\$1.44 million awarded in lawsuit



A settlement has been reached in a lawsuit filed in the wake of a two-plane collision over Plymouth Township that killed three persons. One of the planes had taken off from Mettetal Airport in Canton.

A lawsuit sparked by a small plane collision in 1990 over Plymouth Township has resulted in a \$1.44 million jury award for the family of one crash victim.

A Wayne county circuit court jury on Nov. 12 ruled in favor of the family

of Robert Gunn.

The suit followed the July 23 collision of the plane occupied by Gunn, 65, and Charles Nix, 55, of Detroit, with a second airplane piloted by Daniel Starr of Cedar Springs. All three men died in the crash.

Roger Wolcott, who represented Gunn's family, said the jury agreed

with a National Transportation Safety Board finding that the Federal Armed Services Inc. airplane piloted by Starr violated federal regulations by overtaking the aircraft occupied by Gunn and Nix.

In the suit, Wolcott claimed negligence on the part of Federal Armed Services.

Scott Torpey, attorney for Federal Armed Services, said he would file an appeal before the state Court of Appeals "within the next month or two."

"The jury deliberated for four days,

it was obviously a close decision," he said.

While the main wreckage of each airplane was separated by several hundred yards, debris was scattered over a two-mile area.

The collision happened at 9:30 a.m. on a cloudless day just south of M-14 and west of Beck.

According to the NTSB, the crash happened when Starr, in a twin-engine Piper Aerostar, tried to overtake the single-engine Piper Cherokee flown by Nix.

City expands recycling

City residents will soon be able to put out more kinds of recyclables at the curb.

Magazines, batteries, corrugated cardboard, envelopes (junk mail) and glass are to be accepted at the curb along with items already being taken.

CURBSIDE

This is the first significant change in the city's curb-side recycling program since it began in July.

The start-up of the expanded program "will be in the near future," said assistant city manager Paul Sincoc, "probably after the first of the year."

Sincoc and city solid waste coordinator Joe Russell said they're waiting for the go-ahead from the city's trash hauler, Mr. Rubbish.

It was earlier this year that city officials decided to go with a bagged-recyclables system, rather than the bin method used by Plymouth Township and other communities.

The creation of community recycling programs was sparked by orders from the state Department of Natural Resources to reduce trash going to landfills, or face penalties.

Since the city of Plymouth started its program, officials have had to field some complaints from residents wondering why the city didn't go for the bin method.

The recyclables-in-a-bag method the city opted for didn't include glass, as does the bin method. But once the revised program starts, glass will be accepted at the curb — not in the bag but in a separate container — along with other materials not being accepted in the communities using the bin method.

Oh deer: Slaughterhouse is busy

For the faint-hearted, the buzz of the saw can be deafening. Not to mention the sight of a deer's hind quarter whizzed through the sharp blade. But for the Boyer family, it's another day on the job.

"It's a family business," said Starr Stennis, daughter of Bob and Carole Boyer, who operates Boyer's Meat Processing. "I do everything my dad does — except the saw."

In the heart of the hunting season, the Boyer family is consumed with deer — dead deer. The bow season brought the Boyers 232 deer for processing. And by the time hunting is over the family expects to process close to 1,000 deer.

"We're running pretty close to even (with last year)," Bob Boyer

said. As of Thursday morning, the family had worked on its 245th deer.

Except for a sign posted at the end of a driveway, you wouldn't notice the operation as you drove down Barr Road off of Geddes in the far southwest corner of the township. A nice house faces the roadway. A long driveway takes you back to the processing plant surrounded by fenced areas.

What is everyday for the Boyers might not be for the average person who would rather not know what happens to the cows, pigs, goats and lambs that sooner or later become dinner. The Boyers smile a lot when a newcomer walks in apprehensively. But a handshake can

Local crowd hears 'thumbs up' message

Mike Utley, the Detroit Lion paralyzed in a game at the Silverdome a year ago, won the hearts of hundreds as he addressed a standing-room-only crowd of kids, teachers, parents, and reporters at West Middle School Thursday. Among them was an NBC TV crew filming a segment for a special to be aired nationally before the Lions' Thanksgiving Day game. Seventh-grader Chad Ellege spoke

for many when he said, "Mike Utley is like a cool guy and everything. He has a good attitude."

Utley, a right guard, broke his neck in a freak play in the Lions-Rams game a year ago Nov. 17. As he was carried from the field on a stretcher, Utley flashed the "thumbs up" sign to teammates and fans, signaling that he'd be back.

The gesture sums up the goal of the Mike Utley Foundation for spinal cord injury research, as well as the

National Football League's Thumbs Up merchandise program that benefits the foundation.

The Livonia-based Wauldron Corp., brainchild of Plymouth resident Jim Wauldron, recently received an NFL license to sell Thumbs Up T-shirts, sweatshirts and caps with the logos of all 28 NFL teams. So far, the NFL has donated \$150,000 in royalties from merchandise sales to the foundation.

At West, Utley spent an hour kibitzing with his host and friend Jim Wauldron, answering students' questions, and relating what he's learned about life.

Thumbs up posters and banners welcoming Utley hung on walls throughout the school. One thumbs up poster, covered with students' signatures, was given to Utley along with

Speaker: decide who can be helped

There's a better way. "The reality down the road is that none of us will have enough money to help everyone," said Myron Liner, vice president of United Way of Southeast Michigan.

Liner, whose job it is to determine which agencies receive United Way funding, told the Canton Economic Club at Geneva Presbyterian Church Wednesday that there is a better way — particularly with reductions in human resources funding — to determine who will be helped.

"All of the money we spend will not solve problems and make them go away." And it's a myth that volunteers can pick up the slack of what government and social service agencies cannot provide, Liner said.

Northwestern University has developed a method of filling the gap of "where people are and where they need to be," Liner said.

Community mapping, such as going door-to-door to determine needs, must be done. Liner suggested providing services based on a system similar to medical triage where it's determined who

can wait for help, who needs help immediately and who really can't be helped.

"It makes better use of existing services," Liner said. "To put a Band-Aid on problems probably makes us feel better in the short run," but people will be back for help.

Liner is expected to send information to Canton about such a community study. "I understand the concept, not necessarily the

process," said the Rev. Bill Myers, a past president of the Canton Community Foundation.

Township supervisor Tom Yack expressed the same sentiments. Yack would like people with time and talents to join forces with those who need help. "I'd like a community volunteer center established. I think we understand the potential in the community."

The need to recognize that as on a battlefield not all people can be helped, made sense to Myers and others.

"That for me was the most hopeful thing to say," Myers said. "Before it was not hopeful because there are more people and problems than dollars. For me, this was a logical way to get the most bang for the buck."

Rather than just a door-to-door approach to determine who needs what, Myers suggested that the school system, law enforcement and churches, for example, also be included in any survey.

Bill Joyner, foundation executive director, said it's time to adapt to different ways. "I think Myron Liner's suggestion is one we need to consider and perhaps implement."

Joyner lauded Liner's assessment of Canton as a healthy community in which commitment to others is clear. The formation of the foundation shows a recognition of problems in the community. "There does exist a basic infrastructure of services."

Services need to be unique and provided in a unique way to match the community. "We need to adapt to changing strategies," he said. "We are in constant communication with people; with homeowners associations, with students. The best way is to be streetwise and be out in the streets."

Bruce Patterson, foundation vice president, was intrigued with Liner's comments. "Our foundation is awkward and gawky and is reactive instead of proactive. We are at a point in our civilization where we can't expect never-ending resources for never-ending problems."

Patterson said he is hopeful for new ways of meeting needs with continuing limited dollars. "We are progressing toward a time when we will be able to delineate the community and its needs."

put the newcomer at ease.

Helping hunters

"The hunters bring them in, drop them off and we take care of it from there," Stennis said.

From the average 100-pound deer, the Boyers — all dressed in white, including aprons and caps — make steaks, roasts, chops, hamburger and sausage. The cuts are packaged and quick frozen. Processing takes about three-four days and costs about \$35. Actually, the Boyers can make 14 different kinds of sausage.

"They (deer) should be brought in right away," Bob Boyer said. "You cannot age venison."

The work starts in a smaller room where Boyer's son, Larry, hangs the deer up and skins it. The animals are already gutted by hunters right after they are killed. "The hunter has to gut them otherwise the meat will spoil. They leave it (internal organs) in the woods for other animals to eat," Bob Boyer said.

Unless the hunter wants it, skins will be sent to a hide company. The feet or hoofs this

year will be given to area Boy Scouts for a project. Nothing really has to go to waste. Heads this year are expected to be picked up by a woman involved in another project, Boyer said.

When Larry Boyer is done, the deer is sent into the next room — sort of the main room — where Bob Boyer is working the saw, and his wife, Carole, and daughter, Starr, package the meat.

With hunting season in full swing, the Boyers are a busy family. Fifteen-hour days are the norm. But as Starr says, it's a good job working with her family and setting her own hours. What more could you ask?

Bob Boyer can rattle off the answers to any variety of questions about meat, its taste and how it's best processed. Does are better meat. Venison has a wild taste. And bear meat — the Boyers process maybe five or six annually — has a strong taste.

Michigan deer aren't the only type processed by the Boyers. Hunters bring in deer from Pennsylvania and Wyoming. And they also process antelope, caribou and moose.

But that's not all the Boyers do. They also raise animals for slaughter. "We don't retail

anything," Carole Boyer said. In fact, you can drive down there, pick out an animal and tell them how you want it processed. A whole cow, for example, costs \$1,000-\$1,100.

Farm animals

Other customers bring their farm animals in to be slaughtered. "If you're a farmer you bring it in to us. You know what that animal has eaten. When you buy at the store, you don't know what the animals have been fed," Bob Boyer said.

All cuts are to the customer's liking. That's appealing to many who follow certain religious practices. Boyer sells a lot to Middle Eastern customers, for example.

There's no doubt the Boyers know what they're doing. They've had the processing plant on Barr Road for eight years. Before that, Carole and Bob owned their own grocery store with a butcher's shop for 16 years. Before that, Bob was a butcher for the Kroger supermarket chain.

Next year, the family expects to add some new equipment so they can process poultry including ducks, geese, chickens and turkeys.

Giving thanks

Holiday festival returns to city

Plymouth's one-of-a-kind Thanksgiving celebration is ready to roll.

To go with the Thanksgiving re-enactment in Kellogg Park, the centerpiece of "A Plymouth Thanksgiving," are some new and improved features — a native American flute player, expanded storytelling and more.

The third annual event happens Friday and Saturday downtown.

Founded by downtown business people Fred Hill, Sharon Pugh and Nancy Sheehan, it's based on the idea that businesses start celebrating Christmas a bit too early, as some malls put out holiday decorations in October.

Plus, they say, Thanksgiving is a great American holiday, worthy of special attention.

Pugh said organizers have raised nearly \$7,000 to go with the \$3,000 kicked in by the city to put on the event.

"We had a few people who didn't contribute this year but we have some new people so it evens

out," she said.

Because the event has been a success with onlookers and with the press — the CNN network has reported on "A Plymouth Thanksgiving" worldwide — no big changes are in the works.

Returning are native American dancers, a non-denominational service, craft and art exhibitions in downtown shops, storytelling at the Masonic Temple near Kellogg Park and the main event — a re-creation of the first Thanksgiving with the Plymouth Park Players and native Americans in period dress.

Organizers are encouraging more community participation. "If anybody wants to dress up as pilgrims, join us, be a part of it," Pugh said.

Those interested can call the downtown development authority office, Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce office, or her store, Sideways.

The event takes place from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. both days.

Native American dancers are scheduled for noon and 2 p.m., the service for 1 p.m., the dinner

re-creation at 1:30 on Friday and Saturday.

The storytellers scheduled to perform are Ron Lowe, Plymouth's city attorney; Debra Christian and Charlotte Blair, at 3 p.m. both days.

On order are the corn stalks, Indian corn and other decorations traditionally used for "A Plymouth Thanksgiving."

Native American flute player Louie Thunderhawk is scheduled to play for 15 minutes at 11:30 a.m. and 2:45 p.m. both days.

Plans also call for the guitar-hammered dulcimer group the Deer St. Players to perform from 2-3 p.m. both days at the Mayflower Hotel, and from 3-4 p.m. at Kellogg Park both days if weather permits.

In the building that formerly housed Fred Hill Haberdashers on Main Street, there will be a chair-carving exhibition from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day, in which the carver begins with a big slab of wood.

There is no charge to attend the "A Plymouth Thanksgiving" events.

Each year, the Plymouth Salvation Army gives thousands of food bags to needy families in Canton, Plymouth and Northville.

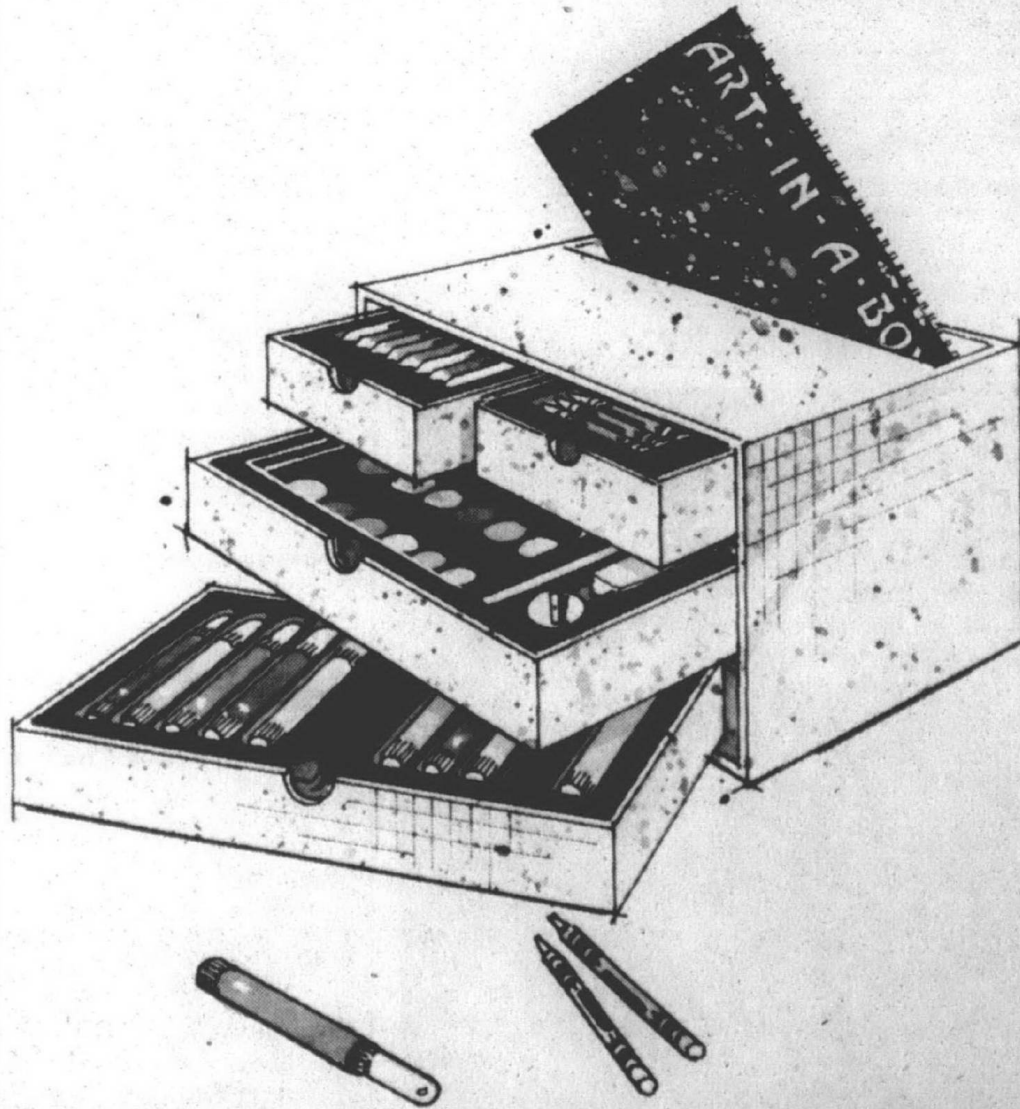

Vudu Hippies: Back to basics



What do you do if your highly anticipated New York showcase draws and audience of seven? If you're the Vudu Hippies, you head home to get leaner and meaner, so to speak, and get back to the basics that made your music click in the local clubs in the first place.

There they sat in a Manhattan McDonald's at 2 in the morning.

Five frightened, disillusioned musicians left to decide their fate after it was seemingly sealed following a highly anticipated showcase went bust at the venerable New York club CBGB's when only seven people turned up.

"And three of them we were related to," said bassist Chris Newberg, 22, who is from Birmingham.

The Vudu Hippies were a frayed lot that June night, having come full circle from the ebullience and enthusiasm that marked their highly touted arrival on the local scene three years ago. Reality arrived and it wasn't a cheeseburger.

Amid the discarded Big Mac containers, Newberg said the band decided to get back to basics. That meant the painful process of letting go of one of its guitarists, putting together a fresh collection of new songs and going into the studio.

The result is "Happy Medium," an 11-song testament to the resiliency forged from weathering a few crises and the musical maturation of an ambitious group of artists.

This is easily discernible in the robust guitar pop stylings in songs such as "Edge of the World" or "To God."

The Vudu Hippies' more seductive num-

bers, though, speak to uncertainty. Those may come in the pensive "Slow Bass" or the emotionally strewn "2 Sisters," which chronicles the disintegration between split personalities. The brooding number is written in the first and the third person.

"It symbolizes the record," said Newberg, who is one of the band's primary songwriters. "There's a lot of emotion and a lot of misrepresentation in it."

Such rancor wasn't present when the Vudu Hippies started fresh out of high school (Birmingham Brother Rice and Marian). Rather the enthusiasm of vocalist Renee Paquette, 21, drummer Brad Schrage, 21, and Newberg could barely be contained.

The Vudu Hippies promptly released a cassette, "Smarties," which draws grimaces today from band members. They also ingratiated themselves at a host of clubs in Ann Arbor and Detroit with their thoughtful and engaging performances.

The realities of the music business seeped in. A host of guitarists had already come and went as they initially performed as a five-piece band.

When guitarist Graham Cousens, 23, joined the group earlier this year, things finally looked settled. Then came the showcase in New York in June, which was preceded by a grueling 18-hour bus ride and a frightful stop in Cleveland.

With the debacle at CBGB's also came the realization one of the guitarists would have to go. The odd man out was Schrage's brother Rick.

"Up until that day, it was the hardest thing I've ever had to do," said Schrage about telling his brother. "He took it well, though."

Such experiences have made the Vudu Hippies wiser. They've grown in other ways.

Paquette's voice has always been the dynamic in the band and capable of kicking up a vocal dust storm reminiscent of ex-Lone Justice singer Maria McKee. Such emotional wailing, though, is now tempered by self-assuredness.

"I knew my limits now where before I didn't," said Paquette, who is from Southfield. "I would try to overdo it before. . . I thought having a small range was bad, but it's not."

The Vudu Hippies' range on stage is confident, largely devoid of posing and cliched theatrics. A recent show at Rick's Cafe saw the band in riveting form.

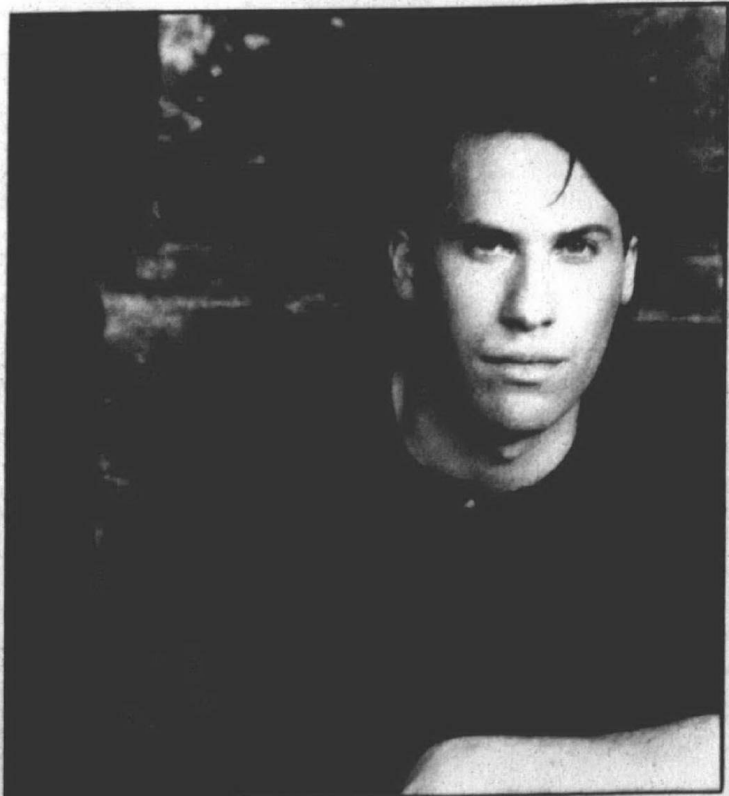
"Happy Medium," which will be released in January, has the same attributes.

"It's a transitional record," Newberg said. "It was a transitional time for the band . . . which gives it a full range of emotion and diversity on the album."

Having grown up, one wonders where there's left to go? Replied Newberg, "I think where we're going is deeper into ourselves."

DRY — PJ Harvey

At a time when high-tech gimmickry has extended its grip to most forms of alternative music and "rockers" whose ideas were entombed a generation ago are hailed every time they churn out a top seller, PJ Harvey's "Dry" is a welcome change.

The fittingly titled debut by the Dorset-based trio offers a sharp, unadorned sound led by the strong vocals and sure guitar of the band's eponymous founder.

The group, which formed in July of last year, claims a wide range of influences that include early Rolling Stones, Elmore James and Captain Beefheart.

"Dry" opens with "Oh My Lover," a slow, mournful, bass-driven plea to a paramour.

With "Dress," the danceable third cut, Harvey shows off her muscular vocal style in a celebration of sensuality. The group, Ste-

phen Vaughan leading the way on bass, shows a similar athleticism on "Sheela-Na-Gig."

The pace slows a bit for the ironic "Plants and Rags," on which an acoustic guitar and a cello are prominent. The song, written by Harvey and Robert Ellis, tells of a broad imagination that helps ease a limited material life.

Ellis, who plays drums and harmonium and adds vocal backing, also shares writing credits with Harvey on "Joe." An able group of studio musicians assisted the trio for the album.

Spike converses with 'Malcolm X'

Like him or not, Spike Lee sure knows how to stir up the media. He urged students to cut class last week to check out his new screen biography of "Malcolm X." He irked the press in his attempts to accommodate only black journalists for interviews.

Spike's got \$30 million riding on this project along with his reputation. The great thing is that "Malcolm X" is every bit as good as Spike says — a fair, surprisingly objective biography of the controversial black leader, featuring a knockout lead performance by Denzel Washington.

Clocking in at almost 3 1/2 hours, this truly epic film opens with Malcolm Little as a young dandy

in a zoot suit walking Harlem streets with long loping arm strokes.

Harlem's golden age is presented almost in the context of the Hollywood musical, complete with a raucous dance scene. This is heaven for Malcolm with its fashionable denizens, trend-setting jazz, and for a smart guy like him, loads of opportunity.

Malcolm engages in some numbers running and burglaries with best friend Shorty (played by Spike Lee) before the pair ends up in prison. It's here that Malcolm meets Barnes (Albert Hall), a persuasive fellow con who teaches him the discipline and pride of the Muslim faith.

He becomes a Muslim behind bars and on release is immediately taken into the fold. His oratory and powerful presence make him one of the organization's most sought-after speakers.

So popular is Malcolm that many Muslims fear that he is

grandstanding for the press. These accusations, along with a sex scandal involving leader Elijah Muhammad, causes Malcolm to break off on his own, a move that directly leads to his assassination in 1965.

From what I've been able to gather, "Malcolm X" paints a fairly realistic portrait. Sure, you know where Spike stands. He obviously idolizes the man. Yet, he also depicts Malcolm's frequent bad judgment, inappropriate public statements (he labeled the Kennedy assassination "chickens coming home to roost") and overt sexism.

As a character, Malcolm is so thoroughly amazing and entertaining because of his chameleon-like transformations over the years from drug-pushing Detroit Red (so called for his years residing in Michigan) to the enlightened Malik El-Shabazz who makes a soul-searching pilgrimage to Mecca.

Denzel Washington, seen in virtually every shot, has the role of his life here. Not only does he strongly resemble the thin, bespectacled Malcolm, but he has the intensity to create more than a martyr symbol, something he was unable to do with Stephen Biko under the weight of Richard Attenborough's South African epic "Cry Freedom."

Watch Spike scream — and rightly so — if his star and his film are snubbed at the Academy Awards next year. It would be Spike's first Oscar; Washington's second.

Spike's ranting and raving makes perfect sense in the wake of this landmark film. Like Malcolm, he knows that wildly controversial statements will allow his voice to be heard. With films like "Do the Right Thing" and "Malcolm X" under his belt, that voice should echo for years to come.

Cookie controversy consumes commission

The most contentious topic of discussion among Wayne County commissioners last week was whether the sheriff's department should buy 20,000 boxes of Girl Scout cookies.

The unusually lighthearted meeting was a far cry from what was expected to be a boisterous session on the new budget. The commission will take up the budget issue on Wednesday.

Instead, commissioners enjoyed an uncharacteristic spasm of amity marked by numerous temporary absences on the part of several commissioners, the occupation of the chairman's seat by three different commissioners, and a second vote on the Girl Scout cookie issue because some people weren't sure if a quorum was present for the first vote.

When the meeting began at 2:30 p.m. (a half hour late as usual), six of the 15 commissioners were absent: Otis Mathis, D-Detroit, George Cushingberry, D-Detroit, David Cavanagh, D-Grosse

Pointe, Susan Hubbard, D-Dearborn, Bryan Amann, D-Canton, and Maurice Breen, R-Plymouth. By meeting's end two hours later, all but Mathis, Breen and Cavanagh had drifted in.

Between start and finish, commission chairman Arthur Blackwell, D-Detroit, disappeared from the dais to be replaced by vice chair Jackie Currie, D-Detroit, as presiding officer. Then Currie departed the chamber and the just-arrived Cushingberry took her place. But Currie returned and Cushingberry took his usual seat. Then Blackwell came back and took over to finish the meeting.

Considering the speculation of late that a new chairman will be selected in January to replace Blackwell, one almost got the impression that "tryouts" were being conducted.

At one point, commissioner William O'Neil, D-Allen Park, forgot that Currie was no longer chairing the meeting and addressed Blackwell as "madame

chair." Everyone laughed, and Blackwell said, "I've got some boxing gloves if you're in doubt any time."

As to the Girl Scout cookies, the sheriff's department had requested that the commission approve spending \$6,800 for 20,000 boxes to supply residents of the Wayne County Jail with a low-cost dessert.

O'Neil wondered why they didn't go out for bids on the cookie contract. Commission attorney Ben Washburn said, "It's not a competitive bid because it's a sole-source supplier."

O'Neil replied, "It's a known fact that there are a zillion suppliers of cookies. We are opening the biggest Pandora's box. I can't wait for the M&M groups to come to us (and ask us to buy candy from them)."

The sheriff's department spokesman said the cost of desserts for inmates will be just two cents a serving with the Girl Scout cookies as opposed to 14 cents with regular desserts.

Commissioner Kay Beard, D-Westland, wanted to know what the serving size is. "I think they get two or three cookies," the sheriff's department spokesman said. "That's part of their meal."

The commissioners present at the time voted to approve the purchase with O'Neil abstaining to lodge his protest. But when Blackwell returned later, someone asked that the vote be taken again because no one was quite sure if they had the required eight commissioners present for the first vote.

The cookie purchase passed once again, with O'Neil proffering his now-familiar abstention.

Amann, who came into the meeting room about 30 minutes before it was all over, got in on the last of the cookie controversy.

"Why are we buying these for the guys in jail?" he asked. "Do they deserve cookies?"

Blackwell teased, "Ninety-five percent of those incarcerated get out, so be careful what you're saying."

a West T-shirt. A Seattle native, Utley told students that when he was their age, he attended a Catholic grade school. "You guys are lucky; you don't have to wear a damn uniform," he said.

Utley starred on the gridiron for Kennedy High School and Washington State University before being drafted by the Lions in the third round four years ago. "The Lions were the only team I wanted to play for," he said.

Utley described a typical day in his post-football life. Utley has an apartment in Denver, where he is receiving treatment at Craig Hospital.

"I get up at 6 a.m. and get a couple hours of medical help. After that, from 10 till about noon, I go to the gym and lift," he said. After lunch, Utley drives his specially-equipped van to Craig, where he undergoes rehabilitation.

Defies doctors

Utley already is defying doctors who said he'd never walk again. He's regained much of his mobility, and is learning to "gate," using parallel bars and braces to swing himself forward while holding himself upright.

Progress has been slow, but sure. "The first time I picked something up off the floor, that was a good day," he said. "The day I stood up without passing out, that was a good day." So was Super Bowl Sunday, when after trying for an hour and a half, Utley was able to open a can of Coke for himself.

Much of his free time is spent with girlfriend Debbie Riddle, a 1986 graduate of Rochester Adams High School.

"I still do the same stupid stuff; I just get caught a little quicker," he said.

Utley passed along some advice.

"Keep your heads straight, so when your time comes, you guys can be leaders," he said. "My parents always stood behind me. You have to find someone who will be a role model for you."

Program working

Utley, still muscular and broad-shouldered with an earring dangling from his left ear, said he's been thrilled with the enthusiasm the Thumbs Up program has generated across the country.

"It makes you feel good that people are aware of what's going on," he said. "I want to make sure there is a cure for this. I want myself to be fixed, and I want to everyone else to be fixed, too."

"How did you feel emotionally when you learned you were paralyzed?" asked a student.

"To tell you the truth, there was only one time when I felt down," said Utley. "It just took me a second to realize that's not what I wanted. There were a million things I could do before I was hurt, and there are still 999,999 things I can do. Don't worry about those things you can't do; don't waste time thinking about it."

Being an athlete, "I've never learned to give up. I never have and I never will," he added.

Standing ovation

Utley, who's competing in triathlons and wheelchair races, says he believes in thinking positive. "Everyone has bad days; parents, adults, everybody. You just have to keep pushing. There's always something else out there you want. Just go out and get it."

Students, thumbs up, gave Utley a standing ovation.

"It's an honor to come here before you," said a clearly moved Utley. "Just focus on yourself; believe in yourself, because you're number one. No matter what happens, you're still who you are."

Utley said it's important not to look back. "You can't say, 'I wish... Don't do that. Go on from this day forward. I live for today, prepare for tomorrow and learn from yesterday so I don't repeat my mistakes.'"

Don't forget to dream, he added.

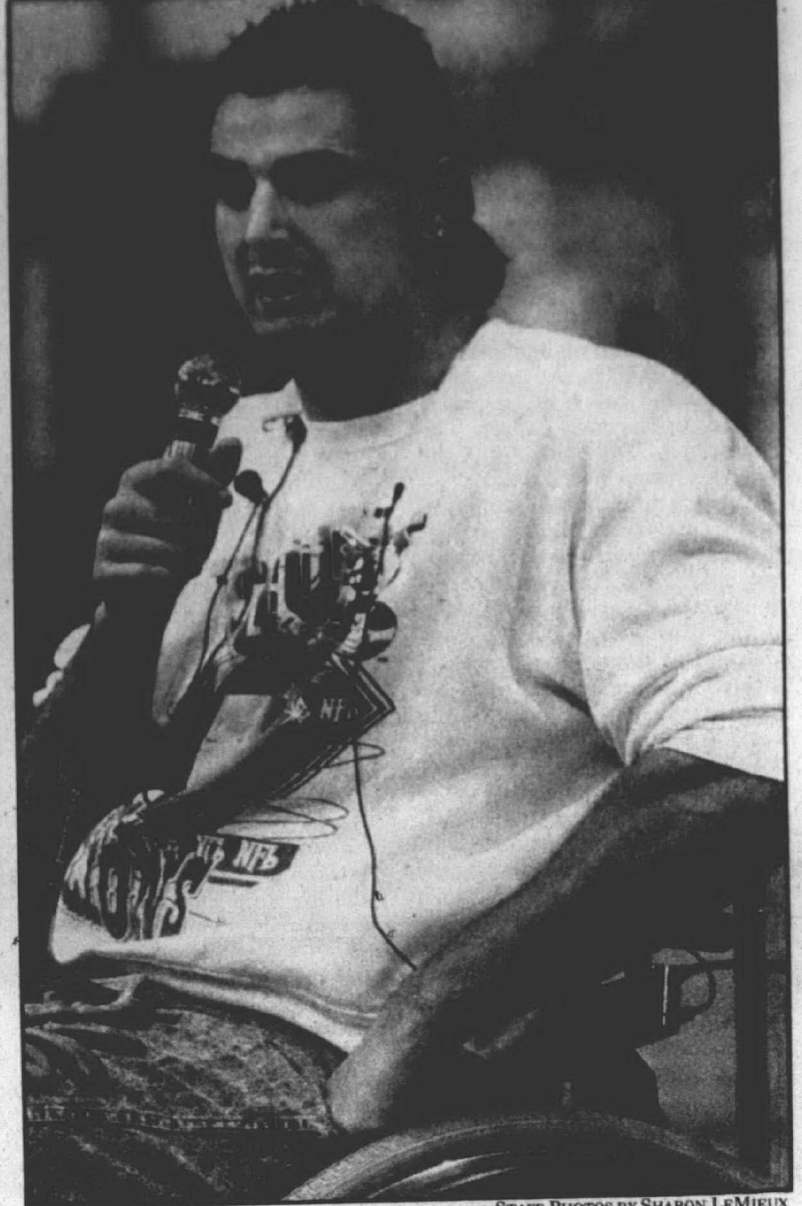
"When I'm feeling down, I envision riding my motorcycle, tilting back and relaxing. I make myself relax and feel good. Wish and

Starr was flying the aircraft from Detroit City Airport to Benton Harbor, transporting a load of canceled checks.

Nix and Gunn, a flight instructor, were on a training flight that took off from Mettetal Airport in Canton.

NTSB investigator Mark Doub found that the Aerostar "impacted the Cherokee from the right rear," as evidenced by the location of propeller slashes in the right wing of the Cherokee.

"The regulations say the plane

in front has the right of way," Wolcott said.

The presiding judge in the case was John H. Gillis.

According to Doub, "Witnesses reported that both aircraft were on a westerly heading at about 1,000-1,500 feet when the twin-engine aircraft overtook, and flew through the single engine aircraft."

"They reported that immediately after the impact, the right wing came off the Cherokee and the aircraft spiraled vertically to the ground."

Sometime after the New Year, clear, green and brown glass will be accepted.

"They have to put it in some kind of rigid container, made out of plastic or metal," Russell said.

Also being accepted are:

■ Batteries — to go in a separate bag to be placed inside the recyclables bag.

■ Magazines, to be placed in a brown paper bag and kept separate from newspapers placed in another brown bag.

■ Junk mail, envelopes and paper, placed inside the recyclables bag.

■ Corrugated cardboard, set out loose with the trash.

"The residents will get a flier in the mail" detailing the new program, Russell said.

A video detailing the expanded program is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Monday on cable TV Channel 15.

S'craft seeks applicants for vacancies

Help wanted: Part-time job, friendly co-workers, fancy title, lots of reading required, no pay.

That's not exactly the ad Schoolcraft College will take out, but the board of trustees is busily engaged in hunting up two people to fill the vacancies left by Jeanne Stempien and Thaddeus McCotter.

Stempien was elected to the Wayne County Circuit Court Nov. 3, while McCotter gained admission to the county commission. Both will take over their new jobs Jan. 1.

McCotter and Stempien turned in their resignations (effective Dec. 31) to the Schoolcraft board Wednesday. Hence the five remaining trustees can get down to the business of discovering replacements.

To be eligible to serve on the

Schoolcraft board a person must be a registered voter and live in the Plymouth-Canton, Livonia, Garden City, Clarenceville, Northville or part of the Novi school districts.

The board will accept applications through Dec. 15, then interview all the candidates on Jan. 6, 13 and 20. The new board members will be sworn in on Jan. 27.

Trustee Mary Breen said the board generally gets 10-12 applications when vacancies occur. The record is 27.

However, the newly appointed members must face the voters June 14 to keep their jobs. Current trustee Patricia Watson, who was appointed to fill a vacancy in October 1991, will also be up for election at that time.

Also, folks who apply for one of the appointments and don't make the cut have a chance to

get even next year if they want to campaign for one of the three trusteeships up for election in June.

Stempien has been a Schoolcraft board member since 1985, serving as chair for the last two years. In her resignation letter, she said, "(You have) my sincerest wishes for the continuing success of Schoolcraft College. The years that I have served as trustee have been very gratifying to me and I will treasure them always."

McCotter has been on the Schoolcraft board since June 1989. In his resignation letter, he said, "To my fellow trustees, the administration, the faculty and above all the students, I fondly say: I am proud to have served with you in serving this college and this community; and, because of your proven commitment to Schoolcraft and

this community, I know the college will continue on its course of excellence."

But McCotter and Stempien aren't the only Schoolcraft denizens bidding adieu to this particular institution of higher learning.

Executive secretary Joyce Ludwig, who has served three Schoolcraft presidents in 28 years of employment, performed her duties as board secretary for the last time Wednesday night, Dec. 14 is Ludwig's last day on the job, after which she'll head for Florida and a session with her new grandchild.

Ludwig's replacement, Fran Joswiak, 50, of Highland, was introduced at Wednesday's meeting. Joswiak was chosen from among 55 applicants, which is longer odds than Miss America faces.

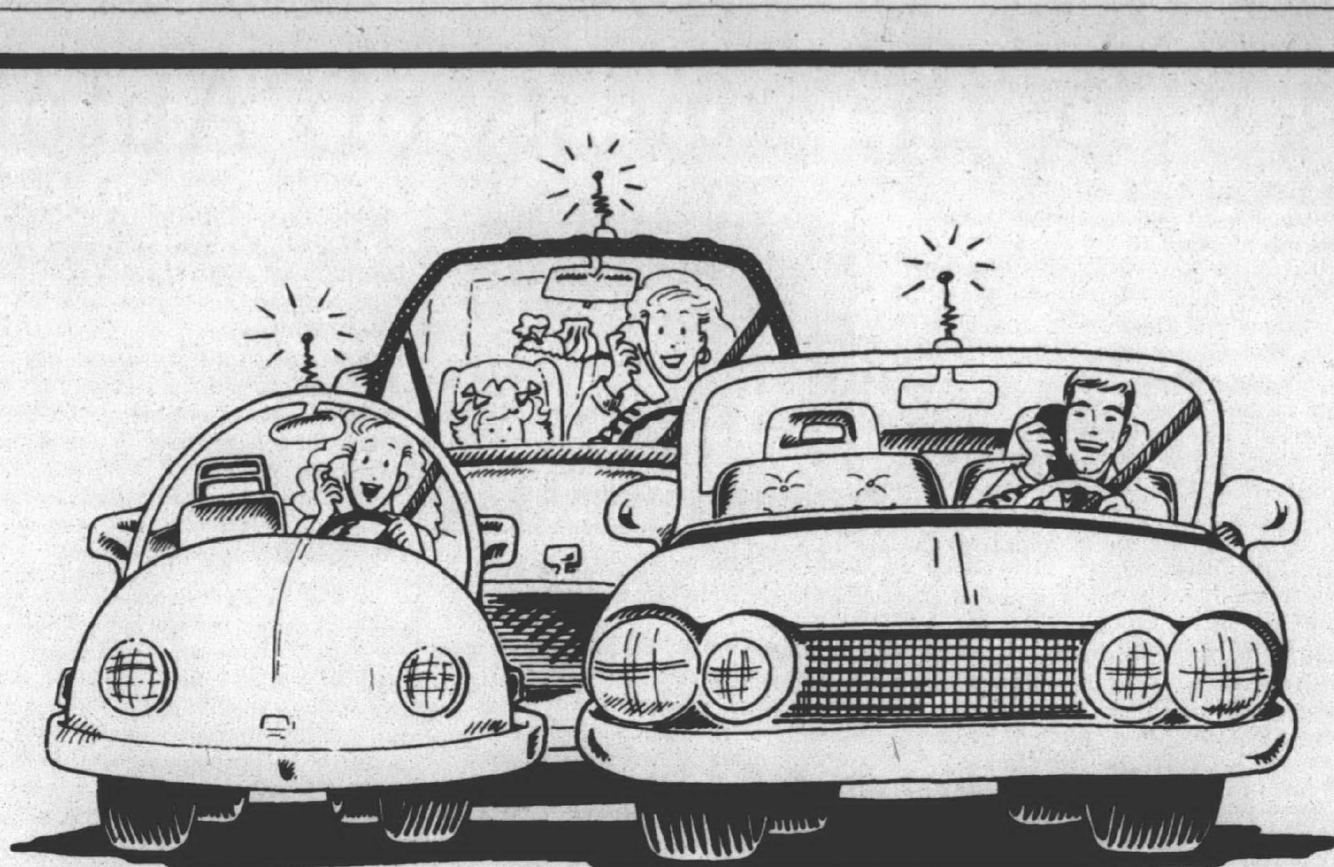

Conference shows more to learn about tolerance

Against a backdrop of the beating death of Malice Green, a long-planned community conference on racism was held in Birmingham last week.

Sponsored by the Birmingham Bloomfield Task Force on Race Relations, Focus: HOPE and the Race Relations Council of Metropolitan Detroit, it attracted a large, well-integrated, well-intentioned audience bent on "Getting to the heart of it: Taking our pulse on racism."

What was quite obvious from the general discussion and that which went on in small groups around the room was that the blacks attending knew a whole lot more about whites than we knew about them.

"Let's just talk about the word 'honky' — an epithet applied to whites by blacks. Most whites have had so little experience with blacks, except on our own terms, that we don't know its full meaning.

So when the groups analyzed a situation in which a white is referred to as a "honky" and a black as a "nigger," the whites didn't really know whether they could be equated.

How very little I know was recently reinforced when, purely by chance, I was part of an otherwise all-black audience.

My husband and I were in Chicago two weekends ago, and went with our younger daughter and her friend to a comedy club.

When we were seated, I looked around and noticed that my husband, daughter and I were the only white people there, with the exception of one waitress.

The truth: Had we known we would be the only whites, we would have been afraid to go.

And we would have missed a lot. We missed a lot anyway. Much of

the humor and dialogue is hard to catch, when you have our small frame of reference. Yet, we expect blacks to negotiate in a white world every day.

"Hey, I see some whites up in the colored section," the black comedian said to good-natured laughter. A few minutes later, he called for applause because "they're supporting black comedy."

I thought of that experience when

Lila Cabbil, president of LMC Diversified Consulting, pointed out at the conference that blacks support white businesses but whites completely ignore black businesses, such as along the "Avenue of Fashion" at Livernois and Seven Mile Road.

I thought of that experience when keynote speaker Father William Cunningham from Focus: HOPE explained how carefully he trained young black men and women to take jobs in the white community — including how to talk to and treat "Mrs. Levandowski of Rochester."

"If you talk to Mrs. Levandowski, you can remember black is beautiful, but business is business," he tells them.

One Vietnam veteran told his group at the conference there had been virtually no discrimination in his military unit — probably because it was a case of survival.

Which drew the response: "We're not

looking at this issue as a survival issue — but we probably need to."

Incidents such as the beating death of Malice Green, the incessant killing of black children, and the fear that keeps many blacks on one side of Eight Mile and suburban whites on the other, attest to that.

Over five years, the task force in Birmingham has taken steps, such as this conference, designed to re-educate its institutions and residents.

It meets at 8 a.m. the third Monday of the month at The Community House in Birmingham. It's time for others to find out what the task force is doing and apply it to their communities.

You see, it's a matter of survival.

Movie misses depth, honesty of 'Autobiography'

The critics are stumbling over themselves to praise Spike Lee's "Malcolm X." The words "masterpiece" and "epic" are being freely thrown about.

Unfortunately, the praise smacks of patronization because these critics briefly suggest what is wrong with this film and then scurry on as if they didn't want to offend the great black auteur or his black audience. Lee and his films are too important to be so shamelessly patronized.

"Malcolm X" is a big, ambitious and important movie. It is a must-see for those who have any interest in American history and in strong, intelligent films. On the plus side, Lee stays true to the "Autobiography." He doesn't reject the controversial ending in which Malcolm moves from strict separatism and racial hatred to a more accommodating position.

Denzel Washington gives an outstanding performance as Malcolm. He

captures the fire and anger, but he also captures the humanity in his sly smiles and in the growing awareness of his spiritual being. Other performances, especially Al Freeman Jr.'s dead-on Elijah Muhammad, are excellent. Lee's experiments with the medium are about 75 percent successful, especially the use of black and white as memory jolts to those of us who saw Malcolm through early '60s television.

So what is wrong? As in other Lee "joints" (his word for his works), there is a basic dishonesty in his portrayal of black inner city neighborhoods and life. In "Do The Right Thing," Lee's New York slum resembled nothing so much as a Sesame Street set. The streets were tidy, the conflicts until the end were also a little too tidy. In the end Lee's concepts were foggy. Danny Aiello's pizza parlor owner was the most humane character, which seems not at all what Lee had in mind. That

movie, too, was provocative and well acted but disquieting and disappointing.

In "Malcolm X" the problem is more serious. In the Alex Haley penned "Autobiography," which is one of the greatest books of our time, Malcolm goes through several spiritual transformations. The early part of the book tells explicitly what Malcolm went through as a child and young man. He is brutally honest about his life as a pimp,

pusher, drug addict and thief. He is blunt about his views of racism, but he is also blunt about the lack of self-esteem and responsible behavior in the black community.

The movie sadly misses all of this. The scene in which a teacher tells Malcolm to forget about being a lawyer and study for a Negro trade is one of the strongest in the book because it is told with subtlety and presented after establishing Malcolm's love of books and his good showing as a student.

In the movie, it is played for laughs with a caricatured white bigot teacher in loud clothes with a loud mouth. And it is only briefly mentioned that Malcolm was a good student. Later, Christopher Plummer plays another comic white, a vulgar preacher who knows God is a white man. In fact, all whites are reduced to comic walk ons as racists or twits (no doubt Lee's revenge for Steppin' Fetchit).

In the movie, the Harlem of the '40s is a way cool black amusement park where Malcolm and his little buddy, played by Lee, walk around in blinding zoot suits and wide brimmed hats. The music is hot and the games are slick. This is in the book but so is the other side. Where is the poverty, where is the brutal crime, where is the ravaging addiction, where is the irresponsibility that Malcolm later rebelled against? Malcolm's crimes are also treated lightly. This is far from the spiritual depths that the book details.

Do the right thing, see the movie, yes, but more importantly read the book!

Madonna marks 45 years prepared for future challenges

Madonna University marked its 45th anniversary last week with liturgy, campus activities and the announcement that the school has completed a five-year \$10 million fund-raising campaign and met a Kresge Foundation Challenge grant deadline of Dec. 1.

Madonna is the largest Catholic Franciscan University in the United States.

"From its founding in 1947 by the Felician Sisters of Livonia, Madonna has remained committed to the spiritual, educational and service-oriented mission of its Franciscan Catholic heritage," said Sister Mary Francilene, university president.

In the university's annual report for 1991-1992, Sister Francilene outlined the successes of the school. Quoting from one of her favorite scriptural passages (Exodus 14:15) "Tell the people to go forward" she urges supporters planning for the future: "Let us do it together."

An outgrowth of Presentation Junior College, Madonna has grown from a small women's college with 218 students to 4,419 men and women in 1992.

The liberal arts college started out in the Felician Sisters Motherhouse at Schoolcraft and Levan and offered only four programs - education, social work, medical technology and secretarial science. In 1959, Madonna was accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

The school became coeducational in 1972. The university prides itself on opening its doors to both older and younger adult varying in age, economic, religious, social and cultural backgrounds. Sixteen percent of total enrollment is composed of minority students. As of 1991 one-quarter of the student were men.

In 1975, the school initiated interpreting programs for communication with deaf people and admitted the first deaf students. Since that time, more than 500 deaf and hearing-impaired people have enrolled at Madonna.

Madonna now offers more than 50 undergraduate programs along with master's degrees in business, education and nursing.

In 1991, Madonna College became Madonna University. The school has had only five presidents - Sister Mary Paula (1947-1954), Sister Mary Assumpta (1954-1960), Sister Mary Raynelda (1960-1965), Sister Mary Danatha (1965-1976 and for the last 16 years Sister Mary Francilene.

In the 1960s the school's major buildings were constructed. Additional building followed - the Activities Center in 1971, a new \$4.5 million library and lecture hall in 1984, Educational Development Center in 1987 and the acquired Angelo DiPonio Building in 1991.

The announcement of the successful five-year fund-raising campaign and challenge grant, will mean more improvements at the Schoolcraft and Levan campus. The challenge grant from the Kresge Foundation is designed to aid students in the science-related fields.

"The Kresge Foundation approved a grant of \$300,000 toward Madonna's science renovation on a challenge basis to assist the university in raising the balance of the \$10 million campaign which was \$944,315," explained Sister Francilene.

Community leaders and friends of the university also have committed financial help over the years.

"Our future is predicated on hope and shared vision. We are a living, breathing, dynamic community of people," said Sister

Francilene. "We cannot do all that our mission challenges us to do without the support and involvement of many caring individuals who share the values, hopes and purposes of all humanity," she added.

Last Thursday, administrators, faculty, staff and student representatives attended a liturgy of thanksgiving. Recognition was given to many individual including those who have been with the university for 10 and 20 year periods.

Ann Marie Fowler, a junior music major, received the St. Catherine Undergraduate Achievement Medal. The award is presented each year through the Detroit Chapter of Kappa Gamma Pi to a student who has completed five semesters of college work at Madonna while maintaining a grade point average of 3.25 or better.

On Saturday, university benefactors participated in a special Eucharistic liturgy and banquet. Lifetime members of the President's Cabinet were presented with a medallion while those who have given sustained support for five and 10 years received plaques.

Donors, new to the President's Cabinet, received pins.

William T. Phillips, chairman of Phillips Service Industries in Livonia, is chairman of the Madonna University Board of Trustees. Recent newcomers to the board are William P. Connor, president and chief executive officer of Norquick Distributing Co. of Livonia and Lawrence A. Wisne, president of Progressive Tool & Industries Co. of Southfield.

PAIN AND SWELLING

When joints are swollen, they are not necessarily painful. The reverse is also true: a joint can look perfectly normal at a time it is causing you intense distress.

Joint swelling and pain are in step when the swelling occurs suddenly. Swelling represents the accumulation of fluid in a joint; if the fluid flows in quickly, the joint capsule must distend rapidly. The sudden stretch affects the joint as if it were placed on a medieval rack.

In contrast, if the irritation is slight but sufficient to cause the joint to react, you may have a slow increase in fluid. The site would have time to adjust; you could develop large amounts of fluid so gradually you would not feel the need to seek medical attention.

You can have a great deal of damage to a joint with continual pain, and yet have no swelling. A typical instance is a ligament tear in a knee or ankle, or a shoulder rotator cuff tear. The makeup of joints includes not only tissue but nerve endings. In the case of injury, nerve endings are irritated by stretching or direct damage and express their disruption by signals you receive as pain.

Physicians experienced in arthritis do not need to see evidence of swelling to appreciate that your joints hurt badly. The features and pattern of onset often provide the information as to why you are in pain and indicate what treatment is in order.

Metro expansion, noise reduction plans outlined

Metro Airport isn't taking over Romulus. It just looks that way.

Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara announced Friday that the county will finance a \$930-million expansion and renovation of Metro in part by bonding for \$750 million. The bonds were tentatively approved Wednesday by the county commission. The rest of the project will be paid for with money from a \$3-per-passenger tax on flights leaving Metro and money from the federal airport trust fund.

In addition, the Federal Aviation Administration recently approved a new set of airline routes for landing and taking off from Metro. The new routes, which take effect Nov. 29, will spread the arriving and departing aircraft out over a wider area than the current routes do.

So people living under the new routes will be subjected to no more than 40 takeoffs a day on an average of two days per week, deputy executive Michael Duggan said. Also, a midnight-to-6 a.m. curfew will limit takeoffs to the north to an average of two days a week during that time.

Along the same lines, the county hopes to spend \$110 million on noise reduction. Most of that is supposed to be used to buy houses or add soundproofing materials to houses in high noise areas near the airport, mainly in Romulus and Huron Township.

As for the expansion, McNamara said he believes it will "create" 20,000 area jobs by 2000, mostly because an increase in the number of Metro's international gates from six to at least 15 will be a boon to area companies that ship goods overseas.

"It's critical that Wayne County begin to develop a more efficient international terminal," McNamara said. "We can't afford to hold back when other (big airports) are building for the future. We sincerely believe that airport development promises the best possibilities for our future."

The expansion, expected to be completed in 1998, includes:

- Construction of a south access road to the airport (\$128 million).
- A new terminal located south of the existing terminal (\$662 million).
- Reconstruction of existing terminals and concourses (\$95 million).

■ A fourth runway to the west and parallel to the existing main runway (\$92 million).

County commissioner Bryan Amann, D-Canton, said he's happy about McNamara's announcement. "I view this as potentially the Fourth of July of Wayne County," he said. "It's a declaration of independence from the airlines."

Other commissioners were not so cheerful. Susan Hubbard, D-Dearborn, the chairwoman of the commission's airport noise committee, said McNamara's noise mitigation plan is inadequate. "I won't participate in their press conference until there's a noise abatement program in place," she said.

Hubbard, who has been accused of politicizing the airport noise committee's hearings so she can run for mayor of Dearborn next year, accused McNamara of expanding Metro because he wants to run for governor.

Deputy executive Michael Duggan said of Hubbard, "She has not behaved in a responsible manner. I don't think too many people will take her seriously. If she can point to one tangible thing she has accomplished, I'll pay attention to her."

Save time, and money with cooking shortcuts

Fortunately, I've learned to master my use of time pretty well. Not that I'm any kind of a neurotic punctualist, but compared to some of my friends, when I say I'm going to do something at a specific time, I do it.

I leave plenty of time for travel, opting to "get there a little early rather than a little late." Same goes for cooking.

Cooking rituals

There are thousands of recipes and cooking techniques that require ample amounts of time. Many of these, like bread making for instance, are more of a ritual.

Sure, there are shortcuts to making homemade bread, things like quick rise yeast, mixers that knead and convection cooking, but when it comes to making bread I relish the sensation derived from "working with the dough."

I don't want to hurry it along. I want to smell the yeast proofing, I want to see the rising under those dishtowels, I want to savor the aroma of the baking. If you have ever made bread, you know what I'm talking about.

Cooking shortcuts

But alas, the only time I can cook like that is when I block out hours, and the only way to block out hours is to save up those minutes here and there. Sure, I use shortcuts. Why not? Especially when they are as easy as:

Why would anyone spend hours making soup stock when it can be made even better using a pressure cooker in under an hour? Furthermore, if you want soup and don't have the time to pressure cook, you just can't beat those jars of soup stock and soup base available at Kitchin Glamor, Williams-Sonoma and restaurant supply houses.

Why would anyone, short of Chef Joe Becker, the pastry prince from Schoolcraft College, want to spend the time and money to make puff pastry dough when Pepperidge Farm has a package sitting in your grocer's freezer for around \$2 that works just as well?

I keep this stuff in my freezer and use it on everything from appetizers to pasties and even Beef Wellington.

Why would anyone want to spend hours greasing and washing cookie sheets and baking dishes when you can line them with a product called parchment paper? Long a staple at bakeries, this specially treated paper can be re-used until it literally burns up.

Last year, I made about 20 dozen cookies and used the same baking pans and parchment paper. Never once greased or washed a pan. Here's something really basic — have you ever dropped an egg on the kitchen floor, and used half a roll of paper towels to "get it up?"

Did you know that covering it with table salt and allowing it to stand for three minutes will make for a one-towel cleanup?

Time savers

Not being a big promoter of processed foods, I just can't imagine why anyone, who, like me, uses garlic and anchovies only occasionally, and usually wastes more than I would ever use, hasn't discovered the chopped versions of garlic in a jar, and the tubes of anchovy and tomato puree.

My vegetable crisper drawer is beginning to look like a deli with all these time-saver tubes and jars of flavors from around the world. I can't imagine why more people don't use ground turkey products instead of ground red meats for spaghetti sauces, tacos and sloppy joes. Not only is it more healthy because of the reduction in fat, but it also costs less. When mixed into a well-seasoned sauce base, you'll be hard pressed to tell the difference between it and meat.

Party tips

Getting so close to the holidays, I can't believe it when I hear that people throwing a holiday bash get so uptight about the food, et al. The idea of having a party is to "party," so do as much as you can ahead of time, stay out of the kitchen as much as possible, and enjoy your guests.

Use the washing machine and wash tub to hold ice, beer, soft drinks, etc. Have the food spread out throughout the house rather than sequestered on one table. A card table in each corner can hold as much or more than one dining room table.

Exchange "services" with a friend or neighbor for "helping," especially with the setup and cleanup.

Best buy of the season: a tiny plastic dough scraper that can clean the frost off a windshield, scrape the crud off a frypan or clean a counter or table top without scratching.

Cost — about 89 cents available at all gourmet shops and kitchen stores.

Whatever you do, don't panic on Thanksgiving Day. Don't worry if you run out of something, most major grocery stores are open. Whether this is your first Thanksgiving dinner, or 10th, we've got tips to help you thaw and cook the big bird.

If you wake up on Thanksgiving morning to find the bird still frozen, or discover you're out of cranberry sauce, don't panic, help is on the way.

Most major Detroit area grocery stores will be open on Thanksgiving Day. Farmer Jack and A&P with the exception of the Farmer Jack store at 11 Mile and Lasher in Southfield will be open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Kroger stores will be open 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., and Meijer's will be open 24 hours on Thanksgiving.

On the big day, if things go wrong, the first person to call is your mother. If that fails, call one of the turkey hot lines listed above. Moms usually know the answers.

Shelia Garvey, who teaches foods at Livonia Stevenson High School in Livonia, wrote a worksheet on "How to cook a Thanksgiving dinner," after her daughter Jill, who lives in Washington, D.C., called in a panic.

Step by step, she explains how to

buy and cook a turkey. Here's a quick lesson for new cooks. Seasoned cooks should think of it as a review.

According to Garvey, "turkeys are available in either the fresh or frozen state, and there is a noticeable flavor difference and cooking time difference between the two."

"Fresh turkeys are more moist, richer flavored, and make a darker and more rich gravy. If a fresh turkey has been purchased, follow the cooking directions which accompany the bird for roasting times."

Thawing turkey

"Frozen birds require thawing which should be done in the refrigerator a couple of days in advance. Thawing on the counter can be dangerous because of bacteria which accumulates on the skin and in the carcass as the turkey thaws. After the thawing, the bird should be washed inside and out and the bag of giblets inside the rear of the carcass should be removed."

To thaw the bird inside the refrigerator, "place the still-wrapped turkey, breast up, on a shallow tray and slide it onto a refrigerator shelf," recommends the Butterball Turkey Company in their newly published "Butterball Turkey Cookbook," (Hearst Books, New York 1992, \$12.95).

"The tray, which may be any rimmed, flat pan such as a jelly-roll or roasting pan, catches juices which may leak from the wrapper as the bird thaws." (See chart for times).

If you forget to take the turkey out of the freezer, don't panic. "To defrost the bird quickly, plan on about 30 minutes per pound," said Lois Thieleke, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service.

Leave the bird in the original unopened bag in the sink with cold water. Change the cold water every 30 minutes to ensure safe, but effective thawing. Refrigerator thawing is the most preferred method for safety reasons. (See chart for times).

To thaw a turkey in a microwave oven, check manufacturer's instruction for the size turkey that will fit in your oven, the minutes per pound,

TURKEY AND STUFFING PIE CRUST

Either 3 cups leftover stuffing

or:

- 1 stick butter or margarine
- 1 1/4 cups boiling water
- 3 1/2 cups seasoned stuffing
- Filling
- 1 can (2.8 ounces) French fried onions
- 1 can (10 1/2 ounces) cream of chicken soup
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1 1/2 cups (7 ounces) cooked turkey, cubed
- 1 package (10 ounces) frozen peas, thawed

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. If leftover stuffing is being used, combine it with half of the can of onions and toss lightly to mix.

If stuffing is being prepared, follow these directions.

Heat butter and water until the butter has melted. Add the stuffing and toss lightly until the stuffing is moistened. Stir in half of the can of onions.

Spoon the stuffing into a 9-inch pie plate, pressing it onto the bottom and up the sides to form a shell.

In a bowl, combine the soup, milk, turkey and peas; pour this mixture into the shell.

Cover with foil and bake for 30 minutes at 350 degrees.

Top with remaining onions and bake uncovered for 5 minutes longer. 4-6 portions.

CRANBERRY GELATIN SALAD

3 ounce package raspberry gelatin
1 can (15 ounces) cranberry relish

Follow the package directions to make the gelatin. Add the cranberry relish and chill until set.

Serve on a bed of lettuce. This recipe offers a delicious way to make use of leftover cranberry relish.

Recommended wines have easy to swallow prices

We can truly say this column is a response to consumer demand. Your calls to our voice mailbox requested wine recommendations for the Thanksgiving Feast this coming Thursday.

Since you didn't give us a clue about what you wanted to spend, we're offering selections at \$10 and less, and then some pricier ultra-premium bottlings. Because many wine shops have holiday wine sales in progress, you may find recommended wines even cheaper than the price we give.

The Associated Food Dealers of Michigan report that although budgets may be tight currently, it won't cost as much to loosen our belts after a big Thanksgiving dinner this year.

According to the AFD, the price to buy and prepare a traditional turkey dinner has gone down over the last two years. The AFD esti-

mates that the cost including turkey and all the traditional trimmings — stuffing, mashed potatoes, gravy, yams, cranberry sauce, rolls, pumpkin pie and even wine! — averages approximately \$3.45 per person at a table for 10.

If your budget allows a higher average, then sample some of the premium pours recommended.

The veritable treasure trove of food flavors finding their way to the Thanksgiving dinner plate are

well complemented by an equal bounty of flavorful wines.

Chardonnay, America's favorite white wine, is well suited to the holiday feast. Oakier, more complex styles are not overwhelmed by seasonings in the dressing or gravy. They aren't beat up on the palate by sweet potatoes or cranberries. Oranges in a cranberry relish actually showcase the bright tropical fruit of several California chardonnays. These oakier styles cost more to produce and the price quickly escalates over \$10.

Heading the list of values in the chardonnay category are the 1991 Santa Monica from Chile (\$7), Barton & Guestier Saint Louis from France's Macon region (\$8), and 1991 Rodney Strong, Sonoma County (\$10).

Australian producers were the first to blend semillon and chardonnay to create "semchards." The idea caught on in California and one of the best semchards is the 1991 Lockwood (\$9).

Between \$10 and \$15, we highly recommend these chardonnays:

1991 Chateau Souverain, Sonoma; 1991 J. Lohr Riverstone; and 1991 Kendall-Jackson Camelot Vineyard. Michigan native Fred Fisher, owner of Fisher Vineyards in the Sonoma Valley, has always had a big following for his wines in our state. His 1990 Fisher Coach Insignia Chardonnay (\$15) is the best he's produced to date. Its broad flavor intensity stems from about 10 percent naturally fermented lots in the blend.

Exceptionally flavorful is the 1990 Fetzer Reserve Chardonnay (\$18.50). The 1990 Robert Sinskey Vineyards Carneros Reserve Chardonnay (\$28) is a knockout with buttery richness and harmonious flavors.

Fruity red wines are well-paired to turkey, especially the juicier, darker meat. Before French Beaujolais Nouveau prices went

through the roof, we always recommended them. Today, they are not worth the money. California gamays have taken up the slack and are delicious. The best this year are the 1992 Beringer Nouveau Gamay Beaujolais and the 1992 Preston Vineyards Gamay Beaujolais at around \$7.50 each.

Merlots also match well with darker turkey meat. They have less overt fruitiness than a gamay and are more complex. Their soft finish works well against potatoes, gravy and dressing. We like the following merlots: 1990 Round Hill (\$7.50); 1990 Chateau Souverain (\$10); 1990 Kendall-Jackson Vintner's Reserve (\$14); and 1990 Merryvale (\$18).

Shortcut appetizers, broth easy

SAUSAGE APPETIZERS

- 1 pound packaged puff pastry dough
- 1/2 pound smoked kielbasa or sausage
- 4 tablespoons fancy mustard (i.e. honey mustard, dijon, etc)
- 1 egg white

Defrost frozen puff pastry. Open sheets and cut into 2-inch by 2-inch squares. Cut a small slice of kielbasa and place on each square. Top with a tiny dollop of fancy mustard. Bring ends together to wrap sausage and place seam down on a baking sheet covered with parchment paper. Brush with egg whites and bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until golden. Serve warm.

BASIC BEEF STOCK PRESSURE COOKER VERSION

- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 2 carrots diced
- 2 ribs celery, diced
- 2 medium onions, chopped
- 3 pounds meaty beef bones, split by butcher
- 1 cup dry white wine
- 3 cloves garlic, mashed
- 1 teaspoon thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon tarragon
- 2 bay leaves
- 3 large sprigs parsley
- 1 teaspoon peppercorns, fresh ground
- 2 teaspoons salt or to taste
- 10 cups water

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Combine oil with vegetables, stirring to coat. Add meat bones.

Bake, stirring frequently for 25 minutes or until vegetables and bones are a deep golden brown. Scrape vegetables and bones into a pressure cooker. Place baking dish over medium heat and add wine. Scrape to dislodge particles and deglaze the baking dish.

Pour into pressure cooker. Add garlic seasonings and water. Secure lid. Develop pressure over high heat, reduce heat to medium low and cook for 60 minutes. Release steam according to manufacturer's directions. Remove lid and mix well. Strain stock and press vegetable pulp through a strainer if desired. Remove meat from bones and add to stock.

and the power level to use for thawing. "The Microwave Cook's Complete Companion," Rosemary Dunn Stancil and Lorella Nichols Wilkins, (Fawcett Columbine, New York, 1990, \$24.95) says to "leave the turkey in the original wrapper, and place it in a casserole to catch any liquid."

"Begin defrosting with the breast side up, turn turkey over midway through defrosting. The bird should still be icy in the center when it is removed from the microwave. Complete the thawing by immersing the bird in cold water." (See chart for times).

Cooking times

Back to the bird. "The interior of the bird should be lightly salted, just before cooking, and it is at this time that the bird should be stuffed with dressing," said Garvey. "Never stuff a turkey the night before to save time in the morning, and never keep the stuffing in the carcass and spoon it out later as leftovers."

The stuffing must come out of the bird right after the meal. If these sanitary procedures are not followed, salmonella or food poisoning can occur.

If you want to save time stuffing the bird, June Dugar of Livonia

has a tip that works like a charm. "Make the stuffing the night before and put it in a bread wrapper. Put the open end of the bag in the turkey, and push the stuffing in," said Dugar.

"After stuffing the interior of the bird, bind or truss the bird's carcass closed with a pre-purchased set of pins and string or use string and nails to wrap the opening tightly," said Garvey.

Place the turkey breast-side up in a shallow roasting pan. Cover turkey loosely with aluminum foil. Remove foil 20 to 30 minutes before roasting is finished to allow the bird to brown. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. Bake immediately. Figure 15-18 minutes per pound for an unstuffed bird, and 18-24 minutes per pound for a stuffed bird. Baste it occasionally, too.

Thieleke said the turkey is done when the meat thermometer registers 180 degrees, the juices run clear, and the legs wiggle in the sockets. A turkey breast is done when the thermometer registers 170 degrees. Stuffing tem-

perature should be at least 165 degrees. Allow the cooked turkey to sit 20 minutes before carving.

Here are some time-savers from "Food News For Consumers/Holidays 1992" — Save 30 to 60 minutes of roasting time by using an oven cooking bag. Actual time saved depends on the size of your turkey.

Save two hours by baking your stuffing in a separate pan. A 20-pound unstuffed bird cooks in about 4 1/2 hours versus 6 1/2 hours if stuffed.

Halve your cooking time (oven space permitting) with two 10-pound unstuffed birds versus one stuffed 20-pounder. Cuts cooking time from 6 1/2 to 3 1/2 hours.

Refrigerate leftovers. Never leave perishable foods at room temperature over two hours. Thieleke recommends removing all meat from the carcass and storing in small shallow containers so they cook faster. Use leftover turkey within three to four days, gravy within one to two days, or freeze all or any of these.

Brownie cookbook satisfies cravings for something sweet

Nice and easy. Some foods have a casual air, like those eaten at a backyard barbecue or at a picnic in the park. In the winter those events are just a memory in Michigan.

But here you are with a cold November in your soul, and you want something sweet to eat on a dreary night that doesn't seem much good for anything else. It doesn't get much more casual than this. A brownie would probably hit the spot.

"Brownies and Blondies," by Lisa Yockelson, the first in a series called American Baking Classics, was published in 1992 by HarperCollins Inc. and offers a variety of recipes for brownies and their lighter-colored cousin blondies.

"Brownies hold a time-honored place at charity bake sales, in the holiday cookie tin, heaped on a plate as an after school treat, or as

a casual dessert, simply cut from the baking dish and served forth plain or with a scoop of ice cream," Yockelson writes in the introduction.

The basic ingredients of butter, eggs, sugar, and flour figure into all these recipes. Then comes the time to make choices. Will it be Classic Cake Brownies or a variation: Deep Dish Fudge Brownies, Black Bottom Brownies or Rocky

Road Brownies? How about Classic Blondies or Oatmeal and Peanut Butter Blondies or Coconut Blondies?

While the recipes are for the most part simple, they require the dirtying of a lot of dishes — a bowl for the dry ingredients, another for the moist ingredients, a container for the melted chocolate, one for melted butter and still another to toss the chocolate

chips with a teaspoon of the flour mixture.

Blondies mixed up quickly and smelled great while baking. The result: a moist, cream-colored snack that tastes of brown sugar, butter and vanilla.

The 101-page book also includes tips for baking, cutting, storing and freezing the brownies. It's \$12.50.

Marbled pumpkin cheesecake elegant

AP — For an elegant Thanksgiving dessert, serve Marbled Pumpkin Cheesecake. The cheesecake is swirled with the richness of chocolate. Canned pumpkin adds flavor and moistness.

MARBLED PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE

- 1 1/4 cups graham cracker crumbs
- 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted
- 2 cups (12-ounce package) miniature semisweet chocolate chips
- Three 8-ounce packages cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup packed light brown sugar
- 1 3/4 cups (16-ounce can) solid pack pumpkin
- 4 eggs
- 1/2 cup undiluted evaporated milk

- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg

For the crust: In a medium bowl, combine graham cracker crumbs, sugar and butter. Press onto bottom of greased 10-inch springform pan; sprinkle with 1 cup chocolate chips.

For the cheesecake: In a small, heavy saucepan over low heat, melt remaining 1 cup chocolate chips, stirring constantly until smooth. In large mixer bowl, beat cream cheese, granulated sugar and brown sugar. Beat in pumpkin. Beat in eggs and evaporated milk. Beat in cornstarch, cinnamon and nutmeg. Remove 1 cup pumpkin batter; stir into melted chocolate. Pour pumpkin mixture into crust. Spoon chocolate mixture over top; swirl. Bake in a preheated 325-degree F oven for 60 minutes or until edge of filling is set. Turn oven off. Allow cheesecake to stand in oven for 30 minutes. Remove from oven. Cool completely. Cover, chill for several hours. Makes 12 to 16 servings.

Brownies and blondies warm up dreary nights

BLACK BOTTOM BROWNIES

- 3/4 cup unsifted all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 8 Tablespoons (1 stick) unsalted butter, melted and cooled
- 3 squares (3 ounces) unsweetened chocolate, melted and cooled
- 1 cup superfine sugar
- 2 extra-large eggs
- 1 extra-large egg yolk
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter and flour a 9-by-9-by-2-inch baking pan.

For the brownies, thoroughly mix the all-purpose flour, baking powder and salt. Set aside 2 teaspoons of the flour mixture for the cream cheese topping (recipe below).

Whisk the butter and chocolate in a bowl; beat in the sugar, eggs, egg yolk and vanilla extract. Add the dry ingredients and stir to form a batter.

Pour and scrape the batter into the prepared pan; spread the batter evenly.

CREAM-CHEESE TOPPING

- 2 3-ounce packages cream cheese, softened
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- Pinch of salt
- 1 extra-large egg
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup miniature semisweet chocolate chips

Beat the cream cheese, sugar and salt in a bowl on moderate speed for 2 minutes. Add the egg and vanilla extract and beat for 1 minute. Toss the chocolate chips with the reserved 2 teaspoons of dry ingredients from the brownie recipe above, and stir into the cream cheese mixture. Pour the topping over the brownie batter; gently swirl the cream cheese mixture into the chocolate batter using a table knife and small spatula. Bake the brownies for 30 to 32 minutes, or until just set.

Cool the brownies completely in the pan on a rack. Cut into 2 1/4-by-

2 1/4-inch squares. Remove the brownies from the pan using a metal spatula. Refrigerate in an airtight tin.

OATMEAL AND PEANUT BUTTER BLONDIES

- 1 1/4 cups unsifted all-purpose flour
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
- 8 Tablespoons (1 stick) unsalted butter, melted and cooled
- 1 Tablespoon shortening, melted and cooled
- 3/4 cup light brown sugar
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 3/4 cup creamy peanut butter
- 3 Tablespoons milk
- 2 extra-large eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup "quick-cooking" (not instant) oatmeal

- 1/2 cup sweetened flaked coconut

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter and flour a 9-by-9-by-2-inch baking pan.

Thoroughly mix the all-purpose flour, baking soda, salt and nutmeg. Whisk the butter, shortening, brown sugar and granulated sugar in a bowl; add the peanut butter and beat for 2 minutes. Blend in the milk. Beat in the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition; blend in the vanilla extract. Add the dry ingredients, oatmeal and coconut and stir.

Pour and scrape the batter into the prepared pan; spread the batter evenly. Bake the blondies for 30 minutes, or until just set.

Cool the blondies completely in the pan on a rack. Cut into 2 1/4-by-2 1/4-inch squares. Remove the blondies from the pan using a metal spatula. Store in an airtight tin.

Baking questions answered

AP — During this busy season of holiday baking and candy making, the Better Homes and Gardens test kitchen fields an avalanche of questions from readers. Here are some answers to those frequently asked baking questions.

Question: When should flour be sifted?

Answer: All-purpose flour is already pre-sifted so you do not need to sift it again. However, before you measure it, stir it with a spoon to make sure it's not packed down. Then spoon it into the measuring cup without packing it. Cake flour, on the other hand, does need sifting.

Question: If I'm off on measuring just a little bit, does it matter?

Answer: It is very important to measure accurately for baking. Too much flour, milk, sugar, or leavening can ruin a good recipe.

To measure liquids, use a standard glass or clear plastic measuring cup. Place it on a level surface and keep your eye level with the mark you wish to read. Fill the cup to the mark. Don't lift the cup off the counter; your hand is not as steady as the counter.

To measure dry ingredients, use a measuring cup that is the exact capacity you need. (Don't use a glass measuring cup.) Lightly spoon the ingredient into the cup. Use a metal spatula or the straight side of a kitchen knife to level. Do not pack any dry ingredients except brown sugar. Brown sugar should be packed enough to hold the shape of the measure when turned out.

Question: When I'm using my electric mixer, I never know which speed to use. What's the rule?

Answer: For cookies, beat fat (shortening, margarine, or butter) on medium speed about 30 seconds to soften. Using high speed may sling the margarine out of the bowl. Low speed can burn out the motor.

For stiff doughs, beat in flour on low speed.

For meringues and egg yolks, beat on high speed.

For whipping cream, beat on low or medium speed.

For mixtures that may splash, use low speed.

Question: Why is the dough for my sugar cookies too soft to roll out and cut into shapes?

Answer: Dough made with butter makes the stiffest dough. Cookie dough made with margarine, especially corn oil margarine, needs more chilling or freezing time before it's firm enough to roll and cut into shapes for sugar cookies. Because soft or diet margarine and spreads create a softer dough and makes tougher, drier cookies, do not use them for baking unless the recipe so specifies.

Question: Some recipes never tell me to preheat the oven. Is it necessary?

Answer: For baking, it is important to heat the oven about 10 minutes before baking to get the proper rising and even doneness. Because the top element is on

during the preheating period, baked goods can overbrown. Cake tops may set and crack as cakes rise.

Question: How do I know when breads, cakes and cookies are done?

Answer: Set the kitchen timer. Check for doneness at the minimum baking time given in the recipe. For yeast breads, the crust should be brown and the loaf should sound hollow when you tap the top. For cakes, insert a wooden toothpick near the center. When it comes out clean (without batter on it), the cake is done.

Baked goods are delivered fresh every morning from Chene Modern Bakery. Tasty Tray has all your favorites — angel wings, eclairs, strudels, almond and poppyseed rolls. If you need a decorated cake for a special occasion, they can accommodate you.

Tasty Tray sells only Kowalski products. "Kowalski is made in Michigan, and they follow strict standards," said Michalowski.

Kowalski Sausage Company is

Slash the fat in Swiss steak by half

AP — We've slashed the fat in Swiss steak by half! How did we do it? We skipped coating the meat in flour first, so it absorbs less fat. Then we browned the meat in a pan sprayed with non-stick coating. Rather than using the pan drippings for the sauce, we wiped the pan clean and started from scratch.

SWISS STEAK

1 pound boneless beef round steak, cut 3½-inch thick
Non-stick spray coating
One 28-ounce can tomatoes, cut up
1 small onion, sliced and sepa-

rated into rings
½ cup sliced celery
1 bay leaf
1½ teaspoons dried marjoram, crushed
¼ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon pepper
1 tablespoon cornstarch
1 tablespoon cold water
2 cups hot cooked rice or fettuccine

Trim fat from steak. Cut into 4 serving-size pieces. Spray a cold 12-inch skillet with non-stick coating. Preheat skillet over medium heat. Brown steak on both sides; remove from skillet. Wipe skillet with paper towels.

Return steak to skillet. Add undrained tomatoes, onion, celery, bay leaf, marjoram, salt and pepper. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer, covered, about 1½ hours or until meat is tender. Remove meat from skillet; keep warm. Discard bay leaf. Skim off any fat.

For sauce, mix cornstarch and water; stir into tomato mixture. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly. Cook and stir for 2 minutes more. Serve meat and sauce over rice or fettuccine. Makes 4 servings.

Go out on limb when choosing tree toppers

The earliest Christmas ornaments were heavy blown-glass balls, lined in shiny lead and filled with colored wax. Known as kugels, they hung in windows until Queen Victoria and Prince Albert popularized the Christmas tree and the weighty balls were used to separate the branches that held flaming candles.

While the Victorians elevated Christmas to a pageant of tinsel and garland, and wrapped the celebration in heavenly angels and jolly Santas, the holiday grew even more opulent over the years and turned commercial just before World War II. It was then that the first American Christmas ball company, bearing the trademark Shiny Brite, discovered a way to mass produce ornaments.

Each season as you dig through your boxes of tree trimmers, you probably recall a memory associated with every bauble. Whether a mouth-blown antique or a handmade paper cutout from kindergarten days, ornaments not only transform an ordinary tree, but envelop us in warm family tradition.

In searching for fun and imaginative tree toppers, I encountered shoppers with varying tastes and ideas. Each had a personal favorite.



Ruth Seiler of Farmington Hills, for instance, is an Annalee Dolls collector. She always has a red and green tree and tops it with an Annalee snowman. "I've been collecting for years," she said. "I started with mice and added from there."

Annalee Thorndike is a household name to her devoted followers. She designs flexible felt characters like the elf pictured (\$17). The original hand-painted faces are graced with expression. You can see the entire Annalee Dolls collection at **The Village Barn and Christmas Attic** in Franklin.



Seiler also admired this charming muslin-clad angel. Perfect for a homespun, country-look tree, Bethany (\$50) is trimmed in crocheted lace and gracefully spreads her delicate straw wings. I found Bethany in the Christmas store at **Hudson's, Twelve Oaks Mall** in Novi, but she is available at all area Hudson's stores.



Of course, Christmas really celebrates the child in all of us and a child's tree wouldn't be complete without Santa. This whimsical red velvet Santa (\$22) from **The Village Barn and Christmas Attic** is handmade and features a pocket in the back for attaching him to the treetop. Once in place, he can be positioned as you wish.

"For years my children put Santa's cap on top of the tree," reminisced **Bernie Nouhan** of

Dearborn Heights as she contemplated new tree toppers. She chose an old-fashioned St. Nick cloaked in green and red velvet, and holding a lighted wreath.

Not to be missed at **The Christmas Attic** are the Christopher Radko limited edition mouth-blown glass ornaments, crafted by Eastern European glass workers.

In addition to Santas, teddy bears are popular tree ornaments and **Larry and Connie Beaber** of Dearborn create an entire bear tree. I found them in **Jacobson's Birmingham** store carefully choosing among the glass bears. Jacobson's also has an array of stuffed bears and other lovable animals on a toy-themed tree.

Straying a bit from tradition, **Harissa Miller** of Farmington enjoys designing her own contemporary creation for the crown of her tree. Shopping with her son, John, Hiller described her extravagant decoration as a glittering mixture of silver spiky, tulle netting, tiny star garland, and a huge mylar bow with long trailing ribbons.

I found the silver sprays (\$6), gold netting (\$8) and silver and gold star garland (\$4) at **Jacobson's** and Miller suggested **Jo-Ann Fabrics** for the yards of tulle.

And so the tree-trimming party begins. Pop some corn for stringing and be patient with those endless strands of lights. Sing along with your favorite carols, a medieval custom renewed by the Queen of Christmas, Victoria.

Next week, I'll deck your entrance hall with welcoming ideas that cheerfully usher guests into your home.

Ed Czarnecki of Huntington Woods, had the same idea as he guided his two toddlers through the Italian village of enchantment last week.

Emma, 5, spoke while her brother Nicholas, 3, shook his head in agreement.

"It's a good, good show," she said. "We have the tape of Pinocchio and we watched it three times. But this is better than the movie."

Not all the visitors to Hudson's third annual holiday fairy tale display were school age.

Emma Paster of Oak Park, and a Hudson's employee, said she came to work early to walk through the exhibit.

"Of course I like it," she laughed. "Why shouldn't I? It's beautiful. We didn't have anything like this when I was a young child."

"This is really nice," said Rachel tugging her little sister onto the next scene. "I think all the kids should come to see Pinocchio and watch the tape at home. We love it."

Separate from the Pinocchio exhibit, but also on the lower level, Santa's Workshop is a second holiday treat.

The 1,300-square-foot shop features 30 elves busily preparing packages for Christmas. Santa moves about the workshop wearing either his traditional suit or suspenders over his work shirt and pants. Photo packages run \$6-\$16.

Clinton's roomie at Yale recalls college days

At President-elect Bill Clinton's election night victory bash in Little Rock, Ark., he held up a May 4 issue of *The New Republic* magazine in Truman-like-fashion. Large bold letters on the cover blurted out the words, "Why Clinton Can't Win."

The crowd went wild. So did William Coleman III, a Southfield resident, who roomed with the 42nd president-elect at Yale Law School some 20 years ago. Coleman had brought the article with him from Michigan, confident of its irony.

His old college chum dated and signed the magazine for him.

Coleman, a senior partner at the Detroit law firm of Pepper, Hamilton and Scheetz, first recalls meeting Clinton in the Yale Law School cafeteria in 1970.

During the first week of classes Coleman and the handful of other African-Americans attending the Ivy League campus gravitated to each other and by the second week had a designated table inside the cafeteria exclusively for the black students.

It didn't take long before a "tall, robust friendly guy with a thick Southern accent," plopped down at the black table and "violated taboo," Coleman remembers. Clinton's friendly demeanor earned him acceptance in the group quickly.

"He was a lot of fun to be with. He was an inter-

esting, hardworking person," Coleman said of Clinton. "We enjoyed being together."

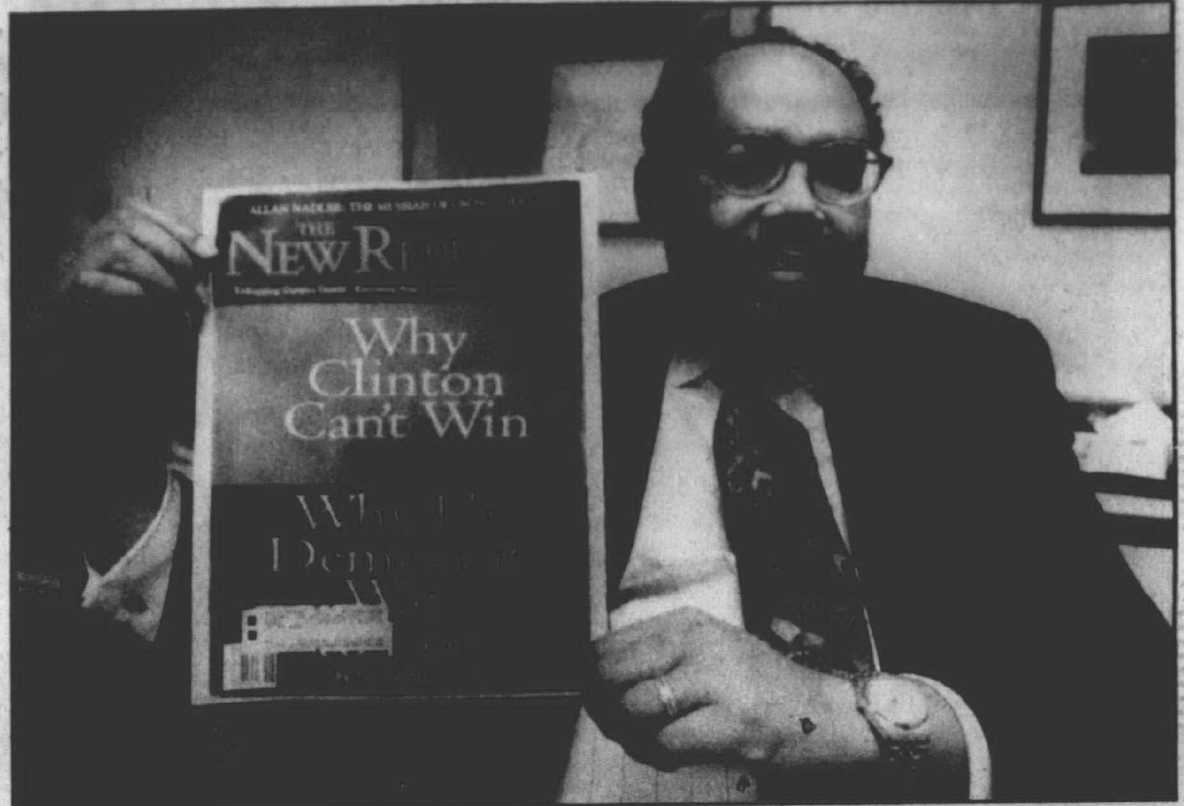
The two immediately became friends when Clinton approached Coleman shortly thereafter and asked him if he wanted to share a beach house in Milford, Conn., about 20 minutes outside of New Haven, home of Yale University.

The four-bedroom home was also shared with two other students, both from England. Clinton had met the other men while a Rhode Scholar.

Clinton commuted to the university via Volkswagen beetle. Coleman described it as "old, battered and swathedly tied together"

The transportation was needed since Clinton dedicated much of his time and energy to his political interests, Coleman said. During the year at the beach house he remembers the president-elect "spending almost every moment" managing a political campaign for a Democratic candidate running for the U.S. Senate from Connecticut. The senate hopeful captured the districts Clinton was in charge of, but lost the election, Coleman said.

Clinton's political ambitions were apparent then, although Coleman never recalled him saying he wanted to become President of the United States. While most students nearing graduation dreamed of working for large law offices in New York and Washington D.C., Clinton wanted to go back to Arkansas, Coleman said.

Group battles 'war toys'

The end of the cold war and reduction of military arms hasn't chilled one organization's fight to stop the production of war toys.

Women's Action for New Directions will be arming themselves this month with an arsenal of picket signs, leaflets and petitions. They plan to demonstrate at an area toy store Friday when mobs of shoppers are expected to kick off the Christmas shopping season.

Toys the group pinpoints as violent include such popular items such as G.I. Joe, Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles, Transformers and Nintendo video games.

The Southfield Toys 'R' Us store has been the subject of WAND's Stop War Toys protest over the past two years. About 20 peace groups are sponsoring this year's demonstration led by the national women's organization. Between

50 to 100 protesters are expected.

Toys 'R' Us management was unavailable for comment.

Phyllis Friedman, chair of the Stop War Toys campaign, said the demonstration will be peaceful, seeking to increase awareness from parents and grandparents.

"At three years old these kids are pointing a (Nintendo) gun at a screen, they don't even know it is a gun and that guns can kill," Friedman said.

Another member of the group Laura Perreault, a Southfield resident, said people are unaware of the results when they buy these items for their children. Suggested toys include creative playthings such as art supplies, sports equipment, and musical instruments.

"Who wouldn't agree that if you bombard a kid with violence they're not going to be affected," Friedman added.

The American Psychiatric Association, The American Academy of Pediatrics and the

U.S. Surgeon General, have voiced concerns too. Studies have shown antisocial behavior such as kicking, punching and insults follow the use of violent theme toys.

Friedman claims toy manufacturers and children's television are "sugar-coating" the issue. The Ninja Turtles, for example, "use humor to make it easier for kids to swallow. Here, these turtles are eating pizza and jumping around with swords, beating each other up," she said.

The national group is formerly Women's Action for Nuclear Disarmament, however, the name was changed after the fall of Soviet Union and now focuses on women and children issues as well as political concerns.

WAND's national Stop War Toys campaign has been successful in removing several toys from the shelves including an Arab terrorist doll. Friedman said it not only represented violence but was racist.

Soccer needs better sports

So. How hot do you like your oil? There are a number of people out there who'd like to dunk my butt — and the remainder of my anatomy — into a cauldron of that very same stuff, while it boils. All because I said soccer players displayed the least amount of sportsmanship.

This viewpoint was determined by my own observations at dozens of high school and college soccer games. During those games, there was an almost complete lack of sportsmanship.

Since that column appeared, I have been deluged by responses. That's great. Really. But first, please understand that, contrary to public perception, I am alone in this endeavor. I have no secretary to answer these calls or help with responses.

Which is why I'm writing this column.

I have not ignored you, but returning every call and still trying to put together a newspaper would not have been possible.

Letters that have been written will be printed. Some of the people who have called and left their opinions on my answering machine will be noted here.

Analyzing the responses

Now. The question is, should I pack my bags and head for the airport, or should I stay and make sure my will's in order?

Based on your responses, neither may be necessary (whew). And, I must admit, that surprised me.

In my business, I had always found people will respond when they strongly disagree. I suppose I'll have to amend that now.

I was surprised to find how many people shared my views. According to my calculations, at least two-thirds of the responses I received agreed at least somewhat with what I said.

OK. Some clarification. Several people thought I generalized. Mrs. A. Ramirez of Farmington Hills called it "a misrepresentation and over-generalization."

Generalization is a label I'm willing to bear. Let me put it like this: No, I have not seen every soccer game played in the metro area, nor do I have plans to. So, by strict definition, I will always be guilty of generalizing.

I will generalize, sort of, in categorizing the responses. Those who favored my views were officials (dozens called, almost all in favor), most coaches (some, like Oakland University's Gary Parsons, took exception to certain parts of the column) and more than a few parents.

Players imitate players

Players almost entirely opposed. Many of their responses were interesting — Lance Pellow, a Plymouth Canton junior varsity player, doubted my definition of "integrity and intensity," then said, "The feeling you get when your team scores a goal or when you stick a player on a breakaway cannot be described by someone watching in the stands."

Depending how it's done, of course, but under most circumstances "sticking a player on a breakaway" is a red-card offense. If that's what you enjoy about the game, something is wrong.

I don't wish to single out a junior varsity player for criticism; it's his attitude that's noteworthy. Players imitate players. They see an older guy toss the ball away to delay a restart and they think that's the thing to do.

I agree there might be some strategic advantage to a stunt like that. But I don't believe that's why players do it. They do it to antagonize their opponents. And that's bad sportsmanship.

I wouldn't feel right if I didn't mention my most interesting response. It comes from Sue Monroe, a school psychologist in West Bloomfield. "It's fairly obvious to me," she said. "They want to roughen up the sport and make it more acceptable to fans and players who watch football and play basketball."

"For a long time, (soccer) was perceived as a sport for sissies. Those kinds of things make it more acceptable."

What to do

Interesting. If it's accurate, and an argument could be made supporting it, then something must be done before the sport becomes an enormous hockey game.

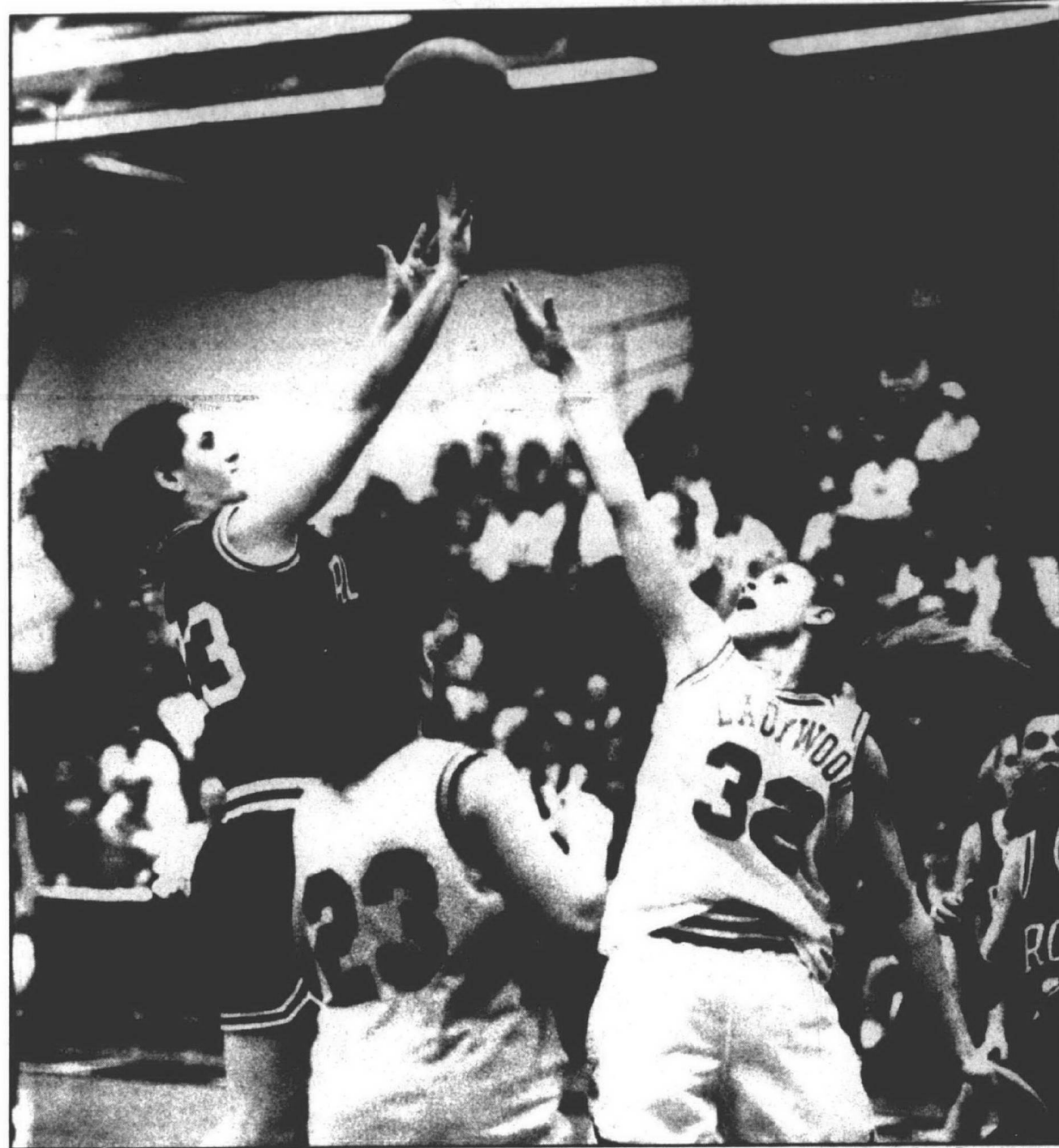
The officials who responded all agreed something must be done, and several had suggestions — including, and this surprised me as well, that they themselves must do a better job.

Officials are often too soft. For example: Delaying the game is a cardable offense, but does that ever happen? I think not.

Talking trash, too (especially to an official), can earn a card. But players test officials, pushing until they are warned. Warn them early and maybe there will be fewer complaints.

Prybylski, playing with a cold and laryngitis, made three of five free throws in overtime Friday night to lead Ladywood to a 53-51 victory over Plymouth Salem in a Class A girls basketball district final at Canton.

Prybylski didn't score during regulation but made a pair of free throws with a minute left in OT to give Ladywood a 52-49 lead.

Salem senior center Cyndi Platter, who had a game-high 26 points, scored on a back-door play to make it 52-51, but Prybylski split a pair of free throws with 26 seconds left.

Prybylski said she lost her voice prior to Thursday's practice and was suffering from a cold but neither ailment would keep her from playing.

"It never entered my mind," said Prybylski, who played with four fouls in the fourth quarter and during the OT. "It feels good to finally be on top. I knew a lot of (Salem players), especially (starting guard) Christy Parimucha (who lives across the street)."

Salem enjoyed a 21-9 halftime lead but Ladywood's full-court press caused 18 turnovers in the second half and OT, including 10 in the third quarter.

The Blazers' defense prevailed in the last minute of OT as senior guard Mary Jo Kelly stole a pass with 35 seconds left and the Rocks had a traveling violation with 13 seconds remaining.

"Turnovers were key," said Salem coach Fred Thomann, whose teams have won seven districts in his 10

Ocelots in national volleyball tourney

Really, if Schoolcraft College's volleyball team listens to its coach — Tom Teeters — then it won't have many worries heading into the NJCAA Tournament, which starts today in Phoenix.

That's because the Lady Ocelots head into the tournament with that most feared label — at least to its opponents: *unknown quantity*.

That means they aren't really all that good, but they have been known to rise to the occasion. How high? Well, that's the question, isn't it?

Let's define it like this, for now: SC was able to rise enough to get this far (a 38-11 record), and that's really farther than Teeters says he figured they'd go.

And remember: He's been here before. This is SC's fifth-straight trip to the NJCAA Tournament. In Teeters' eight seasons as coach, the Ocelots have made this trip seven times.

So how does this team compare with its predecessors? Is it among the best?

Sorry. "By far, it's not," said Teeters. "This was the weakest team I've had at regionals, going against one of the strongest teams we've faced at regionals (Kellogg CC)."

And yet, Kellogg proved unable to get past SC. The Lady Bruins, 69-1 and ranked fifth in the NJCAA entering the regionals, lost twice to the Ocelots. "There's a certain chemistry that's carried us," explained Teeters. "It's an unknown factor."

"You never know when it's going to take over. It's a factor that's hard to measure."

(Hear that? By that definition, you really can't disappoint; all you can do is excel because no one figures you'll do much, anyway.)

If the Ocelots are going to make a long run in the NJCAAs, that unknown quantity is going to have to reach heretofore unexplored heights. SC has been seeded eighth, something Teeters didn't really want. It puts the Ocelots in the same pool as No. 1-seed Miami-Dade Wolfson.

There are 16 teams in the tournament (four pools of four teams); SC wants to be one of the eight to survive the first cut.

There are certain indicators that

will show if the Ocelots are in the hunt. First and foremost, serving: "Serving well will indicate if we are going to win," said Teeters. "If our serves are not on, we end up losing. We can't afford to miss more than three serves (a game)."

SC lacks a formidable power game, and its blocking isn't great — which makes the need for a tough serve that much more imperative. If an opponent gets a number of easy set opportunities, the Ocelots will be in trouble.

One thing they do well is play defense. "Our serve reception will always be there," said Teeters.

It will have to be. And there will have to be much, much more if SC is going to make a run for the title.

Shamrocks soar past Eagles in grid semi

Redford Catholic Central played power football and Utica Eisenhower a finesse game, but neither was decisive Saturday in a thrilling Class AA semifinal.

Instead, the kicking game had the final say in this classic run-pass confrontation.

Adam Borchert booted his second game-winning field goal in as many weeks to give the Shamrocks a 17-14, overtime victory at Rynearson Stadium in Ypsilanti.

The Shamrocks (12-0) will play defending state champion and top-ranked Saginaw Arthur Hill in a rematch of last year's final at 1 p.m. Saturday in the Silverdome.

After the Eagles (11-1) missed a fourth-down field goal in OT, the Shamrocks didn't bother to run a play. Borchert won it on first down with his 27-yard kick.

"There's no choice in that matter," CC coach Tom Mach said. "With any other decision, you're changing an error."

Borchert booted a 34-yarder on the last play of the game to beat Troy 9-6 the previous week, and CC defeated Detroit King a year ago in the semifinals with an overtime field goal.

"Coach told me 'All you can do is be a hero; don't worry about it,'" Borchert said. "Everything was perfect: the snap, the hold. All I had to do was put it through."

The field goal capped an exciting fourth quarter that saw CC rally to take a 14-7 lead, with two touchdowns coming 1:01 apart, and Eisenhower making a late surge to force OT.

The Shamrocks got all of their 213 yards on the ground. Junior tailback Fred Taylor had 105 on 25 carries, and senior fullback Jason Krueger added 68 on 15 attempts. Each rushed for one TD.

The Eagles countered with the passing of Tim Youngblood, who was 18-of-36 for 247 yards, with one TD and one interception. CC held Ike to a 17 yards net rushing.

CC trailed 7-0 most of the game and struggled early to sustain any offense. Taylor had trouble with his footing in the first half when he had 41 yards on 11 tries, but he changed shoes with assistant coach George Kunec at halftime.

"I was slipping a little too much; I had to do something about it," Taylor said. "(Kunec) asked me if I wanted his shoes. I couldn't do any worse than I already was. Mine were regular grass shoes; these were turf shoes."

Taylor's 15-yard run and Borchert's PAT kick tied the score 7-7 following an eight-play, 51-yard drive at 11:55 in the fourth. CC had 122 yards in the second half.

"In the first half, we'd get a drive going and slip," Mach said, adding the Shamrocks tried to run outside early. "We were third-and-7 a lot and our offense is predicated on being third-and-1 or third-and-2."

"Instead of trying to go around, we just went at them in the second half. That way our footing was better, because when we tried to run sideways we were slipping."

On the ensuing kickoff, CC's Jeff Lachapelle caused a fumble and Jon Wolfe recovered at the Ike 7-yard line. Krueger walked into the end zone on second down from 3 yards. Borchert made it 14-7.

Youngblood threw across his body and over the middle to Jason Paul, who ran to the CC 10 for a 43-yard gain. But Youngblood's pass on the next play was tipped and CC noseguard Paul Nemzek intercepted.

The Shamrocks picked up one first down but had to punt, giving Ike the ball with 4½ minutes left.

On fourth-and-25 at the CC 45, Youngblood threw a Hail Mary pass to 6-foot-3 Scott Hiegel, who leaped from a crowd of players to make the catch at the 7. Ike scored on the next play, Youngblood throwing again to Hiegel with 1:47 left in regulation. Trevor Starnes kicked the tying PAT.

"(Hiegel) was super tall and I tried to jump as high as I could, but he got it down," CC defensive back Brady Pankow said. "In overtime, I had to take it like it was a personal thing."

Youngblood threw three incomplete passes in OT — the CC secondary came up big — before Starnes missed his field-goal attempt. The second pass was caught out of bounds, and Pankow stepped in front of the receiver for a big knockdown on the third try.

The Eagles scored late in the first quarter on Derek Aberlich's 1-yard run after a CC fumble.

CC played the way Ike's defense wanted in the first half but executed to its strength in the second half, according to Ike coach Bob Lantzy.

"We were praying to get them into any kind of perimeter game," he said. "We thought our speed on defense would help us."

"I think they came in with the intention to plug away and work the clock against us. I think they knew they weren't going to option, pitch or sweep on us, so they kept taking those big people inside and wore us down."

Marlins capture 16th district crown

Farmington Hills Mercy, having reached the district final in girls basketball with a second-half comeback, survived one by host Novi to win the championship Friday night, 51-44.

The Marlins, who extended their winning streak to seven games, have won 16 district titles in 18 years under coach Larry Baker.

Mercy (12-11) will play Royal Oak Kimball at 7:30 tonight in the regional tournament at Southfield-Lathrup High School. The championship game is slated for 7 p.m. Tuesday.

"This was a big-time goal for our team this year," Baker said, "and it was a real challenge because all three opponents were highly motivated. They had lost recent district games to us and believed they could get us this year."

The Wildcats (9-13) made their best effort in the second half when they outscored Mercy 32-22 and reduced a 29-12 halftime deficit.

The Marlins, who rallied from

18 points down Wednesday to defeat Walled Lake Central 64-63 in triple overtime, all but decided the game in the first half.

Mercy took advantage of its quickness and used a pressing, trapping defense to force the Wildcats into 20 first-half turnovers.

Consequently, Novi didn't get many shots, and the Marlins were strong on the defensive boards again when they did.

Mercy, which led 16-4 after one quarter, made almost as many shots as the Wildcats attempted in the first half. The Marlins were 13 of 27 from the floor, Novi four of 14.

"We didn't miss a beat from the fourth quarter Wednesday to the first quarter today," Baker said. "I told (the players) that's what I wanted to see. Mercy had to take a cocky attitude, seize the moment and not wait for something to happen."

"We dug a huge hole for them, and they played a terrific third quarter and still had a lot of ground to gain."

The Wildcats, led by Kristin Kenny, who scored 11 of her 19

points in the third quarter, outscored Mercy 11-2 in the last two minutes of the third quarter to get within 37-29.

"Once we got used to what they were doing, the girls started looking at the basket; we pressed them effectively and got back in the game," Novi coach John Hoffman said.

"They could have folded, but they took the bull by the horns and went right after them. We're pleased with the comeback. It's almost as good as a win for me."

Novi made eight of 12 field goals in the third period, while the Marlins (four of 14) had the same kind of shooting touch the Wildcats had earlier.

"They were throwing the ball deep against our trap, and we got more cautious," Baker said. "We're not a cat-and-mouse team. We're more effective in an up-tempo situation where we get to play aggressively. If we slow down and do a lot of thinking we don't seem to play deliberate basketball."

Novi's shooting cooled to five of 17 — the Wildcats missed seven of their first eight — in the

fourth quarter. The Marlins made theirs count (four of seven) and also sank six of nine free throws late in the game.

Valire Jones had seven of her nine points in the second half to help Mercy protect its lead. Dana Wade scored eight of her 12 in the first half. Julie Angell finished with 11 points and Katie Heffernan eight. Christine Edwards added nine for the Wildcats.

"I thought Wednesday and tonight our seniors showed real leadership," Baker said. "I was particularly pleased through this tournament with the court leadership of Katie Heffernan and Dana Wade."

Winning the district was a refreshing event for the Marlins, who were winless in the Central Division of the Catholic League while playing some of the state's best teams.

"We lost 10 of 11 games at one point in the season," Baker said. "All of those opponents save one were ranked. Nonetheless, it took a devastating toll on our confidence."

years. "We knew going in we had to pass and catch the ball."

The Blazers advance to tonight's regional game at 6 p.m. against Ann Arbor Huron at Ypsilanti High. Salem finished 13-10.

Ladywood won despite making only 16 of 60 shots (26 percent) and trailing 40-30 with about five minutes left in the fourth quarter.

Tara Overaitis, who had 17 of her team high 20 points after halftime, scored eight straight in the fourth quarter to pull the Blazers within 40-36 with 3:55 left in regulation. A three-point shot by Andrea Putti and Overaitis' three-point play made the score 44-44 with 1:30 remaining.

Platter made two free throws with 23 seconds left to put Salem ahead 46-44, but Anne Poglits forced OT with her only basket of the game and :05 left on the clock.

"This is our best district championship we ever got, because we were not supposed to win. We were not supposed to win at the end of the first half."

Kavanaugh doesn't know how the Blazers overcame their shooting woes.

"If I knew that, I'd write a book, be a coaching genius and make a lot of money," Kavanaugh said. "We knew Salem was going to play zone so we mentally said, 'Hey, we've got to make our shots' and panicked a bit."

Ladywood won under similar circumstances Wednesday, recovering from a 13-point deficit to defeat Livonia Stevenson 55-51 in a district semifinal.

"Yeah, it's a carbon copy. They made the plays at the end; we didn't," Thomann said.

Salem got superb play from Platter and senior Shelly Sockow. Platter made eight of 14 shots from the floor and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds. Sockow finished with 15 points on seven of nine shots and 11 rebounds. Senior guards Leslie Gotts, Cindy McClure and Parimucha also started their final games, although Gotts ended with 2:37 left in regulation after fouling out.

"I feel bad for the whole team," Thomann said. "The seniors worked hard. We didn't win but it doesn't mean we were not successful. We had a lot of peaks and valleys, but it was an awesome ride."

Said Kavanaugh: "Platter is a great player, what I like about her most is the way she catches the ball and faces the basket."

In Oakland County, officials experimented with what's called the three-whistle system. The linesmen, as well as the referee, each had whistles and were allowed to call fouls.

I have heard both good and bad regarding this, one side insisting it's necessary, the other saying it creates havoc on the field. I believe it could work, that the proper coordination could be found. Heck, in college basketball they have had three officials for 10 players in a much smaller area; why not in soccer?

Others share blame

But officiating isn't going to rectify all the problems. I mentioned Parsons didn't agree with parts of my original column; the OU coach thinks the problems I mentioned aren't limited to soccer, and singling out soccer is wrong.

I agree that problems exist in almost all sports. But I also stand by my original assertion: I have not witnessed any other sport that is more lacking in sports-

manship than soccer.

Coaches — at all levels — and parents share the blame. When players on Parsons' team explode and a fight breaks out, causing the cancellation of a match, is it Parsons' fault? He's been coaching those players for only a few months.

He should have control over them, but it isn't always easy to tell how much a player will take. Soccer players all seem to have a chip on their shoulder; the question is, how far will they go before they figure that chip's been violated?

And who put it there to begin with? A temperamental age-group coach, perhaps, or an overzealous parent.

Soccer is a fast-growing sport, which means finding competent coaches and officials can be difficult.

But that's not much of an excuse. Because basic sportsmanship and competition should — indeed, must — coexist, whatever the sport.

DCD tops Borgess to win tournament

It was a classic court confrontation: Size against speed, pressure against youth.

Detroit Country Day had the size, with 6-foot Shereese Mayo and a pair of 5-9 forwards, Cathy Hayes and Tara Spight. Redford Bishop Borgess had the speed, throughout its lineup, which featured no starter taller than 5-7.

Both had youth, but Country Day's freshmen guards, Pam Bierzynski and Katie Kerr, faced the greater challenge: to handle the Spartans' pressure in a pressure-packed situation — a Class C district final.

Give them both high marks. Instead of folding, or wearing down, or allowing their mistakes to multiply, the Yellowjacket twosome gained poise and confidence as the game progressed. In the pivotal third quarter they spurred their team to a 16-4 advantage, and it ultimately led to a 45-33 Country Day triumph at Detroit Benedictine.

The win gives Country Day, now 19-2, a ticket to the regionals against the Manchester district winner. Borgess bows out at 20-3.

"We were worried about their pressure," said Yellowjacket coach Frank Orlando. "But as the game went on, they got stronger, they believed they could play. I give all the credit to the girls."

Listen to Bierzynski and one would think there was no real turning point, a moment when she and backcourt mate Kerr suddenly believed they could withstand the intense pressure. "You always believe you can handle something," said the 5-5 freshman. "You've just got to feel good in yourself. And we do."

No reason not to now. They did have problems — Country Day committed 22 turnovers — but they executed well enough, using their superior size and going to the basket whenever the opportunity presented itself. Bierzynski

knocked down eight of her 10 points in the second half, most coming on drives.

But Kerr proved to be the heart of this team. She finished with a game-high 16 points, including six in a row in the second quarter that turned a three-point deficit into a 19-18 halftime lead.

Borgess, on the other hand, had its weaknesses laid bare. The Spartans are extremely quick and fast, but, as coach Dave Mann said, "If anything, this showed our lack of a true post game. We haven't had one all year, but we've been able to compensate."

Mann wanted to give credit for his team's abysmal shooting from the floor — 13-of-59 (22 percent) — to Country Day. But that's questionable. The Yellowjackets sat back in a 1-2-2 zone throughout the game, daring Borgess to shoot from the perimeter.

The Spartans did, and missed. In the first 9½ minutes of the second half, they scored just four points. They were 2-of-14 from the field in the third quarter.

They didn't give up. They put together an 11-point run in a four-minute span of the fourth, fueled by six Yellowjacket turnovers. But it was too little, too late. Country Day still led by eight, and only 1:39 remained.

"We played a zone because we felt, as far as matchups are concerned, we couldn't keep up with their speed," said Orlando. "It was just our fortune that they weren't hitting."

"On any given day . . . you never know."

Mann knows. Just a mediocre shooting performance could have saved Borgess (after an 8-for-27 shooting performance in the first half, Country Day was 13-of-27 in the second). Only Maxann Reese reached double figures in scoring, with 12. No other Spartan scored more than six.

Salem's Mr. Soccer headlines dream team

For the second year in a row, the All-Observer boys soccer team boasts the No. 1 player in the state.

Plymouth Salem senior Tom Baker was named the 1992 Mr. Soccer by the coaches association. Travis Roy, the former Livonia Stevenson star now playing for the University of Wisconsin, won the award last year.

Baker guided the Rocks to an 18-3-2 season and runner-up finish in the Class A tournament.

Redford Catholic Central, which won the Catholic League title and lost to Salem in the regional final, placed three players on the all-area team.

Western Lakes Activities Association co-champs Livonia Franklin and Farmington are represented by forwards Victor Rodopoulos and Mike Giese.

Livonia Stevenson, Plymouth Canton, Salem and Livonia Churchill put two players each on the honor squad.

Salem's Ken Johnson was selected Coach of the Year.

Despite a lineup riddled by injuries for half the season, he juggled his lineup to keep Salem on a winning roll until the final week of the regular season when Baker went down with an ankle injury.

The Rocks set a school record with a 14-game unbeaten streak until losing consecutive games to Farmington and Churchill.

Salem finished the regular season 12-2-2 and won six straight tournament games before losing 2-1 in overtime to Warren DeLaSalle in the state final.

ALL-AREA TEAM

Anthony Verrino, senior, Redford CC: Verrino led the Shamrocks in scoring with 16 goals and seven assists. The two-time All-Catholic forward and team captain had 35 career goals.

"Anthony is an outstanding high school soccer player," coach Phil LaJoy said. "Opposing coaches would comment on how dangerous a forward Anthony was and how difficult he was to defend."

Mike Giese, senior, Farmington: Giese was a four-year starter for the Falcons and accumulated 54 goals and 37 assists during his career. He scored 27 goals while taking 76 shots and assisted on 10 others this year.

Giese is an Olympic Development Player and the No. 3-rated player in Class A.

"Mike is probably the best forward in the state and, of course, the best player Farmington has had in the last several years," coach Luke Juncaj said. "He has a lot of speed, a lot of skill and is just a great all-round soccer player."

Victor Rodopoulos, junior, Franklin: Rodopoulos helped the Patriots achieve their most successful season in school history with a 12-3-3 finish.

He scored 11 goals and assisted on eight. Rodopoulos, a three-year varsity player, has 38 career goals and 24 assists.

"Victor started for us as a freshman, and the team has become much stronger ever since because of Victor," coach Frantz LaMarre said. "He has been a great asset to the team."

"He's an excellent striker and good distributor. At the start of the year, I told him he was going to draw more defenders and, for the team to be much better, he would have to distribute the ball sooner to other people — and he did that."

Troiani was Churchill's leading scorer with 12 goals and eight assists but was marked closely by opponents. His career totals were 30 goals and 22 assists.

"We used him as a target, someone to get the ball to quickly," Churchill coach Mark Mason said. "He can get it under control, turn with it and play facing the goal. You can work a give-and-go and be a little more creative when you have a player who can play it close to his feet."

"He got most of the attention from defenders, and he was not able to get as many goals as last year when we had other players to take the pressure off him."

was a steady influence in the middle for the Shamrocks and was an impact player at points up and down the field. He was CC's most valuable player and Player Of The Year in the Catholic League.

Though he was closely marked by opponents, he scored 10 goals and had eight assists this year, bringing his respective career totals to 38 and 32.

"He's a complete ballplayer," LaJoy said. "He has the ability to get the entire team involved in the game. Rich has a work ethic second to none."

Tom Baker, senior, Salem: Baker scored 11 goals and had nine assists this year but was noted more for being an excellent playmaker and his ability to control the game.

He scored 34 goals and had 25 assists during four years as a starter. Baker is a two-time all-state selection and team MVP.

"He's the best player Salem ever had," coach Ken Johnson said. "We were state finalists twice, won a league championship and were 66-12-6 with Tom on the team."

Adam Pichler, senior, Stevenson: Pichler has been a standout midfielder for the Spartans for several years. He scored seven goals and as many assists this year. He had career totals of 16 goals and 15 assists.

"Adam is the most durable defender I have ever coached," Stevenson coach Walt Barrett said. "He constantly wears down his opponents and creates numerous scoring opportunities for himself and his team."

Jeff Thomas, senior, Stevenson: Thomas played in the midfield but also spent time as sweeper. He excelled at disrupting the opposing offense.

Thomas also scored five goals and assisted on eight this year, giving him 13 and 17 for his career, respectively.

"Jeff is an extremely skilled player," Barrett said. "He's the kind of player who can wreck a game in a matter of seconds. I have seen him do this at least a half dozen times in the last two years."

Owen Crosby, senior, Canton: Crosby was a big reason the Chiefs earned a state ranking and had the best overall record in the WLAA.

He used his height (6-foot-5) and basketball ability to his advantage on defense, timing his leaps to head the ball away from the Canton goal. He also scored two goals and had one assist.

"He's probably the most consistent and valuable defender to play soccer at Canton," coach Don Smith said. "He's very coachable and great at performing air-traffic control."

Chris Saline, senior, Salem: Saline played a key role in the Rocks posting nine shutouts and allowing only 21 goals. The Rocks had 19 shutout victories during Saline's two years as a starter.

"He's a strong defender and a great leader," Johnson said.

Mike Wdowiak, senior, Canton: Area coaches thought enough of Canton's defense to put two of its players on the first team.

Wdowiak also contributed two goals and four assists this year. During his career, he scored six goals and was credited with nine assists.

"Mike is a four-year letter winner and is very dedicated to the game," Smith said. "He's one of the reasons for our successful seasons."

Adam Borchert, junior, Redford CC: Borchert has been a starting defender for the Shamrocks since his freshman season. He managed to score two goals and four assists this year.

Borchert is an All-Catholic player and made the all-academic team, too.

"Adam is an extremely intelligent ballplayer," LaJoy said. "He is a strong player who could get the ball out of the defensive zone while under great pressure."

Kal Kaliszewski, senior, Churchill: Kaliszewski, an Olympic Development goalkeeper, recorded 12 shutouts and posted a 0.79 goals-against average. He made 102 saves in 20 games.

Tucker plays can-do principal in 'A Town Torn Apart'

'Doc' Littky offers paradigm for success

Michael Tucker is excited about his latest TV movie, *A Town Torn Apart*, but he's afraid it won't get the attention it deserves.

Airing Monday, Nov. 30, on NBC, just a day after the books close on the networks' "sweeps" ratings slugfest, *Town* offers neither gunfire nor glamour, the usual commodities peddled by the network publicity machine. Instead, the movie dramatizes the true story of how a high-school principal turned his school around and the unorthodox methods he used to achieve his results.

The premise was such a long shot, Tucker says, that his friend and co-producer David Rintels initially warned him, "I don't think we can get a network sale on this." But NBC's entertainment chief, Warren Littlefield, was apparently swept along on the tide of the *L.A. Law* co-star's enthusiasm, and he made *A Town Torn Apart* the anchor of the network's "The More You Know" education and public-service week.

In the drama, Tucker plays

Dennis Littky, a doctor of psychology and Long Island school principal who left his career in education and moved to a small New Hampshire town, where he became the editor of the local newspaper. He lived in a primitive log house outside town with a pretty cellist who wasn't his wife, and the townsfolk viewed him with suspicion.

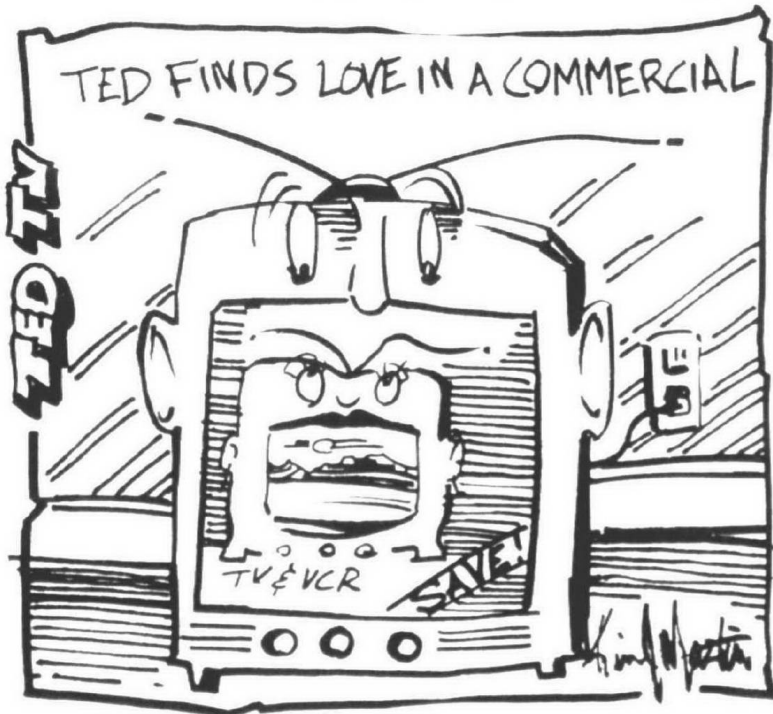
As the movie opens, Littky becomes aware of serious problems at Winchester's Thayer High, which is smeared with graffiti, crippled by violence and sinking fast. At Thayer High, kids don't expect to graduate, much less go on to college. To everyone's surprise, Littky produces his credentials and applies for the job of principal.

Littky works all summer to transform the appearance of the school using paint and supplies donated by parents after the first of many Littky pep talks. His strategy is to encourage the students to take pride in their school and to reach out to each individual in an effort to ignite a passion for learning. He

eliminates study hall, sends students into town to take part-time jobs that will teach them math and science and sets up small groups mentored by faculty members to make sure the students have a network of emotional and academic support. He even persuades one teacher (Jill Eikenberry) to take on the challenge of tutoring a special class of slow readers in an off-campus location.

Littky's proposals are unsettling, but he quickly wins over both students and teachers. Parents are another matter. Despite the success of Littky's methods (test scores are rising, and students frequently stay at school during the evening to work on class projects), a group of traditional-minded citizens takes umbrage and tries to block Littky's return for a second year at Thayer.

The movie chugs along as indefatigably as Tucker's "Doc" and provides several emotional highs, but best of which is the unveiling (filmed at the real Thayer High) of a mural painted by a drop-out student during Littky's first summer. These moments make up for a certain sappiness in the script, and the overall effect should inspire any leader, educator or not, to keep trying, no matter what the odds.

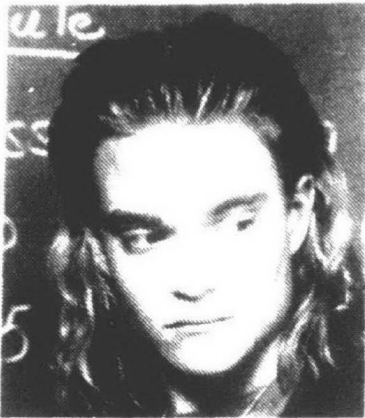

A: The exotic-looking child actor was born Sabu Dastagir in Karapur, Mysore, India, on Jan. 27, 1924. He was working as a stable boy for a wealthy maharajah when American documentarian Robert Flaherty cast him in the title role in 1937's *Elephant Boy*. The mysterious and carefree persona of that and the following similar characters he played captivated both British and American audiences and led to a number of other films spotlighting the Indian boy in various adventures. His most notable role, of course, was as Mowgli in a 1942 screen adaptation of Rudyard Kipling's *The Jungle Book*, a precursor to the animated Disney film in 1967. His career waned when the mystique of jungle films did the same and after moving to Hollywood, he starred in a handful of other films before his sudden death as a result of heart failure in 1963.

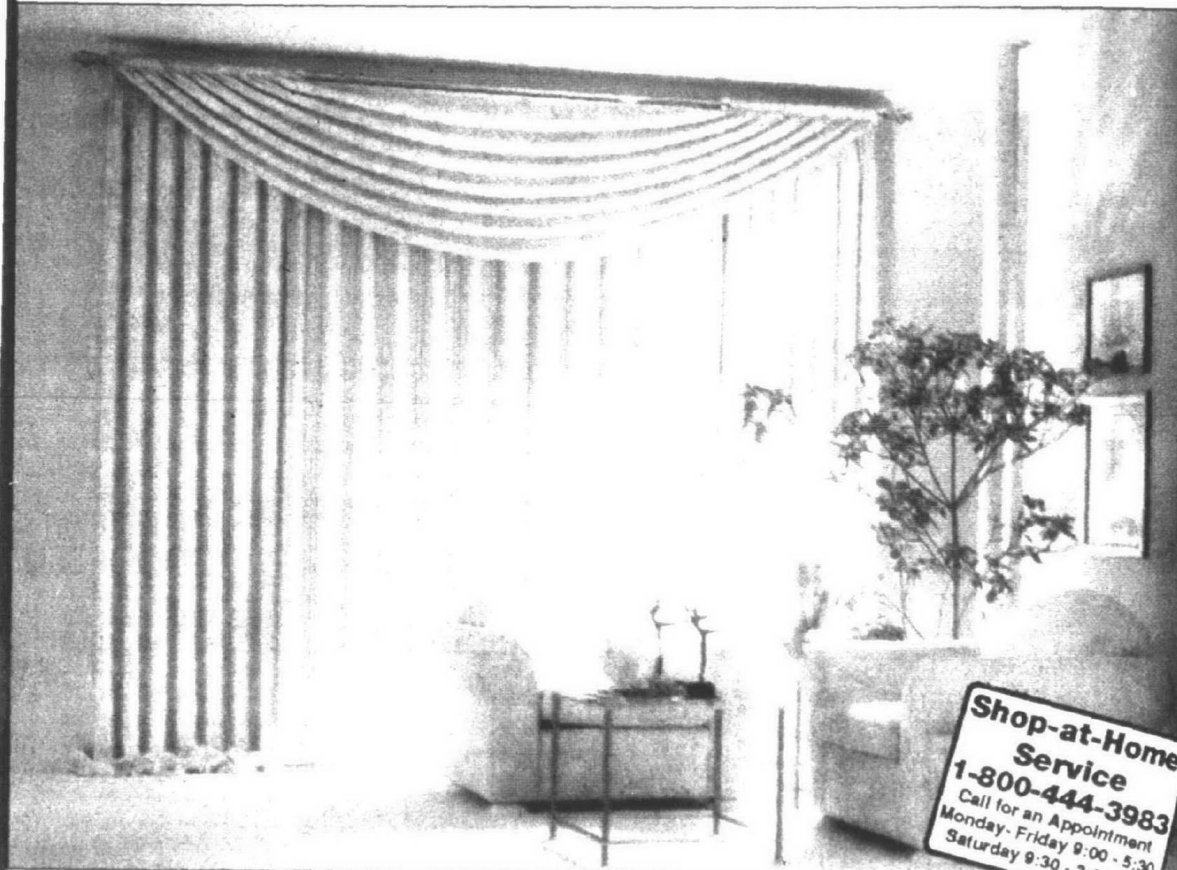

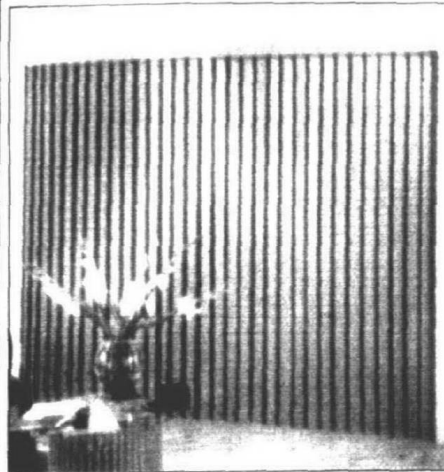

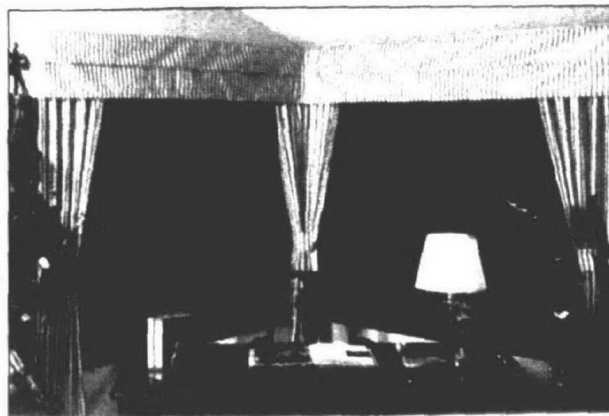
