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Schools mull new tax proposal



The Plymouth Canton schools, which lost a bid to have voters approve a school tax increase in June, are looking to put another tax proposal to the voters. But it wouldn't come until June and after several public hearings.

It's a dirty word to most taxpayers, but Plymouth Canton school board members may be shouting it again real soon.

Millage
School board members set a timetable Monday night for discussing the "potential need for a millage proposal" and they approved the millage rate for this school year which represents a 0.01

percent increase over last year.

Residents attending a public hearing on the increased millage rate only sought clarification. They were not there to protest the change.

The .01 percent increase is the result of school finance officials' decision to carry the number of mills levied to the fourth digit beyond the decimal point rather than just to the second digit, according to Raymond Hoedel, finance director for the district.

The district will levy 90.172 mills this year. A 90.17 millage rate was approved by board resolution in August. An additional .01 mills was added after a public hearing earlier in the year, Hoedel said.

The public hearing Monday pertained to a .0121 increase that will give an added \$24,000 annually to the district, Hoedel said. For a person owning a \$100,000 home, the increase will reflect less than a \$1 increase per year.

"It doesn't seem like much money for a district this size, but every bit helps," Hoedel said.

Plymouth Canton schools spend \$1.4 million per week to stay in business.

After an overwhelming defeat of a

school millage last year, Plymouth Canton board members were left with no choice but to make cuts. Now they must decide if they will go to voters once again for more money.

Board members Monday established a timetable for discussions on budget issues and the potential for another millage election. The public will be invited to attend the study sessions and express their views as the decision is being made, said Roland Thomas, board president.

"I'm glad we're putting this out to the public early," said board member David Artley of the timetable.

Radio doctor dispenses advice

Building rapport with your doctor is vital to your life.

When a patient comes in to talk to a doctor, he or she is open and honest. Dr. William Ross said Tuesday on a live radio show, "House Calls," which is produced by United Home Services in Canton.

Taking lists of questions to your doctor can be a helpful idea, Ross said during the WCAR radio show.

"A doctor should welcome that," he said, adding that some people interview him before they become patients.

And we develop some kind of rapport at that time," said Ross, an associate professor of clinical medicine at Michigan State University Osteopathic College of Medicine.

Today, it's "service, service," that's what we have to do," he said.

When you go to a doctor for the first time, be prepared to list the medication you're taking, your past medical history and the surgical procedures that

you've undergone. And remember, most people who are interviewed are not happy.

It's hard to spend 30 minutes with a doctor, but you can usually do that. The doctor should be able to answer your questions. But if the doctor is not able to answer your questions, it's better to have a long appointment. And if you are the reason she made the appointment.

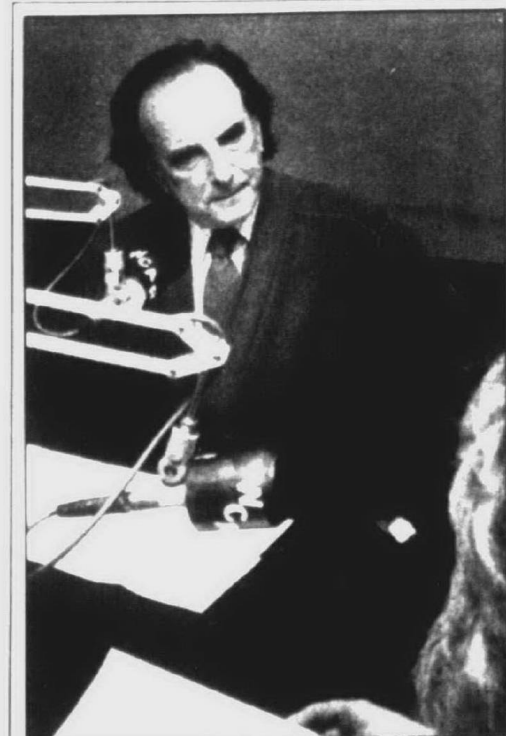
Doctors need to listen more and ask less. That's an important answer, he added.

One of the most common complaints doctors hear is the time spent waiting for doctors. Patients should consider Ross said that people with long genes need immediate care and take procedures.

If an emergency comes on, we have to take it first," Ross added.

And if you've ever wondered whether a doctor is supposed to tell patients of critical or fatal illness, it depends on your doctor.

It's a philosophical question and you have to deal with each patient as an individual," Ross said. There's no rule that you have to tell them.

Skeleton clockmaker takes bare bones approach

From tiny screws to gears to the pendulum, Conrad Bouchard's skeleton clocks are made from scratch.

It's a labor of love, with each creation taking more than 600 hours to complete. He's got five made already and is working on a sixth.

Skeleton clocks were a popular furnishing in England during the 1800s. The clocks are bare, with cut any casing to hide the inner workings of the machineries.

Bouchard is drawn to the simplicity. "It shows the work of a clock master," he said.

The retired General Motors engineer turned his garage into a work-

shop more than 20 years ago. He was looking for a hobby that complemented his career as an engineer. He began his career at General Motors in the late 1960s designing aircraft as the nation talking about the impending war.

The retiree, who is in his early 80s, set up his workshop with great care, buying both tools and paraphernalia that reflects both his interests and his sense of humor.

First, it served as a restoration site for old Rolls-Royces. For the last eight years, it has been a clock shop.

"I got hard to work on cars," Bouchard said. "So I wrote to a man in England eight years ago. He's an old clock maker. He sent

me drawings of skeleton clocks from the early 1800s.

And that sparked his passion. Bouchard is making clocks for each of his two children and four grandchildren. Wife Helen also wants one.

He's in his workshop from about 9 in the morning until 5 in the afternoon, she said. He doesn't let too much interfere with his clock work.

The completed clocks adorn the couple's Birmingham living room and will not be distributed until after Bouchard dies.

"I wouldn't ever think of selling these," he said. "The gears, the screws everything. I make 1 do buy springs. But this is a job of pa-

tience. It all starts with a single sheet of brass.

A brass sheet these days runs at approximately \$300.

Each of the four clocks Bouchard has made is of a different design.

A ball clock relies on a metal ball winding its way through a side to side path that trips timing mechanisms every 30 seconds.

A scissors clock has numerous parts that resemble shears, including the pendulum. The two pendulums are timed to cross each other, like scissors snipping, he said.

The last one completed was a lyre clock with the frame shaped like the creek harp-like instrument.

The newest project is a crystal clock that will have plexiglas look-

ing like cut crystal on the pendulum and face. "It's going to be lovely," said Bouchard, as he scanned the unassembled parts on his work bench.

Each clock piece must first be made, though producing gears isn't an easy task. Some of the larger gears have 100 teeth to them, all must be precisely even and there is no pattern or form to follow. It's basically trial and error.

From there, Bouchard must fit all the pieces together. The least bit of inaccuracy results in a clock that won't run.

Once everything fits well, the clock is taken apart and Bouchard begins the arduous task of polishing each brass piece until it shines.

Each piece is sanded with five different grades of sandpaper, then brass polish is applied and the finishing touch is lacquer.

"The worst part is the finishing and the polishing," Bouchard said. "It's tedious."

The work benches cross the entire back wall of the three-car garage, where three of Bouchard's eight restored Rolls-Royces share the space. Five of the cars were sold.

The benches hold everything from small drill bits to lathes, chisels and other shaping tools are neatly arranged and vises are four at the end of each table.

"It's precision work and you have to be steady. I just hope I can keep this up," Bouchard said.

Memorial fund drive goes slow

Fund raising for the Canton Township veterans memorial is moving along a little slower than planners had hoped.

About \$12,000 of the \$55,800 needed has been collected to date, according to township finance director and project coordinator John Spencer.

"We made a deposit on the granite last week and we're trying to get donations together for the bricks," Spencer said.

Collection canisters placed in local businesses weren't resulting in many donations, Spencer said, so they were removed.

"I think we'll make another effort to contact local businesses for support," he said.

Donors providing \$300 or more can have their names engraved in bricks that will be placed in a walkway around the monument itself.

The monument was originally set to go next to the township administration building, but Spencer said

the project architect is considering another site in Heritage Park that might make it more visible to the general public.

The monument will be dedicated to all local veterans — from the War of 1812 to Operation Desert Storm. Whether serving during peacetime or wartime, all veterans will be remembered, Spencer said.

"Although those serving in the military during the Cold War didn't see battle, they did serve their country and they should be recognized."

Spencer is a former commander of the Canton Veterans of Foreign Wars post. He is coordinating the project with Jim LaGrow of the Plymouth VFW.

"Jim called and said the Plymouth memorial was done and it's time to work on one for Canton," Spencer said.

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Tax plan biased against seniors, opponents say

Opponents say older and middle-class homeowners would get little benefit from Gov. John Engler's Cut & Cap property tax plan, Proposal C, on the ballot.

Proposal C would cap annual property assessment increases at 3 percent and reduce school operating property taxes 30 percent if voters say yes Nov. 3. The state would reimburse local school districts.

The cut would be offset, dollar for dollar, by a reduction in the homestead credit, objected Jim Hudson of the American Association of Retired Persons, AARP, as one of 20 groups in Advance Michigan, which is fighting both Proposals A and C.

The homestead credit is a state income tax rebate to families whose property taxes exceed 1.5 percent of household income. Senior citizens get 100 percent of the excess property tax refunded; others get back 60 percent of the excess from Lansing.

"Among elderly households with incomes below \$75,000 a year, 70 percent would have the same property tax bill as before the cut," Hudson said Monday in a Southfield news conference.

Tax cut dwindles

Economist Ruth Beier, of Michigan State University's Institute for Public Policy and Social Research and a former Treasury official in Gov. Blanchard's administration, gave this example of how "Cut & Cap" would affect a suburban family.

If its total property taxes are \$3,000, two-thirds going to schools, its tax bill would be cut by \$600 (20 percent of \$2,000), but its state income tax rebate would be cut \$300, paring its savings to \$300.

The family also would lose on the federal income tax, said Beier, bringing the benefit to only \$80.

In contrast, businesses and wealthier homeowners would get the full 30 percent cut.

'No free lunch'

Detroit Councilman David Eberhard said Proposal C would obligate the state to reimburse school districts \$1.3 billion a year by 1997.

Folks, there ain't no free lunch. Right now the money's not in the budget," Eberhard said.

Beier added, "The state has no choice but to raise taxes" to pay for Cut & Cap.

Funding reimbursements with an increase in the state income tax would require an income tax rate of 6.3 percent by the year 2002. The current rate is 4.6 percent," she said.

If the Legislature decided against raising the income tax, she added, it would have to increase the single-business tax to 4.55 percent from the current 2.35 percent. Or it would have to seek voter approval to increase the 4 percent sales tax to 8.77 percent.

The group also opposes Proposal A, which would cap assessment increases at 5 percent a year.

Civic groups supporting Advance Michigan are League of Women Voters, AARP, Michigan PTA and Michigan Association of University

Women

Union groups include the Michigan Education Association, AFL-CIO, United Auto Workers and Michigan Federation of Teachers.

Government-related groups include the Michigan Municipal League, Michigan Association of School Boards, various groups of school districts and administrators, and such program beneficiaries as Healthy Mothers-Healthy Babies.

Engler's reply

Gov. Engler's chief economic spokesman, state Treasurer Douglas Roberts, made this case for Proposal C.

- No one said taxes won't be raised. But he is confident the program's cost can be paid by dedicating half the annual 3 percent growth of state revenues.

- There will be little budget growth for state employees, already well paid. State colleges will have to become more efficient or raise tuition.

- Property tax rates on business and wealthy homeowners went up exactly the same amount of millage as for middle- and low-income homeowners, and their taxes all should be cut at the same rate.

- Proposal C should be viewed as an economic growth measure in a state that for 25 years as had unemployment rates higher than the national average. Reducing the tax on capital will encourage business investment, and jobs—in the reverse way that raising taxes has dampened investment and employment.

Edison to build service center

Detroit Edison is building a new service center in Van Buren Township to serve western Wayne County.

The new 4,000-square-foot warehouse, garage and office facility will house repair and line crews serving the area. Ninety employees from the

utility's Livonia and Taylor service centers will move to the new building Dec. 31. Campbell Manix, of Southfield, won a \$3 million construction contract for the facility.

James Connelly, manager of Detroit Edison's Wayne-Montroe Division, said the new service center is

part of company efforts to better serve customers. It will allow employees to better coordinate their efforts, Connelly said.

They're building a smaller warehouse because of a new, just-in-time system of delivering materials and tools, he said.

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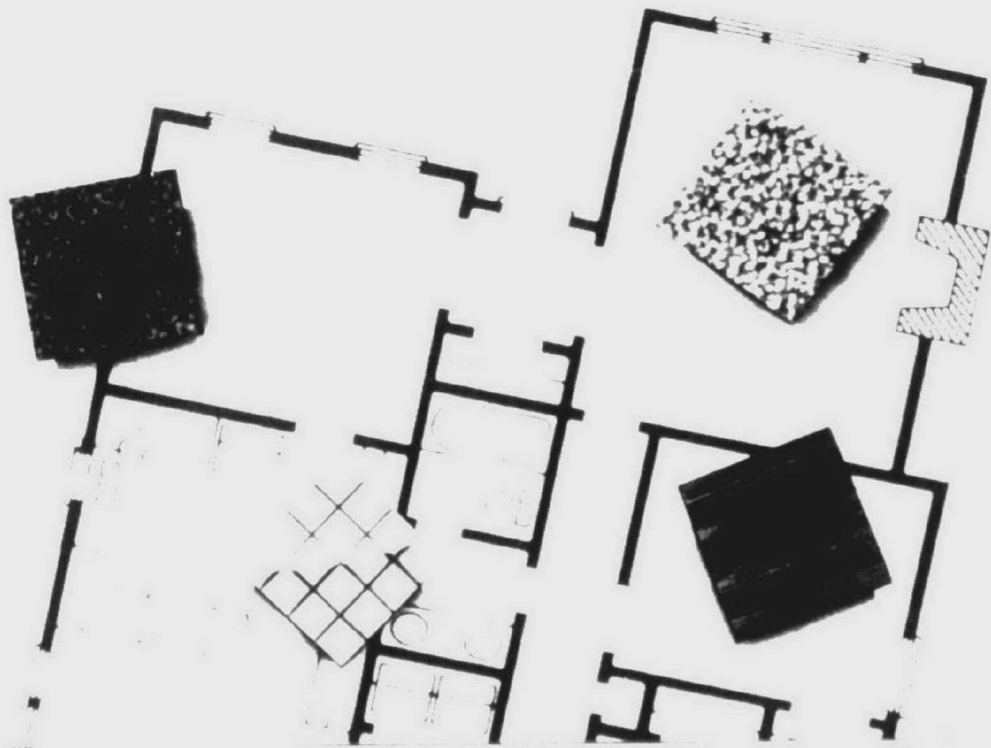
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State chamber fires back at ad attacking Proposal C

The Michigan Chamber of Commerce says that a television commercial attacking Proposal C is "false and misleading."

Proposal C is a proposed amendment to the state Constitution that would cut school operating taxes 30 percent over five years, require that the state reimburse school districts for revenue lost due to the cut, and cap annual property tax assessment increases at 3 percent or inflation, whichever is less.

Proposal C will be on the Nov. 3 general election ballot.

Apparently, the campaign against meaningful property tax re-

lief for homeowners and job providers will be based on the theory that, if you are going to tell a lie, tell a big one," said Rich Studley, the Michigan Chamber's vice president of government relations.

Contrary to the misinformation contained in the commercial, Proposal C will cut and cap property taxes for all property owners. Read Proposal C and you will see that there is no tax shift and no tax increase. Proposal C also has nothing to do with the lottery because it is not a school finance proposal," Studley said.

"Michigan's teacher unions are currently engaged in illegal strikes

that have kept almost 200,000 children out of school. The same teacher unions are behind the campaign against property tax relief. We are confident that voters will see through this smokescreen and vote yes on Proposal C, especially when they learn that the opposition has no alternative but the status quo," Studley concluded.

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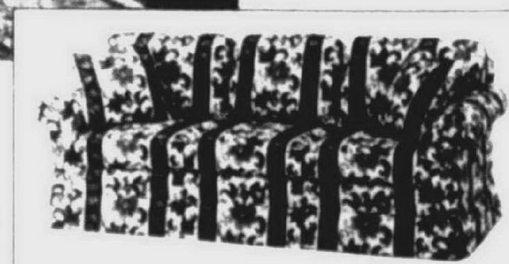
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Local emergency rooms

Everything from scrapes to stabbings

Every day, all kinds of problems walk through the doors of local emergency rooms.

Most people are suffering from relatively minor injuries like cuts, scrapes, fractures or sprains. A recent statewide study, however, found that violence victims are more common in emergency rooms than people injured in car accidents. Two local hospital officials said gunshot wounds and other violent injuries are relatively rare, but a third said they are on the rise.

At St. Mary Hospital in Livonia, the emergency room is far more likely to see an auto accident victim than a shooting or stabbing injury.

At Garden City Hospital, during winter snows, injuries from snowblowers are more common than gunshot injuries, said spokesman Mitch Nimmoor.

At Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills, though, the emergency room is seeing more victims of violence, said spokeswoman Margot Gorchow.

"The last year to year-and-a-half we've seen a dramatic increase in

the number of emergency room visits as a result of violence," said Gorchow. She estimated such visits have risen from one a month to one or two per week, in part because of the closing of nearby Redford Community and Grace hospitals.

The statewide study, conducted by the Michigan Hospital Association, recorded 3,600 emergency room visits during a 24-hour period last October in 46 Michigan hospitals.

Topping the list of ailments were cuts, scrapes and other wounds, which brought 11 percent of all patients to emergency rooms. Respiratory ailments brought another 11 percent; sprains, and strains 7 percent; ear, cold and flu problems 6.5 percent.

Nearly 5 percent of patients were shot, stabbed or assaulted. That compares to 4.5 percent who were accident victims.

Ninety percent of the violence victims were treated at urban hospitals, according to the MHA study.

Cathy Dixon, manager of St. Mary Hospital's emergency unit, said St. Mary participated in the statewide study.

She said minor ailments like sore throats, aches and pains are most common at St. Mary, followed by cardiac arrest and strokes.

"We do get some assaults and violence here but not like the urban areas. That's not the population we have," said Dixon.

"When we do have injuries it's generally from the industrial area around here, the freeways, or, in the summer, sports injuries."

Patients suffering from heart attacks are fairly common, as are stress-related ailments like anxiety attacks or heart attacks, she said.

St. Mary's emergency room averages 80-120 patients per day, she said.

Nimmoor of Garden City Hospital said snowblower accidents are surprisingly common on winter days.

More common reasons for visits to Garden City's emergency room are cardiac distress and sprains, cuts and scrapes, he said.

The hospital's emergency room handles 3,000 patients per year, but few are violence-related, he said.

"We do get a few of those, but they're not that frequent," Nim-

moor said. The Southeast Michigan Hospital Council studied emergency room admissions at 11 hospitals over two days in August and found cuts, abdominal pains and cold and flu symptoms among the most common ailments, said vice-president for public relations Mary Tenniswood.

But the SMHC study, also showed gun shot, stab and drug overdose admissions combined to outnumber heart attacks patients.

Hospital room activity "is getting to be a real window on societal problems," Tenniswood said.

More people are coming to emergency rooms for ailments that are more easily and cheaply treated by family doctors, she said. This is because people are either uninsured, underinsured or their doctors are too busy, she said.

Emergency rooms are also treating more patients with multiple problems, for example, like the homeless diabetic who can't afford to buy the insulin and has no place to go when discharged.

"It's required a lot of effort on the part of hospitals to adjust to these changes," Tenniswood said.

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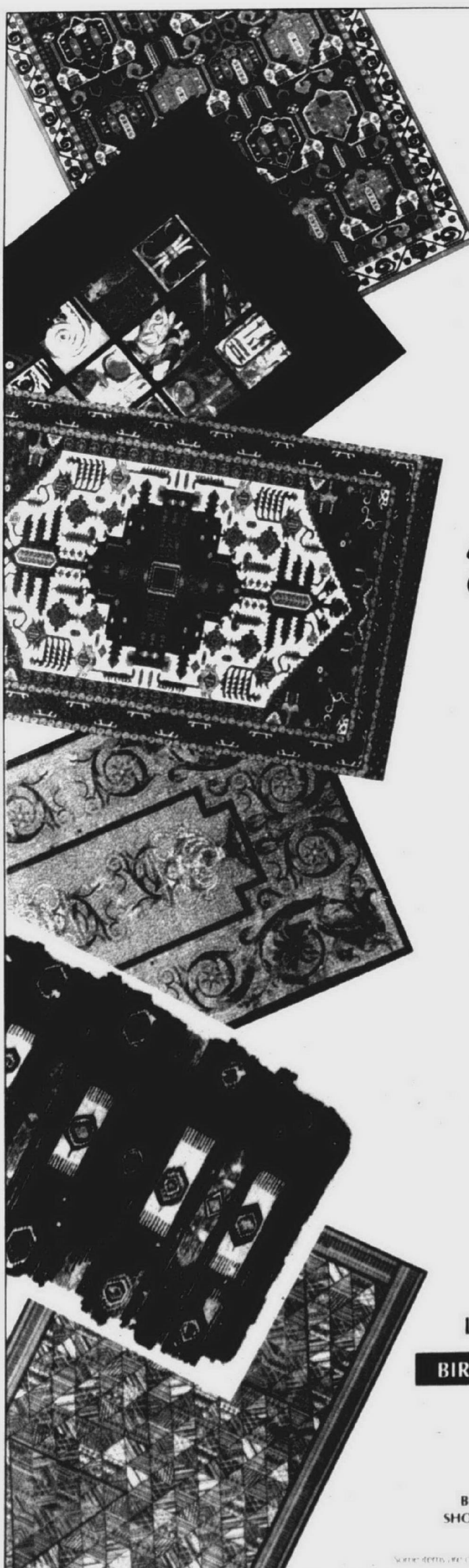

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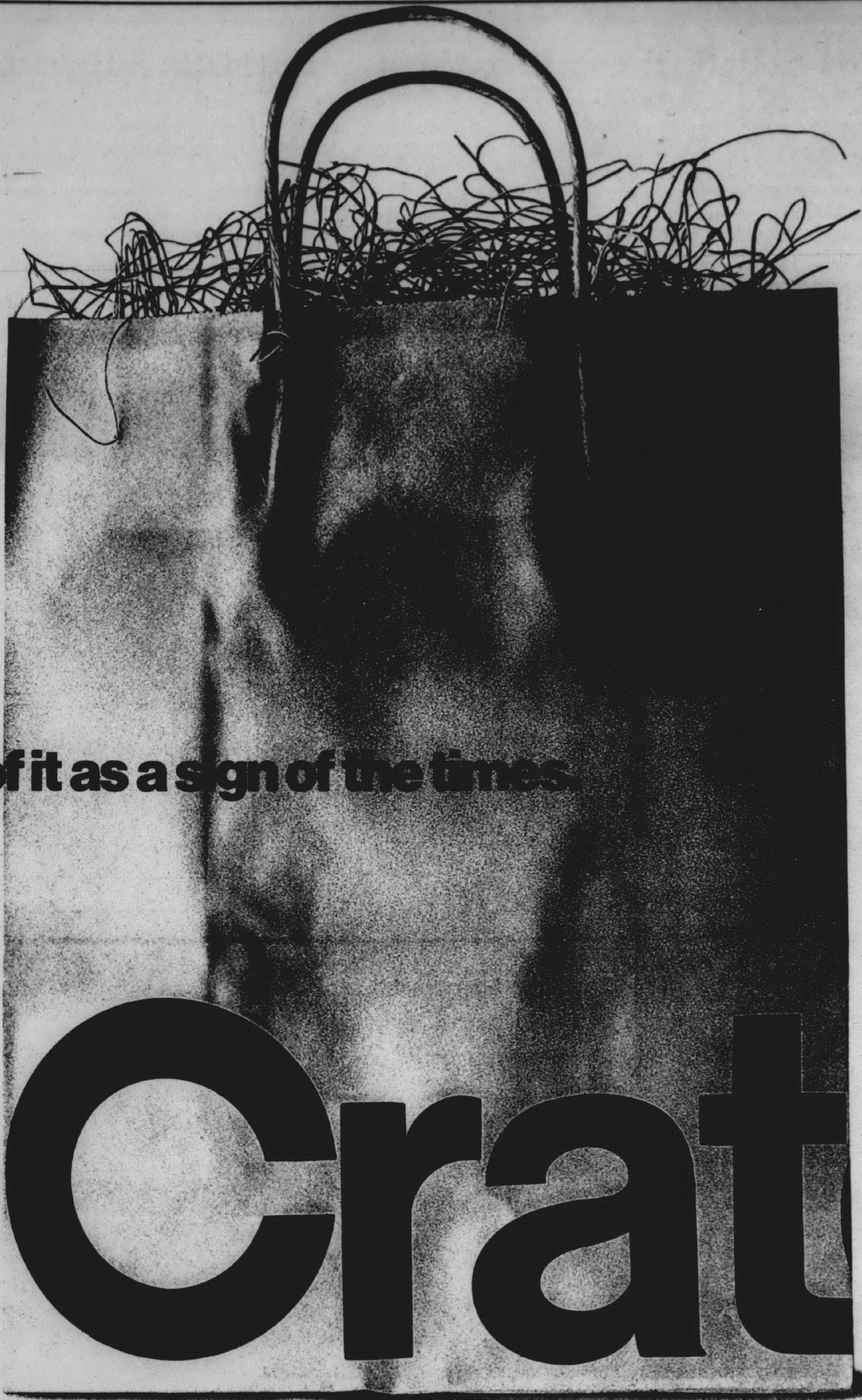

Edsel Ford backs small gas tax hike

Edsel Ford spoke to the Canton Economic Club on Wednesday, telling members he supports a gas tax as a way to pay off the federal deficit. Such a position is different from the formal position of the Ford Motor Co.

Ford Motor Co. has leaned on its subsidiary, Ford Credit, during these tough economic times, according to Edsel B. Ford II during a presentation to a full-house crowd Wednesday at the Canton Economic Club.

"While Ford Motor, along with other automobile manufacturers, has struggled through difficult economic times, Ford Credit is posting record profits," said Ford, the great-grandson of Henry Ford, the founder of Ford Motor Co.

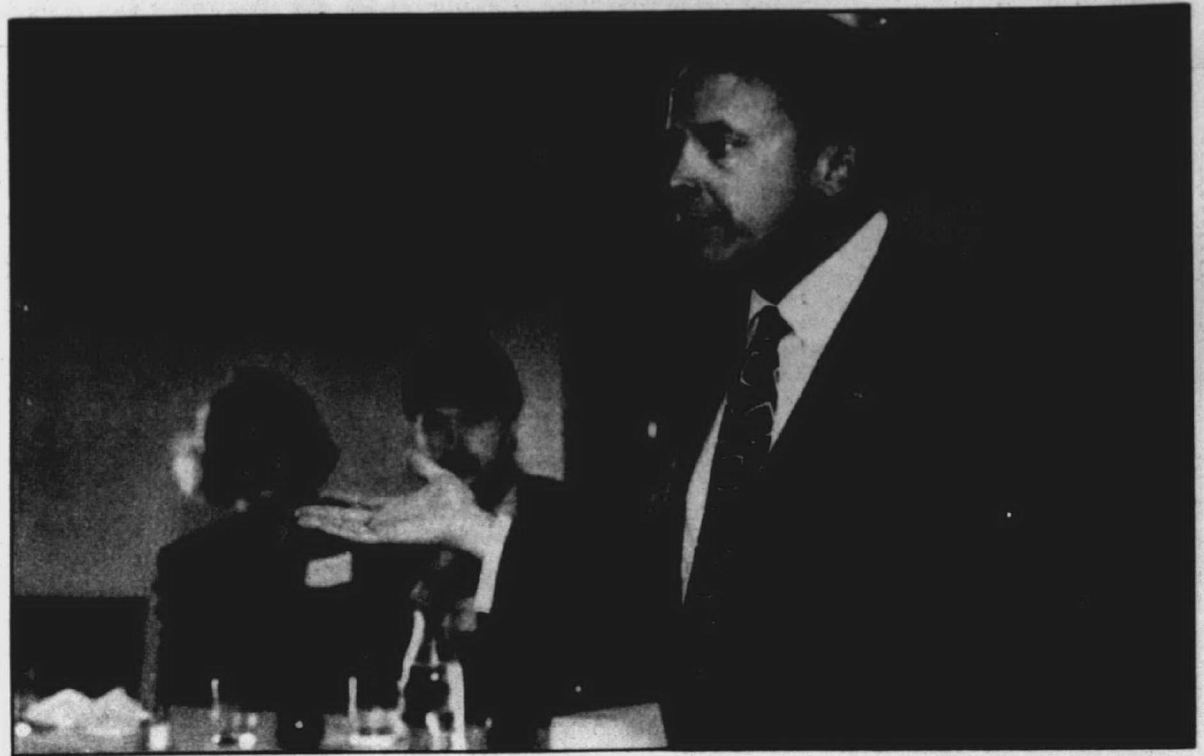
The mission of Ford Credit is twofold, Ford said, to support Ford Motor Co. vehicle sales and to provide a consistent source of earnings to the company.

"Ford Credit's record earnings have helped Ford Motor maintain its aggressive vehicle development program and I'm proud to say that despite some difficult economic times, Ford hasn't cut one product program," said Ford who is president and chief operating officer of Ford Motor Credit and a member of the board of directors of Ford Motor Co.

Ford Credit provides vehicle financing for Ford, Lincoln-Mercury, Ford Truck and affiliated dealers in 23 countries.

Ford Credit finances 77 percent of all Ford Motor Co.'s worldwide factory sales to dealers, finances one out of every three Ford retail sales worldwide conducting transactions in 22 countries and operating in 13 different languages.

Edsel Ford noted, too, that of the top

10-selling vehicles in the U.S. during 1992, five — F-Series truck, Taurus, Explorer, Ranger and Escort — are Ford products.

And the future for Ford Motor looks bright, Ford said, with the presentation of the 1993 Ford Probe, the seven passenger Mercury Villager minivan, the 1993 Ranger pickup and the 1993 Lincoln Mark VIII.

"The '93 Lincoln Mark VIII has been called a hot-rod Lincoln," Ford said. "The aerodynamics will be going head to head with Lexus."

Since sales are based on the health of

the economy, Ford said, he was "pessimistically optimistic" about the economic picture of the country. On one hand, sales will remain slow for the rest of the year and on the other hand, "we're anticipating even lower interest rates and moderate inflation."

Fielding a question from the audience about using gas taxes to help balance the budget, Ford said he would be in favor of the idea as long as the increase was kept to a minimum, like five cents per gallon as opposed to 50 cents per gallon.

Ford said he was happy to speak to

the group because many of the company's employees live in Canton and Plymouth. And based on new-car registration, people in the western suburbs are supportive of Ford products.

Meanwhile, organizers of the Canton Community Foundation, which sponsors the Canton Economic Club, had to turn down loudspeakers in the hallway of Geneva Presbyterian Church where the monthly meetings are held. Apparently, Japanese Mazda employees were trying to learn English and couldn't hear their lessons over Ford's talk.

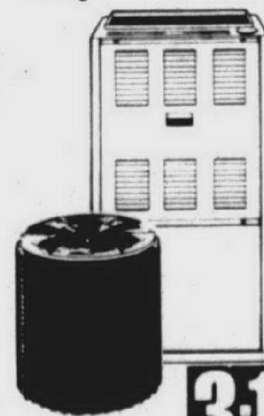

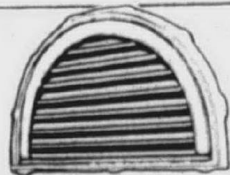

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Steroid abuse

Efforts pumped up to stop it

We've all seen those hard bodies on TV. Men and women with muscles the size of a tree trunk, posing for the crowd. For some they are heroes, and for those folks steroid use is the vehicle to muscles as big as the RenCen.

Steroids are a different kind of drug, a different high than other drugs offer, but the consequences can be just as serious. Just ask the late Lyle Alzado, the former pro football player who died from years of steroid use.

That's why Canton and Plymouth are lucky that the Plymouth-Canton Substance Abuse Task Force and Bally's Vic Tanny are taking aim at steroids.

Right now it's an information campaign, according to John Santomauro, Canton's director of public safety. He's chairman of the drug task force.

Part of the impetus to get the campaign going came from a recently enacted state law that outlawed non-prescription use and distribution of steroids.

Since then, Vic Tanny has posted signs in locker rooms warning that members caught selling, distributing or using the drugs will be prosecuted.

The signs probably won't stop those addicted to pumping past the point at which their body says to stop. But at least they're reminders.

The question here is: Will body builders heed the warnings?

Northville Police Chief Chip Snider, a weight lifter himself, contends that "steroids have permeated to some degree every gym in the metro area."

While an information campaign is the first step toward creating an awareness of the steroid problem, the ultimate solution is in our own minds.

We need to realize that we can't all look like Arnold Schwarzenegger. People come in all sorts of shapes and sizes and, despite the Nike commercials that say "Just Do It," we all can't compete in the Mr. or Mrs. muscle contest of our choice.

Steroid addiction is an addiction to perfection, not a personal perfection, but one beamed to us on cable television. We're taught to accept people from different ethnic, religious and racial backgrounds. And now's the time to learn to accept ourselves, the way our bodies are.

If we do, there will be less abuse of steroids.

Time to pass animal abuse bill

Abusing and torturing small, defenseless animals is such a mean-spirited act that merely hearing or reading about it is enough to make the average person's skin crawl. While the public reaction is strong, the current penalties are dismally weak.

Michigan legislators have a bill before them that could change that, making stiffer penalties and mandatory psychiatric help requirements for people convicted of animal abuse.

Torturing animals currently carries only a misdemeanor charge, meaning that after a conviction the worst a person can expect is 90 days in jail and/or a \$500 fine. That hardly reflects the way society feels toward people who hurt small creatures.

Senate Bill 1092 is a comprehensive package that not only makes the crime a felony rather than the current misdemeanor, but also recognizes animal abuse as a stepping stone to people abuse. Convicts must receive mental health treatment to end violent, anti-social behavior. Penalties also include meaningful community service and up to two years in jail.

Animal abusers also lose the right to animal ownership and can be returned to jail if found to have pets in their possession.

Sponsored by state Sen. Virgil Smith, D-Detroit, and state Sen. Phillip Arthurhultz, R-Whitetail, the measure is endorsed by the Michigan Humane Society.

Humane Society executive director Gary Tiscornia hails the latest proposal as a step in the right direction for animal protection. The

current Michigan act shows cats, dogs and other pets as property, rather than living creatures that feel pain. The current penalties are for hurting others' properties, rather than for hurting the animals themselves.

The Michigan Humane Society also stressed to legislators that people who abuse animals often graduate their torturing techniques to intimidate and maim men and women. During interviews, mass murderer Leslie Williams admitted that he had tortured his girlfriend's cats. Mass murderer Jeffrey Dahmer made similar revelations.

"Laws that protect animals reflect well on society," said Tiscornia. "We're frankly tired of dealing with cases where we investigate and then the person is convicted of a misdemeanor. The animals don't know if they're property or not — the animals only know that they're suffering."

The current Senate legislation will help not only animals but the individuals who have tortured souls and wish to harm those that are smaller than they are, working up the courage to pick on people their own size. A law with felony penalties puts teeth into animal protection and sends a strong signal that torture of any kind will not be tolerated in Michigan.

With the legislative session soon to open, local legislators should be encouraged to act quickly on Senate Bill 1092 and provide stiffer penalties for animal abuse in an attempt to make Michigan a safe place for all living creatures.

Suburbs alter political strategy

Chrysler announced last week it intends to move its world headquarters from urban Highland Park to suburban Auburn Hills. That's a good marker indicating a fundamental and historic shift to the suburbs going on in the country today.

The third century of America's history is going to be a suburban century.

Until 1920 most Americans lived in the countryside. By the 1960 census, the country was evenly divided between rural, urban and suburban. But by 1990, the urban population had declined to just over 30 percent and rural to less than a quarter.

We are now a suburban nation with an inner fringe of city dwellers and an outer fringe of people living in the countryside. The 1990 census, for example, showed Michigan with a majority living in suburbs, which in turn were growing more rapidly than either rural or urban populations.

As William Schneider, a distinguished American historian, points out, our myths mark our demography.

The first century of our history was dominated by the rural myth: the sturdy, self-reliant Jeffersonian farmer.

To escape the hardship of rural life, people began moving to the cities, joining countless immigrants escaping their own hardships in the old country. So arose the urban myth: the city as melting pot, as the great engine of the nation's prosperity and culture.

And now we see the push to the suburbs — to escape the danger and crowding and deteriorating conditions of the city — augmented by suburban pull — cheap land, green yards, single-family "dream houses." The Gallup Poll asked Americans in 1989 where they would like to live; only 19 percent said a city.

And so the suburban myth arose, beginning in the 1950s with TV shows like "Ozzie and

Harriet" and progressing to movies like "E.T."

The components of the myth — property ownership (defined as single-family housing), nuclear family social structures (idealized as two-parent families with children) and concern for safety and security (symbolized by chain link fences and security guards at subdivision entrances) — are highly individualistic and profoundly anti-collectivist.

The reality is even more striking: with home ownership (and the property taxes that accompany it) their main trait, suburbanites are the first dominant demographic group in American history to define themselves as taxpayers.

That's why Democrats have been in so much trouble for so many years of the suburbanization of America.

With their traditional demographic base in the declining cities, their customary philosophy of redistributing wealth is out of synch with the new realities of the suburbs. And with their emphasis on government activism, they have earned the Republican label of "taxers and spenders."

All this is beginning to change. (Next week: The suburban political strategy.) Phil Power is chairman of the company that owns this newspaper.

This 'choice' has destructive consequence

Sexism is a terribly destructive weapon, particularly when it's used as a banner for the Deity. It is just one example of the consequences of the evangelical right's crusade for schools of choice, a cause rapidly being adopted by political candidates desperate to remain in office.

The biggest sham since the Know-Nothings ran a candidate for president, schools of choice is an ill-conceived, fundamentalist Christian crusade to economically gut our public school system, forcing future generations to live by the rules of a militant few.

To believe it couldn't happen would be nice, but dangerously naive.

Susan Stanley, an ambitious, well-groomed, athletic young woman, knows better.

A student at Rochester Hills-based Lutheran High School Northwest, Stanley tried out as a kicker for the football team. And she made it, at least according to the school's coach, athletic director and principal. But Lutheran

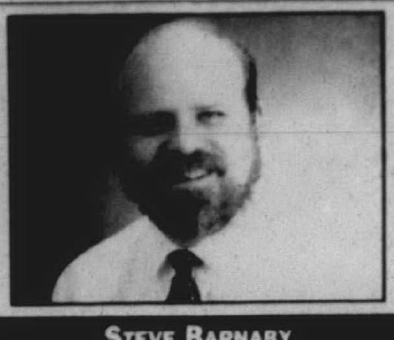
High School Association superintendent John Herzog thought otherwise.

As Herzog points out, it's a private school's prerogative to do what it pleases. True enough. And that's why schools of choice implementation would be a danger to our freedoms.

Many of us feel that women are equal and should be allowed the same opportunities, whether it be on the gridiron or in the boardroom. Herzog obviously feels otherwise, at least when it comes to the gridiron. Under the present system, his beliefs are protected by the doctrine of separation of church and state. If Stanley and her family don't like it, they can leave, no matter how harsh that may seem.

Under a fully developed schools of choice system, persons of Herzog's mind could very well be making such "choices" for those who believe otherwise.

The fundamentalist right is a potent force, as was recently demonstrated during the Republican National Con-

vention. Its goals are no less focused than those of fundamentalist movements in other parts of the world where to survive is to live by the beliefs of the few.

Seemingly harmless, the squeaky-clean fundamentalists scoot around the country, smiling nicely, looking all comers directly in the eye and ex-

pounding the belief that, if only we all shared the same "Christian principles," everything would just be fine. This assumption alone is enough to give any lover of democracy the shivers.

"Christian principles" for many of the fundamentalist right is prayer in schools; men dominating women who must, in turn, fulfill their role as obedient servants; worship of a Christian deity; a ban on women controlling their own bodies; capital punishment; and a government which is impotent in aiding those who are unable to help themselves.

These are values which fundamentalists certainly have a right to foster among themselves. But they are values that many others of us, including many Christians, feel are inappropriate in maintaining Constitutional freedoms if applied to society in general.

Sports have always been a lightning rod for those who wish to deny equality to other groups. For years women were forced to play half-court basketball in

the belief they were physically inferior to men; blacks were banned from professional sports and then forbidden to play certain positions such as quarterback because some people believed that being born black made a person less intelligent.

At the turn of the century, women were forbidden from participating in the Olympic marathon in the mistaken belief they were unable to physically stand the rigors of the long run.

Each of these misguided notions has set back women and blacks in their battle for equality by reinforcing stereotypes.

Let's all of us who so wish pray that, by the turn of century, nice young women like Susan Stanley will be able to strive for any position in life they so desire, unfettered by the "choices" enforced by others.

Parents, preps doubt scout service

■ Several area families paid Jeff Silverman, who claimed to operate a scouting service, to promote their student-athlete children to various colleges but haven't heard from him in months.

As a recruiter for Scouting Report of Michigan, Jeff Silverman promised to help high school athletes find a college scholarship.

But for now, two families who paid \$650 each to contract with Scouting Report are only interested in finding Silverman — who from all accounts moved to California in June.

Plymouth Township residents Pam and Lee Westerhold said they signed up their daughter, Amy Westerhold, a Canton High basketball player, last Jan. 29 after receiving a Scouting Report brochure in the mail.

A Redford Township resident who asked not to be named said she signed up her son, a baseball player at Thurston High, last February after reading an article about Scouting Report in the Observer.

When interviewed last January by the Observer, Silverman said he helps athletes who sign up with Scouting Report get exposure to every college and

university in the country throughout his/her high school career.

Silverman said he would send periodic profiles, complete with statistics and personality traits, and highlight videos. Silverman, 34 at the time of the interview, said he had 28 clients and there's at least "another 1,500 out there."

But the two families said Silverman's correspondence lasted only a couple of months after he received the checks made out in his name and he fell short of his promises.

Silverman worked at a residence on Briarton Street in Farmington Hills but moved to California in June, according to a current resident at the address. A woman at that house, who identified herself as the wife of Silverman's former roommate, told a reporter "if I talk to him (Silverman), I'll tell him you stopped by."

Silverman's mother, a Farmington Hills resident who refused to give her first name, confirmed over the telephone Tuesday night that her son moved to California. She said she did

not know his phone number, occupation or whereabouts in California.

"I sort of lost touch with him," she said. "When I talk to him, I'll let him know you called."

Caught off guard

Amy Westerhold is a senior guard for Canton's undefeated girls basketball team. She was a starter last year when the Chiefs advanced to the Class A semifinals before losing to eventual champion Detroit Martin Luther King.

Westerhold signed up with Scouting Report last January, but the family hasn't seen or heard from Silverman since March, Pam Westerhold said.

The Westerholds used to be able to call Silverman and at least get an answering machine. Lately, the phone just rings. Now she's thinking of calling the Better Business Bureau.

(Pam Westerhold said she called Michigan Bell which confirmed Silverman's Scouting Report phone number has not been disconnected and has been in service since April, 1991.)

"I was getting suspicious this summer simply because Amy was not getting literature from colleges," Pam Westerhold said. "I thought this is her

senior summer, she should get mail now. Getting Amy exposure was our interest. I sent him a schedule two weeks ago and wrote 'We're still waiting, we need the videotape you promised.'"

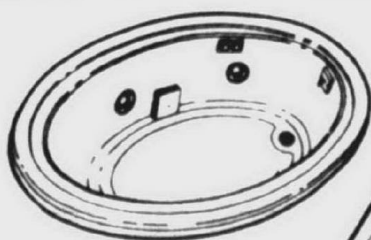

Madonna 4th at challenging tourney

A challenge was expected. When heading to a tournament in which eight of 15 teams are ranked among the top 30 in the NAIA — four in the top 10 — it can be assumed a team will be tested.

Madonna University was. And the Fighting Crusaders handled it well.

They didn't win the Indiana University Purdue University-Indianapolis Volleyball Invitational, but they were in the running. Madonna finished with four wins in six matches to place fourth overall.

Host IUPUI, ranked second nationally, won with a perfect 6-0 record. Northwood Institute, Madonna's chief rival in NAIA District 23 and ranked fourth nationally, was second with a 5-1 mark.

"The competition was great at this tournament," said Crusader coach Jerry Abraham. "At times, I

thought we played our best volleyball of the year. But we have a lot of areas we need to improve. We need to block better, serve harder. Our serving needs to be more offensively oriented."

Madonna placed second in pool play to IUPUI. The Crusaders, ranked 25th in the NAIA prior to the tournament, opened by beating No. 28 Harding University (of Searcy, Ark.) 15-9, 15-13. They followed with a 15-9, 15-10 triumph over Saint Xavier College (Chicago).

In their third pool play match, they lost to IUPUI 15-11, 15-11, but bounced back for a 15-12, 15-5 victory over Milligan College (Milligan, Tenn.). Madonna lost to Huntington College (Montgomery, Ala.) 15-13, 11-15, 15-10 in a battle of second-place finishers in pool play, but turned in an inspired performance against sixth-ranked Universi-

ty of Montevallo (Montevallo, Ala.), winning 15-11, 15-13.

Elena Oparka sparked Madonna with a stellar hitting performance. Oparka delivered 68 kills in the tournament, averaging 5.2 a game while hitting .336. She added one solo block, 11 block assists and 34 digs.

Dana Finley finished with 56 kills (.274, 4.2 per game), five solos and 15 block assists, and a team-best 50 digs, while Tonia Smith had 41 kills (.184, 3.2) and 43 digs. Maureen Paulin contributed 46 digs, and setter Mazie Pilut had 134 assists to kills (11.1 per game).

On Tuesday, Madonna went up against another ranked team — Wayne State, rated 20th in the NCAA's Division II. And again, the Crusaders came away winners, beating the Tartars 15-11, 15-9, 15-12 at Madonna.

The victory did not come easily. Madonna trailed 11-0 in the first game before staging a rally. Finley started it with three consecutive serving aces, and Smith followed with a pair of kills to put the comeback in motion.

Oparka and Finley finished with 13 kills apiece in the match, with Smith adding 10. Smith also had 18 digs; Paulin and Finley had 12 digs each.

Pilut, though, sparked the win, according to Abraham. "I thought she set her best match of the season," he said. "We needed someone to lead the team out there, offensively and defensively, and she did." Pilut finished with 34 assists (11.3 per game).

Madonna improved its record to 10-3. The loss was WSU's first after six-straight wins.

Schoolcraft men win Region XII opener

So Schoolcraft College's men's soccer team did what it had to do — it won, beating Lakeland (Ohio) CC 4-0 Saturday in the Region 12 opener for both teams at Lakeland.

Quick strikes propel Ocelots

In a historical context, this match would not make the top 10 most memorable list.

Both coaches agreed on that point, which seemed surprising, considering how few things they agree upon. Still, no one associated with Schoolcraft College's men's soccer program would argue with the outcome — a 2-0 Ocelot triumph over arch-regional-rival Macomb Community College Wednesday at SC.

The result means that the Ocelots, winners of the last three Region 12 titles, have a leg up on Macomb, the only region team other than SC to travel to the NJCAA Inter-regional Tournament in the past 12 years.

Games between these two teams are always pivotal. Twice in the

past three years, the home-and-home series has decided nothing; the two teams split and did not lose again in the region, forcing a playoff.

And yet, while the drama seems never-yielding, the play Wednesday was not quite what one would hope for in a big game. It was kind of like the Super Bowl, which boasts the two best teams but rarely breeds a good game.

"Both teams looked young," said Macomb coach Mick Lakatos — a point well-taken, since both teams are pretty much rebuilt. "I've seen Schoolcraft and Macomb both play better games than this."

Obviously, Lakatos had more to grieve about. SC fumbled about through the first 20 minutes of the game, giving up nothing but not taking anything, either. "Our directive to our kids was, 'Don't fool

around on defense. Don't take chances back there,'" said Ocelot coach Van Dimitriou.

Dimitriou figured SC was both better and far deeper in talent, particularly at midfield. Problem was, early in the game the Ocelots weren't showing it. "We moved people around until we found the right combination," said Dimitriou.

That meant summoning Nate Stovall — who scored the region-clinching goal against Macomb in last year's playoff — and Sean Ryan from the bench. Both made their presence felt.

With about 15 minutes left in the first half, Stovall sent a pass into Tim Lampi on the right side. Lampi eluded one defender and rifled a shot at goal, which Monarch keeper Craig David just deflected over his head. No matter, the free ball bounced behind him, and Matt Lividini pounced on it and put it in

to give SC a 1-0 lead.

It stayed that way less than two minutes. Again, it was Stovall starting the play, springing Andy Cosenza on a breakaway at midfield. Cosenza did the rest, outrunning one defender and faking David to the ground before burying his shot.

"The last 15, 20 minutes of the first half was about as good as we can play," Dimitriou said, adding, "Today was not one of our better days. I thought we should have played better than we did against them."

The second half was one missed opportunity after another, by both teams. Fortunately for SC, scoring was not urgent.

Now comes a period of adjustments for both teams, trying to improve without looking too far into the future. They meet again at Macomb Oct. 14.

Report, Silverman made a profile of Westerhold. The profile included the player's picture, statistics and personality traits. Silverman sent 50 copies of the profile to the Westerhold home to be proofread, Pam Westerhold said.

"I thought it was too flowery; it wasn't all Amy," Pam Westerhold said. "He said she was an 85-percent free throw shooter, and I don't know where he got that. He wrote that 'there are far too many awards in this young women's life to name here.' That's not true. He said she carried a 3.4 grade-point average when we told him 3.2 or 3.3. And he mentioned she would be 'very helpful to academic underachievers.'"

It also had a typo. "It looked poor," she said. "I sent it back, circled the error and said 'correct this.' I never got anything back from him."

Pam Westerhold said they left messages on Silverman's answering machine to have him come out and videotape the AAU state championship last March at Canton High School. But he never showed, she said.

Pam Westerhold said Silverman promised her daughter \$50 for each friend she convinced to sign up with Scouting Report.

"I'm glad she didn't (give brochures out); you'd just feel bad," Pam Westerhold said. "We'd like

our money back; that would be it at this point."

A convincing story

After the Scouting Report story appeared in the Observer, the Redford Township resident thought the service was a good idea but her husband didn't.

"Our first contact (with Silverman) was by phone. I had him come out to the house and that's when my other half (her husband) had a fit," the woman said. "My husband was completely against it. I just figured, well, it's going to work out and tried to prove he was wrong."

So the woman and her mother split the \$650 cost to sign up the Thurston athlete, who was a sophomore on the Thurston baseball team.

The woman said Silverman communicated by telephone for two to three months, but he never showed up again in person. No personal profile was made, and Silverman never attended a Thurston baseball game, she said.

"The end of the season came up and I wanted to give him some stats, but I was never able to get a hold of him," she said. "There used to be a recorder on at his home and he'd always call back. I feel like I really got screwed."

Not all believed

Erin Lucas, a junior guard at Livonia Ladywood, talked highly of Silverman in the Observer article: "I talk to Jeff about once a week, and he makes sure my grade point average is up and stays on top of us," she was quoted as saying. "Without this, I could not get as much exposure, writing colleges on my own."

Lucas, who transferred to Ladywood from West Bloomfield High, had a different story to tell Tuesday night.

"He (Silverman) stopped calling me in February," she said. Lucas said she's almost positive her parents did not pay the full \$650 to sign up. Lucas' parents are vacationing in Alaska and were unavailable for comment.

"My dad was sold on it for a while but he decided it wasn't worth it," she said. "He (Silverman) must have broken a few hearts."

One of Lucas' teammates, Tracy Prybylski, didn't join Scouting Report, but Silverman called her father, Paul Prybylski, several times on the phone.

"I told him I didn't believe in those things; it wasn't a big bang for the buck," Paul Prybylski said. "He wanted to come over and show me this, but it never got past the phone calls."

"They should find themselves well up that board (displayed in the gym) and should represent us either as a team or individuals at the state meet," Krafchak said. "Hopefully, they will reach their potential because they deserve it."

The Rocks also return junior Katie Heid, sophomore Kim Czaplicki,

senior Kelly Morante, sophomore Sarah Hamilton and junior Julie Cutting, who had foot surgery in late July and is just starting to work into shape.

Joining the team this year are first-year runners Courtney Sheldon (sophomore) and Lynda Sebestyen (junior). Hamilton was 40th (21:56), Sebestyen 45th (22:12) and Sheldon 49th (22:18) at West Bloomfield.

"We're really deep; we can go down to nine kids and compete with almost anybody," Krafchak said.

The freshman class includes Cara Okopyn, Kimberly Sheldon, Liz Barrett (the daughter of Farmington High coach John Barrett) and Jennifer Grunas.

Salem was fourth in the WLAA behind North Farmington, Livonia Stevenson and Walled Lake Western and should be in the chase again this year.

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


"I think it's a rare opportunity for people in the community to see something that's not produced a lot," said Sally Dubats, director of "Veronica's Room," the season-opener for the 46th PTG season.

There was stiff competition at the auditions, and the four cast members — Kathleen Lietz, Francine Hachem, Dave Price and David McKnight — have been great to work with, said Dubats, a Madison Heights resident.

"I think everyone knew how much talent was in the auditions." The play gives actors an opportunity to explore humanity's darker side, going from sweetness to evil.

"This play gives them an opportunity to do both." Other PTG productions for the 1992-93 season will be Thornton Wilder's "Matchmaker," the musical "Fiddler on the Roof" and the British farce "Noises Off."

"I think they were looking for something a little different for this season," said Dubats, artistic director for West End Productions of Livonia. "It has more tension than, say, an Agatha Christie."

The thriller involves an apparently charming elderly couple and their ef-

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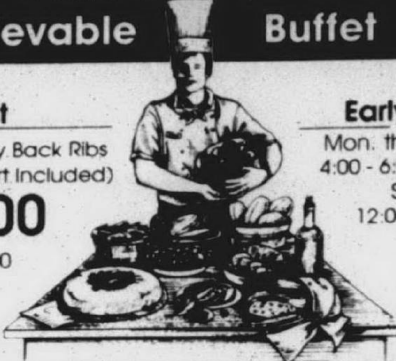

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Low blood supply spurs Red Cross to call on donors

While the nation is rallying to help Hurricane Andrew victims, local health administrators are asking for help in Michigan.

The Southeastern Michigan Blood Services Region of the American Red Cross said the area desperately needs donors. Everytime someone donates blood it's processed into three components, red blood cells, plasma and platelets, which allows

hospitals to give patients the needed component.

Inventories were depleted by a series of medical emergencies that began last week, requiring large amounts of platelets, which are most often used by Leukemia and cancer patients.

"At the time we were already quite low with inventory of platelets and Wednesday we had to rush imports of platelets from around the country, according to Mark Cornillie, a Red Cross spokesman.

"We tend to have blood shortages just about every summer, but it is unusual that we become urgent on platelets first."

While all the emergency needs were met last week, there could be a problem if there are additional emergencies requiring large amounts of platelets, according to Dr. A. William Shafer, principal officer for the Red Cross Blood Program in Southeastern Michigan.

"A sudden demand could wipe out our safety net," he said.

The Red Cross is asking donors to call 1-800-582-4383 and schedule an appointment.

"We're trying to open various centers and extend hours and make things as convenient as possible for them to donate," Cornillie said. "We prefer people to call so we can schedule them."

Several of the centers will be open on Sunday in response to the shortage.

Meanwhile, mobil gas dealers are trying

to meet the needs of disabled children. Some 150 dealers in the Detroit, Lansing and Grand Rapids area will be participating in a program to help children in need of physical rehabilitation at Beaumont Hospital's Pediatric Rehabilitation Center.

Between September 17 and October 3 participating dealers will donate two cents per gallon for all Super Unleaded Gasoline sold between Sept. 17 and Oct. 3. They hope to raise \$40,000.

Toys needed by hurricane victims

A furry friend to curl up with at night.

That is the need local residents are working to meet for the young-victims of Hurricane Andrew.

Stuffed animals were collected from local children and school workers in the Plymouth-Canton district.

Mary Ann Walsh is packing up

four more boxes now to send to her sister in Florida.

"I don't go through the Red Cross because my sister can see that the children get the toys right away," Walsh said.

Walsh's sister was evacuated from her home in Ponom Beach just before Andrew hit land. The evacuation center she went to — a

hotel — lost the top two floors. Her home was undamaged.

When she returned to her home two days later, she began volunteering with the Red Cross near Homestead — one of the hardest hit communities, Walsh said.

When Walsh heard of the need for children's toys, she began a collection.

"I'm not sure if I'm going to send any more out, but I'll wait and see what my sister suggests I do," Walsh said.

Walsh's son also lives in Florida, but he also escaped the devastation.

Friends and co-workers have chipped in to help Walsh pay for shipping the toys to the children of Homestead.

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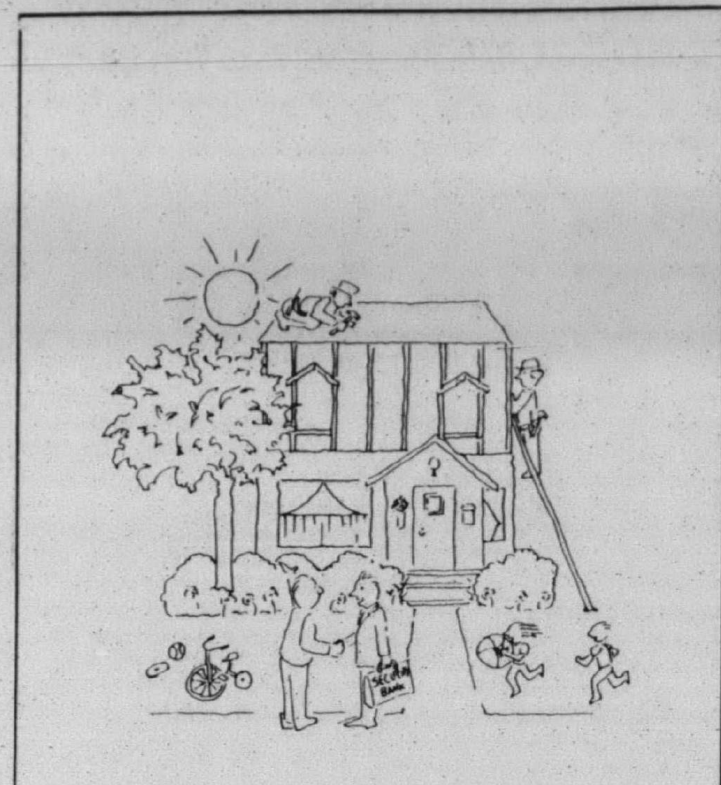

Poll shows support for ban on tobacco sales to children

Seventy-three percent of Michigan voters support banning the sale of tobacco products through vending machines and 66 percent support prohibiting tobacco companies from giving away free samples, according to an American Lung Association/American Cancer Society-sponsored survey released earlier this week.

Larry A. McAllister, chief executive officer of the American Lung Association of Michigan, at a news conference called on legislators to "take a stand now to stop the flow of tobacco products to the hands of our children."

Citing the strong public support for measures which would help to protect the health of minors, McAllister called for support of bills to ban free distribution of tobacco samples and also to restrict access to vending machines.

"The state of Michigan must now enforce the laws it has on the books. We must also pass stricter laws prohibiting access - or we will pay for our indifference with lives, and also with the loss of federal dollars," he said.

In explaining the loss of federal dollars if enforcement is not stepped up, Ron Davis, M.D., chief medical officer of Michigan's Public Health Department, noted, "With new federal regulations, we now risk losing between 10 and 40 percent of

Michigan's nearly \$54 million of federal drug education money if we do not have laws in place that effectively prohibit the sale and distribution of tobacco products to those under the age of 18. We must confront the fact that current tobacco control laws are simply not working."

Federal drug education funding is threatened as a result of the "Synar Amendment," a recent amendment to the Federal Alcohol Drug Abuse and Mental Health Administration (ADAMHA) block grant which requires states to pass laws that prevent minors from purchasing tobacco products.

Further results of the Lung Association/Cancer Society survey indicate that 63 percent of Michigan voters would favor licensing tobacco retailers just as is currently required of those who sell alcohol.

"Each day, more than 3,000 American teenagers start smoking, and we know that the addictive qualities of tobacco, not unlike those of heroin and cocaine, will keep many of these youngsters 'hooked' for decades," noted Kathy Johnson, spokesperson for the American Cancer Society's Michigan Division, Inc.

"Ninety percent of today's smokers began their addiction as children and adolescents and three bills awaiting Senate action are de-

signed to help stop the flow of tobacco products to minors," Johnson added.

Rep. Mary Brown, D-Kalamazoo, is sponsoring a bill that will limit tobacco vending machines to places where children cannot gain access. Rep. Jessie Dalman, R-Holland, is sponsoring a bill that will prohibit the free distribution of tobacco products through the mail and Rep. Michael Bennane, D-Detroit, has put forward a bill that will prohibit the sale of single cigarettes.

Sen. John Pridnia, R-Oscoda, chair of the Senate Health Policy Committee, is spearheading the passage of these bills through the Senate.

Other survey results today showed overwhelming public support for establishing smoke-free environments. According to Albert Sparrow, M.D., a pediatric cardiologist and chair of the Michigan Coalition on Smoking OR Health, "Ninety percent of the public supports a ban on smoking in all K-12 schools, which really shows that the public has come a long way in understanding the health hazards related to being exposed to second-hand smoke."

Eighty-one percent of those surveyed felt that private businesses should be required, at a minimum, to separate smokers from non-smokers at the worksite.

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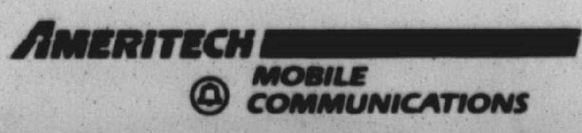

Work starts on new senior apartments

The site where automotive pioneer Henry Ford was born will soon become home to one of America's most comprehensive life care retirement communities.

Ground breaking for Henry Ford Village, which will be built over the next five years on a 35-acre parcel of farm land at the southeast corner of Ford Road and Greenfield Avenue in Dearborn, was held Wednesday.

It is here that Henry Ford was born in 1863 and where he spent his boyhood years. Henry Ford Village's one- and two-bedroom apartments will accommodate more than 1,000 independent residents taking advantage of the community's 24-hour security, on-site health care, daily dining and activities.

The new community is a joint venture of Ford Motor Land Development Corp. and Retirement & Health Services Corp., a development firm that built and manages a

1,500-resident community near Baltimore, that is often cited as the most progressive life care community in America.

An information center has opened on the site and more than 200 people already have made deposits, according to John Erickson, president of Retirement & Health Services Corp.

"We're very pleased with the strong interest that has been shown in this development and are confident it will be a great success," Erickson said.

"Construction on the first phase will begin this fall and the first units will be open by September 1993," Erickson added.

"We wanted the ultimate use of the original Ford family farm to be a fitting tribute to Henry Ford's lifetime of contributions," said Wayne Doran, Ford Land chairman.

The community will have three dining areas for independent residents, a chapel, medical center, its own in-house television channel for televising community information and events, on-site college courses, on-site banking, shopping, hair salons and a myriad of activities reflecting the varied interests of the community's residents.

Like many life care communities popular throughout America, Henry Ford Village plans to offer several levels of personal and medical services so that residents will not have to move if their health needs change.

Although the community's daily emphasis will be on its active, independent lifestyle, on-site nursing care will be provided to meet the short- or long-term needs of residents.

Home health care will be avail-

able to residents should they need temporary care in their apartments following a hospitalization. The Village's on-site medical center will be staffed by physicians who specialize in geriatrics medicine.

Visiting specialists such as cardiologists, ophthalmologists and orthopedic surgeons will also hold regular office hours in the medical center.

Refundable entrance deposits will range from \$63,000 for studio apartments to \$79,000 for one-bedroom apartments and \$135,000 for two-bedroom, two-bath apartments.

Henry Ford Village will become an integral part of the 2,360-acre Fairlane community being developed in Dearborn and adjacent Allen Park by Ford Motor Land Development Corp.

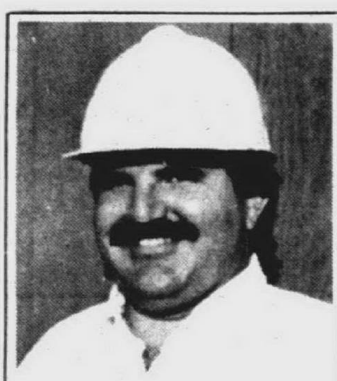

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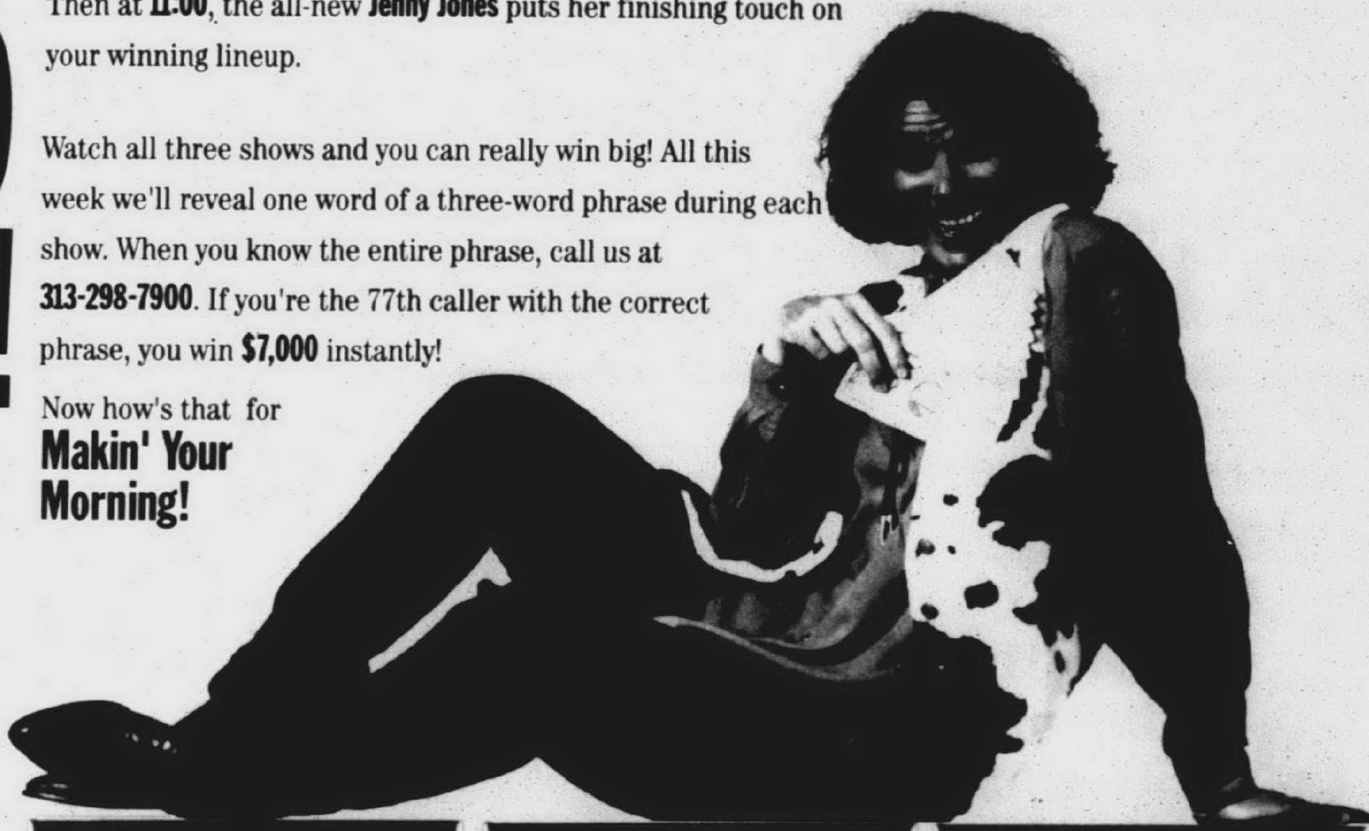

Contract talks challenge Chrysler exec

■ A Plymouth Township man who has risen through the managerial ranks will lead Chrysler's bargaining team in negotiations with the UAW. He previews some of the issues in looking at the industry.

It's no different in the auto industry than any other business nowadays. Health care costs and flexibility in the workforce are major concerns of management.

Thomas Gallagher, a Plymouth Township resident, knows all about it.

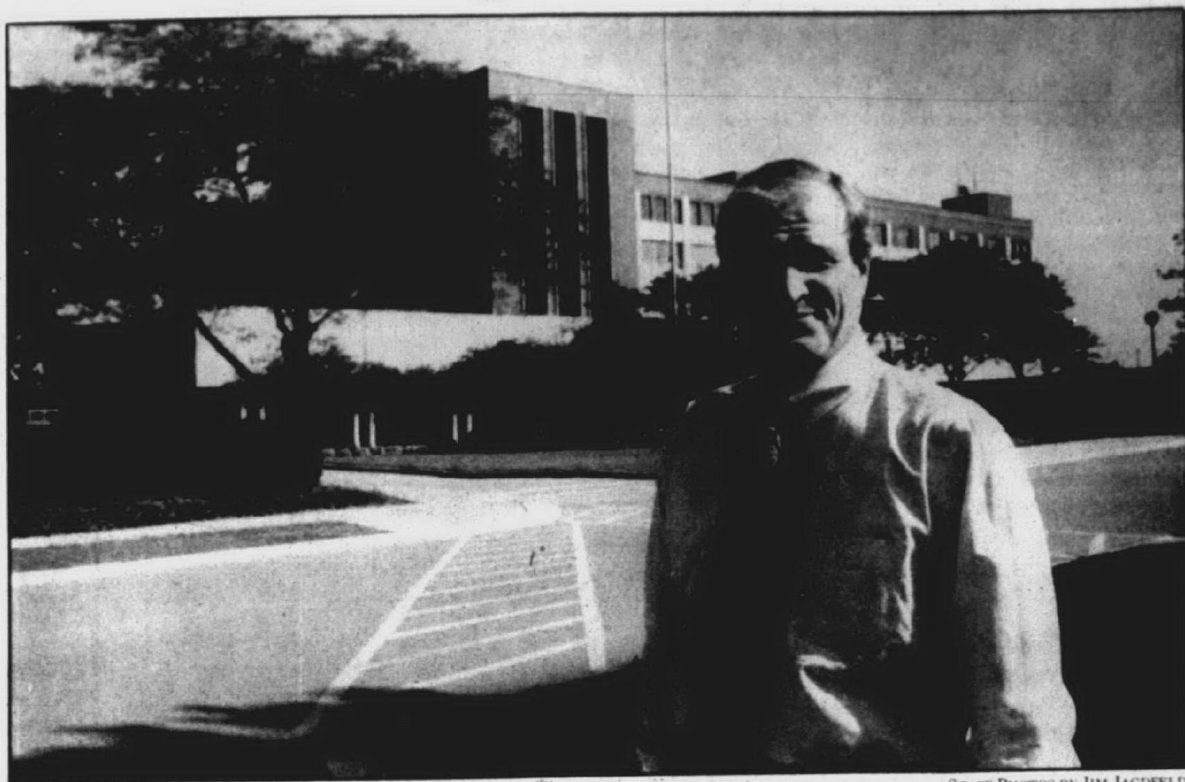
Gallagher, recently promoted to vice president for employee relations at Chrysler Corp., will head the automaker's bargaining team next year in contract negotiations with the UAW.

"Health care, no question about it, is one of the major competitive disadvantages we have in the auto industry," he said. "We use a figure that it costs \$1,000 per car. You have to find ways to address that."

And about jobs in the plant? "We have to find ways to be leaner, take out waste, do a better job, change the process," Gallagher said. "If we don't... we won't be able to sell products and be competitive in the market place."

Gallagher, 50, joined Chrysler in 1976 after working as a lawyer with the National Labor Relations Board. He has served as director of employees benefits, director of human resources operations and director of union relations at Chrysler.

"Labor is the arena which I enjoy the most," he said. "It's an arena where you get action. Maybe interaction is a better word. You have give and take. You work hard to solve complicated issues."

Gallagher has worked both sides of the street. He was a union building representative while teaching in Detroit.

He also brings academic credentials — B.A. and law degrees from Wayne State University, an M.B.A. from Michigan State and advanced management certificates from Harvard Business School and MSU — to the job.

Fallout on health care from the political arena this year will have an impact

on negotiations next, Gallagher said.

He expects that co-payment of premiums, deductibles before third-party payments, and use of directed health maintenance organizations will come up in bargaining.

"To be sure, no one likes to pay if they can get it free," Gallagher said. "You're hopefully able to demonstrate through experience... that's not really a horror story."

Chrysler, the smallest of the domestic auto manufacturers and one that's spent considerable time on the financial roller coaster, has taken the lead in negotiating flexible work rules, Gallagher said.

"I see the need to be even more flexible, working together to develop more ways to produce quality," he said. But

Earlier retirement savings compound to better return

Progress begins with getting a clear view of the obstacles."

Our financial profile this month focuses on Luann Petrus, who needs to focus on the last few hurdles to attain financial security for herself.

At age 28, Petrus has made good progress in establishing her financial base. She recently bought a house in Livonia and works as an administrative assistant at a local engineering firm. She has no dependents.

Her salary is \$22,500 per year, and her employer provides her with the following insurance benefits: medical (HMO), dental, short-term disability (13 weeks), and group term life insurance (\$15,000). In addition, she has a personally owned \$100,000 universal life insurance policy. Goals include the purchase of a car within the next two years and beginning some retirement savings within the next three years.

Petrus has done a good job managing her income. She lives within her means and has no debt beyond the house mortgage. She drives a 1986 Chevy, and she has good auto coverage on this car.

In fact, she may be over-insured, because her car's value is relatively low, she should review whether it makes financial sense to keep her collision and comprehensive coverage. She pays a significant annual premium for these coverages, and

the maximum she will ever collect is the modest resale value of the car.

Disability insurance

Petrus realizes that her short-term disability plan at work is inadequate.

"I am a single woman living on my own," she said. "If my income should stop or decrease, I'll be in big trouble."

A single period on disability lasting 12 months or longer would undo everything she has accomplished to date. She would likely lose her savings, her home, and most of her possessions. A recent report indicated that most home foreclosures were due to disability — not loss of job or death.

Her biggest asset now is her ability to bring in an income and the time to build a nest egg. She has insured her possessions adequately, but not the income that allows her to buy and maintain these possessions. We refer to this as insuring the golden eggs, but not the goose that lays the golden eggs. She needs to buy a personally-owned, long-term disability policy that pays benefits until she reaches 65.

As she has 13 weeks coverage at work, she can purchase a policy

with a 90-day waiting period (the period before her personal disability policy pays benefits). She should purchase a policy that pays her at least \$1,000 per month of income (which is automatically free of federal income tax), and the coverage should include cost-of-living increases built into the benefit. Although most disability policies do not cover any time off due to pregnancy, most good policies will pay benefits for any complications resulting from the pregnancy. Such a policy will cost Petrus \$450-\$650 per year.

Estate planning

"It is because I have no dependents" that Petrus has no will or other estate plan in place.

As an adult with some savings and a house, Petrus still needs to do some basic estate planning. It needn't be elaborate. A simple will allows her to name the administrator of her estate, rather than having the court appoint someone. It would also give her the opportunity to direct some of her personal possessions to the most appropriate family member.

It could also be helpful to have a

"Yeah, and what if somebody else notices all that space? I mean I've got all our executives stuck in traffic on I-75 running up these incredible cellular phone bills, just because I thought we didn't have room out here. I told those guys in Highland Park that we didn't have room for our executives and engineers in Auburn Hills, and we were going to keep the headquarters down there. Now I figure we are going to have to move our headquarters, or else we will have to unscrawl all those executive nameplates and leave the place half-empty."

"So what's the problem?"
"Our credibility is at stake. I mean, we got a \$160 million tax

break, the state built us a couple of expressways and we refined the whole deal a couple of times. I never figured we would have to move the whole headquarters and bankrupt Highland Park. I suppose I should have looked at the blueprints."

"I guess," Lutz says, still worried about the helicopter hanger. "At least you got Highland Park to sign off on the tax deal before you found out. So what are we going to do?"

"Hey, I've got an idea. How about planting corn on the lawn down there? Then we could sell the whole place off to Toyota or something. You know how those Japanese like to build their places in cornfields. Do you think they'd buy that?"

"You've got an honest face. I've never known you to go back on your word."

"OK," says Chairman Lee. "By the way, do you know where Bob Eaton is? I figure I should tell him about this too. He's probably stuck on I-75. Those radio traffic reports are pretty bad these days."

"What'd you say? I can't hear you over these rotor blades."

more pain may precede a final cure. "Clearly, as you get leaner, the number of opportunities in terms of positions probably will be few," Gallagher said. "As you get leaner, responsibilities get greater. I think we can attract top talent."

There are other positives as well, he added.

"We have an aging work force. We'll have attrition. We are constantly going to need to refurbish skilled trade groups." And who knows what a booming economy and a hot batch of products might bring, Gallagher said.

"It's not a closed industry, but it will never boom like in the '50s or '60s," he predicted.

"It's a situation today that's a lot better than five or six years ago. We're doing a better job of producing quality products, we're more productive, relations with the union

are better and improving.

"The bottom line is there's going to be a vital auto industry in this area. We're not going to let it happen — that the auto industry will go away," Gallagher said.

Stan Marshall, a UAW vice president who heads up the union's Chrysler division, regards Gallagher's abilities highly.

"He certainly has a lot of experience with the business and bargaining," Marshall said. "I'd certainly think he'd be an asset to the company. I would hope rapport would

be there like with (A.P.) St. John (Gallagher's predecessor). We were able to work out our differences pretty good."

Gallagher reports to Thomas G. Denomme, executive vice president-corporate staff group.

"Tom is an experienced labor negotiator. He's very adept at dealing with the union and representing our views to them and theirs to us," Denomme said. "He's a very straight guy who tells it like it is. He's a good guy to deal with. He doesn't have any hidden agendas."

House approves family leave bill, Bush vows veto

Here's how *Observer & Eccentric-area members of Congress* were recorded on major roll call votes in the week ending Sept. 11

HOUSE

Yes for family leave: By a vote of 241 for and 161 against, the House sent to the White House a bill (S5) requiring employers of at least 50 workers to provide up to 12 weeks of annual unpaid leave for childbirth or other medical circumstances involving an em-

ployee of close family member. Workers taking leave would retain health benefits and get their job back when they return.

President Bush has vowed a veto. The bill is backed by the AARP and many unions, and opposed by business groups including the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

Supporter Marge Roukema, R-N.J., said the issue "is not about mandates or benefit packages. It is fundamentally about values, family values, and a standard of decency."

Opponent Tom DeLay, R-

Tex., said "this bill will push American businesses and our economy even deeper into the quagmire of inefficiency" by placing mandates on employers.

A yes vote was to pass the bill. **Area representatives voting yes were: Dennis Hertel, D-Harper Woods, William Ford, D-Taylor, Sander Levin, D-Southfield. Voting no: William Broomfield, R-Birmingham. Not voting: Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth.**

More for maritime administration: The House passed, 331 for and 48 against, a bill (HR 4484) authorizing \$765 million for the U.S. Maritime Administration in fiscal 1993. The figure is at least 30 percent above both the president's 1993 request and the comparable 1992 budget. Most of the increase is for expanding the government-owned "ready reserve" merchant fleet.

The bill contains \$225 million for subsidizing private owners of passenger liners and freighters, a program whose rationale is to keep the merchant marine internationally competitive and prepared for any wartime role.

Supporter Jack Fields, R-

Tex., said that although more costly than requested by President Bush, the measure will ensure "a strong, viable merchant marine."

No one spoke against the bill.

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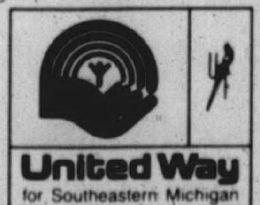

SENATE

Yes on appeals judge: By a vote of 62 for and 36 against, the Senate confirmed the nomination of Edward E. Carnes, assistant attorney general of Alabama, as an 11th Circuit Court of Appeals judge.

Civil rights groups said that as Alabama's top prosecutor, Carnes has advocated the death penalty with a fervor that shows racial bias. But his sup-

porters, including both Alabama senators, said that in fighting to uphold death penalty convictions he has performed a mandatory prosecutorial role.

A yes vote was to support the nomination. **Michigan Senators Carl Levin and Donald Riegle, both Democrats, voted no.**

Shelves product liability bill: The Senate set aside a product liability bill limiting consumer suits against manufacturers over defective products. The vote on a cloture motion was not directly on the merits of the legislation (S 640). The tally of 58-38 fell

just short of the three-fifth majority needed by sponsors to end debate and move to near certain final passage of the bill.

The bill has campaign overtones because President Bush says it will help to hold down the high cost that litigation inflicts on the economy. It is backed by business organizations and opposed by consumer groups and trial lawyers.

Congress has wrestled with product-liability legislation for a decade.

A yes vote was to move to final passage of product-liability legislation. **Carl Levin voted no. Riegle voted yes.**

Space station stands: By a vote of 34 for and 62 against, the Senate refused to kill NASA's planned space station by diverting its fiscal 1993 funding to deficit reduction and veterans' health

programs. The vote kept \$2.1 billion for "Freedom" in an appropriations bill (HR 5697) later sent to conference with the House.

NASA hopes to orbit the manned facility by the turn of the century. About \$30 billion of the \$40 billion projected development cost remains to be appropriated.

Amendment supporter John Warner, R-Va., said "we need to focus on reducing the deficit now if we are going to avoid a horrendous economic crisis for our children and grandchildren."

Calling Freedom important to economic recovery, John Seymour, R-Calif., said "in the state of California alone, it supports 4,000 jobs and \$4 billion worth of contracts."

A yes vote was to kill the space station. **Carl Levin voted yes. Riegle voted no.**

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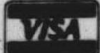
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Take a hike for animals on Saturday

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
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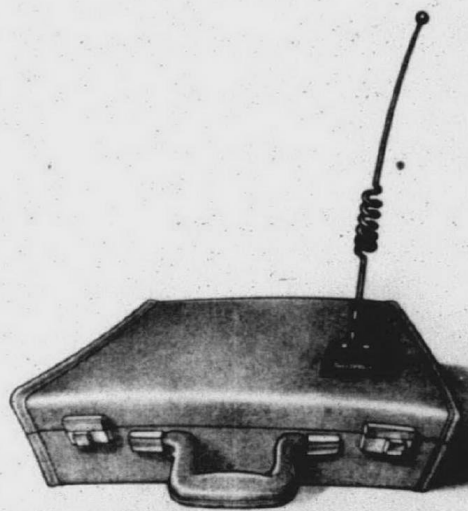

Troupe finds space beyond final frontier

Twenty-six years have passed since the television series "Star Trek" first aired on NBC. Today that series has spawned six movies and an immensely successful second series, "Star Trek: The Next Generation," which recently finished its fifth season.

But what is it that has made a television show which ran for only three seasons and never made the top 10 in the Nielsen ratings become a cultural phenomenon? What's so great about "Star Trek?"

When "Star Trek" premiered in September 1966, it was the first adult-oriented science fiction series with continuing characters. Unlike previous serious science fiction programs like "Twilight Zone" and "The Outer Limits," "Star Trek" was not an anthology series. It offered the same characters week after week along with stories involving more than just robots, ray guns and the monster of the week.

Unlike most previous science fiction TV series and movies, "Star Trek" themes were not centered on intergalactic wars or alien invasions. They presented a positive view of the future and taught us that diversity, not conformity, should be celebrated.

The mission of the Enterprise was to explore the galaxy and contact other life forms, not conquer other worlds. In the turbulent '60s, when the country was divided, "Star Trek" aired with a hopeful look at the future. Not only were men and women of different nationalities working together, but the citizens of earth were working side by side with people from other planets.

There is more to its appeal than a positive theme. The series also offered strong characters who were believable because they were fallible.

Believable characters

Captain Kirk was modeled after C.S. Forester's captain Horatio Hornblower. He often sought the advice of his friends Spock, the logical Vulcan science officer, and Dr. Leonard "Bones" McCoy, the emotion-charged chief medical officer.

Each provided Kirk a different viewpoint. Similarly, the half human Spock could view humanity both in general and on his own by observing the different emotional attitudes of Kirk and McCoy.

Other characters were just as complex. Ask Chief Engineer Montgomery Scott to do the impossible in two weeks and he'd do it in one. Apart from spending shore leaves catching up on technical manuals, Scotty is a collector of antique weapons.

Helmman Hikaru Sulu is not only a capable bridge officer, but also a botanist and fencer. He fancied himself a swashbuckler not unlike D'Artagnan.

Communications officer Uhura was a strong willed, effective officer who spent her spare time entertaining the crew with her music. Navigator Pavel Chekhov, the youngest of the group, displayed the rashness and impatience of youth, along with a strong sense of ethnic pride, claiming everything was "invented in Russia."

These characters worked so well because they were created by a talented group of actors. Unfortunately, with the exception of William Shatner and Leonard Nimoy, the cast of "Star Trek" has by and large been overlooked by the general public — a pity considering their accomplishments.

Distinguished careers

DeForest Kelley (McCoy), now all but retired from acting, has appeared in more than 20 movies and 50 television programs. Especially in the many westerns he appeared in, Kelley had a distinguished career as a screen villain.

James Doohan (Scott), also all but retired, began his career on radio, appearing on more than 3,500 programs. He has taught acting at New York's Neighborhood Playhouse and has appeared in numerous television shows.

George Takei (Sulu) recently made the movies "Prisoners of the Sun" and "Return to the River Kwai." During the past 40 years, he has appeared in more than a dozen films and more than 40 TV shows.

When Gene Roddenberry launched "Star Trek" in 1966, he boldly went where no other television show had gone before.

What he didn't anticipate was his fictional five-year mission that 26 years later shows no sign of ending.

More than two decades after "Star Trek" went off the air, faded prints are still playing the rerun circuit, its aging stars are still saving the universe on the movie screen, and fans are flocking to conventions and clubs to keep the spirit alive.

Why? Ask Cynde Boroff of Livonia. This trekkie recalls "Star Trek" as a "novel, innovative TV show" that addressed some pretty controversial issues.

The "Star Trek?" A show where Romulans hide their evil doings with their cloaking device, where superhuman Kahn and cohorts roamed the galaxy, and the crew of the USS Enterprise kept the peace without interfer-

ing with the course of universal events.

Yes, that "Star Trek." "It addressed issues no one wanted to touch," she said. "As I watched it, I think it had an impact on my view of the world. It opened up a larger world to me because it did address contemporary issues."

She saw that in the show and so did a lot of other people. Need proof? Just take a look at the roster of the USS Intrepid, metro Detroit's "Star Trek"

fan club.

Professionals, skilled tradesmen, homemakers, even their children are continuing the adventure Roddenberry began. USS Intrepid has 250 adult members along with 50 youth members from throughout the area as well as Alaska, New York, St. Croix and England.

What Leonard Nimoy was to the Enterprise, Boroff is to the Intrepid club — the first officer, serving under "captain" Anthony Lesnick, a Dearborn attorney. Line and staff officer positions made popular by the TV show have been adopted as club offices.

Like the TV show, there's a chief medical officer, Doreen Ganos who, unlike her Hollywood counterpart DeForest Kelly, is really a surgeon at Henry Ford Hospital. Diana Brown of Dearborn is the club's version of chief engineering officer Commander Scott. And Wendy Nelson of Westland is to the club what Lt. Uhura was to the USS Enterprise, the communications officer.

A lot in common

"You take people from a widely divergent background, put them together and it's amazing how much they have in common," Boroff said. "We have white collar people as members; we have blue collar people as members. We're all here because a love of the TV show, the movies, the novels and the models."

But before you begin thinking these people run around in plastic Vulcan ears and homemade Federation uniforms, think again. Yes, the members are "trekkies," but they devote much of their time to the club's goal — "making the 23rd century a reality today."

"Our goal is more than cursory," said Lesnick. "We're more than a 'golly, gee whiz, we like 'Star Trek.' The people involved in 'Star Trek' are very forward thinking. When we say we want the 23rd century today it means we want to make this time better now."

"It sounds corny, but it's a way of bringing out the best in people."

Yes, the club has its share of "Star Trek" related activities. Members were at a "Star Tek" convention in Dearborn in July, and social functions range from an all-galaxy bowling tournament to video marathons.

But matching the list of social functions is a list of charitable activities. They've collected thousands of Campbell Soup labels for Detroit's Headstart program, worked at the annual Channel 56 auction, delivered clothing and household items to the Detroit Rescue Mission and provided the beverages for picnics at the Penrickton Center for the Blind.

"In essence, we try to be a microcosm of what things would be in the future," Lesnick said. "We're interested in seeing a society where Jim, our black member, Susan, our Jewish member, and Bill, our handicap member, are just Jim, Bill and Susan."

"We don't take any political position. We don't force a non-belief on anyone. Everyone can be who they are in this club."

The club has only been around for five years and in that time has grown to one of the largest such clubs in the country. It started out with a core group of people met at a "Star Trek" conven-

She has had more roles on stage than in the movies or on TV, but since doing "Star Trek," she has been actively involved in recruiting women and minorities for NASA's space shuttle program.

Walter Koenig (Chekhov) originated a theater program designed to act as therapy for emotionally dis-

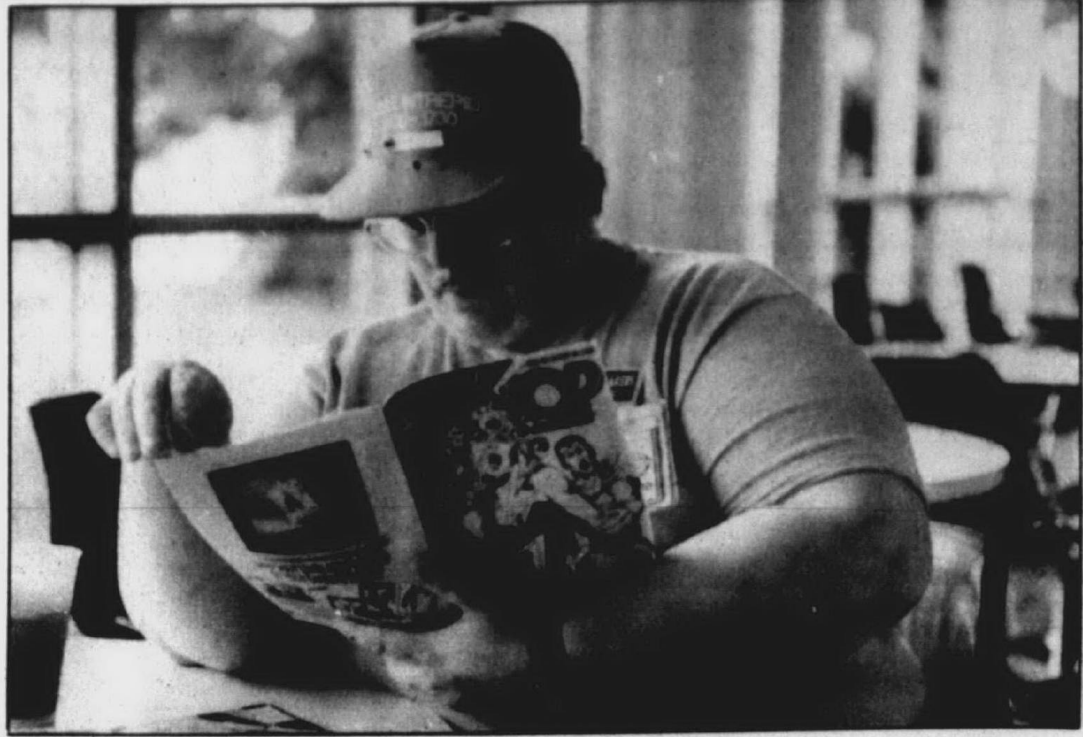
turbed and overly aggressive young people. He recently starred in the movie "Moontrap" and for the last several years has been performing with actor Mark Lenard (who played Spock's father) in a play called "Actors."

The creator

"Star Trek" was the brainchild of the late Gene Roddenberry, a former police officer, who had a vision he wanted to share. Despite pressure from network and studio executives, Roddenberry stuck to that vision. The result changed the face of American culture.

tion. That meeting led to more meetings and the club's start.

Positive outlook

"From the first meeting, we were a positive forward looking group," said Boroff said. "We knew we could go where no club had gone before."

A lot of the members are second and third generation fans and the club's setup reflects that.

The children of adult members are enrolled in the Intrepid's academy. As cadets, they have meetings and outings designed to enrich their minds and lives through education, experience and adventure. They graduate at age 16, receiving the rank of ensign and their first year free as an adult crewmember.

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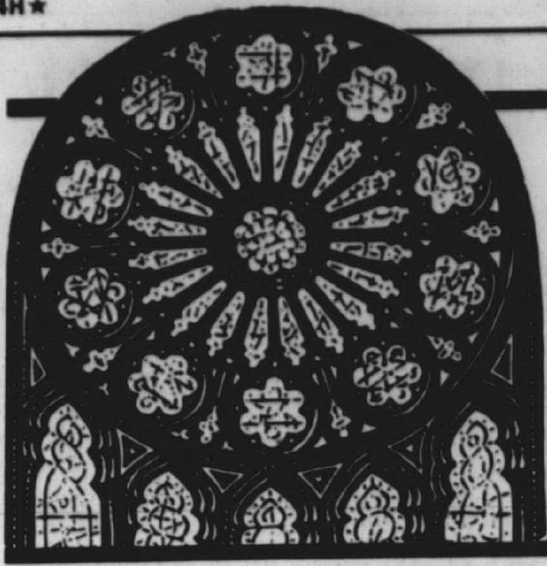

Heeding the call

Churches reach out to make the disabled feel welcome

Mike often grumbles that the pastor of his suburban Detroit church "mumbles" during the sermon.

"Why doesn't he talk louder?" wonders Mike, a retiree in his early 70s.

Mike's pastor uses a microphone. But maybe Mike is becoming hard-of-hearing.

"There is some stigma — usually self-imposed — to being hearing impaired," said Patrick Haggerty, 42, a hearing-impaired accountant from Canton. "The individual (who is) hearing impaired doesn't want to appear conspicuous or isn't aware there is a problem."

Haggerty is a member of Geneva Presbyterian Church of Canton. Several years ago, during a remodeling, the church installed special audio equipment to help hearing impaired worshippers.

"I think it was a recognition that some people in the congregation needed assistance," Haggerty said. "I was asked for my input."

In recent years, religious institutions have stepped up efforts to meet the needs of people with physical limitations.

"We want to include all people in meaningful participation," said Howard Hoeflein, director of the office of life and dignity for the Archdiocese of Detroit.

The archdiocese, with more than 300 churches in Detroit and surrounding areas, is embarking on a five-year plan to bring its churches to barrier-free status.

Under Michigan law, all public places must be accessible to dis-

abled people.

Often, improvements come as churches are remodeled. Changes include widening doorways, installing ramps and curb cuts and making other adjustments so wheelchairs can enter buildings.

Some churches have installed audio equipment for use by the hearing impaired. A few provide sign-language interpretation during services.

Large-print prayer books or service outlines, where available, make it easier for visually handicapped people to take part.

Equal opportunity

"You're not giving (handicapped) special treatment, you're giving them equal opportunity," said Haggerty, who teaches math and accounting at local community colleges and considers himself an advocate for hearing impaired.

Haggerty, whose deafness was diagnosed in early childhood, uses two hearing aids. Handicapped people often feel isolated, but they must make their needs known, he said.

"Most churches are very willing," according to Haggerty. "One of the things we have to overcome is people's reluctance to appear different by using them."

Geneva has three pocket-sized receivers which the hearing impaired can use. The receivers pick up signals fed from a microphone through FM transmission.

An earphone, earplugs or an audio loop — a coil of wire worn around the neck — is used by the person.

"It's more relaxing because I don't have to strain (to hear),"

Haggerty said. "I'm the only one who uses it regularly. Others use it occasionally."

The Rev. Richard Yost, fluent in sign language, ministers to the Catholic deaf of west-side Detroit and suburbs.

Yost, 45, is based at Our Lady of Loretto Church in Redford Township. Yost has normal hearing, but has worked with and counseled deaf people for several years.

The church's regular 9:30 a.m. Sunday Mass has signing. Many hearing-impaired people travel long distances to attend. A social hour follows.

Help for children

Around 10 hearing-impaired children attend twice-monthly religious education classes at Loretto. Another location for this ministry is the St. John Deaf Center in Warren.

"Such services offer what we hearing people take for granted," Yost said. "Families with children have to make tremendous sacrifices to find programs for their children to 'fit in.'"

Yost also teaches sign language and sensitivity training for hearing people to communicate with deaf friends, family and co-workers.

His parishioners aren't interested in an audio loop, Yost said.

Ward Evangelical Presbyterian Church of Livonia has some 5,000 members, many with special physical needs.

The church, built 36 years ago, has made improvements to increase accessibility, said Kelly

Sharkey, communications coordinator for the church.

The building has an elevator and, around 1½ years ago, the restrooms were remodeled for greater access to wheelchairs.

According to Sharkey, Ward has had an usher who used a wheelchair. And there is a Sunday school class for developmentally handicapped adults.

The Archdiocese of Detroit in November will publish an updated manual with information about parking, entrances, interior access, elevators and restrooms at its churches.

Some parishes have the audio loop. Some are stocked with large-print missalettes.

"Our goal is to have one church in each vicariate (geographical cluster) with these services," said Hoeflein.

The archdiocese, which began addressing the needs of the disabled during the 1960s, has formulated a new plan. During the next few years, churches that can afford to will be required to bring their buildings to current access guidelines.

In some cases, this will be a formidable challenge, Hoeflein said. Many churches were built decades ago with steps and narrow entrances. Some parishes simply cannot afford costly repairs.

Churches with financial hardship may receive assistance, including help and advice from churches which have already undergone renovation.

"Our goal is to get each parish to do as much as it can by the target date of January 1998," Hoeflein said.

We have seen fine people, pursuers of truth and kindness, men and women of generosity, and yet they have had to carry burdens of illness, distress and affliction. As we grow older, we witness the suffering of the good, the death of the all-too-young, and the passing of the righteous. Simultaneously, we

see the untroubled lives of the selfish, and the seeming bliss of the cruel.

By conventional wisdom, none of this makes sense. We are taught from birth that the good would be rewarded and the evil-doer punished. As children when we behaved ourselves and did what our parents told us, if we were not rewarded, at least we were not punished. But if we did the reverse, we soon discovered that punishment would be forthcoming.

When we began to grow up, we gradually became aware that what

we had learned as children was not quite so in the marketplaces of life, and we recognized the sad truth that life is not fair.

Upon this realization, different responses are possible. The first is the answer of submissiveness.

Accept, ask no questions, raise no outcry, seek not to change the scheme of things. The proper mood for living is resignation. As the poet suggested in The Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam: "The Moving Finger Writes; and, having writ, moves on: nor all your Piety nor Wit shall lure it back to cancel half a Line, nor all

your Tears wash out a Word of it."

This is what the Buddhists call "Karma," the wheel of necessity. This is the act of Providence. In the name of fate, the world's unfairness and inequity is tolerated, condoned and justified.

But a different response is possible and needed. Religion, at its highest, teaches us that we were put on earth to make life more fair.

The greatest challenge of moral conduct is this: the more unfair life is, the more fair and just and compassionate we are to be. If life is unfair to you, make it more fair to oth-

ers. This commitment enables us to live in a world which can be unfair without becoming deranged or filled with bitterness.

Life is unfair to families who are divided because of singleness, divorce, death and alienation.

Life is unfair to slow learners and those with learning disabilities.

Life is unfair to many older people, particularly those who are infirm and weak, and who suffer from neglect and emptiness.

Life is unfair to those whose lives are ravaged with the suffering of terminal illness, and for their loved

ones. Life is unfair to the afflicted and the handicapped. And who is not afflicted, and who is not handicapped?

For all these and more, we should make the world more fair, more sensitive, more compassionate.

As we make the world more fair, we discover that we belong together. The weak need the strong; the sick, the well; the ignorant, the learned; the frightened, the brave. The only way to make life more fair is to affirm it is a common gift in which all of us must share.

The Cohns' play is challenging



The hope of fun-loving ordinary people when they begin at this game is that with practice and resolution they will develop and possibly experience extraordinary possibilities.

Two who did are Nancy and Jerry Cohn from Novi, who are also one of the nicest and most precise partnerships we have in our suburban game. Because of their many other preoccupations, their play is limited, but what a challenge and pleasure when they let themselves get involved.

I first met them at Dave and Judy's Saturday evening duplicate some two years ago, and since that first confrontation I have mounted a major respect for their initiative and intuition. In their playing presence, one perceives an uncommon regard each has for the other's ability and judgment and this is, in this one's opinion, of striking significance. The immortal Howard Sehenken once said, "The most important person at the table is your partner."

The Cohns have been active duplicate stayers for a couple of decades, attaining their life master rating some 14 years ago. Since then, they have compiled something in excess of 2,000 points, which is well above most of our local performers. I was pleasantly surprised to learn of their recent transformation from standard American to Edgar Kaplan and Al Sheinwold's exacting bidding methods, but this system is actually best suited to pairs who spend most of their play together.

I asked Jerry what was the occasion for their most memorable celebration. His reply was singular. "The London, Ontario, regional of '83. We got lucky and won the mixed pair event with 240 tables in session. Nancy played superbly!" Today's hand comes from that game and you will enjoy their exceptional defensive performance.

Jerry's diamond queen was allowed to hold, and that caused him much concern. What was declarer up to? Nancy had played her seven and declarer his deuce. Had East started an echo to show attitude or was it only for count? Jerry concluded to continue the suit which declarer won with his ace.

At trick (3) a trump to dummy's king and back to his spade king.

Nancy thought that was odd and decided to part with her spade lady! She was giving up nothing and still had secondary control of the suit.

Some genius had once told her to be generous (give up your high cards) when it looks like you are being set up for an end play. She wasn't sure, but obviously declarer must have had that in mind. Otherwise, he would have been forced at some stage to guess the club suit.

At (5) and (6), declarer drew Jerry's last two trumps. And Nancy echoed in clubs. At trick (7), a diamond to dummy's king and the spade ace. Nancy made another marvelous play, her spade jack! At trick (8), declarer played a small spade from dummy, and again the very perceptive Nancy played an amazing card: her spade three! Oh, rotten socks, she thought to herself, if Jerry doesn't have the nine. He did, and he won it and dutifully led a small club, beating the contract for a tie for a top. The gracious declarer complimented Nancy on her preserving the spade three, otherwise she was end played.

Her contemporary oils on paper in spotlight

She loves oils. But she also loves how watercolors are framed. So Plymouth artist Andrea DeZell taps the best of both worlds by creating contemporary oils on paper.

Her artwork ranges in price from \$200 to \$500. Five examples of this unusual art form, including two very contemporary pieces, are on exhibit through October at Atrium Gallery, 109 N. Center, Northville.

"Her work is extraordinary," says gallery co-owner Pat Jania of Northville. "So many people who come to the gallery stop by her work and just stare. Her colors have such definition, such crispness. And there's nothing flat about her work; it has a great deal of depth, more so than most painters achieve."

A watercolor — matted and framed under glass — is "very pretty, very contemporary," said DeZell, a professional artist for 15 years. "Oil on canvas has an older appearance that's not updated enough. What I do is use oil to get the color I want but frame my art like a watercolor. I'm updating my oil to a more contemporary appearance but still getting the rich color."

A member of the 3 Cities and Farmington artists clubs, DeZell calls her work "a combination of abstract and realism. I've found it very exciting."

Oils let her achieve "a very rich watercolor ranging from a soft pastel to a deep hue. It's really quite different from what you typically see."

"I'm really successful with this," she said. "It's taking off to the point where I'm looking into lithograph prints so I can go national."

A 3-D look

With an abstract background on watercolor or canvas paper, DeZell brings realism to the forefront in her work, creating an almost three-dimensional effect. "Some people say it looks almost like it's embossed," DeZell said.

Her abstract realism leans toward florals and fruits. "But I'll paint virtually anything," she said. "I do a lot of commission pieces: portraits, landscapes, home settings, still life."

An example of abstract realism is her "Blackberry Harvest." It took best of show in the 3 Cities Art Club's spring juried exhibition. "The light hitting against the configuration of berries makes it so three-dimensional," Jania said. "You feel as if you can pick up the little berries in the basket."

Original vs. prints

DeZell hopes her exhibit at the Atrium "gives people more awareness of art today and points up the differences between original art and prints."

"People tend to buy prints to match their furnishings or furniture," she said. "Original art has true value, something not found in a print. Good art always increases in value; there's no depreciation."

That's not to say DeZell doesn't recognize the role prints play. To expand her visibility and marketability, she's checking into having her work lithographed.

"Right now, I'm limited to a small group of people. Not all see what I do. I want to really branch out so everyone would be aware. I truly love what I'm doing and want to share it with everybody. Prints would let me do just that."

It takes weeks to complete one painting. "I can't produce them fast enough to supply all of the areas I'd like to supply," DeZell said. "My only alternative — to reach more people and to spend the great amount of time I'd like to spend on each painting — is to make lithographs."

DeZell has staged one-person shows in Detroit and Cleveland. Her commissioned artwork hangs in private art collections in five states and Canada. She has taken part in Plymouth's Art in the Park and Fall Festival.

She twice was asked to show at the American Publishing Co.'s national art design exhibit in the Dairy Barn Cultural Arts Center in Athens, Ohio.

Still, she hasn't lost her sense of priorities, donating auction pieces to both the Michigan Cancer Foundation and the Special Olympics.

A Plymouth resident since 1969, DeZell offers private instruction for adults (oil painting) and children (mixed media drawing and painting).

For two years in the '70s, she volunteer taught drawing and clay sculpture to Plymouth elementary school students.

Today, she occasionally visits Plymouth elementary and middle schools to talk up art. "It's something I really love to do," DeZell said. "It's a lot of fun and the kids get really excited."

DeZell shows examples of her artwork, tells about getting started in art and answers a lot of questions. "Children are really interested in how I got as far as I have," she said. "They also want to know how much I charge."

Environment, heritage inspire her

Watercolorist Carol McCreedy grew up on the Westland farm her family has worked since 1834. The vibrant colors of

flowering plants and vegetables left an indelible influence on her work.

Red impatiens, geraniums, beets and cabbage, orange pumpkins and yellow chrysanthemums vie for the viewer's attention in her still life on exhibit at D & M Art Studio and Gallery in Plymouth.

"I always wanted to paint since I was 7 or 8, and my cousin and I planted a field of snapdragons to sell to our customers," McCreedy said.

"My mom china-painted and my great-grandmother was an oil painter. My great-grandmother would paint on whatever she had on hand — paper, a slate chalkboard."

"I'm comfortable with flowers. I'm around vegetables and flowers all day, so I'm always getting ideas for paintings. Being at the greenhouse, I'll see a flower I like or a vase, mostly I get my ideas at work."

After earning a bachelor of fine arts degree from Center for Creative Studies in 1980, McCreedy worked at an advertising agency, Studio Associates in Dearborn, airbrushing and retouching photos in gouache for 2½ years.

"Watercolor was actually what I liked the most at Center for Creative Studies. I spent my first year studying fine art but realized there are very few artists making a living from their painting. I switched to advertising design in my second year," McCreedy said.

"I admire Norman Rockwell, people who made a living at what they love,

Maxfield Parrish. I don't paint like them but I admire them. You don't have to try to figure their paintings out. They're just pleasing to the eye."

After a family crisis, McCreedy returned to the farm where she works a 40-hour week as a manager for the family business, Clyde Smith & Sons Greenhouses and Garden Center. The

Smith family works five acres of greenhouses, growing and selling bedding plants and fresh produce from their farm market on Newburgh Road.

"I went back to the farm. I enjoy plant season. In March and April, the houses are full and there's lots of color," McCreedy said.

"Ninety percent of the time I paint from life. Most of the time, I set up still life. If I'm not working from life, I use five or six references. I keep files. I collect seed catalogs. I tell my students you have to keep files."

Gallery will showcase impressionistic paradise

Impressionist John Zaccheo uses a palette knife to paint landscapes of seaside villages dotting lush hillsides along the Mediterranean coast in a 20-piece exhibition of his work running Sept. 19-29 at Wentworth Gallery in Laurel Park Place Mall, Six Mile and Newburgh, Livonia.

The public can meet the artist and discuss his work at opening receptions planned for 2-4 p.m. and 7-9 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 19.

"The whole gallery will be taken down. The whole gallery will be John Zaccheo," said Anita Smith, director.

Ripe for escape, the Isle of Hvar, Pontasieva and Lipari, Italy, speak of tranquility, lyrical clusters of pink, white and lavender flowers brightening the countryside and decorating the lines of Spanish-influenced architecture.

"I like the colors. It almost seems that you can see yourself on one of the porches looking out to sea," Smith said.

"John Zaccheo has traveled around the whole world. His work is in the collections of former President Jimmy Carter, the estate of Anwar Sadat, Menachim Begin and Nelson Rockefeller."

Travels to 36 countries from the remoteness of the upper Amazon River and the Himalayas to the exotic South Sea Islands inspire Zaccheo's scenes, heavy with impasto, and palette reminiscent of Monet.

"All the places I've been able to visit,

I can share those places with the viewer, the excitement of the people, the excitement of the place. I try to bring that out in the colors," Zaccheo said in an interview from his Palm Beach, Fla., home.

"When I travel, I remember the best of Venice. I remember the wonderful

gondola rides, the wonderful food, the people. In my paintings, the vibrant color is like the Italian people or Greece."

Zaccheo offers three types of work in this exhibit: oil on canvas, limited-edition serigraphs on 100-percent-cotton rag paper and limited-edition serigraphs on canvas embellished with oil and marquis.

"I feel very strongly I want as many people as possible to have my work. That's why I've created different types of art for people at different levels of affordability. Maybe they can't afford an original. They can afford to have an embellished print," Zaccheo said.

"For the embellished serigraph, I take a silkscreen print on canvas. I cover most of the print with oil paint and a palette knife. It takes a tremendous amount of work, a tremendous amount of discipline."

Zaccheo's love of light-filled canvases, highly textured with brilliant color, take their cue from French Impressionism. "I admire most of the impressionists because of their freedom — Monet, Renoir, Gauguin and Vincent Van Gogh," Zaccheo said.

McCreedy became a watercolor instructor three years ago. She currently teaches watercolor at Frame Works of Livonia, and charcoal and pastel drawing through Plymouth Canton Community Education at Plymouth Salem High School.

"I think for watercolors you have to have a drawing background but anybody can paint. It just takes practice. I encourage my students to work at it," McCreedy said.

White snapdragons contrast a midnight blue background in "Indian Corn," a watercolor still life.

"I like using a dark background because it brings out the colors of the flowers. I block in the flowers, the colors first. Usually, I have several paintings going at the same time," McCreedy said. "I work my color on a butcher block tray and I never throw anything out."

McCreedy opened a tin container filled to the brim with paint tubes in various stages of squeezing. She dotted the tray with color and began working it with a wet brush.

"I like to work big so the watercolor can move. I always work on full sheets, 300-pound watercolor paper," McCreedy said. "I use good brushes, usually a big brush. It holds a lot of water."

McCreedy uses a spray bottle of water and blotter paper to move the paint around the paper, creating a lyrical backdrop.

"I try to repeat the colors. I try to make a triangle of color to keep your eye moving on the paper when I set up a still life," she said. "I like to use crystal or glass vases. I like to play with the reflections."

McCreedy doesn't have as much time to paint as she would like with two sons, 8 and 5, who participate in extra-curricular hockey, a husband, and teaching art along with working full-time at the farm.

"I do a lot of advertising for the farm. Painting's relaxing. It's the love of my life. It's what I want to do even in the middle of the night," McCreedy said. "I would like to paint more. I'd like to illustrate children's books."

"Monet, I love his colors, the way he applied the paint; Van Gogh, the way he attacked the painting. I attack the canvas. I attack the sky with my palette knife emotionally. I create emotion. If a tree is green, I don't necessarily paint it green. I paint it what I feel."

"I try to create a bit of magic in my work, a bit of make believe."

Born in 1942 in Kingston, New York, Zaccheo, after earning a bachelor of arts degree at Syracuse University, studied at the Art Students League of New York in the early 1960s.

From 1969 to 1979, he worked in the advertising field in a variety of positions, including packaging designer, magazine illustrator and creative director for Warner Brothers' New York office.

"From packaging, I went to magazine illustration. My illustration has been on the cover of most major magazines, Life and Time," Zaccheo said. "I designed hundreds of album covers,

from the Partridge Family to the Fifth Dimension, Seals & Croft and Gordon Lightfoot."

Zaccheo retired from the whirlwind lifestyle of New York's advertising scene at age 35 to paint full time in Palm Beach these last 15 years. His work is on exhibit at 28 Wentworth galleries from the East Coast to the Midwest.

"It was a big decision to switch from commercial to fine art. Fine art is permanent. I have control over what I paint. I paint what I feel. Fine art is to paint what's inside you as a human being," Zaccheo said. "In my work, I strive to give part of myself. I believe that what I create is what I am."

Wentworth Gallery specializes in limited-edition serigraphs, original paintings and sculptures by artists Itzhak Tarkay, Erte, Delacroix, Behrens, McKnight and Mack.

Wentworth publishes limited-edition serigraphs of work by Frane Mlinar, Maxwell Parsons, Fanch Ledan as well as Zaccheo, and sculptures by Misha Frid.

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Her palette serves up colorful retrospective

Livonia Arts Commission presents "Retrospective in Color," an exhibition spanning 15 years of paintings by watercolorist Shirley Bishop of Livonia, through Sept. 30 in the lobby of Livonia City Hall, Farmington Road and Five Mile.

An artist's reception for Bishop runs 7-9 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 17 at city hall.

The retrospective, featuring 34 florals, still-life and architectural landscapes, is Bishop's first one-woman show.

"Watercolor takes a lot of pre-planning. With oil, you tend to rework it and rework it," Bishop said. "Watercolor's very spontaneous. It's very fresh."

Bishop began a long, continuing road of visual art studies with Livonia artist Marie Tuthill, with whom she studied oil painting for more than five years.

After growing disillusioned with oils, Bishop sought an exciting, new medium: watercolor. Bishop took classes in the hard to handle medium with Visual Arts Association of Livonia (VAAL) instructor Anne Dase Loveland and Farmington Hills artist Edee Joppich.

"I take classes all the time to keep me painting. I try to paint a little bit everyday," Bishop said.

"I'm very intrigued by shape and forms and negative spaces. Once you start painting, you start looking at things differently. You notice things you've never seen before like how the light plays on a leaf, on a tree.

"I really like Georgia O'Keeffe, the way she handles watercolor. I'm always looking at how people handle it and see if I can learn something."

Bishop has exhibited watercolors with the VAAL, Farmington Artists Club and as a VAAL student in

Joppich's "Creative Approach to Watercolor" class, which resulted in the exhibition "Creativity-21 Artists Paint an Amaryllis" in the Farmington Community Library. Bishop has exhibited watercolors at Joppich's Bay Street Gallery in Northport.

"When I look at a painting, I'm looking at composition. I look at the design of it first," Bishop said.

Bishop strongly believes her watercolors are influenced by the natural beauty surrounding her home in Northern Michigan on Crystal Lake.

She refers to her style of painting as abstract realism, "where a concrete image is transformed into an abstract interpretation of the synergy between design, shape and light."

"I use hot pressed paper. I use a lot of salt, a lot of alcohol, a lot of resist. The secret is in making it look like I don't," Bishop said.

Using flat shapes of color, Bishop

captures in white the architecture of Bates Hamburgers on the northwest corner of Five Mile and Farmington Roads in Livonia.

"I painted it for Bob a long time ago. That's his favorite restaurant. It has marvelous structure line," Bishop said.

Bob is husband Robert R. Bishop, city treasurer, and a big supporter of Shirley's art. "Bob's a big

fan of the arts," Bishop said.

Two collages have been included in Bishop's show. "I just started to do collage. It's very abstract," Bishop said.

In a recent interview, Bishop was excited about the annual weeklong watercolor workshop she attends in Northern Michigan with Joppich and several other women painters.

"We go out on location everyday.

We do some serious painting up there," Bishop said. "You end up with six or seven paintings by the time you're done."


Besides the time spent painting, Bishop works as part of the design team at Lorizoni Fashion Designs of Livonia, producers of special order women's clothing.

Show hours are 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays.

Mortgage plan helps buyers with lower down payment

One of the biggest stumbling blocks for would-be homeowners is the down payment.

Mortgage lenders generally require a 20-percent commitment in cash from borrowers, which amounts to \$10,000 on a starter home with a purchase price of \$50,000. Some young families just don't have the dough when adding application fees and closing costs.

Debt can be another hurdle. Lenders on conventional mort-

gages generally limit borrowers to monthly payments — interest, principal, taxes and insurance — of 28 percent of gross income, 33 percent including housing and all debt.

That, too, can be disqualifying and frustrating, especially if applicants are right on the edge.

Consider the community home buyers program, a partnership between the state, lenders, private mortgage insurers and the Federal National Mortgage Association.

Borrowers have to come up with only 5 percent down — \$2,500 on a

\$50,000 house. Mortgage debt can go as high as 33 percent of monthly gross income and all debt can rise as high as 38 percent.

"Basically, it's aimed for the first-time buyer, but a lot of real estate people don't know about it," said Joe Scheringer, an agent for Prudential Great Lakes Realty in Troy.

"Its purpose is to get buyers into homes who usually wouldn't qualify for mortgages," said Sue Schoettle, a loan officer for Sunbelt National Mortgage in Bingham Farms.

"It's for everybody, low and moderate income," said Michael Lubig, vice president and manager of the mortgage department for Standard Federal Bank headquartered in Troy.

Mortgage applicants through the community home buyers program in Wayne and Oakland counties must have family income of less than \$51,800. Move-up houses can be bought as well as starter homes.

Borrowers also must pay mortgage insurance, which fluctuates depending on the down payment.

With 5 percent down, figure on about 1 percent at closing for the first year in advance, then about a half percent monthly on the outstanding balance.

That's still less than the 3 percent initially required on FHA-backed loans.

Interest rates, application costs and processing fees are the same as for conventional mortgages.

Prospects also must take a class, usually offered by lenders, to apply. It touches on such topics as how to shop for a house, what to look for

inside and out, budgeting, qualifying for a mortgage and closing the deal.

"I think the classes are good. A lot of people buying houses today don't know a light bulb from a faucet," said Al Marshall, vice president and manager of business development for First Federal of Michigan.

Schoettle suggests that persons interested in getting a loan through the community home buyers program first find a lender they're comfortable with.

Association has right to protect property

CONDO QUERIES

One of the residents in the condominium wants to rent our clubhouse for a wedding. We are concerned that this will attract a number of undesirable characters because the bride is a member of a motorcycle gang. We think she is a nice person, but we do not think that type of element should be allowed in our condom-

inium community facility. Do we have an opportunity to keep this from occurring? We are afraid of damage to the recreational facility and the rest of the common elements of the condominium.

You must be extremely careful in approaching this issue because you cannot discriminate against residents or owners on the basis of sex, marital status, etc. But the association has a right to impose reasonable rules on the use of community facility so as to protect the residents and the property of the condominium association from damages.

Accordingly, if in fact it appears that the holding of a wedding in the community facility may result in damage occurring to the common elements, and it can be justified, you may have a right to deny the request for such a wedding, hopefully on grounds other than the fact that there are "motorcycle" people are attending.

On the other hand, you have, as an alternative an opportunity to impose reasonable requirements on the person having the wedding by requiring the posting of an adequate security deposit. I would suggest that you consult with your legal counsel concerning the param-

eters that the board has in this regard under your condominium documents, any rules you have concerning the use of the community facility, and state law.

Mortgage delinquency rising

(AP) — The percentage of homeowners behind on their mortgages climbed in the April-June quarter and would have risen even more if not for declining interest rates.

The Mortgage Bankers Association of America said a seasonally adjusted 4.77 percent of homeowners nationally were 30 days or more late on their mortgage payments, up from 4.52 percent during the first three months of the year.

That broke a string of three quarterly declines. Still, the new rate was well below the five-year high of 5.28 percent, hit during the second quarter of 1991.

Warren Lasko, executive vice president of the association, said the reversal was not unexpected because of the slow growth of American's income and the stagnant job market.

Adjusted for inflation, per capita personal income fell 1.9 percent last year, the worst performance in at least 12 years. The unemployment rate at the end of the second quarter was at an eight-year high of 7.8 percent, although it edged down to 7.7 percent in July.

Lasko said the sluggish economy probably would have produced an even higher delinquency rate if not for the sharp decline in mortgage rates.

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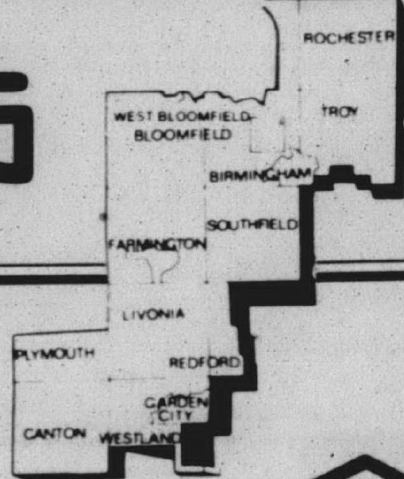

Movin' up

More space, amenities on wish lists



Move-up buyers cross a wide spectrum. Some are growing families looking for more space. Others are transferees who know they'll be moving in a few years. Others are seeking a change of status to a more expensive house.

"I was just coming from a divorce where we had a house on Orchard Lake. I was looking for something like I had, but much less expensive that offered openness.

"My model appealed to me because it offered a master suite on the first floor. Upstairs provided privacy with two bedrooms and a loft.

"I suppose when you build something new, you get choices — tile, fixtures. I had options to customize my new home.

It just had everything I was looking for — floor plan, general flow, privacy."

Residential builders who work in the \$130,000 to \$200,000 price range say that they appeal to a broad spectrum of buyers. They could be interested in a "new" move-up or a first new buy from an existing home.

"They kind of overlap," said Norm Finkelstein, partner in the Irvine Group of Farmington Hills. "Buyers at \$130,000 tend to be young families, first move-up, first-time buyers, some from apartments, others who had been living with their parents.

"When you're talking \$190,000, \$200,000, very often those are people who are empty nesters in their late 40s and 50s, some with a child living at home for another year or two, moving down from larger houses," Finkelstein added.

Defying description

"A typical buyer is really hard to define," said Deen Hyde, marketing director for Pulte Homes of Michigan. "We probably have two main types.

"A transferee represents about 40 percent of our business. They stay three to five years on average. They look for value, a good investment. They know they will turn it over in three to five years. They want the most square footage for the money.

"The other type is the local move-up," Hyde said. "The motivation is a larger family or change in status. They're looking for the most home for the money in terms of amenities."

Dave Gerish, vice president of Gerish Building in Plymouth, had similar observations.

"I've got some customers who have a house costing \$300,000-plus moving down because they don't want the maintenance," he said. "Another customer who is a move-up will come in three or four years later and say, 'Build me a new home.'"

Spacious master bedroom suites and basements — some used for additional living space, others for storage — are high on the list of buyers' priorities, builders said.

"They all want an impressive master suite as a retreat, more or less," Finkelstein said.

"We are finding a big trend away from contemporary to traditional, especially a country-look with big porches, large windows. Yet for interiors, they like to have contemporary openness with traditional moldings," he said.

First-floor laundries are still preferred, Finkelstein said, even though some builders have designed utility rooms on upper levels where the bedrooms are.

Master suite a must

"Older people want a first-floor master bedroom," Gerish said. "Younger people are looking for the most rooms they can get for the kids."

Hyde also notices that many buyers today want the master suite on the main floor — older owners to avoid stairs, younger to get some space away from the kids.

About half of his buyers request a whirlpool tub in the master suite as an extra, Gerish said.

Kitchens are getting more attention. "The kitchen is the place where people are congregating," Hyde said. "We have two-way fireplaces between the kitchen and great room and kitchen and family room. We've started doing a lot of eating bars in the kitchen. They're becoming popular off an island."

Finkelstein also noted that two-way fireplaces are getting popular.

Buyers today are more knowledgeable and much more sophisticated than a

decade or so ago, builders agree.

"As people move up to their second, third and fourth home, they're more discriminating with what they want," Hyde said. "They want to be sure things they don't like aren't incorporated.

"Surprisingly enough, the higher you go, the more involved they are," Finkelstein said.

Compromise is the order of the day when wish lists clash with financial reality.

"Some will compromise on a formal dining room," Finkelstein said. "They'll compromise on a two-car rather than three-car garage. They'll compromise on a walk-out basement. Maybe they don't want to pay the price on that fourth bedroom."

Gerish and Hyde suggested that buyers most often will accommodate on floor coverings.

Plywood price rise expected to be temporary

Builders and suppliers here expect that the price of plywood, which soared nationally in the wake of Hurricane Andrew, will return to normal levels in November when construction activity tapers and demand slackens.

At least that was their thinking before Hurricane Iniki slammed into Hawaii last weekend.

"There is so much panic going on in the marketplace now. That usually follows natural disasters. It's short term and short lived," said Sheila Weidman, spokeswoman for Georgia-Pacific.

That company is the largest single volume supplier of plywood nationally and the second largest of framing materials, she added.

Plywood — used for roofs, floors and exterior sheathing — has increased in price by about a third since late August, said Tom Polk, a buyer for National Lumber in Warren, a major supplier to builders here.

Plywood accounts for about 20 percent of all wood used in residential construction, he said.

Framing materials used for trusses, studs and joists have increased on the order of 7 percent directly as the result of the hurricane, said Fred Capaldi Jr., a Rochester Hills builder.

"This storm couldn't have come at worse time as far as the availability of plywood is concerned," said A.D. "Pete" Correll, president and chief operating officer of Georgia-Pacific.

"Supply shortages have been the major influence on prices," Correll said. "Product delivery dates already were extended due to increased demand. There is no additional capacity available in the industry to meet the tremendous need that has been created by the hurricane."

"In contrast, when Hurricane Hugo hit the East Coast (1989), even though prices escalated, there was excess capacity in the industry to meet the extraordinary demand," he said.

Curtailments of lumbering operations in recent years due to environmental concerns also influenced supply and prices, Georgia-Pacific reported.

The company froze prices on Aug. 31 after Andrew but not before they had risen 15 percent, Weidman said. Prices had soared 15-20 percent prior to the storm due to supply and demand, she said.

A couple of builders and suppliers contacted here last

week thought the price rise was merely a blip on the constantly changing lumber price roller coaster.

"I think this will pass," Capaldi said. "It happened before. It will happen again. I wonder, too, if some increase in price isn't deliberate, human nature being what it is."

Robert Jones, a West Bloomfield builder, said that the lumber market — affected by actual supply and demand as well as perceptions of supply — changes as much as other commodities.

"The market in years past when winter came prices started to drop," Jones said. "California (building) is literally dead in the water. There seems to be enough spots where there's lack of demand that I personally don't see a problem with getting materials."

And then came Iniki.

The lumber market tends to fluctuate like the stock market, Polk said. He forecast a price dip, but not to pre-Andrew levels, by the end of the month based on a falloff in demand.

"We have a 45- to 60-day inventory file," said Dave Corna, divisional construction sales manager for Erb Lumber headquartered in Birmingham. "The problem is replacing that. We project by the first weekend in November, things will soften dramatically due to seasonality."

Builders who contract for a specific price have to eat any increases.

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Making a house a home

Moving vans criss-cross the country in late summer, planting families in new places. Once the urgency of settling kids in new schools has passed, attention turns to another domestic demand: making the new home distinctively yours.

A first line of attack is as close as the paint store.

"Since stark white is the color of choice of many builders, adding color in a few strategic spots adds warmth," says Ken Charbonneau, color and merchandise manager for Benjamin Moore & Co.

Neutrals such as gray, peach, rose, and taupe take the edge off of a room and generally work well with the carpeting that often comes with new construction. Changing a bedroom from white to peach or coral is almost always a decorative improvement, he says.

Old houses often need a new paint job to clean up as well as spruce up the decor. If the walls are in decent shape — with all nails countersunk and spackled — the existing paint can be used as a base coat unless you plan to cover a dark wall in a light color.

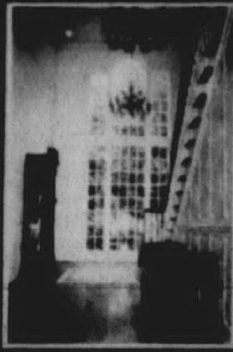
"Especially in the kitchen and bath, wash surfaces that haven't been painted in a long time,"

Charbonneau says. "Paint doesn't adhere properly to greasy, soapy or mildewed walls."

Use a powdered detergent such as Spic & Span and wash the walls from the bottom up to avoid streaks, he suggests.

If rooms lack architectural detail, you can create some. Add a painted border at waist height or at eye level. A low-cost idea for the dining room is to make a "stencil" of a china or curtain pattern by running it through a copying machine. Cut out the pattern, trace it onto the wall with pencil then paint it in.

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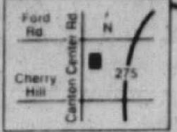
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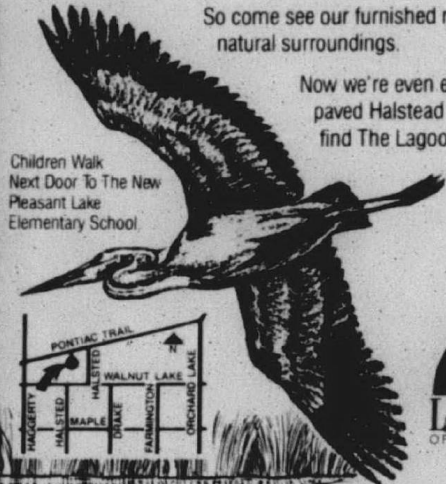
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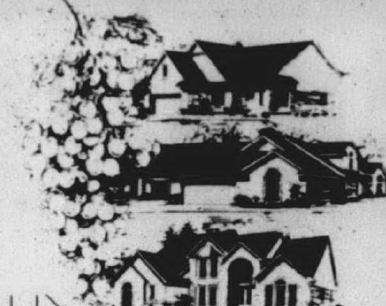
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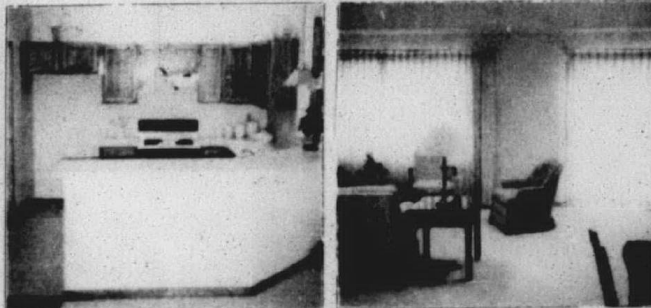
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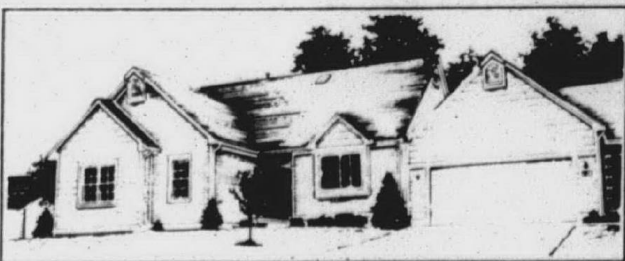
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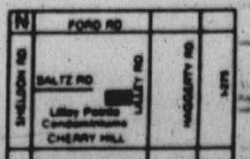
