Weather, events treats at Fest



The weather was perfect, the crowd large and the fun was there for the asking. Food with the tops on most folks list. There was the Rotary chicken dinner, a pancake breakfast and food booths along Main Street.

You just couldn't beat the weather for the 1992 Plymouth Community Fall Festival.

Sunshine and high temperatures around 70 reigned, as crowds flocked to Kellogg Park downtown and the Central Middle School-Plymouth Cultural Center area.

The Saturday schedule opened at 9 a.m. with the Optimist Pet Show, where judges Kathy Mount, Terry Bennett and Jill Young were trying to decide who should get first through third place ribbons in the dog show.

"It's an extremely difficult decision," host Felix Rotter told several hundred kids, moms, dads and grandparents, from the festival stage.

"Out of 30 animals there are 30 that are extremely gorgeous," he said over the microphone.

Soon, Ann Patterson was leading her dog Dickens through a trick, getting the small long-haired pooch to turn around on his back legs. That sparked applause from onlookers.

Lee Lundgren of Dearborn Heights watched the show with granddaughter Kristen, 9. "She wanted to see the pets," Lundgren said.

Meanwhile, several kids seeking to enter fish, turtles, rabbits, lizards and even pet rats in the "unusual" pet category waited their turn on stage.

Across from the Penn Theater was the Omnicom cable TV truck, with blue letters spelling Omnicoma set against bands of green, yellow and red.

In Kellogg Park just west of the cable TV outdoor studio were a group of Centennial Education Park students with blue stickers touting U.S. Congressman Bill Ford's candidacy.

"We're going to Washington D.C. in the spring," said Johanna Houghton of Plymouth, joined by other government students Jennifer Kelley, Mandi Napolitano, Laura Sanderman and Wendy Graves. The students were treated to a pancake breakfast by the congressman.

Waiting in line for the Kiwanis pancake breakfast, a line that stretched from The Gathering to the First Federal

Bank building, were Sharon and Brian Fioritto.

"It's our first year in Plymouth, we just moved from Mount Clemens," Sharon Fioritto said. "Plymouth's got a lot more to do than they do on the east side."

Over at the Little Professor Book Store on Main, city commissioner Dennis Shrewsbury was into his second day spent sitting in the store window, to raise money for Hospice Services of Plymouth.

"We've raised about \$350 so far he said," gesturing toward a fishbowl at the foot of his recliner where donations were collected.

Shrewsbury and others were recruited to sit and read in the book store window. Among the selections piling up near the fish bowl was "Political Babble — The 1,000 dumbest things ever said by politicians."

Shrewsbury even spent Friday night sleeping in the recliner. "I've been faithful to my pledge," he said.

North of Kellogg Park outside Central Middle School, craft sellers gathered. Among the crafts offered for sale were wind chimes in the shapes of reindeer and sharks from Harmon Hollow Bell Works, and framed photographs by

Depressed laid-off auto worker kills self

Canton Township's Micki Alpers was the divorced mother of two daughters when out of the blue, her high school sweetheart called in 1980. Living in Ypsilanti and working at General Motors Willow Run assembly plant, Mark Alpers tracked her down in their old hometown of Alpena. Alpers had graduated the year before Micki from Alpena High School.

"He said, 'I'm coming to see you in four weeks.'" Alpers said she warned him that "I'm not 17 and I don't have any hips any more."

"He said, 'Just remember, I'm not 17, and I have a belly,'" she said.

When the two got together, "It was

like we never parted. One kiss and that's all she wrote," said Alpers.

The two were married in 1983. An otherwise happy marriage was marred by Mark's battles with depression and alcoholism. Last November, he learned Willow Run was closing. Early this summer, he was laid off.

Aug. 31, while Micki was up north for her 20th high school reunion, 40-year-old Mark Alpers checked into the Motel 6 in Canton. He rented a room toward the back, where the parties go, Micki said. Next to the bathtub, Mark used a deer rifle he hid in his trunk to shoot himself through the chin and brain.

"He always said he hated his brain," said Micki, tears filling in her eyes.

"Mark had been severely depressed for years, and the job situation contributed to it," she said. "He was a person who would go to work with a smile and

GM offers help to wracked workers

Willow Run workers say Mark Alpers was the 23rd plant employee to die since the fall announcement that the plant would close. They attribute the deaths to both suicide and stress-related heart attacks.

While the number of deaths could not be confirmed, GM officials say they empathize with families and realize this is an extremely stressful time for employees.

Psychologists have been available for

employees at GM plants since the 1986 round of plant closings, said Nettie Seabrooks, director of government and civic affairs for North American Operations.

Millage vote

Expect to hear soon that Plymouth-Canton Community Schools will once again ask voters for a millage increase, this time in April.

Sources say the ballot proposal is likely to be discussed at the school board meeting tonight. It begins at 7:30 p.m., upstairs in the E.J. McClendon Administration Building at 454 S. Harvey.

How much millage the district will seek is up in the air, much depends on the outcome of school finance proposals in the November election.

Also on the agenda Monday night is a truth-in-taxation public hearing and certification of the winter tax levy. Due to a slight increase in the SEV, the district's operating millage is going up .0121 mills, worth \$24,000 in revenue for Plymouth-Canton schools.

The board is expected to ratify contracts for the licensed technicians and security guards.

Detour

From 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through early October, the right turn lane from Ford Road onto Haggerty and the south east-bound lane on Ford will be closed, the Western Townships Utilities Authority has announced.

The land closings are necessary to allow digging beneath Ford Road, said Deloris Newell, WTUA executive director.

The construction is part of the WTUA wastewater transportation project. When completed in 1994, it will carry sewage from Canton, Northville and Plymouth Townships to the Ypsilanti Community Utilities Authority treatment plant in Ypsilanti.

Crossing work

Plymouth mayor Robert Jones reported some good news to city commissioners on Tuesday about the Main Street railroad crossing.

"The rubber materials are on order and we're expecting installation in the early fall," he said, of the rubberized railroad crossing on Main Street.

goof around, but people didn't really know him. That was his way of hiding his feelings."

A painter

A perfectionist and a talented artist who once exhibited his paintings at the Ann Arbor art fair, Mark was in and out of treatment centers for problems with alcohol. Last January, he was arrested for drunken driving and his license was taken away. Micki said she pleaded with the court to put him on an electronic tether.

"I think if they wouldn't have been so lenient, he would be alive, because they could have tracked him down on the computer," said Micki, a secretary at a health center in Canton.

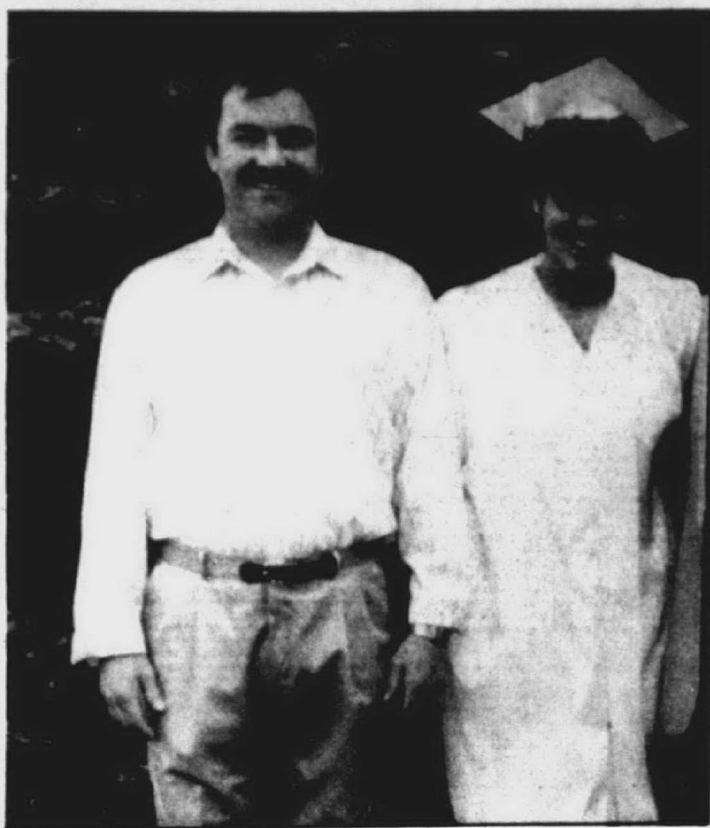
Micki's daughter Krisha, 18, says she always knew her stepdad was depressed, "but when he lost his license and his job, he felt like a teenager grounded to the house; like there wasn't anything he could do for us. After 16 years at the plant, it was like he was starting over. He didn't go to college, so he was limited in what he could find."

Suicide planned

A friend of Mark's told the family that he'd planned his suicide "right down to the moment," last November, shortly after the plant closing was announced. "The friend said Mark did it this way because he wanted me to be already gone. He didn't want me to think it was anything I did or said. He wanted to make sure he had a good time with the kids beforehand."

With their stepdad, Krisha and Kamie, 16, had dinner at Pizza Hut, saw "Unforgiven" at a Laurel Park theater, and rented movies the week their mother was up north with her family. "He seemed depressed, but when we got home, he would put on a smile. I think it was kind of a mask," said Krisha, who enters the Air Force next week.

The night before Micki left for up north, "Mark was laughing and jok-

ing. He was making comments about what I was wearing to my reunion," she said.

\$500 on table

When Micki got home about 7:30 p.m. Aug. 31, "I knew something was wrong. In 12 years, he'd never left extra bill money, but \$500 was on the table with a note that said, 'This is for bills,'" she said.

"I called the Canton police and told them about the bill money and that he was suicidal. They said they would come out the next day, because he had to be missing for 24 hours."

Mark's body was found at Motel 6 about 12:20 p.m., Sept. 2. "They said he'd probably done it four to six hours before that," said Micki. Police found a few cigarette butts but no sign that Mark had been drinking or taking drugs.

His friend said he chose Motel 6 because it was one story, and the bullet wouldn't go up into anyone else's room, Micki said.

Senseless death

What hurts most about her husband's "lonely, stupid and senseless" death is that so many people were willing to help.

"It wasn't that family, friends and therapists didn't extend their hands, it was because Mark wouldn't reach out to them," said Micki.

Mark often said he had no friends. Yet when he died, hundreds packed Pawlus Funeral Home. Co-workers, neighbors, friends and family sent cards, flowers and food and took up collections for the family, said Micki, who learned that members of five generations of Alpers men have suffered from manic depression and committed suicide. Mark's father talked about suicide, but recently died of cancer.

Besides his wife and stepdaughters, Alpers is survived by his mother, Marjorie Bevan of Charlottesville, Va., and sister Sheila Alpers of Greenbelt, Md.

Commission delays action, parking recommendation

The debate over the city's too-strict parking ordinance spilled into the city commission chambers on Tuesday.

More exactly, it is the question of how much downtown businesses should pay — if anything — to provide parking spaces.

Many in recent years have maintained that the city demands too much of businesses, especially restaurants, trying to locate in the city.

That's because the city has demanded payment of tens of thousands of dollars from these businesses, if they can't provide plenty of on-site parking.

Some say there's already plenty of available parking in the city, and the ordinance needlessly chases business away — businesses that Plymouth needs.

Before city commissioners on Tuesday was a recommendation from city manager Steve Walters.

The recommendation pertained to parking credits. Some, including Plymouth attorney Carol Levitte, say the city has not set a uniform price per parking space, by which to determine parking credits a business must pay.

Walters said that by ordinance, the city commission every year is to review the amount to be charged per parking space in March.

But the last time the parking credit rate was reviewed was 1986. Then, commissioners agreed to raise

the amount from \$3,500 per parking credit to \$4,300, for 1987.

The amount per parking credit, or parking space, is supposed to be tied to how much it costs to create such a parking space.

The money then goes into a parking fund — recently re-established by the city — to go toward creation of needed future parking.

The recommendation to city commissioners was that they vote to re-establish \$4,300 as the amount per parking credit, and that sparked debate.

"I'm not sure I see a reason to rubber stamp something that was done six years ago," said commissioner Dennis Shrewsbury.

Noting that a parking committee is reviewing city parking ordinances and planning changes, Shrewsbury said, "Let's wait until we get the true facts."

The debate continued. Commissioner Jerry Vorva suggested that it would be redundant for commissioners to vote to approve \$4,300 as the price per parking credit, as they'd already set that amount in 1986.

Commissioner William McAninch disagreed: "The record would show that the Plymouth City Commission has been negligent in not having a review every March."

Should the commission not act, "The record will continue to show that we have been negligent," he said, adding the commission should follow Walters' recommendation.

Senior housing plan scrapped

A plan to turn the former Plymouth Radisson hotel into senior housing has been scrapped.

Jim Courtney, who owns three ReAmerica offices, had announced plans in July 1991 to buy the hotel on Northville Road.

But this week, he reported the deal won't go down.

"The cost to do it was too expensive," said Courtney, who planned the project with partner Ron Cook.

"We couldn't make it work with the purchase price of the hotel," Courtney said.

The hotel closed June 30, 1991. Formerly the Plymouth Hilton, the Radisson Hotel Plymouth was bought in 1989 by the Columbia Sussex Corp. of Kentucky.

The company, the biggest Radisson franchise holder in the United States, said then it would advertise aggressively to attract business.

The firm declined to comment on the hotel closing, and a company official could not be reached for comment on what might be next for the former hotel.

The building has 195 sleeping rooms, several meeting rooms and a pool, along with a bar and restau-

rant. Observers speculated when the hotel closed that it is not easily accessible to business travelers, hence the failure of the hotel to succeed.

While the hotel did have high occupancy rates in the early '80s, those rates fell in recent years, even though the bar and restaurant attracted business.

The hotel ballroom, the fourth largest in the state, had been used up until the time the hotel closed, for exhibitions, including several baseball card shows.

Its last use was as the site for an exhibition of Beatles memorabilia.

"Ever since then, we've advised plants that this is something that's been very helpful and very appreciated by the employees.

"We want to do everything we can to help employees through an extremely difficult time," she said.

GM spokesman Patrick Morrissey said an employee assistance program is in place because "We know it's a bad situation. We're doing what we can to help people. We hope we can do the right thing to help them get through this."

Services available for employees at GM facilities in-

clude Alcoholics Anonymous, and individual and group counseling. Therapy sessions address drug addiction, and emotional and stress-related problems.

"We know the people at Willow Run have been really involved since announcement to help people with the transition period," said Morrissey. "To enhance what the plant was already doing, we brought in an outside counselor to do individual counseling to help people deal with their emotions. Employees deal with this in different ways."

"We've learned to display what we're selling a little bit more, and you have to help people make their decision a little bit," he said.

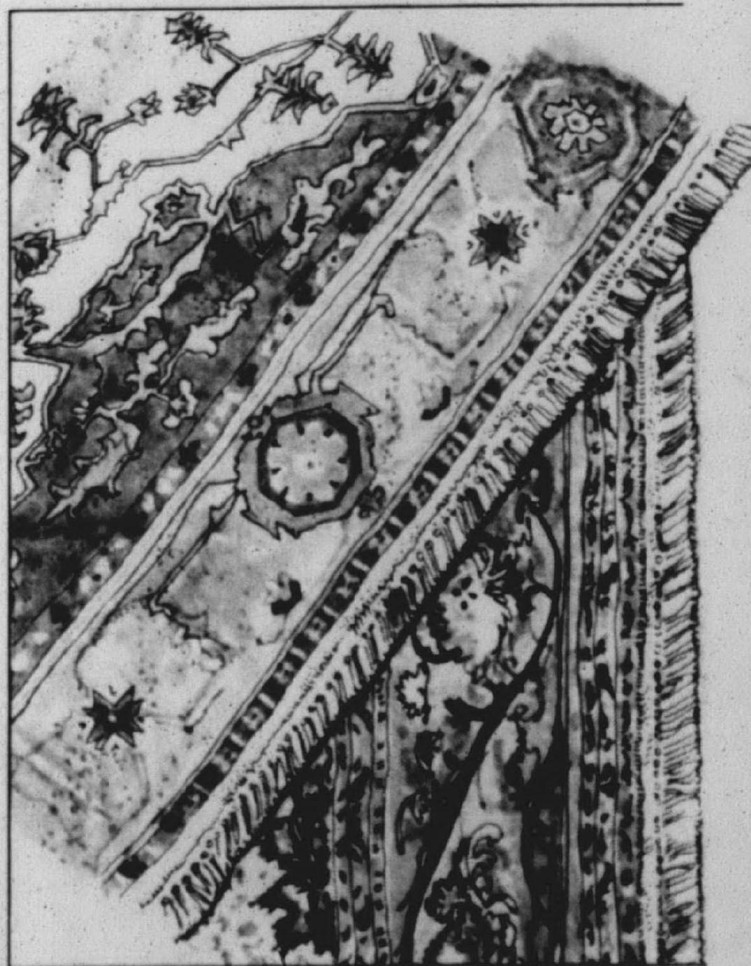
"We've had a good time out here."

"I really wanted to do it before because I watched my brother compete and loved it," Hough said. "My dad thought I would get hurt."

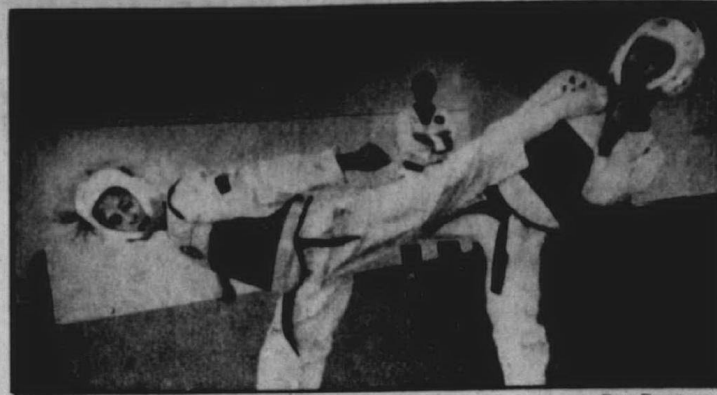
Hough's brother, Ed, was a tough competitor in the field, but he never tried out for the national team.

Commissioners compromise

McNamara agrees to single ballot question

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners is battling .500 on ballot proposals.

Having voted last month to put six proposals on the November ballot, commissioners were chagrined when county Executive Edward McNamara vetoed four of them.

In his veto statements, McNamara argued that the proposals were either illegal, superfluous or attempts to usurp his authority.

Then during a spirited discussion Thursday, the commission voted 13-1 to drop three of the vetoed proposals in exchange for McNamara letting the fourth one go on the November ballot.

Only commissioner, William O'Neil, D-Southgate, voted against compromising with McNamara. O'Neil argued that the board should vote to override the vetoes or challenge McNamara in court. "We should have been in court a week and a half ago," he said.

The proposal McNamara agreed to allow on the ballot would require the county executive to submit an executive department reorganization plan to the commission for approval within 90 days after taking office or getting re-elected.

That means, for example, that if McNamara gets re-elected in 1994 and wants to change the duties of one of his employees, he would have to get commission permission.

Even though he consented to letting this proposal on the ballot, McNamara called it "merely but another attempt to again intrude

said Beard's proposal violates state law and is an attempt to "usurp the authority of the (executive)."

The third withdrawn proposal would have given the commission approval rights over the pay and benefits of all non-union executive branch employees.

McNamara said in his veto statement that executive branch employees are paid about the same as legislative branch employees, and so the proposed change is unnecessary.

Also to appear on the November ballot are two proposals that McNamara did not veto.

The first one will seem very familiar to voters because they voted it down by a 59-41 percent margin in the Aug. 4 primary. This proposal asks voters to tax themselves an additional half mill for 10 years to support health services and mental health services in the county.

Amann opposed putting the millage-increase question back on the ballot. "The action of the commission has been childish," he said. "It was disrespectful to the voters." McNamara also opposes this one, Duggan said.

The last proposal concerns a 1988, 10-year, one-mill tax. One-tenth of that money was supposed to be spent to build and operate a juvenile offender work/training institution. But that hasn't been done because of a shift in state policy.

So the proposal asks voters to allow the money raised with that 0.1 mill to be given back to Wayne County cities and townships to pay for local youth programs.

and usurp the administrative authority of the executive branch."

Commissioner Bryan Amann, D-Canton, favors the proposal, but doesn't expect voters to approve it. He said voters probably won't understand the proposal and therefore will vote against it.

"It may be too esoteric for the voters to appreciate and understand," Amann said. "This proposal is fighting an uphill battle."

Commissioner Maurice Breen, R-Plymouth, agreed with Amann. "The inclination would be to vote no on something like that," he said.

Deputy county executive Mike Duggan called the proposal "crazy" and said McNamara will oppose it. "I don't think anyone will take it seriously," he said. "If this passes, then the legislative/executive bick-

ering could shut down county government."

Among the ballot proposals the commission withdrew Thursday was one that would have asked voters to permit the use of "the separation of powers concept to determine the meaning of the charter as to the relationship of the executive, judicial and legislative branches of county government."

In his veto statement, McNamara called that proposal "too vague and ambiguous" and said "the proposed language does nothing to clarify the matter."

The second withdrawn ballot proposal, put forth by Kay Beard, D-Westland, would have allowed the county's auditor general to audit all county agencies, including McNamara's office.

JOINT REPLACEMENTS
If you need both knees or both hips replaced because of advanced arthritis, the decision of which side to operate on first, rests with you. Which joint hurts the worse rather than which side x-ray shows as more advanced, determines the site of the initial operation.
In other cases of multiple joint replacement, professional judgement takes over. If your arthritis involves the hands and knees, and/or a hip and shoulder, the orthopedic surgeon decides which joint to replace first and the order to follow.
The general rule is that upper extremity replacement comes before lower extremity, with hand before shoulder and foot before knee before hip.
The reason relates to rehabilitation. A successful knee replacement depends on a program of progressive ambulation. Initially you must be able to use a walker. You need hands strong enough to grasp the walker and shoulders of sufficient strength to bear the weight of your body. If your hands or shoulders cannot accept this burden, they need repair, then you can undertake a knee operation.
In the lower extremities the same rule holds. Before you can walk, you must be able to stand in a stable manner. If your feet are deformed, they cannot take on the stress of maintaining a balanced stance. Therefore, foot surgery takes precedence over knee repair.

Perot rode in on a mood of national discontent

Early in 1990, at the height of a demagogue-dominated mob effort to suppress my egalitarian ideas and get me fired from the Rochester schools' assistant superintendency, I was quoted in an Observer & Eccentric newspaper as follows:

"Thank God our children are growing up in a democracy where no demagogue can legally close their door to free speech and critical inquiry. So let's not voluntarily close that door on their teachers and educational leaders with our own hands.

"If through ignorance and fear we do that, it's only a matter of time before a dictator does ride into national office, because our electorate will be too unschooled to understand what they'll be losing if they don't oppose him, and they'll become a non-electorate almost overnight . . ."

Two years later came Ross Perot, the most-dangerous demagogue to emerge

in a democratic country since the days of Wisconsin Senator Joe McCarthy, or maybe even the days following the fall of Germany's Weimar Republic.

He was a candidate who spied on people, cloaked himself in the trappings of militarism, paid for his own monumental campaign — meant to further enrich the super-rich by cutting the capital gains tax and wanted the Constitution changed so as president he could veto any appropriation passed by Congress that he didn't favor.

Even though perhaps he didn't realize it, he frighteningly resembled a presidential candidate for an autocracy rather than for a constitutional democracy.

Making Perot's candidacy even scarier was the fact that he rode in during an era of national discontent with an elitist Republican president who is sadly out of touch with the needs of ordinary Americans.

And while that president's Democratic challenger offers a progressive platform, he wasn't promptly forthright in responding to an allegation of philandering. In the end, his initial hesitancy in responding to that allegation still could cost Bill Clinton the presidency — even though it shouldn't.

If their now well-documented womanizing had prevented the election

of George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Franklin Roosevelt, Dwight D. Eisenhower, Jack Kennedy and Lyndon Johnson, the United States would have suffered immeasurably.

I only wish that right off the bat Clinton had said of his accuser, "If she says we did it, I guess you'll have to draw whatever conclusions you wish. I'm too much a gentleman to contradict a lady. Now let's get back to the real issues regarding America's needs. Next question!"

Regrettably, he didn't say that — and although the topic has faded somewhat, count on the trailing Bush campaign to revive it now with a vengeance. Given the shortcomings of both Bush and Perot, such a revival could have proved doubly damaging had Perot remained viably in the race.

FINNISH UP

A good many visitors to Helsinki will arrive by boat, skimming into the deep South Harbor on one of the huge pleasure ships that cruise daily between Finland and Sweden, Germany, Poland and Estonia.

A few days — or even hours — later they will reboard and head for Russian waters. The traffic is about as heavy in the opposite direction.

Helsinki remains a little cousin to St. Petersburg in the minds — and travel patterns — of many foreigners.

Some won't even realize that Helsinki celebrates its 75th anniversary of independence in December; typically, the city has refrained from publicity that might be deemed immodest, provocative or overcommercial. But in the last century the Finnish capital has succeeded in honing an unusual Nordic-Baltic-European identity in its physical look as well as its spirit.

Remnants of Swedish (1550-1809) and Russian (1809-1917) domination now share center stage with Finland's own styles: National Romanticism (a hybrid of Jugendstil focusing on local materials and myths) and the Functionalism made famous by Alvar Aalto.

At this time of the year facades of all kinds are neutralized by flower beds and terrace restaurants filled with ultraviolet-ray-loving Finns, whose immediate priority is to soak in every last bit of light before the darkening of autumn.

Events

For a country of only 5 million people Finland's own musical talent is prodigious. A revival of the Finnish National Opera's production of Leevi Madetoja's "The Ostrobothnians" opened on Sept. 5. It also plays Sept. 16, 30 and Oct. 6. Tickets: from \$11 to \$40. The box office is at 34B Albertinkatu (129 255).

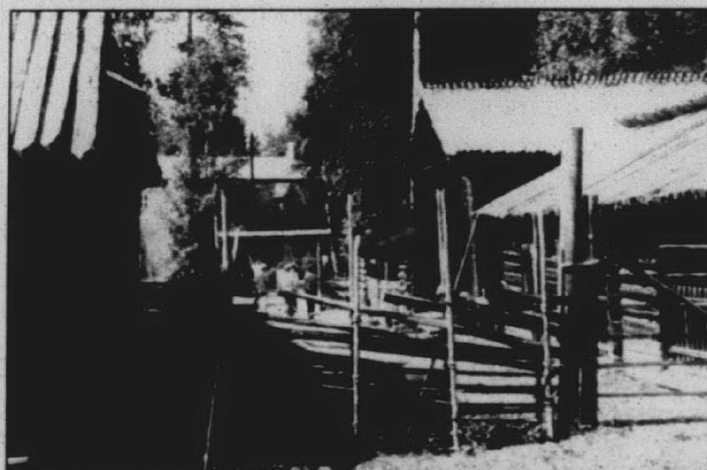
The Finnish Radio Symphony orchestra begins its regular season with the conductor Jukka-Pekka Saraste on Sept. 16, in Finlandia Hall. Frank Peter Zimmermann will perform Dvorak's Violin Concerto; also on the program are Debussy and Scriabin. Tickets: \$12.50, \$17.20 and \$20.

Just as the rains start to fall and the sun starts to beat its winter retreat, the Fifth Helsinki Film Festival — Love and Anarchy (446 428) — unreeles in six movie houses downtown. This year's festival, Sept. 25 to Oct. 1, will offer more than 100 screenings with emphasis on new Japanese cinema and a retrospective of David Cronenberg's work. Tickets: \$6, or 10 films for \$49.

Sightseeing

Finlandia Hall, built in 1971, is not just Helsinki's main concert site but the famous last work of Alvar Aalto, who designed everything from its facade to its furniture. Unfortunately, the white marble exterior has decayed drastically and must be changed.

Across the street stands a monument to the National Romantic style, the Finnish National Museum, 34 Mannerheimintie (40 501), built in 1906. Its architecture echoes various old Finnish churches and castles and the foyer is decorated with frescoes by the National Romantic artist Akseli Gallen-Kallela.

The unpretentious but pleasing permanent collection traces life in Finland from prehistoric times to the present. Open daily from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. (to 3 p.m. after Sept. 1); on Tuesday also 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Admission: \$1.20 and \$2.40.

Also nearby, the Temppeliaukio Church, 3 Lutherinkatu, was built di-

rectly into a rocky outcrop in 1969; its solar ceiling spreads from coiled copper into panes of glass that let in natural light.

In addition to Lutheran services the church holds fine chamber- and folk-music concerts. Hours for visiting change weekly, but it is usually open Monday to Friday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Call 494 698.

On nice days Helsinki's "tourist" islands are places to relax. Seurasaari, connected to the mainland by a wooden bridge 3 miles from the city center, has been turned into an open-air museum (484 712) strewn with old farmsteads and other buildings transplanted from different parts of Finland.

In September, partly open with no tours (but the guide booklets are very thorough), Mondays to Fridays 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.; Saturdays and Sundays 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission: \$1.20 and \$2.40; Wednesdays, free.

The purchase of a Helsinki Card can be a worthwhile investment since it grants free passage on all metropolitan transport and free or reduced entrance to many sites.

The card can be bought from the Helsinki City Tourist Office, 19 Pohjoisesplanadi (169 3757), and at some hotels and travel agencies. Cost: \$18.40 for one day, \$26 for two days, \$31 for three days; for children ages 7 to 16, \$11 to \$16.

Where to stay

The Hotel Strand Inter-Continental, John Stenbergin Ranta (39 351), is a world-class hotel with 200 rooms on the waterfront about five minutes from the downtown area. Request a room with a sea view. Doubles cost \$278 weekdays; \$139 weekends.

The venerable Hotel Seurahuone Sociis, 12 Kaivokatu (170 441), has 118 carefully appointed rooms, many of them quite large, right across from the beautiful Helsinki Railway Station. Downstairs is the city's most famous cafe, resplendent in high-ceilinged Jugendstil and open late into the night. Doubles cost \$222 weekdays; \$114 weekends.

Budget: Hotel Olympia, 2 Lantinen Brahenkatu (750 801), has 99 orderly rooms — many overlooking a tree-lined sports field — in a residential area about 15 minutes from downtown. Doubles cost \$95 all week.

The beds are a bit hard, but the Hotelli Helka, 23 Pohjoisen Rautatiekatu (440 581), has 161 decent rooms in the city center and is part of the Best Western chain. Doubles in the old part cost \$93 weekdays or \$68 weekends; in the new part, \$149 weekdays or \$107 weekends.

The Theater Inn Omahojja, 3 Itäinen Teatterikuja (666 211), occupies part of a turn-of-the-century building behind the National Theater. Its reception area is truly dramatic, but the 15 bedrooms are austere. Doubles with private shower and toilet cost \$78, doubles with toilet \$68, doubles without either \$61.

Full-service hotels in Helsinki generally have sauna available, but bath tubs and double beds are less certain.

Special agents track down real deals

This summer's low airfares have been tempting — but often difficult to find.

The reason is simple: The airlines set aside a limited number of seats to sell at an advertised price.

With a computerized pricing system they can monitor, hour by hour, how many seats have been sold and how many are left. Often as the demand changes, so do the fares.

The number of such fare hikes is staggering — as many as 200,000 price shifts per day during the recent airfare wars.

What's a consumer to do? One recourse is to find a trained travel agent who is equipped with a travel computer network that keeps up, second by second, with the new rates. Preferably that would be a major computer-reservations system, such as American Airlines' Saabre or United Airlines' Apollo network.

In fact, more travelers are using the services of agents, according to statistics gathered by the American Society of Travel Agents (ASTA), which represents more than 20,000 agencies in 129 countries.

ASTA estimates that 80 percent of all air tickets are now booked by travel agents. So are 40 percent of all hotel reservations and 95 percent of all cruise reservations.

But choosing a travel agent can be difficult.

"You should choose a travel agent the same way you would pick a doctor or a lawyer — by asking friends and relatives to recommend one," says Emily Porter, a spokeswoman for ASTA.

"It's important to visit the agency and to ask questions. Equally important are the questions they ask you, to determine your interests, your budget, where you've been and where you'd like to go.

"Find out if they've been to the destination or taken the cruise line you're considering."

Travel agencies run the gamut from local mom-and-pop shops to well-equipped branches of major travel agencies such as American Express and Carlson Travel Net-

work. Some will book anything and everything; others are specialists, making reservations only, for example, on cruises.

"I always encourage people to speak with the owner or manager of a travel agency," says Brian Robb, vice president of retail-marketing for Carlson Travel Network, which has 1,300 branches across the United States.

"That first contact is the most important. That person should be able to steer you to the agent who can best help you, to the one who knows cruises, for example, or resorts.

"You don't want to find yourself speaking with an agent who only does business travel and can book a Hyatt or the shuttle, but has never done resorts before."

President's Detroit speech draws cheers and jeers

President George Bush's speech to the Detroit Economic Club last Thursday took hits from Democrats and was a hit with Republicans.

Trying to strike a conservative, anti-big-government pose, Bush promised tax and spending cuts in the first year of a second term if he should be re-elected. He didn't say which taxes he would reduce, but suggested he could cut the income tax by 1 percent, reduce the tax on small businesses by a third and cut the capital gains tax.

"I want to stimulate entrepreneurial capitalism, not punish it," he said. "I want to empower people to

make their own choices, not yoke them to new bureaucracies. I want a government that spends less, regulates less and taxes less."

Bush also said he would . . .
● Reduce the White House budget by one-third if Congress agrees to a one-third cut in its budget, too.

● Streamline the executive branch bureaucracy by merging or abolishing parts of it.

● Reduce the pay of federal employees making more than \$75,000/year by 5 percent.

About five hours after Bush's speech, U.S. Rep. Sander Levin, D-Southfield, whose district includes Redford Township, issued a one-

page press release criticizing it.

"Once again the president has demonstrated his inability to relate to the problems of ordinary Americans," Levin said. "He called for a renewed America, but dragged out the same tired, old ideas he's touted for four years, like an untargeted cut in the capital gains tax. He confirmed that another four years of a Bush administration would be simply more of the same."

U.S. Sen. Carl Levin, D-Michigan, panned the Bush speech in a press release, too. "Michigan has lost a quarter of a million manufacturing jobs since 1979, and it wasn't until this election rolled around that President Bush seemed to

care," he said. "He has done nothing to use the tools he's been given to reverse our painfully weak trade policy. As Ben Franklin said, 'Well done is better than well said.'"

State Sen. Bob Geake, R-Northville, who is running against incumbent Democrat William D. Ford in the 13th District, said he didn't hear Bush's speech to the economic club.

But on Bush's proposal to cut taxes, Geake said, "That sounds to me like a good program and I would support it." He also favored the

plans to cut White House and Congress budgets by one-third and to streamline the executive branch bureaucracy.

The new 13th District includes Plymouth, Plymouth Township, part of Livonia, Canton Township, Garden City and Westland.

Ford didn't like Bush's speech. "(Bush) seemed to string together a bunch of his old ideas that we've heard before," Ford said. "He didn't answer the concerns that the working people of our district express to me. They're worried about whether

their job will be there next year, how they're going to pay for a health emergency, or if they're going to be able to send their kids to college."

A little stuffing makes hefty vegetables a meal

Oh ye with garden, take heed! The very best summer vegetables are those picked in their infancy, tiny, tender and still glistening with the fresh dew of morning.

But as summer wears on, the garden patch seems to explode, sometimes producing faster than we can harvest.

And when we return from vacations to find the inevitable zucchini that in our absence has grown to the size of a Volkswagen, look upon it as an opportunity to turn a liability into an asset with wonderful stuffed vegetable dishes.

Even those who don't toil to raise their own vegetables will always need to find uses for mature vegetables, since many farmers, choosing heft over flavor, wait to pick their crops until they have reached maximum growth.

As a result, by the end of summer, markets and kitchen gardens alike are flooded with vegetables that are perfect for stuffing.

Stuffy vegetables

Vegetables most adapted to stuffing are artichokes, cabbage, tomatoes, zucchini, peppers, onions, eggplant, turnips and mushrooms. Many of these can be filled, cooked and served either hot or cold. Ah, but the most proficient by far is the lowly summer squash, which, because of their delicate flavors, are always ideal for stuffing.

Zucchini, crooked neck, pattypan and acorn squash, beg to be stuffed with the likes of a delicate poppyseed bread stuffing or, in contrast, a hearty stuffing comprised of chopped sausage, onion, garlic and tomato. Even a subtle mixture of both could only benefit their obscure flavor.

Momma's stuffing

Momma always prepared zucchini stuffed with a mixture of cottage cheese, Parmesan cheese, egg and pepper. Combining the latter, she would wack the giant zucchini lengthwise with a kitchen weapon we, as kids, called "the machete".

Using a wooden spoon that sometimes doubled as a disciplinary tool, she would scoop out the seeds with one firm stroke, something that to this day, she still accomplishes with skill.

Even though the filling was a simple mixture of dairy products, when momma now tries the same dish at my house, only prepared with farmer's cheese, fresh grated Romano cheese, Amish brown eggs and fresh ground pepper, she still secretly proclaims her recipe to still be the best (or so dad says.) But that's OK because momma's taste for the simple will never go out of style.

Momma not only excelled with stuffing a zucchini but also equally impressive was her ability to stuff one mean pepper and an occasional onion. The peppers weren't the typical Hungarian stuffed peppers, baked beyond recognition in canned tomato juice.

Her's were first roasted to remove the bitter skins, then stuffed with a three meat meatloaf-type mixture comprised of ground beef, pork and veal.

I can remember observing her open one of those tiny cans of mushrooms in gravy, a can of French fried onion rings and a can of Campbell's condensed cream of celery soup. Mix it all with a dice of onion (with hands, of course,) then scoop up just enough of the mixture to be stuffed into an awaiting shell.

Topped with just a splash of tomato juice, these stuffed peppers were right up there on the family's list of favorite requests when mealtime came around.

Outstanding onions

Onions are a Janes Gang favorite, especially when hollowed and filled with seasoned breadcrumbs and butter.

These are especially easy to create when wrapped in foil and tossed onto the grill or simply baked in a 350 degree oven. The same can go for pattypan squash.

This year's garden produced some succulent pattypan and a mixture of ground sausage, breadcrumbs, Parmesan cheese and a little red wine turned an otherwise bland and mundane vegetable into a meal-in-itself stuffed vegetable.

So if Mother Nature pulls a fast one on you and your garden, never underestimate what a little stuffing might do.

Don't forget to add "stuff it" to your vegetable repertoire of slice it, dice it, chop it, stir fry it, steam it, bake it, shake it, etc. What might have been a reject can become a star — with stuffing.

FIGHT snack attacks WITH CRISP

Apples



If you want to be healthy to the core, reduce the fat in your diet, and reach for an apple the next time you're hungry for a snack.

You've heard the saying — "an apple a day keeps the doctor away." Well, it's true, apples are good for you. The next time you're hungry for something crisp and sweet, reach for an apple.

Think apples when you're planning fall dinner menus, too. Wendy Schwartz of Birmingham, a registered dietitian and volunteer for the American Heart Association of Michigan created a healthy low fat, low cholesterol harvest dinner using apples.

The main course, Autumn Apple Chicken, (see recipe inside) features boneless chicken breasts with apple cider and apple wedges. She got the recipe from the "The Health Club Cooks," published by the Jewish Community Center of Metropolitan Detroit.

Autumn Apple Chicken is a variation of a dish in the "Silver Palate Cookbook," by Julee Rosso & Sheila Lukins. It was created by Davida Robinson, one of the JCC cookbook editors, and contains no added fat.

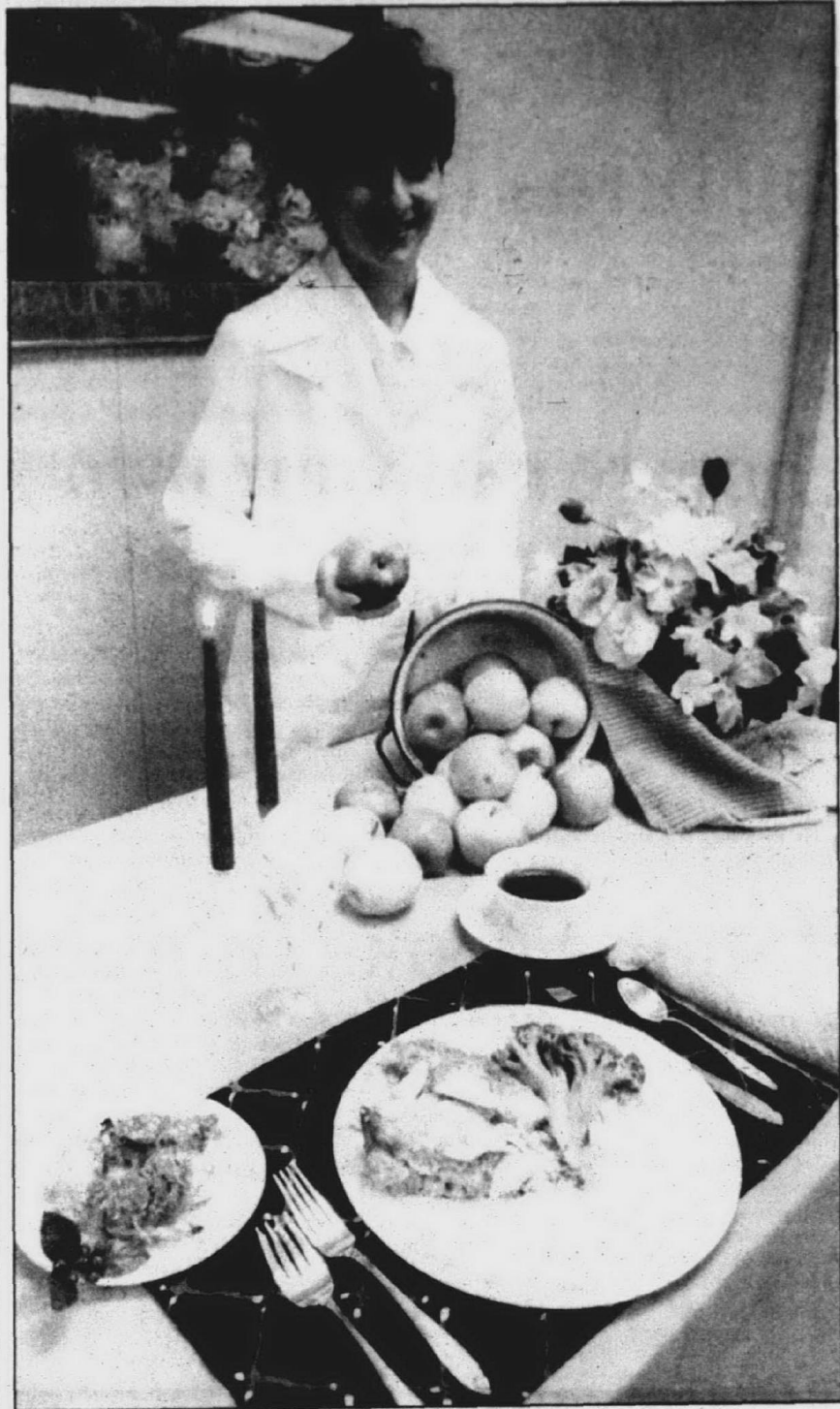
It has become a part of the Robinson Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year) meal. This year Rosh Hashanah begins on Monday, Sept. 28 and apples will be a part of many of those holiday menus.

September, besides being the start of the apple season, is National Cholesterol Awareness Month. It's a good time to start healthy habits like eating more fruits and vegetables and less fat. Some people like David Solomon of Southfield who recently had open heart surgery and angioplasty were forced to change their eating habits.

"I used to be a real nut as far as butter and cheeses," said Solomon who is in his middle 50s. "Now I stay away from fat. If I use low fat cheese in a meal, I don't use margarine."

Mary Cabaj of Royal Oak is in her 70s and had open heart surgery for a valve replacement in May. Now she bakes and broils foods instead of frying, and she selects low-fat desserts, skim milk and avoids cheeses.

When you're hungry for a snack, reach for an apple said Schwartz. They're a good source of dietary fiber

and high in complex carbohydrates which may lower the risk of cancer, heart disease and diabetes.

A medium apple contains about 80 calories, one gram of fat, and are sodium free. They provide 15 percent of the U.S.D.A., recommended daily requirement for vitamin C — more than a peach, pear or bunch of grapes. Apples are an important source of potassium and contain the trace mineral boron which helps the body use calcium and keep brain function alert.

Bring your apples to the Cranbrook Institute of Science Honey and Apples festival, 1-4:30 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 26 and Sunday, Sept. 27, and 1-4:30 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 3 and Sunday, Oct. 4. Visitors can blend their own brand of cider, the old-fashioned way by feeding

the hand-operated press as it produces apple juice. It takes about 1/4 bushel of apples to make a gallon of cider.

The activities are included in the regular museum admission of \$5 for adults, \$4 for children ages three to 17, and senior citizens, 65 and older.

To keep apples from turning brown once you've cut them, just dunk them in a 50/50 mixture of lemon juice and water. Extra apples freeze easily.

BARBECUED RIBS

2-4 pounds country-style spare ribs
1 bottle (18 ounces) thick and spicy barbecue sauce with honey
1/2 can (6 ounces) beer

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Rinse spare ribs and pat dry with paper towel.

Place in a shallow baking dish with bone side down. Pour in 1/2 can of beer and follow with enough barbecue sauce to cover the top of the meat.

Cover baking dish with foil and bake for 1 to 1 1/4 hours.

Ten minutes before serving, remove foil, add more barbecue sauce if needed, and place the baking dish under the broiler, leaving several inches between the meat and the heating element. Broil until meat begins to brown and sizzle. Serve on a plate or platter. Serves 4.

POTATO PANCAKES

1 cup mashed potatoes
1 medium raw potato, peeled and shredded
1 cup Bisquick
1/2 cup milk
1 egg
1 Tablespoon sugar
1 small onion, chopped

1-2 Tablespoons vegetable oil
Salt to taste

Combine all ingredients and beat with a fork until all are blended. Lightly coat the bottom of a large frying pan with the vegetable oil or use non-stick spray.

Spoon in batter, making pancakes about 2 to 3 inches in diameter and brown on both sides.

Repeat until all batter is used up. Serve with curried fruit spooned over top. Serves 4.

CURRIED FRUIT BAKE

1 can (16 ounces) pear halves
1 can (16 ounces) peach halves
5 maraschino cherries
3 Tablespoons butter or margarine
1/2 cup brown sugar
2 teaspoons curry powder

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Drain and dry fruits and cut into bite-sized pieces.

Melt butter or margarine in a small pan. Add brown sugar and curry powder.

Place the fruit in an 8-inch by 8-inch baking dish. Spoon butter mixture over the top of the fruit. Bake uncovered for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Serve warm over pancakes.

Any leftovers of this delicious fruit dish can be frozen.

AUTUMN APPLE CHICKEN

- 8 boneless chicken breasts
- 2 cups apple cider
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1 Tablespoon ground ginger
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 3 Tablespoons brown sugar

2 apples, peeled, cored and cut in thin wedges

The night before serving, marinate chicken in apple cider. Remove chicken from apple cider, but reserve cider for later. Mix flour, ginger and cinnamon in a small bowl. Dredge the chicken with the flour mixture and place in a shallow baking pan. Bake chicken at 350 de-

grees for 40 minutes. Meanwhile, combine reserved cider, brown sugar and apple slices. Pour the marinade mixture over the chicken and bake 25 minutes more. Serves 8.

- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup flour

- 1/4 cup oatmeal
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 2 Tablespoons margarine, softened

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Lightly oil an 8-inch square baking pan. Place apple slices in pan. Mix remaining ingredients thoroughly. Sprinkle over apples.

Bake 30 minutes or until apples are tender and topping is golden brown. Serve warm, and if desired, with vanilla yogurt or yogurt dessert sauce. Serves 4-6.

MOMMA'S DAIRY STUFFED ZUCCHINI

- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 1 cup Parmesan Cheese

2 eggs
black pepper to taste
1 large zucchini, split lengthwise, seeds removed

Combine first 4 ingredients, mix well. Pour mixture into hollowed

out zucchini. Place on a nonstick baking sheet and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes, uncovered.

ONIONS STUFFED WITH WILD RICE AND SAUSAGE

- 1/4 cup wild rice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 6 large yellow onions
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 cup chopped mushrooms
- 1/2 cup bulk sausage

2 tablespoons fresh chopped parsley
1/2 teaspoon dried sage, crumbled
salt and pepper, to taste
beef or chicken broth

Wash rice in 3 to 4 changes of cold water and remove any foreign particles. Add salt to 3 cups boiling water. Gradually pour in rice so that water does not stop boiling.

Reduce heat, cover and simmer, stirring occasionally with fork, until rice is tender and all water is absorbed, about 30-45 minutes. Meanwhile, remove loose outer skins of onions without cutting off root or stem ends. Add onions to large pot of boiling water. Reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes. Drain and cool.

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Generously butter a deep baking dish. With a sharp knife, cut out stem (top) of onion, leaving root intact. Remove any remaining skin from outside.

Cut out center, leaving shell 1/2-inch thick. Set shells in baking dish. Chop remaining onion, reserve 1/2 cup. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add onion and mushrooms. Saute until golden. Crumble sausage and add to skillet.

Cook until sausage is browned. Transfer to bowl, add rice, parsley, sage, salt and pepper. Fill onions equally. Add enough broth to come halfway up the sides of the onions. Bake for 20 minutes. Spoon some of the broth over before serving.

Cider fondue cooks in microwave

AP — Since my family owns and operates an apple orchard, it shouldn't surprise you that I'm always on the prowl for great apple recipes. For fall's crisp, cool evenings, this fondue dinner, laced with freshly pressed cider and a sprinkling of spice, really hits the spot. By using your microwave oven, you can cook, serve and reheat the fondue all in the same dish. If it cools before you're finished, simply pop the fondue into the microwave oven and

reheat on 50 percent power (medium) for 1 to 2 minutes.

Serve the fondue with juicy apple or pear slices, cubed French or rye bread, steamed pearl onions, cauliflower flowerets, carrot slices, squash cubes, or other fall vegetable dippers.

CIDER-CHEESE FONDUE

- 2 cups shredded Muenster, Cheddar, or Swiss cheese (8 ounces)

- 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg or dried dillweed
- 1/2 cup apple cider, juice, or dry white wine
- Bread cubes, or vegetable or fruit dippers

In a medium mixing bowl combine cheese, flour and nutmeg or dillweed; toss to coat. Set aside.

In a 1-quart microwave-safe casserole cook cider, juice, or wine, uncovered, on 100 percent power

(high) about 1 minute or until hot. Add cheese mixture to hot liquid.

Cook, uncovered, on 50 percent power (medium) for 3 to 5 minutes or until cheese is melted and mixture is hot, stirring every 2 minutes. Serve with bread cubes or vegetable or fruit dippers. Makes 4 servings.

Kid-pleasing sandwich ready in minutes

AP — Sandwiches are a popular pick for packing in the lunch box, and not without reason. A kid-pleasing sandwich can be assembled in minutes.

- 1 spinach leaf
- 2 ounces sliced low-fat bologna

Combine cream cheese, carrot, raisins and walnuts. Spread equal

Fall is like spring. It's a season of beginnings, and renewed commitment to achieving our true potential. For some people, that means cleaning windows, carpets and getting the house shipshape for the winter. For others, it means going back to school, maybe for the first time in years, and acting on goals and dreams.

I'm going to be turning over a new leaf by providing more low fat, low cholesterol recipes for readers. While researching the apple story on the Taste front, I visited the American Heart Association of Michigan office in Lathrup Village and met people like Tony Maher of Oak Park who were forced to change their eating habits and lifestyles after undergoing open heart surgery.

Their stories were a chilling reminder of the danger of an unhealthy diet.

Maher of Oak Park is only 39. He's a diabetic, who had open heart bypass surgery and an angioplasty. Changing his eating habits wasn't

easy, but Maher is making progress. Two years ago he weighed 360 pounds, now he weighs 220, and is still losing weight.

"I feel alive," he said. "I was always sluggish and tired, and never exercised."

Learn more about ways to reduce the fat and cholesterol in your diet at the American Heart Association's eighth annual Food Festival. American Heart Association of Michigan volunteers will be at the following area supermarkets Sept. 19-25 to encourage people to help their heart stay healthy.

Volunteers will be at Kroger, 4395 Orchard Lake Road, Orchard Lake, 626-0022; Kroger, 19855 Twelve Mile Road, Southfield, 559-9829 and Shopping Center Market, 6433 Orchard Lake Road, West Bloomfield, to help shoppers identify low-fat foods. A free refrigerator poster, "Heart Healthy Foods," will be given to those who pledge to reduce their dietary intake.

The theme of the event is "Turn Down Your Fat-O-Stat!" Even if there isn't a participating grocery store in your neighborhood, you can still take the pledge and improve your health today.

"Some people will want to take

the pledge 'cold turkey,' doing all 12 things at once. We recommend that you take a step at a time so that these new habits can be more permanent," said Jean Friend, AHA volunteer and registered dietitian with the Offices of Services to the Aging.

Switch from whole milk to milk that's one percent fat or less. Read the labels on food you buy, noting the grams and kinds of fat. Switch from butter to a margarine that is no more than two grams of saturated fat per tablespoon, and use butter-flavored granules.

Switch to low-fat mayonnaise and use half as much as you normally do. Avoid fried foods whenever possible. Eat five or more fruits and vegetables a day.

Switch to low-fat or fat-free cheeses. Eat only lean cuts of red meat, remove the skin from poultry before it's cooked. Eat bread, cereal, rice and pasta. Eat low-fat breakfast items like English muffins, bagels and whole grain breads. Eat low-fat ice-milk, sherbet and other low-fat desserts. Switch to polyunsaturated and monounsaturated oils such as canola, corn, safflower, sesame, soybean, sunflower and olive oil and use non-stick vegeta-

ble cooking spray.

Save some tomatoes for sauce

AP — Cash in on this year's bumper crop of tomatoes with a cache of zesty homemade tomato sauce. Instead of pulling out the canning jars the way Grandma did, follow the recipe below for freezing.

Divide the sauce into handy portions for making your favorite recipes or for spooning over pasta, pizza, fish, or chicken.

The recipe calls for plum tomatoes, but you can use just about any kind of garden variety tomato, provided the tomatoes are firm and ripe.

FREEZER TOMATO SAUCE

- 6 pounds plum tomatoes or other tomatoes
- 1 1/2 cups chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped celery
- 3 large cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons olive oil or cooking oil
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 1 to 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 fresh red cayenne chili pepper, seeded and finely chopped (1/2 teaspoon), or 1/8 teaspoon ground red pepper (optional)
- 2 tablespoons snipped fresh oregano or 2 teaspoons dried oregano, crushed
- 1 to 2 tablespoons snipped fresh thyme, or 1 to 2 teaspoons dried thyme, crushed

In a large kettle bring 4 inches of water to boiling. Immerse tomatoes in boiling water for 1 minute. Drain in a colander; peel, seed and chop tomatoes. You should have 10 cups.

In the same kettle cook onion, celery and garlic in hot oil about 5 minutes or until tender. Add tomatoes, sugar, salt, pepper and cayenne pepper, if desired. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer, uncovered, about 45 minutes or until desired consistency, stirring occasionally. Add oregano and thyme; simmer, uncovered, for 15 minutes more. Cool slightly.

In a food processor bowl process sauce, one fourth at a time, to desired texture. (Or, put sauce through a food mill.) Place sauce in a bowl set in ice water to cool quickly. Fill freezer containers; seal tightly, label and freeze.

To thaw one portion, remove from freezer container and place in a saucepan. Cook over medium heat until hot, stirring occasionally. (Or, in a 1-quart microwave-safe cas-

serole cook on 100 percent power (high) for 12 to 14 minutes, stirring occasionally.) Makes 3 to 4 pints.

'Trip' with U2 can cost plenty

U2 can make you sing. U2 can make you dance. U2 can also make you go broke.

Go to a concert as a consumer, as we did Wednesday when the Irish quartet rolled Zoo TV Outside Broadcast into the Pontiac Silverdome, and you end up being consumed in the vortex of pocket book plundering.

"I guess it's the price of love... you know it's not cheap," sings Bono on "Ultra Violet (Light My Way)." Neither is one of his shows.

When you add the cost of tickets and ancillaries, such as parking, a T-shirt and something to eat, the damage assessment on the wallet can be in excess of \$60 for one person. And double that figure with a date.

The first jolt, obviously, is the ticket. Ours, like everyone's, was \$30 and bought from a friend who had an extra ducat.

That was only the beginning. Once our Ford Escort rolled into the Dome, preconcert anticipation was quickly brought down to reality. Parking was \$7, two bucks more than the going rate of \$5. For that price, we thought a car wash should be included.

Already, \$37 is spent and we haven't even plunked down in our seat yet.

Since dinner was missed in the mad dash to beat traffic jams en route to the monolithic structure, we stopped by the refreshment area. By stadium concession stand standards, the prices were rather reasonable. We bought a jumbo pretzel and a Diet Coke, which together cost \$3.75.

Another cha-ching, and we ha-

ven't made it to the souvenir stand yet.

The concert T-shirt is a badge of honor, the ultimate symbol that you came, you saw and you were there. A U2 tee has always been a highly sought possession among fans, stemming back to the days when the band's sleeveless black shirts with the white flag on the pocket in the "War" days were the rage.

This tour's clothing line was rather bland by comparison. The shirts come in the basic colors of white and black with a rather nondescript design on the front and tour dates on the back. The cost is \$23. (Outside some bootleg shirts — also 100 percent cotton but made in China — were going for \$10)

Other official merchandise, such as "Achtung Baby" baseball jerseys (\$40), baseball caps (\$20), tank tops (\$20), programs (\$13) and, of course, U2 condoms (\$2) was available.

We settle for a black Zoo TV Tour tee for \$23.

Our seats were on the main floor, but in the 78th row and 100 yards away from the proceedings. For the price of the ticket, we were treated to two opening acts Heroes of Hip-hop and Primus. However, due to the tin-can acoustics, both sounded like mud.

Once U2 hit the stage we were treated to a dazzling multi-media display and a host of great songs.

Of course, we were forced to stand on our \$30 seat for the duration of the two-hour show to get a glimpse of the actual performers onstage. Most of the time, we had to settle for watching Zoo TV on the monitors above the stage.

Was it worth it? Sure, if you're a rabid U2 fan.

Otherwise \$63.75 is a lot of money to watch TV.

Kelly Brown is one half of CIMX-FM's morning tandem whose perky personality helps butter the toast and gets the coffee brewing. So imagine the surprise when the usually ebullient dee jay sounds a bit perturbed on the phone.

Caffeine backlash? A Tim Horton maple glaze not sit well?

Not quite. The 1981 Livonia Churchill graduate gets miffed by criticism the "cutting edge" station has not entirely fulfilled its promise of playing new music by airing enough local music. The co-host of the "Homeboy" show heard 11-11:30 p.m. Sundays hasn't taken some of the knocks to heart, the most recent of which were leveled in the August edition of Monthly Detroit.

"Actually, no I don't take it personally," said Brown, 29, after concluding her usual 6-10 a.m. shift on the air with Anglophile Mike Harrison. "I know I'm doing as much as I can... I work my butt off. Every day I'm working for these guys."

Brown does daily reports on what shows are taking place that evening. She's also been one of the most visible on the local scene, working exhaustive hours (she estimates sometimes up to 70 hours a week) by turning up at local gigs and station-sponsored promotions.

And, of course, there's the "Homeboy" show she hosts, which showcases a half-hour of music from local bands.

"In terms of dee jays, she's not the typical dee jay in that she's very approachable," said Art Lyzak, who operates Lili's in Hamtramck. "She truly loves local music."

The main beef against CIMX-FM has been it hasn't put many local artists (Goobar & the Peas, See Dick Run as exceptions) into regular rotation. Instead, the majority of them have been relegated to the Sunday radio abyss.

But it begs the question: How much is enough?

There are those who argue the station could do better than an obligatory half-hour (extended to one hour once a month for live remotes). Then

there are those who credit CIMX-FM as a catalyst in helping rejuvenate this area's alternative scene, which has been largely ignored by AOR stations in Detroit for years.

Undeniably, local music has become a passion for Brown, who started getting involved after seeing several shows at Lili's in Hamtramck.

"I'd go to Lili's and see bands and I thought they were really good," she said. "The Seattle scene wasn't happening yet and nothing has been happening in Detroit musically for a real long time."

Their struggles somewhat mirror her own. She worked as an administrative assistant for Shearson Lehman Hutton Inc., before deciding to chuck it in a daunting career change to radio.

After graduating from Specs Howard School of Broadcast, Brown worked as an intern at WRIF-FM. When Greg St. James moved over to CIMX-FM in 1990, he invited her join him in the undertaking of the format change.

Brown quickly went from performing administrative tasks to doing on-air reports from local shows at area clubs. Last year, she landed a full-time slot on the morning drive with St. James.

During her 60 to 70 hour work week, sleep is the most difficult spin to Brown's radio career. She said she often takes a nap for a few hours before heading out to a show. Despite that, she's keeps quite a cheerful outlook and is certainly grateful for her break in radio.

"There's people I went to school with who are still doing farm reports in Moose Breath, Ohio," she said.

Good looks: Whose responsibility is it?

Dear Readers,

Some weeks ago, on just one day, there were three talk shows all with the same theme. The theme was the importance men attach to their wives' attractiveness. Two of these shows had on husbands who were unhappy that their wives had lost their good looks by gaining weight. Three plastic surgeons who had operated extensively on their own wives were presented on the other show.

It was clear that all three presentations were meant to be supportive of the "victimized woman point of view." The husbands on the first two show were pretty dorky guys, complaining that they had married beautiful "chicks" with gorgeous figures only to find themselves 10 years later with overweight matrons no longer resembling the Playboy centerfold.

The men said this made them feel disgusted, unloved and tricked. Why, they wondered in unison, had their wives been so meticulous about their appearance before they got married only to sink into decrepitude once the bond became harder to break. After all, they said, one of the main reasons they had chosen these particular women was because their looks "turned them on."

I was distressed because I knew that if I could ignore the sleazy impression these men made, their words made sense. If I buy an expensive dress and it goes limp after one cleaning, I, too, want my money back.

The wives were an unhappy, but

far more sympathetic lot. They all felt very bad about gaining weight and getting sloppy. But, sadly, they were not able to exercise the self-discipline necessary to change. They all believed that one of the factors most affecting their ability to discipline themselves was that their husbands do not love them.

The hosts and the audiences agreed. The collective myth they all tried to perpetuate was that, one, caring about how our spouse looks is superficial; two, if we lack self-discipline and pride in ourselves we still deserve sympathy, understanding and love; three, men who expect their wives to live up to the standard the wives had set before marriage are heartless and demanding; and four, without love we cannot have the self-esteem necessary to be a disciplined person.

I hope that when the issue is spelled out this way, it sounds as whiney to you as it does to me.

The audience on the show with the three plastic surgeons was also sympathetic to the women, even though these three women didn't need nor did they want any sympathy. They had requested and desired the various surgeries that had lifted, tightened and generally made them more youthful. A lot of the audience still wanted to villify the doctors.

The audience, on this show as on the others, accused the men of being overinvested in their wives' appearance. The implication again was that women would not be so superficial about their loved ones. The women's own investment in their appearance was ignored.

Binder's dream comes true with 'Crossing the Bridge'

Mike Binder has always admired Woody Allen.

During his formative years in Birmingham, Binder would write scripts in the hope that he could follow in Allen's footsteps as a writer and director of feature films.

However, before making it in films, Woody Allen had to gain notoriety by working elsewhere in the entertainment industry.

"I knew he had started as a stand-up comedian," Binder said.

So, Binder left Birmingham and made his mark in comedy, doing "The Tonight Show," "Late Night with David Letterman" and a slew of HBO work — but only as a means to an end. His ultimate goal remained to write and produce his own films.

That goal has been reached with the weekend release of Binder's new film "Crossing the Bridge." While "Coupe De Ville" in 1990 was the first of his screenplays to be produced, "Crossing the Bridge" marks

the first time Binder has also occupied the director's chair.

Originally written in 1979 and entitled "The Bridge," it took a great deal of effort to bring Binder's semi-autobiographical story of three friends coming of age in mid-70s Detroit to the big screen. Binder produced the film independent of the major studios, so his vision could remain intact. After "The Bridge" was completed, the stumping for a distributor began, and a taker was found in a rather unusual place.

"We shopped around the studios and eventually sold it to Touchstone Pictures (a division of Disney)," said Binder last week while in town for the film's local premiere. "Jeffrey Katzenberg and Michael Eisner (the two heads who run the Disney studio) watched it, and once they had seen it, they loved it."

"Crossing the Bridge" stars Josh Charles, seen in "Dead Poets Society" and "Don't Tell Mom the Babysitter's Dead," in the role of Mort

Golden, a funny kid who writes TV and movie scripts, but spends most of his time hanging out with his two best friends. Stephen ("The Young Riders") Baldwin plays Denny Morgan, a former high school football hero with family problems, and Jason Gedrick is Tim Reese, a pug-nacious rebel who rounds out the trio.

The three friends spend most of their time cruising in the "War Wagon," an old beat-up Buick Electra. Among their favorite destinations are the strip clubs across the Ambassador Bridge in Canada and a clearing where they drink and smoke marijuana. Eventually, the boys are offered a proposition that involves drugs and another crossing of the bridge but with much higher stakes.

"It really was another time," Binder said about the prominence of alcohol and drugs in the film's plot. "I don't think the movie advocates drinking and drugs. It shows the characters walking away from all that. When you're 19-20-years-

old, you don't realize how quickly you can screw up your life."

The movie features many shots of Detroit area landmarks, including the Ambassador Bridge, Tiger Stadium and Lafayette Coney Island. But the majority of the film, which is set in 1975, was shot around Minneapolis.

"It's really funny because I've worked on this film for so long," Binder said. "I told the producers 'Don't worry, I'll show you where every location is.' We got back here (to Birmingham and Royal Oak) and none of them were there anymore. Between all the strip malls and burger joints, it just didn't have the same feel anymore."

Binder is thrilled that his dream of making movies has become a reality and has no intention of returning to stand-up comedy work. He is currently on location in Ontario working on the follow-up to "Bridge," entitled "Tamakwa." The film is about a reunion of people who went to summer camp together as children.

Another autobiographical work, "Tamakwa" stars Elizabeth Perkins, Diane Lane, Kevin Polisk and Alan Arkin and is scheduled for release next year.

"This is a lot harder work," Binder said, comparing moviemaking to stand-up comedy. "With comedy, you got your answer back immediately as to whether a joke is funny or not. With films, it can sometimes take years. But it's a lot more rewarding."

Woody Allen and Ingmar Bergman have never been shy about working personal problems out on celluloid. Their "Husbands and Wives" and "The Best Intentions," both opening this weekend, offer fans an even greater insight

into what makes these two filmmakers tick.

"Husbands and Wives" will certainly fan the fires of Woody Allen gossip mongers. The story, about marital infidelity complicated by a middle-aged college professor's romantic interest in a 20-year-old, hits even closer to home than the previews hinted at.

More than a simple case of life imitating art, however, this is Allen's strongest, most challenging film since "Crimes and Misdemeanors." It's by far his most personal.

In the first scene, Allen and Mia Farrow, as Columbia writing professor Gabe and wife Judy, are rocked by news that their best friends Jack and Sally (Sidney Pollack and Judy Davis) plan to divorce. Soon we realize that neither of the couples is very happily married.

Allen uses a hand-held camera throughout the film, most wildly in this opening scene where both the characters and the audience are thrown off kilter. The camera pans and zooms across the apartment, unsure where to focus on the frenzied dialogue, as if it's following the action at a sports event.

Had the film continued at this pace, it would have been virtually unwatchable, but cinematographer Carlo DiPalma calms the camera down and settles into a more subtly shaky, documentary-style look at the relationships unraveling and sometimes sewing up again.

Juliette Lewis, so remarkable as the teenager in "Cape Fear," brings a blend of sophistication and prententiousness to Rain, another in a series of "kamikaze women" that Gabe falls for. Judy Davis, brilliant in "Naked Lunch" and "Impromptu" and undeniably the most talented actress working in movies today, punctuates every line with criticism in her role as the hyper-opinionated Sally.

Armchair psychologists will spend hours trying to figure out what went on in Allen's head during the writing and filming of "Husbands and Wives." And as much as

I wanted to forget the overblown scandal while watching the film, it's impossible to separate the cinema from the verite in Allen's latest experiment, where admitted confusion regarding the mysteries of love is worn fully on his sleeve.

Ingmar Bergman officially retired from directing in 1983, but his work still resonates. He wrote the screenplay for "The Best Intentions" (playing Friday through Sunday at the Detroit Film Theatre) in the hope of more fully understanding its subject — the courtship and early married life of his parents, both of whom were by all accounts difficult individuals.

Instead of mounting the director's chair again, Bergman dropped the script into the hands of Bille August. Those who saw his "Pelle the Conqueror" realize that August is practically Bergman reincarnated, so the choice was logical — almost inevitable — that he should direct.

This leads to the ultimate frustration with the aptly named "Best Intentions" because, with all of its beauty and insight into the human spirit, it never takes on a life of its own. The self-absorbed, slightly pompous minister Henrik (Samuel Froler) and his self-absorbed, slightly snobbish bride Anna (Pernilla August) would not survive on the screen without the Bergman name.

When the film does work, it's because Bergman paints such an often unflattering portrait of them. You grow to hate Henrik and Anna for their stubbornness and their wrong moves. Meanwhile, August does effectively convey the squalor of a minister's existence along with the few simple pleasures that keep the couple going.

Like many of Bergman's films, "The Best Intentions" is a downer, administered with an especially heavy hand. As in "Pelle," August tries so hard to mimic the well-modulated tone of Bergman's work that we're too often left with an imitation that's as pale as the faces of its long-suffering characters.

These are daytime talk shows. They are watched primarily by women who stay home during the day. That they might pander to what the media thinks woman who are home in the morning want to hear is understandable. Also, beauty has become to much too great an extent the fulcrum upon which a woman's power rests.

It is understandable that women, including myself resent this. But it

is also true that women, like men, get angry when they feel tricked and we don't love the people we think tricked us.

It is also true that many women complain bitterly about making love to a fat man. The truth that supersedes all of these is that each of us must in the end take responsibility for ourselves, because it is a lie to pretend that someone else should or could take care of us. No

one can give us the discipline we need.

Too often I hear women talk about feeling victimized by men. However, when men say they have been victimized by women, they are cads. That is often not true.

North runs over, and through, Canton

Okay, it's way too early to start talking about North Farmington's football playoff chances — even after Saturday's 35-14 trouncing of Plymouth Canton at North. Raider coach Jim O'Leary just laughs off such queries.

"We've got to get better defensively, especially in the secondary," insists O'Leary. How much better? "A lot better. If we improve our secondary, we'll be a good football team."

Canton coach Bob Khoenle isn't so particular. And playoffs are the furthest thing from his mind — his team is 0-2 and he knows why.

"Our defense . . ." he muttered as he left the North field Saturday. "Football is defense. Sure, we made mistakes on offense, we fumbled the ball away and had that bad snap. But if we stop them

it's still 0-0.

"If you can't play defense, what can you play in football?"

Good question. Khoenle only wishes he had an answer.

The Chiefs were unable to cope with North's running game, from start to finish. On their first series, the Raiders got on the board when Rob Chuba rumbled 52 yards for a touchdown.

Canton never caught up. A promising opening drive ended in disappointment for the Chiefs. After twice converting on fourth down to reach North's 21, Lenny Gardner fumbled and the Raiders' Mike Corridore recovered.

A seven-play drive covering 58 yards at the start of the second quarter gave North its second TD. Todd Anderson did most of the damage, carrying for 34 yards — the last 10 for the score.

Canton did close to within 14-6 with a well-executed 69-yard drive midway through the second quarter. Shankie completed three key passes in the sequence: 21 and 11 yards to Tim Moritz and, on third down, an 8-yarder to Justin Buchhop for the TD.

But North marched right back. The Raiders went 74 yards in eight plays, with Chuba rushing for 38 yards and Anderson 21. Chuba got the TD on a 9-yard run with 43 seconds left in the half to make it 21-6 at the break.

Canton's fortunes — or misfortunes — did not change course in the second half. On their opening possession, Shankie was sacked on fourth down and the Raiders took over at their own 37.

On second down, Anderson swept through left tackle and raced 58 yards to the end zone. On their next possession, the Chiefs

added to their miseries with a punt snap well over Koziol's head. He fell on the ball at the 11, but North was in the end zone again in two plays, this time Dana Darnell scoring on a 5-yard run to make it 35-6.

Canton got a second TD with another strong drive, this one guided by quarterback Scott Valimont. The Chiefs went 80 yards in 14 plays, with Valimont gaining 43 of them. His 1-yard sneak with 11:14 left, and Ryan Ostach's two-point run, made it 35-14.

Anderson gained 133 yards on 15 carries (scoring twice) and Chuba added 102 more on six attempts (also scoring twice).

Canton's Shankie completed 12-of-22 passes for 149 yards and a TD, but was intercepted twice. Gardner had 54 yards rushing on 13 tries. But four turnovers and a bad snap on a punt ruined the Chiefs.

Harrison capitalizes on Salem miscues

dicted. The Hawks, who beat Dearborn Divine Child in overtime the first week, have won 19 consecutive regular-season games and 15 straight overall.

"We'll really have to suck it up (without Cislo), and the guys will have to step it up another notch with their play," Herrington said. "We have two tough games coming in the division, and it's a tough time to have an injury."

Harrison plays Livonia Franklin (2-0) later this week and division favorite Walled Lake Western after that.

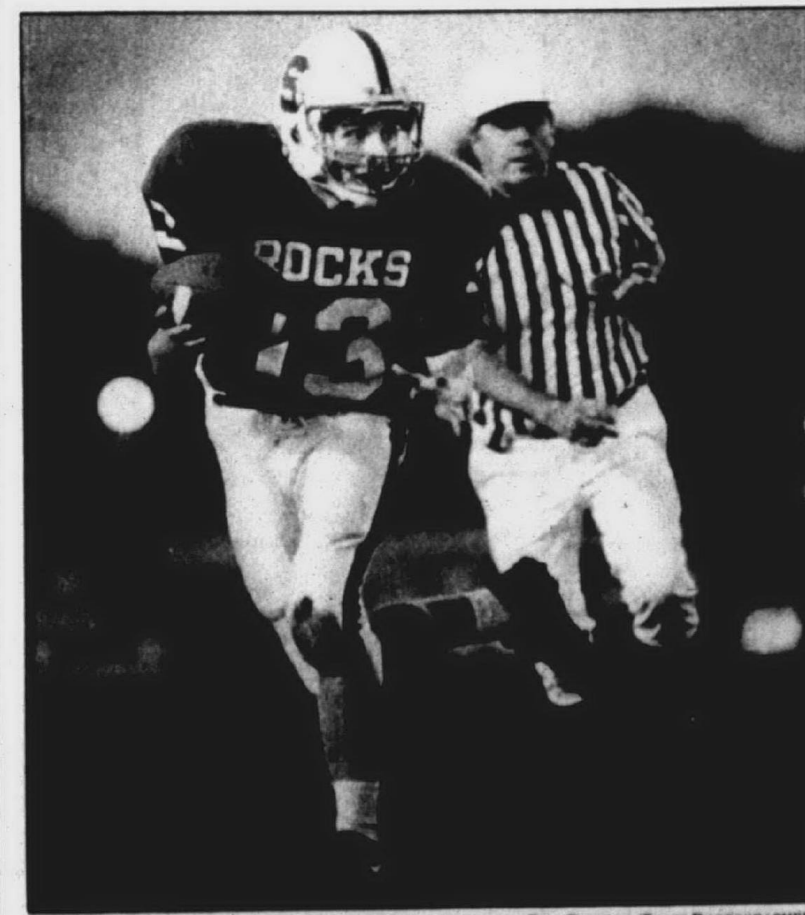

Canton better of No. 2 hoop teams

New tennis coach changes allegiance

Barbara Hanosh not only has to get used to a new job as a head coach, but she also has to develop a new loyalty.

The rookie girls tennis coach at Plymouth Canton takes over for retired Carol Michaels — the coach of her biggest rival while she attended Plymouth Salem from 1982-85.

Hanosh, who won the league title as a fourth singles player her senior year, is happy to have the opportunity to coach one of the Plymouth teams.

"I would have preferred to stay at Salem Rock," Hanosh admitted, "but this is just one big school system and I'm happy to have the chance to coach here. It will be fun when we play Salem."

Canton finished 8-5 last season and lost a total of six players to graduation. Some of the notable losses are the top three singles players — Denise Gildo, Jennifer Davis and Dorothy Pao — and Cyndee Jones, one of the top doubles players.

Junior Ellen Gaston makes the

jump from fourth singles to the No. 1 spot.

"She is a strong player and very determined," Hanosh said. "She knows what she'll be up against and will have to face some top-ranked players."

A new player in the program is sophomore Olive Ikeh, who will be the second singles player.

"She is very quick on her feet," Hanosh said. "She has natural athletic ability and has picked up the skills well."

Senior captains Lynne Cessante and Pam Reynolds will be the Nos. 3 and 4 singles players, respectively. The duo was Canton's second doubles team last season.

Teaming up to make the first doubles team are seniors Anne Zachary and Kelley Blanke, who comprised the third doubles team a year ago.

"I think both are ready to be the first team," Hanosh said. "They communicate with each other well,

and both have a good idea how to play the game."

Seniors Shazia Ahmed and Kelley Caulfield are the second doubles team. Both started practicing with the team late but are getting back to where they should be, Hanosh said.

The last two doubles teams are still up for grabs. The team of senior Kelley Reeber and junior Kara Fiegenschuh or the duo of juniors Noel Kilgore and Jenny Staszal will claim the spots.

The Chiefs, who beat Ypsilanti 5-2 in their first meet, should be a WLAA contender, according to Hanosh.

"We are steady all the way around," she said. "Our top singles players will come across some tough players who are club-trained, but I think we are strong all the way down the line. There isn't a drop off with our team. It should be a good year. The team is energetic and motivated."

Salem takes wait-and-see approach

Plymouth Salem coach Judy Braun refuses to make any predictions about her girls tennis team until she sees the competition.

But who can blame her? The Rocks have lost two of their top three singles players and two of their top doubles players.

"She took the pressure as a freshman well," Braun said. "She had to

play some top-notch players and ran into some troubles, but she did well."

Junior Deepa Sreenivasan moves up from the fourth singles spot to the No. 2 spot.

"She's hitting the ball harder," Braun said. "When you hit to her, it's like hitting against a wall; she'll return everything. She's very tenacious."

Moving from doubles to singles are seniors Kelly Kirkpatrick and Ann Bartalucci, who will be the Nos. 3 and 4 players, respectively.

"As I watch Ana, I think she may end up a better singles player than a doubles player," Braun said. "She is moving better on the court and usually you move better on doubles."

Moving up from second doubles to first is the team of Melissa Kowalis and Natalie Graves.

"They play well together as a team," Braun said. "Both are more

mature this year. Both chose to play doubles together again this season, and they believe they can do well as a team, which is important."

Senior Jin Shin Kwak and sophomore Christey Moyer move from the third doubles spot to the second position.

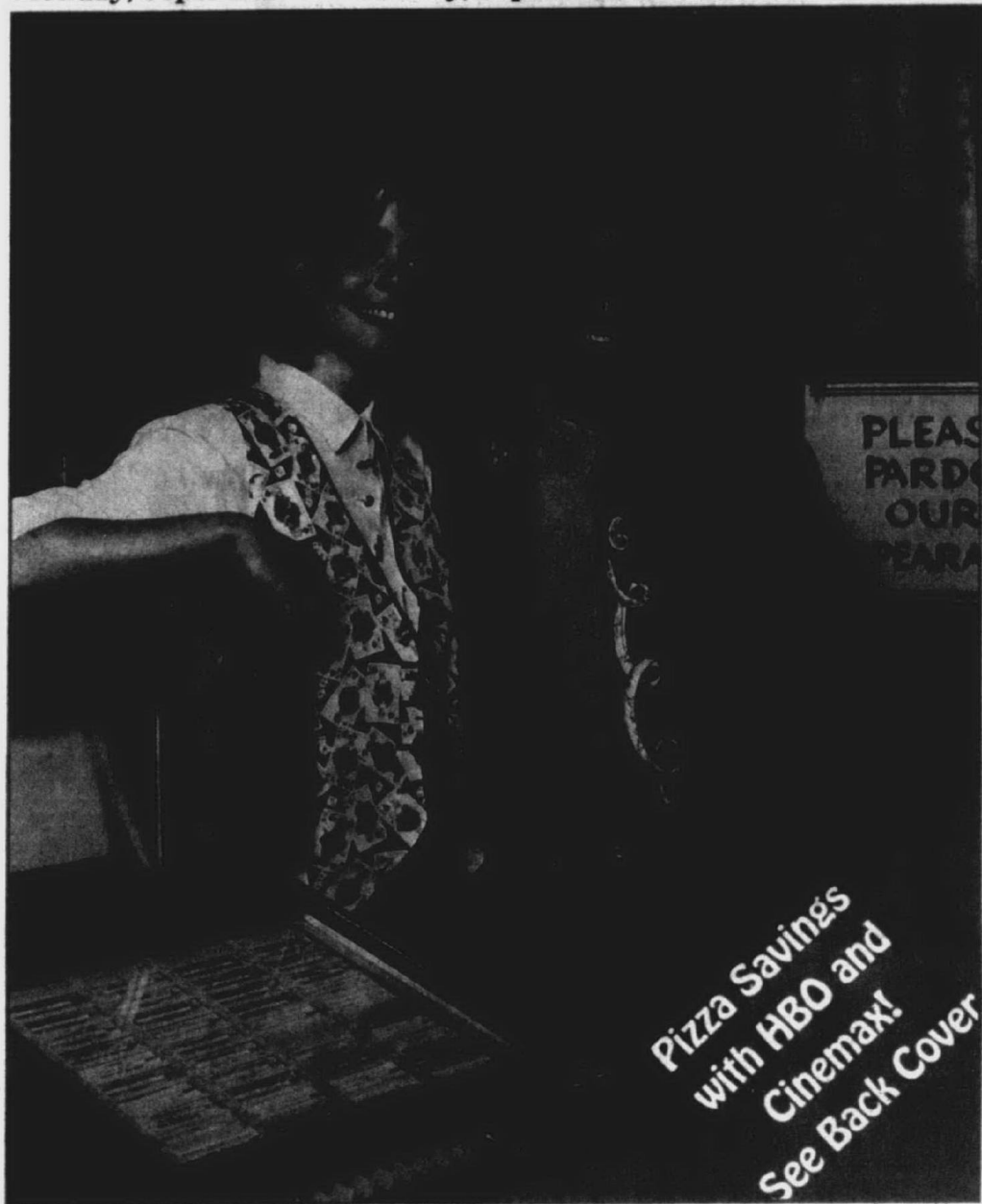

English's second series a hit not to miss

While some TV producers are fond of saying they're making "a little movie" every week, Diane English is not among these cultural effete English the award-winning creator of *Murphy Brown* and the target of election-year criticism for her characters' lack of "family values," is bringing a new comedy to CBS on Monday, Sept. 21.

But don't think of the premiere of English's *Love and War* as a TV show or even a movie. Think of it as an evening at the theater.

Set in Manhattan, *Love and War* has a Gershwin theme and the feel of a sophisticated, 1930s romantic comedy. It features Susan Dey as a just-divorced restaurateur and Jay Thomas as an opinion columnist and 42-year-old bachelor. Despite their differences and their mutual fear of new disappointments in romance, the pair begin to fall in love.

To give us a glimpse of her main characters' souls, English employs the common stage device of having

them turn and speak to the audience—or in this case, the camera.

But besides such calculated theatrical elements, the one-hour premiere episode plays like a play because it was filmed that way—in one pass, with no time for retakes, extra camera angles or flubbed lines. The live-on-film effect was a child of necessity—after a 10-day rehearsal schedule and a day's delay due to union negotiations with the crew, the pilot had to be shot on the first evening of curfew during last spring's Los Angeles riots. Otherwise, English would have lost two of her actors—Dey and co-star Michael Nouri—to other commitments.

At about two o'clock in the afternoon, the manager of the lot that we were shooting on came to us and said, "We're evacuating the lot, and you must all go home."

There was no way we would postpone. So Joel Shukovsky, English's husband and co-producer, negotiated for us, and they allowed

us to shoot our show, only one pass at 4 p.m. At 6:30, everyone had to be in their cars going home."

Even their planned studio audience was unavailable. But a tour bus of 40 teenagers (some with Super Soakers) turned away from *The Dennis Miller Show* was located in time.

"They weren't the people that we expected to respond to our show," English continues, "and yet we got a wonderful response from them."

Besides Thomas, Jack Stein and Dey's Wally Porter, the cast includes Suzie Plakson as Meg, an acerbic sports writer, John Hancock as Ike, the owner of journalists' watering hole The Blue Shamrock, Joel Murray as a sanitation worker who feels at home in the seedy hangout, and Nouri as Dey's ex-husband, a narcissistic actor. Future episodes will include Joanna Gleason as a suburban housewife hired as a Blue Shamrock waitress.

So we went ahead. There's some bouncy camera work here and there that we'll live with. But we kind of considered it a small miracle and are looking forward to going on from there.

From there includes the development of both the romance and The Blue Shamrock, which Wally buys on a kind of self-imposed dare to prove to herself and the world that she's still a success. Her first place, Chez Wally, had to be sold in the divorce settlement.

With top-notch writing and acting and a premium Monday-night time slot, *Love and War*, Wally and Jack and The Blue Shamrock should all be long-running hits.

'Young Musicians' make concerted effort

Assembling more youthful talent than most conductors could shake a stick at, The Disney Channel wisely hands the baton to master movie maestros Henry Mancini and John Williams, among others, for its *Young Musicians Symphony Orchestra*.

In an exclusive Disney premiere on Tuesday, Sept. 15, the music of Gershwin, Mozart and Beethoven is expertly rendered, not by Williams' own Boston Pops Orchestra or Mancini's pals at the Royal Philharmonic, but instead by *wunderkinds* who are fractions of the ages of their professional counterparts.

Williams, whose uplifting *Star Wars* themes were to the '80s what "M-I-C-K-E-Y" was to the '50s, says the film world owes the Mouse a musical tip of the hat.

Dudley Moore, also a composer and conductor, is an added treat as host of the *Young Musicians* special, but the real bright spots are the kids.

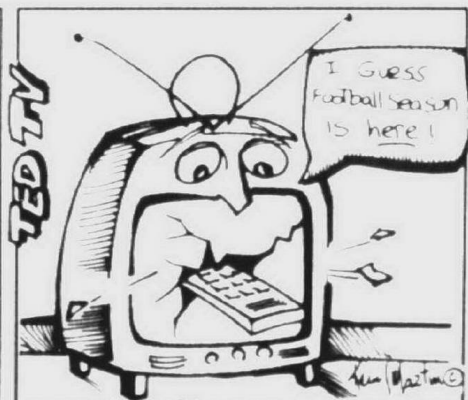

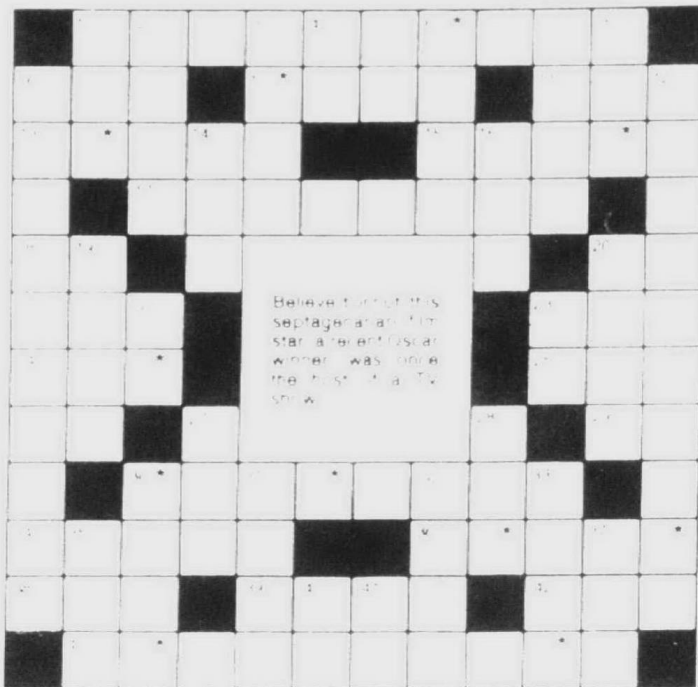

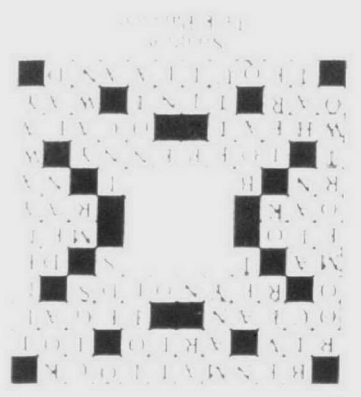
CROSSWORD PUZZLE

I want to know all the facts about him. What is his life in Oklahoma?

Dear Reader: Robert Tyler portrays Trucker McKenzie, a character that is considered to be a romantic hero. Tyler is a native of Stockton, Calif., and is the first actor in his family. While growing up, his main interest was music, and to this day he is an avid rock 'n' roll fan.

After finishing a year of college, Tyler went to New York to pursue a career in theater. He worked a variety of jobs to help pay for acting lessons. Eventually, his acting career took off, and he landed an off-Broadway spot as a would-be Eskimo in the comedy *Almost Romance*, opposite Helen Slater. He also worked with Elizabeth Berkley in *Sorrows and Sins*, an intense drama set during the Vietnam War era.

In June 1988, Tyler was cast as Spence Davies, a short-term but highly visible character on *As the World Turns*. In fact, he actually screen tested for his current role on *Loving* during a rehearsal break from the other soap.
