# Tuesday vote cuts city field to 8



Eight of nine candidates for city commission will survive Tuesday's primary in the City of Plymouth and move on to the November general election. A 20-percent turnout is expected. Four seats on the commission are up for grabs.

It's been said that the city commission primary election on Tuesday won't decide a whole lot — but tell that to the candidate who'll be eliminated from the race.

City voters are asked to choose

eight of the nine candidates running for city commission in the primary.

The eight who survive the primary go on to a November general election, where four will win election to the commission.

City clerk Linda Langmesser predicts that about 20 percent of regis-

tered voters will turn out, as typical for primary elections in Plymouth.

"We've got 610 absentee ballots that have been issued and I've only got a third of them back," Langmesser said Friday.

While turnout is typically low for a primary, it rises to 30-35 percent for a general election in November, she said.

The candidates are:  
 ■ Michael Caffery, events coordinator for the Michigan Boating Industries Association who ran unsuccessfully in November as a Democrat for

the Wayne County Commission.  
 ■ Stella Greene, appointed to the city commission earlier this year and a former downtown development authority co-chairwoman who cites experience in community affairs, background in financial matters, and a desire to contribute.

■ Ron Loisel, partner in a Plymouth public accounting and condo property management firm. The former city commissioner cites his financial background and experience as

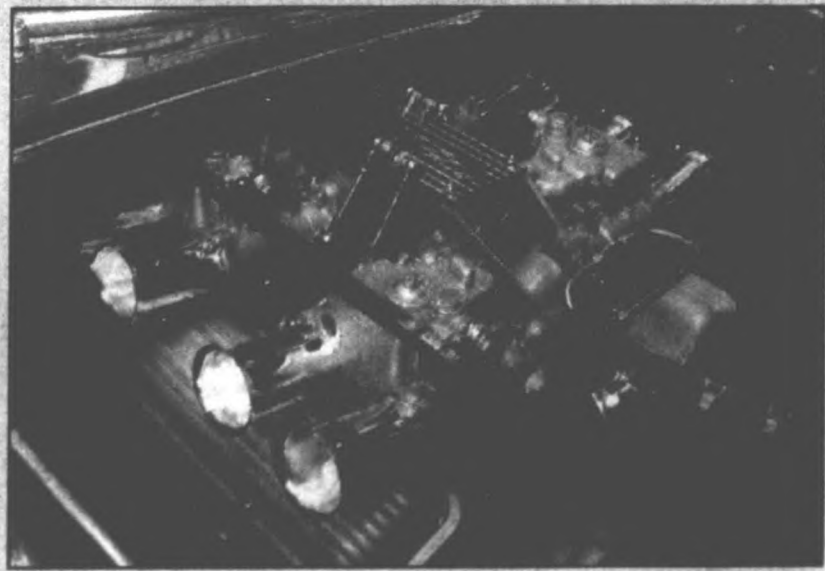
## Spyder spins into car show

# Cheers to charity

## Bar rivalry scores for good cause

Until now, the most famous bar rivalry pitted the TV "Cheers" pub against arch-rival Gary's Old Town Tavern.

But when the Lakepoint Yacht Club plays the Beaver Creek Tackle and Beer tavern in a softball game in Hines Park at Haggerty Road in Plymouth Township, the winners will be two charities.

Donations raised by the Lakepoint Yacht Club will benefit the Make A Wish Foundation, which uses proceeds to pay for fun

activities for kids diagnosed with terminal illness.

Donations raised by Beaver Creek will benefit the March of Dimes, said bartender Corinna Bennett.

Noon on Sunday, Aug. 15, marks the time for the 2nd Annual Charity Softball Game organized by wait staffs of the two establishments, the Yacht Club in Livonia and Beaver Creek in Westland.

The first time around, "We decided to play for the March of Dimes," said Melissa Mantay, a Lakepoint Yacht Club waitress.

This year, "We wanted to do

something different," she said, so their portion of proceeds are going to the Make A Wish Foundation.

Bennett said the idea for the two bars to play each other in a softball game originated last year.

"Then, one of our employees said, 'Why don't we do it for charity?'" she recalled.

The number of participating bars has grown to include Frankie's, Malarky's Pub and Jimmy's Next Door.

All participating taverns will donate refreshments and hot dogs.

Pledges are being accepted at the taverns, at the softball game,

a property manager, saying his objective is to maintain services at low cost.

Glen Mackie, a product planner for Ford Motor Co. who cites a need for Plymouth's younger families to have representation on the city commission.

David McDonald, a retired U.S. Army colonel who directs an ROTC program in Redford, who cites a lifelong dedication to public service and a desire to have city government do things "cheaper and smarter."

Douglas Miller, assistant director of pharmacy services at Henry Ford Hospital and professor of pharmacy at Wayne State University. The current city commissioner headed a downtown parking study committee, and he cites a desire to complete projects now under way and improve the commercial and industrial tax base.

Tom Prose, a medical doctor and vice chairman of the city planning commission. He cites a concern with the community, a need to review the level of service now provided by the police department and a review of city services based on costs and who uses them.

Rosita Smith, a city planning commissioner, member of the parking study committee and activist in environmental issues. She cites a desire to help decide issues coming before the commission and finding more ways to cut the city budget.

John Voe, a senior partner of the law firm Sommers, Schwartz, Silver & Schwartz. The current city commissioner cites experience, a desire to represent all residents, downtown revitalization, working toward shared services with other communities and giving "non-residents an equal opportunity to share in the expenses of the cultural center like we do."

Voters in precincts 1, 4 and 5 vote at the Plymouth Cultural Center, 525 Farmer.

Voters in precinct 2 vote at Starkweather School, 550 N. Holbrook, and precinct 3 voters vote at Central school, 650 W. Church.

Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. Langmesser said people may vote by absentee ballot before 5 p.m. today, or for an emergency reason on voting day Tuesday.

# Unemployment up, but below '92

Unemployment rates in Plymouth and Canton rose slightly in May compared to April levels, but are still below rates recorded for May 1992.

In the City of Plymouth, the May unemployment rate was 1.9 percent, up from 1.8 percent reported in April. The May 1992 unemployment rate was 2.3 percent.

In Plymouth Township, the May unemployment rate was 2.3

percent, up from 2.2 percent reported in April but below the 2.8-percent unemployment rate recorded in May 1992.

In Canton, the May rate was 2.8 percent, up from 2.7 percent in April and 3.4 percent recorded in May 1992.

The Michigan Employment Securities Commission, which compiles unemployment rates, reported that the number of Michi-

gan workers with jobs set a record in May for the second straight month, despite an increase of three-tenths of a percentage point in the state's seasonally adjusted jobless rate.

"In May, Michigan experienced a typical pattern of labor force and employment growth as workers, including many youth, began entering the job market in search of seasonal jobs which become

more plentiful as we approach the summer season," said MESC director F. Robert Edwards.

Among the industries reporting hiring gains in May were construction, services, agriculture and local government.

Local government employment rose as seasonal jobs opened at municipal parks and golf courses. Retail employment reported its normal seasonal hiring increases, the MESC reported.

and minimum sizes for districts. They don't talk about a maximum size. There's a floor, but not a top end. Maybe some of our districts are too large; just maybe.

"The legislature has to start listening. They listen, then go off and do what they want, but they don't hear us," said Thomas. "School districts have asked for years for effective strike legislation. We haven't gotten anything yet."

Vorva says major change is

needed, and must be decided upon before financing is. "How do you talk about financing, when you don't know what you're going to finance? What we had before is not fundable, and not defensible, because all this system creates is spiraling costs. We have 1,300 fewer students in the Plymouth-Canton district than we did 10 years ago, it costs tons of more dollars per student, and the results are worse."

Vorva said he will soon announce public forums in the com-

munity where educational issues will be discussed.

He has several money-saving ideas to propose. One would be taxing retirement earnings of state employees and teachers, who currently are exempted. Another would lessen insurance costs for teachers by bidding out contracts. A third would consolidate districts and perhaps eliminate intermediate school districts.

Vorva, who donated his last pay raise to charity, also is proposing

a unicameral legislature, with just one body, rather than a house and senate.

"I am willing to give up my own job to make government responsive and the proper size. How many people in the school system are willing to do that? How many of them are going to come forward with ideas, pointing to waste and inefficiency? No, their answer is, 'I need more money, and another level of administration.' 'I'm willing to redesign government altogether. Are they?'"

35 coats of hand-rubbed lacquer, it's been re-chromed, re-polished," he said.

Sassak, who invents toys for a living, said only two of the cars were built by Ferrari engineer Giotto Bizzarrini. It was featured in Road and Track in 1988.

Sassak's father, John Sassak, knew a former Bizzarrini investor who lived in Detroit, and bought the car from him.

"He sold it to my brother John Jr. in 1969; I bought it in 1971," said Sassak, who "thoroughly enjoyed driving the car for 10 years before undertaking a full restoration," completed in 1988.

Bizzarrini was at the peak of his career and had put his lifetime of engineering, design and race know-how into the car, Sassak said.

Bizzarrini's claim to fame was that when he worked for Ferrari in the 1950s, he designed the original Ferrari GTO. The competition race car "was winning most of the races back in the '60s," Sassak said.

The designer then left Ferrari with six other engineers and started his own company in Italy. "He was a great engineer, but he did not have the business sense," Sassak said.

Among unique features of the Spyder is its roof design. "It can be transformed from a coupe to a T-top, to a Targa top, then into a

full convertible," he said.

"The cockpit was filled with Italian leather, fine polished wood, wool carpeting, all complementing the precise row of Veglia instruments," Sassak continued. At the 1988 Meadowbrook Concours d'Elegance show in Rochester, the car won Best Sports Car in two classes over 35 other cars.

Sassak said the car has been popular in other shows, including this year's Pebble Beach, Calif. Concours d'Elegance, where it won an award in the postwar Italian coachwork class.

The Bizzarrini Spyder had a 327 horsepower Chevrolet Corvette engine, modified so it has 400 horsepower.

"He took a race car and put it on the street and sold it as a semi-production car," Sassak said.

The show is scheduled for 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 8 at Meadow Brook Hall. Other Plymouth and Canton car owners are participating in the show.

# Adoptees learn of homeland

"Han nyung ha seh yo" does not pop up often in conversations among American children — except at a new Korean culture camp, where the greeting was exchanged frequently.

In fact, the word "hello" was banned for the week so that the students would learn to greet each other the Korean way: with those words and a deep, polite bow.

Nearly 90 children adopted from Korean families learned about their heritage at the summer camp this month at the Korean Presbyterian Church in Southfield.

"We have them learn that first because it is very important to be able to greet people in the Korean culture. And we want to make sure they learn to speak (Korean) here because they never will at home," director Clara Nam said on the last day of camp, July 16. She was surrounded by children enthusiastically polishing newly learned Tae Kwon Do routines, putting the last few strokes on theater masks, and preparing Kim Bob, a Korean rice and seaweed sandwich.

For Nam, that enthusiasm was a sign that the camp's goal — to give adopted Korean children a sense of their past and make it a source of pride — had been met.

Stepping into the basement of the church, which volunteered its building for the camp, was a little like taking a quick trip to Korea. Children sang songs, played games and painted calligraphy in groups. Many wore traditional clothing. Brigit Fitzgerald, 6, of Plymouth, showed off her bright, colorfully embroidered Korean dress for the closing ceremony.

"I like my dress. It's pretty. It makes me feel like Korea," Brigit said.

Most children said they learned to really like having a Korean heritage, but Nam pointed to another interesting aspect of the camp, where others learned what it was like to be in the minority or feel out of place.

Nam referred to the many siblings, who are not Korean, but participated in the camp to better understand their brother's or sister's culture. Parents said enrolling all the children was a valuable experience for the whole family.

Ed Grima of Livonia said the experience has been good for both of his daughters; one is biological, one is Korean.

"They come home every day singing Korean songs and they seem to have an idea of what they are singing about," Grima, father of Stephanie, 9, and Jennifer, 7, said. "We want to make sure (Stephanie) learns about her culture and this was a good way."

Helen Detrych of Northville also has a biological and a Korean-adopted child in her family and said her biological son, Nicholas, 7, has learned how Christopher, 8, feels living in a culture where he looks different than most.

"I thought it would be a good experience for Nicholas from the perspective of being a Caucasian in a room filled with children different from himself . . . It gives him a sense of what Christopher feels like, a chance to look through his eyes," Detrych said.

Nam said the fact that Korean-adopted children look different from their American parents and siblings makes the camp even more important for developing a

strong sense of self and pride.

"That is the first thing people notice when the family is introduced. They look different from their parents and they can't blend, so we want them to feel comfortable with who they are," she said.

Parents said, enthusiastically, that the entire camp was an excellent pride and awareness experience for their children, especially Deborah Corey of Rochester, who said it has made her son Tynan Min, 6½, interested in his history. "Because of this experience, he is now getting really interested in his culture," she said, adding that that was one of the goals she hoped the camp would achieve.

"And I think having him understand his culture and where he came from is important to his well-being," she said. "We're the ones who snatched him from his country and we all know where we came from, and he has the same right to know where he came from."

Chris Casselman of Waterford said the camp has been equally beneficial for her two adopted children, sisters Kristina and Molly, who are learning to become more comfortable with their culture.

"This is the first time in their lives they can walk into a room where they are not a minority. It's relaxing for them because they don't have to feel different," she said.

When the camp ended, the children went back to their homes where they were likely to be the only Korean face. But parents said the camp's lessons have taken root.

"I'm just hoping we can find a way to do it every year. It's important," said Nam.

Court system aids hearing impaired

Lots has changed in the world of court reporting since 35th District Judge James Garber, then a newly named assistant Wayne County prosecutor, worked with Lamont Chestnut, the one-legged court reporter.

"Literally, Lamont had lost his leg in a childhood accident. My first assignment as an assistant prosecutor was in Recorder's Court before Judge Vinny Brennan," said Garber, who is impressed with a computerized system recently purchased by his court reporter, Carole Goodfellow.

"Vinny was a brand new Recorder's Court judge, I was brand new, and Vinny's dad, Marty, was the clerk. The only one who really knew what was going on was Lamont," the judge said. "If you didn't speak up, or spoke too fast, he'd warn you once. He'd tell you to speak up, slow down, or whatever the case may be. If you didn't, he'd take his crutch and and whack you in the leg."

In 30 years, court reporting has evolved in many directions. Thirty-fifth District Court features a video court-reporting system in Judge Charles Kaufman's court; a court recording system with audio equipment in Judge John MacDonald's court; and computer-aided transcription in Garber's court.

The beauty of the computerized system is that it's practical, cost-effective, and can assist the hearing impaired, while providing numerous other advantages to the judge, prosecutor and defense attorney.

It utilizes a traditional steno machine linked to a computer lap-top "notebook" with an extensive dictionary. As the reporter types testimony in steno shorthand, the computer translates it into English, which appears in-

stantaneously on the lap-top video screen.

Screens can be placed throughout the courtroom for use by deaf defendants to read what's been said; by attorneys to review testimony and conduct word searches; and by judges to research law, write opinions and select specific jury instructions. The technology allows the hearing impaired to serve as jurors.

Recently, a hearing-impaired youngster visited District Court with his classmates from Bird School. Without the computerized system, David Marks would have been reliant upon teacher aide Donna Caracostas to interpret testimony during the drunk-

en-driving proceeding.

"But the judge had David come up front and sat him in front of the monitor," said Caracostas. "He could watch as Carole was typing. He was reading testimony word for word, just like closed captioning. It worked out marvelously."

"The mother happened to be on the field trip, and thought it was the most thoughtful thing anyone had ever done for him. It was a wonderful experience for him."

Goodfellow sees terrific potential in the technology. "There are 9.2 million hearing-impaired people in the United States. One in 10 people is hearing-impaired to some degree," she said. The hearing impaired, even

those skilled at lip reading, miss about 60 percent of what is said and have to do considerable guessing to follow conversations, lectures and dialogue, she said.

Goodfellow foresees the technology's use in classrooms, at governmental and PTO meetings; even in church. "A lot of reporters are volunteering their time pro bono for the satisfaction of helping someone else in settings like these," she said. Goodfellow herself has volunteered at her church. She'd like to see a large screen installed and her equipment used so that the reverend's words can be displayed in text. "We need to get the message out to the hearing impaired that there's tremendous opportunity here," she said.

For Goodfellow, a mother of two who recently earned her bachelor's degree in business administration from Northwood University in Midland, it's a labor of love.

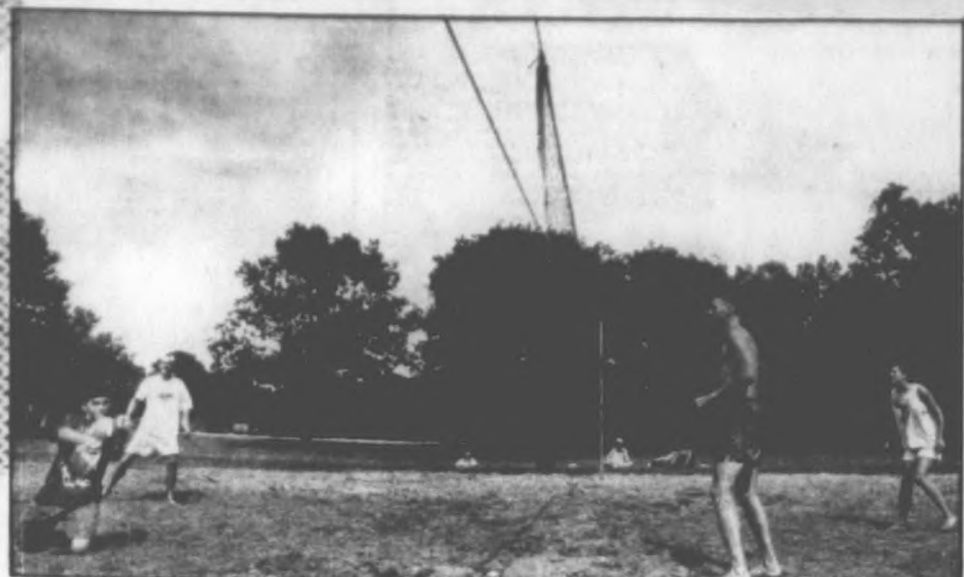

Who says basketball is the most popular sport in the United States?

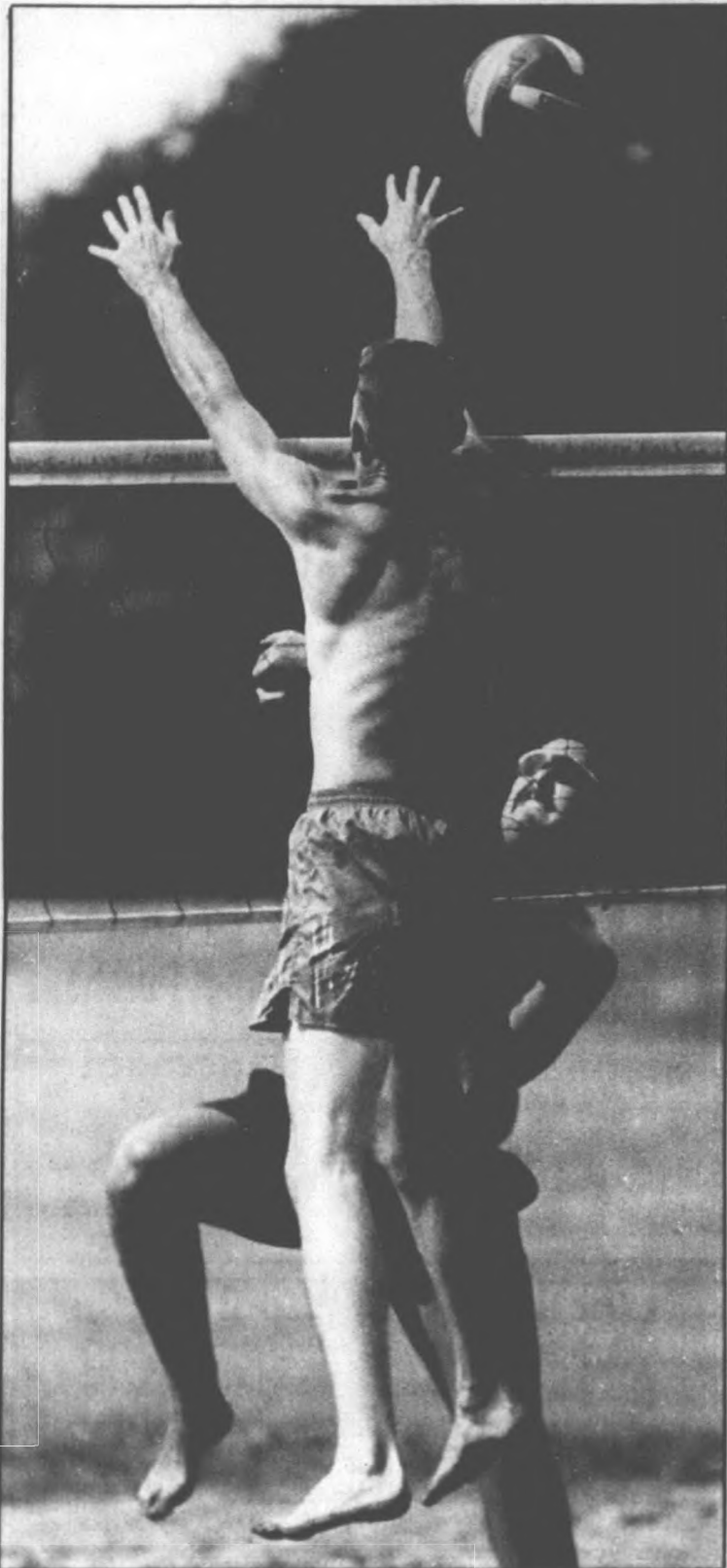
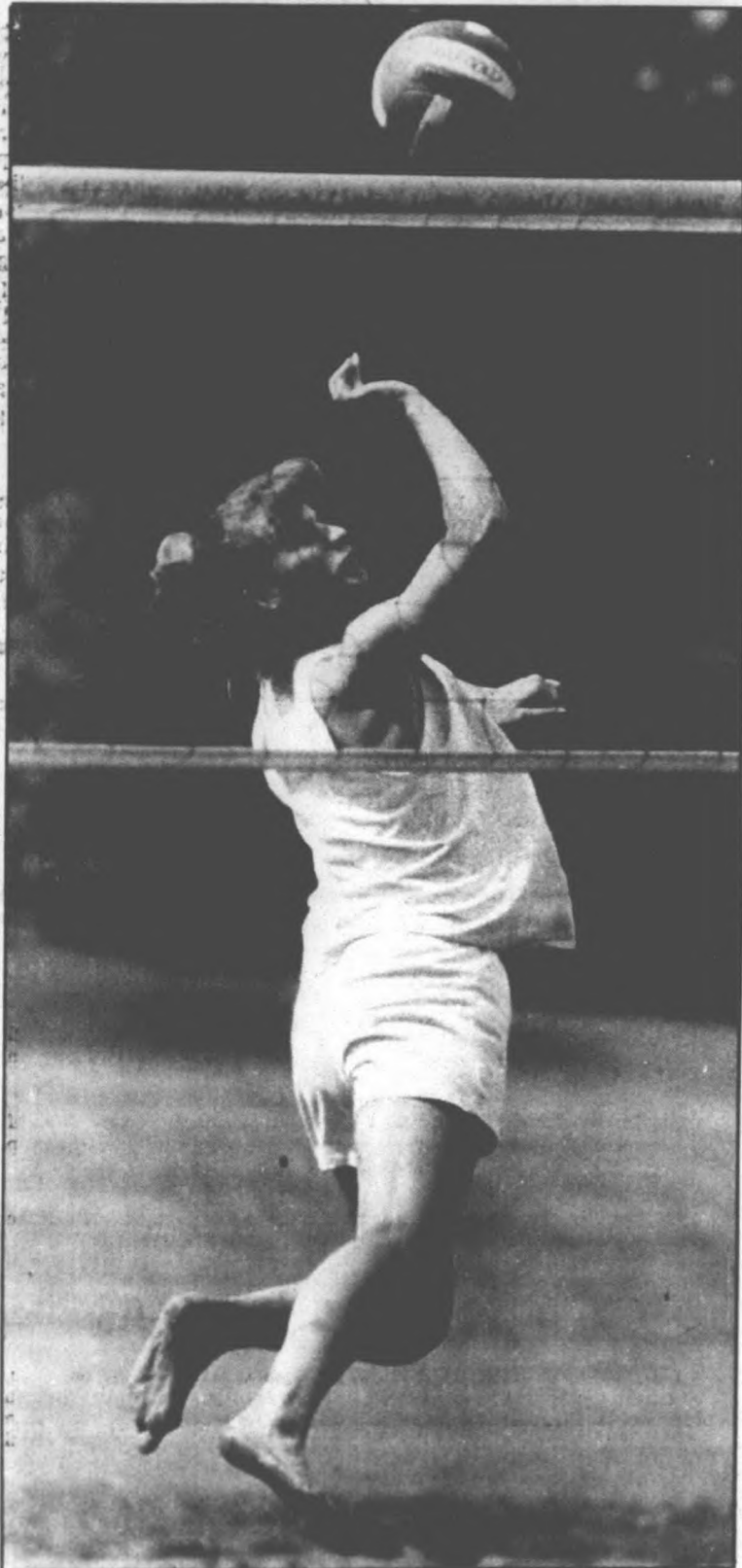

## Duran Duran puts vivid in tour

■ The band MTV made? In the 1980s, Duran Duran zoomed to stardom with vivid, thought-provoking videos that aired on the cable rock channel. Now, the troupe has turned to an opera set designer for a "new look."

After setting a precedent with their vivid, thought-provoking videos, Duran Duran is hoping to duplicate that success by the spectacle of their summer tour.

"It's definitely going to be on a whole new level," said keyboardist Nick Rhodes about the tour which hits Pine Knob Wednesday, Aug. 4. "I really think that we've managed to pull off something that we didn't think would be possible."

The interactive set was designed by opera set designer Stephanos Lazaridis.

"I went to see a couple of this guy's operas in England. I was so stunned that I wondered if he'd be interested in doing anything for us," Rhodes said.

It was a nice surprise - for both men.

"He was thrilled that we asked him to be involved; he's done the most extraordinary job of any rock set I've seen," Rhodes said.

He quickly corrected himself.

"It's more like a Broadway set than a rock set," he said.

It's safe to assume that Rhodes is quite thrilled about this tour even though at the time of the interview, he had only seen the scale model.

"I'm a great music fan myself. It's incredibly spectacular if you see a good one. I'm really, really excited about the thought of this one," he said.

Aside from the set, a three-member string section will join the band, which also includes original members vocalist Simon LeBon and bassist John Taylor, as well as recent addition guitarist Warren Cuccurullo and touring drummer Fergus Gerard.

The tour is to support Duran Duran's recent release, "Duran Duran." Although Duran Duran released an album with that name in

the early 1980s, the group decided to name the album after a graphic artist designed the cover without being given a title.

After seeing the proof, the group realized there was no appropriate place for a title. So they left it off.

Plus, Rhodes said, there wasn't an apt title.

"No song (on the album) represented the whole of the record. It's so eclectic. Nothing showed what the record was about. After 12, 13 years it was time to re-establish the name," he said.

"Eclectic" certainly describes the album, which blends techno, Brazilian, pop, dance and acoustic music.

That, Rhodes said, was the result of recording in Cuccurullo's living room.

"It was a relaxed vibe, sitting on sofas," he said. "We hadn't really

used much before. We're keen to experimenting in different sounds."

So far, the album has spawned three different-sounding hits, "Ordinary World," "Come Undone," and "Too Much Information."

The third single, the first song on the album, is the most controversial or seemingly hypocritical of the organization that helped launch them. The opening lyrics are: "Destroyed by MTV I hate to bite the hand that feeds me too much information."

Rhodes said that's not the case.

"It's not an indictment (of) MTV. The first thing I did when I got to New York was turn on MTV," he said. "The truth was MTV was very important to us. Early on, it helped make the band in America."

The song, which knocks news organizations as well, was actually inspired by the commercialization of the Gulf War, he said.

"It was inspired by the Gulf War being beamed into our living rooms by cable networks. It was something

... reduced to like a TV game show almost. There wasn't any attention paid to the body bags, the misery and the destruction.

"It was just sort of glossed over."

Video, however, is what made Duran Duran the band of the 1980s. Since then, however, they've been unable to shake the associations with their early videos like "Rio."

"Everyone pictures us sitting on the front of a boat; that was one day of our lives."

He hopes the tour will change that.

"I think word will probably start spreading (once the tour starts). They'll have to come along and see," he said.

Duran Duran performs with special guest Terence Trent D'Arby at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 4, at Pine Knob Music Theatre, I-75 and Sashabaw Road, Clarkston. Tickets are \$21.50 pavilion and \$12.50 lawn. For more information, call 377-0100.

# DFT unveils its lineup for fall series

The Detroit Film Theatre saw some of its biggest successes last season with premieres of "Indochine," "Brother's Keeper," and especially "The Crying Game."

So what do you do for an encore? If you're Elliot Wilhelm, curator of the Detroit Institute of Arts film program, you just keep booking quality movies. "Orlando," a new British import, opens this weekend.

"We don't measure our success in terms of attendance," Wilhelm said. "We book what we like and what's of exceptionally high quality. Some come off incredibly well."

Believe it or not, "The Crying Game" was a gamble.

"Last December, I asked people and surprisingly few had even heard of it," Wilhelm said of the Oscar-nominated film, with a much-publicized sexual identity twist that helped it break box office records nationwide.

stones. I thought, 'Enough!'"

Like many ska bands, the Bosstones' fan base averages about 18 years of age. That's all right with Carr.

"I hate playing over 21 shows. Most of the people are at the bar, getting totally drunk and they don't watch the show."

Because the crowd is so young — and dedicated — they enjoy catering to them.

"We like to play the clubs and keep ticket prices low — especially considering we bring in 15-year-olds who don't have a lot of money," he said. They keep the ticket prices around \$8; T-shirts are \$12-15.

Another way the Bosstones reciprocate their fans' admiration is by answering all the group's fan mail.

## MOVIES

Coincidentally, "Orlando" also deals with gender bending. Based on a novel by Virginia Woolf, it follows the title character (played by Tilda Swinton) who lives for 400 years, first as a man and then as a woman.

The two-weekend run will be followed by "Un Couer en Hiver" (Aug. 20-22), a typically French scenario about two men in love with the same woman. Claude Sautet directs.

Other intriguing titles this season include "The Music of Chance" (Sept. 3-5), an American movie about gambling and the nature of luck; "Farewell to My Concubine" (Oct. 22-24), an epic study of two actors and their relationship over 50 years; and "The Long Day Closes" (Nov. 19-21), the follow-up to Terence Davies'

brilliant "Distant Voices, Still Lives."

A fall fixture, "The International Tournee of Animation," screens Nov. 26-28, this year in its 24th edition.

With the success of movies like "Roger and Me," "A Brief History of Time" and "Brother's Keeper," it's no surprise that the DFT offers four new films in the documentary, or as Wilhelm likes to say, "non-fiction" category.

"I don't know if they're becoming more fun per se," Wilhelm said, "but the people who make them are becoming more than just chroniclers of events. They're experimenting and coming up with some incredibly strong work."

"Road Scholar" (Aug. 27-29) follows Andrei Codrescu, Transylvania-born and now New Orleans-based National Public Radio commentator, as he takes to the road in search of the American Dream. Detroit is one of the stops on his 4,500-mile, coast-to-coast odyssey.

In "Time Indefinite" (Oct. 8-10), Ross McElwee, who made the very personal and funny "Sherman's March" in 1986, focuses on the events of everyday life. "Rock Hudson's Home Movies" (Dec. 3-4) uses clips from the actor's movies as clues to his sexual preference.

No films on the new schedule were made prior to 1991, which may disappoint fans who enjoy seeing bright new prints of vintage works on the DFT screen.

"There were so many strong films to choose from that we didn't have time for the restored films on this schedule," Wilhelm said, then promising, "We will have at least two next season for our 20th anniversary."

# Boarding school presents home environment

**QUESTION:** I have a son who is very bright. However, he skips school, doesn't do his homework and, I'm afraid, he is getting in to the wrong crowd — a drug crowd. He is in the eighth grade and in a good school system. Someone told me that there are some private boarding schools that may help my situation. Do you know of any and where they are located? I would like one out of this immediate area but within driving distance.

**ANSWER:** You need to get a copy of the Boarding School Directory for the United States (1-800-637-8308). After a bit of research, I found there are 242 of these boarding schools in the country.

Of course, we have the internationally known Cranbrook Kingswood School, a day and boarding upper school in Bloomfield Hills with students from about 25 states and 15 foreign countries. And there is the Interlochen Arts Academy, an intensive fine arts school, which is second to none in the nation and maybe the world. There are other boarding schools within driving range of your home in Michigan, Ohio, Indiana and other nearby states.

The only other boarding school in Michigan is The Leelanau School, an

eight to 12th grade co-educational, non-denominational college preparatory, boarding school in Glen Arbor near the Sleeping Bear Dunes — a beautiful setting.

**A look inside**

Having been in public education all my life and not really having a full handle on boarding schools, I took it upon myself to talk to Leelanau's assistant director of admissions, Pam Touhey. Candidly, I was interested in looking at a private boarding school's curriculum, rules, activities etc. to make a comparison with what I lived through during 35 years in the public school trenches as a teacher, principal and assistant superintendent.

What a dream environment The Leelanau (boarding) School would be to work in. There is a class ratio of six to eight students per teacher. Study periods are mandatory 8-10 p.m. except Fridays and Saturdays. If a student is not maintaining a good grade point average, increased study hall time on the weekend is allotted.

Grades are posted every week and parents know how their child is doing each week in school, not every six weeks via a report card.

There is mandatory, periodic drug testing (if parents feel this is against their constitutional rights, then take your kid home). Can you see public education demanding mandatory drug testing to keep drugs out of school? It would be a feeding frenzy for lawyers.

Yet when one of our public kids flips out on drugs, it's "what are those funny school people doing about this?" It's the principal, the teachers, the superintendent, the board and its policies that have failed.

Get out of line in The Leelanau School, i.e. cheating, foul language, fighting, and you meet with a disciplinary review committee consisting of the principal, head master, teachers and student representatives. The peer

pressure, having classmates on the review board, makes it a total school family issue. And peer pressure, in a safe and caring environment, does work.

The students can't just leave the campus and "tool around in their car at the malls" or roam the area. Students take trips to Traverse City and other immediate areas on weekends, take other educational and experiential trips (white water rafting, skiing, camping, cultural activities), but always on a school bus and they are always chaperoned.

Sound a bit regimented? I'm not sure! I always thought we adults were responsible for our children. How about a trade-off where 100 percent of the Leelanau student population is accepted to four-year universities?

Each student has other home type responsibilities, such as dishes, raking leaves and there is a daily room inspection. These were the standards I was brought up with under a naval chief petty officer and so were my children. Didn't hurt me or my children.

**A home away from home**

But The Leelanau School (you can find others in the boarding school

directory) offers more than clear rules and structure. It becomes a "home away from home." Staff members live on campus with the students. There are Family Advisory Units, that is, staff members assigned to five or six students, creating the family-oriented environment.

The curriculum standards are of high quality, offering advanced or accelerated classes similar to what is found in many local quality school programs.

A drawback for me, thinking as a former typical high school student, would have been to leave all my friends. However, in your case, since you have the money and you see your son drifting, a boarding school may be a wise choice.

Keep in mind these are not schools for delinquents. Most of the students are well put together young adults. This type of atmosphere should rub off on your child since he is young and not quite yet into the drug scene you see him heading toward.

# Educational industry tries to hoodwink taxpayers

One of the best family stories that I grew up hearing was the one about my grandfather standing up to the KKK during the early 1930s.

It's something we could all learn from. The difference now, though, is that the educational establishment has become the KKK, hiding behind white sheets and trying to scare us into propping up an old system whose time has come.

But back to the South during the Depression. Then as now, there wasn't enough state or local money to support two school systems, one for blacks, the other for whites.

So to save money, the local school board decided that black and white students who lived in the same country neighborhoods should ride on the same school bus. They went to separate schools, of course; this was nearly 30 years before southern schools were integrated. But consolidating the bus routes would save some money.

The thought of black and white kids on the same school bus prompted the local chapter of the white-sheet boys to tell their neighbors to keep their kids off the buses.

For some reason that's lost to time,

my grandfather decided to put my father and uncle on the bus. And for a week they were the only white kids on it.

But then came Friday night, and the KKK got together for an informal barbecue on my grandfather's farm. Grandpa was the subject of the roast.

There they stood in their finest. I've often wondered if the guys' wives ever complained about missing sheets. Anyway, they called my grandfather out of the house and told him to keep his kids off the bus.

Grandpa recognized the voice of the grand dragon, or whatever he was, and using country terms suggested that he would keep his kids off the bus if the grand dragon would refrain from his visits to places where black prostitutes were employed.

The KKK went away and after a couple of weeks there were black and white kids on that school bus. And about 25 years later that neighborhood in Arkansas became the first in the South to have an integrated system.

But now back to the modern day KKK in Michigan, which is composed of school administrators, teachers unions and school boards.

Like my grandfather, voters are standing up to the modern day KKK and saying: "No, we're not afraid of your threats and we're not going to pay for duplicate bus routes just to prop up an old social order."

No matter how much liberal rhetoric school officials put out for public consumption about equal opportunity for students, we've still managed to create exclusive school districts for a privileged few that leave poor, rural white kids and blacks in urban areas out in the cold.

It's not just racial segregation, it's economic segregation that would make Selma, Ala., look like a center of liberal beliefs.

The state Legislature's scrapping of the property tax system for education is the best thing that's happened to this state in 30 years. We've got a chance to redesign a system that ensures that every kid has an equal chance at life.

However, the modern-day KKK will be staging plenty of raids in Lansing and in local school districts. They'll be fighting needed school district consolidations, controls on teacher strikes and the sweet deal that the Michigan Education Association has on medical insurance that sends about \$1,000 per year into union coffers to finance political campaigns.

Like my grandfather did in the 1930s, it's time for us to call the KKK's bluff. They tend to go away when you figure out who they've been sleeping with.

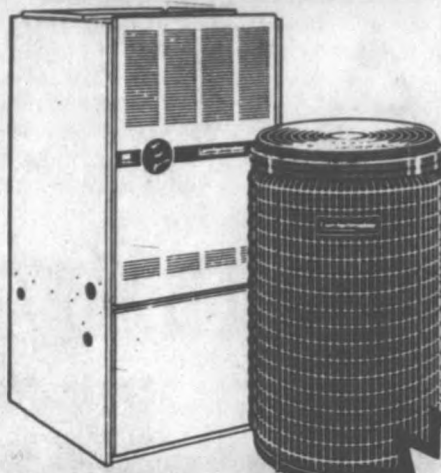

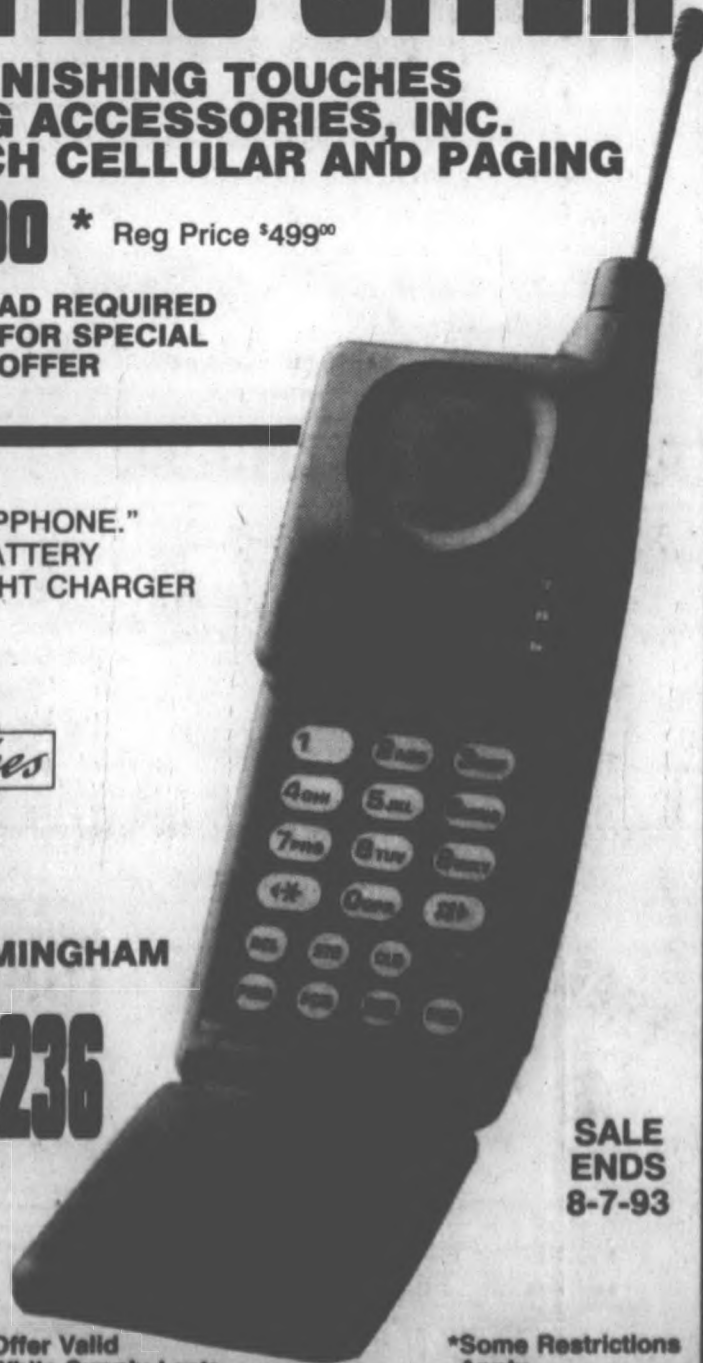

## Commissioners balk at county budget agreement

Feuding Wayne County officials put aside their differences long enough last Wednesday to shake hands on a set of budget cuts designed to close an \$11.75-million deficit.

The county commission was scheduled to have a special meeting this morning to approve the budget cuts. But commissioner Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, who also represents Plymouth and Plymouth Township, said Friday he doubted if his colleagues would agree on anything today.

"If it happens I think it's going to happen late in the week," he said.

The alleged agreement occurred Wednesday when Executive Edward McNamara met with commission chairman Arthur

Blackwell, D-Detroit, vice chairwoman Kay Beard, D-Westland, who also represents Garden City, and commissioners William O'Neil, D-Allen Park, and George Cushingberry, D-Detroit.

"I think we resolved our problems," McNamara said. "We're maturing or starting to get tired."

But members of the commission's Ways and Means Committee, who met Friday, spent 90 minutes arguing about whether Wednesday's result was an agreement or an agreement to negotiate, McCotter said.

Beard said that McNamara's people made many changes in what was agreed on Wednesday. "They went back to practically the beginning of this process,"

she said. "It was a big disappointment."

The problem is that, based on projections from county spending in December, January and February, there's a deficit of \$11.75 million that must be eliminated to be in accordance with state law. The actual deficit might be bigger or smaller, but no one will know the answer to that until spending figures from March, April and May are ready. And those numbers aren't ready yet, unless you believe the rumor that McNamara's people have them, but are keeping it a secret.

The story thus far goes like this:

■ McNamara submits a plan for budget cuts to commission.

■ Commission disregards McNamara's plan and passes one of its own.

■ McNamara starts passing out layoff notices to county employees, including 66 commission staffers, but no one from his own staff.

■ McNamara vetoes commission's budget cut plan.

■ Commission votes to cancel layoff notices.

Then came the alleged agreement between McNamara and Blackwell on Wednesday.

There's also been a whole lot of name-calling. McNamara's No. 1 aide, deputy executive Michael Duggan, called the commissioners who opposed McNamara's plan "a phony group of hypocrites."

Then commissioners said a lot of nasty things about Duggan, like this from Beard, "He runs off at the mouth and it's too bad because he hurts his boss and makes himself less admirable."

Asked if Duggan's confrontational style hindered the process, McNamara said: "Everything is hardball down here. Too often you'll find that kindness is misinterpreted as weakness."

McCotter wonders why a Democrat executive and a Democrat commission can't agree on budget cuts and wishes McNamara were more involved in the process.

"If Mr. McNamara was handling more of this, there would be less of a problem," McCotter said, adding, "If Republicans write

budgets these things won't happen."

The pivotal point of the argument, according to O'Neil, is whether the commission's nearly \$7 million personal budget should take a hit.

Many commissioners, O'Neil said, don't care a lot about where cuts occur in the \$350 million general-fund budget, as long as they don't occur in the commission's portion of that budget. "That's what it boils down to too often," he said.

Later this year, the budget battles are likely to increase in intensity, because everyone says there won't be as much money to go around as in years past.

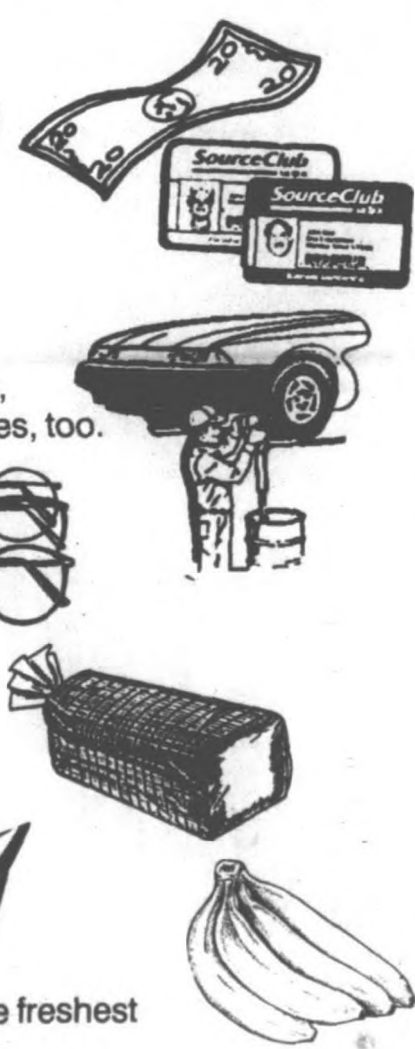

## Tips help beginners tackle slab of ribs

Any novice cook attempting to tackle a slab of ribs certainly has their work cut out for them. Not that ribs are difficult to prepare, but a stroll by the butcher case finds baby backs, spareribs, beef ribs, pork ribs and country ribs. How's a cook to know the difference?

There are so many questions to be answered. What is the best way to cook ribs? Do you parboil, parbake, soak, marinate, trim or just throw them on the grill and pray for a miracle?

Here's a primer on everything you ever wanted to know about ribs.

## Rib vocabulary

First off, let's tackle the different kinds of ribs. Regular spareribs are from the front of the rib cage and are held together by the sternum bone, and in most cases are the most difficult to cut and eat, mainly because of the attached sternum bone. Most supermarkets carry only pork ribs.

Beef ribs can be up to two feet long and would require a meat cooler all by themselves. Also, most slaughterhouses trim the beef ribs so well that there really isn't much meat left on the bones to make it worth your while.

Regular pork barbecue ribs are spareribs with the sternum bone removed. Baby-back ribs are generally cut from the loin, are about 2 inches wide, and have more meat on them than either of the other two. Expect to pay about 20 cents more per pound for barbecue ribs over regular spareribs and about 40 cents more per pound for baby backs over barbecue ribs.

Country ribs are really not ribs at all. They are the meaty section of the rib end of the loin split in half and then cut into chop-like strips. All of the above mentioned ribs are delicious, especially when finished with a sauce under the grill. The lighter-weight ribs cut from small hogs have a tendency to be more tender than those from larger animals.

For portioning purposes, the general rule of thumb is to allow at least four ribs per person, with two full racks of ribs being enough to feed six average people.

"The Joy of Cooking" recommends allowing about 1 pound of ribs per person.

## Prep work

Is parboiling or parbaking the ribs before cooking really necessary? All of the cooking manuals I researched for this story indicate parboiling or parbaking is necessary for the tenderest and least-fatty ribs. Parboiling ribs for five minutes in my estimation boils away some flavor. Momma always soaked her ribs in about two cups of vinegar to break down the tough fibers and then parbaked them, drained and uncovered in a 400-degree oven for about 30 minutes.

Many soul-food cookbooks suggest parbaking in the vinegar, and I have done both, finding that the parbaked ribs actually baked in vinegar have more of a "bite" because of the vinegar.

Through experience, I have observed many rib aficionado's "mopping" their ribs with vinegar seasoned with paprika, garlic and onion during the cooking process to keep them moist.

In my estimation, this mopping during the cooking process is by far the most critical step when making ribs because it is important to keep the ribs moist during the cooking process. All publications used as sources for this story indicate that this step should be repeated every 10 minutes during the cooking process, whether in the oven or on the grill.

Cooking times will vary. Allow at least 1 hour of actual cooking time on the grill or in the oven for ribs. Here's a tip from "Jack Daniel's Old Time Barbecue Cookbook" to tell if the ribs are done — "Pinch the meat between the ribs; when it's done, it will 'give' under your fingertips." It is a matter of personal preference whether or not to sauce ribs during the cooking process.

## Sauce

Personally, I have found that slathering on a sweet sauce loaded with brown sugar, molasses or honey has a tendency to burn when added directly during the cooking time. Therefore, I prefer to wait until the last five minutes to slather on some sauce, and pass more sauce on the side. Occasionally, I prefer to forgo sauce and coat the ribs with a dry rub of salt, pepper, spices and herbs. Again, this step is usually done during the last 5 minutes of cooking. Ribs cooked in the oven should be cooked at 350 degrees on a rack to allow the fat to drain.

When grilling, it is imperative that coals be kept gray and that a squirt bottle of water or broth be kept handy to avert any flare-ups that might happen from the dripping fat.

If necessary, ribs can also be broiled in the broiler, again on a rack and frequently basted, as you would ribs on an outdoor grill.

stocked with lots of different kinds of liqueurs do it too. Now Hiram Walker & Sons Inc., the Windsor-based Canadian distiller whose Midwest office is in Farmington Hills, wants to stop all this sneaking around by taking liquor out of the cabinet and into the pantry.

Consumers got a taste of Hiram Walker's Culinary Collection, comprised of 12 premium brands of spirits that lend themselves to use in cooking, at the Michigan Tastefest in Detroit's New Center area July 2-5. Fifteen chefs from some of metro Detroit's finest restaurants including Sweet Lorraine's, Excalibur, Restaurant Di Modesta and Morels: A Michigan Bistro, prepared new recipes featuring spirits and liqueurs from the Hiram Walker Culinary Collection.

Informally called "Chefs in a Bottle," spirits in the Culinary Collection will be sold to consumers in 9-ounce size bottles, available individually for about \$3 each or in a rack that holds eight bottles for about \$25 this fall.

Consumers will be able to pick and choose flavors, and the company will add new ones depending on demand. The prototype we saw contained cream of banana, anisette, creme de menthe, ginger brandy, cherry brandy, triple sec, creme de cassis, and amaretto.

"If we're going to encourage people to cook with spirits we have to make it available in smaller quantities," said company president Donald Coe of Birmingham. "We want people to think of these liqueurs as spices that enhance cooking. The cost is comparable to what you pay for a bottle of spice. These liqueurs are concentrated essences of fruits, roots and vegetables."

It's no secret that liquor sales in the United States have been steadily declining over the past 10 years, about 19 percent, with increased emphasis on healthier living. The mar-

ket for distilled spirits isn't expanding.

"We're totally comfortable with that," said Coe. "But in order for us to maintain our business we had to look for ways to stabilize it. Spirits have always been used by chefs. We're trying to get this idea across to consumers. We're taking an old idea and freshening it up."

To develop the Culinary Collection, Coe said Hiram Walker talked to chefs, since 50 percent of its products are sold to restaurant operations, to find out what flavors they were using.

Hiram Walker's Culinary Col-

lection is being promoted with recipe booklets which introduce new ways of using their products.

"I think it's great for the home cook," said Lorraine Platman owner of Sweet Lorraine's in Southfield, one of the Culinary Showcase participants at Tastefest. "A lot of people leave liqueurs out of recipes that call for them because they don't want to buy a big bottle. I've been having a lot of fun experimenting with these liqueurs. The liqueurs give you give you the wow or punch in a sauce. The alcohol evaporates faster than water. When you're experimenting, start with just a

teaspoon to add flavor."

Besides introducing new ways of cooking with liqueurs, Hiram Walker is helping chefs-in training.

Coe said he is proud to be involved in the Hiram Walker Foundation established last year.

"The purpose is to fund scholarships and provide meaningful employment for minorities. Restaurants have a shortage of employees and are a starting workplace for many minorities. We're challenging schools to work with us."

This year the foundation

awarded \$4,000 to Henry Ford Community College in Dearborn, and \$4,000 to Schoolcraft College in Livonia for scholarships to support minority education in the food service and retail industry.

Elizabeth Wilson, a graduate of the Culinary Institute of America's ALANA (African, Latin, Native American) program is working for Hiram Walker with chefs across the country to develop and test recipes, and evaluate training seminars for interested hospitality educational programs and schools.

## Pamper your ribs with dry rub, sauce

### BASIC BARBECUE RIB SAUCE

- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 4 tablespoons honey
- 2 cloves garlic, smashed and chopped
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon fresh ground ginger
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 cup catsup
- 1/2 teaspoon Tobasco sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon mustard seed
- 1/2 teaspoon celery seed
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
  - 1 teaspoon cornstarch diluted in 1 tablespoon water
- Combine all ingredients in a saucepan over low heat. Cook for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and allow to cool for 5 minutes. Strain sauce through a colander and use for ribs. Makes 1 1/2 cups.

### FEROCIOUS BARBECUE SAUCE

- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1 tablespoon oil or bacon drippings
- 1/2 cup water
- 2 tablespoons vinegar

- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 cup bottled chili sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon ground coriander
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/8 teaspoon ground saffron

In a saucepan, saute onion in oil or bacon drippings until golden. Combine remaining ingredients and simmer over very low heat for 20 minutes. Makes about 2 cups.

### DRY RUB FOR RIBS

- 1/4 cup salt
- 1/4 cup pepper
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon thyme, crushed
- 1/2 teaspoon rosemary, crushed
- 3 teaspoons paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

Combine all ingredients in a plastic bag and mix well. Coat ribs generously in the mix, rubbing in the mix for optimum flavor. Shake off any excess before cooking.

## Tips help lessen health risks of barbecuing

Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension, said she often receives calls in the summer from people asking if it's safe to barbecue.

"The best advice we can give to consumers is that barbecue or grilling should not be used every

day as the main method of cooking," said Treitman. "Grilled fatty meats are suspected of increasing the risk of cancer. If meat is allowed to become charred — even when broiled or pan fried the same risk occurs."

So here are a few tips to lessen the risk when you want to barbe-

- cue: ■ Pick low-fat meats, or at least trim all visible fat before grilling.
- Wrap meat in foil to protect from the smoke.
- Don't place the heat source directly beneath the meat — put coals to one side.
- Scrape off charred parts of

- meat. ■ Place aluminum foil or a metal pan between the meat and the coals to catch the dripping fat.

What are some cooking tips you would like to share with our readers?

Wnuk said he loves wooden cutting boards and good wooden utensils that won't scratch expensive cookware. "Keep your cutting board and utensils well-seasoned by rubbing them with a mixture of mineral oil, lemon juice and freshly squeezed garlic," he said. Rellinger recommends using a simmering ring under the pot to prevent burning when you're cooking chili or spaghetti sauce.

If stranded on a dessert island, what would you not be caught without?

Wnuk said he can do just about anything with some good wooden utensils like a long-handled spoon and spatula, while Rellinger loves a good sharp utilitarian knife.

What does the future hold?

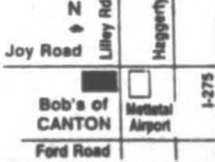

# New Italian wines make summer entertaining flavorful

Recently, we tasted some new Italian wines that please both palate and purse. These wines will make your summer entertaining more flavorful.

Tasting wines without food can be deceiving since a wine's character usually improves with a well-selected dish. Fortunately, our tasting included some exceptional Italian cuisine. Since most wine is consumed with meals, we have selected a number of wines that are especially food-worthy.

The 1988 **Notari Brut Riserva** (\$10-11) is a delightfully refreshing sparkling wine made from 90 percent chardonnay and 10 percent pinot noir, the varietals used to make French champagne. Greet your guests with this well-chilled bubbly. Although Italian Asti Spumante is sweet, this wine is totally dry. We think you'll find it a bargain at this price. Several restaurants in the area are using it as a house pour, so look for it when you dine out.

Summer entertaining emphasizes white wines and light reds that can be chilled before serving. Let's take a look at the white Italian wines first.

The 1990 **Lamberti Bianco di**

**Costoza** (\$9) is a blend of five white varietals from northern Italy. It is a great aperitif with a variety of hot and cold hors d'oeuvres such as fried calamari, soft shell crabs, melon and prosciutto or cheese raviolis with cream sauce.

Gavi is a white wine produced in Italy's Piedmont region from a grape known as Cortese di Gavi. The 1990 **Ca' Bianca Gavi di Gavi La Centuriona** (\$14-16) has aromas and flavors that highlight pineapple, pear and lime in a style that brings you back for another sip. Grilled white fish is a perfect complement.

If you just can't get along without chardonnay, try the 1989 **Castello di Gabbiano Ariella Chardonnay** (\$19-23). You will

nay, **Carneros** (\$16) has creamy textures, toasty oak and the truity freshness that only Carneros-grown grapes offer.

■ 1991 **Vichon Chevrignon** (\$9.60) is consistently the best blend of sauvignon blanc (62 percent) and semillon (38 percent) to be found. Grapefruit and vanilla-oak opens to hints of melon in a style where both

fruit and oak take their rightful place without one dominating the other.

■ 1992 **Joseph Phelps Vin du Mistral Grenache Rose** (\$10) showcases lively cherry aromas and flavors and is an excellent choice for a summer picnic wine to complement roast chicken, pasta, chilled salads, shrimp or crab.

be very impressed by this barrel-aged beauty. Its blend of honey, melon, cinnamon and nutmeg flavors make it unique and tasty. Try it with cracked crab, melted butter and sauteed mushrooms.

Wine-producer Gianni Gagliardo is an advocate of the white grape variety known as favorita, grown in northern Italy's Piedmont. According to Gagliardo, the favorita can make light, easy-drinking wines cold fermented in stainless steel, classic wines aged on the yeast lees or intense, still-bodied wines aged in French oak.

The 1991 **Gagliardo "Allegro" Favorita** (\$10-11) is the first style with fresh apple-pear qualities and a touch of sparkle

— Italians call it frizzante. The 1991 **Gagliardo "Casa" Favorita** (\$11-13) is fermented on the lees and has a more intense apple-pear quality with a delicate mineral character. The 1990 **Gagliardo Neirole Favorita** (\$29-30) has layer upon layer of oak fragrance blended with lemon and citrus peel.

Embossed on the "Neirole" bottle is a mask that any thespian will recognize. Gagliardo maintains that when people first meet they wear a mask that is soon removed after a glass of his wine. Several of the Gagliardo labels

also carry the mask motif. We agree that one of the great benefits of wine is a relaxed camaraderie.

Don't avoid red wines in the August heat. Select light red wines that can be served slightly chilled. If a red wine is too warm it will not be refreshing, so don't hesitate to put it in the refrigerator or an ice bucket with a mixture of ice and water before serving.

Dolcetto is a grape variety producing light, fruity wines that are best when consumed young and slightly chilled. The 1990 **Gagli-**

ardo **Dolcetto d'Alba** (\$10-11) has a wonderful cherry quality that is a great accompaniment for grilled Italian sausage.

Gagliardo's red wines are made with the philosophy that they should have early appeal and approachability yet are ageable. His 1988 **Gagliardo La Serra Barolo** (\$24-26) is harvested late for structure and mouthfeel. This is not a typical big, robust Barolo. It is elegant and drinkable now. The **Gagliardo Batle** (\$28) is made of 100 percent nebbiolo grown in Barolo. Chill it lightly to bring out its cherry aromas and flavors.

If you are searching for a traditional style Barolo from a great year, the 1985 **Ca' Bianco Barolo Riserva Cascina Denegri** (\$19-23) is a wine in which you can sink your teeth. Serve at cellar temperature (55-60 degrees F) and be prepared for a big fruit expression complemented by leather, mushrooms and smooth tannins. There are few Barolos of this quality at this price.

## Spirits enhance chicken, shrimp

### RIO DE JANEIRO CHICKEN

- 1 1/2 pounds boneless, skinless chicken breast, julienned
- 1 pound fresh asparagus, trimmed and blanched
- 1/2 pound Cremini mushrooms, quartered and sauteed
- 1 yellow bell pepper, finely julienned and sauteed lightly
- 2 cups julienned spinach
- Puff pastry, cut into squares and formed into boxes
- Red and green apple slices for garnish

Saute chicken in a scant amount of canola oil until tender. Add remaining ingredients and saute until heated through. Quickly toss in spinach and toss with Brazilian Coffee-Vanilla sauce. Serve in a puff pastry box and garnish with apple slices.

### BRAZILIAN COFFEE-VANILLA SAUCE

- 3/4 cup Tuaca Liqueur
- 1/4 cup Creme de Cacao
- 18 ounces chicken stock
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon white pepper

- 3/4 teaspoon instant espresso
- 1/2 fresh hot chili pepper, chopped
- zest of 1/4 orange
- 1/4 cup arrowroot
- 1/4 cup water
- 1/2 cup dried Michigan cherries
- 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream

Combine both liqueurs in a large saucepan and heat to boil — add stock, cinnamon, pepper, espresso, zest, chili pepper and continue to boil on high heat for approximately 10 minutes.

Combine arrowroot and water and stir into sauce — lower heat and add cream and cherries and continue to cook approximately 10 more minutes until flavors are combined. Remove from heat. Serves 4.

### MARGARITA SHRIMP

- 1 1/2 cup dry vermouth
- 4 tablespoons Hiram Walker Two Fingers Tequila
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 green onions, sliced

- 4 tablespoons dry white wine

## Food doesn't have to smell bad to be spoiled

"The recent outbreak of 'E-coli' food poisoning in the Pacific Northwest reminds us of the importance of food handling practices," said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service.

"Food doesn't have to smell, or even taste bad, to be a source of food poisoning," she said. It is very important that food is handled safely. Personal hygiene is very important in the prevention

of food-borne illnesses. "Careless handwashing can be a source of food poisoning," said Treitman. Hands should be lathered for at least 20 seconds and rinsed well before handling food.

Here are some other food safety tips:

- Teach children to wash hands after visiting the restroom and before eating or touching food.
- Cook all ground beef products until center is light gray and juices run clear (160 degrees).

# Chefs share recipes from new cookbook

## WESTERN STEAK SALAD

- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/4 cup lime juice
- 2 tablespoons steak sauce
- 2 tablespoons wine vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup steak sauce
- 1 tablespoon lime juice
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1/2 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
- 1 pound boneless beef sirloin steak
- 6 cups torn romaine lettuce
- 8 cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 small avocado, peeled, cut into chunks

1 small red onion, halved, sliced

For dressing, in jar combine 1/4 cup oil, 1/4 cup lime juice, 2 tablespoons steak sauce, vinegar and salt. Cover and shake vigorously; chill to blend flavors.

In small bowl, combine 1/4 cup steak sauce, 1 tablespoon lime juice, 1 tablespoon oil and hot pepper sauce. Brush on both sides of steak. Let stand 30 minutes in refrigerator.

Broil or grill steak, 3 to 4 inches from heat source to desired doneness, turning and brushing once with marinade. Let steak stand while preparing salad mixture.

In large bowl, combine romaine

lettuce, tomatoes, avocado and onion; toss with 1/4 cup salad dressing and divide among 4 salad bowls.

Thinly slice steak across grain; arrange on top of salad mixture. Serve salad with remaining dressing, if desired. Makes 4 servings (about 1 1/4 cups dressing).

## HOMEMADE CITY CHICKEN

- 2 pounds veal shoulder, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1/4 cup milk
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 tablespoon flour
- 2 tablespoons water
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 cups bread crumbs

1/4 cup cooking oil

1 13-ounce can chicken broth

Thread cubed veal on wooden skewers. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Mix water and egg. Dip skewered veal into egg wash and roll in bread crumbs. Heat oil in skillet. Brown veal on all sides.

Add chicken broth, cover and simmer for 45 minutes. Add flour to chicken broth and a touch of milk to make a nice gravy, stir to thicken. Makes 8 servings.

AP — Mediterranean seasonings and handy kitchen appliances turn broccoli into a tantalizing appetizer spread. First cook the broccoli in your microwave oven, then skillet-saute the onion and garlic in olive oil. Skillet cooking imparts a toasty flavor and golden color that microwave cooking just can't mimic. This spread tastes delicious, served at room temperature or chilled, on crackers and French bread.

## SPICY BROCCOLI SPREAD

- 2 cups broccoli flowerets
  - 2 tablespoons water
  - 1/2 cup chopped onion
  - 1 small clove garlic, minced
  - 1/4 teaspoon crushed dried red pepper flakes
  - 2 tablespoons olive oil
  - 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
- Assorted crackers or thinly sliced French bread, toasted

In a 1-quart microwave-safe casserole cook broccoli and water, covered, on 100 percent (high) power for 5 to 7 minutes or until tender. Drain.

Meanwhile, in a small skillet cook onion, garlic and red pepper flakes in hot olive oil until golden, about 10 minutes.

In a blender container or food processor bowl combine onion mixture, broccoli and Parmesan cheese. Cover and blend un-

til smooth. Transfer to a small bowl or ramekin; smooth top with spatula. Serve at room temperature or cover and chill for up to 24 hours. Let stand at room temperature for 30 minutes after chilling. Serve with crackers or toasted bread. Makes about 3 1/2 cups.

# Colorful sweet peppers brighten any dish

AP — Not that many years ago, sweet peppers signified one type — green bells. Thankfully, now you can buy red, yellow, orange, purple and even brown sweet peppers. When you substitute these colorful varieties for the more familiar green bell peppers, they brighten just about any dish — casseroles, fillings, rice, pastas and salads.

During the off-season, colored sweet peppers generally are more expensive than green peppers. But come summer, all varieties are so plentiful that you may find them priced about the same.

Sweet peppers are attractive, easy-to-grow additions to home gardens, too. Take advantage of the price break or your garden bounty by cooking with them this summer.

Though sweet peppers aren't peppery tasting, they belong to the same plant family — capsicum — as hot peppers. Like tomatoes, sweet peppers are classi-

fied botanically as a fruit, but are used mainly as a vegetable in cooking.

**Buying peppers**

When you're shopping for sweet peppers, you'll find some are rounded, with thick walls; others may be long and slender, depending on the variety. Select brightly colored peppers with a full shape. Avoid shriveled, bruised or broken peppers. Choose among the following pepper colors, coordinating them with the colors of other ingredients in your recipe. They all taste about the same — mild and slightly sweet.

■ **Chocolate:** This dark brown bell pepper has a green stem and interior. Serve it fresh to preserve the brown color. It turns green when cooked.

■ **Golden or Orange:** Warm up the look of any dish with this red-orange bell pepper. It has an orange interior and a green stem.

■ **Green:** You can always find the traditional green bell pepper with a green stem and interior. If you leave this pepper in a vinaigrette or other acidic marinade, it will turn from bright green to an olive color. It is still safe to eat.

■ **Purple:** Like the chocolate pepper, this vivid purple bell pepper turns green when cooked, so serve it fresh to preserve the color. It has a green stem.

■ **Red:** When ripened on the vine, some green bell peppers turn red. These peppers have a red interior and a green stem. They do not change color in vinaigrettes and marinades.

■ **Yellow:** This sun-colored bell pepper has a green stem and yellow interior. Match it with red and orange peppers for a sunset-colored salad or stir-fry.

**Storing sweet peppers**

Cover and store fresh peppers in your refrigerator for up to five

days. You can freeze sliced or chopped fresh peppers in freezer bags or containers for up to six months, but they will lose their crispness.

**Roasting sweet peppers**

Aficionados of Mexican and Mediterranean-style foods love the smoky, sweet flavor of roasted red peppers. Roasting loosens and makes the skin easy to remove. Some people like to remove the skin because they feel it has a slightly bitter taste.

To roast peppers, cut them in half lengthwise and remove the seeds. Place pepper halves, cut side down, on a foil-lined baking sheet. Bake, uncovered, in a 425-degree F oven for 20 to 25 minutes or until the skin is bubbly and brown. Place the peppers in a clean paper bag. Seal and let stand for 20 to 30 minutes or until the peppers are cool enough to handle. Pull off the skin gently and slowly, using a paring knife.

New SourceClub promises savings



Ho hum. Another warehouse club is opening in the area. "Not so!" says SourceClub president Paul Boyer. This new Meijer-owned store in Livonia is one shoppers have just got to see.

"We're a warehouse club like no other," said Paul Boyer, pitching the debut of the fifth Source Club in Michigan, opening Aug. 10 at Haggerty, south of Eight Mile in Livonia.

"We've got a bright interior, sky lights, painted walls, wide aisles, the lowest membership fee around, and responding to concerns that warehouse shopping means you have to buy more than you need, some individual items... Oh, and some really hot prices!"

One Westland family who has been shopping at the Source Club at Newburgh and Ford roads since it opened in May agreed with Boyer.

"We also have a Pace Club membership," said the mother, who did not want her name published. "With three school-age kids to feed, we find we're saving about 20 percent off our grocery bill by buying staples at these warehouses once a month. It's fun too, because you never know what

you're going to find. Some surprise items they get from buy-outs are really unique. I bought a name-brand recliner for the family room for under \$200."

Two kinds of shoppers

Boyer said Source Club targets two groups of shoppers — one in the business of running a business, the other in the business of running a home.

"Both groups want to improve their bottom line," he said. "Businesses use us as a wholesaler, buying things like motor oil, computer paper, restaurant products, cigarettes and candy by the gross, to pass the savings onto their customers. Homeowners use us to stock up on paper products, detergents, frozen foods and soft drinks, to pass the savings onto themselves."

Boyer said additionally, Source Clubs offer members a marketplace with fresh and frozen foods, a bakery, optical center, one-hour photo finishing and a food court. The stores also

move large volumes of books, audio and computer equipment, home furnishings, tires and clothing.

Why you save

The savings come from the retailer's ability to eliminate operating costs through the no-frills setting. Signage is kept to a minimum. Shelving is rack-style. The floors are concrete. There are no warehouses to maintain because merchandise is shipped directly from the manufacturer to the selling floor. Purchasing in large quantities also guarantees the best price.

Warehouse clubs charge customers a membership fee which Boyer said is used "as part of the margin we need to run the business." At the Source Club, a \$20 fee entitles the bearer to a photo ID which must be shown each time a shopper enters the store. Other warehouse clubs charge annual membership fees of \$25 to \$30.

"Club membership allows us to communicate with our shoppers on a personal level," Boyer said. "We know them. We can respond to their comments and concerns immediately. We stay in touch with them."

One-day trial passes are available to interested newcomers through

newspaper advertisements for the Source Club as well as inquiries at each management office.

"I read somewhere that the average household can save \$1,300 a year shopping from a club rather than a supermarket," Boyer said. "That easily pays the price of membership quite quickly."

Janet Brown walked the aisles at the Westland Source Club with a calculator in her hand.

"I recommend shopping this way," she said. "Per unit price. That's what I want to know. Per unit price."

In her basket were several cases of Hi-C boxed drinks and Del Monte creamed style corn.

Warehouse-style shopping came from California some 16 years ago when Price Club stores opened, offering the average person the chance to shop like businesses shop. Since then, key players have included 212 Wal-mart-owned Sam's Wholesale Clubs, Kmart's recently sold-off 101 Pace Warehouses, 85 Costco Clubs, and 78 Price Clubs.

Currently, more than 21 million people in the United States hold club membership cards. Last year, warehouse club sales topped \$29 billion. That figure is expected to reach an estimated \$100 billion by the year 2000.

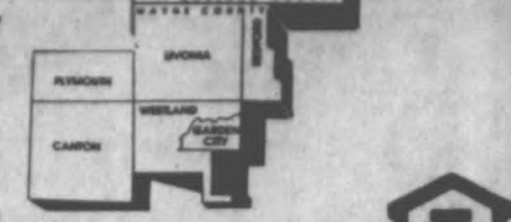

## Finesse girls pursue national crown

The 18-and-under Finesse slo-pitch softball team will attempt to become the first Michigan entry in 10 years to win a USSSA world tournament this week.

Finesse, comprised mostly of players from communities serviced by the Observer & Eccentric newspapers, will compete against nearly 70 other teams from around the country Aug. 5-8 in Muncie, Ind.

Using the national rankings to support its cause, Finesse is considered a legitimate contender and just might return with the championship.

"We're anticipating a big finish," Finesse manager Barry Patterson said. "Our motto is 'They have a seven-foot trophy they're waiting for us

to pick up in Muncie.'

"Like any other team, we need some good breaks, but I feel more confident about this (Finesse) team than any other I've coached."

The last Michigan team to win a world title was Jake's Harley-Davidson of Garden City, which won the 15-and-under championship in 1983.

Patterson was told by a USSSA official the team will probably be ranked in the top five going into the world tournament.

The rankings are based on a point system, and teams earn points based on how they do in national invitationals and state tournaments.

Finesse, which finished fourth in the world last year, has won three of five this year and was second in the other two.

"I'm thinking one or two based on what I know the other teams have done," Patterson said. "There are carryover points from the previous year and we did very well. I think there's very little doubt we'll be in the top three."

Coyro was 9-1 as a senior and 20-1 in his career at South. McDonald batted .510 with 35 runs batted in his final year at Lamphere, earning league MVP honors. Paul hit .419 his senior season and was Macomb Athletic Conference Red Division MVP; Coyro was MAC White Division MVP.

The others signed by Lyon are Eric Carlson, a right-hander from Clarkston who was 7-2 with a 2.50 ERA as a senior; Jeff Harwood, an infielder from St. Clair who batted .458 and stole a school-record 50 bases as a senior, while setting another school mark for runs scored; and Luis Mendoza, a catcher from Royal Oak Kimball who hit .368 and threw out 68 percent of the attempted base stealers.

#### More swim signings

Amazing. That's the only way to describe OU coach Pete Hovland's recruiting triumphs. After years of frustration, including two consecutive sub-par recruiting efforts, the Pioneers have hit the jackpot.

Their list of newcomers for the upcoming season swelled to 19 — 14 of whom have already swam times fast enough to qualify for the NCAA II championship meet — with the addition of two foreign-born transfers, Arthur Albiero from Sai Paolo, Brazil, and Jens Kristensen, from Glesborg, Denmark.

Albiero comes to OU from California State-Bakersfield, the NCAA II champion the past eight years. Albiero was a four-time All-American in last season's NCAA II meet, placing third in the 400-yard individual medley, fourth in the 500 freestyle, sixth in the 200 backstroke and 10th in the 100 back.

coaches Don Dreher (Plymouth) and Dennis Schlimgen (Walled Lake).

Horosko and Selmi graduated from high school in 1992 but met the age requirement and were able to play another season with Finesse. They are among seven players who received college scholarships in the last two years.

Horosko, Flood, Dawn Godfrey (Walled Lake) and Laura Apligan (Northville) play for Eastern Michigan University, Selmi for Henry Ford Community College and Czach for Madonna University. Kintz will choose between Henry Ford and Daytona Beach Community College.

Lehnis and Selmi are returning all-world players. Desentz (MVP), Flood and Marley made the all-tournament team this year in Smyrna, Tenn., and Selmi, Wasiak and Lehnis were so honored at the All-America NIT in Cincinnati.

Finesse won the Spirit of Smyrna, Metro Sports Unlimited (Shepardsville, Ky.) and state (Sterling Heights) tournaments and was second in the Canton and All-America NITs.

In addition to its travel tournaments, Finesse competes in a women's league at Softball City but emphasizes the youth games in which it has a 32-9 record.

### Slo-pitch helps players

Though all of the Finesse players have distinguished themselves as fast-pitch players, they have no trouble adapting to the different style of softball.

"Defensively, the girls improve tremendously playing slo-pitch because everybody is involved on defense," Patterson said. "There isn't a game goes by that each player doesn't have to make two or three plays; whereas, in the fast-pitch game,

you can go the whole game or tournament without having to make a play.

"My contention is we learn to swing the bat more aggressively in slo-pitch because you hit every time up.

"Kintz, Flood and Horosko were all-state in fast-pitch and played slo-pitch in the summer. Obviously, it didn't affect them negatively. I'm a firm believer the slo-pitch game helps them become better ballplayers."

Selmi leads the team with a .531 batting average and is second in RBI (36). Kintz, who bats cleanup behind Selmi, is hitting .467 and leads Finesse with 46 RBI, six home runs and 10 triples.

Flood is the leadoff batter, is second with a .525 average and has scored a team-leading 40 runs. Lehnis (.421, 23 RBI) and Wasiak (.404, 26 RBI) also are among the top producers of offense.

"We're a power-hitting team,"

Patterson said. "We can explode like no team I've coached. I don't know of any other team in the country that can pile up the runs like us when we're on."

"Hitting and outfield defense are our strengths. Those are the real keys in slo-pitch. The outfield becomes so much more important. So many games are won or lost because of what happens out there."

Finesse overcame deficits to win the Metro Sports and state tournaments. It trailed the Louisville Grayhaws 11-2 in the third inning but rallied to win 18-13 in Shepardsville.

After finishing second to the Club Hollywood Flames of Euclid (Ohio) in two tournaments, Finesse erased a 6-5 deficit and won the state final on Wasiak's two-run single in the seventh inning, 7-6.

"We didn't think an Ohio team should win the state tournament," Patterson said.

# Revved-up Grieco hits

Richard Grieco's been in the fast lane for quite a while now. In high school, he played hockey and lacrosse and was named an All American in football. He went to college on an athletic scholarship, but soon left the slow pace of academia to try his luck at modeling in New York City. Quickly signed by the prestigious Elite agency, Grieco appeared in ads for Chanel, Giorgio Armani and Calvin Klein before he switched paths again, this time deciding to become an actor.

Once more, success was not long in coming. His very first television audition led to a year-long stint in the daytime drama "One Life to Live," after which Grieco moved to Los Angeles. There, guest spots in "Rags to Riches" and "Who's the Boss" propelled him into the Fox network's popular "21 Jump Street" series. His good looks and dashing demeanor made him so popular, he was given his own spinoff series, "Booker."

The big screen has beckoned to Grieco as well, offering him starring roles in "If Looks Could Kill" and "Mobsters." He's slated to star in his own CBS series late this year, and is negotiating the publication of a volume of original poetry titled "Fragments in a Dirty Ashtray."

But the handsome performer's latest work, a high-octane drama titled "Born to Run," roars into view Monday, Aug. 2, on Fox. Directed by Albert Magnoli ("Purple Rain," "Tango & Cash"), the film stars Grieco as quiet Nicky Donatello, a young man who still lives at home, working in his widowed father's small grocery. But on Friday nights, for a few adrenaline-charged moments, Nicky feels truly alive. Gifted with mechanical prowess and a steely calm behind the wheel, Nicky is the toast of the local drag strip. Despite the best efforts of arrogant Phil Landi (Joe Cortese), a small-time crime boss who controls all gambling at the strip, Nicky just can't be beat.

But Phil knows the way to get to Nicky is through his luckless brother Richie (Jay Avacone), a chronic gambler (and loser) who takes the meager profits from his used-car lot to pay his mounting debts. Still, he can't keep up and one day discovers he owes Phil a dismaying \$12,000. Fearful for his life, Richie defies his brother's stern orders and bets everything he has on Nicky's next race.

But "Born to Run," written by Randall M. Badat and Frank Bidetto, is more than just one drag race, and the Donatello brothers find themselves caught in a vortex

of violence and treachery. Ultimately, Nicky knows it's up to him to save both his brother's life and his own future.

Grieco wisely eschews many of the threadbare mannerisms a character like Nicky might suggest, avoiding movie rebels' customary screaming and posturing for an understated, gentle portrayal. His performance instead suggests a restless, quiet child, just wanting to find his niche. Jay Avacone is effective as Richie and Joe Cortese is colorful in his portrayal of Phil, although he tends to overact in the more intense moments. Christian Campbell makes the most of his small role as the teen-age mechanic who idolizes Nicky.

Shelli Lether, on the other hand, is little more than set dressing as Sally, the Manhattan model who leaves her perch on Phil's arm for Nicky's bed. Her shrill cries of "I believed in you" are startlingly amateurish.

But then, what might one do with such shopworn dialogue? Badat and Bidetto have devised a complicated, interesting story, but saddle their actors with lines few thespians could deliver convincingly.

in 1971, "The Point" tells the story of a boy named Oblio (voiced by Michael Lookinland, best known as Bobby on "The Brady Bunch") who lives in a village where everything is pointed. Though he is a polite and well-regarded member of the community, he is banished from the village amid concerns that his roundness will corrupt

the town's moral fiber. Oblio and his dog Arrow must then adventure through the sinister Pointless Forest.

"The Point" was adapted from a story by singer-songwriter Harry Nilsson, who also performed the original songs, including the memorable "Me and My Arrow." Simple, appealing animation, a solid, meaningful story and an unpretentious tone make "The Point" a winner whose message of tolerance rings with poignancy today.

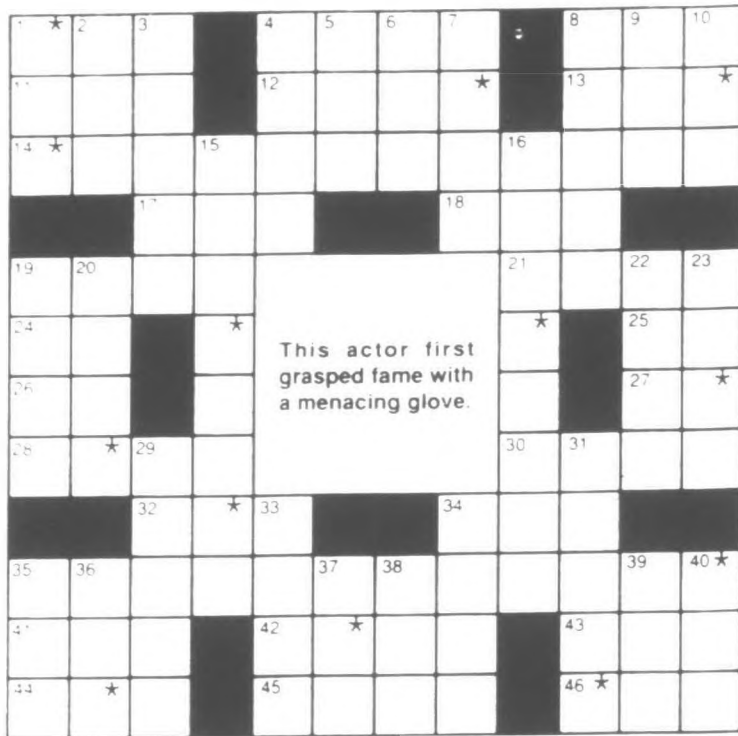

He does take some time to get together with a group of friends and jam. They have a small band called Hard News, "but it is all just for fun."

Muldoon lives in what he calls a "box," but there is a reason for that. "People would be surprised to know what a slob I am," says Muldoon. "If you saw my dressing room or home you would understand. I'm not the neatest guy in the world, so I am happy to have four walls, a desk, stereo and bed. There is a lot less for me to clean up."

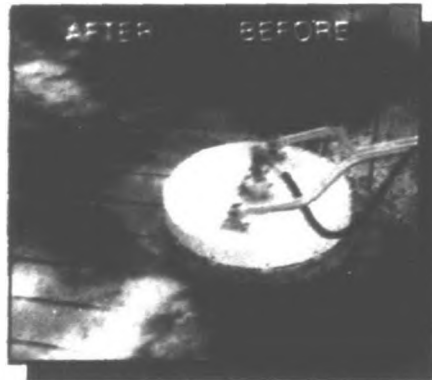

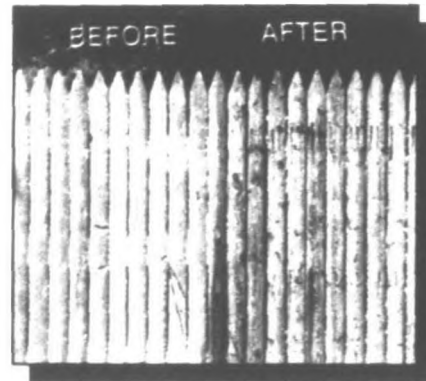

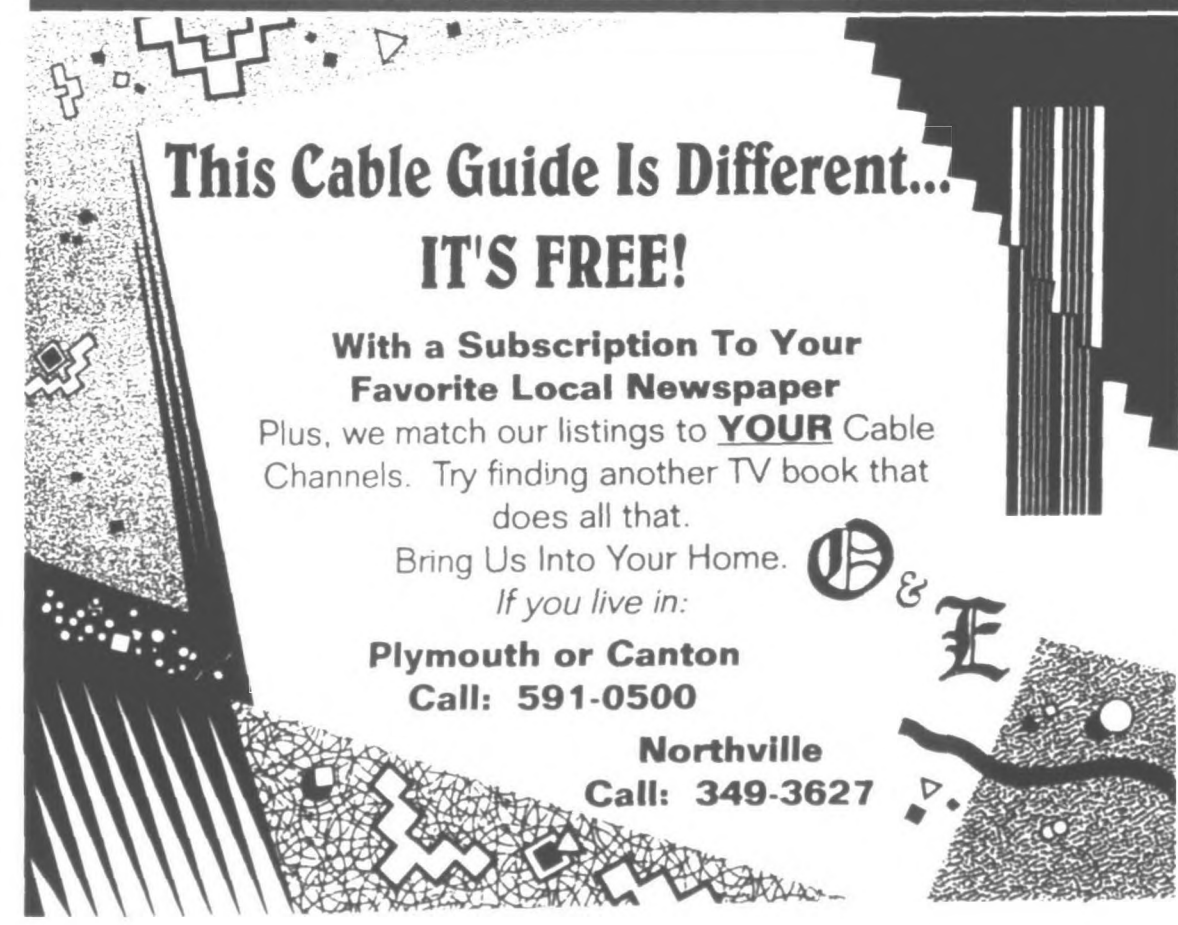
