Rotary dial may be used

Proposal A's value up in the air



While Proposal A would lower property taxes and raise the sales tax, Plymouth-Canton school officials say the district won't benefit or be hurt by it. One school board member contends that neither Proposal A nor a backup plan would be good for the schools.

If a parent of a Plymouth-Canton student went to Las Vegas looking for

answers concerning the two school finance choices on the March 15 ballot, the response would probably be "Pick 'em."

Don't look to the school board for direction, either.

"We won't take a position on this one; it's up to each individual person to decide," said school board president Roland Thomas.

Voters will be asked to decide whether Michigan schools should be financed with a sales tax increase (as outlined by Gov. John Engler-backed Proposal A) or an income tax increase (the backup statutory plan as de-

scribed in the accompanying story).

"Both are bad for schools," said Thomas. "Neither the sales or the income tax is stable enough to support schools."

Both plans will raise \$10.1 billion for schools and provide the same amount of per-student revenue for Plymouth-Canton students.

Either way, the district's per-pupil

Wartime stories live on

Because Plymouth is rich in Civil War history, it could become a prime Midwest site for staging Civil War re-enactments.

That's an idea being touted by John Pappas, a Vietnam veteran who heads the Civil War Memorial Association — the group seeking to move the Civil War memorial from Riverside Cemetery to a park across from Central Middle School on Main Street.

Pappas has presented the group's plan to move the statue to city commissioners. While the Plymouth-Canton schools support the move, the group is seeking approval from veterans groups and some city boards, before commissioners decide on whether to approve or reject the move.

If people like the idea, Pappas said, "We could have huge re-enactments, units from all over the country. We could try to put Plymouth on the map nationally. We have all the contacts."

HISTORY

Such re-enactments would tie in to the moving of the Civil War statue to a more prominent place in town, and would tie in with the Lincoln collection slated for the Plymouth Historical Museum across the street, he said.

Plymouth can also lay claim to a substantial Civil War-related history, as nearly 100 soldiers from the surrounding area embarked from the city to serve in the war.

The Plymouth Historical Society has collected the writings of several soldiers about the experience.

In a 31-page remembrance titled "Recollections of Civil War Days," Nelson Pooler recalled leaving his Canton farm on Hanford Road six miles from Plymouth to go to the city at age 17, to join the Army's "C" Company in the summer of 1861.

"Together with my parents I went to Plymouth . . . and there enrolled my name together with nearly one hundred others.

"A few of these boys I already knew but the great majority of them were strangers to me but they proved with few exceptions to be noble characters who became friends tried and true.

"It is with sadness that I recall them as I remember how they dropped out of our lives from Antietam to the final surrender. Many died upon the field, others mortally wounded in various hospitals. Many with wounds less severe were discharged and came home and with a large number of these I have enjoyed a life-long friendship," wrote Pooler.

Missing children

Reports of missing children would be entered more quickly into the Law Enforcement Information Network under legislation sponsored by state Rep. Jerry Vorva, R-Plymouth, and passed Tuesday by the state House.

Under current law, police must conduct a preliminary investigation before making a LEIN entry or broadcast. The bill would require immediate entry of reports of missing children, disabled people or anyone missing under suspicious circumstances, Vorva said.

"The problem with the present law is that investigations can be extended to unreasonable lengths while the police wait for the missing person to return," Vorva said. "This delay could hamper efforts to locate a missing child and is not

warranted."

The bill now goes to the state Senate for consideration.

Man charged in high-speed chase

An Ypsilanti man accused of leading Plymouth Township police and some nearby police agencies on a high-speed chase was in court Friday on four charges stemming from the Feb. 21 incident.

A not-guilty plea was entered for Percy Lee Frame, 23, on charges of assault with intent to do great bodily harm less than murder, malicious destruction of police property, aggravated assault and a felony firearms charge.

The charges carry a maximum sentence of 20 years in jail. He was released on \$500 bond, following his arraignment before

35th District Judge John MacDonald in Plymouth.

The chase began in Novi and ended in Plymouth, with the suspect eluding police at speeds over 140 mph along the way, police said.

Corvette stolen

A blue two-tone Corvette was reported stolen Thursday from the parking lot of Vic Tanny's, 40700 Ann Arbor Road, as its owner, a Farmington Hills man, 28, was inside.

The theft happened between 9:30-10:30 p.m. according to the report filed with Plymouth Township police.

Complaints dismissed

A Plymouth city commissioner's complaints against two political opponents filed after the Nov. 2 commission election have been dismissed.

John Boyd of the Michigan department of state compliance and rules division said complaints against downtown business owner Jane Bird and downtown development authority member Bob Mundt have been dismissed.

The complaints were lodged by city commissioner Bill McAninch.

In a letter to McAninch, Boyd wrote that the leaflet with Mundt's address distributed to voters "urged only that citizens vote, and would appear to be speech which is not only protected by the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, but which also performs an important public service — that is urging citizens to participate in an upcoming election."

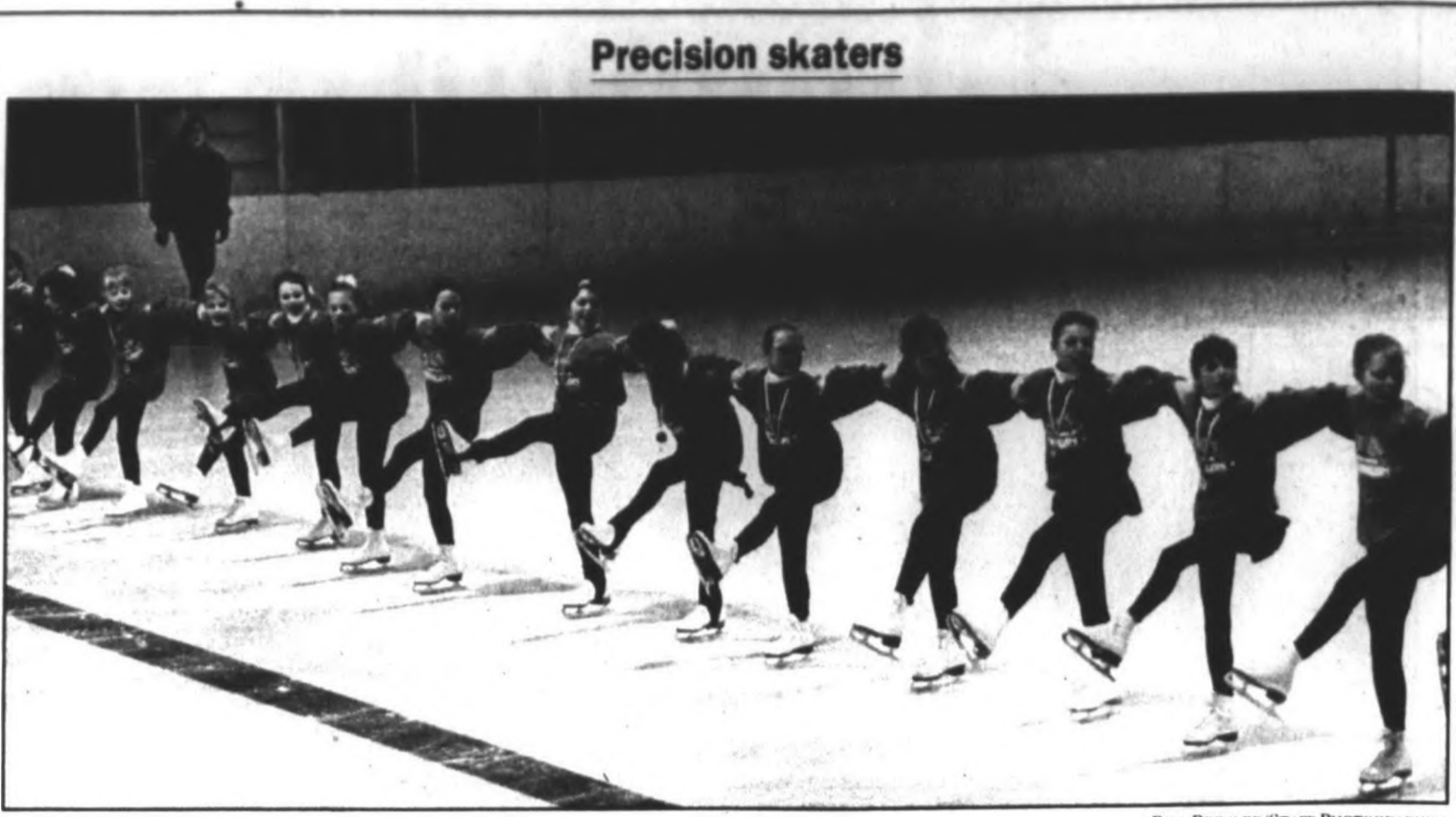
While the material listed cer-

tain candidates and did not list others, Boyd said election rules "apply only to printed campaign material which either specifically or by clear implication supports or opposes a particular candidate or position."

The secretary of state also responded to another complaint lodged by McAninch, that Bird mailed material in which support of candidates was stated but no report was filed with the county on how much was spent on the mailing.

To not file a spending report with the county appears to be in violation of election rules, the secretary of state found. Bird said she didn't know such a filing was required, and signed a conciliation agreement admitting to the mistake.

Boyd said no further action would be sought on this complaint, adding that hundreds of people unaware of election rules sign conciliation agreements each year in Michigan.

Plymouth man charged in embezzlement

A Westland teen who claimed she was robbed at gunpoint while working at a Wayne Road gas station has been ordered to stand trial — along with two alleged accomplices, one a Plymouth man — on charges of embezzling the money.

Dawn Marie Kuck, 19, allegedly lied when she said two masked bandits robbed her of \$900 on the night of Dec. 28 at the Citgo sta-

tion on the northeast corner of Wayne Road and Marquette, police said.

Instead, Kuck arranged the incident with Christopher Allen Fanos, 18, of Westland and Jeffrey Allen Grigal, 19, of Plymouth, police said.

The case unfolded after Kuck failed a polygraph test, and all three defendants eventually provided police with written statements, Westland Detective Sgt. Marc Stobbe said.

The three appeared in 18th

District Court on Thursday for preliminary examinations to determine whether they should stand trial. All three voluntarily waived their hearings, in a move that averted pretrial testimony and sent the cases to Detroit Recorder's Court for trial.

Not-guilty pleas had been entered for the defendants during an earlier arraignment in 18th District Court.

Kuck, Fanos and Grigal could face up to 10 years in prison and \$5,000 fines if convicted of the

charges. They are free pending trial.

According to police accounts, Kuck first spoke with Fanos about the fake robbery. Fanos, employed at a tire shop next door to Citgo, would often stop in and buy pop from Kuck, the reports said.

Following the incident, Kuck approached the two men and asked for a portion of the money, but was told that all of it had been spent, police reports said.

who also lived briefly in Plymouth. Pooler was in the Battle of Gettysburg, and recalled the failed charge by Confederate Gen. Pickett that was the turning point of the battle: "These two were days of terrific fighting and great slaughter to most of our forces culminating on the afternoon of the third in the great charge upon our center of Pickett's division. The prelude of which was an artillery duel the like of which perhaps the world had never seen: This was Lee's last attempt to

break our lines and resulted only in failure."

Pooler was eventually captured during the Battle of the Wilderness, where he spotted Gen. Lee atop his horse. Pooler was taken to Andersonville, Ga., a notorious Confederate prison.

"Andersonville was without doubt the worst of Southern prison pens and was designated throughout our army as the Confederate hell and the abject misery of its thousands of victims proved it rightly named," Pooler

wrote. Of rations, "No fuel of any kind was given where with to cook the rice or meal which then had to be eaten raw which in nearly all cases produced disordered stomach and bowels," he wrote.

"Almost daily were men shot from the sentry boxes, the excuse being they approached too near the dead line.

"There were numbers of cases

of boys tired of the fight for life who boldly stepped over the line and received the bullet which ended their lives."

Pooler was eventually moved to another prison in Georgia. While being moved again, he escaped and joined Union Gen. Sherman's Army in Georgia, and eventually recovered his strength, before his discharge and return home.

Pooler died at age 77 in 1921.

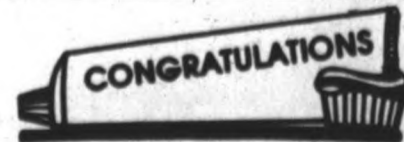

Engler comes to town to present tax pitch

Canton Township was a target of a pro Proposal A blitz last week, as the March 15 vote on the plan draws near.

Gov. John Engler was in town making his own personal pitch for the proposal and on Wednesday Joe Graber looked at the two school financing initiatives - Proposal A and a statutory backup plan - as a school board member, employee and taxpayer.

"I threw out the statutory plan because it can all change," said Graber, 22, a state Senate policy assistant in Lansing and board member for the Schoolcraft School District, south of Kalamazoo.

Graber told members of the Canton Chamber of Commerce Wednesday that he will vote for Proposal A because it's a constitutional amendment. On the other hand, the statutory plan can be changed.

"It (Proposal A) is as solid as a rock. It's not going to change unless I, as a voter, want it to change," said Graber, a Western Michigan University student.

On Friday, Engler was at Fellows Creek Golf Course in Canton to make his own personal pitch for passage of Proposal A. About 50 people, including Canton Supervisor Tom Yack and Plymouth city commissioners Bob Jones and Dennis Shrewsbury grilled the governor on the plan.

Engler took note that cigarette companies are spending more than \$3 million to defeat the proposal. "We don't want Joe Camel deciding on our educational system."

He said Proposal A makes sense because it will bring more tax money into Michigan from outside of the state. "Tourism is on the increase. There are two million Canadians who visit our state each year."

Graber said that while the state Legislature can later change the sales tax - it would be increased to 6 percent under Proposal A - it can't go higher than 6 percent because of the constitutional amendment.

Instead of a sales tax increase, the statutory plan proposes an income tax increase from 4.6 percent to 6 percent. Proposal A would retain the personal exemption at \$2,100 for general taxpayers and \$3,000 for seniors. The statutory plan would increase the exemption to \$3,000 for general taxpayers and \$3,900 to offset the proposed income tax increase.

"If you make only \$6,000 a year, it's still a tax increase," Graber said about the statutory plan provision.

Graber also explained the difference for state property taxes and local school district taxes between the two plans. Both plans would allow districts that spend more than \$6,500 per pupil to ask voters for

supplemental millage. The ballot plan would apply the supplemental mills first to homestead property, up to 18 mills, then uniformly to all other property.

"Our school district is not at \$6,500 per pupil," said Dick Egli, Plymouth-Canton School District spokesman.

Under Proposal A, the single business tax would remain at 2.35 percent. Under the statutory plan, the single business tax will increase from 2.35 percent to 2.75 percent. Graber said a business owner told him that with the proposed tax increase, "he would be making more money by downsizing and laying people off. He will make more profits then."

The statutory plan maintains current law as far as school districts' bonding ability for improvements. Under the ballot plan, bonding for remodeling, improving, furnishing and equipping of existing buildings is not permitted unless it's part of a complete renovation.

"They failed to put in a definition of complete renovation in the law," Graber said.

Some voters are saying that since there aren't a number of organizations jumping on Proposal A's bandwagon, it must be a good deal, Graber said.

"If we vote this in, the fight will get smaller for the money for your schools," Graber said. "If you don't vote for it, the fight will get bigger."

foundation grant will be \$5,548 in 1994-95. That's up from \$5,343 this year, an increase of \$205.

Like Thomas, Plymouth-Canton director of finance Diane Barnes says it's a toss up.

"The formula that was passed and in force right now is not dependent on the March 15 outcome. The primary difference is that under the ballot plan we're depending on sales tax, and under the statutory plan, the income tax," said Barnes, who agrees the property tax is the most stable tax.

Taxes go down

One thing that is certain is that school property tax bills will go down. Plymouth-Canton schools currently levy 35.6 mills; 33.3 operating mills and 2.3 debt retirement mills. For the owner of a \$100,000 home, that amounts to a current tax bill of \$1,780, not including the homestead credit. Under the ballot plan, under which the state would levy 6 mills, the owner of a \$100,000 home would pay \$415 (6 mills plus 2.3 debt retirement mills).

The owner of a \$200,000 home, currently paying \$3,560, would pay \$715 in taxes (12 mills plus 2.3 debt retirement mills).

State Reps. Deborah Whyman, R-Canton, and Jerry Vorva, R-Plymouth, both favor Proposal A, and say the ballot plan, while not ideal, is a better bet for Plymouth-Canton and better public policy.

Proposal A will put in place an assessment cap of 5 percent or the inflation rate, whichever is lower. There's no cap under

the statutory plan.

None of the school reforms originally proposed by Engler are included in either plan, though lawmakers did pass recent legislation allowing charter schools. Cost containment measures will be considered later in the year, she said.

Whyman is making available to her constituents spread sheets "so people can work the numbers and see financially how each plan affects them." Interested voters may obtain a spread sheet by calling (517) 373-2575 or 453-5744.

A wash for schools

While Proposal A "isn't exactly what I would do, it's heads above the other proposal," said Vorva, adding that whether Proposal A passes or not, "it's pretty much a wash for Plymouth-Canton."

The Michigan Education Association is lobbying hard against Proposal A "because teachers don't pay income tax on their retirement. Income tax can go up as high as it wants and it won't affect their retirement," he said.

Plymouth-Canton schools are looking at a possible deficit next year not because of action Lansing has taken, but in part because of pay raises the district has granted and a \$1 million rainy day fund it wants to establish.

"Because of local control, they are in the red, by their numbers. It's their own doing," said Vorva.

The opposition

Opponents of Proposal A include Ted Bohlen, coordinator of the 13th Congressional

District of the pro-Ross Perot United We Stand America. Bohlen, an attorney retired from General Motors, also serves on the school district's superintendent's advisory committee.

A prime reason he opposes Proposal A is because it takes tax-levying power from the people.

"In 1978, people voted in the Headlee Amendment which required increases in revenue to schools to be no greater than the last year's revenue plus the inflation rate," he said. "Under Proposal A, the Legislature and governor can work around these supposed Constitutional guarantees on the basis that if people think they are violating the Constitution, they have the right to sue, and they have the right to defend a suit with your money."

A key element of Proposal A is that with a "three-fourths vote of the Legislature, the Legislature can increase the 6 mills. That means if the Legislature chooses to raise the rate to 106 mills, it can. Now, under the current Constitution, with Headlee, only voters can raise the millage," he said.

Lastly, said Bohlen, the sales tax increase puts the burden on lower-income people, who by necessity spend a greater percentage of their income on taxable items.

While the same amount of revenue will go to schools, what will change "is who pays for it," he said. "Proposal A puts a greater burden on lower income people and benefits ones with higher incomes. They're going to stick whoever is most vulnerable."

Street name spells confusion

It's "Corinne Avenue" - that's one "r" and two "n's" - according to the sign at the end of the street.

But it's "Corrine Street" - two "r's" and one "n" - according to utilities and the post office.

The discrepancy is causing mail delays for residents of the Plymouth Township street, and one resident, Debora Gans, isn't finding it easy to get the matter resolved.

"Yes, it is a problem and always has been," she said, adding that as the post office automates, it could become more of a problem.

The street was originally plotted as Corinne Avenue in the 1950s. But somewhere along the line, the phone company began listing it as Corrine Street.

"Originally I found out there was a problem two years ago when I called Ameritech and said 'I'm moving,'" Gans said, to "Corinne Avenue" as printed on the street sign.

"They said there is no such address. I called the township and they said it's one r and two n's."

Gans called a supervisor at the Plymouth post office. "He told me to look at the (Detroit) Edison bill," Gans said. "I was amazed to find out the post office goes by what Edison says," she said, adding Detroit Edison lists "North Corrine Street."

The problem, Gans said, is that a builder incorrectly spelled the name on a document. And she's finding a bigger problem trying to clear up the matter.

"It has slowed the mail, and a postal supervisor assures me it will only get worse," Gans said.

That's because automated mail scanners reject mail addressed to the name printed on the street sign, causing delays of up to a week or longer in mail delivery.

"Should there be any reimbursement to the residents who are going to have to go through a lot either way?" she asked, as documents including titles,

mortgages and more could require changing.

"The way it stands right now, Edison said get with the township and ask them to make the change, the township said all the tax statements and mortgage papers have to be changed," Gans said.

"My feeling is nobody is going to get back to me, they're going to let it die," Gans said.

An Edison employee who declined to be named said discrepancies in street spellings

"happen plenty of times, that's nothing new."

Township Clerk Marilyn Massengill said, "If we're spelling it right and I'm sure we are, her fight would be with Detroit Edison." Massengill said a solution could involve the township building department contacting Edison about making the change.

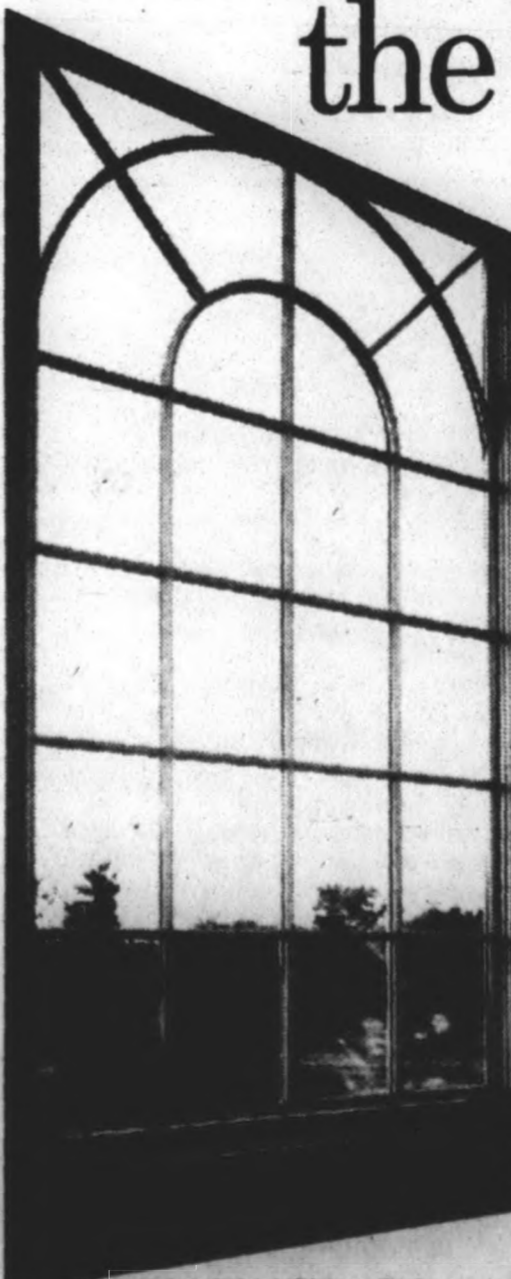

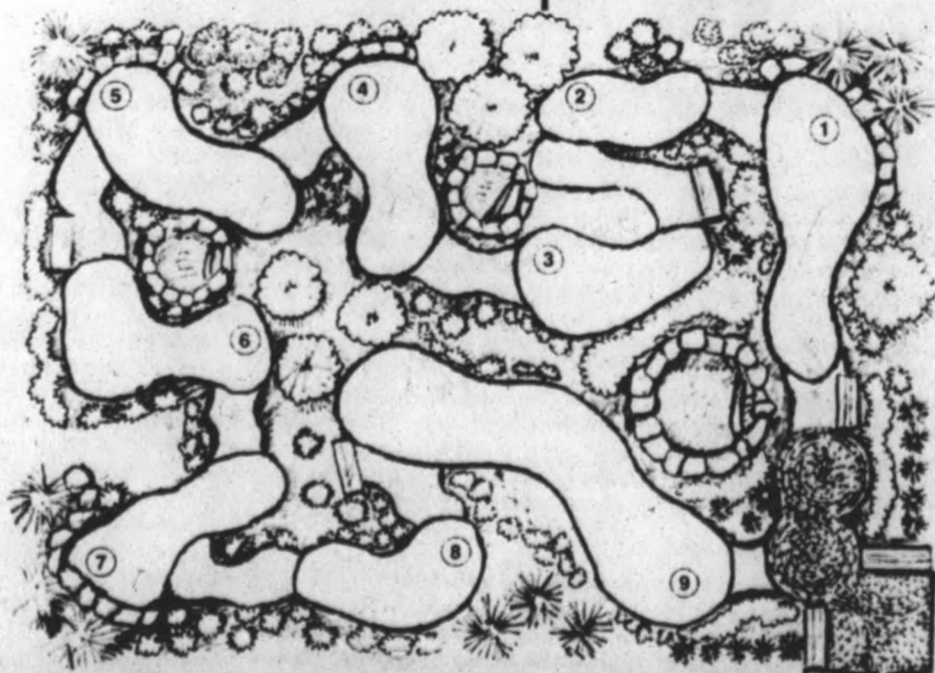

Commission enacts residency ordinance

The Wayne County Commission adopted an ordinance Thursday requiring that all future county government employees live in Wayne County.

Currently, of 5,137 county employees (not including the courts), 439 live outside Wayne County.

There was no word by press time on whether Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara would veto the ordinance. Even if McNamara does veto the ordinance, it appears the commission has enough votes (10) to override the veto.

Although a residency requirement has been in effect for Wayne County civil service employees since 1977, commissioners wished to set a policy that would also apply to upper-echelon appointed officials, like, for example, the personnel director.

The ordinance, introduced by commissioner Bernard Parker, D-Detroit, says, "Each person who is hereafter hired to a position as an employee of the county of Wayne shall maintain their principal residency within Wayne County. The chief executive officer shall place the highest priority upon implementing this policy when bargaining with each (union) of Wayne County employees."

Furthermore, Parker's ordinance gives the commission and the executive the leeway to waive the residency requirement "in those cases where particular skills are required which are not possessed by a county resident."

The ordinance passed 11-4 with the following commission-

ers voting no: Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, who also represents Plymouth and Plymouth Township; Michelle Plawewski, D-Dearborn Heights, who also represents Redford Township and part of Livonia; Bryan Amann, D-Wayne, who also represents Canton Township, and Edward Boike, D-Taylor.

At Thursday's meeting, McCotter said, "I find it ludicrous to use the '70s for a public policy paradigm for the '90s. We're hurting the people who can least afford to be hurt."

Amann said he supports the "spirit" of Parker's intent, but "I'm not alarmed that less than 10 percent of our employees live outside of the county."

Amann complained that very little background information was given to commissioners on Parker's ordinance. He said he didn't know how many county employees lived outside the county until he read it in the Observer, and he didn't know about the 1977 residency requirement until the commission meeting.

Commissioner Kay Beard, D-Westland, who also represents Garden City, supported the ordinance. "If the community is good enough to work for, it should be good enough to live in," she said. "If you work for Wayne County you should live in Wayne County."

Boike said he fears that neighboring counties will adopt similar ordinances, thereby limiting the job possibilities of Wayne County residents.

The governments of Oakland, Washtenaw and Macomb counties don't have residency requirements for their employees. Monroe County does.

Palace takeover concerns employees

With the recent acquisition of Oakland University's Meadow Brook Music Festival, the Auburn Hills-based Arena Associates now stands to be more competitive in the already crowded Detroit music market.

President Thomas Wilson doesn't see Meadow Brook and his company's two other properties, The Palace of Auburn Hills and Pine Knob Music Theatre, as competing with each other, however.

"Although Pine Knob and Meadow Brook are outdoor amphitheaters operating during the same season, we see a complementary — not a competitive — situation," Wilson said.

"With the increased popularity of outdoor tours during the summer months, having two facilities gives us the flexibility to provide the appropriate size facility for a show as well as offer more entertainment during the time of year people want to enjoy the Michigan outdoors."

The move will allow the organi-

zation to develop a variety of acts, he said. At a 7,500-seat capacity, the woodsy Meadow Brook stands nearly half the size of Pine Knob and offers a third of The Palace's seating.

The Oakland University Board of Trustees voted Thursday to approve the organization's bid to operate and manage Meadow Brook beginning this summer. Former managers Brass Ring Productions and Olympia Arenas Inc. — which book shows into and run Detroit's Fox Theatre, Joe Louis Arena and Cobo Arena — "chose not to renew their contract under the existing conditions of the agreement," said Paul Bissonnette, Oakland University's vice president for finance and administration. Brass Ring and Olympia Arenas, which had run the venue since 1992, refused to comment, referring all calls to Oakland University officials.

University President Sandra Packard said every attempt was made to hammer out an agreement with the Livonia-based Brass Ring and Detroit's Olympia Arenas.

"We have gone out of our way to get them to stay on, but they had other business decisions that they had to make," Packard told the trustees at their meeting.

The move will allow Arena Associates more leverage in booking shows, Wilson said.

"It will be fun because, first of all, it's a wonderful place to watch shows. It's a great niche for us because we can go to artists or managers and sort of say, 'In this stage of your artist development, where do you see them playing, a small amphitheater . . . or a bigger amphitheater?'"

Arena Associates will be responsible for all event bookings, marketing, group sales, public relations, parking, security and ground maintenance for the festival.

Before Brass Ring and Olympia Arenas began operating the venue in 1992, Meadow Brook had been operating on a \$1.5-million deficit. Meadow Brook has been on the upswing financially since then; however, last year longtime summer tenant the Detroit Symphony Orchestra moved its shows

to Greenfield Village in Dearborn. Despite that, Arena Associates' Wilson said with Meadow Brook he hopes to duplicate the success he has had with The Palace and Pine Knob.

Since its opening in 1988, The Palace has been voted "Arena of the Year" by Performance magazine and twice by Pollstar magazine.

The group took over Pine Knob 3½ years ago and put \$12 million in improvements into the amphitheater. It has become the nation's highest-grossing and most-attended amphitheater.

"We will put improvements into it and program it and book it and breathe a lot of life back into it like we did up north," he said comparing Meadow Brook to Pine Knob.

Concert goers will not see too many major improvements this year, however. Because Arena Associates got involved so close to the summer season, the changes will be aesthetic, he said.

"This year it will mostly be

Photography relates story of homeless

Where words fail, art communicates. Photojournalist Guy M. Warren documents the homeless with hopes that furthering awareness of their pains and struggles will trigger the concern to find long-term solutions.

For those brave enough to look, Warren puts the word homeless into human terms. Using the stark, stripped-down elements of black and white photography, he graphically illustrates what it means to tough it out on the streets of Seattle, San Francisco, San Diego, Boston, Washington, D.C., New York City and Detroit.

Urban Park-Detroit Art Center will exhibit this powerful 45-piece series, "Living on the Edge: Homeless in America," March 11 through April 4 at the Greentown gallery, 508 Monroe in Trapper's Alley.

At an opening reception 6-9 p.m. Friday, March 11, Warren will talk about the stories behind these images that haunt. He asks all who plan to view the exhibition during its run to bring a can or two of food, a blanket or a few dollars to benefit the homeless in a Detroit area shelter.

"I began the project because I recognized a need to bring a greater awareness to the problem of homelessness in the U.S.," he said. "I also felt a need to contribute whatever I could to help. In this case it is through my craft."

"Granted the problem of homelessness is of enormous proportions all across the United States. It's obvious that I can't even begin to scratch the surface of the problem, but I can help."

Through the lenses of 35mm Nikon and Leica cameras, Warren focuses on a kaleidoscope of people in order to straighten out misconceptions: disabled Vietnam veterans, the unemployed, mentally ill, young as well as old, and those who've simply fallen through the cracks after suffering a series of bad breaks.

"I also think being a housewife is a job everyone should do, at least for a little while — it gives you a great big dose of humility. You have to work hard in your life. I don't trust people who don't know that."

Hersh, in town last week for a pre-tour performance at Record Time in Rochester, has worked hard. For the last decade, she has been the catalyst behind Throwing Muses, which formerly included step-sister Tanya Donnelly. Her new project is a recently released 15-song acoustic solo album "Hips and Makers." Although she thought at the time that acoustic music was "wimpy," Hersh is pleased with the project and had a simple reason for doing it.

"My husband (manager Billy O'Connell), he made me do it," she said with a chuckle during breakfast at the Omni Hotel in Detroit.

The album, which includes a guest appearance by R.E.M.'s Michael Stipe, hasn't found its way to too many radio stations' playlists. Locally, CIMX and WDET have played cuts off her album, but program directors in other areas have chosen not to play it because they were already "playing too many women," she said.

"They can't play too many men, though. . . I never had to worry about it (with Throwing Muses) because I always sounded too much like a guy," said Hersh, who sounds nothing like a man. "Good music is all the same and bad music is all

different — like good and bad families.

"I think bad music should be killed. So I guess that means I'm competitive."

If that wish were to come true, there would be plenty of artists wiped off the map.

"We're in Throwing Muses; we hate everyone," she said mocking a common belief in the music industry. The problem with modern mu-

sic, the 27-year-old Hersh said, is that it misrepresents her generation. She cringes at the title "Generation X."

"Before people started talking about Generation X, our generation was a quiet generation that didn't want to get married if we were going to get divorced. We didn't want money or fame. Now it's all 'Reality Bites' and the Pearl Jams of the world that they call Generation X."

The music industry, she added, is "just selling this horrible candy and it's just bad for you."

She does like a few bands — namely Sugar, Pond and the Meat Puppets.

"Whenever I'm pregnant, all I want to hear is the Meat Puppets," said the mother of Dylan, 7, and Ryder, 2. "I even went into labor during one of their shows but I never told them that."

Her strong sentiments about music is what caused her to temporarily break up the Throwing Muses in June 1992.

"I cared so much about music. I was so sick of it being trashed."

She wasn't about to change Throwing Muses' direction in order to widen her audience, she said.

"I didn't want us to turn into a trendy band. Tanya really had ambitions. The songs she was doing weren't really Throwing Muses songs."

Hersh pursued a solo career. Donnelly, also a former member of the Breeders, formed Belly, last summer's darlings of the music scene.

Soon afterward Hersh, the self-described "nicest person in the world," drummer David Narcizo, bassist Bernard Georges reformed the band without Donnelly. Having been in Throwing Muses since she was 14, Hersh realized how therapeutic her band was for her.

"If I couldn't write songs, I would get really sick. They would just get stuck inside of me," the Rhode Island resident said.

Later this year, the band will release its next album "University." The title is a play on the fact that most Throwing Muses fans are college students but it also works well in the marketing area. Her record label has already made up sweatshirts that read "Throwing Muses University."

"University" was an album that Throwing Muses almost didn't record. Due to financial problems, the band was going to break up again. Fortunately, she said, she was able to work out the band's problems and continue her career that she desperately loves.

"I'm in my favorite band. I love it. I really, really love it."

In his teens, Tim March was inadvertently prepared for the attention he would receive as Sweaterfish's flamboyant lead vocalist.

Living in Northbridge, Mass., the self-described "local freak" turned heads with his earring and long black hair, shaved on the sides.

"The first time I wore all black, my teachers asked me if somebody died," the 24-year-old said.

As March grew older, his anger festered. Meanwhile junior high school kids admired him for his individuality and began to mimic his clothing style.

"It was cool but . . . a lot of kids were really obsessed with it. This little girl, she was the sister of a friend,

I went into her room and there was a shrine. People took pictures of me at school in the hallway. I wore this trench coat with all kinds of pins all over it so they called me the 'Button Man.' There were pictures of me on her mirror. She had papers I had thrown away, a rock I had kicked. It became the 'Cult of Tim,'" he said.

Although he feels uncomfortable about the situation, it taught him a valuable lesson in human relations.

"It's so hard when things like that happen. You have to stay humble. You have to make sure that your ego doesn't go 'lump, lump, lump,'" the soft-spoken March said extending his hands from his head.

Warren shows great compassion for the less fortunate, hiding their faces whenever possible to preserve their dignity.

"One guy is totally silhouetted; you can't see who he is. It could be anybody," Warren said. "If I were digging in the trash cans, I wouldn't want the world to see me. There's people walking by, but nobody says here's a couple dollars for a hamburger. Another guy is sleeping in a shopping cart. I watched people walk by. They ignored him like it was commonplace."

Warren began the series in earnest the spring of 1991 as a book project, but the stimulus dates back to 1984. A focal point in the exhibition, the photograph is one of two color blow-ups. Warren took it in New York City while touring with ZZ Top and Detroit's own Iggy Pop as a photographer's assistant.

Large concrete columns loom above a small heap of a man asleep on the steps. It is daylight.

"There's a lot of violence in the shelters so they spend the nights wandering the streets and sleep during the day," he said. "Living in groups, the younger stronger ones take care of the weak."

Warren's wife Elaine, who has provided support throughout the project, points out that the problems of Phoenix's homeless differ greatly from those in Anchoyage. However, they all share a common need, the need for human companionship, a little kindness, a nod to their existence.

"Many migrate with the seasons; many in southern California had come from up north," she said. "It's so easy to be homeless."

Most people are scared of them because in the backs of their minds they realize that could be them. Who doesn't live from paycheck to paycheck?

"The photographs show they're touchable, that they're brothers, they're sisters. We all go through life seeding, planting and watering seeds. If you realize it will come back to you, it's easy to give."

Warren's inspiration for the series came from photographers who recorded the plight of Americans during the Great Depression. Dorothea Lange, Margaret Bourke-White and Walker Evans serve as heroes. In spite of the fact he suffers periodic bouts with depression, Warren plans to continue his social documentary until the homeless cease to exist in this country.

"Why does anyone go out and document this horror? Because they're living less than dogs. Stop work, look," he said.

Two years of searching for a space finally brought Warren's exhibition to light. Gallery owners balked, fearing it would be unprofitable. Arts commissioners declined; the subject matter was too depressing.

Urban Park gallery director Dave Roberts makes it his policy

to show work on the cutting edge. But his reason for exhibiting Warren's documentary series on the homeless came straight from the heart. The images moved him.

"I was compelled to exhibit the work of Guy Warren because not only are the images compositionally strong but also because Warren is attempting to educate and motivate his audience," said Roberts. "The black and white photographs in this exhibit are on one hand technically superb and on the other hand urge an audience response."

"Here we have an example of the inherent literal interpretation of the photographic image being used in a manner that transcends the traditional art exhibit."

Thanks to Roberts at Urban Park, Laura Hardy at Nelson's Gallery in Livonia who provided frames at cost plus volunteered to cut the mats, Detroit artist Janelle Agar for framing assistance, artist/illustrator, Gwen Dietrich and typesetter Monica Zander of A.R. Brasch Advertising in Southfield, 50 percent of the sales of Warren's prints will be donated to a homeless shelter in the Detroit area.

"The minute I saw Guy's photos I knew I wanted to be a part of this project," said Hardy.

He carried his image into his 20s and his band Sweaterfish. Musically, Sweaterfish — which also includes guitarist Eric Livingston, bassist John Hobbs and drummer Paul Valente — reflects all of their styles. The band has been compared to a string of groups ranging from Bauhaus to, strangely enough, the Kinks.

Sweaterfish fan Mark Chownyk describes the band as "refreshingly melodic and disturbingly surreal." It's the classification of "Goth pop" that annoys March.

"Since I have a slim vocal range... there's not too many famous people out there (with voices like that)," explained March whose band covers Bauhaus' "Bela Lugosi's Dead." He describes his band's moody feeling as "brooding with dark overtones."

Although their blend of gothic rock and shoegazer pop is many times considered "retro," March believes that their music is valid today.

"I think it's kind of timeless," said March, while seated in Hobbs' lavish black and white Royal Oak apartment which ironically blends modern and classic art. Hobbs added that Sweaterfish is representative of the music each member enjoys.

"We're just attracted to music that's just kind of timeless. I'm still a big Bauhaus fan and I'm also a big Cure fan... Hopefully that influences our music, too," said Hobbs who personally is flattered by comparisons to

Bauhaus. An unexpected fan of the band turned out to be the legendary New York club CBGB. Sweaterfish was asked to play CBGB only a month after Hobbs submitted materials about the band. That's amazingly quick for any club.

Their September 1993 show was taped by video director Peter Wallach of Peter Gabriel's "Big Time" fame and son of actor Eli Wallach. Hobbs met Wallach while the two were working on a TV commercial in New York. Sweaterfish was flattered but slightly uneasy that someone of that stature was at their gig.

"I was nervous because I know he's worked with some big people... with huge budgets. We were all nervous being in the club in the first place," Hobbs said. Although Hobbs used his connections to get Wallach to film their show, they got the CBGB show based on their talent alone, he said.

Part of Sweaterfish's attraction is their down-to-earth attitude and realistic lyrics — two traits that many people can relate to.

"Our shows are pretty angst-filled. There's real power behind them. A lot of people can associate with it," March said.

"It's their chance to customize our standard product at no extra charge," said Cynthia Feemster of Burberry's at the Somerset Collection in Troy. "We will have four tables filled with hundreds of fabric swatches from which customers can select suits, slacks and blazers in different patterns and solids in silk, linen and wool. For the customer who likes to purchase two pair of pants with every coat, this is the time to order."

Burberry's has offered the trunk service for the past four years each spring and fall, Feemster said. The company's buyer-representative, Paul Goring, attends to ensure that Burberry's customers get the custom-tailored looks they are after.

There is no official "trunk" with the trunk show, just binders of the season's color and fabric samples spread out for customers to feel and peruse. At the trunk show, shoppers can see the complete set of samples available to Burberry's tailors.

Sales consultant Alan Rosen said the suits are priced between \$595 and \$795. All are made of 100-percent natural fabrics no blends. Since all Bur-

berry's suit pants come with pleated slacks, the trunk show takes special orders for plain front pants.

Burberry's suits are made under license agreement by J. Schoeneman of Fifth Avenue in New York. Suits can be special ordered within a few days if they are in stock in New York. The trunk show suits take six-eight weeks to deliver.

When these suits are completed, the customer must return for a final fitting where minor tailoring is performed in house to hem pant legs and shorten or lengthen sleeves.

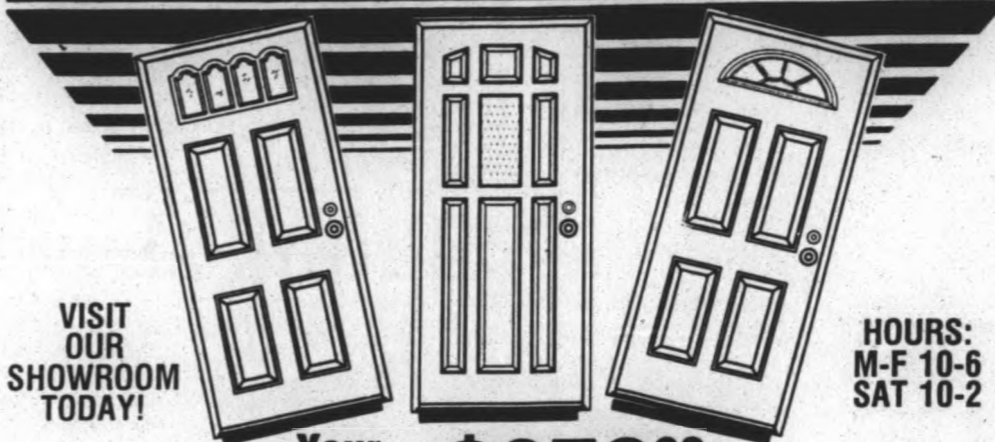

Silver medalist warms to pride of local folks

Unless you were a particularly close observer of the Winter Olympics in Lillehammer, you probably never have heard of John Coyle — even though he's from Oakland County.

But like Nancy Kerrigan, of whom you may have heard more than you care to, he won a silver medal for skating.

Coyle, a West Bloomfield resident, Southfield Christian graduate and frequent of the Birmingham Ice Arena, was a member of the U.S. men's 5,000-meter short track speed skating relay team which took the silver Feb. 26.

Coyle, 25, was honored Thursday, not by a parade through Disney World, but by a ceremony in the Birmingham Public Schools' bus garage, where his mom, Dorothy, works.

He was surrounded not by hordes of strangers trying to decide whether to

shake hands with Mickey Mouse or a skating doll, but by friends, family and local officials who are genuinely proud that he represented their corner of the world so well.

Coyle, unlike Kerrigan, who quickly traded the cold of Norway for the warm, monied skies of Orlando, stayed for the closing ceremonies — a ceremony that imparts the history and spirit of the Olympics upon participants as well as those watching from the stands and from televisions around the world.

Coyle, unlike Kerrigan, didn't have a television crew following his every move, even so close as to pick up ungracious remarks. Kerrigan's disappointment in losing was overheard by the world.

She complained that Oksana Baiul was delayed because the 16-year-old Ukrainian orphan probably had to redo her make-up after her emotional re-

sponse to winning.

In truth, it was because Olympic officials had trouble locating a rendition of the Ukrainian National Anthem for play at the ceremony.

It's very hard to imagine Coyle making such a remark.

After marching in to the red, white and blue-decorated bus garage, with his girlfriend, Billie Thomas, getting a

hug from his mom and a pat from his dad, he confessed: "This is great. I never expected anything like this."

And unlike Kerrigan, he didn't talk of should haves, would haves. Perhaps his expectations weren't gold, as hers surely were, but perhaps they were — or will be, in a future Olympics.

He too has trained — 15 years worth in a type of skating that never holds the pot of gold at the end that figure skating promises — particularly as a member of a relay team.

So along the way he also picked up an engineering degree from Stanford.

"There were a lot of times when things didn't go well and money was tight," Coyle acknowledged. He said his dad kept him at it — never wavering in his support.

Like Kerrigan, after all that effort, Coyle may have initially been more in touch with his personal feelings. Most

of her interviews have revolved around her own views of her performance ("flawless") and seemed to have little relationship to her representation of the United States.

"When you win it, you think, 'That's great,'" Coyle said.

Then: "But when you come home (to the U.S.) you find out you didn't do it just for you but for all these people. I really feel happy about it."

And in that spirit, Coyle may actually end up richer than Kerrigan. Because whether she will be able to feel the pure happiness of the American people through all that silver is a real question.

John Coyle gave his silver medal to his dad for safekeeping. Nancy Kerrigan gave hers to Mickey Mouse.

Dual finance plans neglect needed school reform

Michigan's politicians have shown scant leadership in planning and implementing public school reform. For the most part, so have Michigan's universities.

Rather, the state's stalwarts in this revolutionary arena have been present and recent-past school district executives from the greater metropolitan area such as Bill Keane and Mike Flanagan of Oakland and Wayne County Intermediate School districts; John Schultz, Deborah Anthony, and Beverly Stone of Rochester; Gary Faber of West Bloomfield; and Observer & Eccentric columnist Jim "Doc" Doyle of Troy; soon-to-be Farmington superintendent Bob Maxfield and his past and present Berkeley colleagues Sam Flam, George Blaney, and Tresa Zumsteg.

Others have included John M.

Hoben, Mike Homes and Shirley Spaniel of Plymouth-Canton; Dave Snead of Detroit; Terry Follbaum of Centerline; Marian Ginopolis of Oxford; George DePillo of Warren Consolidated; Beverly Geltner and Karen Roth of Southfield; Betty Davis of Pontiac; and Bob Docking, Gary Doyle, and Dan White of Bloomfield Hills fighting the good fight for reform.

I included the ideas of most of these educators in my Third Annual Telford's Telescope publications when I was Rochester's assistant superintendent of schools (although I doubt many of them wanted this fact publicized at that controversial and tumultuous time). Public school chieftains, though, can't reform the system without help from higher education — nor can they do so without the active good will and good faith of legislators.

Michigan's government in general, and its governor in particular, have failed monumentally to provide the education to which all of the children in this state are entitled. Even so, I've met with one former legislator — gubernatorial candidate Howard Wolpe — and am impressed.

I specifically liked his metaphor

about not removing the patient's heart until a replacement is available — reference to Gov. John Engler's and Sen. Debbie Stabenow's opportunistic initiative to remove the property tax as school support without having a ready replacement.

The "replacements" our Lansing leaders finally came up with (which we'll be forced to choose between on March 15) are like Tweedledum and Tweedledee in that each offers schools the same amount of money. What is really needed, however, is still more money for districts with large pockets of deprived students — and much more creative short- and long-range planning for the state's entire educational institution.

Since I'm obliged to support either Proposal A or its backup, I will vote for A — the sales tax specified in the En-

gler-supported ballot plan. It appears to do the lesser harm to Detroit, which can absorb no more damage. Unlike the backup statutory (income tax) plan, Proposal A gives the voter a say in what he will pay by choosing what and whether to purchase.

The statutory plan lacks the 5 percent cap on tax increases, and it also immediately hits hapless Detroiters with a crushing 9 percent income tax.

Still, what I'd really like to vote for right now is a new governor. And I'd also like to vote for a new Legislature, almost without exception. We need new leaders who have the rare courage to face up to hard choices — and the uncommon wisdom to envision them.

Edison plans area tree trimming

In March and April, Detroit Edison will trim trees in 39 communities, including Canton Township and Livonia. The work is part of the company's \$236 million reliability improvement plan to reduce the number of power outages and storm damage restoration time. Trimming trees to provide a 10-foot minimum clearance with electrical wires helps to reduce the impact of storms on the utility's electrical system. Trees that touch energized

lines can carry electricity and pose safety hazards. In addition, interference from just one tree can cause outages that affect hundreds of customers served by the same electrical circuit. Line clearance crews, in the final year of an accelerated program, trimmed 800,000 trees in 1992 and 750,000 trees last year. The utility will trim trees beyond 1994 on a three and a half to four-year cycle. During the past year, Detroit Edison has reduced the number of customer outages by 50

percent and shortened the length of unavoidable outages by 79 percent, compared with a three-year average prior to the program's start. Trees are trimmed according to National Arborist Association standards, which are designed to protect the trees and keep them healthy. The utility's reliability improvement program also includes adding new circuits, installing more lightning protection for lines and replacing worn or damaged equipment.

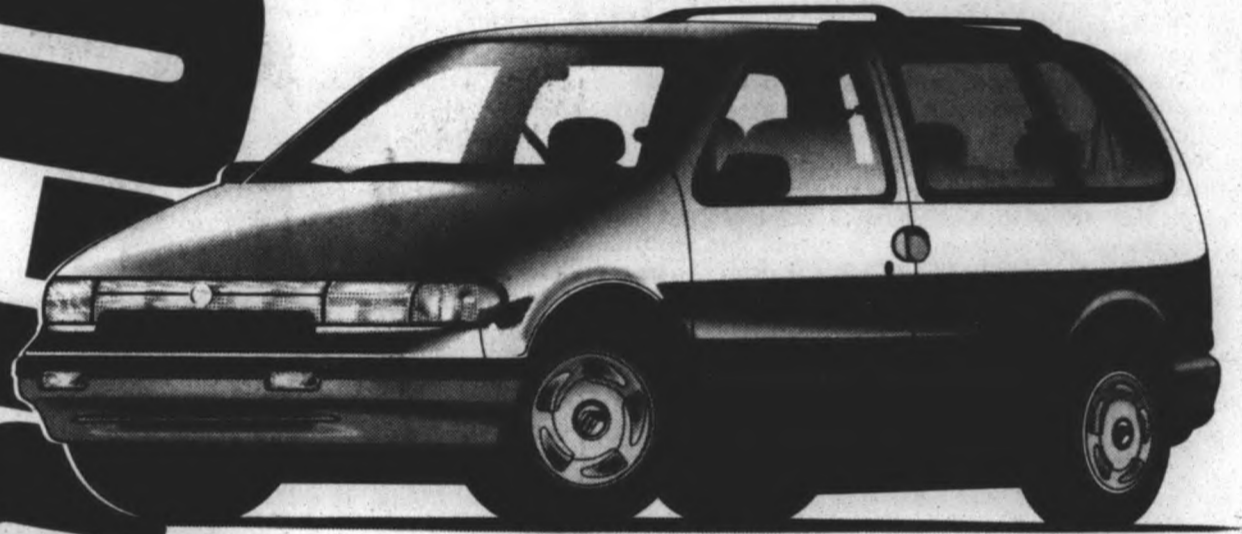

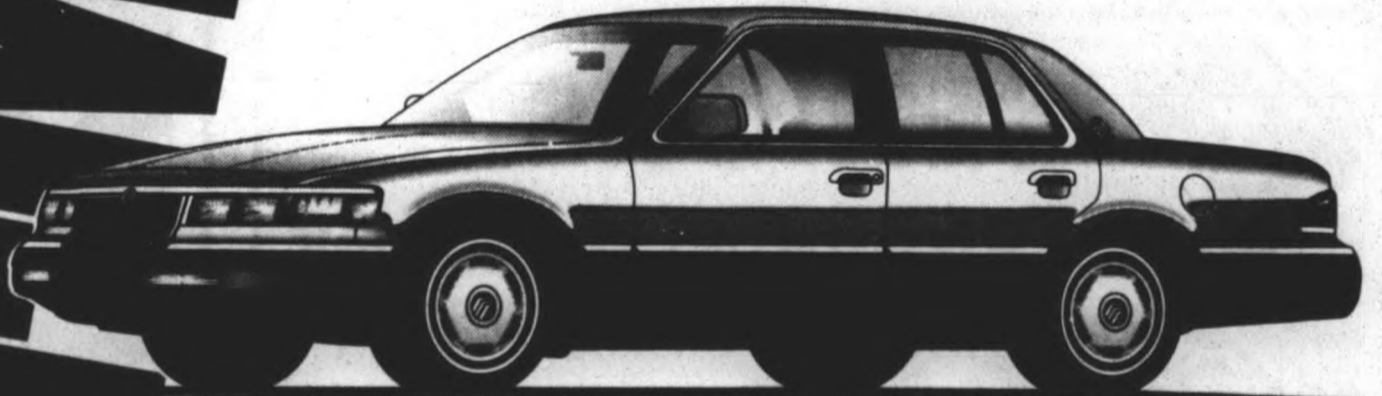

There's a vinegar for every style of cooking

Remember when buying vinegar meant choosing between distilled, cider, red or white? Now, as grocery carts whiz up and down aisles, shoppers stand with profoundly puzzled looks as they stare at an enormous selection of vinegars.

What's a person to do when confronted with raspberry vinegar selling at \$4 a pint on a shelf next to Balsamic vinegar that sells for \$12 a pint. A few inches away is distilled white vinegar, which costs just \$1.39 a gallon.

And those selections, friends, are at the local grocer. Have you checked out the vinegar shelves at gourmet food stores lately? Although there seems to be as many vinegars as wines, there is no reason to feel catatonic in the presence of such abundance.

Vinegar still simply means "vin aigre," sour wine, and is a by-product of fermentation. The production of wine is merely a way station in the process of making vinegar, and the number one job of a winemaker, according to Bob Trinchero of Sutter Home Winery, "is to stop about halfway through the natural progression to vinegar."

Like wine, vinegar can be made from anything that ferments, including molasses, berries, melon, maple syrup, potatoes, barley, malt, beets and even whey.

Prehistoric beginnings

Vinegar has been around since someone accidentally discovered it in prehistoric times when a barrel of fruit was forgotten in a far corner of some cave. We know that Babylonians used it as a preservative and were canny enough to flavor it with herbs. Vinegar is frequently mentioned in the Bible. Greeks and Romans kept vinegar vessels and dipped their bread in it.

There are several types of vinegar. Distilled white is the sharpest and strongest and is made from ethyl alcohol. It is as colorless as water and has no flavor other than its acidity. It is used primarily in pickling, and, in the case of the Janes Gang, as a Mr. Coffee cleaner. Legendary for its cleaning properties, distilled vinegar makes windows sparkle, removes spots, stains and odors.

Malt vinegars are produced from malted barley and potatoes that are first made into a crude beer that is often converted into acetic acid. It is filtered and aged. The British douse malt vinegar on fish and chips, and is one of the main ingredients in Worcestershire sauce.

Most popular variety

Cider vinegar, made by the first settlers from hard cider, is the most popular variety in America. The cider is aged and fermented in red-wood casks for one-two years. It ends up in everything American from catsups to pickles. Cider vinegar is also a great salt remover for snow-dampened shoes.

The Chinese and Japanese are known for their rice vinegars, made from sake with a subtle tang and lightly sweet taste. Rice vinegars are used in hot and sour soup, for pickling, and sauce for spring rolls and pot stickers.

The Germans are known for their potato vinegar, and the French have fruit and overpriced wine vinegars made from what else? - overpriced wines. The saying in France is "you can't make good vinegar from bad wine."

Shoppers can find wine vinegar, sherry vinegar, champagne vinegar and fruit-infusion vinegar, compliments of the French. Of all the vinegars available today, none occasions more comment or popularity than the aceto balsamico.

Balsamic vinegar is the rich, viscous vinegar that is made only in a tiny section of northern Italy around the city of Modena.

There are others that claim to be Balsamic, but good cooks know that the best comes from Modena. What makes Balsamic vinegar from Modena such a find? Sweet grapes are cooked down and filtered and allowed to ferment slowly in a series of wood casks. Its name refers to its health-giving properties as in balm of Gilead, and to the flavors extracted from the barrels of the various woods in which it has aged. It is transferred each year to one of a series of successively smaller barrels of oak, juniper and chestnut, among others.

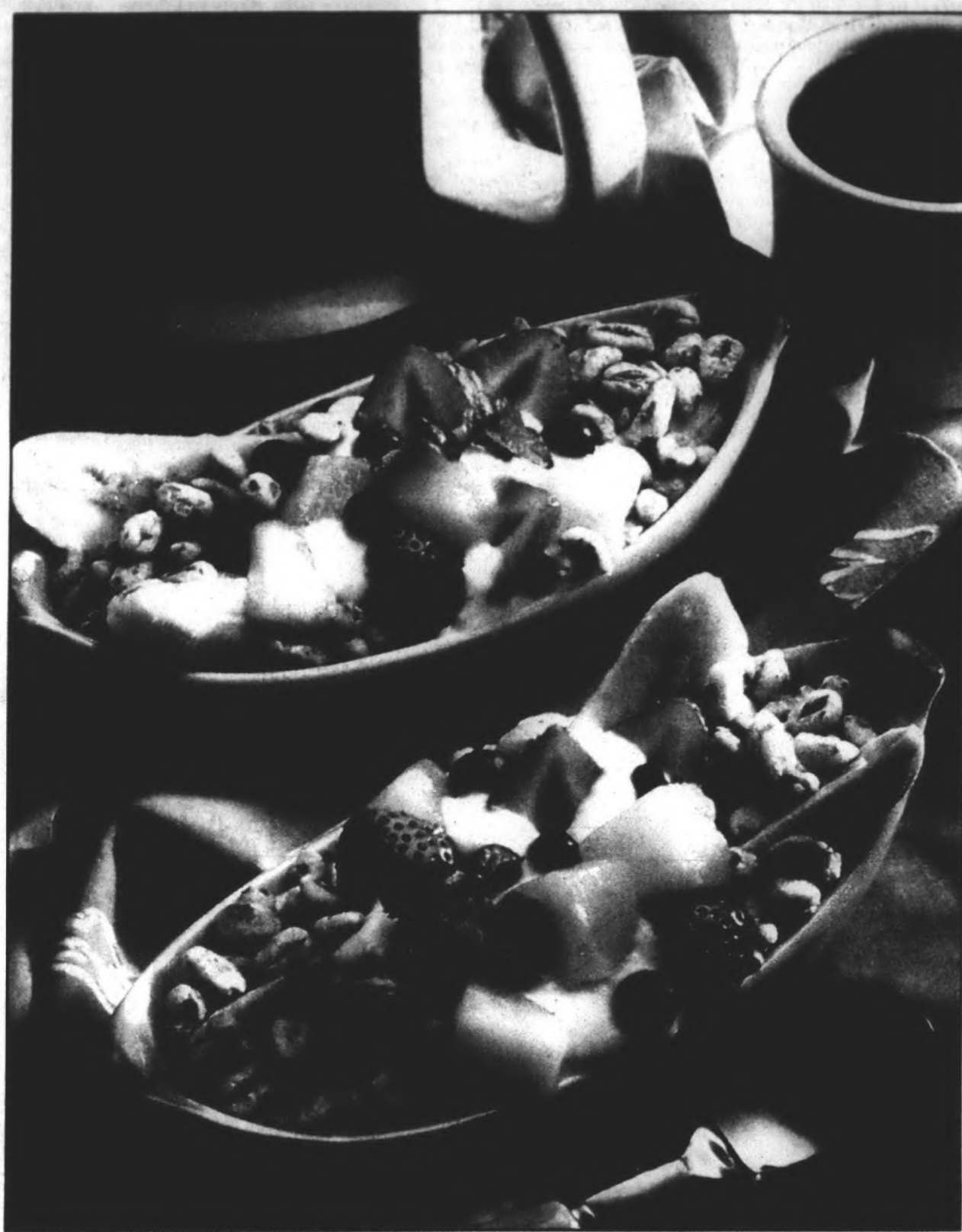

Importer selects finest wines from France's southern Rhone

Focus on Wine

Brands exclusively imports wines from the Perrin family in the southern Rhone. Brothers Francois and Jean-Pierre Perrin are renowned for the wines of Chateau de Beaucastel, Coudoulet de Beaucastel, and La Vieille Ferme.

"We use the traditional grape growing and winemaking methods established by my grandfather," said Francois. "There are two essential concepts: organic grape farming and heating the whole grape before fermentation to extract flavor and color without using sulfur dioxide. Additionally, it should be noted by the consumer that Beaucastel wines are not filtered." A statement related to this is made on the label on the back of the bottle.

At Chateau de Beaucastel in Chateauneuf-du-Pape, all 13 permitted grape varieties are planted. However, the mourvedre grape at 30 percent of the blend, sets the Perrin style for Chateau de Beaucastel Chateauneuf du Pape. The dominance

of mourvedre keeps Beaucastel unique among its neighbors who tend to prefer a greater percentage of grenache and less mourvedre.

Coudoulet de Beaucastel is vinified in the same manner as Chateau de Beaucastel but is made from just four grape varieties: mourvedre, grenache, syrah and cinsault. The vineyards are adjacent to those of Beaucastel across a road separating appellation Chateauneuf-du-Pape from the Cotes du Rhones. This makes Coudoulet de Beaucastel an excellent value for those in the know. Include Coudoulet in a blind tasting of Chateauneuf-du-Papes and you will be convinced.

La Vieille Ferme is a negociant firm created by Jean-Pierre Perrin. He has been able to produce wines of style and distinction at reasonable prices because he is very adept at selecting grower's wines for blending to a consistent style.

"With the 1992 vintage we changed the vinification of La Vieille Ferme Cotes du Luberon Blanc," Perrin reports. "We now employ 10 percent barrel fermentation, which makes the wine rounder and fuller with greater length."

Haas and the Perrin brothers have teamed up in a joint California venture called Tablas Creek Estate Vineyard in Paso Robles. The winery will produce Rhone-style wines exclusively. All budwood necessary for the 85 acres of vineyard comes directly from Chateau de Beaucastel

The wines of the Perrin family imported by Robert Haas through his company Vineyard Brands span the price gamut. La Vieille Ferme wines find few peers in their price range and the wines of Chateau de Beaucastel are at the wine pinnacle in the southern Rhone.

From La Vieille Ferme we recommend: 1992 Cotes du Luberon Blanc (\$7); 1992 Reserve Blanc, Cotes du Rhone (\$8.75); 1990 Cotes du Ventoux Rouge (\$7); and 1990 Rouge Reserve, Cotes du Rhones (\$8.75). You can find lower prices than those quoted in several area wine stores.

Not to be missed under the Coudelet de Beaucastel label are 1992 Cotes du Rhone Blanc (\$22.75) and 1991 Cotes du Rhone Rouge (\$15.75).

Best selections from Chateau de Beaucastel are 1991 Chateauneuf-du-Pape (\$28) and 1990 Chateauneuf du Pape (\$40). On second release special order, your retailer can get both the 1986 and 1983 Chateauneuf-du-Pape at \$42 and \$57 respectively. Ask about these if you're interested.

Development Network in Novi, will explain antioxidants — Beta carotene, and vitamins E and C. There is a \$3 fee. Call 477-6100 to register.

"During the nutrition fair, we'll give people a chance to sample some healthy food items to see how good some of the products are," said Vikki Lasota, clinical nutrition manager at Crittenton Hospital. "There's been a radical taste improvement in low-fat items." The fair will also feature healthy cooking demonstrations,

games and contests to get people excited about nutrition.

The label workshop on March 30 will clear up a lot of the confusion that exists over new labels required by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration on all food packages by May.

A registered dietitian will lead participants through the maze of new terms and explain how to choose healthy food products.

"Studies show that 78-80 percent of us look at food labels when we shop, but we have a hard time interpreting them," said Lasota.

While the Great Pyramid is visually appealing, consumers are also having difficulty understanding the concept of the new USDA Food Guide Pyramid.

At the bottom is the bread, cereal, rice and pasta group. You should have 6-11 servings a day. The next level has two groups — vegetables (3-5 servings a day) and fruits (2-4 servings a day). The third level also has two groups — milk, yogurt and cheese (2-3 servings a day) and meat, poultry, fish, dry beans, eggs and nuts (2-3 servings a day). At the very top are fats, oil and sweets, which you should use sparingly.

"The overall message is to select foods that together give you all the essential nutrients you need to maintain health, without eating too many calories," said Lisa Martin, registered dietitian at St. Mary Hospital in Livonia. See recipes inside.

vineyards. Planting will be completed in 1994-95. "The first vintage will not be released until European vine stock represents 70 percent of vineyard production," Haas reports. The first commercial wines are expected to be available in 1999 — a Haas milestone to usher in a new millennium.

Perrin assessed vintages of the 1990s. He considers 1990 "one of the best" from the southern Rhone and projects optimum drinking of Chateau du Beaucastel Chateaufeuf-du-Pape in 2010. There was a difficult harvest in 1991. "We bulked out 50 percent of the juice," he said. "The wine we bottled is soft and fruity and good to drink now." Better fortunes were experienced in 1992, and Perrin used the words "ripe, extracted, elegant and pleasantly soft" to describe the wines. He ex-

pects the 1993 wines to show better than 1992s and rates them "more in the style of the 1988."

cup vegetable juice.

■ Fruit group — one medium apple, banana, or orange, ½ cup chopped, cooked or canned fruit, ¾ cup juice.

■ Milk, yogurt, cheese group — 1½ ounces of natural cheese, 2 ounces of process cheese, one cup milk or yogurt.

■ Meat, poultry, fish, dry beans, eggs and nuts group — two-three ounces cooked lean meat, poultry or fish, ½ cup cooked dry beans, 1 egg, ½ cup nuts or 2 tablespoons peanut butter.

Saucy fish cooks fast in microwave

AP — Mayonnaise and sour cream give silky richness to a simple sauce that'll go with almost any fish. A hint of ginger and dill provide the background flavor. Just spoon the stir-together sauce over partially cooked fish and cook in your microwave oven for a couple of extra minutes.

FISH FILLETS WITH CREAMY SHRIMP SAUCE

- ½ cup mayonnaise or salad dressing
- 2 tablespoons dairy sour cream
- 1 teaspoon snipped fresh dill or ¼ teaspoon dried dillweed
- ½ teaspoon minced dried onion
- ¼ teaspoon ground ginger
- Dash salt
- ¼ cup peeled, cooked small shrimp
- 1 pound fresh or frozen fish fillets, thawed (such as cod,

- sole or flounder)
- 1 tablespoon margarine or butter
- Lemon wedges (optional)
- Fresh dill sprigs (optional)

In a small mixing bowl stir together mayonnaise or salad dressing, sour cream, dill, onion, ginger and salt. Stir in shrimp; set aside. Arrange fillets in a 12- by 7½- by 2-inch microwave-safe baking dish. Dot with margarine or butter. Cover with waxed paper. Cook on 100 percent power (high) for 5 to 7 minutes or until fish just begins to flake easily, turning dish once.

Spoon sauce atop fish. Cover and cook on high for 1½ to 2 minutes more or until sauce is heated through. If desired, serve with lemon wedges and dill sprigs. Makes 4 servings.

FISH IN FOIL

- For each serving you will need:
- 1 (12-inch) square of foil
- 1 (3 to 4 ounce) portion of flounder or sole

Pickled veggies simply delicious

BALSAMIC VEGETABLES

- 1 quart white wine vinegar
- 2 1/2 cups water
- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1 tablespoon coarse salt
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon fresh ground black pepper
- 1 1/2 teaspoons chopped fresh basil or 1/2 teaspoon, dried
- 3 medium bell peppers, cut into strips
- 3 medium yellow bell peppers, cut into strips
- 1/2 medium head cauliflower, cut into bite sized florettes
- 10 pearl onions, peeled
- 1/2 cup balsamic vinegar

In a 4-quart heavy non-aluminum saucepan, combine the wine vinegar, water, olive oil, salt, sugar, pepper and basil. Bring to a boil and simmer 2-3 minutes.

Drop the peppers and cauliflower into the vinegar and return to a boil. Cover and cook 2 minutes. Remove vegetables with a slotted spoon, leaving the marinade in the saucepan.

Place the vegetables in 2 one quart jars. Add the onions to the hot marinade and cook 5 minutes. Remove onions with a slotted spoon and add to the vegetables. Boil the marinade, uncovered for 5 minutes. Remove from the heat and stir in balsamic vinegar and pour the marinade over the vegetables in the jars. Cover all pieces, adding a little

BALSAMIC VINAIGRETTE

- 18 large cloves garlic, cut into 1/4 inch dice
- About 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 3-6 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 3 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon dark brown sugar
- Salt and fresh ground black pepper to taste

In a medium skillet, slowly cook the garlic in the olive oil over very low heat for 8 minutes or until barely colored. Remove garlic with a slotted spoon and reserve. Turn the heat to medium high and add the vinegars to the oil.

Cook for 1 minute or until the acid has diffused slightly. Add the brown sugar and allow the mixture to bubble slowly for 1 minute. Taste for a sweet/tart balance. You might wish to add a little extra brown sugar or balsamic vinegar to taste.

If the dressing is too sharp, boil for a few moments to boil off some of the vinegars acid. Stir in the reserved garlic and season with salt and pepper. Set aside until ready to serve. Serve over greens, Parmesan Reggiano and Prosciutto and toss lightly. Makes about 1 cup.

Tips for storing convenience foods

"There is a 'whole new world' of foods on our grocery shelves nowadays," said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Michigan State University Extension Service, Oakland County office.

Many types of packaging materials are being used now that were unheard of a few years ago. Also, many sugar- and fat-substitutes are incorporated in our food.

"It used to be simple to know which groceries should go in refrigerator or in the cupboard and how long to keep them," said Treitman. "Today, however, the new ingredients and packaging makes it very confusing. The new shelf-stable microwave meals are an example of modern technology. They can remain on the shelf for 18 months because of special packaging."

Since storing these new foods can be confusing, here is some information to help you keep your

foods safe.

■ Look for the words "refrigerate" or "freeze," "do not freeze," or "refrigerate after opening."

■ "Sell by" — means the last day the item should be sold by the store.

■ "Best if used by" — the food should retain top eating quality until that date.

■ "Expiration date" — the last date a food should be eaten or used.

Select foods that will help you fortify your health

Food fortifies our bodies in an amazing number of ways. Certain nutrients help our immune systems (the series of barriers that protect against invasion from bacteria, viruses and other harmful organisms) slow down changes that can occur with aging, and lower risk of cancer and heart disease.

Some of the most fortifying foods are fruits and vegetables. Citrus fruits, cantaloupes, sweet red and green peppers and papayas are especially nutritious because they are all packed with vitamin C, an important antioxidant. Antioxidants lower the risk of cancer and cataracts by preventing damage to vital cell structures that can come from substances produced during normal body reactions. Vitamin C also blocks the formation of cancer-causing nitrosamines, reducing the danger of stomach cancer.

Leafy green and dark yellow vegetables have other important health boosters: beta-carotene, the form of vitamin A found in

plant foods; and folate, a B vitamin. Both are important to a strong immune system, and both work to lower cancer risk.

Broccoli is a good combination source of vitamins A and C, as well as a cancer-fighting substance called sulphoraphane. Broccoli is a cruciferous vegetable, as are cabbage, cauliflower and Brussels sprouts. Protective substances in cruciferous vegetables, called indoles, have been linked with lower cancer risk.

Whole-grain breads and cereals provide dietary fiber, which seems to lower risk of colon cancer, and vitamin E, an immune system booster and another antioxidant that can lower cancer risk. Grains also contain selenium, another type of antioxidant that is also found in seafood and lean meats.

Fish are good sources of omega-three fatty acids, especially fish from cold waters such as salmon, tuna, and sardines. These fatty acids help protect against heart disease and may lower cancer risk. Fish and shellfish also con-

tain zinc, vital to the immune system. Getting zinc from seafood and other foods (lean meats, whole grains and low-fat dairy products) is safer than taking large doses of zinc supplements, which can actually weaken the immune system.

Easy Seafood Stew, a recipe from the American Institute for Cancer Research, combines carrots, garlic, onion, and other vegetables with fish to provide a wealth of nutrients. Serve it with whole-grain bread or rolls.

EASY SEAFOOD STEW

- 2 cups tomato juice, preferably salt-free
- 1 cup water
- 2-3 medium potato
- 1 cup carrots, slice
- 4-6 green onions, slice
- 1-2 cloves garlic, mince
- 1 cup celery, slice
- 1 bay leaf
- ½ teaspoon basil
- ½ pound fish filets (preferably white-fleshed fish such as

cod, flounder, or sole
¼ to ½ pound sea scallops
Pepper to taste

Combine the tomato juice and water in a large saucepan or pot and bring to a boil. Meanwhile, peel the potatoes and chop them into half-inch cubes. Add them to the juice mixture when it is boiling, and lower the heat to a simmer. Chop the carrots, onions, garlic and celery and add to the pot. Add the bay leaf. Simmer the mixture for 15 more minutes, or until potatoes are tender.

If the scallops are large, cut them in half. Cut the fish into chunks the same size as the scallops, and add the fish and scallops to the stew. Add more water if necessary for desired consistency. Simmer for about 5 minutes, or until the seafood is white and opaque, but not overcooked and rubbery. Season with a dash of pepper, remove the bay leaf, and serve.

Each of the four servings contains 1 to 2 grams of fat and about 215 to 240 calories.

Here's a recipe to try from Vera Ambrose and Kelli Lewton of 2 Unique Catering.

BAKED MIDWEST APPLES

- 6 Granny Smith apples, cored and cut into pieces
- 2 cups of water
- 12 ounces maple syrup
- 12 ounces dried cherries
- ½ cup walnuts, toasted
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon

Put apples and dried cherries in a glass baking dish. Mix together water, ½ of the maple syrup and cinnamon.

Pour mixture over top and bake at 350. Continue basting apples with maple syrup until apples become tender. Garnish with walnuts.

Baked Midwest Maple Apples is a great side dish for baked chicken or pork.

Tips for baking yeast breads

AP — The satisfaction of baking your own bread comes twice. First, there's the pleasure of working the dough with your hands. Then comes the delight of biting into a still-warm slice of wheaty goodness. Your satisfaction is guaranteed if you follow the yeast-bread baking primer below.

Getting a Rise from yeast
Working with yeast requires care and attention, whether you're using regular or quick-rise yeast. (Quick-rising yeast can be a great shortcut for bread bakers, as it can cut the dough's rising time by a third.)

Temperatures that are too hot or too cold will kill the yeast, so the bread won't rise. Use a thermometer to make sure the liquid mixture is just the right temperature, and choose a warm, but not hot, area for rising. Find a draft-free area with the optimum temperature of 80 degrees F to 85 degrees F for raising your dough. Our test kitchen recommends the oven for rising.

To use your oven, place the bowl of dough in an unheated oven on the upper rack, then set a large pan of hot water under the bowl on the oven's lower rack.

Kneading tips you need
Kneading develops good

bread texture, and the amount of flour you use on the kneading surface will affect the moistness of the dough. You can have a sticky problem if you use too little flour or a tough task if you use too much. Many bread recipes give a range for the amount of flour, so start by using the minimum amount as a guideline. If the dough seems sticky, knead in more flour, a little at a time, but do not go over the maximum amount given.

Terms such as soft dough, moderately soft dough, moderately stiff dough and stiff dough are standard terms used to describe the consistency of bread dough. To achieve the proper stiffness, knead the dough for the suggested length of time and identify the stiffness specified in the recipe.

To double-check that you've kneaded the dough long enough, set a timer for the time period suggested in the recipe. You can take a break during the kneading time; just be sure the total kneading time is as long as the recipe suggests.

Here is how to identify the stiffness of dough:

■ Soft dough is very sticky and is used for breads that don't require kneading, such as batter breads.

■ Moderately soft dough is slightly sticky and may be kneaded on a floured surface. It is used for most sweet breads.

■ Moderately stiff dough is not sticky but yields slightly to the touch. It kneads easily when on a floured surface, and is used for most unsweet breads.

■ Stiff dough is firm to the touch and kneads easily on a lightly floured surface. It will, however, have some resilience and will hold its shape after it is kneaded. Chewy-textured breads, such as French breads, are made from this type of dough.

Judging doneness

Baking the bread to golden perfection also makes for great bread. You easily can check your bread for doneness by tapping the top of the loaf with your finger. When you get a hollow sound, the bread is done. Rolls and coffeecakes don't need to be tapped. When their tops are golden brown, remove them from the oven.

Solving problems

The final measure of success lies in looking at the baked loaf. If you notice any of the following problems, try some of these solutions next time you bake. If your bread is heavy and compact:

Be sure the liquid added to the yeast is at the temperature recommended in the recipe. Check the accuracy of your thermometer.

Don't exceed the maximum amount of flour given in the recipe. Add just enough flour to make the dough the proper stiffness.

Use an oven thermometer to check the temperature of your oven. Baking at too low a temperature can result in heavy bread. If the top crust separates from the bottom of the loaf:

Shape into a loaf by gently pulling dough into a loaf shape and tucking edges beneath.

Loosely cover the loaf with a dish towel or waxed paper during rising.

Let the loaf rise just until nearly double, then pop it into the oven.

If the crust is thick:

Use an oven thermometer to check the temperature of your oven. Baking at too low a temperature can result in a thick crust.

If the texture is crumbly:

Be sure not to add too much flour. Use the amount of flour called for in the recipe.

Let the dough rise just until double for the first rising, then until nearly double for the second rising.

Festive ice cream cake has minty taste

AP — What's green as a shamrock, zesty as an Irish jig and perfect for St. Patrick's Day on March 17? A mint ice cream cake.

This festive cake has a rich, luxurious taste that belies its easy preparation: a simple matter of refreshing mint chocolate chip ice cream nestled in a quick buttery shortbread cookie crust. The finishing touches consist of a crown of sweetened whipped cream and easy-to-make chocolate shamrocks.

MINT ICE CREAM CAKE

- 5 1/2-ounce package shortbread cookies
- 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- 1/2 gallon mint chocolate chip or pistachio ice cream, slightly softened
- 1/2 cup heavy (whipping) cream
- 1 tablespoon granulated sugar
- 3 Chocolate Shamrocks (recipe below)

In the bowl of a food processor, place cookies; process until crushed; transfer to a small bowl. With a fork, stir in sugar and melted butter until crumbs are moistened.

In a 9-inch springform pan, press crumb mixture over the bottom; place in freezer until set; about 30 minutes. Spread ice cream evenly over crumb mixture; cover and freeze until firm, about 3 hours. Fifteen minutes before serving, in a medium bowl with an electric mixer, whip heavy cream and the 1 tablespoon sugar until stiff peaks form. Remove cake from freezer; pipe whipped cream around edge. Arrange three Chocolate Shamrocks in the center. Let cake stand at room temperature for 10 minutes before serving. Makes one 9-inch cake (12 servings).

To make Chocolate Shamrocks: Line a baking sheet with waxed paper. Make a shamrock template by drawing a 2-inch shamrock on cardboard; cut out. Using the shamrock template, trace three shamrocks onto waxed paper; set aside.

Melt 2 squares (2 ounces) semi-sweet chocolate. Scrape into a small, resealable plastic bag; snip off one corner from the bag to form a very small hole; trace shamrock outlines with chocolate, filling in centers with chocolate. Freeze until firm. When ready to use, remove carefully from waxed paper.

Produce pointers

Here are some answers to your produce questions from the Produce Marketing Association.

I've heard that excess handling of fruits and vegetables can cause them to shrivel or wilt. Why does that happen?

Fruits and vegetables are made up of mostly water. In fact, water accounts for 80 to 90 percent of

the composition of most items. Obviously, rough handling, which causes damage, will promote significant water loss.

Most fruits and vegetables are covered with a natural wax. Excess handling, even if done gently, can remove the natural coating of wax and again will promote moisture loss.

Don't leave food on counter to defrost

"My mother still insists on defrosting her meat on the counter, how can I convince her that this isn't safe?"

This is a very commonly asked

question on the Food and Nutrition Hotline, said Sylvia Treithman, home economist for the Michigan State University Extension, Oakland County office.

There is good reason to be concerned. Food should never be defrosted at room temperature because bacteria can multiply rapidly and may cause food

poisoning. Some "old time" methods of food handling may no longer be safe.

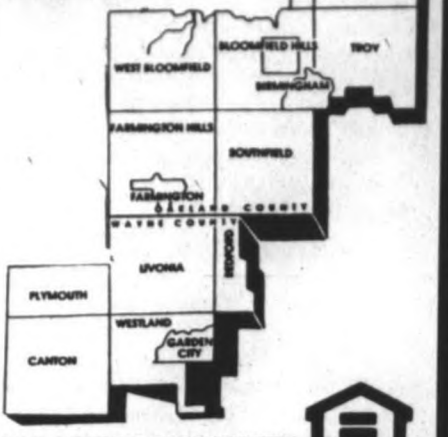

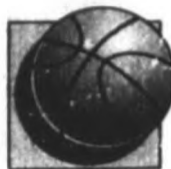

Hail to the Chiefs — 74-56



In a struggle between relative strangers — at least in terms of the Western Lakes Activities Association basketball final — a mix of determination and defense proved difficult to dislodge. Plymouth Canton had both, parlaying them into a league title.

Tadarius Rachal proudly reminded anyone standing in the vicinity of the Plymouth Canton locker room that what happened Friday night — Canton's 74-56 triumph over Farmington in the Western Lakes Activities Association championship basketball game at Northville — fulfilled his prediction of a year ago.

"I told you so," Rachal said. "I told you on the last day of last year we'd win it."

Rachal's promise was filled with something the Chiefs lacked early this season, when they lost four of their first six games: confidence. Not that they didn't believe in themselves, or in the pressure defense coach Dave VanWagoner preached, or in their ability to rebound with bigger teams.

But it took a while for it all to mesh. After their loss to Plymouth Salem in their WLAA opener, it did — to the tune of 12 wins in their last 14 games.

Farmington's season followed a different flow. The Falcons, normally a team scratching to reach the break-

even mark, won seven of their first eight. Their most lethal weapon: quickness.

When two teams built on speed meet for the championship, something has to give. It did.

"They're too quick for us," said Falcon coach Denny Mikel. "That's the bottom line."

The end came early for Farmington — in the first two quarters, when the Falcons managed to make just 5-of-29 shots. Canton was in control, with a 37-21 advantage at the half.

Defense again paved the path to victory for the Chiefs. The Falcons simply could not find many good shots, and when they did, they couldn't convert.

"We didn't shoot the ball well, but they did a good job of not letting us shoot the ball," Mikel said. "We got in a hole early and never did get out of it. They're too good a team to get that far down to. We have no excuses. I think the better team won today."

VanWagoner called Farmington "one of the quicker teams we've played." Then he smiled and added, "But we're the quickest team in the league."

How bad was it? Scott Menser, Farmington's long-range threat, scored 12 points but hit just 4-of-18 shots. Steve Juncaj, another top Falcon scorer, was 2-of-6, getting just five points.

The first quarter was more than half over before Menser buried a 25-foot three-pointer — and that was Farmington's first basket. It trimmed Canton's lead to 9-7 with 3:35 left.

That was as close as the Falcons got. Their only lead in the game came on Stan Lewis' two free throws 18 seconds into the opening quarter.

After Menser's triple, Canton outscored Farmington 11-4 to take a 20-11 advantage into the second quarter — which they started with a 9-1 run. By halftime it was 37-21, with Ron Hunter scoring 10, Matt Paupore nine and Rachal seven in the first half for Canton.

But the Chiefs have a multiple assault group, and it was Ted Docks that got them jump-started in the third quarter, scoring the first basket and making three steals in the opening two minutes. That fueled a 12-4 streak that dug that hole even deeper for the Falcons — 49-25.

They didn't give up, however; they scored the next nine points to narrow the gap to 15. But Canton closed the third quarter almost the same way they started it — with a 12-5 run, which made it 61-39 entering the fourth.

The Chiefs struggled through the first half of the final period, and the Falcons closed again, outscoring them 17-5 in the first 5:05 to make it a 10-point game, 66-56. Jason Jackson's eight points led the comeback.

But there wasn't enough time. As VanWagoner put it, the difference was "our defense and this tremen-

dous desire to win. Our guys just wouldn't be denied tonight."

Paupore ended up with a game-high 20 points. Hunter had 14, Rachal 11 and Rob Radney nine. For Farmington, joining Menser in double figures was Lewis with 17 — but just 11-of-21 from the free throw line — and Jackson with 12.

"There's no doubt they're a quick team, and that's the only thing we have going for us," Mikel summarized. "When we play a quicker team, we're in trouble."

Against Canton, the trouble started early and never really subsided.

Guard Charles Smith is quiet, but silky smooth for Borgess. The loss of Perry Robinson (left team) won't make a difference.

FRONT-END ALIGNMENT

Plymouth Salem (17-3): Won several close games throughout the year, but late season tailspin, plus adversity, has the Rocks feeling a bit shaky. If healthy, senior center James Head needs to play more with the fire of a Dennis Rodman if the Rocks are going to get through the Northville district.

Westland John Glenn (15-4): We know 6-foot-9 Guy Rucker can block shots and rebounds like a Cadillac (not Anderson), but how about getting him the ball more in post position? The Rocks have a tough road to hoe at the Romulus district with the likes of the host Eagles, Livonia Franklin, Wayne Memorial or state-ranked Belleville (in the final).

COOLING SYSTEM

Farmington (13-7): Want to drag? Check out that dual exhaust. Let's squeal some tires. This is by far Oberverland's most hot-headed group, but the talent is there if they play together. Coach Denny Mikel's team is the favorite at Bloomfield Hills Lahser. A rare trip to the regional is not out of the question.

WHEEL BALANCING

North Farmington (10-10): Another team capable of winning the wide-open Lahser district. They have size (Evan Ellis and Scot Lord) and a capable guard in John Pennala running the point. Lost to Glenn last week by only two.

Rocks, minus star, overcome Mustangs

Plymouth Salem showed a great deal of grit in its final regular-season basketball game, overtaking Northville on its home court to post a 63-55 victory in the consolation game of the Western Lakes Activities Association Tournament Friday.

Salem takes a 17-3 record into the state tournament. Northville is 12-8.

The Rocks trailed 42-41 entering the last period. They were playing without their 6-foot-6 all-league forward, James Head, who was sidelined with an illness that has plagued him for the past three weeks.

In addition, coach Bob Brodie remained out of action, attending to his 14-year-old son Joe, who suffered a severe neck injury in a skiing accident 11 days ago. Surgery was performed last Tuesday.

BASKETBALL

Both Head and Brodie could be back for Salem's first state district game, which will be Wednesday against the Plymouth Canton-Northville winner.

In the win over Northville Friday, the Rocks started the final quarter with a vengeance. They outscored the Mustangs 14-4 in the first half of the period, getting six points from Harold Shanks and five from Doug Herriman to go up, 55-46. Northville never got closer than five after that; Salem posted a 22-13 fourth-quarter advantage.

James McDonald, working inside against the much-bigger Mustangs — their starting front line

measures 6-foot-11, 6-7 and 6-6 — paced Salem with 18 points. Dan McKian netted 14 and Herriman had 10. Northville got 15 from Josh Williams and 12 from John Farrar.

GREENHILLS 62, PCA 44: Plymouth Christian Academy struggled in the first half, and it got the Eagles into a hole they could not clamber out of in their regular-season finale Friday at Ann Arbor Greenhills.

PCA finishes its regular season with a 9-11 record; Greenhills is 11-8.

The Eagles trailed 20-10 after one quarter and 37-17 at the half. The deficit grew to 52-27 entering the final period.

Aaron Jones' 10 points and five rebounds led PCA. Ryan Thomason had nine assists.

Salem gets just what Rocks crack Chiefs it needs for title run to earn region berth

Go ahead and try — plan an intricate strategy. Leave no detail unexamined in plotting a preseason path toward winning a second straight state title.

Know what? No hypothetical map could do a better job guiding a team to that goal than the route followed by Plymouth Salem's girls gymnastics team this season.

As Rocks' coach Johanna Anderson admitted after her team easily won the Region II championship Saturday at Plymouth-Canton, "We're in a good position to repeat."

No arguing that, not after examining Saturday's results. Salem won with 143.15 points, which, pending other regional results, edged the state's previous best team score this year — 143.00, posted by Birmingham Seaholm.

Canton was second with 137.25 and Ann Arbor Huron was third with 135.40. All three teams qualify for the state meet, which will begin at 3:30 p.m. Friday at Westland John Glenn.

Glenn placed sixth in the 17-team region with 133.85, and Wayne Memorial was 16th with 42.66.

OK, everyone figured Salem and Canton would finish 1-2 in the region. But going into the meet, Anderson had another concern. "It's always nice to have an extra girl or two in each event," she explained while awaiting Saturday's final results.

Teams that qualify can take their top four scorers to state. If they have more than four among the top eight finishers in each individual event (top six in the all-around), however,

Plymouth Salem reasserted itself Saturday in the Class A district volleyball tournament at Livonia Churchill, capturing the title with a 15-7, 15-1 win over rival Canton.

The Rocks, now 38-6-6 overall, looked more like the team that had gone 11-0 during the Western Lakes Activities Association regular-season schedule.

They wiped out a week's frustration on the same court after being stung the previous week in the WLAA playoffs. The Rocks were ousted in pool play on a tiebreaker by one point.

Ironically, Churchill, the WLAA playoff champion, was eliminated in Saturday's semifinals by upstart Canton, 15-10, 15-8. Salem, meanwhile, clobbered

Northville in the other semifinal, 15-1, 15-1.

"I just think the kids were re-focused, that's all," Salem co-coach Brian Gilles said. "I'm not saying getting eliminated last week was the sole reason we came back and played well today."

"We had a tremendous week of practice and it showed in the way we played. I just think we were too good a team not to come through this thing."

The fired-up Rocks won their second straight district crown as junior Paula Dombrowski recorded 14 kills on the day. Teammate Julie McGur-in served nine aces.

In the final, Karen Gundry and setter Erin Koch each contributed four kills. Sophomore Shelly had two blocks.

they can take additional entries. Only the top four in each event count in the team's score, but the insurance could come in handy.

Salem has that insurance — in every event. As expected, Canton's Katey Gilles extended her unbeaten string in all-around competition with a masterful performance. Gilles won every event, scoring 9.6 in the vault, 9.2 in the uneven parallel bars, 9.35 in the balance beam and 9.55 in the floor exercise. Her first-place all-around total was 37.70.

The surprise came after that. The next five in the all-around standings were all from Salem: Melissa Hopson, second (36.80); Alysia Sofios, third (35.65); Sarah Makins, fourth (35.30); Zoe Yockey, fifth (34.90); and Kristen Kosik, sixth (34.65). All five qualified for each event at state.

"I didn't know that was going to happen," said Anderson. "It makes me really happy, especially to have our best (team) score now. Now we need to do that next week."

Sure, it was gratifying to see her team peaking at the right time — particularly after the Rocks' somewhat shaky start.

"We've progressively improved all year," she said. "This has been a much more difficult year. Last season we had tremendous depth. We didn't lose all year. By the time we got to state, everybody figured we were going to win."

"But we lost two top gymnasts. This year we've been the underdogs all season. Our goal at the beginning of the year was to be in the top three at

state. Now I think we can win it."

Again, depth is the key to Salem's success. The Rocks have five Division I gymnasts; Canton has one (Gilles). When Sofios returned (she missed part of the season due to a commitment to the cheerleading squad), it seemed to push them over the hump.

"She definitely adds to the team score," said Anderson. "She gives us more depth. The whole idea is to have five girls qualify."

Which the Rocks did. Canton's Gilles, meanwhile, will be gunning to become the first freshman to win the Division I all-around championship in five years (the last was Salem's Kim Miller, in 1989).

Canton coach John Cunningham wasn't overjoyed with his team's performance — "We had a decent meet. I was pleased we got second," he said — but it got his team where he wanted it to be, the state final.

As for Salem, the stars must be in the right alignment: having to overcome the loss of two top gymnasts, battling the underdog's role, finishing poorly (for them) at early season invitations, then getting Sofios back.

Factor in that many of the state's top teams were at the Rochester regional, which means it will be more difficult for them to qualify more than four per event, and it's easy to envision what the future holds for the Rocks.

Traylor carries Pilots past CC

If there is a high school basketball player capable of stopping Detroit Murray-Wright junior center Robert Traylor in the low post, Traylor is still looking for him.

"It's possible (to find someone)," said Traylor, a 6-foot-9, 290-pounder. "But I can't give you the exact name."

Traylor scored 26 points and grabbed nine rebounds as Murray-Wright defeated Redford Catholic Central, 79-61, in the Operation Friendship game Saturday at the University of Detroit-Mercy's Calihan Hall.

Traylor turns 17 this year. Imagine how big he'll be when he quits growing.

Traylor made nine of 13 shots, including three monster dunks,

and also helped redirect several CC shots in the paint. The Shamrocks led 14-12 after one quarter and trailed 35-31 at halftime before making only eight of 29 shots from the field in the second half.

Murray-Wright, 15-3 overall and ranked No. 1 in Class A, led 51-46 after three quarters and scored the first nine points of the fourth quarter to stop CC's upset bid.

Isiah Carter, a 6-7 junior forward who looks puny next to Traylor, scored 10 of his 12 points in the second half for the Pilots. Senior guard Edward Novell contributed 15 points and fed Traylor for several easy baskets, including an alley-oop dunk with 6:55 remaining that gave Murray-Wright a 59-46 lead.

Murray-Wright outrebounded CC 45-34. CC made only four of 19 shots in the fourth quarter and was 19 of 57 for the game (33 percent).

"No. 54 (Traylor) is a franchise, there's no doubt about it," CC coach Bernie Holowicki said. "We doubled on Traylor a lot and left 12 (Novell) open too much. I'm not happy with the way we played. Before the game, we were in awe of 54 and lost some edge. We had a satisfied look that what we've accomplished is fine."

Senior guard Andy Slankster and 6-6 senior center Joe Daly played gutsy games for CC.

Slankster scored 21 points, including a trio of three-point shots, and Daly did his best against Traylor, scoring 17 points on six-of-nine shooting to go with a

game-high 11 rebounds. The Shamrocks trailed by as many as 10 early in the third quarter, but Justin Hoener's three-point play cut the deficit to 44-41 with 3:01 remaining. Murray-Wright failed to score on its next possession and CC could have tied the score, but Mike Ridley's three-point shot was no good.

A layup by Novell and a put-back by William Messenger put Murray-Wright up 48-41 in the last minute of the third quarter.

Ridley, a junior guard, made only two of nine shots and scored five points. Senior guard Andy Kummer was held scoreless.

Traylor sat the last 3:01 of the third period because of foul trouble but scored nine points in the fourth quarter.



"I didn't do anything differently," said Broner. "I think it was that suddenly the players started to believe in what they can do."

Broner has been Grenan's assistant for six years; these were the third and fourth games he has substituted for him.

The win over Mott was anything but easy. The two teams had split their regular-season series, and both games were close.

This one was no different; SC's halftime lead was just 33-31.

With the game tied and the clock running down in the second half, Newlin was fouled. Following a Mott timeout, she missed the first free throw but got the second one to fall for the game-winning point.

Tricia Kazyaka, playing her best basketball of the season, led SC with 16 points and nine rebounds. Alisa Wechter had 14 points, Angie Cerne 12 and Cindy Muha 10. Sonya Booth triggered Mott's attack with eight three-

pointers and a game-high 29 points. Amy Fabal added 11.

Against St. Clair, which has won three straight Eastern Conference titles, SC fell behind 45-34 at the half and never caught up. However, the Ocelots battled throughout.

"We hung with the third-ranked team in the country," said Broner. "The effort was there. We made some mental errors, but we overcame them."

SC trailed by 16 midway through the second half before making a run that sliced the deficit in half. St. Clair's Karen Pru-

itt popped in two threes, however, late in the game to decide it.

Pruitt finished with 21 points, including five triples. Alicia Kollmorgen led St. Clair with 29; Jenny Storm added 19.

For the Ocelots, who end their season 13-13, Kazyaka had 22; Julie Klos scored 13; Cerne netted 11; and Muha and Newlin scored 10 apiece.

With the possibility of eight players returning next season — Cerne and Wechter are sophomores — the lessons learned in this tournament could prove valuable indeed.

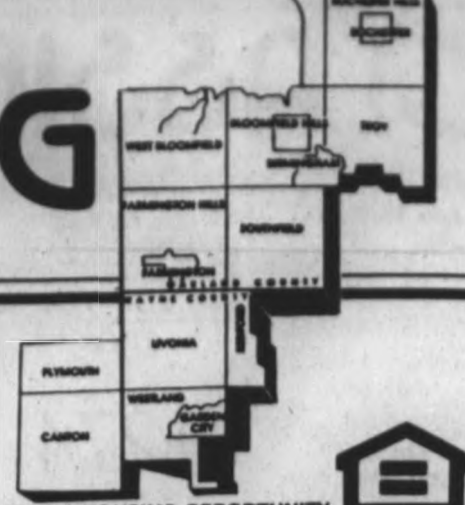

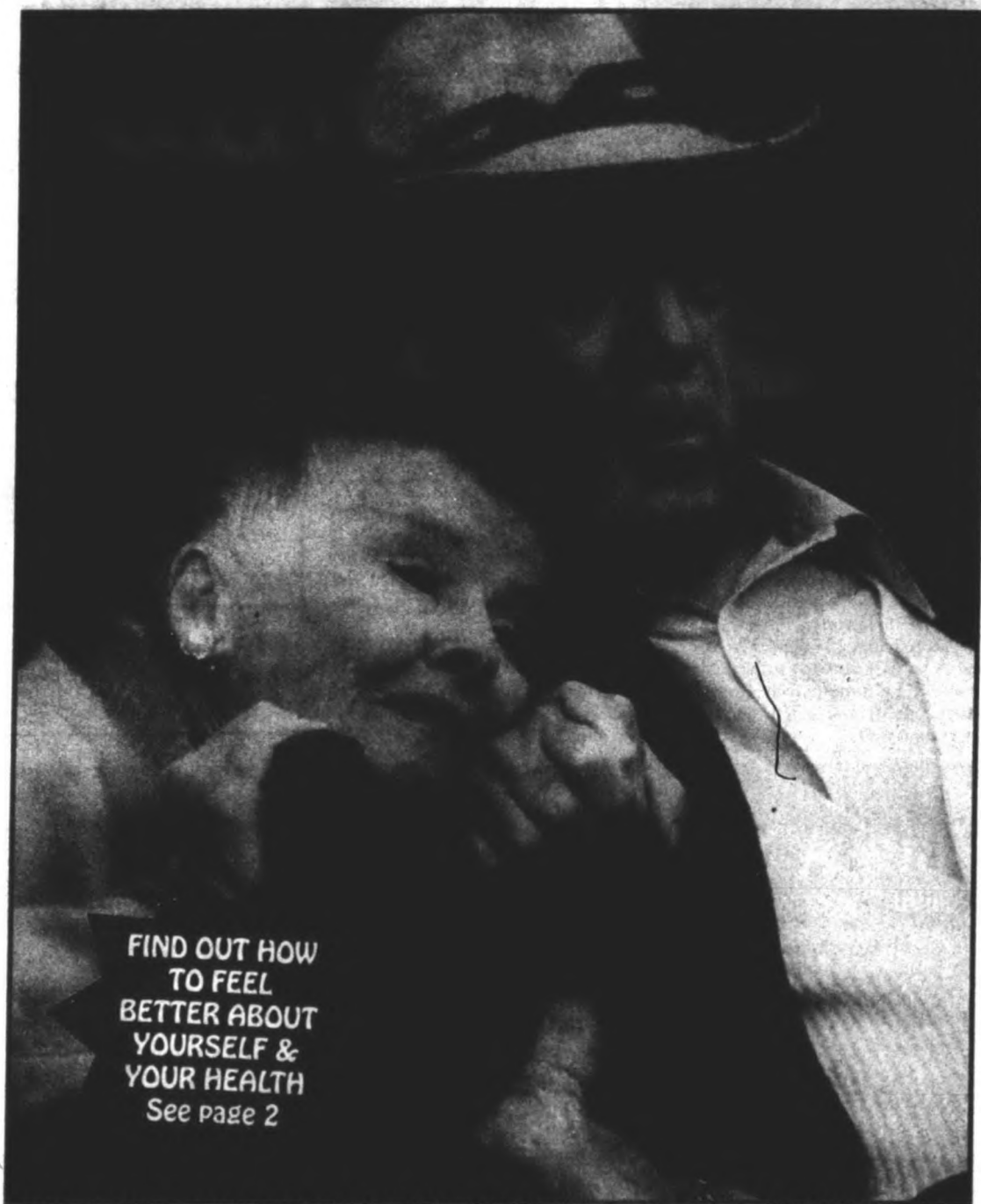

CBS' new romantic comedy stars two Oscar winners

Academy Award winners Katharine Hepburn and Anthony Quinn star in "This Can't Be Love," a romantic comedy premiering Sunday, March 13, on CBS.

Hepburn plans Marion Bennett, a strong-willed and renowned actress who lives with her housekeeper and her new chauffeur, Grant Landis (Jason Bateman). Although he finds his new employer demanding and intimidating, Grant begins to feel protective when Michael Reyman (Quinn) re-enters her life.

The dashing Michael once starred opposite Marion, but his career since then has slipped to B-movies and commercials. He hopes to cash in on a very brief and long-ago romance between them by revealing it in his autobiography. Abetting him in his plan is Sarah Wells (Jami Gertz), who is determined to get the "dirt" on Marion that her publisher needs to make Michael's book a success.

"They (Marion and Michael) get along quite well, until she discovers that he's writing a book," reveals director Anthony Harvey. "Then all

hell breaks loose."

Harvey's enthusiasm for the project, and for working with the actress he directed to her third Oscar for "The Lion in Winter", is evident.

"Tony Quinn is, I think, quite marvelous in it," he says. "And, of course, 'Miss H.' is wonderful when she's up against a great, big, strong, macho actor. That's when she's always at her best. The chemistry of those two was just great."

He also has kind words for Bateman ("a wonderful actor, kind of like a young Jimmy Stewart") and Gertz ("a charming actress, really beautiful").

It's been awhile since the English-born director has been fired-up about his work. Following "Lion" in 1968, he worked again with Hepburn on her TV acting debut in 1973's "The Glass Menagerie" ("a huge success, we got lots of Emmys," he recalls fondly). Ten years later, the pair went through a nightmare together.

"I did a disastrous film, because it was cut up so badly by Cannon Pictures, called 'The Ultimate

Solution of Grace Quigley.' It got the most devastatingly good reviews in England. Then it went to Cannes for something," Harvey says.

"Apparently Rex Reed saw it and told (Cannon producer) Menahem Golan that he thought it was lousy. And Menahem Golan took fright, I suppose, and then we had to reshoot a lot of stuff which didn't work."

The resulting bomb, which co-starred Nick Nolte as a thug hired by an old woman (Hepburn) to help her commit suicide, left the director shaken and scarred. "I have the original cut hidden under my bed and one day I intend..." he says, his voice trailing off. "It was a miserable experience. Terrible. That's why I really haven't done any work for some time. I really needed to go to a rest home after that."

Now, newly energized, he has plunged into his next project, a TV movie about the last days of Leo Tolstoy, to star Anthony Quinn and Liv Ullman. There also is the welcome chance that "The Lion in Winter" will be restored and re-released.

"What's happening is the negative... is rotting," Harvey explains. "There's a guy called Bob Harris who reconstructed 'Lawrence of Arabia,' and for three-and-a-half years he's been trying to get money to get 'Lion in Winter' back into shape. 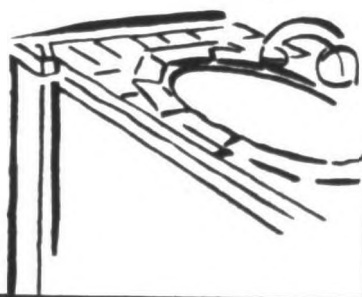
