Money woes hit classrooms



When the kids head back to classes Sept. 1 there will be more desks filled in each room, participation fees for sports, high prices for lunches and increased student parking fees. The reason is that the Plymouth Canton schools have \$5 million less money.

Until now, Plymouth-Canton Community Schools' budget problems have been felt most deeply by the nearly 100 employees who've lost their jobs. Pink-slipped were 58 teachers, five

administrators, three clerical staff, 13 custodial workers, 10 educational aides, two attendance office aides and a warehouse employee.

But when school starts Sept. 1, students, parents and the community will start feeling the pinch.

Among the changes they can expect are larger classes; participation fees for after-school activities and sports; and increased fees for student parking, adult education classes, extended day programs, lunches, and building rental fees.

"This is what happens when you go and take \$5 million out of the budget," said Dean Swartzwelder, referring to the property tax freeze and the state aid cut. "The loss of teaching positions is the result, and it's going to get worse."

Voters in June rejected a 1.5-mill

property tax increase. The district had asked for a tax increase to offset both the property tax freeze and a cut in state aid.

Superintendent John Hoben said there was no way out of establishing activity fees.

"We don't like the idea of charging students to participate in activities, but without sufficient funds, these programs would otherwise be cut," Hoben said. "We felt that the activities were important to some students, so the participa-

Schools delay decision on land sale

After receiving an earful from residents and Plymouth Township officials, Plymouth-Canton school board members agreed last week to give Plymouth Township more time to make an offer on acreage that contains a maple and beech climax forest.

The school district recently decided

to sell 17 acres in Plymouth Township, purchased in 1968 for possible use as an elementary school site.

South of North Territorial and north of Ann Arbor Trail near McClumpha, the property borders Plymouth Township Park to the north.

The board's action gives the township until Oct. 15 to exercise its right of first refusal.

At Monday night's school board meeting, board president Roland Thomas gave the audience — nearly half of whom were residents concerned about the issue — a synopsis of what's happened thus far.

Thomas said administration determined last March the land wouldn't be needed for an elementary school and advertised it for sale.

"One bid was received from The Selective Group Inc. for \$850,000, contingent upon not less than a 35-lot subdivision being approved by Plymouth Township," Thomas said. The board on July 13 accepted a modified bid indicating that if the site plan would permit up to 37 lots, the price would be increased

Pastor leaving

The Rev. James Wysocki of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church in Plymouth is leaving town to become pastor at the Holy Cross Parish in Marine City.

During Wysocki's two-year tenure at the city's biggest church, Our Lady proposed a church school expansion that several neighbors rejected.

While the neighbors and the church haven't yet settled their differences, Wysocki said he's encour-

aged that now "there really is a sense of cooperation between the parish and the community."

In his new job, starting Sept. 1, Wysocki will be pastor at a parish where two troubled high schools have been merged to form one.

"I feel called to that ministry at this particular point and the bishop agrees with me," he said.

County charter amendments await voter opinion

One of Wayne County's hottest fall elections might not involve candidates or taxes but a series of highly technical ballot proposals amending the county charter.

Wayne County Commissioners placed the proposed charter amendments proposals on the fall ballot Thursday, saying they would make county government more efficient by clarifying the roles of the commission, county executive and other county officials.

Commissioners approved the proposal on a series of unanimous voice votes though several commissioners, including Kevin Kelley, D-Redford and Maurice Breen, R-

Plymouth Township were absent from the session.

"This should take care of at least three-quarters of the headlines we've been making lately," said Commissioner Bryan Amann, D-Wayne.

But county Executive Edward McNamara is readying his veto pen and promises a "major campaign" against the proposals in the fall should his veto be overridden.

"This is a series of proposals designed to weaken the county executive's office," deputy executive Michael Duggan said. "It would take the county back to the days when the county commission ran everything and we're sure the people don't want that."

The proposals include:

- Amending the charter to "expressly use the separation of powers concept to determine the relationship between the executive, judicial and legislative branches of county government.

- Providing the auditor general with "the express power to conduct financial and operations compliance audits of all county agencies" as well as providing misdemeanor penalties for those who refuse "reasonable inquiries made by the auditor general".

- Requiring county commission approval of compensation rates and benefits for non-union executive's employees.

- Requiring the executive's office to file an office reorganization plan within 180

days after the start of the executive's new term.

A fifth proposal, expanding commission authority to subpoena records, documents and witnesses, was tabled for further study but may yet appear on the fall ballot.

It would take the votes of 10 of the 15 commissioners to override McNamara's veto.

All five proposals sprang from disputes between the commission and McNamara.

"We've had instances where the auditor general was stonewalled," said Kay Beard, D-Westland, who sponsored that proposal as well as the one that would give the commission final say over executive office pay rates.

"Really, that's the way it should have

been except for a strange opinion from the county corporation counsel giving the power solely to the personnel department."

Commissioners said they never confirmed McNamara's recent hiring of former state representative Teola Hunter because of the executive's failure to file a reorganization plan.

Hunter subsequently gained the Democratic nomination for county clerk.

Despite the political in-fighting, even some commissioners aren't sure how — or whether — the people will vote.

"It will be a long ballot," Amann said. "A lot of these items could be confusing if not explained to people."

It appears both sides will be doing some explaining before election day.

Rotary Club tackles charity projects

The Plymouth Rotary Club isn't just about chicken dinners during Plymouth Community Fall Festival Sundays.

The Plymouth Rotary Board, under the guidance of chairman Maynard Fleming, has recently tackled projects to aid local handicapped. They presented:

- A \$1,400 phonic ear to School-

craft College's Learning Assistance Center for use by local hearing-impaired students. The device allows these students to hear a professor's oral instruction in the classroom.

- \$1,000 to allow four local kids to attend the St. Francis summer camp for mentally impaired.

- \$750 for handicapped exercise equipment in the Schoolcraft Col-

lege weight room.

- A \$2,350 share toward buying a van to be driven by Plymouth Township special service officers who transport local court probationers as manual laborers at Rotary and township projects.

The club also provides up to \$1,000 in academic and vocational scholarships to handicapped resi-

dents.

Projects planned for the coming year include an international youth exchange with a handicapped student, providing adult academic and vocational scholarships, providing handicapped summer camp scholarships, and a lap-top computer program for learning impaired Plymouth grade school students.

tion fee is the only logical answer."

Fees will be charged for athletics, cheerleading, debate, drama, forensics, marching band and pompon squad.

Fees will be \$60 per student per sport or activity. The maximum charge for after-school activities will be \$120 for high school students, with a maximum of \$180 per family. Middle school students will be charged \$35 per sport or activity, with a maximum per-student charge of \$70 and a maximum charge per family of \$105.

Parking fees for students and Canton and Salem high schools will go from \$20 to \$50 per year. Hardship waivers will be granted to students who qualify under federal guidelines for the free or reduced lunch program. The identity of qualifying students will be kept confidential.

The average class size will go up to slightly more than 26, with the highest class size pegged at 38, said Michael Homes, assistant superintendent for instruction.

"These figures are preliminary. There's no question there will be changes over the next three weeks," he said.

Class size in the 42 kindergarten sections will be 21-31. "As

troublesome as the kindergarten sections might be, what we see at the elementary level is even more so," Homes said.

Average secondary school classes also will be higher.

"By Aug. 24, we will have a good feel for kindergarten-through-12th-grade class sizes," Homes said.

Staffing changes will be made during August as enrollment becomes more accurate, said Errol Goldman, executive director/employee relations.

"Over the course of August, we will fine tune, depending on enrollment changes. We will switch teachers from building to building rather than add staff," he said. "We will wait until Aug. 21 to make final changes to reduce disruption as much as possible."

Some middle schools may not be able to offer foreign language instruction, Hoben said.

"There will be some differences in the curriculum at middle schools. Some may not have Spanish or German. It will vary according to the certification of teachers at each school."

Said Goldman: "We have called back many of our Spanish teachers. That's been a strong area the last few years. Within each school, we will do our best. Our priority was to protect the core program."

to \$890,000. Because the board's practice has been to offer local governmental units the right of first refusal, said Thomas, Plymouth Township was offered the right for a period not to exceed 30 calendar days, expiring Aug. 12. "Everyone must understand that Plymouth Township has control over the zoning and ultimate use of this property, not the board of education," he said.

While the township has verbally expressed its interest in purchasing the property, the first written communication of that interest wasn't received until July 13, 1992, added Thomas. "The first indication that we had from the community that there was concern came on July 27. The board that same evening directed the superintendent to work with The Selective Group to extend the 30-day period to at least an additional 60 days, which should permit sufficient time to reach an agreement with the township."

A new subdivision would result in the creation of more traffic as well as the destruction of a climax maple and beech woods. "We would suffer the permanent loss of 17 acres, and the opportunity to preserve this woods for the benefit of generations to come." Residents "very much appreciate the fiscal concerns the district is operating under, however as a prac-

tical matter, we don't believe the one-time sale of this property will solve the problem. It will provide funds only for the building and site fund, a short-term benefit" in contrast with the long-term benefit of a park. "Our concern is we lose forever the opportunity to preserve that woods," Didier said. "We think that's too precious a resource to lose, and we urge you to work with Plymouth Township to reach an agreement." Thomas said the board would ask the township to "give us a timetable for their process to evaluate what their purchase price would be.

Summer play

Kids escape to wooded haven

Most kids who play in the woods adjacent to Plymouth Township Park aren't aware there's a possibility The Selective Group will replace the climax beech and maple forest with a new subdivision.

They're preoccupied on many a summer day with escapades into a world of adventure that unfolds just a few steps into the woods north of the park between Ann Arbor Trail and North Territorial near McClumpha Road.

Chris LaFond, 11, and his brother Mike, 5, led a group of friends to their fort in the woods one recent afternoon.

"Mike and I go down here and play a lot," said Chris. "We set up forts with dead branches that have fallen. It's a nice place to play. You can climb trees, and catch fish and crayfish in the creek. There's a ton of bats. Those are cool to watch."

On their hike, the kids forded a dried creekbed and pretended they were Olympic gymnasts traversing a balance beam while walking the length of an immense fallen hardwood.

Later they happened upon a mammoth tree with a trunk eight feet around. From one angle it looked like a normal, huge beech. When they walked around to the other side, they realized it had a hollowed-out trunk so large they could stand inside it. "Do you think this is a bat cave?" asked one of the gang.

Chris Lamar's house backs up to the woods. His mother, Joanne

Lamar, is organizing a petition drive with other residents to try to preserve the forest.

"I would hate it if they tore the woods down," said Chris Lamar. "I wouldn't like it at all. Sometimes I like seeing owls and hawks back there."

Joanne Lamar has seen the owls and hawks, too. "The owls are great. Sometimes I just sit up at night and listen to them. It's wonderful. Hawks have hovered right over us. It's interesting for the kids," she said.

Lamar, president of the Glenview Homeowners Association, and other concerned residents are working with officials from Plymouth Township and the school board, hoping the school board will agree to sell the land to the township. She envisions nature trails through the woods, and unlit soccer fields on the unwooded portion of the 17 acres.

"We want the schools to know we are voters in this community, and we are not oblivious to what is going on," she said.

Thus far, Lamar's group has collected 600 signatures from residents who support preservation of the woods for public use. John Jawor, manager of nearby Hilltop golf course, also is collecting signatures.

Lamar said a letter was sent to the district in 1986 expressing the community's interest in permitting the township to bid on the property. School officials tell her the letter must have been lost, because there's no record of it, she said.

"I've always been a strong school supporter, but I'm seeing firsthand

what other people have said about the school board. I've never believed it before," she said. "They should have had the courtesy to approach the township and say, 'This is what we are doing.'"

Carol Hansz and her family recently moved here from Dearborn Heights. "When we moved here, the Realtor was pointing out what a valuable resource the beech-and-maple climax forest was. He said he'd never worry about it being developed. That's why we moved here."

Ann LaFond, another concerned homeowner, said, "I grew up north, and I really think we should save the woods for the park. The school board says we can't favor one part of the community over another. But people from all over the community use the park. We don't need a park annex halfway to Ann Arbor."

Annette Stutrud, vice president and treasurer of the Beacon Civic Association, said, "Parklands are very scarce right now. We can't replace these woods."

Stutrud fears what would happen if Glenview were extended to accommodate the proposed subdivision. "Glenview will be just a raceway; a regular thoroughfare. We have a lot of little kids in this area, and we don't have sidewalks."

Lamar points out that homes in existing new subdivisions aren't selling. "Yet there's another one going in on North Territorial. It's called Rolling Oaks, and there's not an oak in sight. What are they going to call it here? Maple Beech Cemetery?"

The bus driver involved in an accident that injured a Canton teenager on Aug. 3 was being tested by the University of Michigan for a permanent driving job and had never driven a bus on the route he followed that day, said Ann Arbor police Lt. Norman Melby.

The Canton girl, Tiffany Hopkins, 15, was in fair condition at the University of Michigan Hospital, according to Toni Shears, a hospital spokeswoman.

Her leg was injured when it was caught between a concrete rubbish bin and a concrete planter she was sitting on at the corner of Church and South University. The bus, making a wide right turn, hit the bin and pushed it into the planter.

The bus driver, a 24-year-old Ypsilanti man and U-M Hospital custodian, received a ticket for careless driving, but police don't plan to charge him with a

crime. "He was new," Melby said. "They were evaluating his driving skills prior to hiring him."

However, Melby said the accident wasn't "anything you can plan on. He was just in the wrong place at the wrong time."

Smith didn't get the bus driving job, according to university spokesman Joe Owsley, and has since returned to his custodian job.

Reaching out

Fund-raising drive planned for September

With its endowment fund virtually drained, the Canton Community Foundation has announced a drive to raise \$100,000 in three weeks.

A group called TEAM 100, which has 14 members, is supposed to raise the money between Sept. 2 and 23 beginning with a breakfast at Palermo's and ending with a foundation birthday breakfast.

"We're definitely going to have to work very hard (to reach this goal)," said foundation president Phyllis Redfern. "It's not going to be easy."

The foundation's director, Bill Joyner, is more confident. "It's doable. It's attainable, and it will happen," he said. "I know the people of Canton are good-hearted."

According to a foundation press release, 100 community leaders will be part of TEAM 100, but Redfern said they might not get that many. "I'm not sure if we'll have 100, but we'll have quite a few."

Indeed, they've snared a fair number of heavy hitters. Among the

14 are: Township Supervisor Tom Yack, clerk Loren Bennett, realtor Joe Van Esley, attorney Bruce Patterson and the Rev. Bill Myers.

Although specific tactics haven't been set yet, Redfern said the TEAM will ask just about every resident and business in Canton for money. "We're trying to hit everybody one way or another," she said. "The key is letting people in the community know that we need people to help people."

Joyner said that the Foundation, in its three-year existence, has never tried to raise more than \$60,000 at one time. "(But) our programs are so large now that we can't function with less than that amount (\$100,000)."

For example, a counseling service that began in January turned out to be so costly that CCF had to clean out its endowment fund, or savings account, to cover the bills.

The fund had \$10,000 in it at the beginning of the year, but the \$2,000/month cost of the counseling service whittled the fund to a pittance.

Although the counseling service cost is down to \$1,500/month now, Joyner expects it to rise again when school starts. Also, the service's \$250/month rent, paid by Van Esley until the end of 1992, may have to be picked up by CCF after Dec. 31.

The idea behind the endowment fund is to have enough money in it

to run CCF's programs off the interest and dividends generated.

Joyner estimated that the board of directors will put up to \$20,000 of TEAM 100's collection into the endowment fund. He also expects to have \$50,000 in the fund by the end of 1992. But CCF needs \$1 million in the fund "before it will be of any value to us," Joyner said.

However, Joyner promised that CCF will have that amount before he steps down as director. "Before I leave here we will have it," he said. "The best way this community can get rid of me is to give me your money."

Other members of TEAM 100 are: Bob Paciocco, Richard Duwel, Mitch Howard, Jack Demmer, Norm Cepela, Pat Haggerty and Redfern.

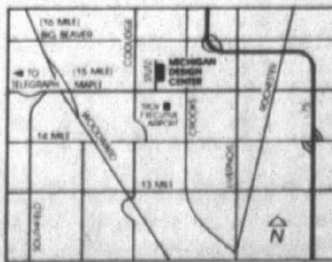

SC board may be in for change

McCotter, Stempien election wins will open 2 seats

Those with an interest in serving on the Schoolcraft board should probably keep their resumes handy.

There could be as many as two openings on the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees this fall, but board members won't be filling them until after the November elections.

Board chairwoman Jeanne Stempien and trustee Thaddeus McCotter were both winners in this month's primaries and have advanced to fall elections.

Stempien, of Northville Township, is one of six candidates running in the non-partisan race for Wayne County Circuit Judge.

Livonia resident McCotter, a Re-

publican, is taking on Democratic nominee Michael Caffery of Plymouth for the 10th District Wayne County Commission seat.

Both would have to resign their Schoolcraft seats if elected, but they'll stay on the board at least until then.

"I can make the meetings, it might be a little tight, but it should be no problem," Stempien said.

McCotter, too, said he'll keep attending college meetings.

"I'm not presuming anything," he

said. "That's the surest way to lose an election."

Of the two, McCotter faces the easiest race.

His commission district, including most of Livonia, Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township, is considered heavily Republican.

Stempien faces a more competitive race for the county circuit court. She finished fourth in the primary, 2,700 votes behind third place finisher Robert L. Ziolkowski,

a Detroit Records Court Judge, and five ahead of the fifth-place finisher, attorney Joseph V. Brennan. Detroit Records Judge Denise Page Hood, assistant Macomb County Prosecutor Diane Hathaway and attorney John W. Callahan are also on the ballot.

The three highest vote-getters will be elected to the bench.

New trustees are generally appointed after a series of public interviews with other trustees. Appointees would then seek election in June.

Regardless of the Stempien's and McCotter's chances, officials aren't even considering replacements, Schoolcraft spokeswoman Sandra Florek said.

"We can't do anything until there's an opening," she said.

Jobless rate rose in June

Jobless rates rose locally and throughout most of the state in June, mainly because young people were looking for summer jobs, according to the Michigan Employment Security Commission.

Still, local unemployment rates were lower than June 1991.

F. Robert Edwards, MESC director, said employment was up throughout Michigan in June but the number of workers entering the job market was greater than the number of available jobs.

"Although seasonal hiring increases in June, we typically have higher unemployment rates as students and other young people begin their search for summer jobs," Edwards said.

Unemployment in Canton was at 4.8 percent in June, with 1,100 workers unemployed and 21,900 employed.

The May unemployment rate was 4.5 percent, and the June 1991 rate was 5.1 percent.

In the city of Plymouth, the unemployment rate was 3.5 percent in June, with 175 unemployed and 4,800 employed, the MESC reported.

In Canton, the June unemployment rate was 4 percent, with 450 unemployed and 10,875 employed.

Among industries reporting seasonal employment gains in June were construction, services, and tourism-related industries including amusement and eating and drinking establishments.

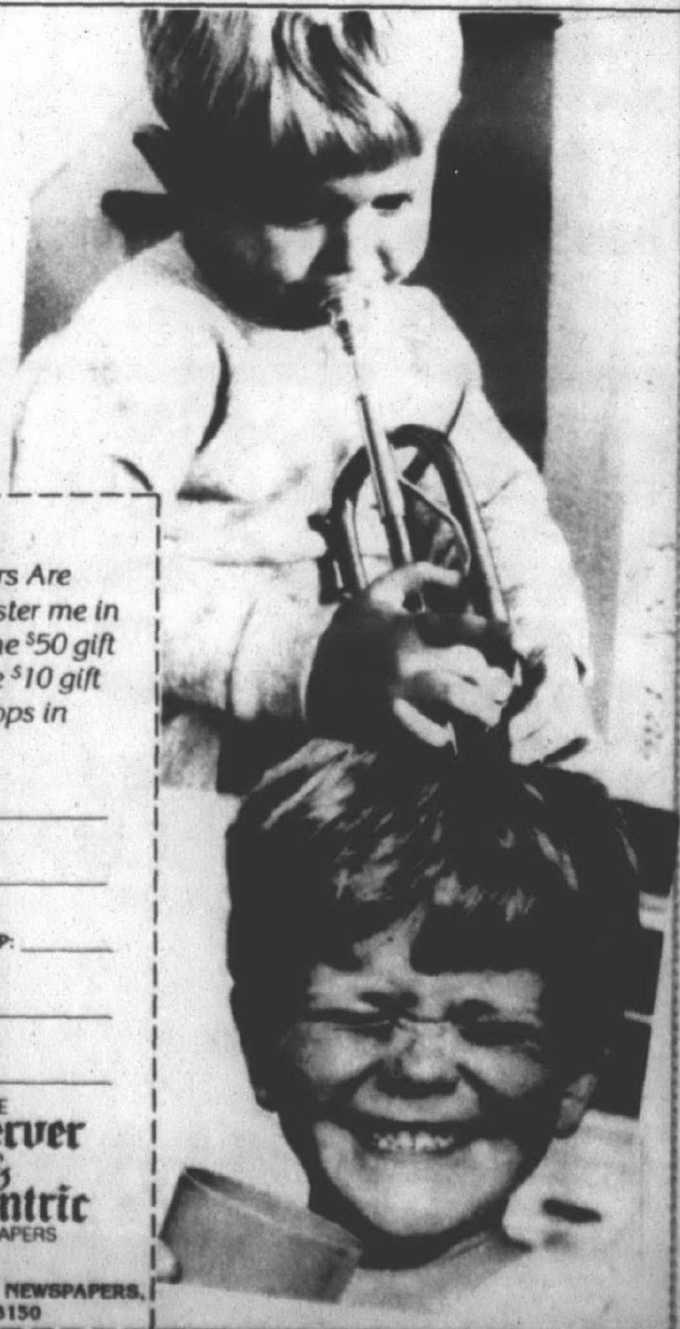

Women on the bench

Judicial candidates see gains, setbacks

Female candidates did surprisingly well in this month's Wayne County judicial primaries, but is it a political breakthrough or another example of the glass ceiling?

Even the principals themselves don't agree.

On one hand, many female candidates said they sensed a changing, more receptive mood among voters.

"As I went out on the campaign trail I did hear from a lot of voters who told me they thought it was time to give women a chance," said circuit court candidate Jeanne Stempien.

Stempien, chair of the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees, placed fourth in the 12-person primary. The top six finishers now are

vying for three seats on the circuit court bench. In addition to Stempien the candidates are Records Court Judge Denise Page Hood, Records Court Judge Robert Ziolkowski and attorneys, Diane M. Hathaway, Joseph Brennan and John W. Callahan.

Seven women were among the 10 candidates nominated in county races for the Michigan Court of Appeals, Wayne County Circuit Court and Wayne County Probate Court.

Still, even some winners said their success doesn't mean female candidates are successful at all levels — and may in some way be a symptom of the small number of women elected to state and national office.

PAC money, some said, rarely

flows to females.

"I've seen reports from the U-M showing voters are more likely to vote for females for school board and judge but both jobs are seen as less policy making more healing, in a sense," Wayne County Circuit Judge Cynthia Stephens said. "My own earnest feeling is that the focus of power centers is not on the judiciary."

But Stephens, a Michigan Appeals Court candidate, said that could be an advantage.

"In judicial races, you have to be a self-starter, you have to meet with a lot of people and community groups," she said. "While community groups may not be as influential in state or national races they

MONITORING YOUR ARTHRITIS THERAPY

If a drug can help, it can hurt. No drug, powerful enough to fight arthritis, is yet so safe that the same power cannot harm body tissues. Science has no test whereby a sample of your blood when analyzed, can reveal if your body will tolerate a medication or react badly to it. Only trying a drug and watching the result will tell if you can tolerate a medicine.

Certain arthritis drugs, like gold salts and methotrexate, need evaluation before you can receive another dose. Other medications, like aspirin and colchicine, require periodic review, perhaps every 6 months or year.

How often testing is in order depends on your health. If you have a peptic ulcer, then a doctor will sample your hemoglobin more frequently than is his usual practice. Arthritis medications may cause quiescent kidney or liver conditions to return. If you had such problems in the past, you would need increased surveillance now.

Monitoring is not restricted to blood testing. Some arthritic drugs can cause lung problems and necessitate a chest x-ray at regular intervals. One drug-plaquenil-can affect the eyes and calls for a periodic examination of your retina.

In arthritis, treatment means more than taking drugs. You should be prepared that care includes the additional time and expense of monitoring medications.

are very important in judicial and local races."

In perhaps the most-watched area race, former Oakland Circuit Judge Alice Gilbert finished a surprising third in the GOP 11th District Congressional primary.

But Wayne Circuit Judge Helene White said she didn't believe Gilbert lost votes because she was a woman.

"To me, it seemed voters were turned off by the negative campaigning between Alice Gilbert and Dave Honigman," White said.

Unlike some of her fellow nominees state Appeals Court candidate White said she believed further political breakthroughs for women are near.

isn't a new thing anymore, but there are more women being elected to other offices," she said.

Others cautioned that female candidates' success in judicial races doesn't mean the legal profession is becoming more receptive to females. "In our office we seem to see bet-

ter female job applicants than males but a lot of big law firms don't hire that many females," said Nancy Diehl, head of the county prosecutor's office child abuse unit and a candidate for probate court.

"For women to make it in the field we really have to do well," said Diehl, who faces top vote-getter Cathie B. Maher of Canton Township in the fall race for Wayne County Probate Court.

Detroit Records Court Judge Denise Page Hood, a candidate for Wayne Circuit Court, may have put the issue in the best perspective.

"It's important that women are being elected judge," Hood said. "But the real test comes when we vote for a female county executive or governor."

Summer the season to be sweet on corn

Mention summertime cooking and immediately you conjure up thoughts about corn. Plump, juicy sweet corn, dripping with butter. Whether it be steamed, boiled or grilled, corn is one of the delights of the summer season.

Corn is indigenous to America. When it comes to culinary heritage, corn belongs right up there next to old glory. During the 13th century in southwestern United States and in Mexico, corn or maize meant life itself, and the cultivation of corn was an act of worship. From birth through death, the economic, social and religious activities of the Hopi Indians of Arizona were bound to the growing of corn. No child could be born with security and survived the first 20 hazardous days of life without corn. For this reason, a special ear of corn was dedicated to each newborn baby as its "corn mother."

No one in Europe knew about corn until Columbus sailed to America in 1492. On Nov. 5, 1492, two Spaniards whom Columbus dispatched to explore the interior of Cuba returned with a report of "a sort of grain called maize which is very well tasted when boiled, roasted or made into a porridge."

Explorer's discovery

Later explorers to the new world found corn being grown by the Indians in all parts of America, from Canada to Chili. The Indians grew all the main types of corn that rare raised today. They prized corn with colorful kernels — red, blue, pink and black or with bands, stripes or spots. The kernels ranged in size from as small as grain of wheat to as large as a quarter. The Indians frequently used corn patterns to decorate pottery, sculpture, and other works of art.

The colonists used corn as money; with it, they paid their rent, taxes and debts. They even traded corn for marriage licenses. In many settlements, corn kept people from starving in difficult times.

Although corn is grown throughout the United States, the greatest production is in an area of the Midwest called the "corn belt," consisting of the seven states of Illinois, Iowa, Indiana, Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska and Ohio. This year, almost 5 billion bushels will be grown in this area alone.

Corn products

If this sounds like more corn than one could handle, figure that of the 94 assorted supermarket items that go into most grocery carts, over a quarter contain one or more ingredients from the corn processing industry. Not to mention the corn derived feed ingredients that are so important to our animal economy. Add to that the fact that many industrial products ranging from cast metals to automobile tires depend on the use of specially designed corn starches.

The Janes Gang is a frequent user of corn and its products. A week doesn't slide by without utilizing corn meal, canned or frozen corn, corn syrup, corn flakes, cornstarch or corn oil in our culinary regime. In addition, corn is used as the major fermenting ingredient when processing whisky.

Corny memories

With summer winding down and corn prices dwindling as local markets reap locally grown products, you'll be seeing corn soon at the familiar dollar per dozen price. At those prices, it would behoove the price watching cook to take advantage of this pricing boom and to "put some up" whether it be canned or frozen to enjoy throughout the upcoming winter months. Don't forget to use those husks and cobs in the compost heap!

Growing up in Wyandotte, corn was a frequent staple in the Janes Gang household. Momma utilized corn in everything from simple side dishes to hearty soups. One of the dishes that is most memorable was her stewing muskrat in corn in the old Nesco roaster for dad. Although us kids never were interested in sampling it, the corned muskrat was usually supplanted with hot dogs. The family cottage was right off Pointe Pelee and I can remember taking walks between swims to local farmers right down the the road who grew and sold fresh corn to the Heinz factory in Leamington.

I would hand the weathered farmer a dollar bill and with "sis" and a grocer bag in tow, we would venture into the fields where the corn was twice as tall as us and fill the bag in minutes with fresh corn on the cob.

Dinner that night was corn in its true and simple form, dripping with oleomargarine. Ah, those were the days!

Don't allow summer to slip past your kitchen without enjoying the great taste of corn.

and starting up everyday. Houlihan's employs 10 people. Caroline, a graduate of Michigan State University, is her mother's assistant and takes care of marketing. Her sister Jill, who earned a bachelor's degree in finance, and now attends Detroit College of Law, takes care of the books. Her brother John who will be attending Oakland University in the fall to study education, helps out in the summer.

Last year, Elaine Houlihan started the Michigan Specialty Food Manufacturer's Association to promote and help manufacturers of specialty foods in Michigan.

To be eligible for membership in the

association, companies must be in business at least six months and have six wholesale accounts. Membership is \$125 a year. For membership information, call Michele Marshall of Mucky Duck Mustard Company at (313) 683-5750.

Many of the people who started these companies did so with encouragement from family and friends who raved about their products. Besides Houlihan's here are the other charter members.

Michaelene Hearn makes gourmet granola. She's contributing a portion of the profits from her Rain Forest Getherings, a granola made with pa-

paya, pineapple, mango, banana chips, cashews and Brazil nuts to the preservation of rain forests.

Celiose Varner (Celia's Sweets) began making pizzelles (an Italian cookie) 10 years ago when her mother-in-law gave her a pizzelle maker. Now her daughter, son, and husband help her make 10,000 pizzelles a week.

Jack and Kristin Trabue of Word of Mouth Foods in Plymouth developed their business from their small butcher shop in Plymouth. They began to sell their pasta sauce in the shop, and customers bought it, and told their friends to do the same. The company also makes barbecue sauce and seasonings.

Judy McConnel of Wenchow, Ltd. makes Jezebel Sauce, a sweet hot sauce, hot dill mustard, natural herbal vinegars, herbal blend and mulling spices.

First cousins Jacqui Ridley and Gail Jacob started making tea breads for Jackie's husband at Mark Ridley's Comedy Castle. Soon a wholesale business developed. In 1990, they bought a retail muffin shop and developed muffin chips, available in six flavors, and distributed across the United States.

Michele Marshall of the increasingly famous Mucky Duck Mustard Co. in Franklin uses a family recipe to make Mucky Duck Mustard. She recently published a cookbook with 170 recipes. With the exception of the first chapter of all chocolate desserts, each dish is made with Mucky Duck Mustard. The cookbook is available at Merchant of Vino in Birmingham and Troy.

Innovative wineries toast of our state

It's not status quo in Michigan's most progressive and innovative wineries. Even the national press recognizes this. Earlier this year, "The Wine Spectator," America's most widely-read wine periodical, mentioned St. Julian Wine Company as one of the best wineries outside California in an article discussing wine across America.

Singled out for special mention were St. Julian's 1990 Barrel-Fermented Chardonnay (\$14), 1989 Chambourcin (\$10.75) and Solera Cream Sherry (\$13.80). Barrel-fermented chardonnay is a new wine for St. Julian and the 1991 available now is in very limited supply.

Solera Cream Sherry from St. Julian was cited in "USA Today" as one of the best tastes of the region and one of the best wines made in the United States. Since its debut in 1975, this sherry has garnered 28 gold medals and brought a national reputation to the winery.

"I'm conservative," St. Julian's President David Braganini said. "When I was a little kid, I wasn't the first one to jump into the water. The American palate is geared to a more sophisticated style of chardonnay,

and we can make that style from grapes grown in southwest Michigan in the Lake Michigan Shore appellation."

To meet the growing demand for Michigan chardonnay, St. Julian is planting additional acreage. Braganini also wants to plant merlot. "Cabernet sauvignon won't ripen in our climate," he maintains.

In our opinion, the best sparkling wine in the state is produced by Larry Mawby at L. Mawby Winery in Suttons Bay. The 1986 Bien de Village (\$30), a sparkling blend of 70 percent pinot noir and 30 percent pinot gris is a classically produced rendition with toasty and yeasty notes over cherry-like fruit. It's creamy and delicious with all the style and elegance of a rich French champagne.

A bargain at \$15 is Blanc de Blancs, the other bubbly from Mawby. Produced for 52 percent seveal, 37 percent vigneoles and 11 percent chardonnay, it's lighter and crisper than the Bien de Village. In a blind tasting of world-class Blanc de Blancs, this wine would show at the top.

Mawby's innovations are showcased in his 1991 Pinot Gris (\$10.20) from 100 percent estate-grown grapes. Also 100 percent barrel fermented, this wine was aged on the lees for added complexity. It is in limited production and represents the very best in Michigan winemaking.

Doug Welsch, winemaker for his family's Fenn Valley Vineyards in Fennville, is excited about a new grape named chardonel resulting from the cross of seveal by chardonnay originating at the New York State Agriculture Experiment Station in Geneva. The 1991 Fenn Valley Chardonel (\$9) is a good rendition and shows much promise for the future.

Also impressive is the 1991 Fenn Valley Gewurztraminer (\$9) full of floral spice with a delicate palate impression.

The ever-gregarious Bill Skolnik, winemaker at Leelanau Cellars in Omena has pulled out all stops with reserve-style chardonnay and two new blends named Vis a Vis.

In a large mixing bowl combine egg, Worcestershire sauce, salt, garlic powder, onion powder and red pepper. Add bread crumbs and turkey; mix well. Shape turkey mixture into six ¾ inch thick patties. Wrap a strip of bacon around outside of each patty; fasten with wooden toothpick.

Grill, uncovered, directly over medium coals for 15 to 18 minutes or until no pink remains, turning once. (Or, place patties on the unheated rack of a broiler pan. Broil 3 to 4 inches from heat for 15 to 18 minutes or until no pink re-

mains and bacon is done, turning once.)

Remove toothpicks before serving. Serve on buns. Top with tomato slices and chili peppers, if desired. Makes 6 servings.

If blending makes superior wines, then Skolnik has done it with Vis a Vis (\$10.95). The white wine ver-

sion is a 50/50 blend of chardonnay and vignoles that brings these two varietals "face to face" as the French name implies. They are not strange bedfellows, but are a harmonious marriage of solid flavors and complexity.

In the red Vis a Vis, Skolnik has paired pinot noir and baco noir to create a tasty, easy-drinking wine for roast chicken, hamburgers, pizza or picnic fare.

At Good Harbor Vineyards in Lake Leelanau, Bruce Simpson continues to produce well-made, excellently priced wines. He has a limited supply of knockout 1991 Pinot Gris (\$12) highlighting apple, pear and apricot fruitiness with attractive wood accents. It's superior with broiled swordfish.

Cook this roast to rare or medium doneness, then slice and serve it with a tropical-style salsa.

EYE OF ROUND WITH PINEAPPLE SALSA

- 2-pound beef eye of round roast
- Two 8¼-ounce cans crushed pineapple, drained
- 2 medium tomatoes, peeled, seeded and chopped
- 2 Tablespoons lime or lemon juice
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 2 teaspoons soy sauce
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- Several dashes bottled hot pepper sauce

Trim any excess fat from roast. Insert a meat thermometer in the center of the roast. In a covered grill arrange medium coals around a drip pan. Test for medium-low heat above the pan. Place the roast on grill rack over drip pan but not over coals. Lower the grill hood. Grill for 1 to 1¼ hours or until meat thermometer registers 140 degrees F for rare; 1½ to 2 hours or 160 degrees F for medium.

Meanwhile, for salsa, in a medium mixing bowl combine pineapple, tomatoes, lime or lemon juice, sugar, soy sauce, garlic powder, dry mustard and hot pepper sauce. Cover and chill until serving time.

When the meat is done, cover it with foil and let stand for 15 minutes before carving. Serve salsa with sliced meat. Makes 8 servings.

Roasting Directions: Place roast on a rack in a shallow roasting pan. Roast, uncovered, in a 325-degree F oven for 1¼ to 1½ hours or until thermometer registers 140 degrees F for rare; 1½ to 2¼ hours or 160 degrees F for medium. Serve as directed above.

Drovers blend rock and tradition



Tin whistles, bodhrans, accordions and fiddles make music steeped in the traditions of Ireland. But don't look for an Irish lilt in talking to The Drovers, a band of Irish-American musicians who've been creating their folk-rock sounds in Chicago. Now they're bringing it to Michigan for us to enjoy.

By design or out of desperation, the Drovers' sound is damp with the mist of the Emerald Isle. Tin whistles, bodhrans, accordions and fiddles find their way into the Drovers' folk-rock frolic. Such instrumentation set against edgy pop melodies may make the band something of an anomaly, but also leaves the Chicago-based alternative outfit to constantly slug it out with several unwanted comparisons.

One of the most common is being likened to the bawdy balladry evocated by the Pogues.

Perhaps a more cynical view would go as far to say the Drovers are merely trying to cash in on the current Irish musical phenomenon wrought with U2 megatours, Sinead's love affair with Frank Sinatra and film characters named Decco thinking they're black soul singers. Not so, says fiddle player Sean Cleland.

Many of the group's members were reared on Irish traditional music as Irish-Americans growing up in Chicago, he says. As accomplished musicians, they later went on to perform jigs and reels at ceilis in social halls and parishes.

"For whatever reason, we stuck by that music," said Cleland, whose band performs Thursday, Aug. 20, at Rick's Cafe in Ann Arbor.

"We didn't want to do jigs and reels anymore. We want to play the music for everybody. The question was, 'What do you do with this stuff?'"

Avoiding the typical teary-eyed pub band laments, the Drovers manage to pull off their synthesis of traditional and rock stylings with a good deal of grace.

Undoubtedly, part of the charm of the band's muse comes from an unfettered reverence for Irish folk music heroes such as the Clancy Brothers, the Chieftains and the like.

That said, the Drovers establish a distinctive sound filled with adroit musicianship, intoxicating acoustic-strummed melodies and, most of the time, breathless vocals provided by Kathleen Keane. Keane shares singing duties on the band's CD "World of Monsters" with Mike Kirkpatrick and Dave Callahan.

Songs such as "Love Won't Be" and "Held Your Hand Like Yesterday" are crafted with a spirited pop demeanor and gently flavored with Irish folk whereas "Trad Reed," a bodhran-tin

whistle instrumental pays homage to their musical roots.

The Drovers formed on St. Patrick's Day in 1988, staking out as a club act in Chicago's vibrant alternative scene.

"We came from playing all the time, at (Irish) dances . . . it's a real hands on type of thing," said Cleland, who has been performing Irish traditional music since he was a child. "It's not like we said, 'Let's start a band and do a demo.' It's not like that."

Though the desired result is the same for the Drovers. The band received an enormous amount of exposure in the firefighting action drama, "Backdraft," which was set in Chicago. Director Ron Howard caught the group's act in a North Side club and became infatuated with the band's traditional alternative dance sound.

In the film, the band is featured kicking out some Celtic jams in the scene of the fire chief's retirement party. "It was good for getting press," Cleland said of the group's cinematic debut. "You can't tell what we're about, though."

Those who have difficulty figuring out what the Drovers are about would be advised by band members to simply listen and enjoy the music. Comparisons, such as the one to the Pogues, need not be applied.

The Drovers will perform Thursday, Aug. 20, at Rick's Cafe, 611 Church, Ann Arbor. For information, call 996-2747.

Advice about harrassing phone calls 'missed the boat'

Dear Ms. Schiff:
I have just read your column, "Street Sense," in The Eccentric for Monday, July 6, 1992. I can't believe your answer to Michelle, a single mother asking your advice about her son's harrassing phone calls from a girl in his class.

You, in essence, told Michelle

that it was OK for this girl to have made the harrassing phone calls just because she is going through difficult years as an adolescent! How can you in good conscience say that this girl's behavior is "within the normal limits of current teenage mores?" Since when is calling at all hours to someone's residence acceptable?

Barbara, you, who is supposed to be a trained therapist and experienced counselor, "missed the boat" in your answer!

The problem with this generation is they are told that it is OK not to listen/obey their parents, or God forbid, be acceptable to other adults. Why do you think families are disintegrating so fast now?

It's people like you who give inept advice to say: "It is important not to feel frustrated, embarrassed or angry. If the mother who called you intended to make you feel that way, do not let her be an accomplice to

your loss of self-esteem. When you talk it out with your daughter, it is important that you understand what she is going through and that you tell her you will support her through these difficult years. This would be a victory for both of you."

Michelle should not have "loss of self-esteem," but should be grateful that someone took the time to inform her that her daughter is wrong to annoy and harrass people. Her daughter needs to be kept busy, i.e., play sports, read books, perform volunteer work, clean her room. Then there would be no "useless free time" to make unwanted phone calls!

Wake up and smell the roses, Barbara, and start giving out some "common sense" in your answers.

Dear Barbara:
Have you completely lost your

mind or what? Are you a . . . fruitcake or what? Your answer to Michelle, the single mother with the pre-teen daughter who called a boy on the phone to the point of harassment, was so totally off base! I'm surprised the paper is keeping you on their staff.

Obviously, you have never experienced this type of phenomenon or you, perhaps, do not yet have a teenaged child. I can tell you directly from experience that a pestering phone caller can and will make your life a living nightmare. We had such a "Caller from Hell" waking us up at 4 a.m. just to talk to my then 11-year-old son.

Age and sex have nothing to do with common courtesy and consideration for other people. You are sending out the wrong message to this poor adult woman who has turned to you for guidance. Instead your answer is about as useful as a screen door on a submarine!

Where do you got off saying this is the sign of the times? I definitely fall into the age category of 30-50, but my daughters do not. They have been instructed that calling a friend, both male and female, is perfectly normal for reasons as homework information, missing assignments or rides or just to talk. The conditions stated by the boy's mother to this single parent is not what would fall into the above category.

We had to have our phone number changed and a restraining order put on this particular female who was harrassing my son at all hours of the day and night. I now speak from experience and, however extreme this case may sound, it could have probably been prevented by a little intervention from a strong and insistent parent who imposed a little control over a pre-teen's phone habits.

You really need to reassess your

answer and realize part of the problem with the way society is going in that there are counselors out there like you who give half-ass advice like that! Why don't you publish your home phone number in the paper and let us call you at odd hours of the night and day to harass you.

I consider myself independent and aggressive, but there is a place and time for this type of behavior to exist in society. I like to think that my own daughters and my son have learned to distinguish between when to use their independence and their aggressiveness so as not to overtake their thought processes and their behavior.

Get with the program yourself, Barbara!

Eastwood resurrects western with 'Unforgiven'

He may look like it when wrestling squealers, but Billy Munny is a cowboy with a dark past and a nasty reputation. Legend has it that the outlaw-turned-pig farmer once shot his way out of a show-down with three lawmen. During a drinking binge, he would gun a man down over the slightest provocation.

In "Unforgiven," Munny, now a widower who's seen the error of his ways, wears years of sorrow beneath Clint Eastwood's trademark squint. His final brush with wickedness leads to the best western Eastwood (or anyone) has made in years.

On the surface, "Unforgiven" has all the elements of a standard horse opera. Munny, his old partner and an eager young gunslinger ride off to collect the bounty offered by prostitutes who want dead the man who scarred the face of one of their girls.

Look deeper and you'll find a heavy moral exercise in Western justice. What is proper punishment for cutting up a woman? Is \$1,000 enough justification for taking anyone's life? How many must die to avenge the loss of your best friend?

Gene Hackman has a great character role as Little Bill Daggett, the sheriff who's not at all thrilled about bounty hunters descending

on his town. He requires every man to surrender his guns before entering his jurisdiction.

English Bob, played with hammy theatricality by Richard Harris, tests local law when he blows in, spouting off about the English monarchy and packing a six-shooter. Little Bill, who knew the flamboyant assassin previously, personally kicks the stuffing out of Bob before riding him out of town on a rail.

You spend the next 20 minutes anticipating the confrontation between Little Bill and Munny. Their meeting takes some truly fateful twists that make even murkier the definition of western hero.

For his part, Eastwood paints a vivid and understated portrait of a man just one drink away from sinking back into the meanness he has worked so hard to overcome. It's light years ahead of his Shane redux in the aptly titled "Pale Rider."

And like any Eastwood picture, there are plenty of quotable lines, especially the introspective ones about taking a man's life: "The only thing he's got; the only thing he'll ever have."

As a director, he has the sense to steer clear of the visual tricks used by the strong directors (Sergio Leone, Don Siegel) he's worked in the past. He and cinematographer Jack Green have a clever way of mixing Technicolor hues with the kind of shadows too rarely used during the golden age of Hollywood

westerns. While it may not have the emotional punch of the classic western, "Unforgiven" has little to apologize for. It proves again that Clint Eastwood is the only man alive who can keep breathing life into the traditional western.

Hensen's puppets capture scary side of Alice's childhood

In 1932, an elderly British widow, Alice Hargreaves, arrives in New York to participate in an academic function and finds herself engulfed by a mob of reporters and photographers. She's impatient with the intrusions and baffled by all the attention.

fanciful stories by clergyman Charles Dodgson, who later published the stories as "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland" under his pen name of Lewis Carroll. A Victorian dowager, Hargreaves, played by Carol Browne, was accepted an invitation from Columbia University to speak at a celebration of the Lewis Carroll centenary. Despite her protests that she really doesn't remember much about Mr. Dodgson, childhood dreams and memories return when she is alone in her hotel room.

Then the elderly woman is talking with the Mad Hatter, the March Hare and the Dormouse. Other times it's the precocious young Alice, played by a rather solemn, dark-haired Amelia Shankley, who is in Wonderland. Other scenes recall young Alice with her family and Dodgson, who clearly had an inappropriate infatuation for the child. The film certainly raises questions about Dodgson and his impact on the child. Young Alice's mother questions why Dodgson would confide so much in the child. The adult Alice remembers her mother burning all

the letters Dodgson had sent her and speculates she wouldn't have done that if there hadn't been something wrong. As played by Ian Holm, Dodgson clearly is lovesick for the child who he tries to woo with stories, presenting her with a first printing of his tales. He's a stuttering, shy man, jealous of the attention Alice receives from a young boyfriend. He's a rather sad character, who knows his infatuation with the child isn't proper or at least will never be what he wants. For the first time, the elderly Alice confronts her long buried feel-

ings and memories about her experiences with Dodgson, who called her the dreamchild. Her thoughts start to subtly surface when she talks pragmatically to reporters who want to talk about dreams. They aren't interested in her, Alice tells them, but the girl she was and who Dodgson made her out to be. "It's hard enough to be what I was at my age let alone what I never was," she says. The film is rich and vividly made, with the story characters designed and operated by Jim Henson and his company. These aren't cuddly cut little figures, they capture the

scary edge that is one side of a child being lost in strange and dangerous land. The subplot involves the elderly woman's companion and a young reporter, who for a sizeable commission sets her up to do some promotions. It's fun to see the imposing widow Hargreaves recording some radio commercials. Director Gavin Millar and screenwriter Dennis Potter took a historical footnote and have made a rich, fascinating film. "Dreamchild" is available on cassette at local video stores.

Vermont gets vibrant in summer

Summer is the reason most Vermonters put up with the winters. For three months, after the rain ends and before the frost turns the leaves, the world becomes a vibrant, lush green and the residents, aroused from their hibernation, venture forth, remembering once again why they live here.

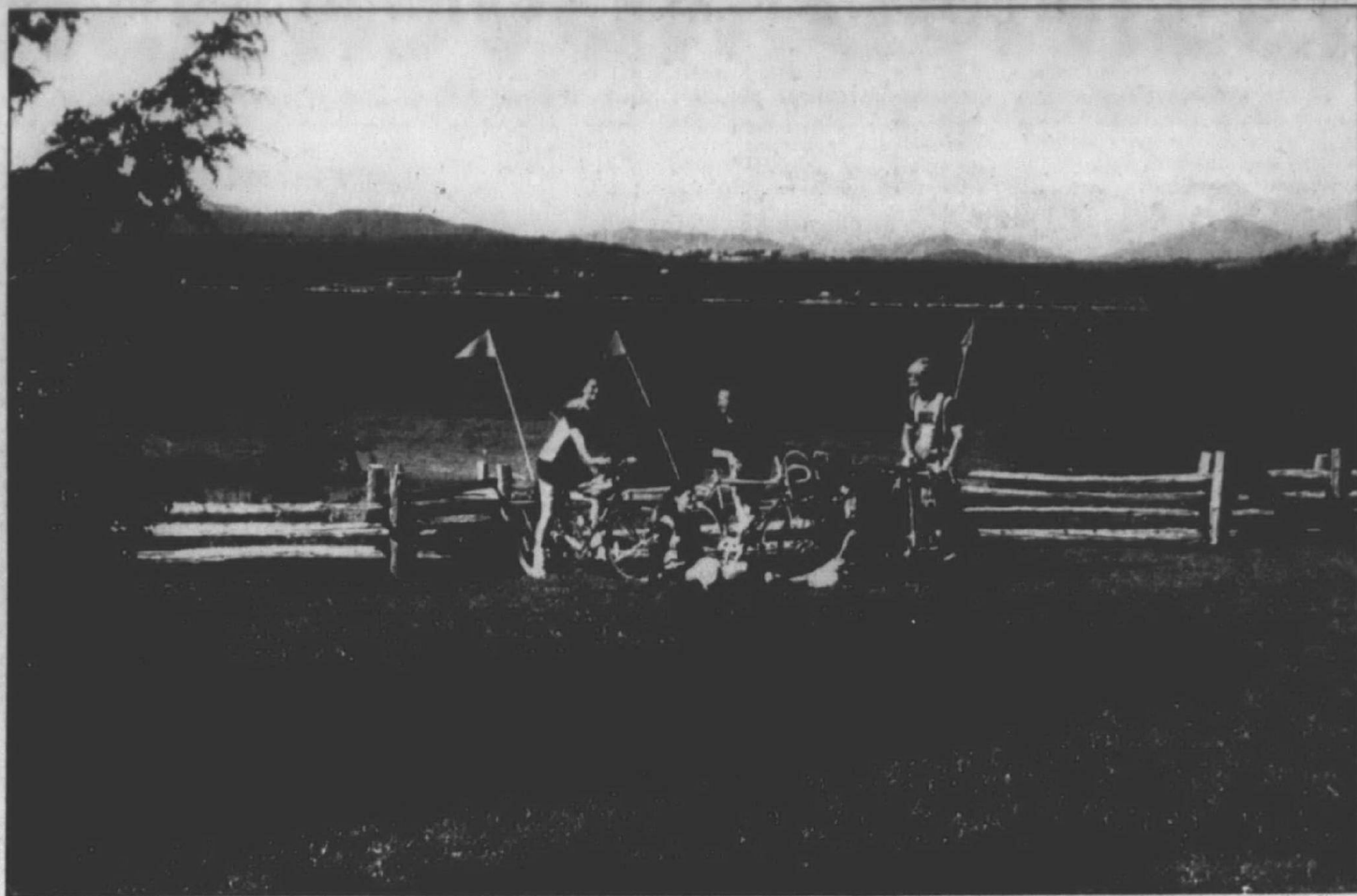
The town of Middlebury on the western side of the state is an ideal jumping-off point for forays into the Green Mountains, because nothing is far away. Lake Champlain, 20 to 25 minutes to the west, offers swimming, boating and fishing. The mountains, with hiking trails, swimming holes and waterfalls, are a short drive to the east.

A college town of 8,000 people, Middlebury is far more cosmopolitan than its size or setting would suggest, with a variety of restaurants and inns that are often included on the recommended lists of national guidebooks.

From mid-June through August the streets and stores sound like a rural United Nations, with people chatting in languages from French to Arabic to Chinese, all of them students at Middlebury College's Summer Language Schools, where English is the only forbidden tongue.

Summer days begin with a rosy sunrise over the Green Mountains and end with a spectacular display of pink, purple and orange as the sun descends over the Adirondacks of New York state to the west.

For three weeks in July the

weather turns hot (by local standards hot is anything above 90 degrees) and humid. When that happens relief is — literally — in sight: the Green Mountains, reliably 10 degrees cooler than the Champlain Valley floor, are a 20-minute drive east and up.

And should it rain, Burlington, with its array of cultural and culinary offerings, is an hour to the north.

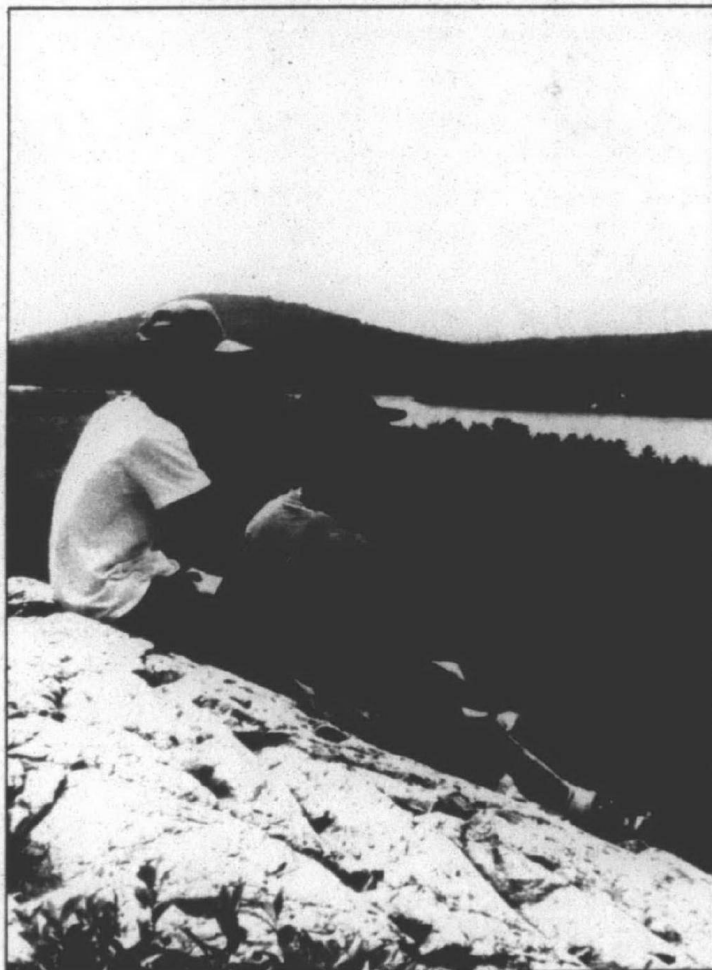
Events

Mozart under the lights at Lincoln Center is an enchanting musical experience. Mozart under the stars at Shelburne Farms near Burlington, is something else again. The Farms is the grand, turn-of-the-century, lakefront summer home built by Dr. William Seward Webb and Lila Vanderbilt Webb.

For three weeks each year the musicians of the Vermont Mozart Festival play on the South Porch to the people seated on the grounds around the Shelburne House. Although other festival venues include downtown Burlington and the Lake Champlain ferry, this is a perennial favorite.

The Vermont Equestrian Summer Showcase, which began with two weeks in Killington, ends with two weeks at the Trapp Family Lodge in Stowe Aug. 12 to 23. Spectator fees are \$5 (\$7 on Sundays) and \$2 for children under 12 and seniors (\$3 on Sundays). Call (802) 496-7469 for schedules.

One of the more unusual summer treats Middlebury has to offer is the

Bread Loaf Writers' Conference, where each night from Aug. 11 to 23 well-known authors give readings. Authors range from Jay Parini and Ron Powers to Hilma Wolitzer and Linda Pastan.

Outings

When Joseph Battell, the wealthy but eccentric Middlebury resident who built the Bread Loaf Inn around the turn of the century, was alive he banned all automobiles from the road leading to his mountain retreat. If that seems extreme in these times it is still an idea that has merit. Hiking and cycling are better choices.

The day-hiking possibilities around the Middlebury region range from a casual, if slightly uphill, stroll to a rugged, rock-climbing experience, best left to the initiated.

Two valuable sources of information are the "Day Hiker's Guide to Vermont," which covers hikes off the Long Trail, and the "Guide Book of the Long Trail." Both are published by the Green Mountain Club and both are sold in the Vermont Book Shop in Middlebury for \$9.95 plus tax.

One relatively easy half-day hike begins at the top of the Appalachian Gap where state Route 17 crosses the Long Trail, which bisects the state from north to

south, following the ridges of the Green Mountains. Park in one of the pull-offs at the top and follow the Long Trail signs, headed south.

The trail climbs steeply for a mile or so, then levels off in a clearing. Follow the path through the bushes and out onto a seriellike cliff.

Although Vermont is correctly thought of as mountainous, there are long flat stretches throughout the Champlain Valley that make it a cyclist's paradise.

Biking has become a wildly popular sport here over the past two decades, in large part because of the efforts of John Freidin, the founder of Vermont Bicycle Touring. Freidin, who no longer owns the business, has encapsulated his knowledge into the helpful "25 Bicycle Tours in Vermont," also for sale at the Vermont Book Shop and well worth the \$8.95 it costs.

For those more comfortable with some outside guidance, Bruce Burgess, the owner of Bicycle Holidays in Middlebury (802-388-2453), will provide either a highlighted map or a custom-designed tour for as many days as you wish. Burgess rents mountain bikes for \$29 the first day and \$20 a day after that.

Helmets cost an additional \$3 a day and reservations are recommended.

Vermont Bicycle Touring (802-453-4811) in nearby Bristol offers two-day weekend tours in addition to the longer variety. Reservations are usually necessary.

For drivers there is a very scenic loop that takes you over the mountains and back again, with opportunities for antiquing, shopping and dining along the way.

Head north out of Middlebury on Route 7, turn right onto Route 17 at New Haven Junction and follow the road through Bristol. Coming out of town, take the second right and follow the road to the top of the Appalachian Gap, making certain to pull over and turn around at the top.

Wind down the mountain past Mad River Glen and Sugarbush to Route 100, go right on Route 100 to Hancock, stopping for lunch and browsing at Warren Country Store.

In Hancock turn right on Route 125 and climb the mountain, turning in at the sign for a look at Texas Falls. Then continue over the mountain, back to Route 7.

Shopping

Over the years Middlebury has evolved into a browser's paradise. The best strategy is to park somewhere around the Green and walk. Nothing is very far.

Along Main Street the Vermont Book Shop (802-388-2061), in residence at the same location for years, is declared by even urban bibliophiles to be a treasure.

Treasures crystallize at Swedish glassworks

A visit to Sweden is not complete without a stop in the area known as the "Kingdom of Crystal."

Situated in the southeastern province of Smaland, a rural area with deep blue lakes and thick pine forests, the kingdom is home to 16 major glassworks.

Among them are Kosta Boda and Orrefors, names that have become synonymous with the acclaimed tradition of Swedish craftsmanship and design.

Visitors flock to the area to see glassblowers at their craft and to take advantage of bargains.

With few exceptions, the local Swedish factories offer large selections of seconds that are far less expensive than first-choice pieces.

In many cases it takes an expert's eye to distinguish the small flaws that mark a piece as a second.

But it doesn't take an expert to become excited about the prices. They are about 50 percent less than first-quality pieces sold in Stockholm and 70 percent less than those sold in the United States.

All the factories welcome visitors. This year Kosta, the oldest glassworks, is celebrating its 250th anniversary.

Kosta was founded in 1742 by

two noted generals — Anders Koskull and George Bogislaus Stael von Holstein — at the request of King Fredrik I, who was intent on building a crystal trade for the country.

The Kosta factory acquired the nearby Boda and Afors glassworks more than 40 years ago, forming Kosta Boda. In 1990 Kosta Boda merged with Orrefors. But each firm retains its own designers and production facilities.

Now 900,000 visitors wander through the Kosta glassworks every year.

"It's rare that a piece of glass is broken, and you'll never see a 'don't touch' sign here," says Diana Hansen, a Kosta spokesperson.

"About 15 percent of a team's production is seconds," she says, adding, "firsts would be enormously expensive if we couldn't sell seconds."

Each year the company introduces two new collections. They discontinue others and offer favorites for as long as they sell.

Amid deafening noise and constant heat, workers maintain a rhythmic pace — blowing, turning and shaping pieces of glass. A six-

man team can make between 800 and 900 wineglasses per day.

Unlike most factories, which keep visitors at bay, Kosta lets guests up close to watch and talk to the workers.

The shop is a large, well-lighted warehouse with thousands of pieces of glassware for sale. About 95 percent of the pieces are seconds; the rest are discontinued firsts.

They include art-glass pieces that are signed and can be bought for a good discount. But finding such pieces takes luck.

The shop carries all the classic Kosta pieces, including the Pippi line of glassware, a favorite for 60 years. These narrow, heavy items include sherry glasses for about \$16, pilsner glasses for about \$27 and champagne glasses for about \$18.

A perennial Kosta favorite is the Snowball, a thick, hollowed-out piece used as a candleholder. It's about \$8.50.

Among the newest art-glass designs is the Pandora series. It features clear-glass with a satin finish. A Pandora candlestick is about \$75. Whimsical pitchers are about \$94.

The Texas series of glass cacti

designed by Gunnel Sahlin are very popular, says Hansen.

"Only later did we find out that these cacti are natives of Arizona," she says. The pieces are priced at about \$66.

Sweden's best-selling glass, Kosta's Chateau wineglass, has delicate beveled facets on the bowl and costs about \$12.

All these prices include Sweden's whopping 25 percent value-added tax (VAT). About 15 percent of that tax is returned when the buyer leaves the country — under Sweden's Tax Free for Tourists plan.

The price of shipping glassware — especially heavy pieces such as vases — to the United States can be as much as the amount of value-added tax that is refunded.

Even so, savvy shoppers often figure it's worthwhile to buy and ship from Sweden.

The ultimate glass experience is a "Hyttail" evening. In this traditional fest, participants have dinner in the factory — Baltic herring which are cooked in the glass furnaces.

Dinner is followed by local folk entertainment. Of course, there is time for shopping. Getting to Kosta involves an overnight trip from Stockholm. There are good accommodations in the nearby cities of Vaxjo or Kalmar.

Fans should not miss Johnston's Sports Den

There's a sign on Plymouth Road west of Telegraph that needs to be changed.

The sign with green background and white letters promotes both Giacomin's Bar and Ram's Horn Restaurant. And while the Ram's Horn is still there, former Detroit Red Wings goalie Eddie Giacomin no longer owns the bar.

It belongs to Larry Johnston, another former Red Wing who bought the bar five years ago from his friend Giacomin. It's now called Johnston's Sports Den in Redford Township.

"One of these days I'm going to go over and change it (the sign on Plymouth Road)," said Johnston, a Red Wings defenseman from 1971 through '74. "As long as people come and spend money, I don't care what you call it."

I spent about a half hour interviewing Johnston last week and leave it to me to accidentally call him "Eddie" as we finished our talk. Johnston was good natured about my mistake, saying, "OK, Frank," as we shook hands.

Then I remembered Johnston saying earlier in the interview: "Real hockey fans remember me."

A rugged Red Wing

OK, so I don't stay home on Saturday nights to watch "Hockey Night in Canada," but I am a hockey fan. I even went to the old Olympia several times with my family during Johnston's era to watch the Red Wings.

Johnston played with Mickey Redmond, Nick Libbett and Red Berenson, but the guy I remember most from that era was Tim Ecclestone.

One guy in the row behind us always used to scream "Hit him with your purse, Ecclestone" — a reference to Ecclestone's less-than-rugged play.

No one had to say that to Johnston, a tough guy who miraculously lost only one tooth in all his years in the National Hockey League and World Hockey Association.

But he almost lost an eye against the Chicago Blackhawks.

"Pit Martin was chasing me, his stick hit me in the eye and I was in the hospital five days," said Johnston, a West Bloomfield resident. "I was flat on my back four, five days. My eyeball was cut and they said if the bleeding stopped it would be no problem. I was lucky that happened."

Johnston spent seven seasons in the minor leagues and his NHL career started in 1969 with the Los Angeles Kings. He was traded to the Red Wings in 1971 and left Detroit in '74 to join the fledgling Michigan Stags of the WHL.

Johnston spent less than one season with the Stags before moving back to the NHL and finishing his career with expansion teams Kansas City and Colorado (now the New Jersey Devils).

Johnston never played with the legendary Gordie Howe, who retired for the first time from the Red Wings in '71, but he exchanged quite a few elbows with No. 9.

"Personally, he's a nice man, but he's a mean Son of a Bitch on the ice," Johnston said of Howe. "Not too many guys fooled with him. He was nasty with the stick."

Trading a stick for a spatula

Johnston plays for the Red Wings' Old-Timers on occasion but a spatula is in his hand more often than a hockey stick. Johnston mans the grill just about every day at Johnston's Sports Den, while son Craig provides help at the bar. Besides selling 34 ounce beers, Johnston's menu is long.

"You name it, we do a little bit of everything," said Johnston, who has been married for more than 30 years to wife June. "I like it (owning a bar). It has its days that are aggravating but most of the time I like it. I really do love it here (in Detroit)."

There's still some paraphernalia and pictures that belong to Giacomin hanging on the walls but Johnston has decorated the bar mostly with his hockey memories.

A Red Wings jersey with Johnston's No. 3 hangs above the bar while a picture of the famed "Production Line" of Howe, Sid Abel and Ted Lindsay adorns the wall near the grill.

Johnston has no thoughts of expanding the business.

"This is plenty big for me," said Johnston, 49. "When you get to be 50 you want to start down-gearing a bit."

Gaza in sync, brings home Junior gold

Michele Gaza didn't travel to Barcelona, Spain this summer but she still brought home Olympic medals.

Gaza, a Garden City resident who will finish high school this year at Farmington Hills Mercy, won both a gold and bronze medal for synchronized swimming at the recently-completed Junior Olympics in Rochester, Minn.

Gaza spent the last year training and going to school in Midlothian, Va. and it was there that she made a team called Briarwood that won the gold. Her bronze medal came in trio competition with teammates from Briarwood.

"It felt good to stand up there (on the medal platform) as a team," Gaza said. "It all paid off."

Gaza is thrilled about winning the medals but the most proud might be her parents.

"They want to frame the medals,"

she said. "My dad took the gold to work."

Gaza placed seventh as a solo synchronized swimmer at the 1991 Junior Olympics but she figured she had a better shot at the gold by going out-of-state to train. There were a lot of lonely days in Virginia but training with coach Fred Day and assistant Pat Easterling, whose house she stayed at, was worth it.

Besides attending the local high school, Gaza practiced at least 20 hours a week with Briarwood.

Gaza had the option of returning to Virginia but she decided she'd rather finish up high school where she started — at Mercy. Gaza will have to travel to East Lansing or Flint to work out but that's fine.

"Mercy is just a wonderful school, my friends supported me the whole year and I want to be around them," she said. "(Virginia) was a great experience and I learned a lot from it. At first it

was real hard and I wanted to come home, not because I didn't like swimming but because I was home sick.

"It was a struggle because I always thought what my friends back home were doing and what I was doing and if I was doing the right thing. I owe it to my parents (Michael and Marlene), they're the best."

Another of Gaza's supporters was best friend Tatum Ames (Garden City), who would keep in touch over the telephone.

"Every Sunday there, I would call her or she would call me, exactly at 9:30," Gaza said.

"Yeah, my parents didn't appreciate it (all the phone calls)," Ames said. "They're so happy she's home because she only lives a couple blocks away and I can drive there."

Gaza plans to compete on Mercy's swimming team this fall but she knows her niche is as a synchronized swimmer. She started synchronized

swimming at age 7 after watching her sister Beth in the sport.

Gaza would like to continue synchronized swimming in college and she hopes to attend Ohio State University, which has the sport.

"I want to try to make the Olympic team, but if not, make the first national team," Gaza said. "But first I just want to survive college swimming."

Gaza said some people don't understand the struggles of a synchronized swimmer.

"A lot of people have misconceptions that synchronized swimmers just do shows and goof off," she said. "But it's very structural, we have to do 20 hours a week in the water, do aerobics, take dance lessons."

"We don't have goggles to wear, we have to listen to underwater music, do counts to everything. That's why everything is synchronized. We're not just guessing."

New Orleans stops upstart Walter's

Walter's Appliance opened and closed the All-American Amateur Baseball Association tournament with losses, but its seven-day stint in Johnstown, Pa. was the most successful ever by an entry from the Livonia Collegiate Baseball League.

But the Livonians forged ahead with a run in the bottom of the inning, only to have Wirebaugh victimized by another two-run shot by Bourgeois in the eighth.

Reliever Sean Henkel, who had two victories and a save to his credit during the week, finally ran out of bullets himself, tagged for three earned runs, including Bourgeois' second two-run blast. The tourney MVP had five RBI on the day.

New Orleans' out-hit Walter's, 15-11.

Outfielder Kevin Young, who led all tourney players in doubles and triples, had two hits and two RBI for Walter's, as did Friday's hero, Craig Overaitis.

Third baseman Jeff Pendell, Walter's leading hitter for the tourney, also contributed two hits and scored twice.

"Up and down our lineup nobody was an easy out," Keller said. "Everybody contributed and did the job. The kids and the coaching staff represented the City of Livonia well. I think we gained a lot of respect down here."

New Orleans, behind the shutout pitching of Mike Romano, reached the final with a 4-0 triumph Saturday over three-time defending champion Baltimore, setting up a rematch against Walter's, which earned a bye into the championship.

Academics attract players

This is not a school a football player would have put anywhere on his list.

Before. What attracted Scott Myrand to Kalamazoo College? "It really didn't have much to do with football," the Livonia Franklin graduate answered. He wanted to enter medical school; a senior defensive tackle, he will graduate with a major in molecular biology.

"Basically, the academics part of it," was how Tony Prey, an offensive lineman from Westland John Glenn, replied to the same question. Prey is about to enter his sophomore year and is considering a major in psychology.

Now, both have found another reason to attend Kalamazoo. The Hornets have, for the past few decades, been near the bottom of the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association. They last won a title in 1963. The last time they had a winning season was 1983.

Winning season

Until last season, when Kalamazoo posted a 5-4 overall mark. The team's 2-3 MIAA record wasn't spectacular, but it got them out of the cellar.

Now, with 15 starters back, the Hornets are looking for more. "Our goal is the same as everyone's in the room, and that is to win the championship," said coach Dave Warmack at Thursday's MIAA pre-season media meeting in Albion. "We are not content to be improved. We want to win."

That's a different attitude for Kalamazoo. But attitudes and bold predictions don't win games; talent does. And the Hornets are compiling it.

Their defense was sixth in the NCAA Division III last year in points allowed (76 in nine games). Seven of those starters return, including Myrand, who had 51 tackles, three for losses, and recovered three fumbles.

Certainly, players like Myrand deserve credit for Kalamazoo's success. The 6-foot, 250-pound tackle didn't play football until his junior year at Franklin; he started only twice on the Patriots' varsity.

But both Myrand and Prey heap the credit for Kalamazoo's turnaround on their coach, Warmack. "We're trying to turn it around, get a tradition going," said Prey. "Coach Warmack is a good coach. I think he's already turned it around."

Myrand said much the same. "I really think Coach Warmack has done an excellent job. He sure is setting a tradition."

The question now is, can the improvement continue, as Warmack forces? Or was '91 just an aberration?

Glenn grad important

Much could depend on Prey. Rated the strongest of the Hornets, Prey stands 6-2 and weighs 276. At John Glenn, he played guard as a junior and center as a senior. At Kalamazoo as a freshman, he started eight games — usually at tackle.

Now, he could be switched to guard — a position he'd rather play — as the Hornet coaching staff searches for ways to fill holes on the offensive front. "I like to be in the middle more," Prey said.

The defense could be just as tough, but that wouldn't satisfy Myrand. "Our goal is to better (last

year's performance)," he said. "I think it would be a disappointment if we didn't."

Such play would elevate Kalamazoo into the contending class. Prey and Myrand believe they belong there. "I think we should have a chance to win it," Prey said confidently.

Myrand was more optimistic. "I think we have a great chance. With last year's performance, we were just short of having an excellent season."

True enough. Kalamazoo lost its four games by a total of 14 points. On the other hand, the Hornets shut out perennial powerhouse Hope 14-0.

Albion favored

Now another hurdle must be cleared: Albion, the three-time defending MIAA champ. "We've never beaten Albion since I've been here," said Myrand.

Nobody's beaten Albion much in the past few seasons, and it could be the same this year. The Britons have a strong nucleus returning, including all-MIAA quarterback Mike Montico.

Adrian College

Last year's record: 4-5 overall, 1-4 in the MIAA. Respect and improvement are Lyaill's goals for the season, and in a league that's become tougher to bottom, victories will be hard to come by — particularly for Adrian.

Albion College

Last year's record: 8-1 overall, 4-0-1 and a tie for first in MIAA. Local players: Chad Burgess (Farmington Hamson), junior wide receiver, 6-3, 185; Mike Spaccaretella (Livonia Churchhill), junior wide receiver, 5-7, 155; Mike Jorlie (North Farmington), freshman defensive back, 5-10, 170; Brian Lee (North Farmington), freshman wide receiver, 6-1, 180; Scott Lieger (Detroit/Redford Catholic Central), freshman offensive lineman, 6-0, 235. Returning starters: Seven offensive, eight defensive. Outlook: The bad news for the Britons is the loss of tailback Hank Wrenman (1,629 yards rushing, 16

TDs). Unfortunately for the rest of the league, that's about all the bad news there is. Albion has won or shared first place in the MIAA three straight years, and is picked to make it four. With all-MIAA quarterback Mike Montico (Country Day) and his top three receivers returning, together with most of the defense, the Britons are already planning a return trip to the NCAA III playoffs.

Alma College

Last year's record: 4-5 overall, 1-4 in the MIAA. Local players: Jeff Skinner (Farmington Hamson), senior defensive lineman. Returning starters: Five offensive, five defensive. Outlook: Jim Cole begins his second season as the Scots head coach on the bottom looking up. Since trying for the MIAA title in 1988 (their first in 16 years), Alma has struggled. Cole said he was "excited about carrying on the tradition of Alma College football." That tradition is lagging. The defense needs strong play from seniors Keith Christnager and Wade Hanna on the line and outside linebacker Dave Johnson.

Hope College

Last year's record: 5-4 overall, 2-3 in the MIAA.

Local players: Chris Marting (Farmington Hills), freshman running back, 5-10, 175.

Returning starters: Four offensive, seven defensive. Outlook: Ray Smith, the dean of MIAA coaches (22 years), says the "cupboard is not bare, but we have a lot of spots to fill." Most are on offense, where, for starters, the Dutchmen must find a quarterback. The defense looks tough, but all-MIAA linebacker Scott Jones must be replaced. All things considered, Hope's hopes for a title don't look good.

Kalamazoo College

Last year's record: 5-4 overall, 2-3 in the MIAA. Local players: Rob Cavagnoli (Farmington), freshman strong safety, 5-10, 180; Marco DeSanto (Livonia Stevenson), sophomore linebacker, 5-11, 198; Erich Kuckland (Livonia Stevenson), sophomore defensive end, 6-2, 215; Scott Myrand (Livonia Franklin), senior defensive tackle, 6-0, 230; Tony Prey (Westland John Glenn), sophomore offensive lineman, 6-2, 276; Bryan Schultz (Canton/Plymouth Salem), junior defensive back, 6-4, 175. Returning starters: Eight offensive, seven defensive. Outlook: This could easily be the "Olivet" of '92. Coaches often note that defense wins championships, and the Hornets' contingent was sixth in the NCAA III.

Olivet College

Last year's record: 7-1-1 overall, 4-0-1 in the MIAA and co-champions.

Local players: Rob Karbowski (Farmington Hamson), junior placekicker, 6-4, 200; Bill Thoms (Plymouth/Plymouth Canton), senior offensive lineman, 5-11, 225. Returning starters: Seven offensive, five defensive. Outlook: Last year capped coach Dominic Livedoti's rebuilding process and gave the Comets something they hadn't possessed since 1974 — a title. Although they still have a lot of talent, repeating won't be easy. Olivet must play its three toughest MIAA games — Kalamazoo, Albion and Hope — on the road. The offense looks good, with the entire line back to protect returning quarterback Nick Leone. In all, six of those coming back received all-MIAA mention. But holes in the offensive and defensive backfield will make it difficult to match last season's record.

Overaitis' homer saves Walter's

Craig Overaitis delivered the "Shot heard 'round Johnstown."

The former Livonia Franklin High and Henry Ford Community College standout cracked a dramatic three-run homer with two-out in the bottom of the ninth inning, giving upstart Walter's Appliance a stunning 8-7 victory Friday over New Orleans at Point Stadium.

Overaitis' heroics, off NORD Boosters reliever Chris Wescott, enabled the first team ever from the Livonia Collegiate Baseball League to play for the coveted All American Amateur Baseball Association Tournament title, held annually (since 1945) in the western Pennsylvania steel town. "I didn't see it land," said Overaitis, who is headed for Madonna University this fall. "I didn't know it was out until the team got up and started yelling.

"I got ahead on the count and I was looking for a pitch. I felt focused and relaxed, instead of nervous and tense. I felt I was in a zone. I'd say it was my greatest thrill, especially in a tournament like this."

It was Walter's fifth straight victory in the 16-team double-elimination tournament and it couldn't have come at a more opportune time against the tourney's lone unbeaten team (among four still alive) in the double-elimination format.

"It was a 3-1 count, he (Overaitis) went with the pitch and sent it over the left-center field screen," said a euphoric Walter's manager Mike Keller. "I'm almost speechless. It was unbelievable."

Walter's overcame a 5-0 first-inning deficit, clawing back into game with a 13-hit attack.

Catcher Eric Stover (Westland John Glenn High/Grand Rapids JC) collected three hits in the victory, while Jeff Pendell (Livonia Churchill/Madonna), Mike Giacomantonio and Overaitis added two each.

'2000 Malibu Road' not open to view

More promising series slated for fall debuts

CBS' six-part, end-of-summer series *2000 Malibu Road* is the tale of a career woman (Lisa Hartman) who's mortgaged to the hilt and "can't sell her house because of the bad real estate market," according to executive producer Joel Schumacher (*Flatliners*). It's a show about "real life," says Hartman. As long as your idea of real life is an exclusive piece of beach-front property and a career in prostitution.

"So she takes in roommates because she's going to stop hooking," Schumacher explains. There's an aspiring actress (17-year-old Drew Barrymore), her "Svengali-like" sister (Tuesday Knight) and a lawyer (Jennifer Beals). Each woman has her secrets (the prostitute was abused by her stepfather, the law-

yer's fiance just died and she has a drinking problem), which we'll discover as this part-time soap works up a lather in the weeks ahead.

From all appearances, CBS has gone slumming with *2000 Malibu Road*, which debuts as a two-hour movie on Sunday, Aug. 23. The remaining hours will air in a Wednesday-night slot beginning Aug. 26. In fact, the behind-the-scenes drama may lead as much interest to the show as its titillating plot lines.

After four weeks of production Schumacher and co-executive producer Terry Louise Fisher (L.A. Law) presented three scenes to the press. The scenes emphasized cleavage, the sisters' intense bond (which include an unusually sensual foot rub), and a business transaction in which Hartman's character raised

her price from \$3,000 to \$4,000 when her client brings along a second woman.

Is all this integral to the plot? That's impossible to say since advance episodes of *Malibu Road* have been withheld by CBS. During their press conference, Schumacher, Fisher and the lead actresses expressed dismay at the aggressive reception the clips received. While the reporters used words like "explorative" and "sleaze," Fisher defended the show as "romantic."

"If it's just sleaze to you," said Schumacher, "I'm sorry, 'cause we don't see it that way."

When one reporter observed that most people "don't charge \$4,000" for sexual favors, Hartman snapped, "That's your problem."

Notably absent from the slugfest were production partner Aaron Spelling, who was on hand during similar press events for Fox's *Melrose Place* and NBC's *The Round Table*, and the CBS executives, including entertainment chief Jeff Sagansky. (In cases where a favorable or even mediocre press reception is anticipated, network executives line up along the sides and back of the room.)

According to Schumacher, Sagansky approached him several months ago about developing the series. In Schumacher's words, "He wanted something with exciting young women and glamour."

In view of the results why doesn't the network simply air *Malibu Road* as part of its steady late-night lineup? Probably because it fears damaging its relationship with hit maker Spelling, series drawing card Hartman (*Knots Landing*) and Fisher, who was hailed for her originality as co-creator of *L.A. Law*. Instead, *Malibu Road* is praised with another summer ensemble drama, *Freshman Dorm*.

Dorm is ostensibly about college life, but there's little time for classes for its trio of coed roommates. In the first episode, one of the young women loses her virginity, and her evidently more wordy pals offer excited congratulations. Episode two is titled, "Sex, Truth and Theatre."

With the mystique of college life strongest among teens in junior high and high school, the network clearly hopes to bring in young viewers, and to keep them for *Malibu Road* in the second hour of prime time. *Freshman Dorm* executive producer Steve Tisch, whose family owns CBS, candidly says he expects the network "to use this show and milk it for all it's worth."

Q: Were we listening to the actual singing voice of Meryl Streep in Postcards From the Edge? — Mrs. L.C. Blair, Sun City West, Ariz.

A: Yes, that's actually Streep singing her heart out as the credits roll, with backup sound from the band Blue Rodeo.

Q: After seeing Batman Returns, I've become interested in Christopher Walken, who plays Max Shreck. Could you please tell me about him — personal facts and what he's done in the past? — L. Slater, Royal Oak, Mich.

A: Walken was born the son of a baker on March 31, 1943, in Astoria, Queens, N.Y., and attended Hofstra University.

Maureen O'Sullivan, John Garrick, Marjorie White and Frank Albertson are among the co-stars. 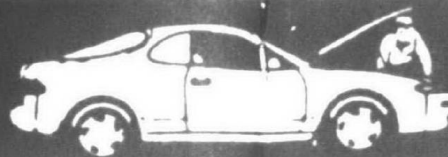

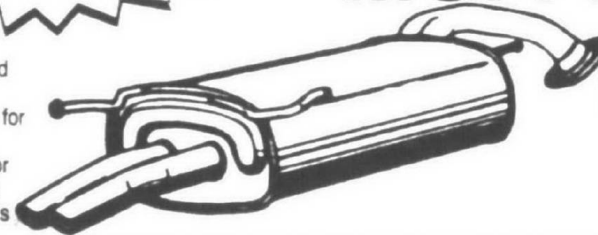
