## Artley only school candidate so far

Longtime school board member Dave Artley is the only candidate, so far, who has announced he will run for one school board seat in June.

Many other likely candidates say they're aren't interested.

Anyone interested in running in the June 14 race has until 4 p.m. April 12 to file nominating petitions at the E.J. McClendon Educational Center. Petitions must have a minimum 34 valid signatures of registered voters in the district.

As of late last week, Artley was the

only person who had pulled nominating petitions.

Artley, first elected to the board in July 1983, said he decided to run for re-election last spring when he chose not to run for a state House of Representatives seat.

"Kids have always been my priority," he said.

"As I looked where I can give back to a community that has always been supportive to myself and my family I thought the school board was a place I wanted to invest my time," said Artley, adding that he hasn't missed a regular board meeting in the 10 years

he has served on the board.

"The school board is a real difficult position, because you represent a very broad cross-section of the community," Artley said, adding that school board members have to reach parents with kids in school, as well as constituents without children.

Artley says the district's biggest successes are academic and extracurricular achievements, as well as a strong force of people who are involved with the schools.

So far, Artley apparently doesn't have any competitors.

Carol Bollman, who ran unsuccessful-

fully for a school board seat last year, said she doesn't expect "anyone will run against Dave Artley."

"He may be a jerk, but he's accessible," said Bollman, who supports Artley's campaign.

"People say he doesn't know what he's talking about. He does know if you talk to him after a meeting, but he won't commit political suicide."

Bollman said she doesn't think she will run this year.

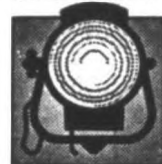
"I don't think I want to commit my life to that regimented circum-

## Filmmaker focuses on Indians

■ Pamela Conn hopes to film the story of the Indians on Montana's Fort Belknap reservation. One slight hurdle: raising some \$400,000.

Plymouth's Oscar-winning documentary director Pamela Conn has a pressing story to tell.

But she needs \$400,000 to film it — the story of the Indians on a Montana reservation and the threat to their lives posed by a mining company.

Conn recently had a chance to raise funds in Hollywood.

She was there Jan. 28, in the grand lobby of the Samuel Goldwyn Theater, with more than 75 other Oscar-winning women. They were gathered for a reception and group photo, to coincide with this year's 65th Academy Awards theme, "Oscar Celebrates Women and the Movies."

"Everybody had to dress in black and white. There was Whoopi Goldberg, Geena Davis, Shirley MacLaine, Ginger Rogers, Marlee Matlin . . . I went there hoping to find money," Conn said.

It was in August of 1991 that Conn became aware of the plight of the Native Americans living at the Fort Belknap Indian Reservation.

"I was there to shoot a film for the Detroit Institute of Arts on plains Indian art."

Working with her on that project was Sue Marx, with whom Conn won the 1988 Academy Award for best documentary short film for "Young at Heart."

While filming in Montana, she heard from crew members of the Indians' concern over strip mining on the south end of the reservation.

"They're taking down the mountains," she said, adding that the mountains are important to the Native Americans as spiritual sites.

Also, the process used to mine gold involves the use of cyanide, which leaches into the groundwater, threatening the health of the reservation's population of 3,500.

Conn has traveled to the reservation four times to hang out with the natives and earn their trust.

"This thing is so overwhelmingly important to me; this is a project that has to be done," she said.

"This is literally a life and death situation for these people; their lives are going down the toilet."

Conn said she's moved by the native Americans' way of looking at life.

"It's like going to a different planet. Their relationship with the earth is so profoundly different."

"The way they look at things, we are made in the image and likeness of God, but so is an ant. We are the same as the trees, rocks and earth."

"I think our money will come," Conn said. "But it could take another year; (meanwhile), the mountains are coming down."

To begin filming the documentary would take "about \$200,000," she said.

## Supervisor to propose budget cuts

In an effort to bolster Plymouth Township's shrinking budget surplus, the township board of trustees is considering \$165,000 in budget cuts.

Supervisor Kathleen Keen-McCarthy is presenting the list of cuts to the board at the regular Tuesday meeting at 7:30 p.m. at township hall.

Will the cuts cause service cutbacks for residents? "At this point I would say no," McCarthy said.

The main contributor to this round of cuts — more rounds will come, the supervisor said — is a provision calling for no merit pay increases for non-union employees, to save \$40,000.

In December, the new board of trustees gave non-union township employees a 3-percent raise, down from the traditional 5 percent. That reduction still angered a few critics of the new board, who maintained the

township wasn't doing enough to reduce spending.

Trustees responded that other township employees were getting negotiated raises, and that it was unfair to make one group take the hit over budget cuts.

Also in December, the township administration used \$700,000 from its budget surplus to balance the 1992 budget, cutting the surplus to \$149,000.

McCarthy said this round of budget cuts, once approved by trustees,

would boost the budget surplus to about \$300,000.

The suggested budget cuts followed McCarthy's request of department heads, after taking office in November, to provide a list of cuts in their departments.

Also, "I instituted as of the first of the year a hiring freeze," she said. So far, the freeze has kept the administration from filling one full-time and one part-time position.

McCarthy said she and department heads will start talking in March

about a second round of budget cuts.

"It's an ongoing discussion. I've asked the department heads to look at creative ways to accomplish the task," she said.

In another budget-related matter, McCarthy said she'll be talking with the township public works department this month on how to deal with increased rates for water being charged by the township's supplier, the City of Detroit.

"One thing we'll look at is the (township) water tower," McCarthy said, adding it's been determined the tower needs repairs.

"Is there a need for it to be functioning as part of our water system, or is it a historical monument?" she asked.

"I think this board has made a lot of progress in two and a half months," McCarthy said.

"I would say we're getting a real sincere effort from our department heads."

**New treasurer**

Teresa Cischke has been appointed City of Plymouth treasurer.

She began working for the city in July 1974 in the finance department, and was appointed to the position of accounting manager in December 1987.

Cischke is a longtime city resident and therefore meets the city's residency requirement for department heads. That requirement was upheld by residents in the November election.

# Inmate claims Fisher tried to pay for confession

A 36-year-old prison inmate testified Friday that Dr. Charles Fisher said in prison that he taped his wife's nose and mouth, then sat and watched her.

"When he knocked her out, he taped her up," said Ricardo Bush, an inmate who claims Fisher paid him several hundred dollars to take the rap for the 1984 murder of Fisher's wife, Ella Maria Mercado Fisher.

"She had woke back up. He said he sat there and watched her. His name was Dr. Fisher and I thought he knew she was dying," said Bush, who is serving a 10-

15-year sentence for breaking and entering and as a habitual offender.

Fisher is charged with one count of inciting perjury, a five-year felony, and one count of attempted obstruction of a justice, a 2 1/2-year felony. He is also awaiting a retrial in the murder of his

wife in their Thornwood home.

Bush told the court that he initially asked Fisher while both were in the State Prison of Southern Michigan Prison at Jackson why he was in prison. "He just said a couple of black guys broke in and killed his wife," Bush testified.

Because detectives found money in a bedroom of the Fisher home, "that's why they kept pressing the issue (against Fisher)," Bush continued. "I told him he had to find someone in prison to take the weight for it."

Initially, Fisher did not respond to his suggestion, said Bush, who in exchange for his testimony will be recommended to earn good behavior credits, which effectively reduces his sentence by three years.

After Bush had been put in the prison's maximum security section, a plumber brought him a note from Fisher. "How can I get

in touch with anyone who can take the weight for me?" Bush recalled the note asking.

Bush and Fisher spoke again. "He told me if I know anyone who would take \$1,500 for the case," Bush responded: "I said I would do it for \$1,500."

On continued questions from Doug Baker, Wayne County assistant prosecutor, Bush explained that Fisher paid him \$30 in prison tokens every two weeks. When they met again, Fisher provided Bush with details of the murder, based on evidence police apparently had, Bush testified.

Bush spoke of beer cans in the

Fisher house. "He said if I was to say that (about beer cans); no one would know that except me and the police," Bush continued.

All in all, Bush testified that he received \$300 over seven to eight months from Fisher.

Two juries found Fisher guilty of first-degree murder in his wife's death. The first trial was ruled in error based on a comment by the prosecutor.

In late 1991, the Michigan Supreme Court reversed the second conviction, ruling that a diary kept by Mercado should not have been admitted into evidence because it was hearsay.

## Gun damages swimming pool

A Plymouth Township homeowner on Brookline reported \$3,000 in damage to his swimming pool Tuesday, after someone shot two holes in the pool with a pellet gun.

The damage happened sometime between 5 and 6 p.m., the homeowner told police. After the shots were fired, water drained from the 24-foot circular pool, the police report continued.

The case was put on inactive status, for lack of suspects and leads.

## Antique search leads to buying historic home

In 1989, Carole Wassenaar of Salem went to an estate sale at a nearby farmhouse. She ended up buying the Victorian home on Napier Road.

"I was born and raised 1 1/2 miles from here, so I'd always known of the house," Wassenaar said. "I went home from the estate sale and got my husband to take a look. At first he said, 'No way,' but he changed his mind." The Wassenaars had already restored two homes in Salem. They decided to do this one as an investment.

According to a monograph by the Salem Area Historical Society, the original land grant was

purchased in 1828 by Lyman Corbin. It included 200 acres, part of which was in Washtenaw County and part in Wayne County.

In 1862, three of Corbin's sons were liable for service in the Civil War. At that time, the law allowed the hiring of a substitute for the sum of \$300. To raise the needed money, Corbin took out two mortgages, one for \$300 and one for \$600.

After Corbin died in 1865, the property passed to Joseph Doane, who built the current house in 1881.

"We closed on the house and two acres in July 1989, and began work on the outside," Wassenaar said. "We did several weekends of bulldozer work, taking down a chicken coop and an old shed."

The shed appeared to have been built with some materials taken from the first house on the site. Wassenaar saved the original door and hardware.

When cold weather came, they worked inside. "We had to have an electrician come in and rewire the place," she said. Heating ducts had to be installed upstairs, which had been previously heated by allowing warm air to rise through open grills in the floor. A plumber helped gut and replace the downstairs bath and kitchen, and add a full bath upstairs.

"I packed my lunch in the mornings and was here seven days a week. Bill was here evenings and weekends," Wassenaar said. They stripped the walls and ceilings of at least six layers of

wallpaper. They cleaned and stained the original trim and moldings, and painted the walls white with a hand-stenciled border.

The restoration took a year and the Wassenaars decided to move into their investment for a while. "We couldn't bear to have someone else reap the benefit of all that work," she said.

Decorated with antiques and family heirlooms, the interior of the home has a cozy, pioneer warmth, reminiscent of the early days of the township. The paneled front door lets visitors into a central sitting area furnished in red, white and blue. A braided rug, antique butter churn, and period rocking chair fit right in with the original wainscoting and a 10-

foot-high, built-in cabinet.

The glass in one of the cabinet doors has a large crack running across it. "My husband wouldn't let me replace the glass, because of the unusual repair job someone did," Wassenaar said. She was referring to two large buttons, one on each side of the glass, sewn together with thread through the crack.

Next to the sitting area is a large parlor with trifold doors. On one wall was an unused door to the front porch. Wassenaar covered the entire wall with a quilt made by her great-grandmother. The other walls of the room feature portraits of Wassenaar's great-grandparents. A small table displays a porcelain doll whose hair once belonged to an ancestor.

In the library stands Wassenaar's grandfather's roll-top desk. "He was the Salem Township treasurer, and I can remember people coming to his house to pay for their dog licenses and such," she said.

In the dining room, the Wassenaars worked their way down through carpeting, linoleum, and a layer of hardwood to uncover the original wide plank floor. At one end of the room you can still see scars where an old stove once stood.

Upstairs, the house features an unusual curved hallway. On close examination, one can see where necks were cut in the foot-high baseboards, allowing them to be bent to follow the shape of the wall.

# Foundation opens house

The Canton Community Foundation will conduct an open house to allow the public to ask questions about its operation in the wake of allegations that it is not a fully credited non-profit group.

"We actually thought it was a great idea by the Canton Observer newspaper (in an editorial) to have a meeting to find out who we are and what we're doing," according to William Joyner, foundation executive director.

The foundation treasurer will be present to discuss how money is raised and spent.

"We continue to be an open, community-minded organization like we always are," Joyner said. "Anybody who ever has any questions about the foundation is free to call any day, and we would be happy to talk to them."

The Observer suggested that an open house would help answer questions about the foundation raised by Canton Township Trustee Robert Shefferly at a recent board meeting.

Since then Shefferly was invited, by Joyner and Bill Myers, board member and past foundation president, to review foundation records.

Shefferly said his only remaining concern was that solicitations for money to the foundation should not imply that donations

can be deducted on Michigan tax forms. However, donations to the foundation can be deducted on federal income tax forms.

"The Canton Community Foundation has never claimed the Canton Community Foundation qualified for a State of Michigan tax credit," Myers said.

Shefferly said he welcomed the open house, because it might help dispel rumors that were "flying around."

Shefferly said he started to question the foundation's state tax deduction eligibility because, "I figured it was up to me as an elected official to know more about it and whether they were a non-profit organization."

Initially, Shefferly said, he wanted to ensure the foundation accounting books were open and available to the public.

"It seems they're doing a lot of good in the community; I hate to see them be bad mouthed," Shefferly said.

The open house is from 5-8 p.m. Monday, March 1. Omnicon Cable will televise a portion of the open house, from 5:30-6:30 p.m., to give residents who don't attend access to some of the questions. Residents interested in attending may call 454-5427. Reservations are not necessary. Refreshments will be served.

## New tastes coming to Plymouth

The winter of the Plymouth business community's discontent is nearly over.

Last winter, closings of some prominent businesses caused some to wring their hands and bemoan the future of downtown Plymouth.

But this winter, some new food-related businesses are set to open and others plan to — quite a change from a year ago.

The Breadwinner bakery opened Jan. 27 at 448 Forest, in the former barbershop across from the former Cloverdale Dairy.

On a recent weekday morning, owner Eric Jaroch and two employees worked in a kitchen easily spotted from the store's glass front counter. There, traditional baked goods including scones, cinnamon buns and blueberry muffins shared counter space with cheddar-broccoli muffins and other creative varieties.

Jaroch's family founded the original Breadwinner bakery in Rochester. A demographics study

suggested downtown Plymouth would be a prime spot to open another bakery.

"We specialize in breads," Jaroch said. "Our philosophy has been to make a wholesome product using the finest ingredients we can find."

Since opening, business has "been excellent. People are very friendly; a lot of the business owners have come in. A lot of peo-

ple say, 'We've been waiting a long time for a bakery down here.'"

Opening Feb. 15 in the former A&W restaurant building on Ann Arbor Road is Boston Chicken, a Chicago-based chain with eight other restaurants in metro Detroit.

John Kilborn, a corporate employee, described the company product as "marinated fresh

chicken slow roasted for two hours. We have a full complement of hot and cold side items," he said, including pasta.

Hours will be 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Friday and Saturday.

Downtown at the former Cloverdale Dairy building, Ann Arbor builder Attila Huth continues renovation work, to prepare for the opening in four months of a restaurant specializing in Chinese nouvelle cuisine.

On work to renovate the former dairy, Huth said, "We've gutted it completely inside; basically all that's left is the four outside walls. There's new everything."

Ann Arbor restaurant owner Khee Kwok, who is opening the business, said featured fare will include pasta dishes with sea clam sauce and roast duck.

Also, the city building department reports that a Tubby's submarine shop is seeking approval this month from the city planning commission to locate in the Main Street building formerly occupied by Taco Bell.

# Commission laments lack of contracts for county firms

Wayne County commissioners complained last week that too many contracts for goods and services are awarded to businesses located outside Wayne County.

"Charity begins at home, Mr. Chairman," said commission Vice Chair Kay Beard, D-Westland, suggesting that non-county businesses should be limited to contracts of one-year duration with Wayne County. Beard's district also includes Garden City.

Chairman Arthur Blackwell, D-Detroit, to whom Beard directed her remark, said a move like Beard suggested would invite lawsuits.

"When you start talking about specific protectionist stuff it's dangerous," he said.

The discussion began when commissioner Bernard Parker, D-Detroit, complained about a \$190,000 contract to supply a chemical used in wastewater treatment plants that was recommended to be awarded to a Manistee company, the low bidder.

A Detroit company had also bid on the contract, Parker said, and faced layoffs if it didn't get the contract.

## Hometown companies

Parker suggested that the cost to county taxpayers when hometown companies don't get contracts and employees are laid off might easily exceed the savings to taxpayers by contracting with outstate companies when they underbid Wayne County companies.

## Seniors need chore help

The Senior Alliance Chore Referral Program links seniors with workers who can do outdoor chores. Workers, who are asked to charge the seniors no more than

Even so, Wayne County would lay itself bare to lawsuits if it went too far in favoring area companies over others.

"If we violate our own ordinance process I know we'd be in trouble," said commissioner Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, who also represents the Plymouth and Northville areas.

Comprehensive statistics regarding past contract awards weren't available at press time, but of the 20 contracts the commission voted on Thursday, 12 were proposed to be awarded to businesses outside Wayne County.

In terms of money (excluding a \$4.5 million contract with a Detroit firm), Wayne County companies got \$1.4 million worth of contracts, while the other contracts (three of them out of state) add up to \$1.8 million.

## Legal requirements

Commissioners are concerned that the county economy suffers every time a county government contract isn't awarded to a county business.

They would like to give as many contracts to Wayne County

companies as possible, but legal requirements for using the lowest bidder and the fact that many of the goods and services the county requires are often not available in Wayne County make that wish difficult, if not impossible, to bring to fruition.

Some say that part of the problem is that the county government, like many governments, has made it difficult for businesses to get contracts.

"It's not easy doing business with any level of government," Beard said, because of all the extra paperwork.

## Big bureaucracy

"The problem is that we've built up an incredible bureaucracy," said commissioner Bryan Amann, D-Wayne, who also represents Canton Township.

However, Amann added, "there's a great potential for fraud" in contracting out government work, particularly in a county like Wayne with an annual budget of \$1.5 billion.

"That's why there's all those hoops," he said. "To make sure we're spending the money properly we have to put in all these checks and balances."

The trick is to find out just how much the county government can legally favor county companies when awarding contracts.

"We have to be careful that we don't cross a fine line between a reasonable policy and a protectionist policy that hurts Wayne County businesses that rely on business from other counties," McCotter said.

Already the county has an ordinance that says the bids of Wayne County companies can be reduced by 3 or 6 percent (depending on the dollar amount of the contract) for the purpose of comparing them to other bids for the same contracts.

In that way a county company can get county government work even though it isn't the lowest bidder on a contract.

McCotter said the commission's economic development committee will probably take another look at the problem and see if it can't fine tune the appropriate ordinance again to better favor county companies without endangering their business with other counties.

"It's a scale, and they're going to see if they can balance it any better than it already is," he said.

Blackwell agreed. "Everybody wants to help Wayne County businesses," he said. "We have to do something to get more businesses looking at Wayne County."

# Help group aiding those with MD in many ways

**L**ate last year I wrote a column about a young man I met at a Christmas Eve party. The child, about 3 years old, couldn't walk; at the time, his parents were waiting to see if the diagnosis was a spinal problem or muscular dystrophy.

One point of the column was the parallel to Tiny Tim in Dickens' "A Christmas Story." It was Christmas Eve and here was a small child, unable to walk, happily playing with the host's dog and watching the lights on the tree.

Meanwhile, his parents were telling us that the little boy's present, that he had so been looking forward to — his first wheel chair — had failed to arrive in time for Christmas. His parents were kind of matter-of-fact about it, but the rest of us were seething that a company could be so insensitive to the needs of a little boy one day before Christmas.

A lot of you read that column and called to see if there was anything you

could do. I put the question to the family about the same time they received the diagnosis for their son — he is afflicted with a type of muscular dystrophy.

At first, they seemed interested in letting us pursue the story by sending out a photographer and reporter. Then, they backed off, saying it was their responsibility and it would be shouldered by their family.

Then they changed their mind again. I received a call from the father, who said that while they now had the wheel chair, they still weren't as mobile as they might have liked to be, because the wheel chair would only fit in a specially equipped van. They didn't have one, and the price tag on a van outfitted with the necessary stuff hovers around \$20,000.

And then I met with the boss of the little boy's father in Plymouth's Box Bar. I had come to visit with him and his wife, since they're great people, but

I'd also shown up to discuss how we could help the little boy's family.

Instead, the boss ordered the first of what would be many, many beers and handed me a letter. I stuffed it, unopened, in my wife's purse, a favorite carry-all for everything I don't wish to carry, and, since I really couldn't read anyway at that point in time, continued the evening.

The next morning, I opened the let-

ter. "You mentioned that over 70 people were touched by the article and wondered what they might do to help," it said. "Though we need a used full-size van to transport our son and his electric wheel chair, in the interest of doing what's socially responsible, we suggest people make donations to the Muscular Dystrophy Association."

"MDA will help us and many others purchase new braces, buy wheel chairs, and pay other necessary medical costs. To provide some perspective, our son's leg braces for 1993 will cost somewhere between \$5,000 and \$6,800." The little boy's wheel chair came in at \$11,000, and the letter, from the father, notes that even if his insurance pays 80 percent of all this, and a few other costs, his out-of-pocket expenses will be at least \$4,000, not including modifications to their home, a van, a wheel chair lift, and on and on."

And that's on one income — the father's.

"Your readers are already helping through their tax dollars and their donations to the various charities," the letter continued. "I can vouch that organizations like MDA put their money to good use. I can also assure them that more money is needed."

"And if you know a family with a disabled child, offer to babysit . . . they're great kids." His point was that many people feel uncomfortable babysitting for disabled children — but there's no need to feel awkward. They need help just like any other child.

# MEAP doesn't test a student's survival skills

**P**ity the poor schools. Every year about this time the dreaded MEAP scores come out to haunt teachers, school superintendents, parents and kids.

Parents show up at school board meetings with test scores in hand, wanting to know why their kids can't read or do math as well as in past years. The school administrators usually come up with some mumbo jumbo about how the tests were changed.

My own favorite is an administrator in the Plymouth Canton school district. When asked why girls don't do as well as boys in math and science, the administrator complained that a Barbie doll says "math is hard," when you pull the string.

The assumption here is that kids listen to every talking toy and then go act

it out the remainder of their lives. If that were true, my own kids would be killing people with Star War style laser guns and I'd be shooting Indians from behind trees.

But the real trouble with MEAP scores isn't what they test, it's what they don't test. The mission of schools is packing programs with as many facts as possible and trying to get kids to remember them.

The problem with MEAP tests is that they don't test kids on the knowledge they really need to survive in the world, even though schools teach much of it by accident.

Here's a list of the things that schools teach without knowing it:

- How to deal with tedium. Homework is boring, tedious and stupid much of

the time. But then again so is the work done by most adults.

■ Nasty teachers. Most parents complain about them, but really they are as good as any other teacher. Let's face it, we all have to learn to deal with people we don't like.

■ Kissing up. When kids learn the pet

subject or theory of a teacher and then tailor their work around it, they are kissing up. Such behavior will surely pay off in the future.

■ Breaking school rules. That's always good training. Not only do kids learn that breaking a few rules doesn't mean you're doomed for life, it's almost vocational training for government and law.

■ Subjects that don't exist. My kid came home from college one weekend and announced that he was taking a class in sociology and that outside of academic circles, the subject doesn't exist. "There's nothing you can do with a degree in sociology other than teach it," he said. A good lesson.

■ Keep it neat. Just remember, it doesn't matter what a kid has to say in

an essay, just that it looks neat and has the correct margins. It's form over content. It's a lesson Bill Clinton learned well. Who says we're not training future leaders?

Mastering reading, math and science are all important, but the other things are, too. They're street skills. They teach you the ability to pick up a horse apple and see it for what it is, even though the subject never came up in school.

We should come up with a way to test for it.



Homemade yeast rolls melt in your mouth

Contrary to popular belief, it's very difficult to be a really good food writer, a good cook, and a good liar. You have to realize, in my business, tact is everything.

Of course I tell momma that I enjoyed her overcooked roast. It is also very difficult to say a soup is good when you know darned well it was made with bouillon cubes or that jarred soup base. I even had to nod in appreciation of the "homemade dinner rolls" my sister baked that everyone could tell came right from a "Poppin' Fresh" container. I am sure those rolls were one of the reasons God made butter.

My sister happens to be one of those people who allows yeast rolls to intimidate them. While I have attended gatherings that could have had the guests playing hockey with the rolls, there's really very little to be scared about when baking rolls.

Though any bread recipe can be baked as rolls, dinner rolls are usually enriched with some extra butter, eggs, sugar and sometimes sour cream and cheese.

Refrigerator rolls were originally devised to provide a week's worth of fresh rolls and bread from one batch of dough. The dough is held, covered and weighted to prevent rising in the refrigerator. It can be used as needed.

So a roll is a roll is a roll, you say? Basically, yes. In content, that is. Shape, however, is another story.

Parkerhouse rolls

One traditional shape is the Parkerhouse roll, named after Harvey D. Parker, owner of the well-known Boston hotel of the same name.

To make Parkerhouse rolls, roll once-risen dough on a lightly floured surface to about 1/4-inch thick. Cut into rounds using a biscuit or cookie cutter.

Yours truly thinks an old jelly glass with Wilma Flintstone on it works best, but they're hard to find.

Using a chopstick or the blunt end of a knife, make a deep indentation across the diameter of each roll and then fold one side over not even with the bottom. Brush with butter, allow to rise, then bake.

You know, after all the research I did for this article I was rather disappointed to learn that Harvey Parker got all this fame and adulation just because he folded his rolls a little different. I guess I expected more.

Cloverleaf roll

A cloverleaf roll is simply three small balls of dough cooked in a buttered muffin tin. Dip each 1-inch ball of dough into melted butter and place three balls in each muffin tin. Allow to rise and watch everyone go "oh, ah."

Now, fan-shaped rolls always impressed me. Even the ones in the grocery store always turned out perfect.

To this day, I never knew that all you did was roll out the dough to 1 1/4-inch thickness and then slice into 1-inch strips. Stack six layers deep and cut into 1 1/2 inch squares.

Stack on end in a buttered muffin tin, brush with butter and allow to rise for pull-apart rolls that will simply melt in your mouth.

Crescent rolls are especially attractive, and because they are so small and dainty, I feel like I could eat 12 and not notice any were gone. To make crescents, roll out the dough into 1/4-inch thickness, and cut with a sharp knife into triangular wedges.

Roll each wedge from the wide end — don't start at the point. Place on a backing sheet with the point underneath. Then bend ends toward each other to make a moon shape. Leave 2 inches between each and allow to rise.

Soft sided rolls, like the ones served in my favorite Chinese restaurant, are easily made in a cake or pie pan. Shape the dough into 2-inch balls, dip in melted butter, and place them, almost touching, in a buttered cake pan or pie tin.

Glazing rolls

The best yeast rolls are glazed with a simple brush of melted butter which gives a fine, soft finish.

If you are looking for a clear shine, beat one egg yolk with 1 tablespoon of water and brush before baking.

For a slightly darker glaze, brush one egg yolk with 2 tablespoons of cream.

So if you really want to do somebody who brings Poppin' Fresh rolls to a party a favor this year, send them this column with the recipes in a plain, unmarked envelope.

Better yet, include a few samples. Bon Appetit!

In the Pink! Fruity bubbly is lover's wine

Romance is in the air on Valentine's Day. Toast the one you love, and let them know how special they are with pink champagne.

Rose (row-zay') or pink champagnes are not new. The House of Veuve Clicquot is historically acknowledged as the first to have produced a pink champagne in 1777. In the past, popularity of pink champagne has ebbed and flowed with each generation. Recently, this has not proven true. It's in to stay.

Pink champagne is in vogue, as much for its distinctive color as for its superior match with food. Colors range from pale onion skin to salmon or copper color, and on to cherry red. This bubbly which is fruity, with more robust flavors and more tannin than golden bottlings, works well with appetizers, hearty entrees, fruit desserts and rich, tangy cheeses.

The major portion of rose champagne is consumed by the French and the English. Roughly 3 to 4 percent of all champagne imports to the United States are rose. Although quantities are small, virtually every well-known champagne house has one, and many have two. Some houses produce rose champagne only in vintage years.

Fact and fancy

In an earlier time, the pink color became associated with frivolity and even a symbol of wild and dissolute living. To us, pink champagne is a lovers' wine and Valentine's Day is the perfect time to share it with the love of your life.

Dine at a table with a pink tablecloth, pink flowers and pink candles. Prepare or order a lobster entree and end the meal with strawberries or a red berry tart.

According to one legend, rose

champagne was created for an important wedding when the bride requested a wine to match the satin slippers and long dresses chosen for her bridesmaids. Another popular version relates that pink champagne was blended to honor the coronation of a young queen. It was loved by the Victorians and Edwardians. In the 19th century, pink champagne was commonly named oeil de perdrix (eye of the partridge) for its distinctive color, distinguishing it from its golden-colored relative.

Most likely, pink champagne was an accident of nature during an unusually sunny and warm growing season in the Champagne district. That year, the red champagne grapes, pinot noir and pinot meunier, had darker pigmentation. During pressing, this color entered the

juice and a pink tinge resulted in the wine.

Thinking pink

Rose champagne is difficult to produce. By French law, three methods are permitted, two of them risky and requiring skillful winemaking practices.

The older, more difficult method, allows the skins of pinot noir grapes to remain in contact with the juice after pressing. The second method employs the addition of a portion of still red pinot noir wine from the villages of Bouzy or Ambonnay to the blend prior to the second fermentation in the bottle.

The third and least desirable practice in terms of a lasting pink color, adds a small amount of red pinot noir wine to the bottle before it is corked.

Because color results are unpredictable, producers make rose champagne less frequently than they do golden bottlings. Since quantities are limited and greater production care is required, rose champagne is more expensive than the golden. You can expect to pay between \$40 and \$95 for these special bottlings.

- ▶ Non-vintage Taittinger Cuvee Prestige Rose is highlighted by pinot noir cherry fruit and toasty, bread-dough aromas. It's delicate and finesseful on the palate with hints of vanilla in the finish.
- ▶ 1986 Perrier-Jouet Fleur de Champagne Rose showcases rich pinot noir cherry-like fruit and fullness. Older vintages of this wine are excellent with roast lamb.
- ▶ 1985 G. H. Mumm Brut Rose Mille-sime sports a heady mousse with rich, full flavors and lengthy aftertaste.
- ▶ 1985 Pol Roger Rose shows its early attractiveness with a bright copper color. Aromas of pinot noir cherry fruit are accented by sourdough bread and vanilla. A generous mouthfeel completes a superlative, ageable rendition.
- ▶ 1985 Veuve Clicquot-Ponsardin Rose Reserve offers full aromas and flavors. Its spicy, toasty, bread-dough and rich fruit notes make it a lush, generous wine to accompany a broad spectrum of foods.
- ▶ 1986 Taittinger Comtes de Champagne Rose is an amazing harmony of rich fruit and sourdough toast aromas. While big and full on the palate, it finishes superbly elegant.

Service tips

Always serve champagne well chilled. Place the bottle in a bucket filled with half ice and half cold water for about 30 minutes.

Use caution when opening the bottle. Remove the wire cage with the bottle facing away from you. Using a towel, slowly rotate the bottle while easing the cork from the neck, releasing it with a soft sigh, not a loud pop.

Serve in flutes or tulip-shaped glasses. A tall, slender glass allows the refined bubbles to rise without disappearing quickly. Six glasses per bottle is a generous pour.

"Give the sustenance and fuel that true passion requires," Casanova said. Nothing does it better than harmonizing rose champagne with the proper foods. For starters, canapes called amuse bouche (mouth pleasers) in French are always delicious and festive.

Pink smoked salmon and Boursin cheese spread on heart-shaped bread make attractive finger sandwiches. St. Andre cheese with fresh strawberries is colorful. Individual Barquettes au Boursin (Boat-shaped tartelettes) are unique and easily prepared.

SPINACH CREPES

Filling:  
10 ounces frozen chopped spinach (thawed and well drained)  
1 four ounce can mushrooms (or 1/2 cup fresh)  
3/4 cup fat free mayonnaise  
3 eggs or (3/4 cup Egg Beaters)  
3 tablespoons flour  
Crepes:  
3 eggs (or 3/4 cup Egg Beaters)  
1 cup low fat milk  
3/4 cup flour (unbleached or whole wheat)  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Mix filling ingredients together in a bowl. Mix crepe ingredients together in another bowl. Pour crepe mixture into a hot lightly oiled fry pan to make a 4-inch pancake. Place lightly browned crepe over a muffin tin hole (sprayed with non-stick spray) and spoon enough filling to fill level with top of muffin tin. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Makes 12 crepes.  
You can prepare a double batch and freeze 12 for another meal. They can also be cooked, frozen and then heated in the microwave.

ORZO SALAD

8 ounces orzo (tiny rice-shaped pasta), cooked according to package instructions  
1 medium tomato, diced  
1 bunch scallions, green part only, chopped  
3 ounces feta cheese, crumbled  
1/4 cup olive oil  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
2 tablespoons fresh dill, finely chopped  
1/4 cup chopped green pepper  
1/2 cucumber, (seeds removed) chopped  
pinch of salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

Combine orzo, vegetables and feta cheese in a medium bowl. Whisk together remaining ingredients in a small bowl. Toss with orzo mixture.

For dessert, serve a fruit salad. Mix together any combination of available fruits. If desired, top with a little low-fat vanilla yogurt.

## SMOKED SALMON AND BOURSIN CANAPES

5 ounces (one package) Boursin, softened at room temperature  
6 slices white bread of choice  
¼ pound finely sliced smoked salmon  
Cut 12 heart shapes from the

bread, using a heart-shaped cookie cutter. Spread Boursin on the hearts and top with the smoked salmon formed into rosettes.

## BARQUETTES AU BOURSIN

5 ounce (one package) Boursin, softened at room temperature  
2 large eggs

½ cup heavy cream  
½ cup milk  
½ teaspoon kosher salt  
Freshly ground black pepper and nutmeg to taste  
Prepared pie crust pastry of choice

Place 12 individual tartelette pans on a cookie sheet. Line the pans with the prepared pie crust. Weight crust with waxed paper and

pastry weights or beans to keep bases flat and smooth. Bake the pie crust in lower part of the oven at 350 degrees until just cooked (about 15-20 minutes). Remove paper and weights.

Mix the softened Boursin with the eggs, milk and seasonings. Beat well with whisk. Pour into the baked shells. Place in oven at 350 degrees for 20 to 30 minutes or until golden brown. Serve. Makes 12 tartelettes.

This recipe can be used for two individual 3-inch tarts baked 25 to 30 minutes.

Imported Boursin is available in all specialty cheese shops or in the gourmet cheese section of upscale supermarkets. Our homemade substitute (see recipe above) has never failed.

For fix-in-a-minute appetizers to accompany pink champagne, wrap thin slices of prosciutto or Parma ham around the top ½ of a slender breadstick. Buy herbed chevre, mix it with minced red bell pepper and use the mixture to stuff mushroom caps. Bake these in a hot 400 degree oven until the mushrooms just begin to darken and the cheese melts. Serve warm.

Roasted red bell peppers lightly filmed with extra-virgin olive oil topped with a grind of black pepper and salt to

black Italian olives brings out unusual flavors in a pink champagne. Toss bite-size pieces of Alaskan King crabmeat in a light, lemon vinaigrette and garnish with red radishes.

If the thought of a lobster entree for Valentine's Day does not appeal, then consider any veal, chicken or rabbit preparation with a wine and cream sauce. It will harmonize with the robust flavors, yet creamy texture of a pink champagne. As long as the sauce is not distinctly sweet or overly hot and spicy, it will work. Pork tenderloin is the current flavorful bargain white meat. Grill or roast it using the same advice about saucing.

The higher tannins of rose

champagne pair it handsomely with grilled beef or lamb or these meats with light sauces. Older, well-cellared rose champagnes (1979 vintage perhaps) are especially wonderful with lamb entrees.

Fondues are back. Dust off your old one and prepare chocolate fondue with strawberries for a Valentine's dessert. Since pink champagnes pair harmoniously with strawberries and chocolate, this is a two-for-the-price-of-one treat.

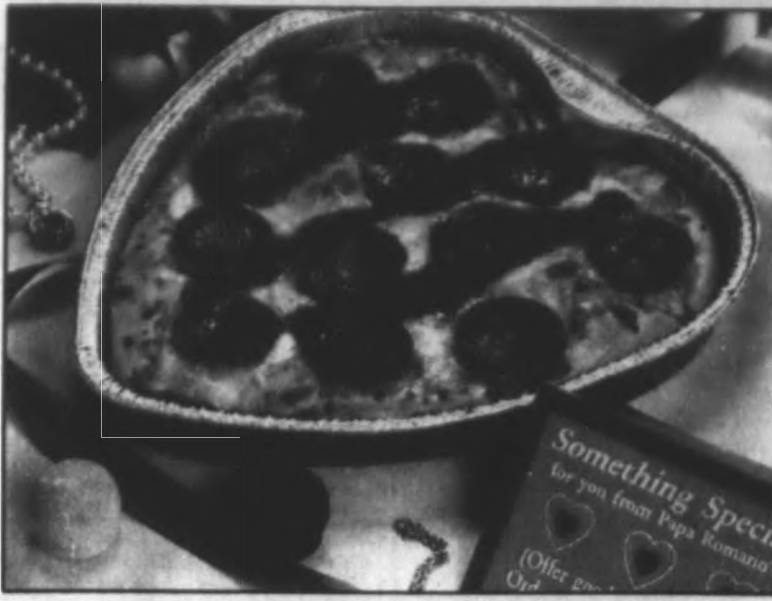

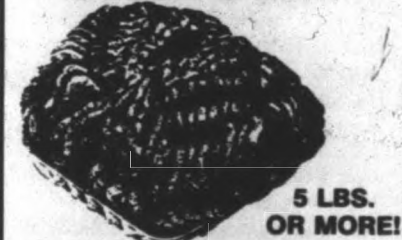

# Homemade rolls worth the work

### STANDARD YEAST ROLLS

- 1 package active dry yeast
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 2 tablespoons lukewarm water
- 1 cup milk
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2½ to 3 cups flour
- ½ teaspoon salt

In a small cup, dissolve yeast and sugar in water. Let stand until foamy, about 10 minutes. In a saucepan, heat milk with butter until melted. Cool to lukewarm. In a mixing bowl, combine yeast mixture with milk mixture and add ½ cups of the flour. Beat vigorously until well-combined.

Cover with a towel and allow the sponge to rise for 1 hour. Stir down the sponge and stir in the salt. Add 1 cup additional flour to make soft dough. Turn onto a floured board and knead until smooth and elastic, about 10 minutes.

Butter a large bowl, turn dough in the bowl to butter the top, cover with a towel and allow to rise for 1 hour. Punch down, make favorite roll shape and allow to rise, then bake in a 400 degree oven for 12 to 15 minutes or until golden. Makes 16 rolls.

### REFRIGERATOR ROLLS

- ¾ cup milk
- 3½ tablespoons sugar
- 1 packet active dry yeast
- 1 egg
- 3½ tablespoons butter
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ cup lukewarm water
- 3 to 3¼ cups flour

In a saucepan, heat milk with butter until melted. Cool to lukewarm. Stir in sugar and salt. In a mixing bowl, dissolve yeast in water, let stand 5 minutes. Beat egg and milk mixture into yeast. Beat in 3 cups flour. Beat well.

Place dough in a well-greased bowl. Turn dough to cover, then wrap with plastic wrap and place a plate with a weight on it on top of it in the refrigerator for up to 5 days.

To use: remove as much dough as needed and prepare the rolls and allow to rise until doubled in bulk, about 1 hour. Preheat oven to 425 degrees, glaze rolls as desired and bake for 12 to 15 minutes or until golden. Makes 16 rolls.

# Apple pie tastes down-home good

Thumb through any old cook-book, and you'll find those wonderful homey dishes — cobblers and crisps, pandowdies and crumbles, shortcakes, deep-dish pies and upside-down cake. These are the kind of the desserts we turn to when we need comforting or nostalgic taste of the past.

In great-grandma's day, most of these down-home desserts were made with whatever fruit was in season combined with ingredients that happened to be on hand. Neither precise measurements nor sophisticated cooking skills were needed.

The "recipes" were passed down from mother to daughter, usually by word of mouth.

Today, many of these old-fashioned favorites are again popular, and for good reason. All are relatively easy to make and a delicious excuse to pair ripe seasonal fruits with wholesome grains like oats.

Oats are a natural ingredient for baking. They're inexpensive, a tasty source of vitamins, minerals and fiber, and even easier to measure than flour. When combined with brown sugar and butter or margarine, oats provide the "crust" in an apple or cherry crisp. They add texture and flavor to batters for cobblers, pandowdies and cakes, and oats can replace some of the flour in pie crusts, too.

Easy Apple Custard Pie, developed in the Quaker Kitchens, uses a pat-in-the-pan oat crust that's very simple to make and tastes just like an oatmeal cookie. There's no top crust to roll either. An oat streusel topping is sprinkled over the apples before baking. Choose a sweet-tart cooking apple like Granny Smith or Jonathan, and if you happen to be watching fat and cholesterol, light sour cream and egg whites can be used in the filling. Use either quick or old fashioned oats. The old fashioned oats will provide more texture.

## EASY APPLE CUSTARD PIE

- crust:**  
 1 1/4 cups all purpose flour  
 1/2 cup oats (quick or old fashioned, uncooked)  
 1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar  
 1/2 teaspoon salt (optional)  
 1/2 cup (1 stick) margarine or butter, melted  
 1 tablespoon water  
 1 teaspoon vanilla
- Filling:**  
 One 8-ounce carton lite sour cream or sour cream  
 2/3 cup firmly packed brown sugar  
 1/4 cup all-purpose flour  
 4 egg whites or 2 eggs, slightly beaten  
 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg  
 4 cups peeled, thinly sliced apples
- Topping:**  
 1/2 cup oats (quick or old fashioned, uncooked)

Heat oven to 375 degrees. For crust, combine dry ingredients. Add margarine, water and vanilla; mix well. Press firmly onto bottom and sides of a 9-inch glass pie plate, forming 1/4-inch rim around edges. Bake 12 to 15 minutes or until light golden brown. Cool.

For filling, combine sour cream, brown sugar, flour, eggs, cinnamon and nutmeg; toss with apples. Arrange in crust.

For topping, combine dry ingredients; cut in margarine until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Sprinkle over filling. Bake 50 to 60 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Serve warm or chilled; refrigerate leftovers. Serves 8.

Trim separable fat from beef; partially freeze meat. Cut meat across the grain into thin bite-size strips.

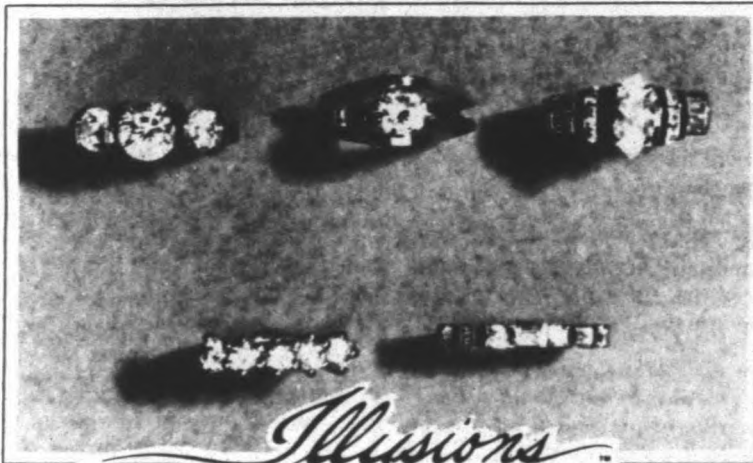

## Skin serves as his canvas

From Pegasus the winged horse of Greek mythology to American eagles, beautiful women and dragons, artist "Tatu Dan" Collins has captured them all on skin.

"If you can imagine it, it can be illustrated on skin," Collins said. "Death figures, butterflies, nipples on male burn victims, I've done them all. I've even done permanent eyeliner and lips."

Now in his second decade of tattooing Collins, who has no formal art training except for high school art classes, estimates he has done more than 50,000 tattoos. He creates his own designs in four basic styles: tribalism, traditional, American and Japanese.

"I prefer American fine line, black and gray work; it's more detailed," the Canton Township resident said. "You get a lot more realism out of it."

The art of tattooing hails back to the Egyptian times. Tattoos found on mummies date back to around 2000 B.C. Polynesians used tattoos to denote social standing and for purposes, erotic and decorative. For New Guinea women, tattoos were a sign of beauty.

Doctors, lawyers, officers of the law, musicians, bikers, burn victims, and even dermatologists have walked away with body art by Collins. Many are repeat customers. Some of them are new customers, needing cover-ups of bad designs done by other tattoo artists.

"Half of all the collectors I tattoo are women," he said. "I think women wear them to be sexy. Men wear them to be macho."

"You could ask a thousand different people and get a thousand answers. They're all art collectors. It's a need to express themselves. It's often been called the signature of the soul."

Collins said his mother knew he'd eventually become an artist, when he began drawing at two years old. At age 13, Collins created his first tattoo in Eskimo fashion on himself using string, thread and India ink. By 15, he had his first professional tattoo. After serving in the U.S. Marine Corps, he lived for 5½ years in Hawaii learning the art and practicing it.

"There's no Gemini School of Tattooing," he said. "You learn by apprenticing and picking the artist's brain whose doing it."

Collins has worked at several area tattoo parlors and for two years had his own shop, "Tattoos by Tatu Dan" in Taylor.

"It's the most personal art form there is, to have your canvas smile back at you and say thanks; it looks great," he said. "A sculptor doesn't get that, an airbrush artist doesn't."

Collins has created a collage of beautiful women running the entire length of Dean Haworth's left arm. There's even a portrait of Haworth's mother.

"I like the way it looks on my body," said the Allen Park resident who got his first tattoo in 1986. "I'm into the art of it. I'm into the beauty of it. I have it on my walls, but I have it on my body, too."

Haworth says his tattoos serve as a good indicator of the types of people he meets.

"People have a different attitude when you have tattoos," he said. "There's a stigmatism attached or bigotry against people with tattoos."

In the last six months, Collins has taken on a new format — that of ink and colored pencil on paper. In November his works on paper were exhibited as part of a group show at Nelson's Gallery in Livonia. Viking girls once found only on skin, now smile back from behind glass. Many of the works are takeoffs on tattoos he designed after woodblock prints by Japanese artist Utagawa Kuniyoshi (1797-1861) for the epic novel "The Water Margin Heroes."

"The detailing he puts in, you just don't see this art every day. There is history behind it. It's been around hundreds of years," said gallery director Laura Hardy.

Collins said he's grateful to Hardy for the opportunities she's given him and his art.

## Live performance is the 'cure'

There was a time when The Incurables played at any place that would let them, when they were labeled as playing hard rock and oldies. Times have changed and the group has carved out a niche for its high energy sounds.

The Incurables they are, immortals they are not.

The four-member group which prides itself on its high energy performances, usually obtains wounds as a result.

"We've acquired a number of bodily injuries just from adrenaline and running into walls," said Pat Kelly, guitarist/vocalist.

"I jumped off stage, I miscalculated . . . and I ran into a mirrored wall . . . I came up with two permanently scarred knees," bassist Ray

Lawson said with a laugh. "I hit a ceiling before, I misjumped one time and kind of hit it."

"I don't want to give you the impression we are slammers or anything or we smash our equipment type stuff," said Kelly. "It's all just internal adrenalin, opposed to externally produced, this is all self induced-produced."

The power they generate when performing has been captured onto a seven-single cassette, "The Incurables," which is being sold independently.

The group will be hosting a release party at Reiser's Keyboard Lounge, 1870 S. Wayne Road, Westland, Saturday, Feb. 13.

The idea for their second release is to solely capture their live performance strength for their fans to enjoy at home.

"We're very energetic on stage," said Ray. "We like to move around and like to get into the music."

"The music actually gets into us, that's how it has always been," Kelly added. "We have been real true to our music and that's what we do: that's where our energy is. We go deep inside of our music and it explodes back out of us."

"The Incurables" follows their first release, "Look in Your Mind," by two years. The latter has found

itself on local radio stations' playlists. The latest release took eight months to record at the Tempermill in Ferndale and will launch the group onto a new rock'n'roll highway.

"We didn't get to the point that all songs had the same sounds," said drummer Darrin Lawson. "This is aimed at the younger audience, the college audience. The first one was more poppier and it appealed to a number of people."

The group has been schooled in students' dislikes and likes by playing fraternity parties. The group feels that such crowds are more open to their performances, which include cover tunes and original songs, and get as consumed into the music and performances as the band does, said rhythm guitarist Chuck Byberg.

"We have played without our pants and people took off their pants," Byberg said.

"It's a great feeling when you look out and see the crowd mouth the words to songs even I can't remember," Kelly added.

Playing fraternity parties and bars is a long way from the conception of the group when Kelly and Ray Lawson started playing when they were students at Wayne Memorial High School.

"We would play any place that would let us — a lot of benefits and a lot of hotel lounges," Kelly said. "We did a lot of audition night-type things. We'd play until we found a

song they liked and then play it over and over."

"We started playing oldies," Ray Lawson said. "'13th Floor Elevator,' 'Mr. Magoo' — a lot of alternative oldies."

"There wasn't much classification at the time," Kelly said. "You were either heavy metal, you were country or you were this oldies music they called it. Some how they stuck us with these guys and we'd have a lot of trouble because with playing these bars and places they would go 'You guys are hard rock,' and we'd go to clubs that played hard rock and they'd go 'You guys are playing oldies.'"

"Fortunately music changed and we pretty much stuck with our roots and stuck with our music and the world caught up with us."

The Incurables have had more member changes than diseases cured this century, but Ray's cousin Darrin joined the group five years ago, followed three years later by Byberg to create today's line-up and sound.

"I would have to say if you have to

classify our music into a style we now would be alternative-pop with a hard edge," Ray said.

Friendship is the key to their existence.

"It's like we are married," Darrin said.

"I'd consider this a marriage with these guys in the band. A more solid and stable and honest marriage than my previous one," Ray said. "We are committed to a goal. We would like to have a major record contract, but we are not going to be blinded by that. We are going to have fun in the mean time."

Fun means playing roughly four gigs per month this winter and spring, going back into the studio in the fall and having a new release by winter, but still maintaining a focus on their music.

"It's a need . . . You can be a good musician and play in your basement all your life until you're dead. We want more than that," Kelly said.

"We're looking to make the most out of all we are doing now," Darrin added.

## Rembrandts master art of acoustic play

The Rembrandts hope to storm into Detroit for their show on Saturday, Feb. 13, at St. Andrew's Hall. Hopefully Mother Nature won't take the pop band's intentions too seriously this time.

"We were supposed to have this huge show last time but there was a big snow storm," said member Phil Solem who along with Danny Wilde makes up the Rembrandts. "We managed to show up. Only about 50 people showed up. I couldn't blame the (other) people for not coming though."

For this show, the Rembrandts are planning a "humongous, variety, action-packed show."

"We decided to go all the way . . . spend all the cash."

That includes hiring an eight-piece band including two cellists, and an accordion player, Michael Ramos,

who has played with the Bo Deans. Solem said carting along a large band is the result of "acoustic show overkill."

"It's probably a knee-jerk reaction to the fact that we've been doing so many acoustic gigs. Once you do an acoustic show, everybody lines up to get you to do one," Solem said in an interview from his Golden Valley, Minn., home. "We've done about 18 quadrillion acoustic gigs. You won't soon hear us a cappella."

This "plugged-in" tour, promoting their artistically named album "Untitled," will take the Rembrandts throughout the United States and possibly to Europe. Solem said it doesn't really matter where the band plays because they can't go sight-seeing anyway.

"When you actually get into the thick of it, all you see are the insides of hotel rooms and sitting in a room doing interviews for 12 hours," Solem

said. "The most amazing things in the world are at your fingertips, but you aren't allowed to touch them."

One thing the duo almost did get to see was a Rembrandt exhibit at a Detroit-area art museum.

"We passed by this museum that had a Rembrandt exhibit. One of our reps said, 'Oh, I want to take pictures of you around the signs.' He pulls over and he got out the camera and stuff. Got us posing around the museum and the entrance hall," Solem said.

"The (guard) wouldn't let us into the exhibit. He didn't seem to care that we were the Rembrandts."

"It turned out he didn't have any film in the camera."

The Rembrandts perform Saturday, Feb. 13, at St. Andrew's Hall, 431 E. Congress, Detroit. Doors open at 9 p.m. Must be 18 or older to enter. Call 961-MELT for more information.

# Grier may be funny, but he's not a 'comic'

Comedy has made David Alan Grier famous but don't call this native Detroit a comic.

"I consider myself an actor," says Grier unequivocally.

And an actor he most certainly is. Grier graduated from the University of Michigan and proceeded on to the Yale School of Drama where he played serious roles. After receiving a master's degree from Yale, Grier headed for Broadway and a critically acclaimed role in "The First," a musical based on the life of baseball's color barrier breaker Jackie Robinson. His portrayal of the legendary Robinson earned him a Tony nomination in 1981.

A couple of years later, Grier starred with a little known actor named Denzel Washington in an off-Broadway production of "A Soldier's Play," which led to his big screen debut in the movie version, "A Soldier's Story."

With an acting resume like that, how did Grier take a left turn and end up doing comedy, both on the live stage and as part of the phenomenally successful television ensemble on Fox's "In Living Color?" It was certainly not something he ever yearned for or expected.

"Never," said Grier when asked if he had even thought about life in comedy during his student days.

"I wanted to be a Shakespearean actor," he said. "I wanted to play Othello. I never thought I'd play the Apollo, let alone play it as a comedy act."

Grier admitted that he did do something resembling comedy on a stage in Connecticut during his Yale days, but did nothing else with it. However, he did meet an actor named Robert Townsend during the filming of "A Soldier's Story," and Townsend later went on to success on the comedy stage and with the film spoof "Hollywood Shuffle."

It was Townsend who dared Grier to try his hand at stand-up, which caught the attention of Keenan Ivory Wayans. As a result, Grier was cast in Wayans' film "I'm Gonna Get You Sucks" and later his television project that was being proposed for the then fledgling Fox network.

"In Living Color" became one of Fox's biggest hits, an edgy ensemble show with an incredible array of characters who quickly became household words. Among Grier's notable characters on the show are blues singer Calhoun Tubbs and Antoine Merriweather of the "Men on . . ." sketches.

"I never imagined a character like Antoine would get so big," Grier said of the overtly gay character. "We were amazed it cleared the censors. With a sketch show like ours, there's a fine line between edgy and crude."

Lately, the show has fallen into a state of internal disarray. Keenan Ivory Wayans, the show's creator and executive producer, quit the show in December over a dispute with Fox. Damon Wayans, Keenan's brother and a star in his own right in films like "Mo'Nasty" and "The Last Boy Scout," made only a few guest appearances this season and has also left.

Tommy Davidson, another founding cast member, is reportedly on hiatus. The remaining cast members and a few newer players, most notably Jamie Foxx, are continuing to tape new shows with the show's trio of head writer's now promoted to co-executive producers.

"Everywhere I go, people ask if we're still on the air," Grier said of the sticky situation. "There is a perception that our show is already over. Fox needs to tell the public that we're still alive and functioning."

"From a business standpoint, they need our show. Fox has launched 15 new shows this year and all of them have bombed except for 'Martin.'"

Grier is sorry to see Keenan

leave, but knows he has plenty to fall back on if "In Living Color" does not continue. Contractually obligated to one more season of "Color," he has a movie script being written for him that Eddie Murphy wants to produce — pay-backs for last summer's "Boomerang," a film in which Murphy, Grier and Martin Lawrence of "Martin" starred.

He also is in the process of developing a television pilot and spends a number of days on the stand-up trail, playing large theaters (he came home to The Fox on New Year's Day). And, finally, if time permits, he'd like to do a serious role again.

"I would love to do a play," Grier said, "but I don't want to do a remake of 'On the Waterfront.'"

# We have responsibility to kids and law

This is from voice mail: Barbara, The following is not so much a question as it is a comment, an angry comment at that. Zoe Baird withdrew from consideration as attorney general of the United States because of the public outcry she provoked by hiring undocumented workers to care for her child and her home. Some years ago when both my children and I were younger, I had the same problem and I solved it the same way. I am a professional woman as is Zoe Baird; I have been listening to self-righteous anger all around me and now I need to express some myself. When I chose the woman who cares for my children I did it because it was obvious that she could love my children better than anyone else I interviewed. I hated breaking a law, but I valued my children's welfare more than any other consideration. I was not in a position to take off a month or two to find another person that would fit all the qualifications, and so I did what was best for my children at that time. The woman without the green

card stayed with me for some time. Sometimes, because of guilt, I would think of finding someone else, but my children really loved her, and so I felt I couldn't disrupt their security. All of this time I was suffering from the added guilt of knowing that I was not home with my children myself. I cannot be sure of Zoe Baird's motivation in this matter, but I do know there are many out there like me struggle to make good choices in a tough world where sometimes none exist.

### Working Mom

Dear Working Mom, Thank you for your comments; I am happy to print them. I hope you will think about this response although you may not like it. The controversy over whether or not to hire illegal workers when it is the very best care you can find for your children is many faceted. I'll address only the morality issue and not the political or legal ones. Let's say we accept Zoe Baird's claim that she is "acting as a mother" when she hired undocumented workers. By that behavior she implies that her moral responsibility to her child was greater than her moral responsibility to uphold the law. Do not misunderstand, there is no way to know if her defense was the truth. I am us-

ing this as the premise because it is what you felt the need to do, put your children's needs above the law.

Since the fallout from the feminist movement began to define our gender differences there has been research on the differences in morality between men and women. In some of these studies, men have been seen as more moral than women because they were more likely to base their moral choices on rules and on universal principles than were women.

Women were more likely to base their moral choices on caring for others and on responsibility in relationships. Men are seen as being worried about interfering with each others' rights while women worry about not helping others when they could have.

It is an oversimplification but still true to say that the reason given for this is that because women bear children they are more concerned with closeness than with independence. The conclusion of these research studies is that we shouldn't think of one kind of morality, adherence to rules, as being better than another kind of morality, responsibility in relationships. The studies say that yes, they are different, but that one is not better than the other.

It is a tribute to women that the opposition to Zoe Baird didn't divide by gender. As many women were outraged by her behavior as were men. They were saying that what is right for the gander is right for the goose, too. They don't want special consideration because of the added responsibility of bearing children.

Morality by its very definition is not what we do because it fits the situation at the time but what we do because it is correct or right no matter how hard it is. What do we teach our children when we break the law so that their lives can be easier?

That does not mean that even honest men and women will not continue to make pragmatic decisions that will break the law. It does mean that we cannot take the moral highground when we do so. It also means that we must necessarily take the consequences for our behavior. It was appropriate that Zoe Baird wasn't given the role of top law enforcer in our land.

# American remake of 'The Vanishing' retains dark spirit

I wasn't the only one to place "The Vanishing" on my list of 1991's 10 best releases. The obscure Dutch thriller, which screened locally at the Detroit Film Theatre, was unanimously hailed as a clever, uncompromisingly dark film that delivered one of the screen's most chilling final images.

Hollywood has now remade "The Vanishing," importing director George Sluizer and retaining much of the same spirit that made the original so captivating.

## MOVIES

Of course, there have been compromises. Given a budget probably 100 times larger than the original's, Sluizer has softened both the message and the ending for American consumption. It still provides ample intelligence, wit and psychological horror.

Both movies stick to the same intriguing premise. Jeff and Diane, young lovers on vacation in Washington state, pull over at a roadside rest stop. She goes inside to use the bathroom, and when

she doesn't return a half hour later, Jeff is suspicious. As night falls, he's downright frantic. Three years later, his job lost and sanity in question, he still searches for clues to her whereabouts.

By this time, Jeff hardly cares whether Diane is alive or dead. His obsession lies solely in learning the truth. "Instead of a chance that she's alive somewhere without me knowing it," he says in anguish, "I'd rather have her dead and discover what happened to her."

Where Sluizer's original kept us guessing along with Jeff, the

remake introduces the madman responsible during the opening credits. The message is no longer that the most normal-looking family man might have, for no reason at all, swiped your girlfriend.

Barney, played here by Jeff Bridges, now becomes a run-of-the-mill American psycho, a chemistry professor who spoofs his teenage daughter with a picnic basket full of spiders and drops flies into chemical-filled petri dishes. With locks of long, curly hair falling into his face, Bridges plays him overly affected and eccentric.

Kiefer Sutherland, however, makes a convincing man obsessed. He tries to start a new life with a new love, Rita (Nancy Travis), but the relationship is haunted by reminders of Diane (Sandra Bullock). Just when he thinks the demons of the past have been exorcised, Jeff receives a message from Barney offering him a chance to find out exactly what happened to his love, but with one little catch.

For his more exciting, though contrived, climax Sluizer inserts some of Hitchcock's red herrings. We know the loaded gun Jeff

keeps hidden in his apartment will surface again. Other bits of information are introduced but never mentioned, such as Rita's comment that she knew Jeff in high school.

The best thing about Sluizer's handling of "The Vanishing" is the sparseness of style. After some shaky camerawork to accentuate Jeff's panic early on, he sticks to the ordinary and natural in subtly stylized compositions. Most importantly, he realizes that horror doesn't always rely on graphic special effects. True horror exists in the imagination.

SC stuns Mott CC

At least once every season, it happens. It was Mott CC's turn this time.

The Bears probably came into Wednesday's men's basketball game at Schoolcraft College with confidence. After all, they were atop the Eastern Conference; SC was at the bottom.

Add to that their superior depth — Mott had 10 players, SC six — and SC's recent struggles (five straight losses, most by lopsided margins), and the outlook for a rout seemed bright.

Surprise! The Ocelots pulled off a shocking upset in dramatic fashion, 85-83, on a three-pointer at the buzzer by Mohammed Abdrabbob Wednesday at SC.

The defeat dropped Mott (16-6 overall, 9-3 in the conference) into a virtual tie for first with Oakland CC and Macomb CC, all with three losses. SC is 2-10 in the conference, 6-16 overall.

The game's final seconds were as improbable as SC's being in the game at all. After all, the Ocelots had been blown out by 40 points by OCC four days earlier.

But they had Jarvis Murray back, an all-conference center last season. Murray missed seven straight games because he had to rewrite an English assignment to complete a first-semester class. SC was 1-6 without him.

Shawn Branum was missing, though, after suffering a broken nose against OCC and having surgery Tuesday. Branum is expected back for Wednesday's game at Alpena CC.

The Murray-led Ocelots built a 43-33 lead by halftime and increased it to 19 points with just under 11 minutes left in the game.

That's when the Bears rediscovered their shooting touch, hitting five straight three-point shots in a 15-4 run. Ron Thompson had three of those; he scored 16 points.

A Kevin Polite triple trimmed SC's lead to 82-81 with less than a minute left. The Ocelots were struggling; they were 0-for-6 from the free throw line in the last two minutes. Steve Whitlow missed two with 12 seconds left.

Then Abdrabbob fouled Kevin Preteet, the conference's leading scorer (SC held him to 12 points). With eight seconds left, Preteet sank both free throws to put Mott ahead, 83-82, its first lead since early in game.

SC got the ball to half-court and called timeout with four seconds left to set up a play with Murray as the first option. "We just wanted to get the ball inbound, drive to the basket and get fouled or something," said coach Dave Bogataj.

But Abdrabbob couldn't inbound the ball. In desperation he tossed it to Whitlow, who was barely able to keep from going out of bounds before passing back to Abdrabbob. Abdrabbob's long shot banked off the glass and went in — the win belonged to SC.

Murray sparkled in his return engagement, scoring 29 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. Abdrabbob had 22 points, and Whitlow and LaMonte Fondren scored 15 apiece. Fondren had 10 boards, and Whitlow dished out six assists. Vince Turner had nine assists.

Polite's 18 points was best for Mott. Jeremy Trent had 11 and Derrick Wyatt scored 10.

It was another in a long line of upsets for SC, which two years ago knocked Macomb out of first.

How many more wins can SC muster? Impossible to tell, but few will be this surprising.

SC women peaking

When they needed it most, the Lady Ocelots got a superior performance from point guard Becky Piotrchowski.

Trailing by a basket with 25 seconds left in regulation, Piotrchowski nailed a jumper to tie Wednesday's game at Mott CC at 69-all and send it into overtime. She then scored all eight of the Lady Ocelots' OT points to lift them to a 79-77 victory.

It was SC's second-straight Eastern Conference win, improving its record to 3-8 (9-10 overall). Mott fell into a tie with SC for the conference's final playoff spot at 3-8.

"We're peaking at the right time," said Lady Ocelot coach Jack Grenan. "We had to have this."

They got it, thanks to Piotrchowski's 23 points, 21 more from Dana Hudson and 18 from 5-10 freshman center Alisa Wechter, who played all 45 minutes. Mott got 21 points from Amy Fabat.

SC, which led 42-34 at the half, didn't help itself at the free throw line, converting just 4-of-13 to Mott's 14-of-22. But the Lady Ocelot defense was tough enough — they twice forced five-second calls in the last five minutes of regulation.

Record run

Going into last weekend's games, at home against Michigan and Michigan State, Illinois senior point guard Jill Estey (from Plymouth Salem) was nine short of the school career record for assists. Estey is averaging 5.7 assists per game this season and has 498 for her career. The Illinois record is 507, held by Jenny Johnson.

One reason for Estey's record-setting performance is her durability. Although only 5-4, she's started 91 consecutive games for the Fighting Illini. She's also averaging 9.4 points and a team-best 2.3 steals. Estey already holds the Illini career record for steals with 229.

Illinois was 7-10 overall and 2-6 in the Big Ten going into the weekend's games. Before her career ends, Estey could move up as high as sixth on the Big Ten's career assist list.

CC wins, Spano MVP at Observer

Traditional high school wrestling power Redford Catholic Central was in the familiar role of champion in the Observerland tournament.

Redford Catholic Central regained some of its old glory and returned to wrestling prominence Saturday in the second annual Observer Tournament.

The Shamrocks, following a couple of down years, put six wrestlers in the championship round and were assured of winning the team title before the finals were contested.

CC, which placed fifth in the first tournament, scored 204 points to finish ahead of Westland John Glenn, Livonia Stevenson, Plymouth Salem and host Garden City.

"We decided we would win one instead of getting beat on all the time," CC coach Mike Rodriguez said. "We

The Eagles kept pace in the first quarter, trailing 21-19, but fell behind 34-25 at halftime. Roeper turned an 11-point lead after three quarters into a

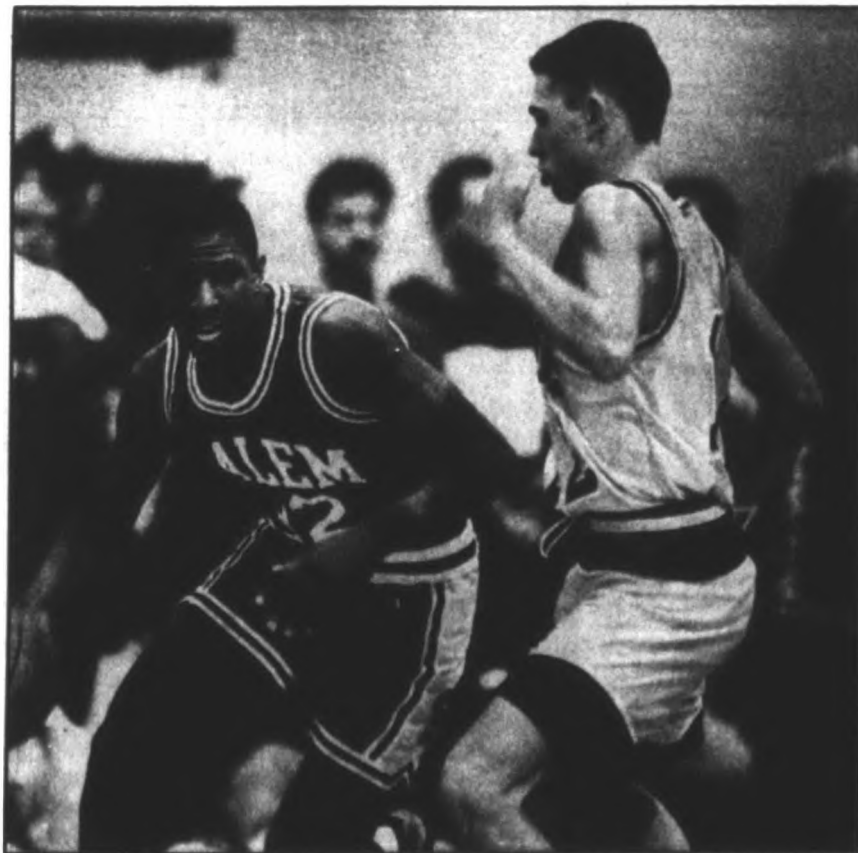
runaway victory with a 21-10 margin in the finale.

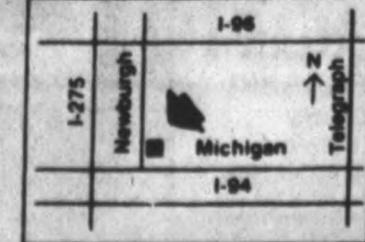
