## Mothers seek play equipment

Mothers in Plymouth's Old Village have joined forces to press the city to provide new playground equipment for children in the area. A May 5 meeting is planned for those interested in the drive.

Some moms living in Old Village are concerned about a lack of good play equipment for their kids and they're trying to do something about it.

Terri Kariniemi on Tuesday told city commissioners she and Susan

Wiercioch were trying to organize an effort to get and put up new play equipment at two Old Village playgrounds, near Fire Station No. 2 and behind Starkweather School.

She asked commissioners for help. She added, "We want more of a say in what's going on."

Mayor Doug Miller responded,

"We'll ask (recreation director) Tom Willette to get with you directly," adding the department has an ongoing project to upgrade city playground equipment.

Also, Miller said city service clubs traditionally help efforts to improve parks, and one could be willing to help the effort.

"That's our next step, if somebody can donate the equipment, we have a group of people who would get together and assemble it," Kariniemi said. "We have somebody to donate food for the event. We're just in the begin-

ning stages — we're still trying to figure out where we're going," she said.

"If we can get a service organization to help us out we'll have a playground assembly day," Kariniemi said.

Of the current playground equipment in Old Village, "If it has movable parts it doesn't work," Kariniemi said. She said volunteers would focus first on the playground near Fire Station No. 2.

Kariniemi said she and some other

## Hilltop golfing rates on upswing

Hilltop Golf Course rates are rising this year.

Eighteen-hole rates for township residents for 1994 are \$18 weekdays, \$21 weekends and holidays and \$9 for seniors and juniors.

Nine-hole rates for residents are \$11.50 weekdays, \$13 weekends and holidays and \$10 for seniors and juniors.

For non-residents, 18-hole rates are \$2 higher and nine-hole rates are \$1 higher.

The township board of trustees approved the rate increase requested by golf course manager John Jawor at the meeting Tuesday.

The new rates for 18 holes are up \$1 over 1993 rates, except for seniors and juniors, for whom rates stay the same.

The township building department put together a comparison chart for trustees, showing rates charged at other area golf courses.

At both Fox Hills, 8768 N. Territorial, and Mission Hills, 14830 Sheldon in Plymouth Township, the weekend 18-hole rate is \$23 — the same rate as charged to non-residents at Hilltop.

## 'Hair' cast member provides home-grown talent

When Kent Dalian as a child would travel from his Plymouth home with his family to see stage shows in downtown Detroit, "I thought I'd really like to do that."

And that's what happened. Dalian, now 26, plays the character "Berger" in the touring production of "Hair," which wrapped up its run Sunday at the Fox Theater in Detroit.

His interest in acting started here. "Somebody was doing a workshop

thing for children, a workshop production of 'Dracula.' My mother knew I was interested so she signed me up. I did the werewolf, they did it in one of the schools," he recalled.

Other local shows he performed in included "The Sound of Music" at age 11. While attending Divine Child High School in Dearborn, he continued to perform in stage productions, and also during his freshman year at Western Michigan University.

He left after one year. "I didn't like school to begin with. It was more of

the same, learning things I had absolutely no interest in, math or science. To me, it was a waste of time. I loved to learn something that tackles my interest. I'd spend hours to research that.

"I had myself convinced I would be just learning theater (at WMU), that wasn't the case."

The summer after leaving college, he played the role of Jesus in a Dearborn Players Guild production of "Jesus Christ Superstar."

That led to acting and directing

work in theater in Key West, Fla., where he played "Riff Raff" in a production of "Rocky Horror Picture Show," and after a brief stay in New York City toured Europe in a rock version of the opera "Carmen" and in "Hair."

Dalian, who played everything from large theaters to church basements in Europe, recalled performing in a large castle moat in Germany. "It started to rain and they were trying to stop

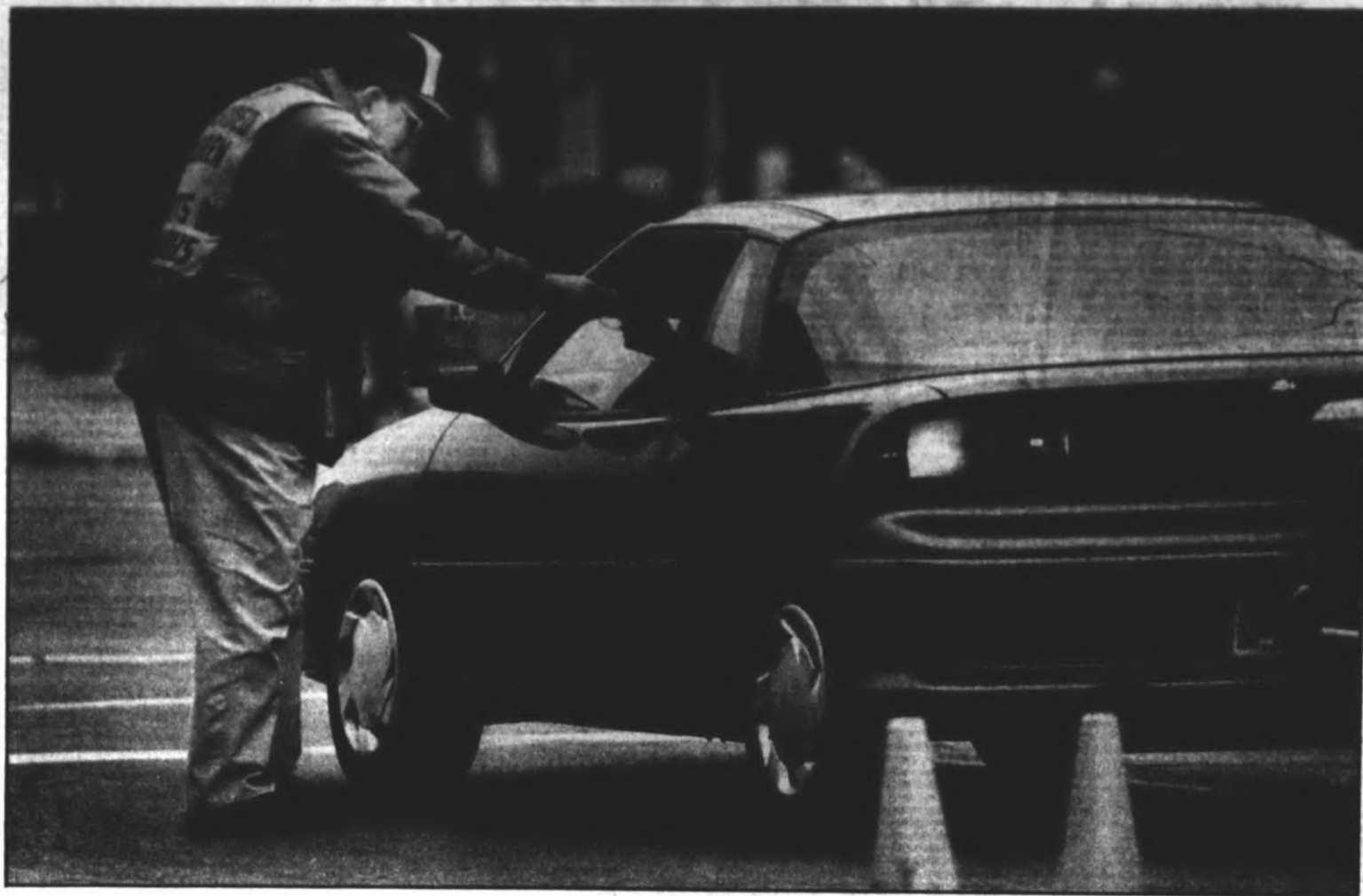

# Grant to help handicapped

Federal grant money will be used to implement handicapped accessibility at Plymouth Township facilities, as well as for a township planning study and senior programs.

The township board of trustees on Tuesday approved a plan to allocate \$121,200 in federal grant money to programs that qualify under guidelines for the federal community development block grant program.

By the plan approved by trustees, \$63,080 in 1994 funds will go for township facility alterations; \$25,000 will go for planning studies; \$15,000 will go toward a senior van program; and \$6,000 to senior center staffing.

Money to make township facilities more accessible for handicapped people includes installing automatic openers at front entrances, widening rest room doorways, and making rest room improvements.

The planning study involves studying roadways to determine whether the areas should be deemed as deteriorating. The roadways are Eckles Road from Plymouth Road to I-96, Northville Road from Hines Park to Five Mile Road, and General Drive between Ann Arbor Road and Joy Road.

To pay salaries for administering the program, \$12,120 of the project funds will be used, according to the allocation approved by trustees.

# Agencies seek donated items

Also, St. Vincent De Paul and Workbench Furniture are collecting hundreds of pieces of furniture for families in need throughout metro Detroit through the "Furniture For Families" effort April 11-30.

Furniture collected in this drive will be provided free to families in need or sold through St. Vincent De Paul thrift stores. Money raised will support the group's food depots around Detroit.

To donate, call St. Vincent De Paul at 567-1910 during business hours to arrange for a pickup. Donations are tax-deductible and earn donors a 20 percent discount at Workbench stores.

the show. All of a sudden, the moat started to float."

Of acting, Dalian said, "It's definitely my passion, probably because a lot of actors are uncomfortable with who they are. I used to be that way, I'm not anymore."

"You can sometimes play these outrageous characters, on stage or on the screen you can murder people but there's no consequences," he said, laughing.

Back in the United States, he auditioned for a U.S. production of "Hair," and was one of 24 actors out of 700 who auditioned to get a part. "The competition is crazy," Dalian said.

"We started in Baltimore a month ago," he said, adding the company will perform in Wash-

ington, D.C., Atlanta, Toronto, then San Francisco after Detroit.

Of the character "Berger," Dalian said, "He's pretty much a wild man, he runs around half naked, jumps out in the audience and climbs over the seats. He gets kicked out of high school and he sings a song about it."

Dalian said his goal is "just hoping to keep working."

"I want to do film. It's a whole different ball game. It's almost like starting over," he said.

After "Hair," Dalian said he'll head back to Broadway. "That's the plan, try to get a name and get an agent in New York with affiliations in L.A.," he said, for film work.

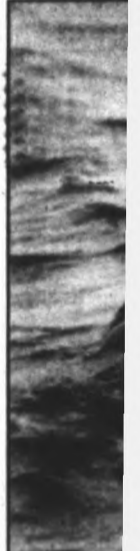

# Saying 'I do' an eye-opener

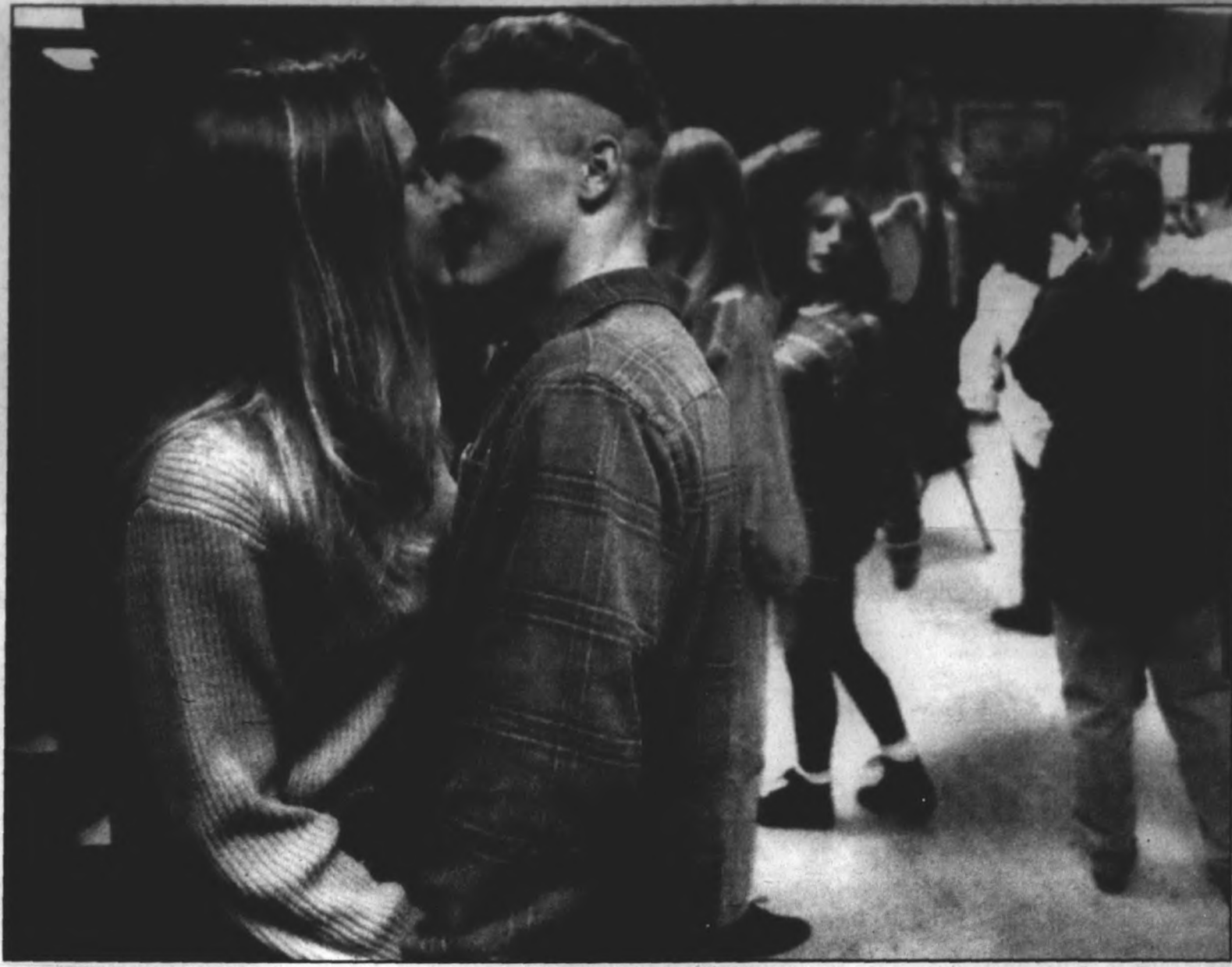
High school home economics isn't what it used to be. In fact, home economics isn't even called home economics anymore. What's more, cooking and sewing are just part of what's taught in Plymouth-Canton's life management curriculum.

Danielle LeBlanc is a Canton junior taking her second Human Relations class.

LeBlanc and her classmates recently took part in mock marriage ceremonies. This week, instructor Chris Johnston Mayo acted as the judge in a mock divorce court.

In May, the class will get an inkling of what it's like to be elderly as part of a geriatrics unit.

"You learn a lot about relating with other people, which is something you're going to use forever," said LeBlanc. "We talk about relationships; we talk about marriage, death and divorce." The class has helped kids

deal with problems involving drug and alcohol use too, she added.

Mayo says Human Relations was added to the curriculum because it's the "perfect complement to academics. While we've prepared students in the past for the scholarly world, we have found a lot of kids are not prepared for life. They don't have the skills to deal with some of the situations they run into.

"A lot of kids have made poor life choices and have gotten into relationships that have given them problems in life and inter-

ferred with career choices."

Mayo said it's gratifying to see students better their lives by incorporating what they've learned. And the classes are growing in popularity. This year, more than 550 students enrolled in Human Relations courses.

"A couple students of mine were actually engaged in high school, and after going through the class postponed their wedding," said Mayo, who teaches at Canton High School. "Another couple decided not to get married at all. The class has helped students get out of abusive dat-

ing situations and to get help."

The class has helped other students deal with severe eating disorders, she added.

Parents seem to like the class also, Mayo said. "I recently heard from a mother who said she thinks the class should be mandatory. She said her daughters had better self-esteem and were making better choices having taken the class."

Human Relations attempts to prepare kids for the future by going through the whole life cycle, said Mayo, whose counterpart at Salem High School is teacher

Diane Gailey.

Units deal with self-esteem, communication, decision-making, setting life goals, getting along with parents, and conflict resolution with peers in addition to love, marriage, divorce, domestic violence, death and dying.

"There are no guarantees in life, but knowledge is power," said Mayo, who also does premarital counseling. "The more you know about yourself, the better choices you'll make. This is a small way of giving kids a dose of reality while they're still in high school."

## Practice

### Firefighters hone rescue skills

OK. There wasn't any ice. But that didn't stop the Canton firefighters from practicing ice and cold-water rescue skills.

"We are practicing different kinds of ice rescue," said Tom Kruger, who with fellow firefighter Greg Tellner spearheaded the three-day training.

With all the man-made ponds that are being built in Canton, including on the new Pheasant Run Golf Course now under construction, as well as retention ponds in subdivisions, Kruger and Tellner thought the rescue training would be timely.

The victim for the training was Van Buren firefighter Mike Moening, a member of the department's dive team. Tellner also donned a cold water suit that though not insulated is designed to keep the diver dry.

"There are basically five steps to rescuing someone that's fallen through the ice or is stranded in cold water," said Kruger, who with Tellner is a member of the department's training committee and attended a similar res-

cue seminar at the Ohio Fire Academy.

In ice-cold water, a person can last only 20 minutes at the most before body temperature begins dropping and hypothermia sets in. Even in 75-degree water, it only takes about 40 minutes before hypothermia occurs.

The training basically follows the Red Cross "reach, throw, row and go" program for water rescue.

The first step is called a soft rescue, where the victim tries to get himself out of the water with a pole or other item. The second step is shore-assisted. "Again, with this step, no one is going in the water. Here we're using an inflated fire hose for the victim to grab," Kruger said.

In the third step - boat-assisted rescue - firefighters would use a boat, but only as an operation point from where lines can be thrown to the victim. When these methods fail to retrieve the victim, a boat-based rescue may be used. Firefighters would take a boat out to the victim and try to pull him in.

The fifth step is to get in the water with the victim and bring

him to shore. This method of rescue is not the first used because of the problems it can pose for rescuers, Kruger said.

"As soon as we enter the water, we are just as prone to get hypothermia. And the victim can panic and pull us under the water, helping no one," Kruger said.

In the future, the fire department hopes to buy other needed equipment for ice and water rescues, such as a boat and cold-water suits. "Right now, we've got some of the basic equipment," Kruger said, such as inner tubes and throw bags filled with rescue line.

## Schools may borrow to buy computers under bill

School districts may borrow — going outside their operating budgets — for computer equipment as well as buildings, under a controversial state Senate bill.

"Telecommunications and technology-related services" are included in the list of things for which a school district may issue bonds. The bill amends a law passed last December allowing schools to sell bonds to renovate portions of buildings, libraries, athletic fields and other physical facilities.

Sen. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham, won approval of an amendment saying that computer services must be treated as an operating expense. Bouchard's amendment also limits the length of time for repayment to the life of the equipment.

Another amendment removed computer software from the bond-

ing list.

The Senate last week passed the bill 31-2 over the long, loud protests of conservative Republicans Doug Carl of Utica and Jack Welborn of Kalamazoo.

All area senators voted yes, except William Faust, D-Westland, and David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, who were absent.

"What heretofore were called operating expenses, and subject to operating millage, we are now going to say can be covered by debt millage," Carl said. "School districts can do an end run (around tax limitations)," he said.

"This is outrageous. Bond salesmen out there will make lots of money urging districts to borrow, borrow, borrow," he said.

Carl said voters approved Proposal A March 15 believing that school operating taxes would be held to 6 mills on homes and farms and 24 mills on business

property and second homes — rates he called "sacrosanct." Permitting school districts to pay for computers outside their operating budgets would "circumvent the intent of the people."

"We are again flaunting the taxpayers by passing this type of legislation right after Proposal A," agreed Welborn.

He said it was all right to pay for wires and outlets for computers through a bond issue when a building is constructed or renovated. "It seems to me they (schools) ought to have enough money to operate efficiently and purchase those (computers) out of operating funds without having to bond," he said.

"We should allow a school district the option of putting a new roof on or to remodel a classroom without doing the entire school, but I think you are going too far with this proposal that allows

them to go in and bond for computers and technical programs.

"That should be an operational cost, not a cost put into bonds, spread into the future so future generations pay for it, rather than it being pay-as-you-go," Welborn said.

The brief battle exposed a long-term tendency in school budgeting: using the operating budget to pay salaries and requesting special millages or bond issues to pay for renovations, repairs and improvements of physical plant.

Proponents said technology is increasingly necessary and too expensive to be covered out of operating budgets. They argued that business borrows to buy machinery and amortizes it over a period of years through depreciation accounts.

## Pearl Jam scores a KO with its fans

Pearl Jam drummer Dave Abbruzzese said in a 1992 interview that playing live shows with his band is like fighting Mike Tyson. If that's the case, Pearl Jam knocked out Detroit area audiences in the first round.

Performing two sold-out shows last weekend — March 19 at Detroit's Masonic Temple and March 20 at Ann Arbor's Crisler Arena — Pearl Jam reinforced their status as one of the top-selling acts in rock. Stripped-down stages adorned with only a few toys and burning candles didn't hinder the show a bit.

Tormented reluctant superstar/lead singer Eddie Vedder growled through 2½ hours of hits — and a cover of Neil Young's "Keep on Rockin' in the Free World" — in near perfection. (Like the 1992 Lollapalooza Festival, "Jeremy" was left off the set list.)

Bassist Jeff Ament, with a baby doll strapped to his back, jumped like a kangaroo around the stage as guitarist Stone Gossard kept his cool, bobbing his head in his trademark goose-like style. Mike McCready staked his claim on the left side of the stage, wailing away on his guitar.

Unlike the Crisler Arena show, Vedder strapped on a guitar for most of Pearl Jam's Masonic set, complementing guitarists Gossard and McCready. In Ann Arbor and Detroit, bassist Ament traded his bass for a slim stand-up model during "Glorified G" and "Daughter" off their latest self-titled album.

Shortly after taking the Masonic Temple stage, Vedder mumbled what so far has to be the understatement of the year: "We're going to be here for awhile. We're going to play some songs. No big deal."

Proving that bands and audiences feed off each other's energy, the Masonic Temple crowd stayed primarily subdued due to a subtle request by Vedder and the abundance of security and police officers. The singer, unemptily dressed in a dark T-shirt and jeans, stomped in small circles. He released some energy during "Leash," walking along the edges of boxes lining the stage, and swinging back and forth over the audience from rope ladders hanging from the lights.

At the end of the show, Vedder downplayed his role as teen idol, tossing cigarettes into the audience. Toasting the crowd, he advised them to enjoy their youth, let the past be the past, and look forward to the future.

Energy was no problem at the Crisler Arena show. Sweaty fans crammed up against the stage barricade and began body surfing long before Vedder slowly approached the front of the stage, head down, smearing black cream around his eyes. Once he was finished he led the band into a rendition of "Jeremy." The stage looked like an elevated slam pit with Vedder, leading the group, thrashing around the stage and dragging his microphone stand along with him.

Even Vedder seemed somewhat surprised by the energy of the Crisler Arena crowd. He offered an explanation: "The other night we had a bomb scare. Last night some crazy people snuck backstage. Then tonight I heard a few people escaped from (a mental institution), and you can tell who they are by their yellow bracelets."

The main floor crowd, given yellow bracelets to wear, wasn't insulted the least bit.

Although the Ann Arbor show was plagued by unsecure parking and overwhelmed, poorly marked ushers, most fans weren't fazed. As the band tore through "Why Go Home" from their debut album "Ten," fans seemed to take the chorus to heart. Leaving early wasn't on their mind.

## Us3: Hip-hop and all that jazz

If you listen closely, you'll again hear the jazz musings of Reuben Wilson, Big John Patton and Art Blakey on "Hand on the Torch." Such samples are turning up in Us3's new release.

While Us3 producers Geoff Wilkinson and Mel Simpson were recording their debut "Hand on the Torch," they never thought about bringing their blend of jazz and hip-hop to the stage. But when their first live show turned into a near riot, they thought well, maybe there was a demand for it. "It was like one of the Beatles' gigs in the '60s," said Wilkinson via telephone from England about his mid-1993 show in Japan. "They actually pulled the (original) trumpet player (Gerard Presencer) off the stage. He was used to playing jazz in England, and he goes all the way to Japan and got pulled off the stage by screaming Japanese women."

"We started thinking that there could actually be a demand to do it live."

For that show, the band took six musicians with them. Since then the revolving band, which stopped at Detroit's Fox Theatre on Saturday, March 12, with UB40, has expanded to nine pieces. (Wilkinson and Simpson are the only two permanent members.) The musical force, which averages age 24, uses a few recordings (samples) at live shows, but mainly the work of saxophonists Tony Cofie and Ed Jones, trumpeter Dominick Glover, bassist Geoffrey Gascoyne, drummer Cheryl Alleyne, keyboardist Timothy Vine, and rappers Rahsaan Kelly, Kobie Powell and Tukka Yoot. Although their stripped-down show in Japan was successful, Wilkinson and Simpson decided they owed it to the audience to play most of the pieces live.

"We thought the audience deserved it, really. Jazz is a music that has to be experienced live, I think. We wanted to make it completely live in order to do justice to the music and not cheat people," Wilkinson said.

While researching what other jazz/hip-hop bands were doing, they discovered that the shows lacked improvisation, which links the two music genres. Using samples was stale, Wilkinson said. Improvisation is what stirs up excitement.

### Education is key

When the Wilkinson and Simpson created Us3, their original intent was to educate the public on the merits of jazz. As its tool, the band uses samples from the Blue Note Records' archives whose rights

were awarded to them after they sampled pieces without permission. The duo's first student was the Jamaican-born rapper Tukka Yoot, a current member of the lineup who they discovered in a studio.

"Tukka is kind of a great example of how I think we've got people into jazz, really. I've seen him buying John Coltrane CDs. I know he wouldn't have done that before. He would have bought his reggae records. We've managed to open his ears to jazz," Wilkinson said.

After his show at the Fox Theatre, Yoot said his discovery of jazz has brought his career full circle.

"I felt when I heard it that I had been missing something," Yoot said patting his face with a towel. "Now I listen to it all the time when I'm home. Educate is what the Us3 project set out to do. It worked. It rebounded onto me. I'm sure if I was

convinced, we could convince others."

Us3, whose lyrics are written by Yoot and fellow rappers Rahsaan Kelly and Kobie Powell, educates subtly. There is no preaching.

"Educate" is a horrible word when you involve it with music. We just kind of wanted to open the door and if people wanted to come through that door, it was there for them. I believe that young people have a real problem having access to jazz," Wilkinson said.

Radio and record company marketing specialists gear jazz toward an older audience, which alienates younger people, he said. Apparently, young people are paying attention to Us3. The video for the first single "Cantaloup (Flip Fantasia)" — sometimes affectionately known as the "bitty bitty bop" song — was included in MTV's trendy "Buzz Bin." Aside from that it has become a dance club hit. Many Us3 fans are unaware that they're learning something by Herbie Hancock other than "Rockit." The track uses excerpts from the musician's song "Cantaloupe Island."

"They don't know they're actually dancing to Herbie Hancock. We get sort of a perverse delight out of that as well. It's a bit subversive," he said with a laugh.

### A fine sample

"Hand on the Torch," which refers to the passing on of the jazz tradition, surprisingly is the only Blue Note album that has sold more

than 500,000 copies. The legendary blues label's archives has included works by Reuben Wilson, Lou Donaldson, Big John Patton, Art Blakey & the Jazz Messengers, Thelonious Monk, Grant Green, Bobby Hutcherson, Horace Silver and Donald Byrd, all of whom are sampled on the record.

"At first I thought that was amazing, but then I thought 'It's a real shame,'" said Jones, who met Wilkinson at a "Jazz Rap Weekend" in England. "It's a real tragedy" that legendary artists haven't achieved that status, he added.

For rapper Yoot, it was a "dream come true." He sees it as repaying his idols for influencing him.

In return, jazz purists have lauded the group's effort.

"We anticipated probably a lot more criticism from the jazz purists. In Japan the jazz purists seem to accept it straight away. Like in Japan, they think really seriously about jazz and they really took us to heart, which was phenomenal. I think even the purists that might not like what we're doing accept it. One of the things were trying to do is get younger people into jazz. Everyone understands that and accepts that."

Some have vehemently opposed what the duo is doing, however.

"The one thing that we have been accused of is tearing pages out of the (jazz) Bible. But our 'stock in trade' answer to that is if we're tearing pages out of the Bible, then we're sanctioned by God."

## Spontaneity counts for Howling Diablos

The Howling Diablos may not be who you think they are. In fact, they're hoping not. The element of surprise is one of the big components of their enormous local popularity.

Depending on what night of the week you see them, the time of night you walk in, where it's at and who's sitting in with the core group that night, you're as likely to see one of the most amazing blues bands in town as you are a screaming rock 'n' roll or envelope-pushing free jazz band. Although they may begin the night with a straight-ahead Detroit blues groove, they'll just as likely end with the Johnny Evans affectionately calls a "nut out."

"Our shows are always real spontaneous," said founder and saxophonist Evans, "to the point where we'll play tunes and the band doesn't even know them. If you create that kind of space where magic and cool stuff can happen, a lot of time it will."

Evans and co-founder Martin Gross, both longtime local music veterans, have been working together for more than a decade, and the chemistry is almost tangible. Singer/songwriter/guitarist Gross is a veteran of the Progressive Blues Band, the Bop Cats, the Urbations and Little Tino and the Hawaiians, who had the hottest single in Detroit in 1984 with "Crazy 'Bout Those Tigers."

# Capra meets the Coens in Proxy'

It's New Year's Eve. Snow drifts by a troubled man perched atop a skyscraper ledge 44 floors high — not counting the mezzanine. How he got there and whether or not he'll jump was a familiar springboard for old Frank Capra movies like "Meet John Doe" or the ubiquitous "It's a Wonderful Life."

Mr. Capra, meet the Coens. Brothers Joel and Ethan, the writer/director team of "Barton Fink" and "Raising Arizona," have breathed new life into the shop-worn premise of "The Hudsucker Proxy," a fictionalized account of the inventor of the Hula Hoop and a visually dazzling tribute to fast-paced comedies of the 1930s.

Tim Robbins plays Norville Barnes, a recent graduate of the Muncie Business School, who lands a job in the mail room of Hudsucker Industries circa 1958. With the death of the company president and controlling interest up for public sale, Hud honchos want a new leader who can bring stock down, so it can be purchased for pennies.

In short, they want an imbecile, and they think they've found one

in Barnes. After all, the earnest Midwesterner walks around with sketches of his new product idea, basically a circle drawn in the middle of a sheet of paper. "You know," he says, shocked that no one else recognizes its brilliance, "for kids."

You know the rest of the story. That invention, the Hula Hoop, becomes a Baby Boomer phenomenon, catapults Barnes and Hudsucker to the top, and leaves Board Chairman Sidney J. Mussberger (Paul Newman) fuming, intent on breaking the young prodigy he personally advanced.

Enter Amy Archer (Jennifer Jason Leigh), a Pulitzer Prize-winning newspaper gal who becomes Barnes' secretary to get the inside scoop.

The Coens, along with "Evil Dead" director and former Detroit Sam Raimi, have scripted a clever little piece of nostalgia, full of wisecracks and overlapping dialogue. And while the emotion of the story gets overpowered by set design and crazy camera angles, it easily ranks as the year's niftiest picture.

In one of the movie's several well-edited sequences, a lone Hula Hoop rolls from an alley down the street and into the path

of a little boy. Viewed from above, the shot recalls the apes eyeing that mystical monolith at the opening of "2001: A Space Odyssey."

At this exact moment, an elementary school has let out for the afternoon. As the boy picks the toy up and starts to swivel and shake, a pack of screaming school kids round the street corner and stare in amazement at what they see. The Hula Hoop, formerly a bust, officially becomes a craze.

For his part, Robbins plays the role with congeniality and "gee whiz" American enthusiasm. It's a pleasure to see him doing slapstick with Paul Newman, who too rarely gets a chance to let his silver hair down.

Blink and you'll miss cameos by character actors Peter Gallagher (as a slick Italian crooner) and Steve Buscemi (as a beatnik coffeehouse server). We could stand to see more of them, along with Bruce Campbell, another former Detroit and star of TV's "Brisco County," as Smitty, the newspaperman.

As gum-snapping newswoman Archer, Jason Leigh does a dead-

on impersonation of Jean Arthur and Rosalind Russell. She's about 20 years out of time, but it hardly matters to the Coen brothers, whose movies read like pages of a 20th century history book thrown up in the air and then hastily reassembled.

Dennis Gassner's set design is a knockout, especially the Deco-era skyscraper that houses Hudsucker. The mail room, inspired no doubt by "Metropolis" and "Brazil," is a nightmare of cables, tubes and feverishly working drones. The top-floor board room, meanwhile, is an exercise in monumental sparseness — only the heavy-lacquered board table and a ticker tape machine backed by the city in silhouette.

Some may see "The Hudsucker Proxy" as a one-joke movie, and indeed it does lose momentum after a while. It's the invention that the Coens bring to virtually every shot that keeps you twisting to this engagingly oddball comedy.

# 'Kalifornia:' A close call with crime

When faced with true, soulless evil, how would your average bleeding-heart intellectual respond? Would a close encounter with an utterly remorseless killer cause a change in the attitude that criminals need treatment, not incarceration and punishment?

On some levels that's the question posed by the 1993 film "Kalifornia" in which a writer and his girlfriend take along a killer and his girlfriend on a cross country drive. The writer, having spent his advance, needs help with expenses as he and his girlfriend, a photographer, visit the scenes of murders committed by serial killers.

David Duchovny and Michelle Forbes play the trendy leather jacket-clad pair who maybe aren't

as sophisticated and worldly as they might like to think. Duchovny's character in particular is fascinated and attracted by the sordid and twisted tales of mass murderers.

"You can't let stereotypes get in the way," he says after meeting their new travel companions.

There is a jarring contrast with the other couple, played as white trash personified by Brad Pitt and Juliette Lewis in the most memorable performances in the film. Pitt's greasy-haired and unkempt Early Grayce murders without a minute of remorse then makes a gift of a dead girl's shoes to the rather dimwitted Adele.

Early and Adele live in a rundown trailer, certainly not a mobile home, in the middle of what appears to be a junkyard. Early, who is already on parole, can't

hold a job, telling his parole officer that they didn't treat him right.

Faced with jail, Early decides it's time for him to relocate with Adele. He tells Adele people think quicker in California because of the heat and by law each month's rent is free.

Duchovny's Brian is the smug sort who sees himself as superior to the harmless but primitive Early. In the end, the writer doesn't have a clue to who he is really dealing with in Early.

Forbes' photographer warms up to the hapless Adele and tries to help her. It's her suspicions of Early that spark the upclose violence that was surely inevitable anyway.

In one scene, the violent Early

perfectly mocks the writer's amateur psychologist questions about how he feels when assaulting someone. The two even do a little shooting together.

Lewis' Adele, barely surviving on her meager wits and self-delusions, is the truly tragic figure of the quartet.

One of the things you might question about "Kalifornia" is whether the writer learned anything from his brush with terror. By the end of the journey that's not totally clear.

Evans was on that 'Teenage Records 45, too, as well as putting in frontline time with the Urbanations, who were managed by former MC5 manager, politico and impresario John Sinclair. It was Sinclair who, inadvertently, was responsible for the formation of the Howling Diablos.

"The first gig the band ever played was at the Michigan Gallery," Gross remembered.

"The first gig was a Gary Grimshaw art opening," Evans interjected. "He and I used to do this thing with John Sinclair called the Blues Scholars. He played drums; I played saxophone, and Sinclair would read his poetry. We were supposed to do that at the Michigan Gallery, and Sinclair had gone off somewhere, and Gary called up and said 'Why don't you and Martin put a band together for the opening?'"

Gross is quick to pay allegiance to the local poetry scene, as well, calling Mick Vranich and Word-ban'd a particular favorite act.

"The band kinda grew out of more of the poetry scene which, to me, is where the Howling thing came from, like Ginsberg's 'Howl,'" he said. "I never wanted it to sound like a rockabilly band or anything else. Some people do draw those conclusions."

Rockabilly they most decidedly are not. Muddy Waters and Archie Shepp influences abound, and there are hints of stylistic predecessors like the MC5 and the Contemporary Jazz Quintet

and peers like Was (Not Was), Fishbone and whatever else the band absorbs. Bassist Mike Hollis and drummer Vin E. (whose other band Sponge was just signed by Sony) make up the core of the band. However, the surprises always lay in which of their turntable selection of guitarists is on a sessions — Michael King, Bobby East of Killing Floor, Tim Diaz of Red C, or Jeff Grand of the Butler Twins blues band.

"It's not the easiest way to go for making money in the music business," said Gross of the band's diversity.

"We've never tried to think of a hit, or thought of what we can do to be famous. It's always just being real truthful with this music and having faith in that. That's why we do it."

## Getting "pinned" is a fashion must

Historically, rites of passage have been commemorated with an appropriate pin. If you stop to ponder the decorative pin, you'll recall that your dad received a pin upon retirement or for 25 years' service to his company. You may have gotten pinned by your college boyfriend, a prelude to an engagement ring. That cherished pin was his fraternity insignia and probably still sits in the bottom of the jewelry box.

Jewelry designer Leslie Ann Pilling owns Presence II, 29260 Franklin Road in Southfield. She reminded me of an even-loftier purpose given the pin. In the military, pins are used as symbols of rank and seniority. As campaign buttons they become political, used throughout history to reflect personal ideals and opinions.

Your mother may have positioned her fancy brooch just so on a suit lapel, or maybe she threw her cashmere sweater over her shoulder, securing it with a pearl sweater guard.

Those same bejeweled pins are back, but the styles and presentations have changed. The "guard" might be arranged asymmetrically on a blazer pocket or worn like an epaulet on the shoulder of a jean jacket (\$60). Today, pins are everywhere.

Pilling designs pin enhancers for pearls, hat pins to group on an oversized sweater, (\$40) and pins attached to long necklaces that drape across the body (\$198).

Many women collect scatter pins to cluster on a collar or coat, tiny bugs or frogs or butterflies. "Pins are even used as home accessories," says Pilling, pointing to a large gold mesh bow that forms a curtain tie-back.

### Pin point plans

"Pins are a focal point. A woman takes the time to select them and put them on as an essential design element." She suggests displaying a pin collection on a beautiful pillow in the bedroom.

Rhapsody in Beads is a medley of original beaded compositions by Beth Stone of West Bloomfield and her mother Ina Katz of Southfield. The two have designed and exhibited their beaded pins for the past few years and find that their customers appreciate their one-of-a-kind creations and enjoy collecting them. While Ina's designs are more uniform in color and involve a focal point vintage bead, Beth's creations are more contemporary and sculptural. ### Pin reminders

As in the case of campaign buttons that communicate a political preference, charities often of pins to communicate a concern for a cause.

Two Hands Inc. encourages disabled, disadvantaged and seriously ill children to create designs for enameled pins that include pineapples, giraffes, ice cream cones and kites (\$12.50-\$16). The Alliance for Homeless and Disabled Artists employs homeless people to craft sparkling pins of recycled Mardi Gras gowns and costumes (\$18-\$38). Examples of these pins look terrific grouped on the brim of a baseball cap. They're available at select Hudson's stores.

More perfect pins include Tiffany's "Fireworks" burst with the radiant colors of pink rubellite, violet tanzanite and sparkling diamonds. This spectacular pin collection explodes in showers of cascading gemstones (\$18,000-\$35,000) at Tiffany & Co. in the Somerset Collection in Troy. The "Race For the Cure" pin by Carolee depicts the figure of a female runner with a pink-enameled ribbon accent (\$25). The pin is available exclusively at Neiman Marcus and proceeds benefit the Susan G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer research.

## Make-up artistry

### Trish McAvoy cosmetics keep it simple

Trish McEvoy, 43, is in town this week launching her neutrals-only palette at Jacobson's — in the Laurel Park Place store in Livonia and the Briarwood store in Ann Arbor.

After more than 20 years as one of New York's top makeup artists, creating the faces that filled Vogue and Harper's Bazaar, McAvoy produced her own line of cosmetics in 1975.

Until last year, she sold the products only to clients who visited her Central Park studio. Last year, she

offered the line to Bendel's Department Stores, with an instant success she hopes to duplicate at select Jacobson's this year.

Radiating the warmth that is also the trademark look of her cosmetics, McEvoy said makeup should be applied in a "fun frame of mind."

"The women who come to the McAvoy counter are the 16-year-old dressed in combat boots and 53-year-old dressed in a Chanel outfit with combat boots," she said with a wide smile. "I would use words like 'natural,' 'classic,' 'simple,' to describe my makeup philosophy."

McAvoy said she originally created the line for professional makeup artists and models. It differs from other cosmetics because the pigment is richer and there's a variety of yellow-based products, which McAvoy believes are more natural and attractive on most faces.

To illustrate her point, she wiped the green eyeshadow and orange lipstick off the face of good-humored Anita Durham of Farmington Hills. Within 10 minutes, Durham's repowdered and blended visage was the envy of onlookers.

"Gee," Durham said, seeming not to miss all the color. "This makeup feels so light and looks so natural."

"I just enhanced your own good looks," McAvoy reassured. "That's what it's all about."

A second feature of McAvoy's line

is the natural animal hair brushes, which are in demand by anyone who knows makeup application. The brushes are a one-time purchase guaranteed to last for years.

McAvoy's line is priced \$15-\$63. The shades are advertised as "trans-generational and trans-racial."

When a customer leaves a McAvoy counter, it is only after she has repeated on one side of her face, what the professionals have showed them on the other side. Customers also take home a personalized, shaded face chart to use as a guide for applying McAvoy's products themselves.

# Parents need to be kept informed of child's performance

**QUESTION:** Overall our school district and its programs are excellent. But I have a complaint. Why is it some teachers don't inform parents early in the school year when their child isn't doing what he is supposed to be doing? Our 10th grade son failed a class the first marking period of the school year and we didn't find out until we received his report card. We called the school but the teacher didn't return the call. We are not blaming the school for his lack of effort. But aren't there any phones in the school? This is not right!

**ANSWER:** I agree! Parents have a legitimate right to be kept informed and notified immediately if there is any sudden or unusual change in school performance or behavior by their child.

As a first-year teacher of science and math in the Grosse Ile School District, a community with many professional people, I learned that lesson fast. I was having the typical first-year teacher problems; that is, kids working on your head to see if you are for real. And, as a result, some students were not performing as well as their potential and

past performance would indicate. It was my fault as much as their fault.

Nevertheless, my first six-week report cards went home with some solid B students getting C(s), some "A" students getting B(s), C students getting D(s) and a few students failed for lack of effort and for disrupting the class.

I was blown away at my first parent-teacher conference trying to justify how I could lower a student grade because of poor classroom behavior. Parents, rightly so, pointed out that the class performance and behavior were separate issues.

Most of these parents were kind and reasonable; a few saw an opportunity to create a scapegoat for their own lack of control over their child. But all clearly indicated to me they wanted to be informed in a timely fashion . . . not after the fact. These parents were right. I was dead wrong. And devastated! But not stupid.

The solution that came to me was so simple. A written progress report; not used much back in the late 60s. A report that would go out after the first three weeks of the school year or anytime a parent needed to be notified of a child's performance.

The standard form I developed was

very simple, very objective, saying:

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Jones:  
You should be aware that your son John:

- (1) Has not been turning in homework
- (2) Failed the last test (and other items).

One or both would be checked. The parent response was most positive.

But oh . . . those little devils. Some kids soon caught on and intercepted any letter to their parents in a school envelope to see if it was from Doyle. So, re-grouping, I sent the letter out in a plain envelope. But they recognized my handwriting. So typing the name and address of the parents became a neces-

sity. But then they checked all letters with no return address . . . and some kids were "steaming" letters open. What creativity!

I got nicknames like the Mailman (and others that I won't mention). . . Being tenacious, letters were sent to the office where the father or mother worked, and then the victory was mine.

But something was lacking. My focus was totally on negative aspects. So I decided to "accentuate the positive."

Another form letter was developed as a follow-up. This form letter said something like: "I would like to take this opportunity to tell you how much your daughter has improved in my class. Her homework, attention to task, test scores, behavior, attitude (whatever) has greatly improved and it is a pleasure to have her in my class."

The feedback from parents was amazing. People want teachers and building administrators to be open and caring; caring about their child.

And the teacher not returning a phone call is inexcusable. If teacher contracts in Michigan weren't so powerful, that teacher should be suspended without pay for a reasonable amount of time. But please, first call

back and check to see if a student aide took the message and dropped the ball. Principals and building secretaries I know simply do not let this happen.

One of the worst scenarios I ever experienced was as the new assistant superintendent in a quality Michigan school district. It was an October parent-teacher conference in the high school gymnasium. I shook the hand of a supportive parent. He and his wife sat down in front of the teacher. The parent asked, "How is my kid doing?" The teacher said, "He failed this first marking period. You will be getting the report card tomorrow."

Totally insane! Parents have a right to know and a progress report should be standard operating procedure. Hey, even my gas station tells me when I'm low on oil . . . before the engine is blown away.

# Local commissioners want officials' names off signs

Wayne County Commissioner Michelle Plawecki objects to signs throughout the county announcing "A better road is on the way" because county Executive Edward McNamara's name is on each sign.

"I've had people calling me up asking why his name is on those signs," said Plawecki, D-Deerborn Heights, whose district includes most of Redford Township.

It bugs Plawecki that signs at county maintenance yards have McNamara's name on them, but not the name of the local commissioner.

The commissioner's name should be on the sign, she said, because people need to know who

to complain to.

"Ed McNamara is not the one who takes constituent complaints," she said.

As a result of Plawecki's protest, a proposed ordinance has emerged from the commission's committee on roads, airports and public services.

Sponsored by commissioners Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, Bryan Amann, D-Wayne, and Ricardo Solomon, D-Detroit, the ordinance would prohibit "the erection of signs which bear the names of elected officials," calling that practice "tantamount to the expenditure of public funds for the purpose of political campaigning."

The commission is expected to discuss the proposed ordinance

Tuesday, March 29, and vote on it as early as Thursday, April 7.

Plawecki is unhappy with the ordinance as currently written. She wants it to say that, if the county executive's name is on a sign, then the relevant county commissioner's name has to be on the sign, too.

Amann, who also represents Canton Township, said Friday he believes Plawecki doesn't have enough support for that.

"As far as I'm concerned, I don't want to see any of our names on signs," Amann said.

McCotter, who also represents Plymouth and Plymouth Township, has said he doesn't want his name on county signs.

McNamara did not return the Observer's phone calls by press time.

# Draft says 'any person' can paint

Although it likely will be altered if it becomes law, the initial draft of the Wayne County Commission's proposed sign ordinance permits "any person" to cover McNamara's name with spray paint on any sign in the county.

Section III of the ordinance, in part, reads, "Any person shall, however, have the right to enter upon county property or right-of-way at any reasonable time for the limited purpose of removing, erasing, or painting over the name of any elected officer which may appear upon a sign, vehicle, or equipment, provided that this work is done in a safe, neat and unobtrusive manner without defacing the remainder of the sign, equipment or vehicle."

When that portion of the proposed ordinance was read to Amann, he said, "That's crazy. Someone doesn't know what they're doing."

Amann predicted an early demise for that sentence.

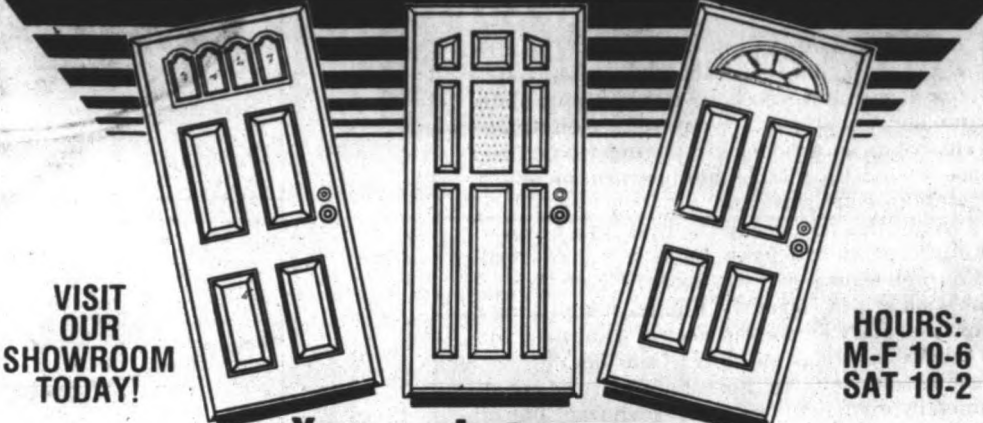

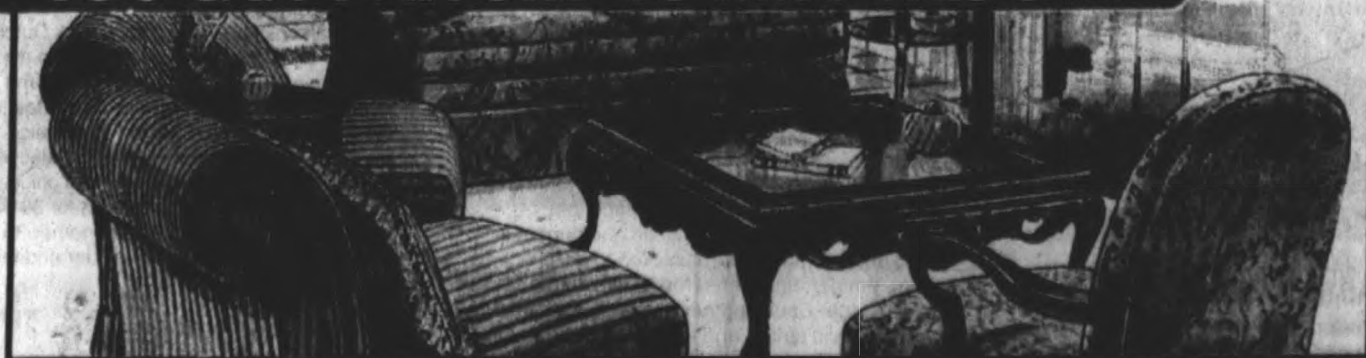

Master the technique of eating artichokes

I think it was Julia Child who said - "The artichoke is the only vegetable that, when you finish eating it, you have more on your plate than when you started." We never ate anything as elusive as an artichoke in Wyandotte not because it wasn't available, but because the only vegetable we ate was corn.

I can to this day, recall the first time I ever encountered an artichoke. I was just a lad fresh out of high school, and was interviewing for a cook's job at the Top of the Flame, at that time a gourmet eatery on the top floor of what used to be the Michcon Gas building at the foot of Woodward downtown. Fortunately, I was accompanied by my neighbor's mother who was one of those gracious elevator operators that have gone the way of 10 cent ice cream cones.

Twila was her name and fine dining was her game. She acquainted the taste buds of this little ole boy from Downriver to the taste of life in the big city. I don't think I liked the taste of my first artichoke, especially when I found myself putting more effort into eating it than anything else. It was but a week later that I discovered the tasty thistle steamed and marinated at a little cozy bistro dubbed the Kickapoo on Grosse Isle. I have been a faithful admirer ever since.

Amongst it's other devotees, the artichoke is regarded as a thing of epicurean elegance and delight. It first came into prominence as a food-stuff in 16th century Italy. It has gone on to win acceptance as a delicacy by many of the cognoscenti of the Western world, but is curiously left unknown or disdained among people's everywhere. My guess is that in addition to its velvety and buttery taste, it is indeed just a plain edible thistle with thorns.

Eating tips

An artichoke is by far the only vegetable I can recall that is so demanding to eat. There are three phases to enjoying an artichoke. The first is the most fun and requires the fingers. This stage consists of dismantling, one by one, the artichoke's outer layer of petals also known as bracts and dipping their fleshy lower tips into melted butter or a sauce. The petals are placed between the teeth and then gently pulled, extracting fleshy tidbits from their flowery base. There are some 40 odd petals to pluck, dip and nibble from a basic artichoke.

Phase two is the most exacting and requires the dexterity of a surgeon. Once the petals are enjoyed, the diner must coordinate the fingers and a knife in unison to extract and dispose of the inedible center, usually referred to as the choke. Unskilled laborers will leave fragments of the choke and yes, to consume the choke will, for a lack of better terms, "choke" you.

This done, phase three simply requires the diner to cut the remaining artichoke heart into bite-sized morsels, again to be enjoyed with a sauce or butter.

An unadorned artichoke is one of the least fattening foods on earth, averaging a mere 25 calories. This virtue, however, diminishes when the vegetable is accompanied by artery clogging butter, mayonnaise and hollandaise sauce.

Cooking methods

One of the best ways to enjoy an artichoke is to steam it. Ah, but that technique too deserves some special remarks. To first prepare an artichoke, the cook, to avoid any possible injury of the diner, should snip off the thorny tips of the artichoke petals. Best done with kitchen scissors, the artichoke will then have to be placed in an acidulated bath to keep from turning brown - (an acidulated bath is 1 quart of water mixed with 1/4 cup lemon juice).

Next, the long rubbery stem must be chopped off as close to the base as possible to facilitate standing. Yours truly prefers to remove about a dozen or so of the petals surrounding the base as these are usually tough and chewy, even after steaming.

Next, "X" marks the base with a sharp paring knife, about 1/4 inch deep to facilitate cooking and ensure a tender heart. At this point the artichoke can be steamed, covered for upwards of 30 minutes or boiled for about the same time. You can discern the doneness when a sharp paring knife is inserted into the base and easily pulls out.

Serve the artichoke immediately at this point, you can stuff the artichoke with a mixture of bread stuffing, eggs and/or meat.

KEEPS THE HOME FIRES BURNING



Bread is the staff of life. For Dr. Robert Majewski, baking the Easter bread he made as a child, is a way of sharing his Polish American heritage with his family, and staying in touch with family in other states.

"Having the same bread my family is having on Easter perpetuates the tradition," said Dr. Robert Majewski who grew up in Massachusetts. "We can't always be together, but can share the same bread."

Majewski, has lived in Livonia with his wife Judy and

their sons, Mark, 11 and Matthew, 4 for the past four years. He learned how to bake the sweet citrus flavored raisin bread called babka from his mother when he was 10, and is passing the tradition on to his sons.

In addition to baking bread for family and friends, Majewski sends a loaf to his

former instructor Dr. Chet Glomski in Buffalo, New York.

"When I was in dental school a friend of mine and I decided to bake Easter bread. We gave the extra loaf to Dr. Glomski. The first year I graduated from dental school I sent him one as a lark on Palm Sunday. He sent me a very nice thank you. I've sent him one every year. This is the 23rd year in a row," said Majewski a dentist at Mott Children's Health Center in Flint.

Since graduating from dental school, Majewski has fine-



tuned his bread baking skills. His sons enjoy helping him.

On this particular day, Matthew is standing at the counter grating lemon peel, while his brother helps braid dough. Judy stands back watching. Baking bread is a father and son project.

Because of health concerns, Majewski reduced the amount of eggs in his mother's recipe, substituting two eggs, plus four egg whites for four whole eggs. The only noticeable difference is a lighter colored batter.

Southern cook cuts fat in 'down home' recipes

Beth Mele of Livonia has a great recipe for those of you looking for an easy way to fill a lot of tummies. Mele moved to Livonia two years ago from Baton Rouge, La. As a clinical physicist at William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak, she is responsible for assisting physicians in administering radioactive implant therapy. Because her schedule sometimes keeps her at the hospital at all different hours, she likes to prepare recipes that are easy and provide leftovers for lunches and late dinners.

She is a wonderful cook but does not like to use all the fat most of the "down home" recipes require. Many Southern recipes call for a "roux." This is a flour and oil mixture that is used to thicken a stew or make gravy. Mele says it takes practice and patience to make a proper roux.

Start by melting the butter or oil in a pan. Add equal parts of flour, stirring continuously. The flour and oil will make a paste. As the paste cooks, it turns a rich brown color. If not watched carefully at this point, it will quickly burn, and then you have to start over.

Although it does thicken the recipe nicely, it will add a large amount of unnecessary fat to the recipe. Fortunately, Mele believes it is not necessary in most recipes.

In her makeover recipe, I eliminated the thigh meat because of its high fat content. By using only boneless, skinless chicken breasts, I reduced the total fat from the chicken from 115.6 grams of fat to 30 grams.

Louisiana Chicken Stew  
Original Recipe

- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 2 large whole chicken breasts (about 3 pounds) skin on, cut into 8 pieces
- 12 chicken thighs (about 4 pounds)
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1 1/2 cups coarsely chopped onion
- 2 cups coarsely chopped celery
- 2 medium green bell peppers, coarsely chopped
- 1 can (32 ounces) tomatoes, chopped, with juice
- 4 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 2 large bay leaves
- 2 large garlic cloves, minced
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 pound precooked, coarsely chopped andouille sausage

Brown all chicken in a large Dutch oven with 1/4 cup oil. Remove chicken to a platter. Add flour to remaining oil to make roux. Place onions, celery and green peppers in roux and cook for 5 minutes. Add the tomatoes, tomato paste, lemon juice, hot pepper sauce, bay leaves, chicken broth, garlic, salt and pepper. Bring to a simmer. Return chicken to Dutch oven. Simmer, uncovered for 30 minutes. Add the sausage. Cook another 30 minutes, or until the chicken is tender and the sauce thick. Serves 12.

Louisiana Chicken Stew  
Reduced-Fat Recipe

- 1/4 cup water
- 10 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cut into bite-size pieces
- 1 1/2 cups coarsely chopped onion
- 2 cups coarsely chopped celery
- 2 medium green bell peppers, coarsely chopped
- 1 can (32 ounces) "no salt added" tomatoes, chopped, with juice
- 4 tablespoons "no salt added" tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
- 3 cans (10.5 ounces each) Campbell's low sodium chicken broth
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 2 large bay leaves
- 2 large garlic cloves, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper

¼ cup chopped red sweet pepper  
¼ teaspoon crushed red pepper  
½ cup freshly shredded or grated Parmesan cheese (about 2 ounces)  
Ground black pepper

Cook linguine or spaghetti according to package directions.  
Meanwhile, spray a medium saucepan with nonstick coating. Cook bacon in saucepan until crisp and light brown. Drain on paper towels. Wipe saucepan clean with a paper towel.

For sauce, in the same saucepan combine egg, milk, peas, sweet pepper and crushed red pepper. Cook and stir over medium heat just until the mixture coats a metal spoon (about 6 minutes). Do not boil. Stir in bacon and half of the Parmesan cheese. Heat through.

But fresh food should never be stored in closed, plastic bags because condensation that occurs may hasten ripening or cause the growth of mold.

Never place washed produce back into a bag that once held unwashed food; you don't want to recontaminate clean food with micro-organisms.

■ Wash fruits and vegetables in cold water.  
■ Some fruits and vegetables, like strawberries and mushrooms, have a high water content and should only be washed just prior to eating. Store these foods away from washed produce in the refrigerator.

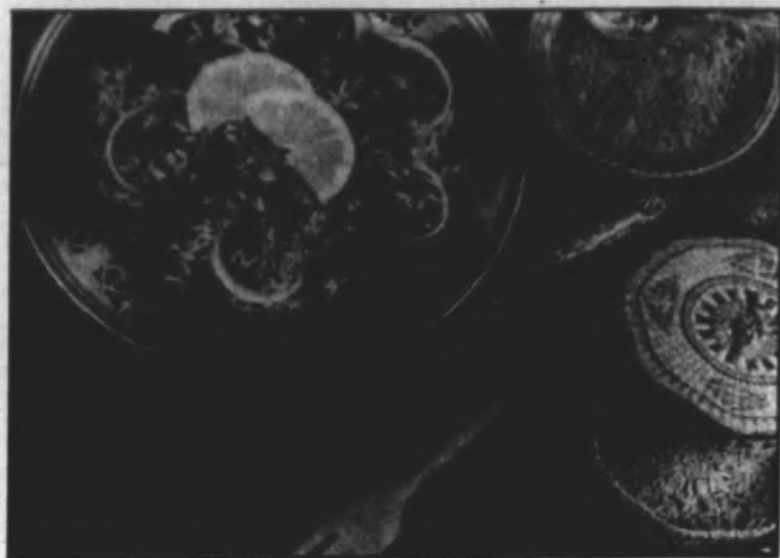
# Lentils and rice, one pot meal

Protein plays an essential role in maintaining health, but many health experts are calling into question the amount of protein Americans normally eat. Since our meals typically focus on meat, poultry, eggs, cheese and other protein-rich foods, we often consume as much as twice the amount of protein we need each day. According to the American Institute for Cancer Research, the recommended daily allowance of protein is 50 grams for women ages 25-50, and 63 grams for men.

Studies have shown that countries where people eat large amounts of animal protein have a higher incidence of heart disease, diabetes and colon or breast cancer. However, although high-protein foods such as meat and dairy products are often high in fat — which is known to increase cancer risk — not enough is known about protein itself to rule it out as a potential cancer risk factor.

Until further research is done on the health effects of protein, the American Institute for Cancer Research recommends choosing low-fat protein sources as part of a healthful diet. Eating skim and low-fat dairy products and extra-lean cuts of meat is a good start, particularly in modest portions (three or four ounces of meat per meal). It is easier to cut back by replacing some animal protein with extra plant protein from dried beans, potatoes, pasta, deer, or corn, and use just a little meat or cheese for flavor. Whole-grain cereals and breads are also good protein sources.

Look at protein as an important

part of your diet, but not the most important part. Most Americans can cut back on protein without jeopardizing their health. By shifting the focus of your meals to give equal attention to meats, fruits, vegetables and grains, you can provide better balance to your diet and help avoid health problems associated with an excess or deficiency of any important nutrients.

Lentil Rice Delight provides a meal in one pot, since the lentils and rice combined make a good low-fat protein source. The fat and calorie content is already fairly low for a whole meal; however, you can reduce it even more by substituting white wine, low-fat broth, or water for the oil.

- ¾ cup brown rice, uncooked
- ½ teaspoon curry powder
- 2¼ cups water
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup lentils, rinsed
- 1½ Tablespoons lemon juice
- 5 ounces frozen spinach (or ½ pound fresh spinach, stems removed)

Saute the chopped onion and garlic in the oil (or white wine, broth or water). Add the rice and curry; sautee 1 or 2 minutes more. Add the water, salt, lentils and lemon juice, and simmer 45 minutes, covered. Add the spinach and simmer a few more minutes until the spinach is tender.

If a spicier flavor is desired, add a dash of hot pepper sauce or chili powder before serving.

Each of the 2 servings (2 cups each) contains 9 grams of fat and 480 calories.

### VITAMIN E FOR MUSCLE SORENESS

Preliminary research seems to indicate that vitamin E supplementation may reduce the muscle damage that accompanies rigorous exercise routines. The evidence that led to this conclusion comes from a study of 21 normal young and older men who took part in an exercise program for 48 days. Half the men took 800 international units of vitamin E, while the other half took a placebo. Muscle damage in each man was assessed on the basis of biopsies from the younger men's leg muscles and the presence of by-products of fat oxidation in the urine of all the men. The results showed that the group taking vitamin E, an antioxidant, exhibited less exercise-induced muscle damage than the placebo group. Bearing this in mind, exercisers may want to take vitamin E to reduce muscle soreness and inflammation.

# Farm owners get tax break from state Senate

State Senate Republicans passed a \$22 million property tax break for agri-business, but not before they took a verbal blistering from Democrats.

Farms — even those owned by corporations and non-residents — will get the same homestead property tax break as homeowners under a bill approved 20-11 Thursday. Nineteen Republicans and one Democrat voted yes; 11 Democrats voted no.

Said an angry Senate Democratic leader Art Miller of Warren: "It's fine we help some business people and do what's good for the farmer. But after spring break, I'm gonna put in a bill to help the electrician and plumber (who work out of their homes). What's

good for rural Michigan is going to be good for small business, too."

The sponsor, Republican Joel Gougeon of Bay City, blamed Democrats for demanding separate tax rates for business and homeowners during 1993 negotiations. "We on this side of the aisle lost that argument," he said.

## Tied to Proposal A

Senate Bill 1027, now on its way to the House, amends Proposal A, approved March 15 by voters.

Proposal A will activate a law placing a 24-mill school tax rate on all business property and second homes, and six mills on principal homesteads and farm property connected to a farmer's homestead. Leased farmland and

disconnected farmland were to be taxed at 24 mills — until this Senate bill.

Voting yes were Republicans Michael Bouchard of Birmingham, Mat Dunaskiss of Lake Orion and Robert Geake of Northville.

Voting no were Democrats William Faust of Westland and George Z. Hart of Dearborn.

Absent were Sens. David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, and Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills.

During the Proposal A campaign, farmers protested the split rate on farm property, and Gov. John Engler agreed to give them a single rate.

Gougeon said that under Proposal A, 66 percent of farmland would have been taxed at six

mills and 33 percent at 24 mills. His bill gives 95 percent of farms the six-mill rate. Only farmland with commercial storage, processing and shipping equipment would pay 24 mills.

The House is working on a similar bill, sponsored by Rep. Dan Gustafson, R-Haslett. It's likely a Senate-House conference committee will work out a compromise.

## Cost unknown

Faust objected to taking up the bill because the Senate Fiscal Agency said it was "not clear" how much revenue schools would lose but there would be "a significant fiscal impact."

Said Faust: "This body holds itself out as fiscally conservative, but it doesn't know the answer to

the question (of revenue loss)."

Sen. James Berryman, D-Adrian, noted that Ohio, Indiana and Illinois residents who own vacation homes in Michigan will pay 24 mills, but those who own farmland will pay only six mills. The Senate rejected, 16 to 18, Berryman's amendment to charge non-resident farm owners 24 mills.

Gougeon thought a split rate on farms would be unconstitutional. Not so, said Democrat John Kelly of Grosse Pointe. "The interstate commerce clause doesn't let us put impediments on products from another state," he said, but Michigan may choose how it give property tax breaks.

## Generous to farms

Conroy of Flint said the bill amounts to "saying farmers aren't

in business. They say it (farming) is a movement. Well, it's not a movement for my retailers, gas station owners and cosmetologists."

"We give a couple hundred million dollars in breaks for farmers," Conroy went on, citing farm exemptions from the single business tax; exemption from sales and use taxes for seeds, tools and pesticides; income tax credits totalling \$60 million; exemption for tractors from the personal property tax; and from motor fuel taxes for farm implements.

If farmers quit, McManus went on, "what do we want the landscape of Michigan to look like in the future? Do we want agriculture? Or do we want everything built up? What happens to the young farmers?"

# Hollywood keeps writer in suspended animation

Waiting in Hollywood is perhaps better than working with nuts and bolts at a hardware store. Al Jean, a 1977 Harrison High grad, has done his share of both.

The script writer worked in Jean's Hardware on 12 Mile, owned by his father, Alfred Jean. The younger Al Jean worked there while in school before working on such shows as "The Simpsons."

"It's funny," Jean said. "I watch 'Home Improvement' and I think I should work on that show, because it's about a guy who works with tools and lives in Michigan. So far, I haven't been offered anything yet."

Jean takes life and work one frame at a time.

After success with TV's cartoon "The Simpsons," Jean and script-writing collaborator Mike Reiss concocted another animated offer-

ing, "The Critic," which has been aired on ABC-TV.

The sitcom centers on a portly New York film critic, who is sort of a schlep Rex Reed. "Saturday Night Live" alum Jon Lovitz does the character's voice.

"We always say he's balder than Siskel and fatter than Ebert," Jean said from his home in the Los Angeles area.

Six episodes of the show ran this winter, including at the height of the "Tonya Harding Olympics." Reviews were mixed.

"It was a little more difficult with this show," Jean said. "With 'The Simpsons,' you just had a family, a mother, a father and three kids."

"The Critic" has one central character, although Jean said he'd like time to develop more. That's in the network's hands.

Jean is waiting to see if "The Critic" will be picked up for the fall. Otherwise, he'll wait for

something else to pop up.

Jean's used to the transient nature of Hollywood writing jobs. Since his days honing his wry humor writing skills at Harvard and National Lampoon magazines, Jean has gone to work for the "Tonight Show" with Johnny Carson, HBO's "Not Necessarily the News," and Fox's "It's Garry Shandling's Show."

The Harvard grad who majored in math owes his success to one equation: He'd take jobs no one else wanted.

Jean and Reiss, who were roommates at Harvard, were summoned to Hollywood to work on the spoof turned crash "Airplane II." The film, which bombed, provided a door for TV writing jobs.

About five years ago, Fox wanted to take a 30-second cartoon on "The Tracey Ullman Show" and turn it into a 30-minute sitcom. Jean and Reiss applied.

"None of our friends wanted to do it because it was a cartoon,"

Jean said. "We had nothing else going. We were out of work."

"The Simpsons" soon became a hit, pummeling "The Cosby Show" into retirement. The sitcom evolved beyond the Dennis the Menace antics of an underachieving urchin named Bart. The show aired Thursdays on Channel 50 parodies pop culture, the political landscape and anything else deemed fit to poke under the sardonic sun.

Characters such as the Indian convenience store operator Apu, the gritty Glaswegian Willie the Groundskeeper and the Kennebecque Mayor of Springfield Diamond Joe Quimby carry the show as much as America's No. 1 animated family.

Jean had a hand in the transition. He and his partner helped create Apu, the mayor and a jazz musician named Bleeding Gums Murphy.

Jean has some favorite episodes.

One included guest appearances by Jose Canseco, Darryl Strawberry and Roger Clemens, who were recruited by Homer's boss Monty Burns for the company's softball team. Another Jean fav was when Michael Jackson visited, providing the voice for an overweight white guy who has delusions of grandeur in which he is the pop star.

Writing for a cartoon has its pluses, Jean said.

"It wasn't difficult conceptually," he said. "Actually, it was kind of liberating because you can do anything you want, go anywhere you want. The big problem with live action is budget."

A show like "The Simpsons" is a year-around effort. Said Jean, "You find you're on a treadmill you can't get off very easily."

Jean and Reiss serve as consultants to "The Simpsons." They hope to work the same magic with "The Critic."

Even certificates and awards hanging on his office wall are made out to Mickey. It's a nickname bestowed on Philippart as a child by his father and used during his days as an amateur flyweight boxer fighting at Olympia during the 1940s.

A Redford Township resident, Philippart is retiring at the end of the month after 26 years as a Wayne County assistant prosecu-

tor, the last two years heading the out-county office in Westland.

"He's a policeman's prosecutor," said Redford public safety director David Parker who has known Philippart for about 20 years.

"If we had a major case, like a homicide, we'd call him if we had questions about what we could and couldn't do. He was always amicable about helping us whenever we called him."

During his years as a prosecutor Philippart was especially known for having a good relationship with police officers who don't necessarily hit it off with attorneys from either side of the aisle. Philippart would look at the

whole case and what the officer was trying to accomplish with the warrant.

"He is highly thought of throughout all of Wayne County and I don't know of any detective who doesn't like him," said Parker.

For his part, Philippart said he always treated the officers as professionals and found they were eager to gain knowledge.

"I've been available and listened when people needed an ear. I like people," Philippart said. "The reason I like out-county is that it's like an old-time prosecutor. You get to know the judges and cops."

After attending Sacred Heart

seminary and a brief stint in the Navy, Philippart decided to follow his father's career choice by becoming an attorney.

"I didn't think I was worthy of becoming a priest. It was natural that I would go to law school."

Asked where he attended law school, Philippart responds like any good Catholic school graduate. "There is only one law school: the University of Detroit."

Philippart was admitted to the bar in 1951, the same year his father died, and joined his father's firm in private practice. Philippart and wife Elizabeth, who had nine children, were married that year.

In 1968, two of the couple's

children, boys 3 and 5, went with a neighbor to the zoo. While they were out, the neighbor decided to include the children in a flight on a small private plane. The plane developed a gas leak and exploded, killing everyone but the pilot.

"It was a hell of a shock. The state police called to tell us where we should pick up the bodies," Philippart said.

A short time later his friend, William Cahalan, then Wayne County prosecutor, asked him to join the prosecutor's staff.

"He said I was a sensible person and he needed me. I figured \$18,000 a year was good," Philippart said. "He and John O'Hair have both been good bosses."

Robert Sage, who was Philippart's boss at the out-county office until his retirement two years ago, said he was sorry Philippart was leaving.

"He was my right arm. He handled a lot of sexual assault cases, heavier homicides and conspiracies," Sage said. "We called him Capt. Smut because was in charge of pornography cases."

One of the first things on the agenda for Philippart and his wife after his retirement, a trip to Alaska. "I guess I get a little nostalgic. It's time to step down. They'll miss you for about a week."

Parents protesting coach's cuts



One of a coach's primary responsibilities is selecting the team. That is never an easy process, but now Plymouth Canton softball coach Jim Arnold's methods are under scrutiny by a group of upset parents who feel his selections were prejudiced.

The parents of six girls cut from the Plymouth Canton softball program plan to bring the issue before the school board at tonight's meeting.

The players believe they were unfairly cut because they played slow-pitch softball in the summer instead of fast-pitch for one of Canton varsity coach Jim Arnold's two teams.

High school teams play fast-pitch during the spring months in Michigan.

Five of the six girls were in the school program last year, and all six played on Mid-America slow-pitch

teams in the summer.

Senior Stacy Movinski was a varsity player last year, sophomores Anne Alioto and Aimee Breil played on the junior varsity and sophomores Nikki Kunec and Marci Dupont were freshman team members. Sue Huber is a freshman this year.

Ray Knickerbocker, manager of the Mid-America program and spokesperson for the girls and their parents, said they will ask the board to review the matter and might seek appropriate legal action — possibly an injunction to re-instate the players.

"This has been a festering boil, and Arnold just lanced it with his

act of retaliation," Knickerbocker said, adding he knows of no Mid-America player who failed to make a fast-pitch school team.

"Two of the six girls are potential scholarship players and are being denied an opportunity. The sole reason is they didn't play fast-pitch in the summer."

Arnold, who has an 83-15 record in three years as varsity coach, was contacted for this story but declined to comment.

The players were cut March 9, two days after practice began, according to Knickerbocker. He and the parents met with Plymouth-Canton athletic director Paul Cummings and Canton assistant athletic director Jim Finn March 16, requesting the girls be re-instated and Arnold removed as coach.

Cummings informed Knickerbocker March 18, the date when Knickerbocker asked for a status re-

port, that he was investigating. In another conversation March 24, he told them their demands would not be met. Cummings said he is confident Arnold made his selections based on ability.

"We have a lot of sports and we do a lot of cutting, and no one dislikes it anymore than me," Cummings said. "But it's still the coach's job to select the team. I'm sure anyone cut from a ballclub is very disappointed because young people work hard to make a ballclub, but that's just the process."

"I'm sure there's not a coach in the district who would select a player on anything other than ability. I'm no different from any other athletic director in the country. You rely on your coaches to pick their team. That's part of the job description."

Canton eyes another banner season

There's nothing a coach would rather do than tell this to anyone who asks about the prospects for his team's upcoming season: *We won't rebuild; we'll reload.*

It's particularly gratifying to the coach of a team that reached the state finals the previous year. Which is exactly the position Plymouth Canton soccer coach Don Smith finds himself.

One welcome returnee is Britta Anderson, a senior forward who missed all last season after undergoing reconstructive knee surgery. She isn't the only one trying to bounce back from that type-injury: senior forward Mandy Salin and sophomore sweeper Beth Ostach also had reconstructive knee surgeries last season.

Leading the returnees is four-year starter Alison Nouné, a senior midfielder. Other seniors returning are stopper Erica Anderson, outside midfielders Lynn Haines and Robyn Pashow, forward Angie Page, and defenders Christy Priebe and Nicole Burns.

"All of them got quite a bit of playing time last year," Smith said. "They got a lot of experience."

Another potential contributor is senior Therese Ideblad, an exchange student from Denmark. "She will definitely be an asset to us," said Smith.

If there's one thing he has plenty of, it's depth. Six juniors will vie for time on the field: Stacy Miller, Kara Moylan and Becci Brown, all defend-

Player losses mean Salem must rebuild

Every coach must face losing key players every season. In school sports, athletes graduate, sometimes taking their team's success with them.

Rebuilding year after year is something a high school coach adapts to. All they can hope to do is minimize the job by bringing back a slew of experienced players. Or at least a few.

Plymouth Salem girls soccer coach Ken Johnson thought he would have the former. Instead, through events he had no control over, he is facing the latter.

Gone from last year's 9-3-4 team are eight starters. Of those returning, only one — senior Susie Parrish, one of three team captains for '94 — was a full-time starter last season.

What hurts is Johnson thought that, when school let out for summer in '93, he would lose just three starters and a fourth part-time player. Kris Goff, Michelle Cronan and Caryn Tatterton, who combined had 11 years of high school experience, were graduating; so was substitute Charu Sinha.

But Johnson didn't think he'd lose the rest of his nucleus. First, Mackenzie Emmett, a three-year starter at defender, moved. Then Mari Hoff, Stacey DeLong, Jenny Bazzarelli and Kelly Lukaski, all starters, opted to train for their club team, the Livonia Hawks, coached by Paul Scicluna.

"What can you do?" said Johnson, explaining he has talked to coaches in other sports who shoulder similar burdens. "It's a big chunk out of my team, but life goes on."

"Whatever happens, happens."

Of those returning, five have considerable experience from last season. Parrish, a junior, will inherit the center midfield position filled by all-star Kris Goff, who played at Michigan State last fall. Parrish will roam around, filling both offensive and defensive needs.

Two seniors who share the captain's duties with Parrish are Jodee Wilsher, a defender, and Alexis Marinova, a striker. Both were part-time starters last season.

The only other senior on the squad is Jaimie Gardner, who just trans-

ferred into the school district. She'll see playing time at midfield.

Julie Buczek, a sophomore, returns at keeper. She took over as starter midway through the '93 season, so Johnson will have some experience in the net. Lisa Bares, a junior defender, is the only other player with varsity experience.

# Underclass rules mat team

Remember the names and faces of the wrestlers on the All-Observer first team. You'll be seeing and hearing about most of them again next year.

The 1994 honor squad is dominated by underclassmen. Only three of the 14 first-teamers are seniors. The remainder consists of nine juniors and two sophomores.

Four are repeat selections: Redford Thurston junior Luley Haddad and Livonia Stevenson juniors Scott Goldman, Chris Mullett and Craig Martin.

Livonia Churchill junior Josh Banks, Farmington senior Mike Prough and Redford Catholic Central senior Liam O'Donohue were second-team picks a year ago. CC junior Dan Krueger made the jump from the third team.

Coach of the Year honors go to the Livonia Stevenson staff headed by Don Berg. It was a team effort by Berg and assistants Jim Carlin, Ben Lewis, Mike Krause and Bob Mounro that made the Spartans the No. 1 team in Observerland.

**ALL-AREA TEAM**  
**John Spolsky, 275, Redford CC:** Spolsky (sophomore) placed eighth in the heavyweight class at the state tournament, was second in the regional and won the district title. He also was the Observerland champion and placed second in three other tournaments. Spolsky was 40-6 this year and has a 43-7 career record.

"John is one of the most exciting wrestlers to step on the mat in recent years," CC coach Mike Rodriguez said. "John qualified for state in his first season on the varsity and still has two more shots at it."

**Matt Michalski, 103, Farmington:** Michalski (sophomore) is the Observerland, Western Lakes Activities Association and district champion at 103 pounds. He also placed second in the regional, third in Oakland County and fifth in the state. Michalski was 36-9 this year and has a 45-15 career record.

"Pound for pound, it would be hard to find a more competitive, determined and dedicated athlete," Farmington coach Al Beyar said.

**Jason Milne, 112, Garden City:** Milne (junior) is the Observerland, Mega Conference and district champion at 112. He also placed first at the Riverview tournament and second at Garden City, Redford Thurston and the regional.

The state qualifier set the school record with 88 takedowns this year and the junior record for single-season wins. He was 42-10 this year, was named co-MVP of the Observerland tournament and has a career record of 68-25.

"Jason improved a tremendous amount since last year with hard work and determination," Garden City coach Phil Freeman said. "His winning attitude in the wrestling room rubbed off on the rest of the team."

"Jason always tries to learn from his losses and keep his wins in perspective. Sometimes he works so hard you have to force him to take a break."

**Josh Banks, 119, Churchill:** Banks (junior) won the Observerland title at 119 and qualified for state. He was second at the Berkeley tournament and third at Trenton, Garden City, the district and the regional.

gional. Banks was 26-7 this year and has a career record of 56-24.

"Josh grew as a wrestler this year," Churchill coach Brent Withington said. "His wrestling has been an inspiration to the team, and I'm looking forward to Josh's accomplishments next year."

**Luley Haddad, 125, Thurston:** Haddad (junior) won the Class B state championship at 125 pounds. After finishing third at Observerland, he didn't lose another match and finished 40-2.

He was first at the Thurston, Dearborn Fordson and Dearborn invitationals, won the Mega Blue title and placed first in the district and regional meets.

Haddad, who was third in the state at 119 last year, has a 103-22 career record. He has a 3.6 grade point in advanced courses and is the junior class president.

"Luley is a gentleman and a leader off the mat, a fierce competitor on it," Thurston coach Bill Cohan said. "He has a spirited outlook on life that you can't coach. He is a great student of the sport and a fine young man."

**Steve Horvath, 130, Garden City:** Horvath (senior) was the Observerland and district champion at 130. He placed second in the Riverview tournament and third at Mount Clemens. Horvath was 23-8 this year and had a 54-43 career record.

"Steve comes from a wrestling family and possesses great natural ability, which he worked hard to perfect in practice," Freeman said.

"Steve was a varsity wrestler from the first day he walked in the wrestling room. He has great technique and quickness, and he learned moves as quickly as they were taught."

**Chris Jaztrebski, 135, Stevenson:** Jaztrebski (junior) won championships at the Observerland, Western Lakes and district tournaments. He led the Spartans in nearfalls with 51 and placed at every meet. Jaztrebski, who plays noseguard on the football team, was 32-10 this year and has a 52-34 career record.

"Chris is a very strong wrestler," Stevenson coach Don Berg said. "He can bench press 260 pounds, and it shows on the mat. He likes to lock up and throw. He learned this year not to force the throw and tries not to muscle it. He is a hard-nosed wrestler on the mat and a gentleman off the mat."

**Mike Prough, 140, Farmington:** Prough (senior) was the Observerland, WLA, district and regional champion. He placed fourth in the Oakland County tournament. Prough was 35-8 this year and had a 75-21 career record.

on at 145. He also placed first at the Trenton (MVP) and Garden City tournaments.

"Craig is a very dedicated wrestler who worked harder than anyone in his weight class," Berg said. "It showed in the state semifinal match when he won in overtime (14-12) over undefeated Garrett Gould of Troy."

"He is very mature for his age. He is on a higher level of thinking than most high school kids. I would have to call him a man among boys."

"He is quick and agile but as strong as a bull. Craig will be back to defend his title at 189 pounds. You can bet on it."

# Madonna adds coach for St. Francis

What a way to welcome the nation's No. 1-ranked baseball team in the NAIA — with all sorts of new additions.

That's exactly what Madonna University has planned for this week's invasion of the Saints from the College of St. Francis (Joliet, Ill.). They won the NAIA World Series last season and remain a top-level college team.

Madonna coach Mike George hopes the team's field, located at the former Livonia Bentley, will be upgraded with the addition of a scoreboard (donated by Pepsi Cola) and a press box/refreshment stand.

And he hopes his team will be improved with the addition of a new coach — Greg Haeger, a Livonia native and Redford Catholic Central graduate.

## BASEBALL

Haeger will take over the duties as George's pitching coach. He has the proper credentials: Haeger played first base and pitched at the University of Michigan until 1990. He missed a great part of the '90 season after wrist surgery that limited his at-bats to about 40.

The injury resulted in his switching from first base to the mound near the end of the season. He didn't get much time in pitching — Haeger estimated about eight innings in five appearances — but that June he was drafted by the Tigers as a pitcher.

He was part of the club's Class A Lakeland team that won the championship in '92, but the following off-season Haeger wrecked

a knee that required reconstructive surgery. The club released him a year ago.

At Lakeland, Haeger said he was "doing a lot of everything — spot starting, long relief, set-up, just about everything." His injury occurred during a pick-up basketball game. "I was doing something I shouldn't have been doing," he said.

Haeger hopes to add only positives to Madonna's pitching, even with his late start. He was added to George's staff last week after his roommate, Sean Maloney, a former Madonna player, told George about his availability.

"I hope I can (help)," Haeger said. "I'm not going to go in and try to change anybody, not now. I'll just give them some minor things, some pointers, suggestions."

His 2 1/4 years pitching in the

minor leagues can only be a help to Madonna's staff. George had been without an in-season pitching coach; Mark Falvo had worked with his staff during the pre-season, but Falvo also coaches Dearborn Divine Child's team, making him unavailable during the season.

So George would absorb the duties himself. "And you can fit what I know about pitching into a thimble," George said, only partially in jest. "He should be a great help. He's pitched at every level: high school (Haeger was all-state at CC), college and pro."

The Fighting Crusaders will need the help against St. Francis.

According to Knickerbocker, Arnold made threatening and intimidating statements to the girls regarding their participation in slow-pitch softball and retaliated by cutting them.

## Martin heads sterling cast in CBS' adaptation of 'Christy'

Christy, Catherine Marshall's best-selling novel of faith and the testing of a young heart, comes to television Easter Sunday, April 3, on CBS. The two-hour movie, starring Kellie Martin ("Life Goes On") as 19-year-old Christy Huddleston was filmed on location in the beautiful Smoky Mountains of Tennessee.

Leaving the comforts of home in Asheville, N.C., to teach at the Cutter Gap mission school in 1912 is an eye-opening experience for Christy, whose students come to class barefoot and grubby, unable to give their home address because there are no streets or house numbers. The Scots-Irish Highlanders are a brooding lot, not given to long explanations. Some still carry on generations-old feuds. As harsh as the physical reality is the spiritual clash of faith, superstition and pragmatism among the people of Cutter Gap.

Christy's first friends in this strange world are Miss Alice Henderson, the sturdy and independent Quaker who founded the school, and

David Grantland, the young mission preacher. They are played by Tyne Daly ("Cagney & Lacey") and Randall Batinkoff, respectively.

Christy tells Miss Alice she wants her life "to count for something," and she struggles hard to succeed at the open-air mission school.

"Christy has even more enthusiasm than I have," says Martin, who took the role after deciding to defer her entrance to Yale University from last fall to next.

"I love Christy's enthusiasm. She doesn't think that there's anything she can't do. She goes for it. And she believes in people. She follows her heart, and it sometimes gets her into some bad situations. But she believes in herself, and she believes in other people."

Strong in character, Christy is at the same time a gently bred young woman of the Gibson Girl era, from a medium-sized Southern city. During filming, Martin says, she had to remind herself that Christy would not have moved or spoken with the freedom a young woman enjoys today.

"She's very proper. She's very

1912. She's still very Southern, and I'm not," Martin says, adding that her character's moral fiber is more important to her than manners or mores. Her idea of a good role, she says, has a lot to do with "whether or not it is an admirable character. I am still a teenager, and I do not want other teenagers to watch the show and not look up to that character. So I wouldn't take a part that I didn't believe in, that I wouldn't look up to."

"I never would have wanted to do what Christy did," Martin says. "I don't know if I would've been able to hold out as long as she did. She was very frightened when she got there. But she stuck it out. And I don't know if I could have done that."

"I admire her very much for leaving her family and leaving a place where she felt safe and going to this backwards settlement of people who are uneducated, going into a classroom full of children who couldn't read, write, some couldn't speak, they didn't have shoes. I probably wouldn't have been able to take it."

Like opening a window on spring, CBS' decision to present "Christy" is a breath of fresh air after a winter of movies about women in crisis and litigation. It features strong roles for both sexes. Daly's Miss Alice is a sharp-shooting pacifist who lives with a deep sorrow caused by her own human frailty. Fairlight Spencer (Tess Harper), a mountain woman who befriends Christy, stands up to a local bully's threat to close the school. The local doctor, Neil MacNeil (Stewart Finlay-McLennan), turned down offers of more conventional practices to return to his people, many of whom mistrust his motives as much as his medicine.

Fortunately, this family drama does not end with Sunday's two-hour movie. The story of Christy continues in six one-hour episodes beginning Thursday, April 7.

If the millions of viewers who made "Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman" a surprise hit respond as well to "Christy," the series will return with more episodes next season. And Yale will have to wait a little longer for a certain young actress to join its freshman class.

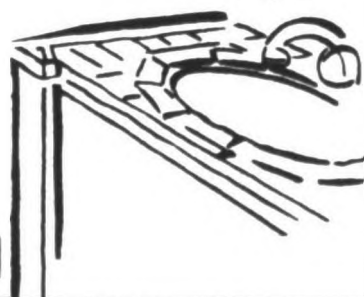

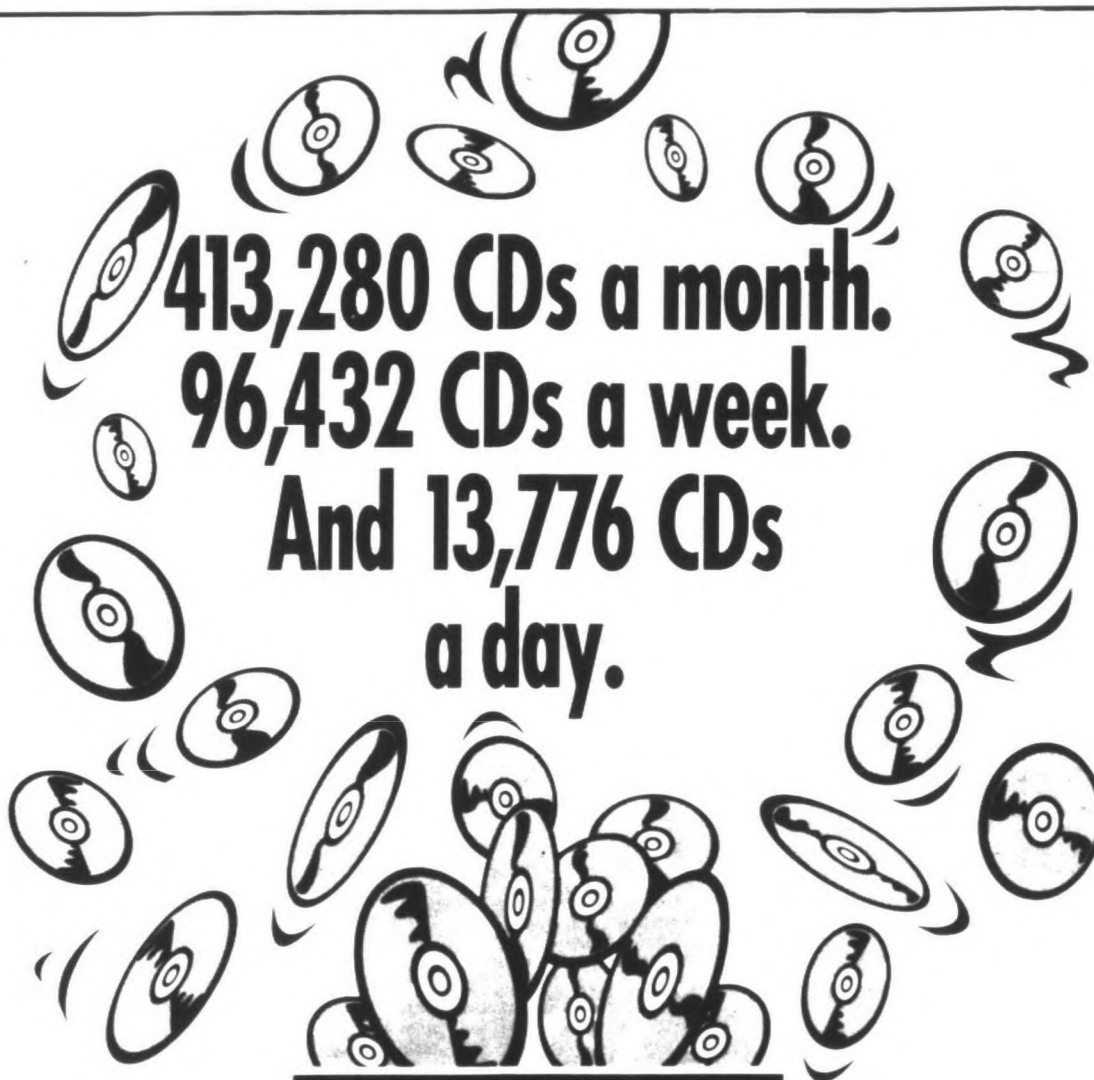
