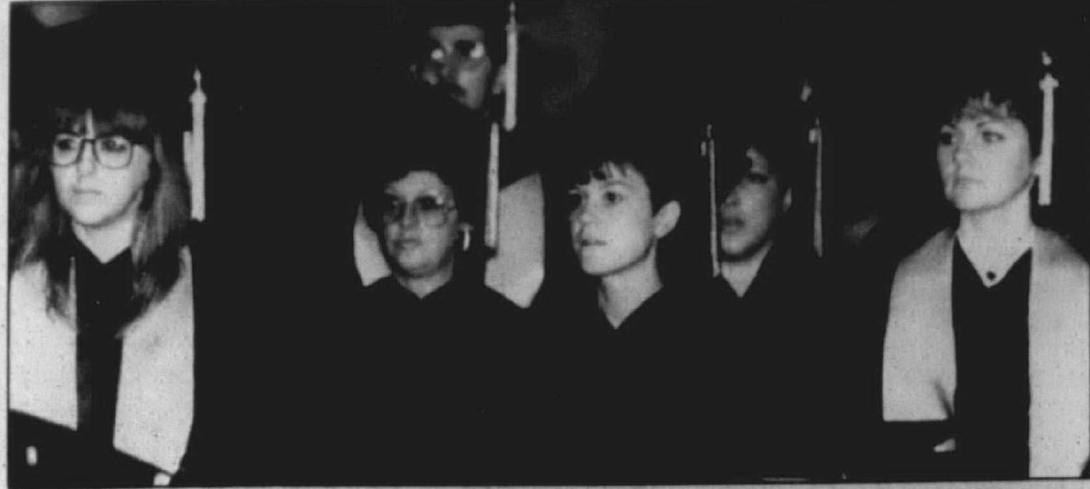
**Blenda Wilson:** The University of Michigan-Dearborn chancellor was commencement speaker and an honorary degree recipient May 9 at Schoolcraft College.

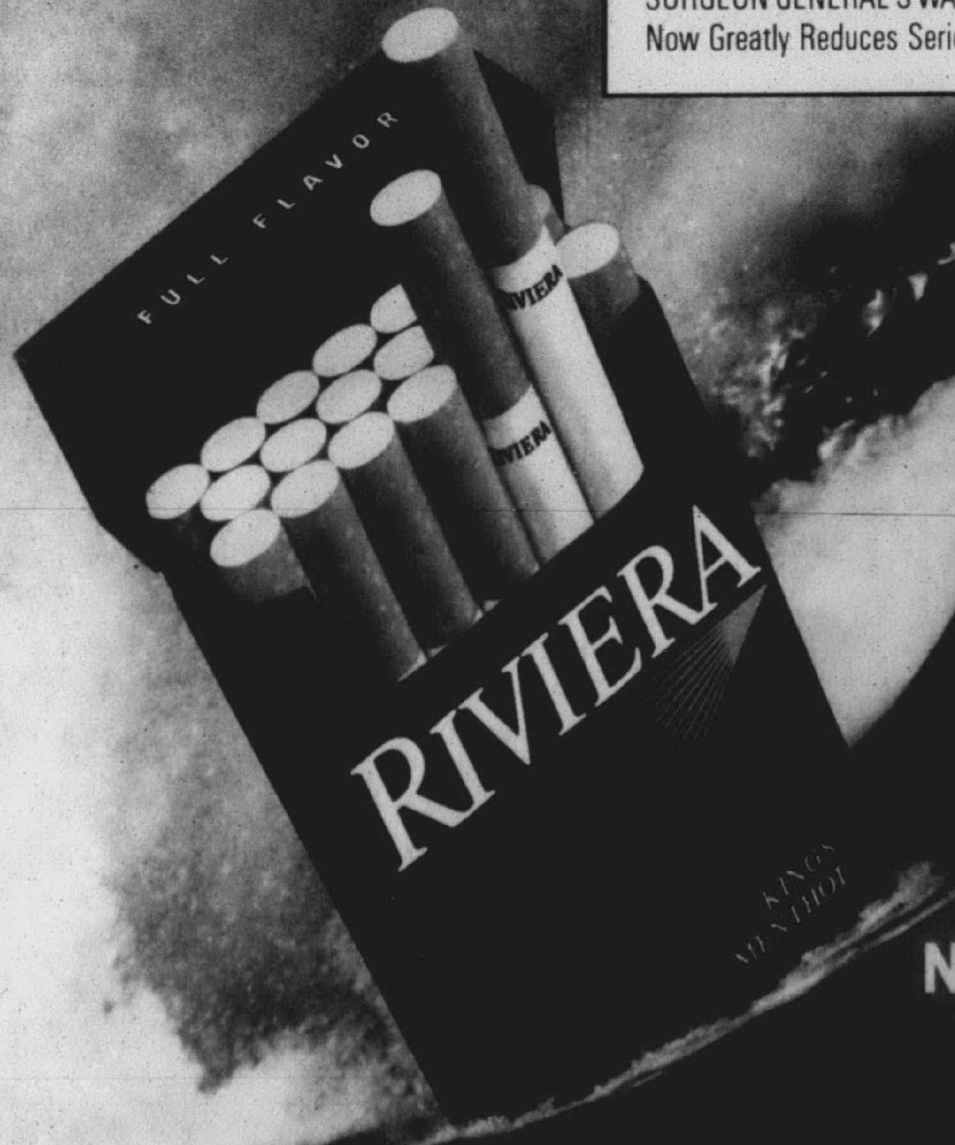

### Treat yourself to some little kitchen luxuries

If the old adage "always a bridesmaid but never a bride" sounds like the story of your life, maybe it's time you treated yourself to some of "life's little luxuries" that are sure to make life in the kitchen a little more enjoyable and time saving.

There are a multitude of kitchen gadgets, doodads and accessories available that not only accessorize the kitchen, but make cooking more enjoyable. Better yet, they are available at reduced or dramatically cheap prices within the reach of just about everyone's budget.

Anyone who has ever visited the Janes Gang kitchen knows that I am a gadget freak. You name it and I have it. All of the following recommendations come not only kitchen tested but rank right up there for usefulness and time saving abilities.

Starting at the bottom of the cost scale and inching upwards, I would be remiss if I failed to mention the following kitchen goodies that make not only great wedding and/or shower goodies but have also made the list of all time Janes favorites. They include:

#### Favorite gadgets

The great pasta/spaghetti fork. This delectable goodie comes in plastic, wood and even in stainless steel. I purchased a plastic model for under two dollars at a local gadget retailer and it really does work.

If you or anyone you know likes pasta, this specially formulated fork has side tines that allow for unparalleled pasta pick-ups. Couple this with a stainless strainer insert that fits inside a multitude of different sized pots for cooking and draining the pasta and a recipe for "momma's great homemade spaghetti sauce" and you have a winning combination sure to be appreciated over the years. Total cash outlay: less than \$20.

When you scream, I scream and we all start screaming for ice cream in the upcoming hot summer months, anyone who calls themselves a lover of this quintessentially frozen treat would go bonkers over the fabled Zeroll ice cream scoop.

Specially formulated with hermetically sealed anti-freeze in the handle, this scoop slices through frozen treats like a hot knife through butter. I received one as a gift about 15 years ago and it still is going strong, one look at me is to know that I love ice cream. Another bargain at about \$12, this scoop is a treat in itself but couple it with an ice cream maker and a bag of rock salt and of course, a treasured family recipe for a creamy old fashioned French vanilla ice cream, and already I feel beads of sweat in anticipation of those dog days of summer.

Another family favorite that has withstood the test of time and good taste is the Mouli Grater. If you remember the pasta dishes at Charlie's restaurants and that great little plastic gizmo that grates hard cheese and cheese and nuts via a crank, then this goodie, coming in at around \$15 is for you (or the new bride).

Available in both molded plastic and stainless, this grater not only makes great grated cheese but also does an equally fabulous job with nuts. A week doesn't go by without pulling out the Mouli for some fresh grated additions to spaghetti, pasta or lasagne. Add a few small bricks of imported hard cheese like Parmesan Reggiano and you'll have the prospective brides yelling Gratz!

#### Keeps knives sharp

There is little doubt that anyone starting a kitchen nowadays will appreciate a set of fine knives. Unfortunately, good cutlery does not come cheap and there is much truth to the rumor that chefs cut themselves only when their knives are dull.

There are a multitude of sharpening steels on the market, but I can highly recommend the purchase of a Craig Claiborn endorsed product called the Chef's Choice Knife Sharpener. Smaller models start at about \$50 with the deluxe models creeping higher but from someone who utilizes this gadget weekly and can appreciate a good sharp knife, I find it virtually indispensable in the kitchen.

Lastly, and like my knives, yours truly also appreciates great cookware. What's best? Stainless? Aluminum? Copper? Anyone who has ever cooked with anodized aluminum knows the greatness of a product dubbed Calphalon. The major pieces parallel the price of truffles but during the month of June every gourmet retailer is offering a "test" piece at drastically reduced prices.

The list of indispensable kitchen gadgets is long, but the products listed above won't break the budget and will certainly make cooking a lot more tolerable.

After 20 years in the kitchen, the average cook probably has 50 percent more kitchen gadgets than needed to make dinner. Most professional chefs will tell you, a good paring knife and chef's knife is all one needs to chop, slice, peel, dice and mince anything. But, what fun is that? Not only is chopping by hand little fun, it's time consuming and hard work.

Granted every good cook, novice or pro, needs a good set of knives for food preparation, but please don't take away my gadgets.

Any bride-to-be who enjoys cooking is spending lots of time these days, selecting cookware, small kitchen appliances and gadgets.

Soon to be married, Stephanie Hagopian of Birmingham loves to cook and has spent hours selecting kitchenware for bridal registries in kitchen shops

around town. As a communications graduate from Michigan State University, she is presently working on a graduate degree in dietetics at Madonna University in Livonia.

"As a student, my time is really limited. Most of the dinners I prepare now are quick, stir-fry dishes or feature pasta entrees," she said. "Because I buy everything fresh, having a good set of knives is a must."

Hagopian said she prefers Wusthof high-carbon stainless steel cutlery and is hoping she'll receive additional pieces as wedding gifts. She has selected Calphalon cookware, saucepans and soup pots.

"It's very good quality, and you won't have to replace it in 10 years," she said. "One of the things I can't do without is

a salad spinner, because I make salads every day."

Much to the benefit of the beginning or novice cook, kitchen shop owners have done a good job educating their staff. The Kitchen Glamor stores in Novi, Redford, Rochester and West Bloomfield, and Williams-Sonoma shops in Troy and Livonia, are examples.

Ann Skupski, regional manager and manager of the West Bloomfield store has been a restaurateur as well as merchandise manager before joining Kitchen Glamor.

"I ask them a few obvious things about their lifestyle," she said. "I'll ask what do they need to make breakfast? For lunch, are you on the run or do you need to make a hot lunch? I try to find

out what's their style of eating, and then divide the needs into categories — baking, making entrees and serving."

Most beginning cooks buy what's trendy or what their relatives suggest, Skupski said. "They need to be realistic. If you're going to buy a gadget, buy a good gadget. I've never forgotten a quote I read in a trade magazine when I first began working — 'quality endures long after the price is forgotten.'"

Joan Liposchak, manager of Williams-Sonoma in the Somerset Collection in Troy, advises brides-to-be to select a good set of cookware, utensils and knives.

"Depending on their style of cooking, it's best to select pans for individual uses." She also suggests brides ask for an assortment of items. "Shoppers who are looking for a gift often like to combine items and package them in gift baskets."

One thing customers often overlook is a cookbook by itself or given in combination with other kitchen items.

## Proper glass enhances wine enjoyment

Sight, smell and taste are all involved in total wine enjoyment. To a wine aficionado, the proper wine glass is a tool used to harmonize the three elements. This tool should be transparent, colorless and unadorned.

According to legend, the first wine glass was fashioned by Aphrodite from a bubble of seafoam she cut in half coming forth from the sea. Amusingly, except for one point made by the myth — wine glasses should be crystal clear.

The Bohemians and Venetians had a secret formula for tinting glass, and until the turn of the century, use of colored wine glasses was both fashionable and practical. Since winemaking techniques had not yet been perfected, wine of that era was cloudy and lacked eye appeal.

A basic all-purpose wine glass should have a minimum 8-oz. volume. This size allows placement of 2-3 oz. of wine in the glass allowing adequate volume for swirling the wine to volatilize aromatic components. Connoisseurs prefer larger sizes, particularly for red wines.

Sparkling wines have the most eye appeal. They

should be served in a 6-oz. tulip or flute. These shapes allow the bubbles to rise slowly through the wine from the stem. Watching the tiny bubbles and formation of mousse (the slight head) is part of the total enjoyment.

Pink champagne is very popular. Pinot noir, used in all champagne, except Blanc de blancs, is a red grape. If the winemaker allows a period of skin contact prior to fermentation, or for a short period during fermentation, the resulting wine will have a slight blush. A hollow-stem flute is the perfect glass for pink champagne.

A wine carafe is utilitarian. Some older red wines need decanting. If the wine has been properly stored on its side, the sediment formed during bottle aging has collected there. The bottle should be turned upright several hours prior to decanting. Hold the bottle over a candle and pour the wine into the carafe. When the sediment approaches the neck of the bottle, decanting should be terminated.

Wells Cargo in Birmingham has a large selection of practically-priced stemware. A recent shopping trip uncovered the following: Champagne flutes and tulips for under \$3; Auslese glass with a green stem, \$3.97; Burgundy goblet, \$1.73; Bordeaux or all-purpose 13-oz., \$1.77; and a wine carafe, \$4.97.

The art of making wine glasses has reached an optimum state. For more than 225 years, 10 generations of the Austrian Riedel family have produced some of the world's finest wine glasses. Claus Joseph Riedel, a ninth generation family member, was the first glass designer to recognize the relationship between the size and shape of a wine glass and the taste of the wine in that glass.

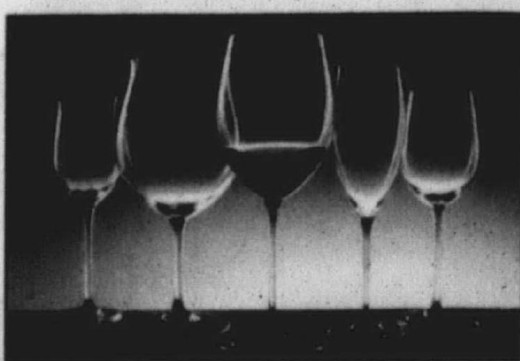
To enhance the experience of drinking wine, several series of Riedel stemware are available matching the

glass to the wine. The Overture series is priced around \$8.50 per stem; the Vinum series begins at \$15 and the Sommeliers series, the ultimate in fine, hand-blown stemware with a thin, polished lip can range as high as \$70 per stem for the largest goblets. In phoning various merchants who carry Riedel glasses, we found widely disparate prices, so shop before you purchase.

Slades, Southfield; Studio 330, Bloomfield Hills; Cloverleaf Market, Southfield; and all Merchant of Vino locations carry Riedel stemware. It may be special ordered if not immediately in hand.

"The balance of these glasses is perfect," said Bloomfield Hills Studio 330 owner Randy Forester. "No other stemware showcases wine so well." We have used these glasses and we agree.

"The 22-oz. Bordeaux glass in the Vinum Series makes the perfect, all-purpose red wine glass," maintains Merchant of Vino's Mark Jonna. "It's the only wine glass I sell because it's the best," said Cloverleaf Market's wine expert Jim Lutfy.

# Raspberries garnish refreshing lemon tart

**TARTE AU CITRON ET AUX AMANDES (LEMON TART WITH ALMONDS)**

- 2 cups flour, sifted
- 1/4 cup ground almonds
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1-2 teaspoons finely grated lemon rind
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, cubed
- 1 egg yolk
- 3-4 tablespoons ice cold water

- Filling:** 4 eggs  
 1/2 cup sugar  
 2 tablespoons finely grated lemon rind (2 lemons), retain the juice

- 1 cup unsalted butter, melted and cooled
- 1 cup coarsely ground unpeeled toasted almonds

- Garnish:** 2 tablespoons confectioners' sugar  
 2-3 cups raspberry puree

- Puree:** 2-10 oz packages frozen raspberries  
 juice of 2 large lemons  
 sugar to taste

To make the puree: Thaw the berries preserving the juice that melts off. Put the berries in a blender, add lemon juice and whip until blended. Add sugar to taste. Strain if desired. Refrigerate until serving. To prepare the pastry:

Combine the flour, almonds, sugar, salt and lemon rind in a large bowl. Lightly rub the butter into the flour using your fingertips, until the mixture resembles coarse cornmeal. Mix the egg yolk with 3 tablespoons of the ice water and stir into the crumbled mixture. The dough should form a soft ball. Add the remaining tablespoon of water if all the ingredients are not well combined. Wrap the dough in plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least 2 hours or overnight.

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Roll the dough out to form a circle large enough for a 12 inch tart pan with a removable bottom. Line the buttered tart ring with the dough and refrigerate for 30 minutes. (Note: It's essential to

butter the tart ring well.) Prick the dough with the tines of a fork. Line the dough with waxed or parchment paper, then metal baking pebbles or dried beans and bake for 5 minutes. Set aside to cool, remove paper and beans.

To prepare the filling: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Beat the eggs, sugar and lemon rind together until pale in color and very fluffy. Slowly beat in the lemon juice and then the melted butter.

Gently fold in the almonds with a spatula and transfer the filling to tart pan. Set tart on a baking sheet and bake for 30 minutes or until filling is firm. Set aside to cool.

When ready to serve, sprinkle cooled tart with confectioners' sugar and cut into wedges. Spread a little raspberry puree

on the bottom of each plate. Place slice on top and pour a little the puree around each slice. Serves 10.

## Get to the bottom of that freezer

"When was the last time you saw the bottom of your freezer?" asks Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland Cooperative Extension Service. "Keeping frozen food too long may result in poor quality, not even worth using."

Freezer burn is the result of keeping meals or poultry too long in the freezer or from improper wrapping procedures and materials. The outward surface appears dry and white and quality is then very poor.

It's important to label all frozen foods with contents and date so that the oldest foods can be used up first. Here are some tips to make the most of your freezer:

Learn proper wrapping, use freezer bags and containers, not refrigerator containers. Avoid using old margarine tubs to freeze food, these are not vapor proof and are not good for freezer use.

Keep your freezer full — it's cheaper on electricity to run a full freezer, and in case of power failure, a full freezer acts as an insulator to keep food colder longer.

Use "first in first out" system, put the newer food in back so the older is used first.

Freeze food sold within 24 hours. Do not stack warm packages on top of each other, allow space to permit air circulation after food is frozen solid, stack packages if desired.

## Gadgets complete a kitchen

Most of us who love to cook find ourselves drawn into kitchenware shops like honey bees to a flower. A visit into the kitchen cupboards of an experienced cook will often reveal a collection of culinary trends which could be described as complete.

The list begins with truffle shavers and ends with a croissant cutter. But there are a number of gadgets which any experienced, enthusiastic cook will tell you, "they

can't live without." Most of them have been around for decades and some are relatively new.

Instant meat thermometer for baking, grilling and roasting. Candy thermometer for measuring liquid temperatures for bread making, sauces and cooking custards. Oven thermometer, crucial because ovens are often out of calibration.

Zester to remove zest from lemons, oranges and grapefruits. Cuisinart or Krups Mini Prep Processor

— takes up little space, great for quickly chopping 1/2 onion.

KitchenAid Ultra Power 7-speed hand mixer, the lowest setting is very slow, perfect for heavy batters. Immersion hand better, great for pureeing soups right in the pot.

Nonstick skillets 8 and 12 inch, great for eggs, frittatas and sauteeing. Nonstick rolling pin, Chef's Choice knife sharpener, hones and sharpens knives which is essential.

## Serve pasta with red or green sauce

**ITALIAN MEAT SAUCE FOR PASTA**

- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, chopped fine
- 1 pound ground round steak
- 1/4 pound ground lean pork
- 2 cups Italian tomatoes
- 1/2 cup Italian tomato paste
- 1/2 cup beef or veal stock
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 bay leaf
- 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms
- 2 tablespoons oregano and basil
- fresh grated Parmesan or Romano cheese

Heat olive oil in a two-quart, non-reactive saucepan. Add garlic. Heat until garlic begins to sizzle. Add meats and cook until meat is cooked throughout. Drain and add remaining ingredients except mushrooms, basil, oregano and cheese. Simmer uncovered for 1 hour. During the last fifteen minutes of cooking, add mushrooms,

basil and oregano. Serve sauce over fresh pasta and top with fresh grated cheese.

### ANGELED EGGS

- 6 hard-cooked eggs
- 1 can (3 oz.) chunk chicken packed in water, undrained
- 3 tablespoons bottled chutney
- 2 teaspoons skim milk

# Garlic — It can be healthful, but beware of its side effects

The ancient Romans and Greeks referred to garlic as a "stinking rose" with powerful healing powers. In 1550 B.C., the Egyptians thought there were 22 different garlic-based formulas to cure ailments from body weaknesses, headaches to throat tumors.

The Romans treated garlic as a source of power and proposed 61 garlic cures. Garlic could supposedly cure ailments from hemorrhoids to snake bites. Probably the most interesting use for garlic was to use it to keep away vampires and other evil spirits.

Is garlic really an ancient wonder-drug? Today there are medical studies suggesting that eating garlic may reduce the chances of a heart attack, reduce cholesterol and blood pressure. These medical studies done in Europe used a highly concentrated dried garlic powder, and, according to their findings, very few over the counter garlic supplements contain the herb's active ingredient, allicin.

These scientists warn that taking garlic is not enough to control cho-

lesterol, on its own. If you're borderline it may be useful but not for those with severe cholesterol problems.

Beware of claims that garlic cures athlete's foot, hay fever, arthritis and many other disorders until more medical evidence is available. Large amounts of garlic can cause gas, stomach irritation, body odor and bad breath. Until all the evidence is in, keep the garlic in the kitchen cupboard and not in the medicine cabinet.

Fresh garlic is available all year, along with granulated garlic, instant minced garlic, instant garlic powder, garlic salt and minced garlic in oil.

Preserving garlic from the garden can be very easy. The key to keeping it fresh is proper air circulation while it is hung to dry. Several plants with the leaves still attached can be braided together or tied together and then hung to dry. The garlic heads can be easily broken off for use in cooking.

When purchasing garlic, select heads that are large, plump, firm, crisp and free of soft spots or shriveled cloves. Buy heads that are sold loose rather than boxed; it is an easier way to tell if the head is fresh.

Store garlic in a cool, dark, well ventilated spot rather than the re-

frigerator. Refrigeration tends to make them sprout. Garlic with soft, yellowed cloves or green sprouts should be tossed out.

Don't peel the cloves until you are ready to use them. Unpeeled, a head of garlic will stay fresh for weeks or can be frozen indefinitely in an enclosed freezer bag or freezer container.

Peeling the papery skin off the garlic clove is easy. Press the clove with the flat side of a broad knife or give it a good whack with the knife handle until it breaks the skin. Then, it will slip right off.

The pungency of garlic is determined by how finely chopped and how long it's been cooked. The smaller the pieces, the hotter the flavor; while the longer the cooking time the milder it becomes.

Baking garlic heads for about an hour drizzled with olive oil, butter and a little water will make them taste very sweet with the soft texture of butter. It can then be used as a spread for French bread or turned into a garlic sauce for beef or lamb.

Whisk some fresh garlic into leftover soups or sauces for a flavor boost. Drop a peeled garlic clove into French salad dressing and leave for about 24 hours, remove the clove, you'll enjoy the new flavor treat.

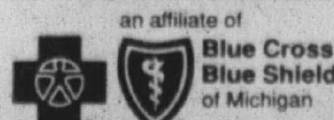

### Salem girls win division

Plymouth Salem dethroned Livonia Stevenson as the Lakes Division champion in girls track Wednesday, handing the Spartans their first Western Lakes Activities Association dual-meet defeat in four years, 86-42.

"We put many hours into it, and it's very satisfying," Salem coach Mark Gregor said of the team success. "It's nice to see the girls stay healthy and improve during the season."

The Rocks, 5-0 in the division and 7-0 overall, are expected to contend for the WLAA championship at the annual conference meet Tuesday at Centennial Educational Park. Stevenson finished 4-1 and 9-1.

Salem had only one winner in the field events — Melissa Hopson in the high jump (5-0) — but won all but one event on the track.

Theresa Giacherio won the high and intermediate hurdles in 15.8 and 48.5, and Tonya Wheeler, Vanessa Benning and Stacey Witthoff were other major players in the victory.

Wheeler won the 400 dash (1:01.1), Benning the 100 (12.6) and Witthoff the 800 run (2:31.6). All three were part of at least two relays — the Rocks won all four — along with Sarah Hamilton, Lynda Sebestyen, Marcia Parker and Dana Driscoll.

Hamilton, Driscoll and Parker combined with Benning to win the 400 (52.1) and Wheeler the 800 (1:48.5). Hamilton, Sebestyen, Witthoff and Wheeler won the 1,600 (4:27.9) and Sebestyen, Nicole Zavisa, Kelly Stankov and Witthoff the 3,200 (10:14.5).

Salem also won the distance runs with Karen Boudreau in the 1,600 (5:38.5) and Emily Farrell in the 3,200 (12:20.8). Stevenson's Teresa Sarno won the shot put (37-1) and discus (124-7) and Cathy Bacile the long jump (16-3/4) and 200 dash (27.1).

### Chiefs win 8th straight

The Plymouth Canton girls track team won the Western Division title for the eighth consecutive year in the Western Lakes Activities Association, routing Livonia Churchill 103-25 in the final dual meet Wednesday.

The Chiefs finished 5-0 in the division and 5-1 overall. Canton will try to defend its WLAA championship Tuesday at CEP.

Karina Kilpelainen won the hurdle races, running 16.1 in the highs and 49.1 in the intermediates, and contributed to one of Canton's four relay victories.

Becky Bockstanz and Olive Ikeh combined with Kilpelainen and Ndu Okwumabua to win the 400 relay (52.7), Michelle Dean and Alicia King the 800 (1:54.4).

Plymouth Salem avenged an earlier loss to Northville in girls soccer by winning 1-0 in a Western Lakes Activities Association crossover game Wednesday at Salem.

Senior Julie Thomas scored the only goal off the rebound from a shot by junior Kris Goff midway in the first half.

Junior goalkeeper Meshia Chicon recorded her third consecutive shutout. "With every game, she gets better," Salem coach Ken Johnson said.

## Canton wins WLAA soccer final



The Western Lakes Activities Association championship in girls soccer changed hands Thursday night when Plymouth Canton took the title from host Livonia Stevenson, 2-0. It was the second win over Stevenson for the unbeaten Chiefs.

Plymouth Canton made a favorable impression on Livonia Stevenson girls soccer coach Mary Kay Hussey when the teams played each other in April.

The Chiefs did nothing to change her opinion Thursday night, defeating Hussey's Spartans a second time and winning the Western Lakes Activities Association championship with a 2-0 victory at Stevenson.

"The first time we played Canton I thought they were a great team," Hussey said. "I'm still impressed with them, and I think they're the team to beat (in the state tournament)."

It was the second WLAA title in four years for No. 2-ranked Canton, 12-0-2 going into an opening-round district game tonight against rival Plymouth Salem. No. 3 Stevenson, the reigning champ until last week, takes an 11-2-2

record into post-season play tonight at Livonia Churchill.

The Spartans pressured much of the first half, especially the first 15 minutes when the ball seldom left the Canton end. But the Chiefs led 1-0 at halftime, converting their only shot of the half.

After a corner kick by Christina Stansell, Stevenson goalkeeper Alicia Smith stepped out to get the ball, but Canton's Amy Tortora knocked it past her as she did.

"That's the way it happens a lot of times," Canton coach Don Smith of a 6-1 shooting disadvantage in the first half. "I'm glad we were on the good end of that one."

"I was a little worried (early), but we play a zone type defense where we fall back. We were sorta ducking and hoping they didn't knock us in the goal, too."

"Our kids played a terrific game. The girls scrapped and played tough."

The shot opportunities were more even in the second half, with the Spartans holding a 14-6 overall edge.

Canton keeper Jori Welchans made several outstanding saves to get her 10th shutout of the season. The best occurred midway in the second half with the score still 1-0.

A loose ball was bouncing across the front of the Canton goal, with the Spartans getting only two weak attempts. But Michele Brach was ready to drill it on the right side when Welchans leaped in front of her and knocked the ball out of bounds.

"It's disappointing to give up a goal when we controlled most of the first half, but I don't think that took much out of our kids," Hussey said. "They continued to fight and we had a lot of good chances. But their keeper played a phenomenal game, and it didn't go our way."

The Chiefs got an insurance goal with 6 1/2 minutes remaining. Tortora had a breakaway down the left side and centered to Mandy Salin, who fired a shot that was blocked by Smith but got up and kicked in the rebound.

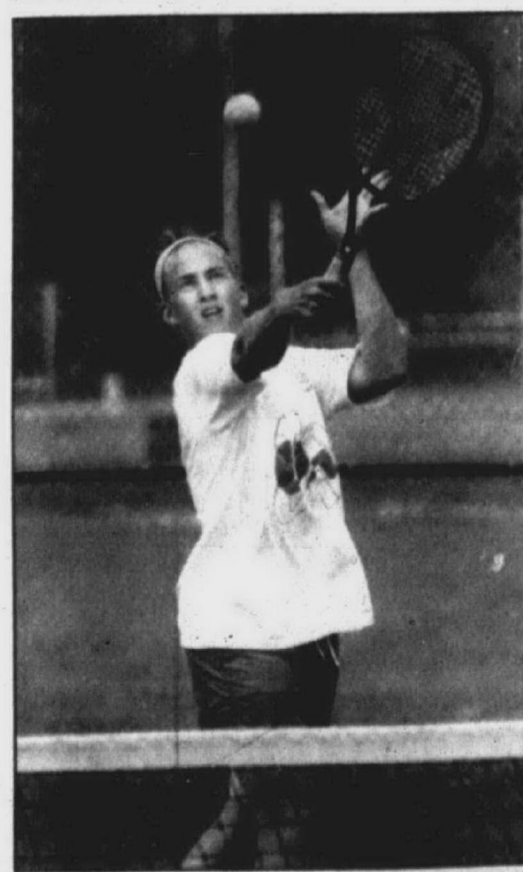
"We pushed Tracy Morrell up to midfield and played flat in the back," Hussey said. "You're either going to score a goal or give one up. You take a chance when you do that, and it didn't work out this time."

Unlike the first game, Stevenson had all-stater Ragen Coyne this time. Smith gave credit to junior halfback Amy Westerhold for defending Coyne and holding her scoreless.

"She's definitely a super player," said Smith of Coyne, "but it's tough for one player to take over as it was with Michael Jordan until (the Chicago Bulls) got some other players."

Coyne, who had four of her nine shots on free kicks, was effective as a playmaker at times, and Stevenson played better than it did the first time in part because of that, according to Hussey.

"If you're talking about scoring, I guess they did the job," she said. "But we don't necessarily look for Ragen to score. She had a great game controlling the midfield. She'd take the ball in against the defense, they fouled her and she got the free kicks."

Plymouth Canton's four-year stranglehold on the Western Lakes Activities Association boys tennis crown is over.

Sweeping all four singles flights, led by the Schwagle brothers (Mark and Matt), Northville reigns supreme in the WLAA after scoring a team-high 19 points in the two-day tourney last week at Livonia Stevenson.

North Farmington and Canton finished second and third with 16 and 14, respectively. Plymouth Salem was a distant fourth with 10. See statistical summary.

Brother Matt, a sophomore, also lived up to his top seeding by beating Churchill's unseeded Martin Knecht for the No. 2 singles title, 6-2, 6-2. Knecht

reached the final by upending second seed Harry Lee of Salem.

Northville also grabbed the Nos. 3 and 4 singles titles.

Brad Smith, also a top seed, blanked North's Tony Fracchia for No. 3 singles crown, 6-0, 6-0.

In a mild upset, Northville's Brit Davis avenged a dual meet loss to Churchill's Nadir Khan, winning the final, 6-4, 6-1.

Northville's domination ended in doubles when Canton's No. 1 duo of Stu Lendenbach and Steve Dale, both juniors, survived an upset bid by Farmington Harrison's duo of Ryan Cahill and Aaron Mobley, 6-4, 7-6.

Canton also captured the No. 3 crown in doubles when Scott Boersma and Chris Bray beat North's tandem of Brian Ellison and Brian Ragland, 6-3, 6-2. Bray and Boersma upset top seeded Northville in the semifinals, 6-3, 6-3.

North earned the other first place medal when Jason Wendorf and Brad Martin, the top seeds, defeated Canton's Alex Warden and Eric Baden, 6-4, 6-2, in the No. 2 flight.

"Our No. 1 and 3 doubles team won and our second doubles team was strong," Libbing said. "We lost all of our singles players from last year, but our No. 4 man (Jeff Fuerst) lost only once, so I have to be pleased."



# CC wins predistrict qualifier

Redford Catholic Central made good use of Brett Walter and the four-ball, three-strike rule in Thursday's Class A district-qualifying baseball game against Livonia Churchill.

CC, which plays with a three-ball, two-strike rule in the Catholic League, had nine hits and beat Churchill 7-1 at Redford's Capitol Park.

One of the catalysts was Walter, a senior outfielder/pitcher who struggled to break into the lineup earlier this month. Walter misplayed a fly ball that led to Churchill's only run in the fifth inning, but he contributed two hits, including a triple, scored a run and knocked in a run with a single.

The win improved CC to 17-3 overall. Churchill, which managed only two hits off four CC pitchers,

fell to 6-7 overall. "It felt good to help out the team," Walter said.

It also felt good to all of the CC hitters knowing they could swing and miss twice each at-bat without striking out. Churchill pitchers Mark Rutherford and Jason Carter struck out only three CC batters.

"All hitters would rather have the 4-3 count because there's more of a chance your pitch will be there," said CC senior Dan Gusoff, who played the first six innings in right field before pitching no-hit ball in the seventh.

Rutherford, Churchill's ace, lasted only three innings after surrendering five runs on five hits, two walks and three strikeouts. In Rutherford's defense, the Chargers committed two errors and two passed balls during his stint and only two of the runs he allowed were earned. Rutherford, who

brought a 1.4 earned run average into the game, threw 40 strikes out of 72 pitches.

"I thought we didn't play well behind Mark," Churchill coach Herb Osterland said. "He was pitching well but CC had the lead and to get back in the game I thought we had to change things. Jason is a different kind of pitcher, he throws more change-ups, curves and sliders. I thought both pitched well but I felt coming in CC has a good ballclub and we had to play a near perfect game to push them."

CC scored three unearned runs to lead 3-0 after three innings and Walter led off the fourth with a triple to the right-center field fence. After a walk to CC third baseman Eric Justice, leadoff batter Scott Kapla stroked a single to score Walter and send Rutherford out of the game. Carter came in and got Paul

Kuhn to ground out but Brian Hicks' sacrifice fly brought Justice home from third for a 5-0 lead. Carter allowed two earned runs and four hits the rest of the way.

Kapla earned the win for the Shamrocks, allowing no runs on one hit, one walk and two hit batters in four innings of work.

### DISTRICT'S BEST

The NAIA District 23 has made its choices for baseball honors, and four of the 15 picked have Observerland ties.

Three of those named are from Madonna University, which tied for third in the regular season with a 14-8 record. Senior first baseman Ernie Bowling and junior second baseman Joe Brusseau (from Redford Bishop Borgess) were repeat selections; senior pitcher Chris Kloc (Redford Thurston) was chosen for the first time.

Bowling had another powerful season. He batted .304, clubbing nine doubles and eight home runs, and driving in 48 runs. His 42 hits tied Brusseau for team-high; his RBI count led the Crusaders.

Chris Smith joins six others in a promising recruiting class for Michigan State hockey coach Ron Mason. Smith, from Canton, was a defenseman for the Detroit Junior Red Wings in the NAJHL last season, collecting 12 goals and 14 assists in 37 games.

The 5-foot-10, 185-pounder is one of four defensemen signed by Mason. Others are Ryan Fleming, Chris Sullivan and Bart Vanstaaldin. The Spartans were 25-11-8 overall last season, finishing third in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association and reaching the NCAA Final Four before losing.

### STRONG COMEBACK

# Romance is standard fare at 'Jack's Place'

## Hal Linden stars in ABC comedy-drama

Love is silly. Shameless. Hopeless. For that matter, so is "Jack's Place," an unabashedly romantic comedy-drama debuting Tuesday, May 26, on ABC.

Hal Linden stars as Jack Evans, a piano-noodling Los Angeles restaurateur. Finola Hughes ("Cats," "Soapdish," "General Hospital") and John Dye ("Makin' the Grade," "Billionaire Boys Club," "Tour of Duty") co-star as Jack's cocktail waitress and bartender, respectively.

Chelsea (Hughes) is a whiz at baseball trivia, but romance generally leaves her stranded. She just can't read a man's signals after he's gotten to first base. Greg Toback (Dye) is a single father and something of a novice behind the bar. He likes Chelsea, and she pretends not to notice. They're both nice people. In fact, you won't meet anything but nice people on this show — except for a few ex-boyfriends who turned out to be cads.

Swirling around this core cast are the patrons and ancillary staff of Jack's Place, from the temperamental French chef who believes love and cooking don't mix to the long-lost daughter who comes looking for her father. Each hour-long show has three story lines, of which one is a boy-meets-girl romance. Guest stars will include

Linda Purl, Michele Greene, Robert Guillaume, Mickey Rooney and Trevor Eve, a British actor ("A Doll's House," "Parnell and the Englishwoman") who does an American dialect better than most and displays talent as a sketch artist as well.

"Jack's Place" isn't bad, but it would look better if one were tipsily infatuated with it, as executive producer Scott Brazil surely is. Brazil is a product of the esteemed MTM studios, where he worked on "The White Shadow" and won Emmys for "Hill Street Blues," but his last two drama series, "TV 101" for NBC and "WIOU" for CBS, flopped after they promised quirkiness yet proved merely derivative. It's a curse that's hard to shake. On paper, "Jack's Place" sounds charming — an affectionate anthology of romance in a neighborhood bistro run with a personal touch — but on screen it falls somewhat short.

Indeed, "Jack's Place" might look better if it looked worse. This upscale "bistro" has no red-checked tablecloths, no candles on the tables, no sawdust on the floor. Set and produced in a city where every good restaurant is distinctively decorated and trendiness is the only constant, Jack's Place has the visual appeal of a page from The Wall Street Journal. If there's to be any romance here, Jack's patrons will

have to bring it with them. Ten years after ABC retired "Barney Miller," Linden is making his second attempt to return to series television ("Blacke's Magic," with Harry Morgan, ran briefly in 1986 on NBC.) Handsome as ever in a Hart, Shaffner and Marx wardrobe, he looks far too debonair to be the Mr. Lonelyhearts of the prime-rib set. British-bred Hughes, a kind of soft-focus Joan Collins, needs to watch her diction. Her "last call" sounds like "law school" — hardly the invitation one wants to hear from a cocktail waitress.


"Jack's Place" joins the ABC schedule where "Civil Wars" failed, representing a programming about-face from a cynical, experimental divorce-court drama audiences rejected to a proven format swimming in a sentimental sauce. With its solid appeal to viewers over 40, "Jack's Place" may be helped in the ratings by rumors of a backstage romance between Hughes and Dye, but it will likely prove to be nothing more than a summer flirtation for the network.

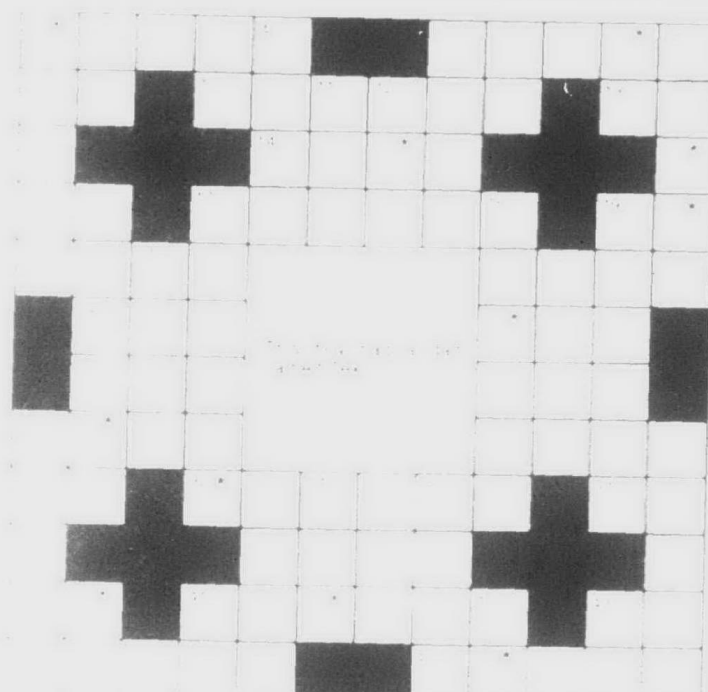

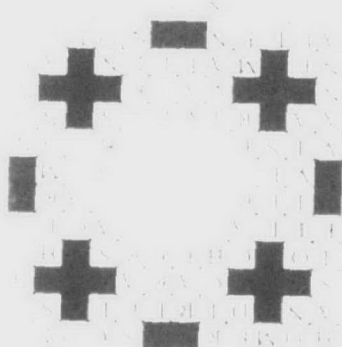

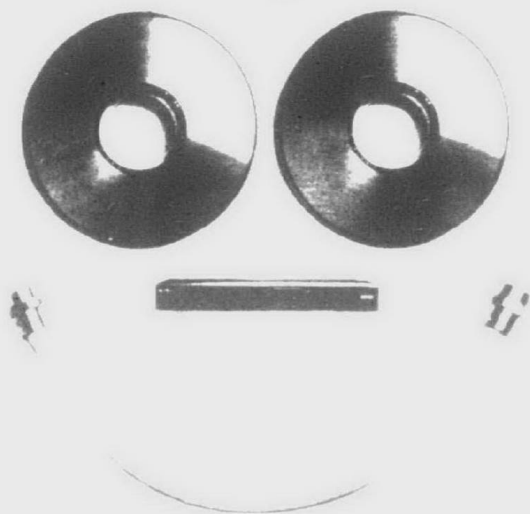
