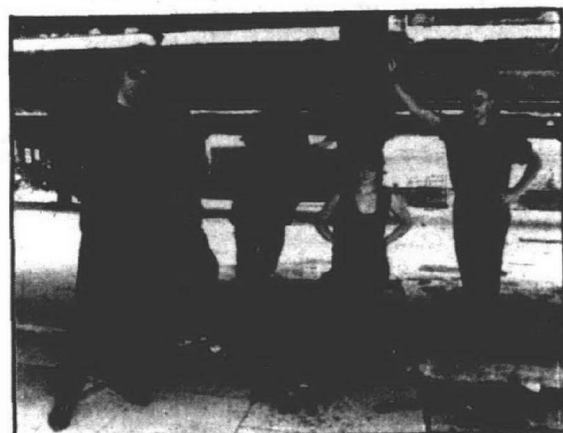

Observers size up election



Changes sparked by last week's election could result in higher assessments for local homeowners, but some changes could aid greater Plymouth.

First comes the election, then the fallout.

Thanks partly to one outcome of the recent election, Plymouth homeowners could next year pay more in taxes to the schools and local government.

But officials say the fallout from the election isn't all bad.

First, the bad news: A two-year

freeze on assessment increases is set to expire Dec. 31. And voters rejected two state ballot proposals which could have limited assessment hikes.

Now, unless state lawmakers take action to limit assessment increases, "most of the community will get hefty assessment increases in 1993," said deputy city clerk Judy Zirblis.

"Obviously since there was a freeze on the rise in assessments it's going to be two years' worth," explained

Plymouth Township finance director Rosemary Harvey.

"I'm thinking it will probably be around 10 percent," Harvey said.

Then again, she noted that by provisions of the Headlee amendment, taxes can rise no higher than the inflation rate. Harvey said it's not known yet how the amendment will be applied in this instance.

Also on the negative side, heavily Republican greater Plymouth is losing its hometown Republican U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, who is retiring, and Democrat William Ford won re-election to a re-drawn district including Plymouth.

Then again, Ford as a candidate

last month won action from the U.S. Postal Service to restore services to the post office on Penniman.

Assistant city manager Paul Sincok suggested legislators should know by the actions of voters last week that politicians should be more in tune with the needs of the public.

Tom Yack is chairman of the Western Townships Utilities Authority which includes Plymouth Township. WTUA is seeking another \$50 million in federal money to offset project start-up costs.

Yack said that while Ford's Republican challenger Bob Geake got more

Ralph Lorenz: 1910-1992

Ralph Lorenz, who died Monday, Nov. 2, at 82, was eulogized on Saturday as a "gentleman with a heart as big as the great outdoors."

More than 200 mourners attended a funeral service for Lorenz, who rescued the then-ailing Mayflower Hotel in 1939 and turned it into the hub of the Plymouth community.

The Rev. Ken Davis, who officiated the service at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Livonia, took note of Lorenz's deep concern for Plymouth.

"He had a vision for the community," Davis said. "He also loved golf, the ponies, Michigan sweet corn and homemade bread."

Davis read comments from the

Lorenz family and friends:

"He never treated me as an employee, but as a friend," Davis quoted. "My dad's lesson in life is to look forward to the next life." "He was a man who provided jobs for hundreds of kids."

"He was a master of body language. One look from him and you knew exactly where you stood." "He filled a void in my life."

Davis said Lorenz talked of death recently, saying: "My life has been an adventure. I can't wait to see what I do, what God has for me out there."

Lorenz's life truly was an adventure. He was born Aug. 11, 1910, in Dolina, Austria. During World War I his family took to the woods to escape the fighting.

Later, the family came to Plymouth, where Lorenz's father found work in the Daisy Air Rifle factory. As a child, Lorenz trapped muskrats and sold the pelts for 75 cents.

Later he attended Eastern Michigan University, where he obtained his first taste of food service work, managing the student union.

Survivors include his wife, Theresa; five children, Staton Lorenz, Sheila Osann, Kirk Lorenz, Ralph Scott Lorenz and Randall Lorenz; two stepdaughters; 13 grandchildren, five step-grandchildren; and a sister, Mary Gillis.

Memorial contributions can be made to the Ralph Lorenz Scholarship Fund at Schoolcraft College.

Mayflower owner Lorenz remembered

Ralph Lorenz, affectionately called the "Burghermeister of Plymouth," will long be remembered for his contributions to the people of Plymouth.

The Austrian-born Lorenz, 82, was buried Saturday from St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Livonia.

For more than 50 years, Lorenz stood at the helm of Plymouth's May-

flower Hotel, earning a national reputation in the process.

"Among all the people in the industry, he ranks as a great leader," Michigan restaurateur Win Schuler

said shortly before Lorenz's 79th birthday. "He has tremendous respect from around the country. He reaches out and takes people in. He is one of the really great civic leaders,

and certainly has put together a fine family."

Longtime friends of the hotelier, promoter, realtor, community booster, developer and property owner commented on Lorenz's life.

"He was a self-made boy, there was just no doubt about it," said Margaret Dunning, 80, who attended Plym-

outh High School with Lorenz. "He was a visionary in the things he could see out there, and he was willing with hard work to make them happen. I thought a lot of Ralph, and he thought a lot of the community. He took many a bump up and down with it, but he was a sincere person."

Preserved hotel

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, credited Lorenz with the preservation of a downtown hotel, "which was very rare in Michigan and throughout the nation. He proved that through a lot of hard hours, and training a lot of young people, you could keep downtown alive."

"Ralph and his family were very individualistic, entrepreneurial and promotional in their ideas," said Pursell. "They've made a major contribution to Plymouth over the years."

Two years ago, Lorenz spoke about his business philosophy. "Anyone can run a hotel when all the rooms are full," he said. "The challenge comes when you have empty rooms. You can't sell yesterday's empty rooms. It takes a lot of imagination, promotion, figuring, plain old hard work, and getting started early in the morning to succeed."

For 35 years, businessman Frank Palmer has eaten two meals a day at the Mayflower. Formerly general manager for a Wiedman Ford dealership, Palmer was closely associated with Lorenz. "Ralph was always interested in one thing: the city of Plymouth. He spent his life worrying about it."

He made friends as well as some enemies along the way, "but the biggest thing people should realize is the man always worked diligently for the city of Plymouth," he said.

"Something people don't even realize is that he's the one who started all of the parking lots we have. The central parking deck was nothing but a mud hole. He got businessmen to chip in with him to build it, and had the city take it over, guaranteeing they'd get so much a year. The same with the Wiedman lot (next door to the hotel)," Palmer said.

Lorenz was one of the individuals who during the Depression worked to re-open the First National Bank of Plymouth, he added. "They got residents to agree that if the bank opened, they wouldn't withdraw more than 10 percent a year until it got going during the Depression."

Credit union started

George Lawton recalled that

Lorenz was instrumental in starting the community credit union, which for a time was housed in the Mayflower Hotel.

The year was 1958 and Daisy Air Rifle, one of the town's major employers, was moving out of state and closing its credit union. "Ralph was one of three or four people who got the charter changed" to convert the facility to the Community Federal Credit Union, said Lawton, the credit union's first general manager. "He was always a real strong supporter."

Former Buick dealer Jack Selle belonged to the Mayflower's Round Table Club, a breakfast and lunch gathering of community leaders originated by Lorenz in the early 1960s.

"We took on the problems of the world and had to solve all of them," said Selle.

"Ralph will be a great loss to the whole city; he did so much for the town, he will always be remembered. He was just a great, great guy, and I will miss him terribly," Selle likened Lorenz to an institution. "He will be here forever in our memories," he said.

Lorenz and John Gaffield of Gaffield Studio Photography came to the Plymouth community about the same time.

He remembers Lorenz giving jobs to high school students; establishing a now nationally known culinary arts program at Schoolcraft College and offering his services as a consultant for Michigan State University's hotel management program.

"I can't think of one person whose interests in all those years were more centered in the downtown Plymouth image," said Gaffield. However he promoted the Mayflower Hotel, he publicized Plymouth. He and his foresight for the future of the Plymouth area will be missed."

Lorenz once turned down an offer from Hilton hotels to head up any hotel in its chain. In 1939, the young manager of the mice-infested, bankrupt Mayflower Hotel eyed potential. Lorenz gained control of the hotel in 1954, buying out the city stockholders. He bought it outright about 10 years later. Wednesday, the Mayflower will celebrate 65 years in business, marking the longest continuous single ownership of a hotel in the state of Michigan.

Missed by friends

Lorenz also will be missed by Realtor J.L. Hudson. Hudson and Lorenz were in the same hospital at the same time a few months ago.

"We were lifelong friends," said Hudson. "I knew Ralph to be a compassionate individual. We shared many ideas over the years. I will greatly miss him."

Sheila Lorenz Osann, one of Ralph and the late Mabel Lorenz's six children, said, "There probably are two things about my dad I will always carry with me. One is that my dad taught me how to play golf. He was a very good golfer. I was in college before I knew there was something to do on Sunday besides go to church and play golf, because that's what we did. He had a great love for it and he passed it on to his whole family."

"In a bigger arena, my dad had an incredible sense of community and how important it was for everybody to be active in the community," Lorenz Osann also is grateful for the business acumen she inherited from her parents. "There are six of us kids, and all of us have been entrepreneurs. There certainly is no question

that was an important thing that was passed around and passed down," she said.

In recognition of his contributions, Lorenz received honorary degrees from Eastern Michigan University and Schoolcraft College. His many honors include a National Senior Entrepreneur of the Year Award from the United States Small Business Administration, presented in 1982 in the Rose Garden of the White House by then-Vice President George Bush.

Lorenz is survived by his wife Theresa; and children Staton of Traverse City; Sheila Lorenz Osann of Grosse Pointe Park; Kirk of Beulah; and Richard, Ralph Scott and Randall, all of Plymouth; step-daughters Danell Dewar of Commerce and Kelly Renard of Hamburg; sister Mary Gillis of Plymouth; 13 grandchildren and five step-grandchildren.

He was buried Saturday from St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Livonia.

The American Legion Passage Gayde Post No. 391 is also scheduled to honor Leo Crane of Plymouth, who was in military training camp in Texas in 1918, soon to go to the front, when the armistice was declared.

Plymouth traffic rerouted

Folks who normally drive Main Street in Plymouth just north of downtown must use a detour for two to three weeks, due to construction of an improved railroad crossing.

Motorists coming into Plymouth via Main must turn right on Amelia Street, left on Farmer, then left on Theodore Street, before turning right on Main.

Motorists leaving the downtown area via Main must turn left on

Theodore, right on Farmer then right on Amelia, before turning left to get back on Main.

The project involves the installation of a rubberized crossing to make for a smoother ride over the railroad tracks at Main.

"It's a blessing, an absolute blessing. We're very happy they went down, especially C. We're happy for the state of Michigan," said Hoedel. "I really commend the entire state and citizens who voted that down. It would have really put an undue burden on their budget to come up with new monies every year to pay out that cut, which would in turn put undue pressures on all schools in the state of Michigan."

The proposals' defeat shows that while "people, of course, would all like to have property tax relief, this wasn't the proper type of property tax relief. A and C

would have caused trickle-down problems for the schools, and in the case of C, real big problems for the state of Michigan. Budgeting is always a growing difficulty; this just would have made it more so."

Hoedel gave high marks to State Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton, who was narrowly defeated in last week's election.

"He was always one to seek input from us, and we would give it to him. We appreciated that. In this last round of state aid bills, we advised our state legislators to vote no, and he did."

Court gets bigger

They're building a room you won't want to enter.

A rising case load has made it necessary to construct a third courtroom at the 35th District Court building in Plymouth. Construction began last spring.

"They've been on schedule all along," said Judy Richardson, court supervisor.

"Everything is identical to the other courtrooms," she said on a recent tour of the \$550,000 court addition, on the south side of the court building on Plymouth Road west of Haggerty.

On a recent weekday, workers laid tile as Richardson showed the prosecutor's office, detention room and main courtroom, with court bench done in wood paneling and laminated plastic.

Once completed, those who use the court won't have to wait as long in the hallways before appearing before the judges.

Retired Circuit Judge Charles Kaufman of Plymouth is scheduled to use the third court room as a part-time judge beginning in January.

"We'll give him the civil cases," said Judge John MacDonald, who organized the push to expand the court building.

He and Judge James Garber will share the other cases assigned to the court.

The state Legislature rejected a bid earlier this year to fund a third judge's salary even though the court is the fifth busiest district court in Michigan by case load.

Because court officials are hiring a retired judge who is getting some compensation from the state, MacDonald said the local court authority will pay \$147 a

day toward the judge's salary, to come out of court proceeds.

"We're still optimistic they'll (legislators) approve a judge in 1995," MacDonald said.

There should be no additional staff costs paid locally to support a third judge, MacDonald said.

"We don't anticipate any increases in staff," he said, adding Judge Kaufman could use a secretary who already works at the court and possibly a new system by which a video camera is used instead of a court reporter.

The court addition was paid for out of court proceeds collected in recent years for construction. Those proceeds are normally returned to the communities served by the court — greater Plymouth, greater Northville and Canton.

After working for several years to expand the court, MacDonald said he's pleased it's finally happening.

"It feels great, it has to be done here," he said.

Policy expected to help patients

Soon there may be in place a new policy allowing terminally ill residents choosing to die at home to have the peaceful death for which they have prepared.

A task force of hospice workers, public safety officials and representatives of the Wayne County Coroner's office and the prosecutor's office have been working to establish guidelines more suited to handling the death of a hospice patient. They anticipate these guidelines will be in place soon.

Under current guidelines, when anyone dies at home the police, emergency personnel and the coroner are called to the home. They often may try to revive the individual, or they may begin an investigation of the death by gathering various bits of evidence from the deceased.

"The traditional way is not the right way," said Canton Township Public Safety Director John Santomauro who served on the task force. "What worked in the past does not necessarily work now."

Under new guidelines, an individual under hospice care can be declared dead by a hospice nurse. A phone call from the nurse to the coroner's office will result in a case file number which would allow family members to release the body to a funeral director without further investigation by the coroner.

A similar task force was formed several years ago without much progress. Santomauro said there is now a better understanding of the problem and so the parties have been able to reach agreement. Canton Township has been operating a similar policy for nearly a year.

"These guidelines are right, safe and compassionate," said Maureen Butrico, executive director of Hospice Services of Western Wayne County. "Families want the moment of death to be peaceful and private. Death, for them, is expected. They don't want the intrusion of sirens and strangers in the home."

The safety personnel are very kind when they come to the home and the families are usually willing to step aside and let them do their jobs, but the emergency stop is unnecessary as far as they are concerned and may prevent response to a real emergency, Butrico said.

While it would not be necessary to call emergency personnel at the time of death, family members may still call 9-1-1 if they are uncertain or nervous.

It would be the hospice nurse's job when she arrives at the home to pronounce death at a certain time and observe surroundings to determine if there may have been foul play involved. Butrico believes the hospice nurse would be better able to assess this situation than police because the nurse has known the family throughout the patient's sickness. If there are suspicious circumstances, the nurse can contact safety personnel.

As with most communities, one of Santomauro's chief concerns has been liability and leaving the department open to legal action when not responding to the home.

"It's taken a lot of people and a lot of unity to arrive at this conclusion," Santomauro said. "We've called in our insurance carriers as part of the task force and they find the policy to be sound."

Legislative action is not required at this point, but Butrico hopes that all hospice agencies and communities can arrive at the same conclusion and adopt these guidelines.

"We've been working very slowly and thoroughly to make sure this agreement serves all parties involved," Butrico said.

Karen Dorney, a hospice nurse for nearly three years, agrees that this new policy would be best for the hospice patient and family.

"Many of these families are fearful of this outside involvement at the end of life," Dorney said. "They consider it an invasion, almost a violation."

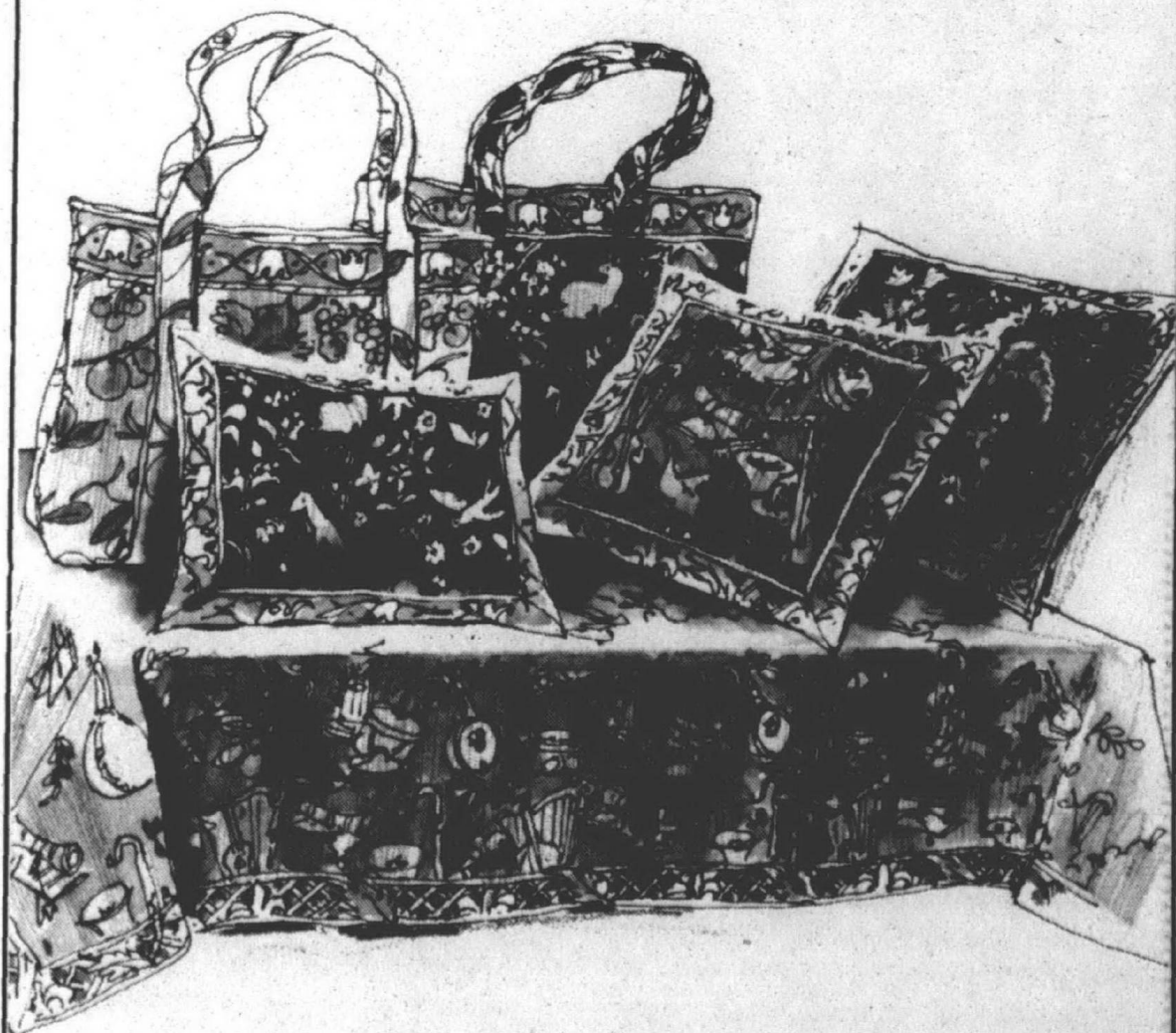

votes in WTUA communities, federal help for WTUA would also aid the Ypsilanti area. Voters there voted more heavily for Ford, in an area that also benefits from WTUA, as the project is tied into a Ypsilanti-based system.

"It could mean potentially lower rates," Yack said, for users of the Ypsilanti-based system if WTUA gets federal aid.

In Plymouth, the rejection of an amendment to allow department heads to live outside the city poses a problem for Police Chief Bob Scoggins, of Canton, and

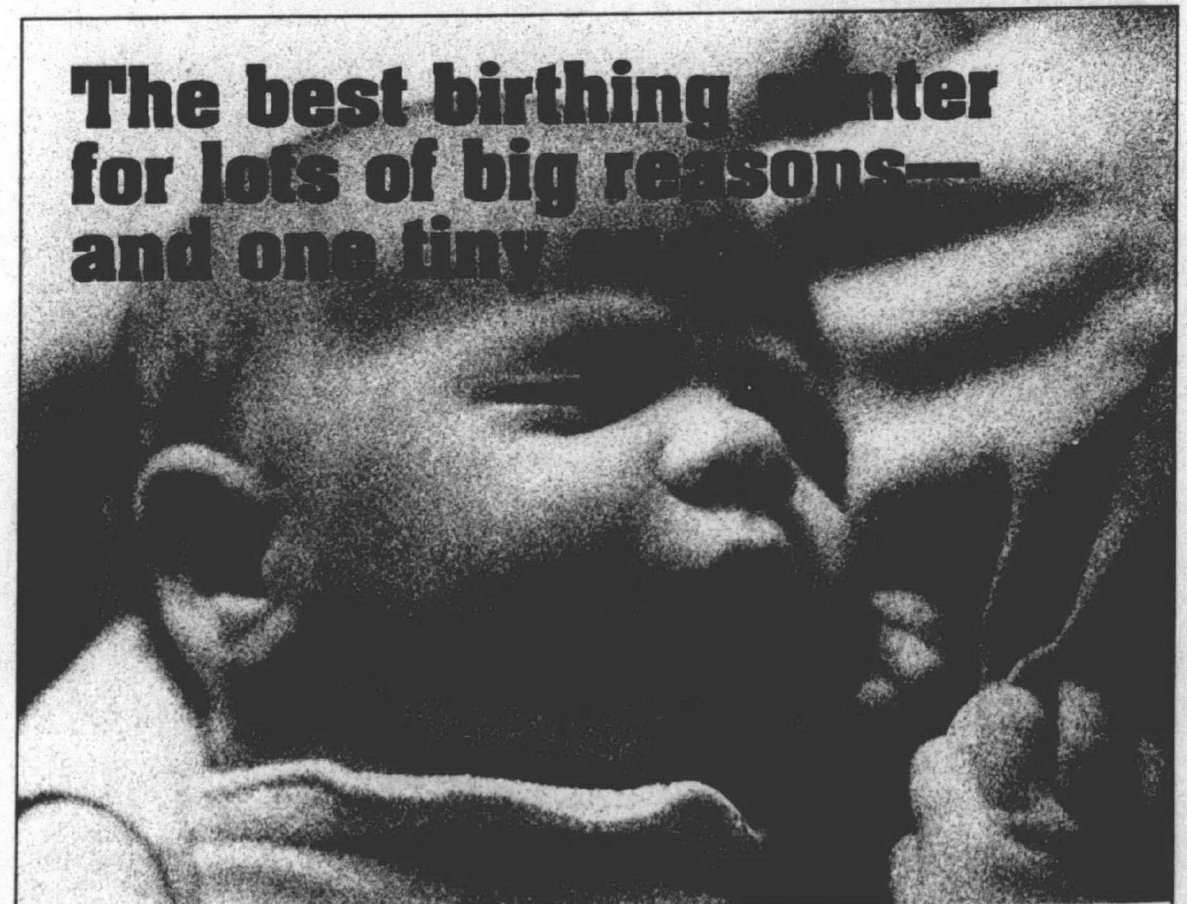

State Senate corrects legal flaw in teen abortion bill

It took the state Senate three hours and one minute to repair the parental consent abortion law.

Three hours of beating down pro-choice amendments.

One minute — with no debate — to fix a flaw that caused a judge to declare the 1990 voter-passed law unenforceable.

Senate action was a going-away gift to Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton, who sponsored the bill passed by the House in September. Kosteva, though a steady supporter of restrictions on abortion, lost his re-election bid Nov. 3 to a Right-to-Life endorsed candidate.

"The only reason we're here is that a Kalamazoo circuit judge said we had to define emergency," said Sen. Jack Welborn, R-Kalamazoo, floor manager of the bill.

Gov. John Engler is expected to sign it promptly, enabling the state to require pregnant girls under age 18 to obtain either parental permission or a probate judge's waiver to obtain an abortion.

Senators voted 26-8 in favor. Supporters included Republicans Michael Bouchard of Birmingham, Mat Dunaskiss of Lake Orion, David Honigman of West Bloomfield and Democrat George Z. Hart of Dearborn.

Opposed was Democrat Jack Faxon of Farmington Hills.

Missing the vote were Robert Geake, R-Northville, and William Faust, D-Westland. Both had excused absences.

Men bawled out

The debate over amendments drew a steady stream of invective from pro-choice Sen. Lana Pollack, D-Ann Arbor.

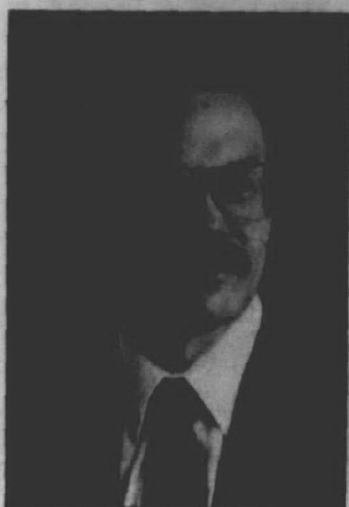
Pollack bawled out "all you

men who can't get pregnant and are chatting . . . all you men who did it with young women and went home to brag about it, leaving her alone and forcing these young women to get second and third trimester abortions."

Pollack condemned the bill as "Big Brother . . . totalitarian . . . People's Republic of China . . . It's an extremely long reach of government's arm to force families to participate in a decision."

She directed her bitterest fire to Sen. Harry Gast, R-St. Joseph, who asked that members of the Appropriations Committee be excused five minutes from the floor session to clean up a couple of minor bills. Pollack and Faxon are member of Appropriations.

"An insult," said Pollack, referring to Gast as a "misogynist" (woman-hater).

"The majority (Republicans) are playing havoc with our caucus," added Faxon.

Finally the Senate simply recessed so that no debate could be conducted while the Appropriations Committee met.

The original law allowed a pregnant girl to bypass her parents and probate court for an "emergency." As enacted, Kosteva's bill drops the word emergency in favor of "medical emer-

S'craft to begin search for 2 new board members

Depressed candidates who lost their contests Nov. 3 take heart.

The Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees is poised to accept applications to fill positions left vacant by the elections of Thaddeus McCotter and Jeanne Stempien.

McCotter was elected to the Wayne County Commission and Stempien to the Wayne County Circuit Court last Tuesday. Each will assume office on Jan. 1.

The procedure for replacing them on the Schoolcraft board goes like this: McCotter and Stempien must submit their official resignations. McCotter said he'll resign whenever the board wants him to.

"Whatever the board considers best for the process is fine with me," he said.

Stempien said she'll make her resignation effective Dec. 31 and

send it to the college in a few days.

Then the board will advertise for applicants, interview applicants and appoint two of the applicants to the vacant seats.

The new members will then be up for election next June, as will trustee Patricia Watson, who was appointed to fill a vacancy in October 1991.

Trustee Mary Breen said the board generally gets 10-12 applications when vacancies occur. The record is 27.

College president Richard McDowell said he'll be happy to accept applications after Nov. 18. "I'm confident we'll have those seats filled by the end of January," he said.

To be eligible to serve on the Schoolcraft board a person must be a registered voter and live in the Plymouth-Canton, Livonia, Garden City, Clarenceville, Northville or part of the Novi school districts.

Celebrity teases musician

His name is Michael Jackson. He looks like Roy Orbison. And surprisingly, like these celebrities, he is a musician.

This Canton Township musician, at age 46, humorously maintains that he's the original Michael Jackson.

At 17, he was playing bass guitar professionally when the famous Jackson was in kindergarten.

And like his namesake, this Jackson was introduced to music by his father when he was eight or nine years old. He took saxophone and guitar lessons in high school and went on to play professionally with the Flaming Embers. They cut the number one hit titled "Westbound Number Nine" when he was about 17 and he also recorded the album "Sunshine" with that group.

Next came several different bands with which Jackson performed at weddings, banquets and bars. He more recently was a member of the oldies band, The Larados, and he appeared at a number of Detroit area hotels and auto shows with that group. He left the Larados when he was unable to travel as extensively as their schedule required.

In his off-stage life, Jackson is married, has three daughters, and has worked for United Airlines for the last 25 years directing the loading and unloading of cargo, and he also serves as a union committee person.

Through the years, Jackson has continued to play bass guitar on the weekends, staying with rock and roll until around age 30, and then appearing in all sorts of variety bands.

"I enjoy the music and I enjoy sticking a few extra dollars in my pocket," he said.

Tucked safely away in his basement are a number of memorabilia from his musical interest, in-

cluding concocted pictures friends have put together of Jackson's face on well known musicians' bodies, including some of his namesake.

As for living with the name Michael Jackson, the Canton musician says he has to maintain his sense of humor.

"Some weeks I've gotten as many as 15 crank calls," he said. "It's mostly young girls making a comment, or several (girls) singing a popular Michael Jackson song. Some I've gotten a good laugh about."

"I'm that way anyway," he said. "I try to make the best of any situation. I enjoy a good laugh and I enjoy generating a good laugh or two."

He and his family got a good laugh about 10 years ago, not long after the famous Jackson hit it big on his own in the music business. He made reservations for "Michael Jackson and family" at Disneyland in California. When they arrived, there was an entourage of 15 or so people clearly expecting the celebrity and a suite of rooms had been reserved.

"When we went to check in, the man at the desk was noticeably disappointed with me," Jackson recalls. "I had given my Detroit address, and someone picked up on the name."

That someone must have known that Jackson the celebrity got his start with Detroit's Motown Records.

Jackson said he thought it was cool when the famous Jackson hit

it big.

"I knew there would be times when I got some attention over it," he said. "And there have been times when I've wished my name wasn't Michael Jackson, like when I'm in a crowd."

For that reason, he goes by Mike Jackson, he said, and oftentimes people don't pick up on it. Yet the bands he has played with often make a point of his name, saying something like, "We have Michael Jackson playing with us tonight!"

Jackson says of his namesake, "He's a very talented person and I like his singing and dancing."

He goes on to chuckle about people who have asked him to moon dance, which he can't do.

"I'm not a dancer at all," Jackson said, and he feels that's because for years he's watched men dancing while he's on stage playing bass guitar, and has observed that, in general, "men don't seem to have it," on the dance floor.

Jackson has come to realize he's far from alone in living with a famous name. There is even another Michael Jackson working at the airport. When he recently picked up an absentee election ballot, he stood in line behind a man named Rod Stewart. And a teller at his local bank told him she'd been anxious to meet him, because she had assisted other bank customers named Elizabeth Taylor and Robert Redford.

It's all in the name.

Battle has begun over next county board chair

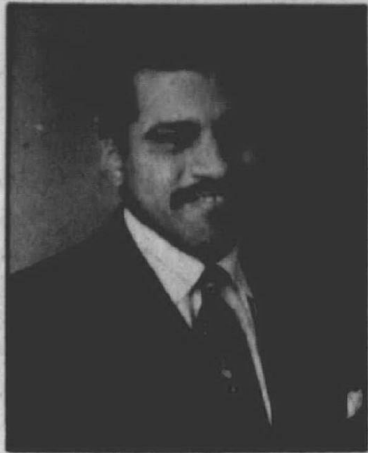
Several members of the Wayne County Commission made a punching bag out of commissioner Bryan Amann, D-Canton, last week for comments he made to the Observer and a letter to the editor he sent to a downriver newspaper.

In a surprise move, commission Chairman Arthur Blackwell, D-Detroit, read Amann's letter aloud at the beginning of the commission meeting Thursday.

Among Amann's more controversial comments were:

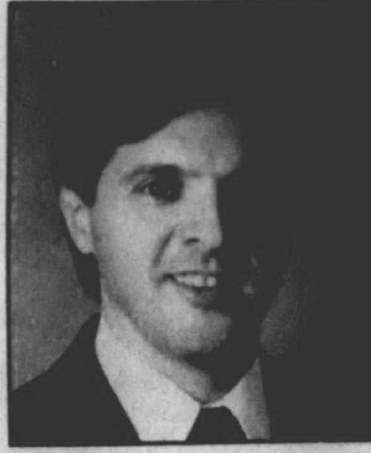
■ "The commission seems hell bent on adopting every self-destructive practice allegedly employed east of the Potomac: ballooning payrolls, political bickering causing a policy gridlock, subterfuge to conceal tax dollars spent for personal political gain and outdated bureaucratic rules that give one commissioner (the chairman) enough power to hold the legislative branch of Wayne County hostage to personal whims."

■ "The chairman has the sole authority to allocate more money to each commissioner over and above their annual \$65,000 office

wrong. It's frustrating just being part of it."

Breen liked it

In an interview Friday, commissioner Maurice Breen, R-Plymouth, who also represents Livonia, said the article was "not particularly" inaccurate. "If we don't like what we read it's always inaccurate."

The commissioners also got on Amann during Thursday's meeting for saying in the article that an audit of the commission budget has never been done. Amann believes that the audit is needed to see if there's any money going out to "ghost employees" who don't really work for the commission.

Auditor General Ramona Henderson said an operations audit of the commission was done three years ago when Blackwell became chairman. However, she added, a "fraud audit" would have to be conducted to find the alleged ghost employees.

Breen, who was not re-elected and will leave the commission after Dec. 31, said Thursday's brouhaha was mostly "political infighting" among commission Democrats.

Amann also noted that the commission has the opportunity to elect a new chairman in January and alter rules that allegedly give the chairman "dictatorial powers."

Said Blackwell, "I found this letter very disappointing. I worked very hard to have an equal commission. I didn't know I had all that power. I'll put my record

up against (Amann's) or anyone else's."

Blackwell added that Amann's letter smacked of racism. Amann disputed that charge when he was permitted to defend himself near the end of the meeting. "Accountability isn't a racial issue," he said. "There's not one word in that letter intended to be racially divisive."

Sticks and stones

Amann also reminded Blackwell of an incident last year when the chairman, during a public meeting, called Amann "the

David Duke of Wayne County." Blackwell apologized for that remark Thursday and said he had been responding to Amann having referred to him as an "emperor."

The commissioners went on to criticize Amann and the Observer for an article published Nov. 2 on the commission's attempt to raise its part of the county budget from \$6 million to \$6.9 million. "This ain't the truth," said commissioner George Cushingberry Jr. of the article.

Commissioner Kay Beard, D-Westland, who also represents Garden City, added: "Those kind

of statements (that Amann made in the Nov. 2 article and the letter) are absolutely irresponsible. We need to have a little more responsibility in the statements we make to the press."

In the article, Amann complained about the commission voting to increase its budget and take money from a foster care fund that's supposed to be saved pending the outcome of a legal battle.

WHY DELAY SURGERY?

It may be true that "if it ain't broke, don't fix it." However, "if it is broke, fix it now," is not equally correct for advocating a joint replacement. One problem is that intervention may not work. No operation is so straightforward that nothing can go wrong; no orthopedist will state that he has never experienced failure.

Furthermore, even with the most scrupulous attention to detail, infection may occur and ruin an otherwise excellent operation. Or, your surgical site may not heal as expected. You could lay down thick tissue whose presence prevents unrestricted joint movement.

The bone in which the replacement sets, for reasons unclear, might give way, causing instability of the new joint. Instances occur when the replacement appears properly positioned but you cannot move it freely or without pain.

If you have more than one joint impaired, you may have difficulty in postoperative rehabilitation. An arthritic shoulder or hand could interfere with use of a walker for exercise after a knee replacement.

Thus, you can have arthritis that hasn't responded to medicine or therapy yet find yourself reluctant to proceed to operation.

You are right to wait. Unexpectedly you may improve. Most likely, you will continue to lose mobility and note increasing pain. A time will come when surgery, no matter how much a hazard, will constitute a help.

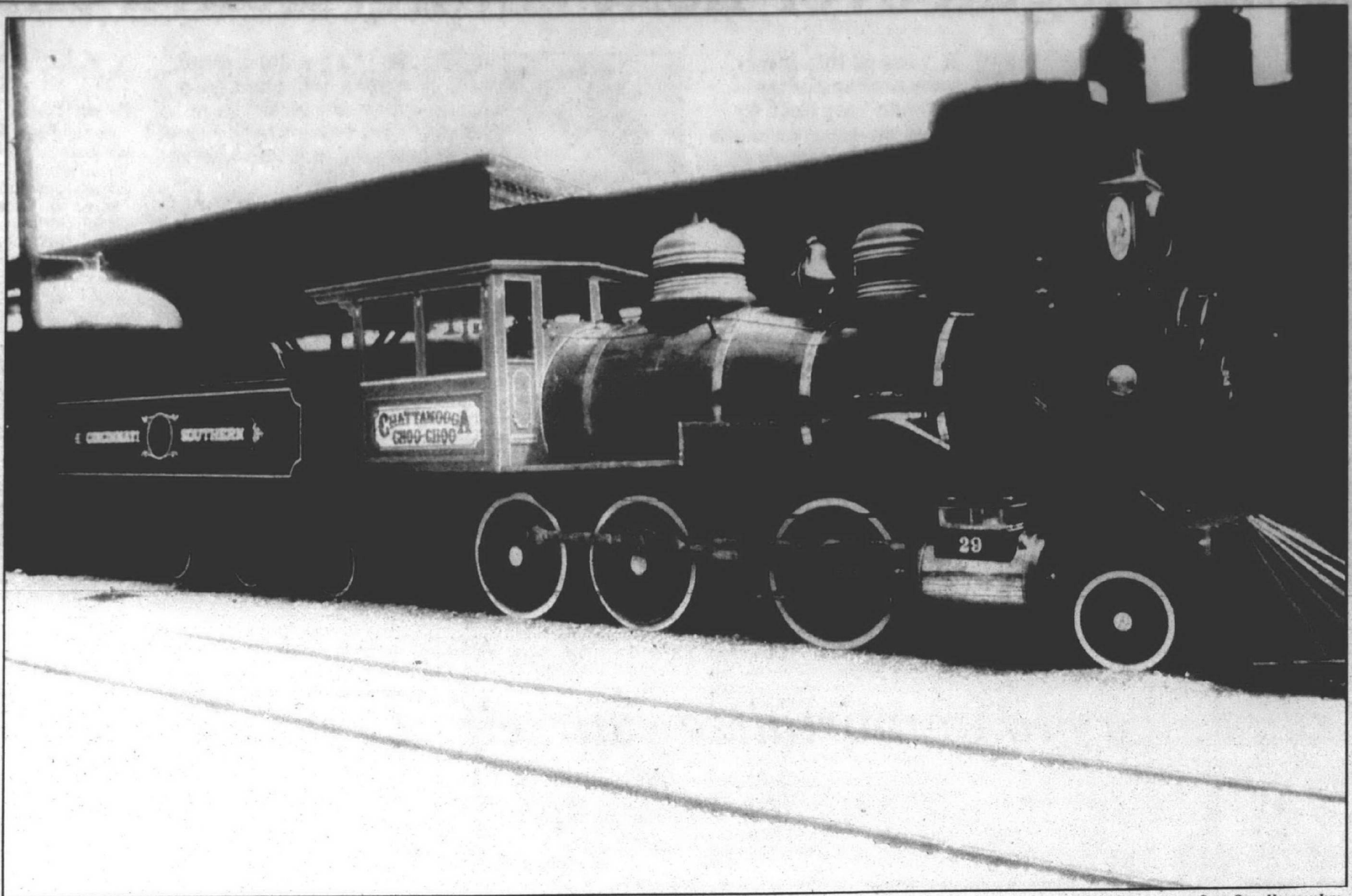
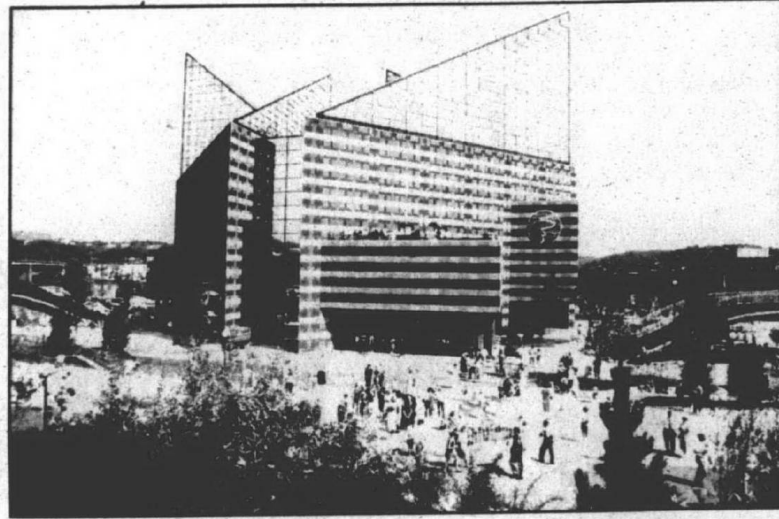

Mention Chattanooga and everyone thinks of one thing, but there's much more to this surprising city in the hills of southern Tennessee than the Chattanooga Choo-choo.

In fact, the last passenger train stopped rolling in 1970 and the old railroad station has been turned into a rather remarkable hotel and repository of railroad lore. But from its enormously successful new \$45 million aquarium to its Civil War landmarks to some venerable natural attractions in and around the city, Chattanooga is becoming an increasingly popular destination.

The biggest new draw is the Tennessee Aquarium, billed as the world's largest aquarium to focus on freshwater habitats. On

the banks of the Tennessee River, the aquarium with its environmentally sensitive setting has helped draw attention to the city's efforts to clean up its air and water. The main problem has been accommodating the crowds, and peak periods bring lengthy waits.

But fall, when the heat cools down and the lush hills are covered in dazzling colors, is always a good time to visit either the city or the mountains, caverns and scenic roads a short drive away.

Events

Events in town include the Chattanooga Symphony and Opera Association, which performs works by Mozart and Saint-Saens on Nov. 19 and 20 at the beautifully restored Tivoli Theater, 709 Broad St. The concerts begin at 8

p.m., and admission ranges from \$10 to \$34. For more information, call 615-267-8583 or 615-756-8687.

Until Nov. 14, the Chattanooga Little Theater will be performing "The Diary of Anne Frank" at the Little Theater, 400 River St. Tickets cost \$10, \$8 for students and \$6 for children; performances start at 8 p.m. with a 2:30 matinee Sundays. For information, call 615-267-8534 or 615-756-8687.

Sightseeing

The Tennessee Aquarium, 1 Broad St., 615-265-0695, has really put Chattanooga on the map as a tourist destination, and with good reason.

Beginning with a soaring re-creation of the Tennessee River's source in the Appalachian high country forest and tracing its path

through the Mississippi Delta, the 130,000-square-foot aquarium includes 4,000 fish and 300 species in seven major freshwater tanks and two terrestrial environments. Open every day except Thanksgiving and Christmas from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Admission is \$8.75; \$4.75 for children 3 to 12, and free for children under 3.

Another popular destination is the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park, 10 miles south of Chattanooga in Fort Oglethorpe, Ga., on U.S. Highway 27, 706-866-9241.

There are 1,400 monuments along the 7-mile park drive, and in the summer park rangers give exhibitions and talks. In the visitors center a truly first-rate film chronicles the 1863 Civil War battle and the men who fought it. The film costs \$2.25 for adults, \$1

for senior citizens and children under 16. Open daily except Christmas; winter, 8 a.m. to 4:45 p.m.; summer 8 a.m. to 5:45 p.m. Admission is free.

More-dedicated Civil War buffs might also want to take in the Confederama-Hall of History, 3742 Tennessee Ave., 615-821-2812, a more modest but still intriguing re-creation of the local Civil War history. Like the military park, it sells a large assortment of Civil War books, documents and related items. Open daily 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; June 1 to Labor Day, 8:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. Admission is \$4; \$2 for children 6 to 12.

Perhaps the most famous of Chattanooga's scenic attractions is Rock City, 1400 Patten Road on Lookout Mountain just outside town, 706-820-2531. The 60-year-old 10-acre attraction features unusual rock formations, exhibits for children and a lover's leap with a dazzling view that on a clear day is said to look out over seven states. Open every day except Christmas from 8:30 until sundown. Admission is \$7.50; \$3.75 for children 3 to 12 and free for children under 3.

Not far away on Lookout Mountain is Ruby Falls on State Highway 148, 615-821-2544, a remarkable cavern and 145-foot, multicolored underground waterfall with lots of activities for children. Open daily from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. April through October; 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. from November through March. Admission is \$7.25; \$3.25 for children 6 to 12.

Also nearby is the Lookout Mountain Incline Railway, 3917 St. Elmo Ave., with a ride up Lookout Mountain that's billed as the world's steepest passenger

railway — a grade of 72.7 percent near the top). The mile-long ride up and down the mountain takes about 10 minutes. Round trip: \$6, \$3 for children 3 to 12.

Attractions indoors include the Houston Museum of Decorative Arts, 201 High St., 615-267-7176, which houses the collection of the local antiques dealer Anna Safley Houston and includes furniture, porcelain, glass and textile pieces from the 18th to the 20th centuries. Admission is free. Open Tuesday to Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and Sunday from 2 to 4:30 p.m.

The city's main art museum is the Hunter Museum of Art, 10 Bluff View, 615-267-0968, part of which is housed in a lovely mansion once the home of the Coca-Cola magnate and philanthropist George Thomas Hunter.

In addition to the collection, which is particularly strong on art of the Southeast, there's a lovely sculpture garden with a view overlooking the Tennessee River and Macellan Island Wildlife Sanctuary. Open Tuesday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; Sunday 1 to 4:30 p.m. An admission donation of \$2 is suggested for adults; \$1 for children.

A popular shopping spot downtown is Warehouse Row, 1110 Market St., 615-267-1111, converted turn-of-the-century railroad warehouses that have been transformed into more than 30 designer outlet stores featuring merchandise 20 percent to 75 percent below retail for labels such as Albert Nipon, Perry Ellis, Adrienne Vittadini and Ralph Lauren. Open Monday to Saturday, 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Sunday, noon to 6 p.m.

Don't shutter when trying to focus on new cameras

Trying to keep up with changes in today's camera technology is a bit like attempting to stay on top of the airfares.

They change quickly, with little rhyme or reason. It seems yesterday's model is obsolete today.

What's a buyer to do? One answer is to turn to an expert, such as Robert Rattner, a professional photojournalist who specializes in travel and nature photography for magazines such as Audubon, Smithsonian, Time and the late European Travel & Life. He also writes a photo column for Events U.S.A.

"There are basically three types of cameras now," says Rattner. "There are simple point-and-shoot models that have a fixed focus. These are really one step removed from an instamatic or even the old box Brownie.

"Then there are the point-and-shoot cameras with auto focus and a variety of other features. These have become so sophisticated that camera owners who have SLRs (single-lens reflex

cameras) are trading in their cameras for them.

"The SLRs have gotten very fancy — but they've also gotten more expensive."

The biggest market is for the second group, the point-and-shoot cameras with automatic focus. They've gotten sophisticated enough to satisfy most amateur photographers, Rattner says. The only problem with them is choice. There are about a dozen manufacturers each offering about half a dozen models. To the untrained eye these cameras all look like variations on the same function.

But Rattner points out they can be very different.

"You should look for a number of things when you go to buy a point-and-shoot camera. First of all, make sure the lens is protected when you're not using it. Secondly, look at the camera's specifications to find out what film

speeds it will take.

"Most film has DX or digital coding, which allows the camera to read the film speed off the film canister. The simpler cameras may only have two actual settings — say, ISO 100 and 400.

"So if you intend to use film that's ISO 64 or 1000, you're out of luck."

The automatic-focus option also differs among camera models, he says.

"Active auto focus means the camera shoots out an infrared beam that hits the subject and returns to the camera. It means you must center your subject in the viewfinder. Put the subject to the side and the camera focuses on the background.

"Some cameras have 'focus lock' that allows you to focus on the subject and then move the camera. There are others with 'multibeam focus,' which means the camera focuses on five or more large spots in the picture and makes 'focus lock,' unnecessary."

When it comes to the flash mode, Rattner says it's important

to choose a camera that allows you to turn the flash on manually in order to use a 'fill-in flash' for illuminating outdoor subjects in daylight.

Another feature he mentions is "red-eye reduction."

"A tiny beam is flashed moments before the camera's flash goes off. This causes the human pupil to close down and consequently greatly reduces the chance of your subject looking red-eyed in the photograph. It's a good feature to look for."

The zoom lens is also found on many models, he says.

"It's a wonderful feature. Generally speaking, the 35mm to 70mm and the 35mm to 90mm range are good. There are good 35mm to 105mm (models) around as well, but you'll pay a lot more to jump from 90mm to 105mm and I don't think it's worth it.

So what particular models does Rattner recommend — and for whom?

He enjoys the Pentax IQZoom series, in which the model 60-X lists for \$230. The model 90-WR is "a very good camera, which is

weather-resistant as well. It's a good feature to have." It lists for \$350.

The Olympus Infinity series also "has always been extremely reliable and is known for its good metering." The Infinity Tele has two lenses: a 35mm and a 70mm, allowing for both wide-angle and telephoto shots. It's \$240.

The Olympus Stylus is "a wonderful" camera, with a fixed 35mm lens, red-eye reduction and a compact size. It's \$225.

Rattner also likes Minolta's Freedom series. The Freedom Escort, with a fixed 34mm lens, priced at \$188, is "a good, simple camera."

Barbour (now retired and living in Arizona) turned over an undisclosed sum of money to Schoolcraft for the purpose of creating an "endowment fund" that will likely provide an annual \$400 scholarship to industrious students in the health field for years to come.

Why health?

Barbour's late wife, Loraine, developed Alzheimer's and he found that hiring a trained health care aide wasn't easy. Also, while the couple lived in Plymouth, Loraine volunteered for the Red Cross and at area hospitals.

"I don't want any publicity," Barbour said. "But if telling my story gives someone else the idea to help students, go ahead."

With his gift to the college, Barbour joined 21 other individuals and organizations who have set up endowment funds to provide scholarships or to buy equipment.

Died young

Among the other Schoolcraft benefactors are Livonia residents Marge and Robert Polley, whose daughter, Cindy Lee, was killed in a traffic accident in 1990.

A 1989 graduate of Stevenson High School, Cindy was a freshman at Schoolcraft studying culinary management when she died.

Seeing as how Cindy had been attending college thanks to several scholarships, her parents established the Cindy Lee Polley Memorial Scholarship endowment fund in the amount of \$3,000. Since then the Polleys have added almost \$800 to that.

The donated money is invested and generally earns 7 percent interest, said Schoolcraft spokeswoman Sandra "Sam" Florek. The interest income is then put to good use for the college, or the scholarship winners.

An additional 20 people or organizations have set up scholar-

ships with Schoolcraft, whereby a cash donation is made to the college every year to pay for a scholarship.

But not everyone who gives a scholarship endowment to Schoolcraft wants to be publicly recognized.

About a year ago an individual who requested anonymity walked into the college offices unannounced with a check to establish an endowment scholarship in the name of Eileen Moore.

"For someone to just come in off the street with that kind of money is just incredible," Florek said. "There are few shocks in this business, and that was one of them."

Moore graduated from Schoolcraft in 1970 with an associate's degree in nursing. Four years later she died of cancer. "I really miss Eileen," the anonymous donor said. "She was the best buddy I ever had."

The donor, who is very much

alive, also asked Schoolcraft not to reveal the amount of money given for the endowment.

No heirs

Other people, like Garden City resident Jerry Young, who died in 1984, start Schoolcraft endowments by naming the college in their wills.

A Chrysler tool and die worker for more than 30 years, Young was widowed in retirement and had no children to leave his money to.

So in his will Young left \$65,000 to Schoolcraft to establish a \$50,000 technology scholarship endowment, an \$8,000 endowment to fund senior citizen programs and a \$7,000 endowment to pay for widow and widower programs (like grief seminars).

Not all scholarships are paid for with endowments, however. Schoolcraft also has something called "trustee scholarships," paid for out of the college's general fund.

New committees entice lawmakers

Area legislators are optimistically looking to move up the ranks in the State Capitol, even though control of the House of Representatives is still in doubt.

"I'm interested in adding another committee," said Sen. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham. He chairs Education. "I'd like to combine (work on) Finance and Education," he said.

"I have no desire to change, but I might think about moving over to finance," said Sen. David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield. He's already chair of both Labor and Local Government.

Reason: Although no Senate

elections were held this year, Republican Nick Smith, chair of both the Finance and Agriculture committees, was elected to Congress and will leave Dec. 31.

Sen. Doug Carl, R-Utica, failed in his bid for Congress, but his consolation prize is that he's in line to succeed Smith on Finance, which writes the tax laws.

"I'd say one-fourth of our caucus has expressed an interest" in the Finance Committee, said Senate majority leader Dick Posthumus, R-Alto. Posthumus promised a committee reshuffling "by the end of the month."

gency," defining it as:

"That condition which, on the basis of a physician's good faith clinical judgment, so complicates the medical condition of a pregnant woman as to necessitate an immediate abortion of that woman's pregnancy to avert her death or for which a delay in performing an abortion will create serious risk of substantial and irreversible impairment of a major bodily function."

Amendments lose

Senators lunched at their desks and canceled other committee meetings to debate amendments, mostly from Pollack and Debbie Stabenow, D-Lansing. Most got eight to 10 votes, with 20 needed for adoption.

Some rejected amendments would have:

■ Allowed a 17-year-old who will be 18 during her first trimester to obtain an abortion without consent.

■ Exempted girls from obtaining permission when their parents are in jail.

POINTS OF VIEW

Taxpayers will pay for education funding cuts

QUESTION: I am a central office administrator. I understand citizens concern about taxes. But cuts are devastating to our school district. And when I take that position with citizens I get the, "We heard that song before." Please write some of your observations from your many years of experience in education.

Answer: Doc Doyle's Observations:
 1. Money taken away by government agencies (whether by a reduced tax base or whatever) will never be reimbursed to the local school district by the government. Basis for Observation:
 ■ In the '50s it was decided young people must have a driver education course. It was fully funded by the government and car dealers donated cars. Today local districts pay the tab and, in most cases, cars are leased. Local districts ended up with the tab (at taxpayers expense).
 ■ In the '50s, after Sputnik, the NDEA (National Education Defense Act) was

passed to upgrade science and math teaching (and to fully fund state of the art (expensive) science equipment for all schools. Some teacher training took place, but local districts ended up paying the tab for equipment (at tax payers expense).
 ■ In the '60s, the Vocational Education Act was passed to fully fund a national state of the art vocational and industrial arts program, including major equipment purchases for school districts. The act soon dissipated to the point that local districts ended up paying the tab (at taxpayers expense).
 ■ In the '60s President John F. Kennedy pushed through the long needed Special Education Act and government paid much of the tab. Today, local school districts, in consortium with Intermediate School Districts, pay the tab (at taxpayers expense).
 2. The reduction of property tax to (hopefully) spur new business will deci-

mate public education as it has been known in Michigan. Basis for Observation:
 ■ Trenton (where I grew up as a boy) will lose \$19 million over five years. Trenton's budget today is about 19 million. Trenton, a financially solvent district, has about 3,200 students. Now imagine what poor districts are faced with. Disaster!
 ■ School districts will be faced with: (1) Pay for play for all activities (drama, band, etc). (2) More laid off teachers (which translates into huge class sizes). (3) A shut down of all enriching services such as the media center (the library), gifted and talented programs, field trips, etc. (4) Parents will be furnishing their own transportation to get their kids to school in some districts. I know these are the same arguments you heard at the last millage election, but citizens this is reality... the real world.
 3. If one of Engler's motives is to break

the teacher's union (MEA), he should consider legislation rather than destroying the education of our children.
 ■ If union busting is one of his goals, he should promote legislation to address teacher strikes, blue flu, slow-downs. Today there are no financial penalties to teachers who strike... just make up the days. Many states are moving in the "dock pay for days missed... right or wrong!"
 4. The MEA has performed masterfully for teachers and children over the years but times have changed.
 I believe Engler wants to restore the state's economy. However, with no clear plan to re-fund school districts, the millions of dollars that would be taken away will never be re-couped from local taxpayers.

Dems dominate education posts, Greenleaf is 4th in board race

State Board of Education president Dorothy Beardmore was the lone Republican to survive a Democratic sweep of education posts.

Beardmore, 65, of Rochester Hills, won a second eight-year term on the state's education policymaking body.

Republican Harry Greenleaf, 56, of Livonia, finished fourth in his State Board of Education race. The Ford Motor Co. engineering personnel manager remains on the Schoolcraft College board.

Voters Tuesday picked two candidates apiece for each of four education boards.

Winners in the university board races were: Rebecca McGowan of Ann Arbor and Larry Deitch of Bloomfield Hills for the University of Michigan Board of Regents; Dorothy Gonzales of East Lansing and Bob Traxler of Bay City for the Michigan State Board of Trustees and Denise Lewis of Detroit and Edgar Scribner of St. Clair Shores for Wayne State University Board of Governors.

Among other Observer & Eccentric area candidates:

- Deitch, 45, of Bloomfield Hills, state Democratic party treasurer, made his first try for public office.
- Melanie Reinhold, 37, of Bloomfield Hills, lost her bid for

the Michigan State University Board of Trustees. A landscape company owner, she was appointed by Gov. John Engler in 1991.

Here's how Livonia, Plymouth, Canton, Redford, Westland and Garden City voted in the state board and university elections:

Garden City and Westland voters followed the statewide trend and selected Democrats for all university board posts. Voters also selected Kathleen Straus and Roman Bochenek for state board. In both communities, voters selected Gov. Bill Clinton over George Bush for president.

In Redford, voters split their choices for university board seats between Democrats and Republicans. Redford voters selected McGowan and Nancy Laro for U-M Board of Regents; Reinhold and Gonzales for MSU Board of Trustees and Lewis and GOP incumbent George Bashara at WSU. Redford voters favored Straus and Beardmore for the state board of education. Redford voters also favored Bush over Clinton in presidential balloting.

Livonia, Canton Township, Plymouth and Plymouth Township voters were solidly in the GOP column in all races last Tuesday - including all education posts. Beardmore led the balloting in these areas, Greenleaf

placed second.

Here is the complete tabulation of education races, with the first two names being winners:

State Board — Kathleen Straus, D-Detroit, 1,868,645; Beardmore, 1,614,961; also, Roman Bochenek, D-Detroit, 1,578,897; and Greenleaf, 1,442,723. The board goes from a 5-3 Republican majority to a 4-4 deadlock in 1993.

U-M regents — Rebecca McGowan, D-Ann Arbor, 1,842,399; Deitch, 1,608,802; also Nancy Laro, R-Ann Arbor, 1,548,579; and Neil Nielsen, 1,411,009. Nielsen is an incumbent. Democrats raised their margin to 6-2.

MSU trustees — Dorothy Gonzales, D-Lansing, 1,816,939; Bob Traxler, D-Bay City, 1,702,108; also Reinhold, 1,595,244; and Dean Pridgeon, R-Montgomery, 1,414,807. Reinhold and Pridgeon were incumbents. Democrats take 5-3 control.

Wayne State University — Denise J. Lewis, D-Detroit, 1,798,320; Edgar A. Scribner, D-St. Clair Shores, 1,594,559; also George Bashara, R-Grosse Pointe Shores, 1,435,232; Kevin Fobbs, R-Detroit, 1,406,878. Bashara is an incumbent. Democrats take 6-2 control.

Grandstand tickets available for parade

For the 65th year, spectators may view the parade at no charge along Woodward Avenue, or they

This year's parade will feature two new giant inflatable balloons and eight new floats, including the return of Doodlebug. Other parade favorites like Chilly Willy,

The Nutcracker and Santa will march their traditional route heading south on Woodward from Mack to Jefferson.

Social Security benefits to increase Jan. 1

Social Security and Supplemental Security Income beneficiaries will get a 3-percent increase in payments beginning in January.

The average Social Security benefit for retired workers will rise from \$634 to \$653 monthly.

The maximum benefit for retired workers will increase to \$1,128 from \$1,088 monthly. The maximum federal SSI monthly payments to individuals will rise to \$434 from \$422. The state of Michigan supplements this amount.

The Supplemental Medical Insurance Premium (Part B of Medicare) will be \$36.60 a month beginning January.

Also going to Washington will be Sen. James Barcia, D-Bay City. He had seats on the Natural Resources and Agriculture committees. Eight senators sought other offices this year, but only Smith and Barcia were successful. Gov. John Engler will schedule special elections to fill their vacancies. Both seats are likely to remain with their present parties.

'Very happy'

"I'm very happy where I'm at," said Sen. Mat Dunaskiss, R-Lake Orion. As chair of the Energy and Technology Committee, he sponsored the 1991 Telecommunications Act and is planning a major look at state energy policy in 1993.

Dunaskiss also is sponsoring a bill to continue the 1991 freeze of property tax assessments through 1994. "The failure of Proposal C to pass has furthered my resolve to bring about reform in this area," he said.

The two top committees in the

Senate are Finance and Appropriations — where the money is raised and spent.

Sens. Robert Geake, R-Northville, and Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, are both on that panel. Geake is vice-chair and heads key subcommittees on mental health and social services.

Sen. William Faust, D-Westland, is ranking Democrat on the Commerce and Local Government committees and a member of Technology and Energy. He had an excused absence last week.

Sen. George Z. Hart, D-Dearborn, has little place to move. He's a member of the Economic and Urban Development, Labor, State Affairs, and Transportation-Tourism committees.

House in doubt

Republicans at mid-week thought they had won a 56-54 majority for the first time in a generation. By week's end they found they may have to settle for a 55-55 split.

Two suburban Republicans have their eyes on the House Taxation Committee chair if Democrat Lyn Jondahl is ousted.

"I'm in line for chairman because of seniority," said Rep. Willis Bullard Jr., R-Milford, elected to his sixth term. "Taxation will be very important in the next two years," said Bullard, who is minority vice chair of that panel.

"I'd like to be chair," said Rep. Susan Munsell, R-Howell, an accountant elected to her fourth term.

But it won't come down to a fight. House GOP leader Paul Hillegonds will form a committee on committees and consider the assignment wishes of 15 or so newcomers as well as the ambitions of veteran members. Munsell said the process could take two months.

Rep. John Jamian, R-Birmingham, winner of a second term, said, "I want to stay on Public Health — I can make a valuable contribution, and it's important."

Washtenaw helps Ford win

U.S. Rep. William D. Ford, a Democrat from Ypsilanti, defeated state Sen. R. Robert Geake of Northville Township by 22,365 votes in Tuesday's balloting for U.S. Congress.

Ford received 127,273 votes to Geake's 104,908 votes.

Other candidates and their vote totals included: Randall Roe an independent from Ypsilanti, 8,565; Paul S. Jensen of Ann Arbor who was running on the Tisch ticket, 3,316 and Larry Roberts of the Workers League, 1,150 Detroit.

The results, while still unofficial because the board of canvassers has yet to certify the election, include 100 percent of precincts in the 13th District which includes western western Wayne County and part of Washtenaw County.

Geake, a Republican in the

fourth year of a six-year senate term, won handily in the Republican strongholds of Livonia, Plymouth, Canton and Northville. Ford won in Garden City, Westland, Inkster and Washtenaw County.

A Geake campaign spokesman said the strategy was to "take the senate district (which includes Canton, Plymouth, Northville and Livonia) and do well in Garden City and key areas of Westland."

Ford took both Garden City and Westland. In Garden City, Ford received 43.8 percent of the vote compared to Geake 39.6 percent. In Westland, Ford received 15,784 votes to Geake's 13,953. In both communities, Gov. Bill Clinton beat George Bush in balloting for president.

Geake won two precincts in Garden City and 13 precincts in

Westland but it wasn't enough to overcome Ford's strong showing in Washtenaw County where he polled 56,830. Geake received only 32,090 votes in the Washtenaw portion of the district.

The new 13th district includes 25 communities and more than 501,000 people.

Ford will begin his 15th term in Congress in January. He is chairman of the House Committee on Education and Labor. The Democrats will control the U.S. House and Senate under President Bill Clinton — a prospect that pleases Ford.

"I'm in the right place with the right president," Ford said election night after declaring victory.

Geake last week was elected assistant majority floor leader in the Senate.

SMART buys 25 new buses

SMART, the suburban bus authority, will introduce 25 new buses Tuesday, according to acting general manager Michael Duggan.

"The bus parade, marching down Jefferson Avenue in downtown Detroit, will introduce the new fleet of shorter, cleaner and brighter SMART buses to its customers and the general public," Duggan said.

SMART will reduce significant maintenance costs by replacing its aging buses with 23 new 30-foot coaches and two new 40-foot coaches, he said.

The Phantom buses, manufactured by the Gillig Corp. of Hayward, Calif., offer high maneuverability with heavy-duty reliability for operation on routes where small-size coaches are desirable. Many components of the Phantoms, including the seats and the diesel engines, were manufactured in Michigan.

Cranberries in stores, bring on the holidays

Not being one to rush the seasons, but let's face it folks, the holidays are upon us. I haven't even put away the lawn chairs yet, and still have a recipe for the ultimate Mint Julep waiting patiently on my desk to try.

What happened to summer? I have friends who have already completed their Christmas shopping. They have their greeting cards written, addressed and stamped, and are ready to head south for some sun. I haven't started my spring house cleaning yet.

It is to these organized people that I dedicate this column on cranberries. Why? because traditionally, I'm about five weeks ahead of myself. I say traditionally because this year, I must be about five weeks behind.

When I start seeing cranberries on the shelves in grocery stores, the holiday season can't be that far away.

Medicinal values

For the nostalgia buffs, cranberries have been popping around kitchens for hundreds of years. Originally called the mossberry (because it is usually grown in boggy areas of North America and Europe), cranberries look like small cherries. The color varies from a clear pink to a deep red.

Used extensively in the Middle Ages as a medicinal product, cranberries have an acid flavor, taste very astringent, and are bitter when eaten raw.

It is because of these "bitter" powers that the cranberry was used to "draw out" certain ailments. The Indians used cranberries, not only medically and for cooking, but also used the coloring as war paint and colorful makeup for tribal rituals.

Cooking cranberries

When cooked, cranberries produce a compote like jelly with a delicate taste. They are traditionally served with fowl and wild game.

Cranberries that are processed usually wind up in the obligatory holiday favorite, canned cranberry sauce, and that omnipotent cure-all for the kidneys, cranberry juice.

Beginning now, you will see cranberries brimming in poly-sealed bags all over grocery stores, gearing up for their big show, which is the holidays. It is during these times that the fresh cranberry finds its way into muffins, breads, fruitcakes, candies, sauces and stuffings.

Ammunition for kids

Of course, when you have kids, you will also find them being used in slingshots; they can be thrown with force because of their solid weight and tendency for explosion on impact.

These smashed cranberries cannot be removed from couches, curtains and carpets unless you are lucky enough to own something made with that new material that won't absorb stains.

Should you have any leftover berries, it is highly suggested that you not place a string of cranberries outdoors "for the birds," especially if you have a light colored automobile near by. Yes, they can stain a car finish too!

Momma's recipe

While researching this column, I called upon momma who agreed to part with her all-time smash hit for homemade cranberry sauce. With pencil in hand, I anxiously awaited the formula which I'm sure would be passed down to yet another generation of Janes'.

Needless to say, I felt like the air was let out of my soufflé when told that all you need was one pound of cranberries to 1½ cups water and 2 cups sugar (1 plus 1½ plus 2).

Easy to remember? sure. But I was looking for something with a little more aplomb that included various amounts of spices and about 14 hours or so on the stove.

"Pour it all in a stainless saucepan, cover and cook until the berries pop" was all I was told. Finally, something of momma's that I can better. I tried the recipe and included a healthy zest of lemon and orange rind, and was even more pleased with the results.

Storing cranberries

Anyway you try it, the taste comparison over that canned stuff is undeniable. Everyone knows that fresh is best.

Cranberries will keep in the refrigerator when simply rinsed under cold water and placed in a colander in one of the crisper drawers or on the lower shelf for about 10 days when fresh.

Dare to be Rare

Roast turkey over an open fire



In the 1990s, Turkey has become one of America's most common foods. Reasonably priced and "healthy," turkey cutlets, turkey breast, turkey drumsticks, turkey ground and turkey smoked are readily available in delis and meat departments.

If turkeys wore T-shirts, their motto would read, "Familiarity makes the heart grow fonder." After all, there was a time, not long ago when "turkey" meant a whole turkey, roasted with all the fixin's appropriate to Thanksgiving, and, possibly, Christmas.

In the 1990's, turkey is one of America's most ubiquitous foods. Reasonably priced and "healthy," turkey cutlets, turkey breast, turkey drumsticks, turkey ground and turkey smoked are readily available in delis and meat departments.

In 1930, Americans consumed 1½ pounds of turkey per person. In 1980, consumption had risen to 10.4 pounds, and in 1991, we're averaging 19.6 pounds of turkey per person.

And yet, practically everyone in America still has turkey with all the fixin's for Thanksgiving! Even though there's no evidence that the first celebrants ate more turkey than venison or quail or even oysters, Thanksgiving just isn't Thanksgiving without turkey.

"It's a turkey holiday," said Mike

Albus, owner of Stan's Market, in Livonia. "We do sell some other birds, such as capons or ducks, but not enough to talk about."

"The really unique aspect of the Thanksgiving bird is the dressing. I hear people in the store talking about their special dressings, or about their secret ingredient that they won't share even with their children."

Some cooks can't get along without Awrey's white stuffing bread. Others buy Pepperidge Farm stuffing and use that as a basis for their own special formula.

Just notice: If you go to somebody's house for Thanksgiving dinner, the real question isn't "How was the turkey?" but "Did you like the dressing?" The dressing is the proof of the cook's talents and hard work.

And ethnic background makes a difference too, said Albus. "My wife's grandmother is Polish, and the day before Thanksgiving she boils a chicken so she can shred the meat and use it in the stuffing. The dressing is fabulous, but who else would go to the trouble?"

We can't deny that all dressings are unique, but there are other approach-

es to preparing the big bird that both distinguishes it from the "norm," while veering more toward authentic cooking methods.

Certainly the first celebrants cooked over an open fire, and some 1990s celebrants manage to cook their turkey without the benefit of an oven, also.

Sharon Staley of Birmingham, her husband Dennis and their three children once spent Thanksgiving camping in the Alpena area. "We were with three other families who also had children with them," she said. "We cooked the turkey in a fire pit. It was a simple way to cook the bird — actually, the only way, since we didn't have a stove — and the novelty took the children's minds of the fact that they were away from the malls."

To follow Staley's method, first you dig a pit, somewhat larger than the 13 pound bird that the families cooked. Build a good-sized fire, and when it has ceased blazing, wrap the well-greased bird with an onion in the cavity, in several layers of heavy-duty aluminum foil and put it on top of the fire. Bank the coals around the bird, and add wood or charcoal to cover the bird.

"It takes about three hours," said Staley. "And the bird is really moist. And of course, waiting for dinner in the crisp northern air really gives you an appetite."

A couple of years ago, Staley was

remodeling her kitchen and had to rely on a two-burner hot-plate to feed the family. "We cooked our turkey that year in the fireplace, using basically the same method that we did in Alpena. It turned out beautifully."

Warren Harvey, of Birmingham has always cooked his family's Thanksgiving turkey because he likes to cook, and his wife Charlotte was born and raised in Scotland where turkey isn't exactly a tradition.

"I just take an 18-pound turkey, grease it good with butter, wire the wings and leg in position, and put it in the rotisserie about 9 a.m. It's finished about 4 p.m."

"I baste it about once an hour, or whenever I happen to walk by. I don't stuff it, but I suppose you could if you wanted to. One year we went to a football game and it didn't get basted at all. The outside was pretty crispy, but the inside was still moist."

In the past, the Harveys fed as many as 50 family members for Thanksgiving, but as their three children and other children have married and started their own holiday tradition, the guest list has dwindled to about 20.

"In the early days, we also had a ham," said Harvey. "And every family brought a dessert dish. To tell the truth, we miss the crowd."

Winner Dinner Recipes



COUNTRY CHICKEN AND BARLEY SOUP

- 4 chicken breast halves (with bones)
- ½ cup barley
- 5½ cups chicken stock
- 1 stalk celery, chopped
- 3 carrots, peeled and sliced
- 1 large tomato, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon soy sauce
- ½ teaspoon basil
- Dash of oregano
- Dash of thyme
- Dash of cayenne pepper
- 2 tablespoons fresh parsley, minced

In a stockpot, bring all ingredients, except parsley, to a boil. Reduce heat, cover and simmer for 1 hour, stirring occasionally. Remove chicken from soup. When cool, remove meat from bones and chop into bite-sized pieces. Return chicken to soup and simmer for 15 minutes. Stir in parsley and serve. Serves 8.

ROMAINE AND DRIED CRANBERRY SALAD

- 1 head romaine lettuce
- ½ cup dried cranberries (or dried cherries)
- ½ cup sliced mushrooms
- 3-4 green onions, chopped, including green stems
- CROUTONS
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 2-3 whole garlic cloves, peeled
- 3 slices white bread, crusts removed and cubed

DRESSING

- 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 2 teaspoons red wine vinegar
- ¼ cup olive oil
- Salt to taste
- Freshly ground pepper to taste

Rinse and dry romaine lettuce. Add other salad ingredients, toss and chill.

To make croutons, remove crusts and cube bread. Heat 3 tablespoons olive oil in a skillet; add whole garlic cloves and bread. Saute until bread cubes are golden and drain in a colander. Remove garlic cloves and add croutons to salad just before tossing with dressing.

To make the dressing, in a small bowl, mix together mustard and vinegar. Add salt and pepper to taste. Whisk in olive oil slowly. Pour over salad, toss and serve.

CHOCOLATE FUDGE SAUCE

- 12 ounces semisweet morsels
- 30 ounces evaporated milk
- 2 sticks butter
- 1 pound confectioners' sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla

Melt semisweet morsels, milk and butter in a large saucepan. Add sugar and bring to a boil. Boil for 6 minutes or until thickened. Add vanilla and stir well. Pour into a 48-ounce jar and refrigerate. When serving, spoon out desired amount and warm in a microwave oven or in a small sauce pan over low heat.

Serve over vanilla ice cream and cut-up fresh pears and/or raspberries.

CRANBERRY APPLE RELISH

2 pounds (8 cups) cranberries, chopped
4 cups peeled and quartered apples, chopped
3 1/2 cups sugar
2 cups orange marmalade
2 cups walnuts, coarsely

chopped
1/2 cup lemon juice

Combine all ingredients in a large mixing bowl. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use. Serve in hollowed out orange halves. Great with game, fowl. Makes 9 cups.

GLAZED CRANBERRIES

2 cups whole cranberries
1 cup sugar

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Arrange berries in a single layer and sprinkle with sugar. Cover with foil and bake 15 minutes. Remove foil and shake pan gently. Recover with foil and bake for 15 minutes. Shake berries again, re-cover with foil and bake for 15 more minutes.

Let stand till cool and transfer to waxed paper — do not crowd. Cool completely, then chill. Great in your next fruitcake.

CRANBERRY RUM SAUCE

2 cups whole cranberries
1/4 cup sugar
1/2 cup unsweetened pineapple juice
1/4 teaspoon grated lemon zest
Grated zest of 1 orange
1/4 cup rum
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
dash salt (optional)

Combine cranberries, sugar, juice and lemon and orange zest in a saucepan and simmer until berries are tender, about 10 minutes. Transfer to blender or food processor and process until smooth. Add remaining ingredients, mix well. Great over ice cream.

CRANBERRY BREAD

2 cups sifted flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 cup sugar
1/4 cup melted butter
1/2 cup orange juice
1 egg, well beaten
1 tablespoon fresh grated orange rind
1 1/2 cup fresh cranberries, halved
1/4 cup chopped walnuts or pecans

Sift dry ingredients together. Mix butter with orange juice, egg and orange rind. Add to dry ingredients, stir to moisten. Stir in berries and nuts. Pour into a greased loaf pan and bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour or until top is golden and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Great with coffee and tea!

CRANBERRY VELVET PIE

1 1/4 cups crushed vanilla wafers
6 tablespoons butter, melted
1 cup whipping cream
1/4 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1 package (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened
1 can (1 pound) whole cranberry sauce

Combine crumbs and melted butter. Press firmly on the bottom and sides of a 9-inch pie plate. Chill until firm. Beat cream cheese till fluffy. Combine whipping cream, sugar and vanilla; whip until thick but not stiff. Gradually add to cream cheese, beating till smooth and creamy. Fold in cranberry sauce. Freeze until firm. Remove from freezer 10 minutes before serving.

BARBECUED TURKEY

8 lb turkey, cut into 8 serving pieces
1/4 cup vinegar
1/4 cup peanut oil
1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
1/2 cup finely chopped onion
1/2 cup finely chopped green pepper
1 teaspoon celery salt
1/4 teaspoon dried oregano leaves
1/2 teaspoon dried basil leaves
1/2 teaspoon white pepper
1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 tsp ground cumin
1 garlic clove, crushed to a paste
Tabasco sauce

In a stainless steel saucepan, combine all of the ingredients except the Tabasco sauce and the turkey. Cook gently until the onion is translucent — about 10 minutes. Remove the sauce from the heat and cool. Add Tabasco sauce to taste. Place the turkey pieces in a large bowl or a large, flat baking dish. Pour the sauce over the turkey, cover and refrigerate for six hours, or overnight.

Turn the pieces frequently. Remove the turkey pieces from the marinade and drain them. Reserve the marinade. Cook the turkey pieces on a grill, with the rack about four inches from the coals for 20 to 25 minutes on each side. Baste the pieces several times with the marinade during the cooking and again when the turkey is done.

GRILLED TURKEY BREAST WITH PINEAPPLE RELISH

Pineapple relish

1 8-ounce can unsweetened crushed pineapple, undrained
1/4 cup finely chopped celery
2 tablespoons finely chopped red onion
1 tablespoon finely chopped parsley
1 tablespoon fresh lime juice
1/2 teaspoon grated fresh ginger
dash of salt
One 1 1/2 pound Butterball fresh boneless turkey breast roast
1/2 teaspoon grated fresh ginger
Dash of freshly ground black pepper
Vegetable oil

To make the relish, combine the first 7 ingredients in a small bowl and let stand at cool room temperature for 1 to 2 hours to let the flavors blend.

Prepare a charcoal or gas grill, or preheat oven to 325 degrees. Separate the coals in the bed of the grill to leave room for a metal or foil drip pan nestled between them. The turkey breast sets over the pan and during cooking the juices drip into it. The pan should be bigger than the turkey breast. For a 22-inch grill, put 25 to 30 briquettes on each long side of the pan. Burn the coals for about 30 minutes until they are covered with gray ash. Set the rack (sprayed with cooking spray) on its brackets with the handles over the coals — this makes it easier to add more briquettes during cooking.

Loosen the skin along one edge of the turkey breast and carefully fold the skin back to expose the meat. Spread the ginger and pepper on the meat. Bring the skin back over the

breast and secure with toothpicks. Brush with vegetable oil.

Grill the turkey breast over medium heat or roast in an 8 by 8 by 2-inch baking dish at 325 degrees for one to 1 1/2 hours or until a meat thermometer inserted in the thickest part of the roast registers 170 degrees.

Cover the turkey breast with aluminum foil and let stand 10 minutes before slicing. Serve with the pineapple relish. Serves four to six.

ROAST WILD TURKEY

Dressed turkey, about 12 pounds
2 loaves white bread, sliced
1 cup melted butter
1 cup hot water
2 cups chestnuts, cooked and chopped
salt and pepper to taste
1 teaspoon sweet marjoram, powdered
1 teaspoon thyme, minced
cornmeal to sprinkle over bird

This is an old Shaker recipe. Pluck bird thoroughly, then scrub with a brush and wash inside and out. Stuff breast and body with sliced and lightly toasted bread, broken into small pieces, to which is added melted butter, hot water, cooked and chopped chestnuts, salt and pepper, sweet marjoram and thyme.

Truss the bird and cover with soft butter and sprinkle with cornmeal. Dust with salt and pepper. Bake in a moderate oven (300 degrees) for 4 1/2 hours. Baste often.

Author celebrates 'Foods of Tuscany' in cookbook



KEELY WYGONIK

Think about it. "The most important events in life take place around food," said Italian cookbook author Giuliano Bugiagli. What would a bat mitzvah, christening, wedding or wake be without a dinner

Tuscan landscape, customs, and food.

"I'm so sick and tired of cookbooks that list recipes, that's it," said Bugiagli. "It's so old-fashioned. A cookbook should be some kind of traveling companion, as well as show food the way it's supposed to be eaten in one season, and not another."

Bugiagli said he wants people to know that Italian food isn't just about tomato sauce and garlic. In "Foods of Tuscany," he writes about the region he knows and loves. It's where he grew up.

He's a thorough researcher, and his attention to detail, and writing style which informs and enlightens, is not accidental. Before

he started writing cookbooks, Bugiagli taught Italian to American college students in Florence.

"Cooking was my hobby. It was fun. I wanted to get to the bottom to know everything about it," he said. "At the end of the term we would have a party and I'd cook for the students. One day someone asked, 'what do you think about starting a cooking school?' Why not, I said."

His school, "Cooking in Florence," the first cooking school in Italy designed for an international clientele, is still going today. "I enjoy teaching a lot," he said.

Today, he divides his time between homes in New York and Florence, and travels extensively.

Bugiagli insists on absolute authenticity in reproducing Italy's cuisine. You won't find any recipes that use packaged pasta, he shows you how to make your own. Here's a recipe from the book.

CHICKEN WITH POMEGRANATES

- 1 chicken (about 3½ pounds)
- 1 tablespoon (½ ounce) sweet butter
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 5 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 cup dry white wine
- A large pinch of cinnamon
- Freshly grated nutmeg
- 1 to 2 cups chicken broth, preferably homemade

Plus
2 large pomegranates
To Serve
A large pinch of ground ginger

Cut the chicken into quarters. Rub the quarters with the tablespoon of butter and sprinkle them with salt and pepper.

Heat the oil in a medium-sized casserole over medium heat and, when the oil is warm, place the chicken in a single layer in the bottom of the casserole. Saute for 2 minutes, then turn the chicken over and saute for 2 minutes more.

Add the wine and let it evaporate for 10 minutes. Season with salt and pepper, then add the cinnamon and a large pinch of nutmeg. Start

adding the broth, a little at a time, turning the chicken two or three times and adding more broth as needed.

Meanwhile, peel the pomegranates, removing all the seeds and discarding the skins.

When the chicken is almost cooked, about 25 minutes from the moment you started adding the broth, add the pomegranate seeds to the casserole, mix very well, cover and cook for 5 minutes more, stirring occasionally to be sure the seeds do not stick to the bottom. Taste for salt and pepper.

Just before serving, sprinkle the ginger all over the chicken and pomegranates, mix very well and transfer to a large serving platter.

Hearty pasta dish chases chills away

Pasta comes in all different shapes and sizes for one simple reason: to complement the sauce it accompanies. The Olive Garden Restaurant suggests these hints for matching pastas and sauces.

Match ribbed pasta or pasta with indentations (fusilli and rotelle) with less thick sauces (these tend to "hold" the sauces).

Match tubular, rounded pasta with smooth surfaces, and often with holds, (penne and rigatoni) with thick, chunkier sauces that will "cling" to the smoothest exterior. Chunkier ingredients like meat and vegetables can lodge themselves in the holes.

Long, thin pasta (spaghetti and linguini) goes best with soupy, shellfish sauces, olive oil-based sauces, herb sauces and butter or olive oil-based tomato sauces because they absorb the juices without becoming soft. Also, the strands wrap and hold these sauces well.

Broader flat noodles (fettucci-

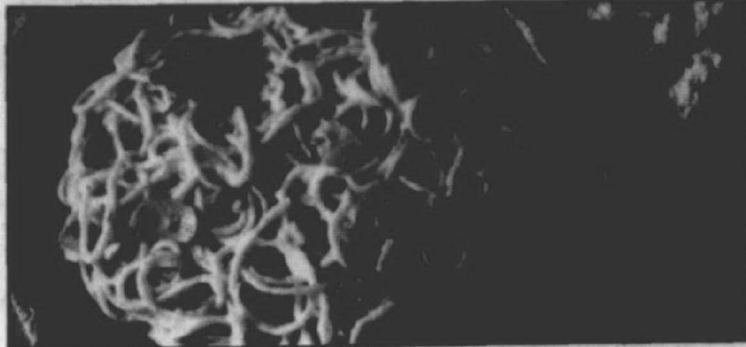
ni and lasagna) are better for richer sauces based with meat, butter, cheese and creams. It coats their surfaces.

The shapes of other ingredients used in pasta should be cut to match the pasta. For example, julienne the vegetables when they're being used with spaghetti or linguini; cut in chunks when served with the boxy shaped pastas like shells and ravioli.

Here's a recipe from the Roman Pasta Holiday menu, available through Nov. 22.

SPAGHETTI CARBONARA

- Ingredients**
 Bechamel Sauce:
 ¼ cup flour
 ¼ cup butter or margarine
 1 quart milk
 ½ teaspoon black pepper
 ½ teaspoon salt
Remaining ingredients
 24 slices bacon, extra-thick
 ¼ cup olive oil
 3 cups (8 oz. by weight)

- mushrooms, sliced
 6 tablespoons green onions, finely chopped
 1 pound Olive Garden fresh spaghetti, uncooked
 2 teaspoons fresh parsley, finely chopped
 ½ cup Parmesan cheese, freshly grated

To make Bechamel Sauce: Melt butter or margarine in a 4-quart heavy saucepan over medium heat. Stir in flour and cook for 1 minute. Add milk, salt and pepper and stir vigorously with a wire whip until mixture barely comes to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer

5 minutes, whipping frequently while sauce thickens. Keep warm.

Procedure: Cook the bacon until fully cooked. Drain on paper towels. Cut into ¼-inch pieces and stir into the Bechamel Sauce.

Heat the olive oil in a large saute pan over medium heat. Add the sliced mushrooms and minced onions and saute until golden. Add to the Bechamel and bacon mixture. Cook fresh spaghetti according to directions. Drain well and add to the sauce with the parsley. Blend well and transfer to a serving dish. Sprinkle with freshly grated Parmesan cheese and serve immediately. Serves 6-8.

Easy Sloppy Joes cook in microwave

AP — Most kids today are familiar with the microwave oven. They begin by preparing after-school snacks or quick breakfasts. As they get older, they can on to easy-to-prepare main dishes, such as the recipe below, included in "Betty Crocker's Boys and Girls Microwave Cookbook" (Prentice Hall, \$15).

EASY SLOPPY JOES

- 1 pound ground turkey or ground beef
 1 medium onion
 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
 3 drops red pepper sauce
 One 10¼-ounce can condensed tomato soup
 6 sliced hamburger buns

With your fingers, crumble ground turkey or beef into small pieces in a 2-quart, microwave-safe casserole.

With a sharp knife and a cutting board, peel and chop the onion. Sprinkle it over the ground turkey or beef.

Cover the casserole with waxed paper. Cook on high (100 percent power) for 3 minutes. Using a long-

handled spoon, stir to break up the meat. Cover the casserole again with waxed paper. Cook on high for 3 or 4 minutes or until the meat is no longer pink.

Using potholders, carefully remove the casserole from the microwave. To let the steam out, carefully lift the edge of the waxed paper that is the farthest away from you. Remove the waxed paper.

Put a colander over a container to hold any fat from the meat. Ask an adult to carefully pour the meat into the colander. Put the drained meat back into the same casserole. Stir in the Worcestershire sauce, red pepper sauce and condensed tomato soup.

Cover the casserole with a lid. Cook on high for 3 minutes. Stir. Cover again; cook on high 1 to 3 minutes or until hot. Using potholders, carefully remove the casserole from the microwave. To let the steam out, remove the lid by lifting it from the side away from you. Fill the hamburger buns with the mixture. Makes 6 servings.

Note: If you like cheeseburgers, you can try a slice of American cheese on top of your Sloppy Joe.

Modify recipes to reduce amount of fat

If a muffin weighs heavy in your hand, and has a sticky surface, it is likely to have as many calories and as much fat as a cupcake or doughnut. Many bakery or deli muffins have more hydro-

genated oil, sugar and eggs than oat or wheat bran. A sign of a high fat content is a dense and moist product, like a baked carrot cake or banana bread. If you change, modify or clean up your recipes this need not happen. Food can still be delicious if the fat, sugar and salt are reduced in favorite recipes.

To reduce sodium in your diet or recipes be on the look out for: baking powder, baking soda, soy sauce, brine, garlic salt, onion salt, monosodium glutamate (MSG), sea salt, sodium chloride (table salt), sodium citrate, sodium nitrate, sodium phosphate and sodium saccharin.

Read the labels on packaged foods. In most home recipes cut

the amount of salt in half, the exception would be yeast bread. You will soon adjust to the less salty flavor.

Instead of using salt, substitute herbs, spices, lemon or lime juice or a combination of these. Some herbs and spices to consider are dill, oregano, basil, rosemary, thyme, cumin, chili powder, curry powder, and paprika. Ketchup and mustard are virtually fat free but are high in sodium. Make your own mustard by using dry mustard powder, add milk, vinegar or water and mix to desired consistency.

To decrease saturated fat and cholesterol, use vegetable oils instead of solid fat. Use about one-fourth less oil than the recipe calls for. Substitute apple sauce in equal amounts for the oil in a cake, brownie or muffin mix.

Most standard recipes call for more sugar, salt and fat than necessary. Use half the amount of sugar called for in baked goods and desserts. Every one-fourth cup of brown or white sugar adds nearly 200 empty calories. This lesser amount of sugar is best for quick breads, cookies, pie filling,

custard pudding and fruit crisps.

Increase the amount of vanilla or cinnamon for recipes that you have decreased the sugar. This will give the impression of sweetness. Eliminate additional calories by replacing frosting with just a light dusting of powdered sugar.

Choose and cook meat the low fat way. The leanest beef is; top round, eye of the round, round tip, sirloin, top loin and tenderloin. These cuts of meat can be made tender by marinating them in an acid-base liquid such as vinegar, citrus juice, tomato juice or wine.

Most salad dressings, creamy or oily get 90 percent of their calories from fat. However they may also contain eggs, cream and cheese. Make your own dressing to avoid the fat. When making a vinaigrette use less oil and more vinegar. For a new flavor, palatable low-oil dressing, use a flavorful walnut oil and a mild balsamer or rice vinegar, add a little garlic, a few herbs, and Dijon mustard. You'll be amazed over the delightful creamy dressing you can make from plain non-fat yogurt, onion, dill, oregano or basil and pepper. Mayonnaise is about 100 percent fat with little cholesterol. A better

choice would be to make your own version by diluting a low-fat or light mayonnaise with nonfat yogurt, lemon juice or vinegar.

For good health reasons, maybe you'd like to consider a semi-vegetarian diet. This is a diet of fresh vegetables, grains, legumes, fresh fruit and dairy products with an occasional moderate serving of beef, poultry or fish. Generally four ounces of uncooked trimmed meat without bone will yield three ounces of cooked meat. A three ounce cooked serving is about the size of a deck of playing cards.

Another way to hold down the fat is to watch the amount of these foods that you eat. The semi-vegetarian diet could possibly lower the risk for heart disease, cancer, diabetes, lower blood cholesterol and blood pressure levels, maintain weight and give you fewer digestive complaints.

Healthy eating does not mean boring or unappealing. Clean up your recipes by reducing the fat, sugar and salt in them, and reduce the fatty foods you choose. You'll feel better and it certainly will be better for you.

Come in out of the cold with spiced cranberry tea

AP — Warm up with a steamy cup of rich, rosy red tea, hot from your microwave oven. Apple cider mixed with cranberry-raspberry juice accounts for the golden pink color.

Cinnamon and cloves add a spicy niceness. You'll need to simmer the spices on medium power for a few minutes to let the flavor fully develop.

For spice bag, place cinnamon and cloves in the center of a 6-inch square of two layers of 100 percent cotton cheesecloth.

Bring corners of cheesecloth together and tie with a clean string. Set spice bag aside.

In a 2-quart microwave-safe casserole combine water and sugar. Cook, uncovered, on 100 percent

power (high) for 1 to 2 minutes or until sugar is dissolved, stirring once. Add spice bag, cider, tea and juice concentrate.

Cook, uncovered, on high for 6 to 9 minutes or until boiling, stirring once. Cook, uncovered, on 50 percent power (medium) for 10 minutes to blend flavors. Remove and

discard spice bag. Pour into 8 mugs.

If desired, float a lemon slice atop each serving. Makes 8 (4-ounce) servings.

Hope Orchestra has high hopes for its 'Lingo'

The Hope Orchestra will celebrate the release of its first CD this week.

Time to break out the champagne bottles? Better break out the Business 101 books instead.

Expecting to be awash in glowing, multi-adjective discourses about the musical merits of "Lingo," their 12-song release, one is met only by the hum of industry from the alternative pop band.

Three of the five members are hunkered down at the kitchen table collectively folding invitations for this Saturday record release party at Alvin's. There seems to be a rather *que sera sera* attitude about the proceeding.

"It's a practical aspect of pop music today," said lead guitarist George Schuster. "You have to have a recording of the band for your fans for them to listen to at their leisure."

Business acumen has seen Hope Orchestra through in their four years of performing (including pre-Hope bands Of All Things and Walk the Dogma). Not surprisingly, the band's press kit trumpeting "Lingo" includes such useful office amenities as a letter opener and a card for the Rolodex with the band's name on it.

Methodical, pragmatic — all those dastardly things suppose to smother inspiration. Hope Orchestra has this riddle figured out, though.

"We're trying to be innovative, creative and unique," said rhythm guitarist Gary Sosnick.

"We're not trying to be commercial."

"Or, I'd be wearing a halter top," added Jurgutis, whose stage presence doesn't pander to sexual cliches.

They want a record deal and they tackle practical aspects with the zeal of an Amway distributor.

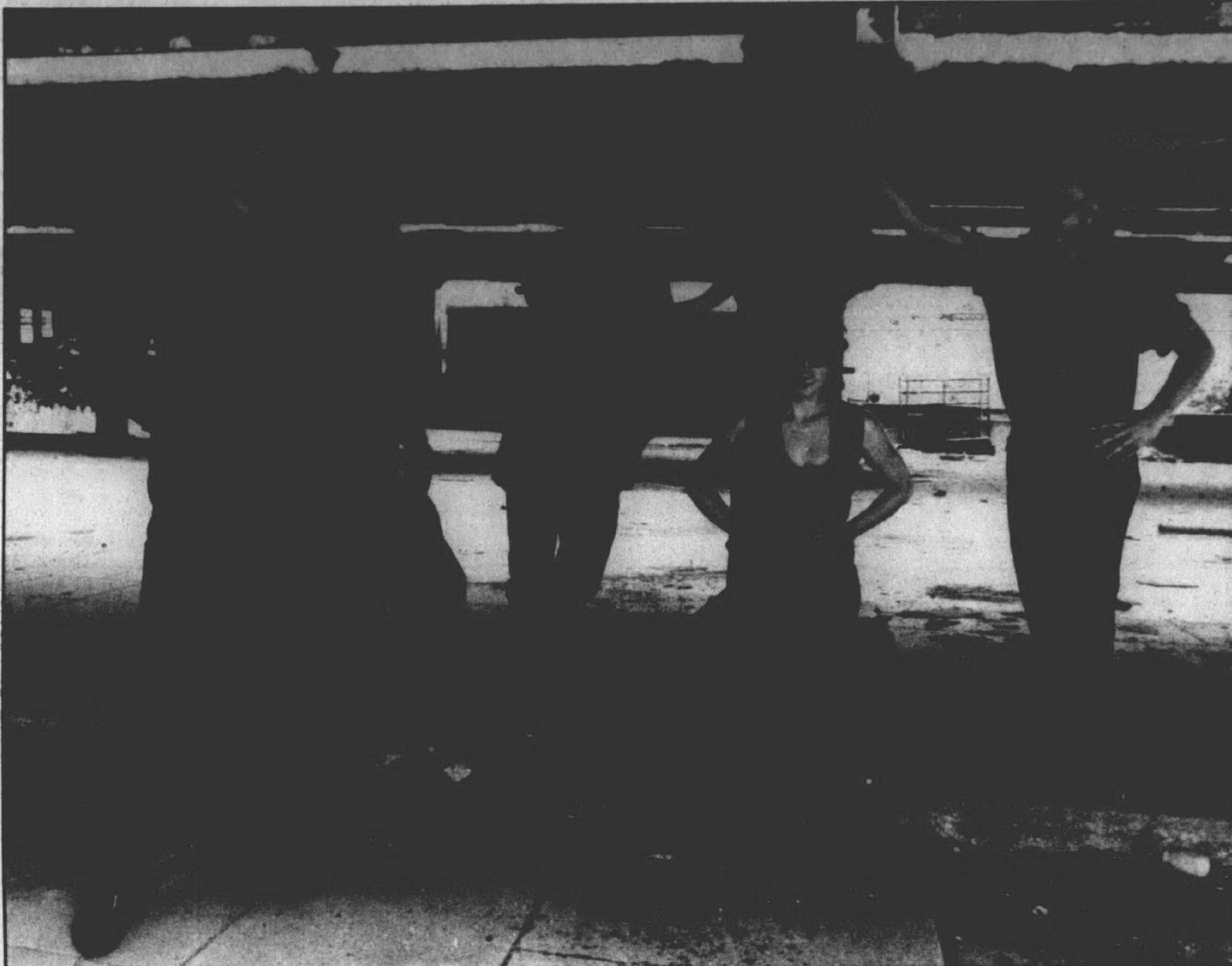

Musically, The Hope Orchestra has always been a tight outfit with Dave Lyon on drums and Pete Peltier on bass along with guitarists Schuster and Sosnick. Yet it's the classically stunning vocals of Jurgutis that offer an immediate focal point.

Lyrical, Hope Orchestra sways between '80s inspired political correctness and the sheepishly sentimental.

A number like "Politics of the Mind," which dates back to their Walk the Dogma days, is a crushing indictment of U.S. policy in Central America. "This Life You Call Money," lambastes yuppie greed.

The conflict is as follows, my religion does not accept suicide and my family would not accept suicide. The one saving grace that I have clung to is that if worse comes to worse and if I no longer can stand the daily pain and the continuing surgeries that will be necessary that I can kill myself.

I am not a coward, I would not dump this on someone else to do it for me. I would not go to someone like Dr. Kervorkian (not that I am being critical of him).

Do you think I am wrong in my position?

No Longer Capable of Standing Suffering

Dear Reader,

Thank you for sharing your inner thoughts with me and with the readers of this column. It is courageous of you to do so. I have given your letter a great deal of thought because I don't know how to answer it. As has been said previously in this column, there is such a thing as a true dilemma. That is a situation with no good solution; where one's choices are all bad.

I do not feel that I am capable of judging another person's degree of pain. I do not feel that I am capable of telling you what you should do. An answer to your question would come from the philosophy of the person giving the answer.

If the person in a rugged individualist (like I think you are), he would cling to the desire to have the final say as to what was going to happen to him. If the person's philosophy was a belief in sacrificing himself for the good of others, he could then accept enduring pain.

I also understand that one can feel a lack of dignity in a life stricken with disabling medical conditions. To those for whom dignity is very important that would add to their distress in continuing to suffer.

two or three at a time, and don't hesitate to use them in a jam. A botched jewelry store heist forces them to do just that, offing police, innocent bystanders, and eventually themselves in the process. "Reservoir Dogs," a stylized new crime film at the Maple, spends a memorable two hours with these small-time hoods. Definitely not for all tastes (some 15 people walked out during the preview screening), this black comedy spills buckets of blood and mines the kind of intensity that made David Lynch's

"Blue Velvet" such an instant classic. Lawrence Tierney, a veteran of '40s film noir, has the build and demeanor of an aging wrestler. He plays Joe, who selects six supposedly trustworthy men for this routine heist. He insists that they use code names (Mr. Pink, Mr. White, Mr. Brown, etc.) in case they are caught. And of course, they aren't satisfied with the monickers, especially nonconforming Mr. Pink (Steve Buscemi). "How about Mr. Purple?" he says. "I could agree to that."

"Reservoir Dogs" jumps back and forth from the aftermath to the planning while never showing the actual heist. Regrouping at an empty warehouse, the remaining colors figure that somebody squealed to the cops. Writer/director Quentin Tarantino, who also plays Mr. Brown, has assembled a heavenly cast of character actors. Buscemi, a familiar face from "Mystery Train"

and "Barton Fink," has a perfect wrong-place-at-the-wrong-time quality. He also gets some of the movie's best lines, from his litany about tipping to his frustrated urging that the rag-tag group "act like professionals."

Harvey Keitel, veteran of Scorsese's "Mean Streets" and "Taxi Driver," agreed to both act and co-produce after reading the knockout script for "Reservoir Dogs." He has his meatiest role in years as Mr. White, a sympathetic con who strikes up a friendship with a fellow "Dog" despite orders to the contrary.

Michael Madsen's Mr. Blonde, meanwhile, is a smooth study in psychopathy. While White and Pink flip out, he sips pop casually through a straw while relating that he was justified in slaughtering a roomful of people. "I told them not to pull the alarm, so they deserved it."

"Reservoir Dogs" is incredibly controlled for a first feature. L.A. filmmaker Tarantino maintains the perfect tone throughout, never goes for cheap laughs and even in the gruesome moments shows some restraint, letting us imagine the details without shoving them in our face.

He's also one of the few modern directors who knows how to use the wide screen image. He pans around the backs of guys during a round-table meeting and plays beautifully with the action in the claustrophobic warehouse, where

most of "Reservoir Dogs" takes place.

The soundtrack spins super hits from the '70s, appropriately introduced by the laconic voice of Stephen Wright's disc jockey. The Stealer's Wheel chestnut "Stuck in the Middle with You" serves as background for a gruesome torture scene.

And the tune even hints at a theme for this movie: that these misfit guys really are stuck with each other despite all the precautions to keep them from getting close.

"Reservoir-Dogs" is the dark-side of "Diner," a buddy movie gone way wrong whose intensity and style can't easily be forgotten.

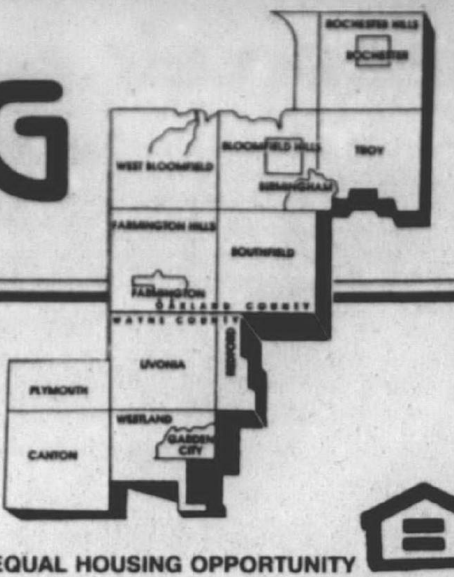

"I thought we were good enough to win," Salem senior Tom Baker said. "Any team can beat another team at any time. I guess we weren't that team. We were kind of unlucky."

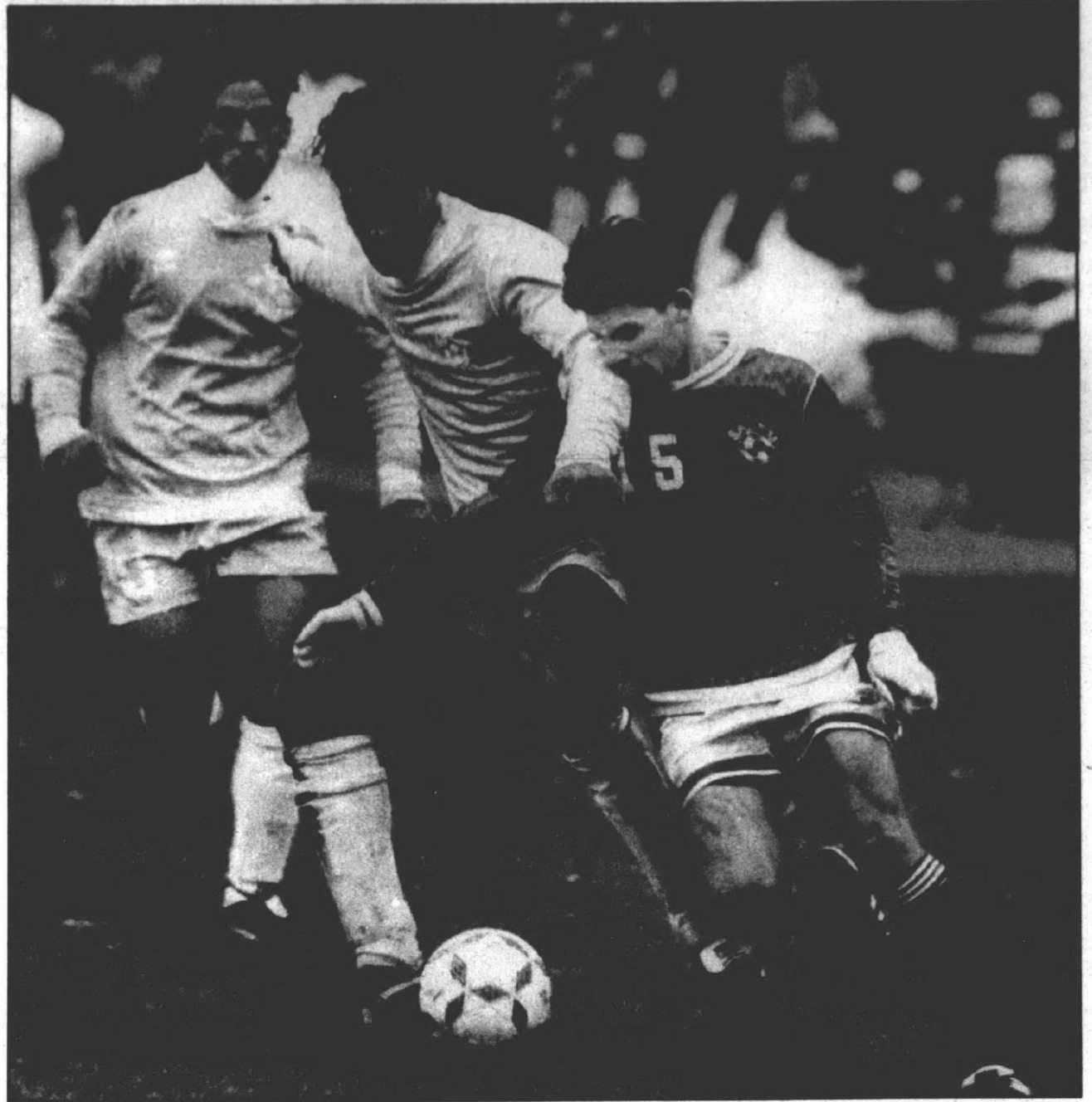

"The kid went right through me," Dood said. "I don't think it should have been a goal, but they got the best of us. It was bouncing around, and I couldn't get to where it was."

"Give him credit. (Fulton) got his foot on it before Dood could get a

Canton's Holmes to pitch for U-M

At one time, Kelly Holmes wondered whether she would be good enough to pitch at the major-college level.

That must seem so long ago now.

No one who has seen her play softball doubts the Plymouth Canton senior has that kind of ability. That includes Holmes, who received a scholarship to the University of Michigan.

"I do think I can pitch at that level and have the (necessary) pitches, like the rise," she said. "They're confident I can, so that makes me feel I'll be able to pitch at that level."

Canton coach Jim Arnold doesn't have to be as modest in his assess-

ment, observing that Holmes is rated among the top 20 high school pitchers in the country.

"She's a college-caliber pitcher right now," he said. "I know she'll help their program tremendously. I think she can step right in there and be one of their starters."

The Wolverines offered Holmes a full ride when they feared she might accept Notre Dame's three-fourths scholarship.

Holmes, a top-notch student with a straight-A average, also visited Michigan State and Northwestern and was recruited by Madonna, Wayne State and Eastern Michigan.

"That showed me how much they wanted me there," Holmes said. "They thought I would fit in their

program and would get a lot of playing time in my freshman year.

"I'll be closer to home, where people can come and watch me and I can still feel the support."

Holmes, who led the Chiefs to a 32-4 record and runner-up finish in the Class A tournament earlier this year, throws hard and with speed, but she wonders how the college diamond dimensions and softball will affect her pitching.

The mound is from 43 feet from home plate instead of 40 in high school. College teams will use an orange-colored ball with red stitching, making it more visible to the batters.

Chiefs, Rocks to meet in girls hoop semifinal

First-round victories Thursday set up a Plymouth Canton-Plymouth Salem rematch in the Western Lakes Activities Association girls basketball playoffs.

The Chiefs, who won the first meeting 53-31 at Salem on Oct. 27, will entertain the Rocks in a WLAA semifinal contest Tuesday night.

Stephanie Gray scored 15 points, Kelly Holmes 14 and Alyson Nouné 13 for the Chiefs (16-2). Erin Vicary recorded a game-high 18 points to lead the Warriors (8-10).

Salem overcame a slow-down attempt by the Raiders, outscoring North 12-2 in the fourth quarter.

"They ran some delay and we took a lot of time each half to take them out of what they were doing," Salem coach Fred Thomann said. "We did what we needed to do to win."

The Rocks (10-8) had no one in double figures but had balanced scoring. Leslie Gotts scored nine points, Christy Parimucha eight and Cyndi Platter six.

Platter, who was in early foul trouble and didn't play long, also had nine rebounds. Gotts had six steals and Parimucha four assists.

North center Carey Perkins also saw her playing time limited by fouls and was held to four points. Allison Stein and Carrie May scored five apiece for the Raiders (9-9).

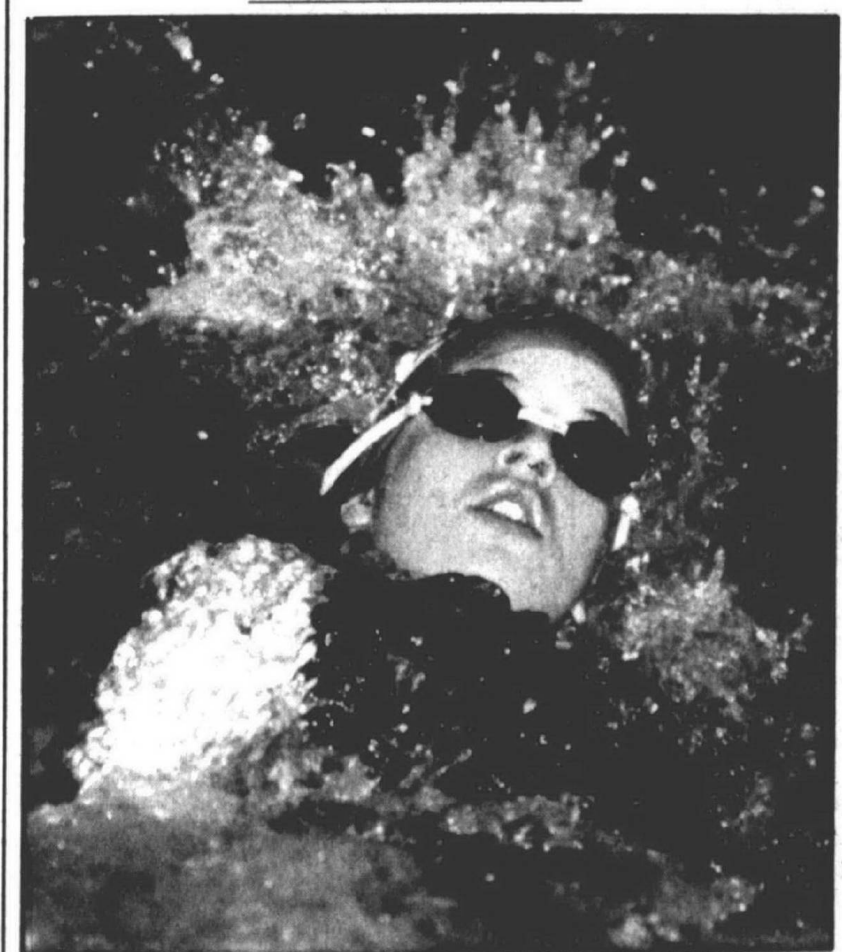
"We played excellent defense," North coach Lance Davis said. "Offensively, we must have averaged 15 turnovers in each quarter, and we were still in the game."

"It just was not a good day offensively. We didn't get enough shots because we were always turning it over. We never got into a rhythm."

"People say you have to pitch in the 60s to pitch Division I," Holmes said, "and I was clocked at 62 in the summer. I think I should be effective with my pitches and speed."

Holmes, who struck out 289 batters last season and has a school-record 635 career strikeouts, doesn't expect to be as overpowering in college.

"Every hitter is going to be a good hitter," she said. "With the new ball, there will be more hitting, and pitching won't be as dominant. I'll work really hard at it and do my best to help the team."

Michigan has sophomore Kelly Kovach, who was named the best freshman player in the Big Ten last season. If all goes well, Holmes could be the other half of a first-rate duo as a freshman.

"A lot depends on how I do in the fall and moving back the mound affects me," she said.

The 6-foot Holmes, who was 23-3 with only 47 walks in 178 1/2 innings and posted a 0.35 earned-run average last season, will have no trouble adjusting to college ball, according to Arnold.

"She can adapt real easily," he said. "You're not allowed to hop off the mound in high school. In college you can, and she's been working on it the last year and a half. She can adapt real easily, and that will help with her speed."

Holmes, who has a 53-9 career record, has recovered from a broken left collarbone in the summer.

While playing catch with the hard-throwing shortstop on her travel team, the ball moved and hit Holmes, who pitched three more games after that. Three weeks later, as she reached across the dinner table one evening, the bone cracked.

"I'm still getting back into it," said Holmes, who also plays for the Canton basketball team. "They said it won't be 100 percent until the end of January."

"It hasn't bothered me, so I'm kinda relieved about that. I did some pitching just to make sure it feels right, and it didn't seem to affect it at all. It's not on my pitching arm, so I'm not real concerned about that."

Spartans repeat; Chiefs 2nd again

The Western Lakes Activities Association girls swim meet Friday night was a virtual replay of the last one.

Livonia Stevenson claimed its second straight championship, winning by nearly the same margin over runner-up Plymouth Canton.

It was the sixth title in 10 years for the third-ranked Spartans and third for coach Greg Phill.

"I told the girls this — and I truly believe it — is the best team I've coached," he said. "When we were third in the state and set all those records (1986), that was a more talented team. As far as practice attendance, dedication and focus, this has been a great team."

The next four teams were the same as 1991 but in different order this year: Northville, North Farmington, Salem and Livonia Churchill. The last five held their places from a year ago.

The Spartans won by 47 points (544-497) over Canton as opposed to 46 last year (542-496). Stevenson got a challenge from the Chiefs, who were seven points ahead after the 100-yard freestyle.

"They're deep in every event," said Canton coach Hooker Wellman of the Spartans. "They have more choices than any team in the conference as far as where they want to put kids."

"Greg Phill did a great job not tapering his kids. They swam sore Wednesday and today. Now they can get back after it and really taper for the state meet."

Based on strong showings Wednesday in the preliminaries and diving Thursday, Wellman hoped his team could challenge in the finals. The Chiefs did but weren't quite strong enough.

"You look at what you can do and think maybe it could come down to the last event," he said.

"It's like flushing the toilet. It gets near the end and it all disappears. There's no room for mistakes. We had to be perfect, plus lucky on how the other teams swam."

Stevenson tied Canton for first place in the medley relay and won just two other events — the 500 freestyle (Tina Caranicolas) and breaststroke (Mandi Falk).

"This year our depth won it; we keep coming at you," Phill said. "Last year we had a few more superstars."

"This is the first time in my coaching career — 16 years — that every kid I entered made the finals and swam tonight."

Phill also attributed the team's continued success to assistant coach Jean Pritchard and first-year diving coach Bud Hurd.

Stevenson's Jennifer Sabina was runner-up to league champion Mandy Terrell of North Farmington — the first time the Spartans have placed a diver in the top six under Phill.

"We scored three points last year in diving and 23 this year," Phill said. "That's a major accomplishment. The addition of a diving coach really helped our team."

Jamie Hilliard, Jill Knapp and Lisa Morrison joined Falk on the medley relay team, which swam its best time of the season. Phill also cited the contributions of freshman Kelly Carlisle, who had two state-cut swims Friday, Beth DeWolf and captains Leslie Nichols, Holly Palmeri and Julie Petrillo.

Phill said he asked his swimmers to refocus their thoughts after a successful dual-meet season and in anticipation of a Canton challenge in the WLAAs finals.

"I believe only two teams in the state could beat us in a dual meet, but this is a different meet," he said. "Everyone sees us rolling over teams in dual meet."

"The girls lost their focus a little. We had to get them back and say 'This is going to be a big meet. Canton is a better team than everyone thinks.'"

Canton junior Jill Mellis was a double winner in the individual medley and butterfly and also helped the Chiefs share first place in the medley relay.

Churchill's Jaime Strauch won the 100 freestyle and swam a leg of the winning 200 freestyle relay. Salem's Mandi Ras was best in the 50 freestyle.

Taylor carries CC to grid win

Redford Catholic Central's 28-12 football victory Saturday afternoon over Detroit Mumford was Taylor made.

Junior tailback Freddie Taylor gained a career-high 157 yards on 27 carries and scored all four touchdowns as the Shamrocks won a Class AA Region 3 playoff game played at Pontiac's Wisner Stadium.

CC, 10-0 overall, will play in the Region 3 final at 1:30 p.m. Saturday against Troy at Wisner Stadium. Troy, also 10-0 overall, beat Detroit Henry Ford 17-6 in the other Region 3 game played Saturday.

Taylor scored on runs of 3, 11, 3 and 3 yards. His third score, which came with 11:58 remaining in the game capped a 14-play, 62-yard drive and gave the Shamrocks a 21-6 lead.

"That was an important drive," CC coach Tom Mach said. "It showed a lot of guts. Our brand of ball is not fancy but our players take pride in it. I can't remember any (CC) tailback since (the late) Aaron Roberts scoring four times."

Mumford made the score 21-12 on a 19-yard TD pass from quarterback Darrell Whaley to Dion Patterson but CC put the game away with an 87-yard drive to make the score 28-12. Taylor's 47-yard run set up his 3-yard score with 2:19 remaining.

The second-half scoring drives were especially satisfying for the Shamrocks, since they twice failed to score after Mumford turnovers in the first quarter. CC, which recovered two fumbles and had three interceptions, gained 152 of its 219 total yards after halftime.

"We felt we should have capitalized (in the first half) and knew we had to come out hard in the second half," Taylor said. "It was all because of the (offensive) line."

CC two-way tackle Aaron Babicz helped open holes for Taylor and fullback Jason Krueger (15 carries, 47 yards) and also combined with teammate Joe Suhajda

to sack Whaley for a 7-yard loss late in the game. Babicz said Mumford is much improved over last year, when the Shamrocks won a regular-season meeting 20-6.

"You've got to love blocking for a smart running back who reads holes like Freddie," said Babicz. "Mumford is stronger than last year, a lot stronger. Their linemen were immovable. You couldn't toy with them. I don't think we'll see anyone else that big."

Mumford's offensive line included bookend tackles Brian Ferguson and Lasceno Franklin, who weigh 360 and 340 pounds, respectively, but CC's main concern was wide receiver Derrick Mason.

Mason came in with 37 catches for 750 yards and nine TDs but finished with only two catches for 37 yards. Mason made a 35-yard catch in the first half, taking the ball away from CC defensive back Ken Rys, but Jeff LaChapelle intercepted a pass three plays later to end Mumford's only threat before halftime.

LaChapelle also intercepted a pass to end Mumford's first possession and linebacker Joe Hermann had an interception to end Mumford's last possession of the game.

"They had an eye on him (Mason) all game, so we were trying to use him as a decoy and send number 2 (Patterson) underneath," Mumford coach Brian Newton said. "We tried to go outside in the flat on screen passes but we really couldn't get into our game plan. We gave them too much field position."

Taylor's 3-yard run gave CC a 7-0 lead with 6:15 remaining in the first quarter. The score came four plays after Brady Pankow recovered a Mumford fumble at the Mustangs' 19-yard line.

Mumford made a bad snap on a punt to give CC possession at the Mustangs' 31 and Taylor scored six plays later from the 11 for a 14-0 halftime lead.

Mumford pulled to within 14-6 in the third quarter on a 3-yard quarterback keeper by Whaley.

hand on it again," Johnson said.

Salem controlled play most of the first half and outshot the Pilots 13-5. The Rocks had six shots on goal to DeLaSalle's two.

However, the Pilots (18-4-1) led 1-0 at halftime after Nick Krawczyk converted a free kick with 47 seconds left in the half. The shot followed a handball violation by Salem defender Brian Spuck, though he appeared to hit the ball with his shoulder.

Dood started with his left but slipped trying to recover when Krawczyk's shot deflected off the Salem wall into the right corner.

"I felt we played our game; we had good passing," Johnson said. "We just couldn't get that one good connection."

"We got revved up in the dressing room at halftime and took it right to them. When we got that goal early, I thought we were on

our way, but it was not meant to be."

Salem senior Joe Perron tied the score at 30:34 in the second half. He shot the ball from the left corner, past the DeLaSalle keeper. The ball got caught between defender Matt Mollicone's feet in front of the goal and spun into the net.

A deciding factor was DeLaSalle's ability to keep Baker from scoring, according to DLS coach Thair Mukhtar, who credited Jason Jaroch for marking the all-state midfielder.

"I thought the key to the game was Jason Jaroch," Mukhtar said. "There's no doubt Tommy Baker is the best player in the state. Jaroch is our best marker. I told him to stay on Baker and go wherever he goes."

"Baker is going to be a big-time college player and for us to get out

of the game without him scoring was a real key. I told the kids, 'If we control Baker offensively, we will win the game.'"

While acknowledging the Rocks outplayed DeLaSalle in the first half, Mukhtar thought he detected a Salem defensive flaw late in an even second half.

"As the game progressed, I thought their defense was weakening," he said, "because our forwards were having a little more liberty with them. We were starting to create more space, and their midfielders were having trouble getting back."

"They were good at one thing that sometimes wins games — the counterattack," Johnson said.

Can Ocelots take next step?

Dave Bogataj is a patient man. Usually. When asked to assess the progress of his Schoolcraft men's basketball program since he took charge in 1987, he will ask you to compare the last two 14-win seasons to the six- and eight-win records of his first two years. He will ask you to compare the team's cumulative grade point average of 2.3 last season to its sub-2.0 marks in 1988 and 1989.

"I feel good about the growth of the program," he said. "But..." His face contorts in an expression of impatience.

"But rather than crawling, can we take a good step this year? I'm tired of taking baby steps," he said. "Can we take one big adult step this year, please?"

Bogataj figures one adult step would take the Ocelots out of the second division of the talent-rich Eastern Conference and land them in the state playoffs for the first time since the early 1980s. And he figures this year's team is capable of one adult step at the very least.

"I like this team, I really do," he said. "I am especially pleased with the athleticism of this group. This is the deepest team I've had here and it is most athletic team I have had here."

Bogataj expects to deploy a nine- or 10-man rotation. Few Ocelot teams have enjoyed such depth.

"It makes us much more versatile and it allows us to play more aggressively than we have in the past," he said. "And it gives me some leverage. If these guys don't practice hard and if they start missing classes, they aren't going to play."

There is one down side: 10 of the 14 players are freshmen.

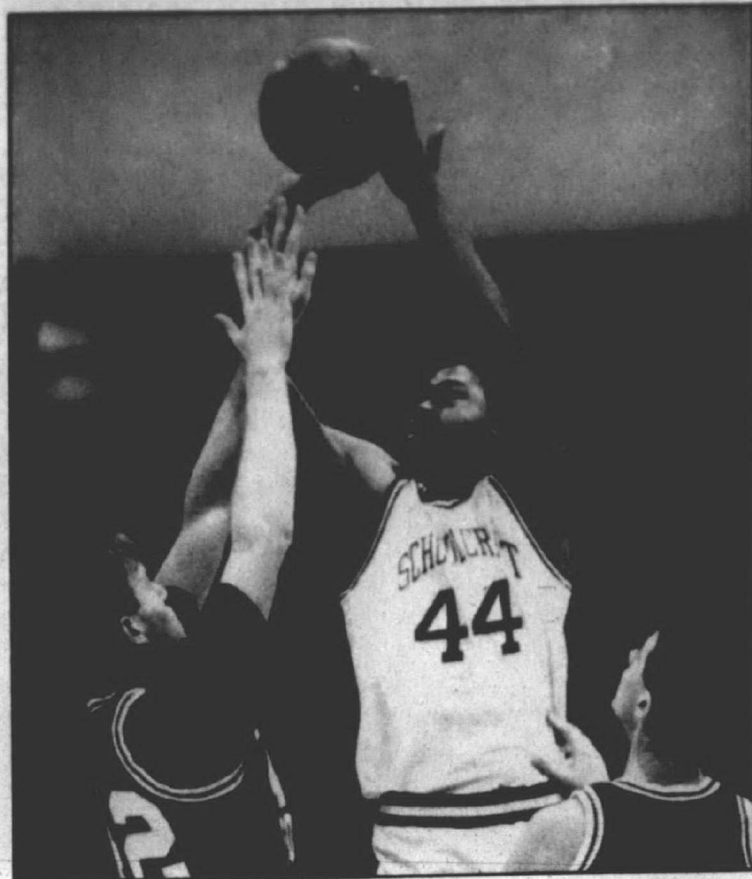
"That's going to kill us until they learn," Bogataj said. "Their athleticism should keep us in the games. And if they can learn to play as a team, we'll be OK."

The lone returnee is 6-6 sophomore forward Jarvis Murray (Detroit Cody). He led the conference in rebounding last season (10 per game) and was fourth in scoring (20 points per game).

"He's worked his butt off and he's become an outstanding player and leader for us," Bogataj said. "But outside of him, I can't tell you who will start. I probably won't know that until after the first couple of games."

There are three other sophomores. Shawn Branum, a 6-0 transfer from Barton Junior College in Kansas, is a strong perimeter shooter. Mohammed Abdraboh, 6-5, from Dearborn, transferred from University of Detroit-Mercy and could see action at shooting guard and both forward positions.

Vincent Turner, 6-0, from Detroit Henry Ford, has returned to school after a two-year stint in the army. He is battling for the point

guard spot with Detroit Redford freshman Craig Bowdry.

Vying for the center and power forward positions are Jermon Carter, a 6-6, 220-pound freshman from Detroit Western, LaMonte Fondren, a 6-5, 195-pound freshman from Oak Park, and Bryant Markowicz, a 6-7, 195-pound freshman from Dearborn Heights Crestwood.

Steve Whitlow, a 6-3 freshman from Redford Catholic Central, could see action at both guard spots and small forward. Courtney Williamson, 6-5 freshman from Detroit Central, could play at either forward spot and at shooting guard.

Frank McCray, 6-3 freshman from Inkster, John Lathan, 6-3 freshman from Detroit Henry Ford, Jon Fitzpatrick, 6-2 freshman from Farmington, and Quincy Mitchell, 6-3 from Detroit Benedictine, can play either big guard or small forward.

"These guys can all run and jump and they are strong," Bogataj said. "And I can do so many things. I can put a real big team on the floor. I can put a small, fast team on the floor. Whatever we need, I'm telling you, I like this team."

There are two factors that temper Bogataj's optimism:

One, the Eastern Conference was tough last year and it looks to be even tougher this year. Macomb Community College, runner-up last year, returns eight players. Defending champion Henry Ford, Oakland Communi-



ty, Mott, Alpena and even traditional cellar-dweller St. Clair all return stronger than last season.

Two, the annual uncertainty over academic eligibility. "We've taken all kinds of measures to address that problem," Bogataj said. "These kids know that if they came here just to play ball, they will be in trouble. The academic services are all in place here. If they still can't get it done, they have no place to look but at themselves." "This isn't high school anymore. It's not boys' basketball, it's men's basketball." No more baby steps.

ABC's 'Jacksons' good, no thriller

Music, parents' portrayals prove highlights

"The title of our miniseries tells the story," says Stan Margulies, executive producer of ABC's five-hour musical drama, *The Jacksons: An American Dream*, airing Sunday and Wednesday, Nov. 15 and 18. Together with partner and former Motown Records executive Suzanne De Passe, Margulies believes he has helped to create a program that "reinforces the age-old belief that a strong family can make any dream come true in this country, given talent, hard work and ambition."

Joseph Jackson's original dream was a successful musical career for himself. An able guitarist and vocalist, Joe planned to move to California and take his stab at show business, but the plans were scuttled by the unexpected pregnancy of his girlfriend Katherine. The couple married and settled in Gary, Ind., where Joe took a job at a steel mill.

But his dream didn't die. As the

family grew, Joe saw in his talented children the potential for stardom. A guitar for Tito was the first of many instruments and pieces of equipment Joe brought into the house, transforming the living room into a rehearsal studio. Relentlessly, Joe pushed his boys (the girls got their chances later, after the breakthrough of the Jackson Five) through practice after practice, often bringing one or more to tears, but never losing sight of his dream.

Lawrence-Hilton Jacobs, long relegated to straight-to-video action films, makes an unforgettable Joe Jackson. Through Jacobs' forceful, carefully crafted performance, we see Joe as a man whose thwarted ambitions and need for a better life blinded him to how hard he was pushing his children.

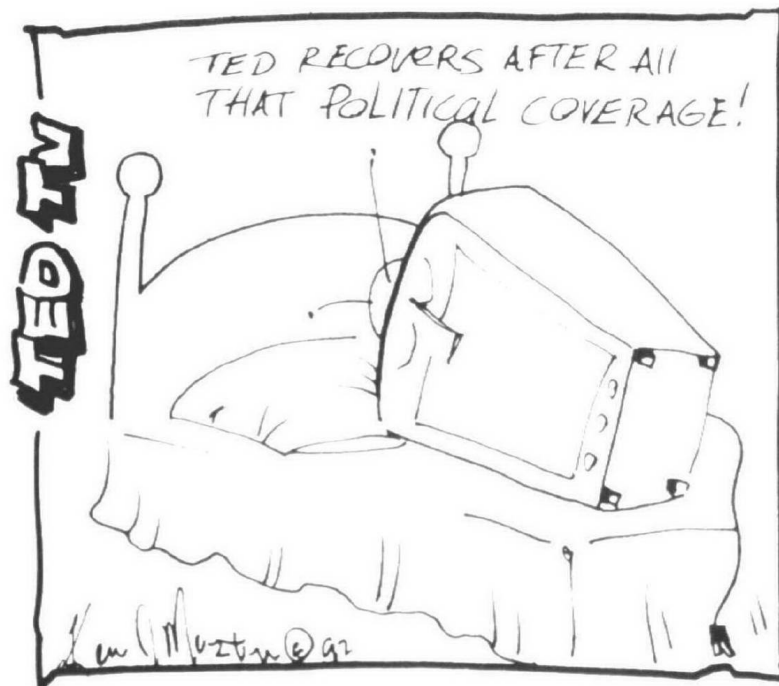
Angela Bassett is warm and sympathetic as Katherine, whose support bound her family in difficult times. The children are played at different ages by three sets of actors. The stand-out performances include Falyn Bryant's sensitive portrayal of eldest daughter Rebbie, and Damon Morris as the oldest of the show's three Jermaines. Wylie

Draper draws the difficult task of portraying the adult Michael and offers only a glimpse of the singer's strange, ultrasensitive relationship with his family and the world around him.

In the supporting ranks, Vanessa Williams makes a classy, eye-catching De Passe, and Holly Robinson does her own singing in an elegant cameo as Diana Ross. Billy Dee Williams brings both glamour and warmth to his small, flashy turn as Motown founder Berry Gordy.

Still, the miniseries is not without its flaws. The work contains isolated moments of TV-style drama—Joe ridiculing a prepubescent Marlon in rehearsal, Katherine's anger and tears at learning of Joe's infidelity—but the only continuing emotions in the piece are love, hope and the ambition to sing, sing, sing. Didn't anyone ever question the worth of their pursuits? Were there no encounters with racism or incidents of dissent as the other performing family members increasingly became Michael's sidemen? And were the Jacksons exempt from the normal agenda of spats, squabbles and divisions that plague other families?

Omissions such as these render *The Jacksons* merely a pastel diorama of the Jacksons' lives, short on excitement and long on caution, an inoffensive, entertaining cartoon that trivializes both a powerful moment in popular music and the very real drama of family life. The miniseries' message seems to be tap your toes, sing along and don't look too hard. It's as simple as A-B-C.

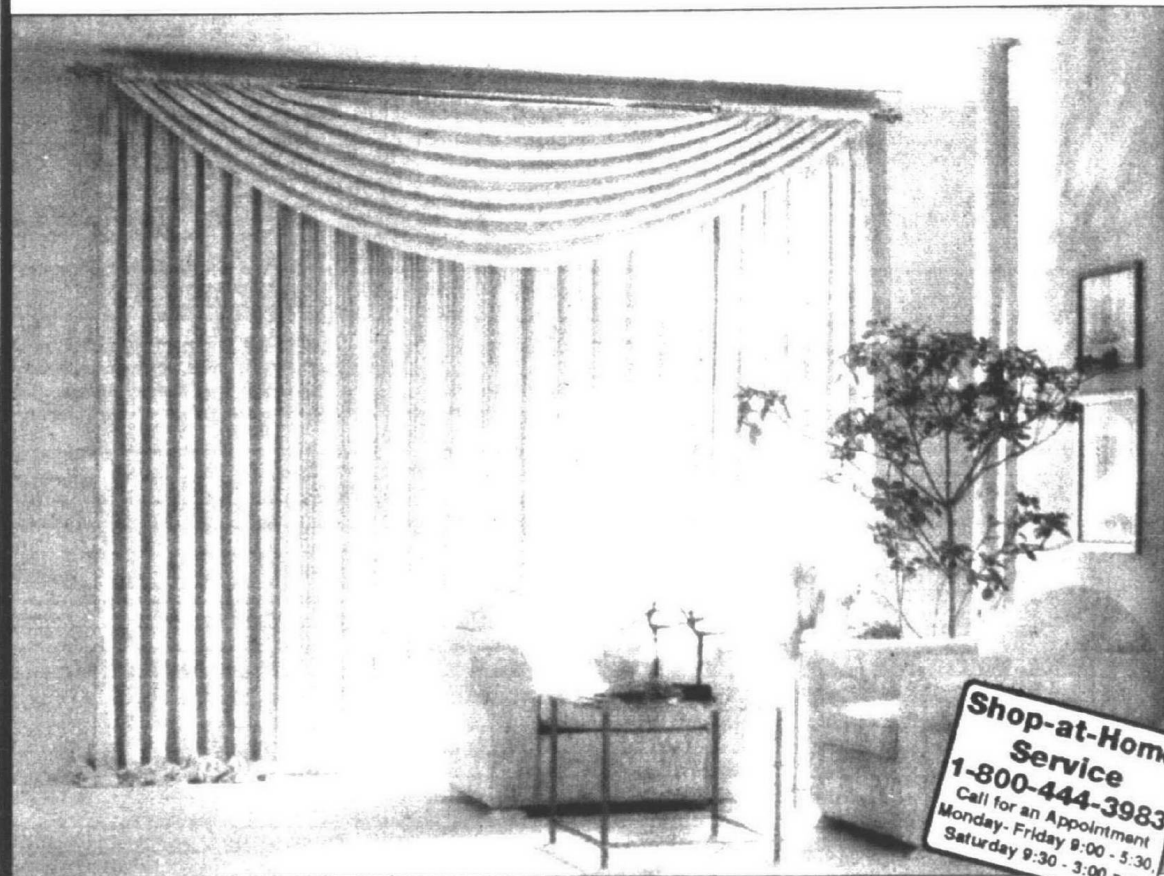

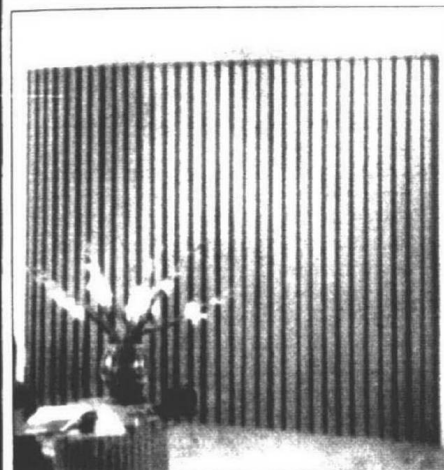
