School chief interviews to start



Seven school superintendent hopefuls will be interviewed by the Plymouth-Canton school board starting Tuesday. There are no local educators up for the job.

There's an excellent chance Plymouth-Canton Community Schools' next superintendent will be from out of state.

Two of seven finalists to be interviewed this week are from Michigan. All are earning at least \$79,000. Candidates to be interviewed are

Gene Demisar, of Missouri's North Kansas City school district, Ronald Jandura of Minnesota's St. Cloud public schools, New York's Charles Little of Hamburg public schools, Massachusetts' Robert Monson of Westwood public schools, and Minnesota's Reginald Nolin, with Duluth public schools.

Michigan candidates are Louis Giannunzio of Marshall schools and Gary Hughes of Durand schools. Tom Tattan, executive director for instruction, didn't make the final cut.

The board will meet at 7:30 p.m. to night at the board office, 454 S. Harvey, April 4, to decide who will be interviewed when, and what questions will be asked.

District spokesman Richard Egli said the board plans to announce its decision May 16. "What the board is looking to do is narrow the field down to three the week of April 18."

The seven candidates will be interviewed at 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. Tuesday,

April 5, Wednesday, April 6, and Thursday, April 7. The last candidate will be interviewed at either 9:30 a.m. or 1:30 p.m. Saturday, April 9.

All interviews will be done in the board meeting room at the E.J. McClendon Center, 454 S. Harvey, Plymouth.

Following that series of interviews, the board will interview up to three finalists at dinner meetings beginning the week of April 18.

Preceding the 7-10 p.m. dinners set for Monday, April 18, Wednesday,

Judicial race heats up as attorneys line up

Are there any local attorneys not running for this judgeship?

The 35th District Court judgeship up for grabs in November is the hottest race in town, judging by the number of local attorneys showing interest in running.

Six candidates have formally announced they're running. But Judge James Garber, who is giving up his

seat on the 35th District bench in January, said 13-17 attorneys have expressed to him their intention to run.

Candidates must file petitions with the state by a May 10 deadline. An Aug. 2 primary will narrow the field to two candidates. The winner is elected on Nov. 8 and would take the seat on the bench Jan. 1.

While the salary may be an incentive for some, it's now at \$98,500

annually. Garber said many attorneys already make that much, and the desire to be a judge may be a more powerful lure.

Almost without exception, when one goes to law school one sits there and thinks about the day they will assume the bench. There is a certain element of prestige," he said.

So far announcing they'll run are Michael Gerou, Carol Levitte, Ron Lowe, Maria Petito, Dennis Shrews-

bury and Karen Dunne Woodside.

Another reason for the high number of potential candidates, Garber said, is, "There's a bunch of lawyers out here," as the Plymouth area attracts generally more upscale home-owners than some areas of the county.

But also, "Our court has a pretty good reputation, it's a very pleasant court to work in," Garber said, adding

City ordinance to take aim at unruly felines

They've heard complaints about roaming cats, and tonight city commissioners are scheduled to discuss a proposed animal ordinance that addresses cat problems for the first time.

Last year, some residents approached commissioners to suggest some regulation of city cats, saying

their neighbors' cats were tearing up flower beds and defecating on their property.

The city administration, noting that several municipalities in recent years have attempted to create ordinances to regulate cats' activities, has in recent months researched those ordinances.

So city officials have come up with a revised animal ordinance to be pre-

sented to city commissioners today for possible modification.

If commissioners approve the ordinance as proposed, cats six months old and older would require vaccinations and licenses, as is required of dogs.

"It speaks directly to owner responsibility," said police Chief Robert Scoggins. "For the first time it addresses the issue of cats, licenses and

vaccination of cats."

Scoggins researched ordinances in Westland, Beverly Hills and other area communities, to compile the ordinance going before commissioners tonight.

The commission is being presented with the first reading of the ordinance tonight. If eventually approved, it

There goes the judge
Third seat's chances look slim

While 35th District Court officials said they hope the state this spring will finally approve their request for a third full-time judge, the chances that will happen could be slipping away.

I've talked to several people in the state Legislature and the state court administrator's office for all intents and purposes that looks to be dead, 35th District Judge James Garber said Thursday.

But state Rep. Jerry Vorva, R-Plymouth, said he's still lobbying

the state Senate Judiciary Committee in hopes of winning approval for a third full-time judge.

Vorva said he told Sen. Bill Van Regenmorter, R-Jenison, of the committee, that we have a visiting judge here, but he's not elected by the people.

The district has done a great job in terms of cost efficiency. I view it as punishment that we are efficient, Vorva said.

Court officials have sought a third full-time judge as the caseload has risen sharply in recent years.

Vorva said he suggested to Van Regenmorter that certain areas of Wayne County that have lost population should lose a judgeship and Plymouth should gain a judgeship.

That may seem like a tough political decision, but that's our job, Vorva said.

A state House committee last month approved the creation of a third full-time judgeship for the 35th District Court, serving Plymouth, Canton and Northville.

that because of this judges in the 35th District Court tend to stay put and not seek higher judicial positions with county courts.

Whatever the call, the potential list of candidates could double the number vying for the bench in the most hotly contested judicial race in recent years — 1978 when Garber first sought and won election to the bench.

That year, Garber recalled, seven candidates ran in the primary.

As time has passed, the cost of running a successful campaign has soared. "When Judge (Dunbar) Davis first ran in '68 he spent something less than \$500, 16 years ago I spent less than \$7,000. I know from public

records that \$30,000-\$35,000 was spent by two of the candidates seven years ago," Garber said.

In a recent district judge election in Farmington Hills, one candidate spent nearly \$70,000, Garber said, adding a successful candidate could spend nearly that much this year in the 35th District.

The court serves Plymouth, Canton and Northville, and candidates must live in the communities to run.

Marion Belding, 35th District Court administrator, said that while she's remaining neutral, when she's out and about in the community, "They're asking who should I vote for, I have to say I'd really rather not take sides."

I think it is difficult for the voting public, when there's so many candidates and they don't know enough about them to decide," Belding said.

Garber said it's also important for him and the other 35th District judges, John MacDonald and Charles Kaufman, to stay neutral.

"We say that whoever wants to come in to chat, we'll be glad to chat. We have talked probably with a half a dozen."

"We say we will appear at none of their campaign functions. That's the way it should be. They sometimes ask for advice on how to go about running a campaign, what do you think the costs are going to be, how many votes it might take to get nominated," Garber said.

Eager readers show their stuff

Janelle Brown of Plymouth loves to read. In fact, the third-grade student at Plymouth Township's Fiegel Elementary spent the past six weeks reading 56 books.

Not only did she have a good time, her hard work paid off when she led her team to victory

March 29 in the school's Caldecott Challenge.

"I like reading a lot. I spent most of my free time at the library. It was worth it," Janelle said. She wasn't the only one spending most of her free time reading. Classmate Scott Lytle read 37 books, Erin Baum read 30 books and Alex Popescu read 10. All are students in third-grade teacher Gerry Dugan's class.

Sponsored by the Fiegel School media center, the Caldecott Challenge is a reading enrichment program designed to introduce third-grade students to Caldecott Award-winning books. Named for English illustrator Randolph Caldecott, the award has honored quality illustrations in picture books since 1938.

"We try to expose the students to a variety of good literature. We're encouraging them to begin to notice the different types of illustrations in books and the way the pictures relate to the story," said Dorothy Eden, library media specialist at Fiegel.

Students were asked to read as many Caldecott books as possible over the six-week period, testing their own comprehension

by completing crossword puzzles after finishing each book, Eden said. At the end of six weeks, the top Caldecott readers from each class formed teams and faced off against each other, answering questions based on the books.

The activity was a success, according to Dugan, whose class took final honors in the challenge. "Everyone did a nice job. All of the students read some of the books, and they understand why the award is given," said Dugan.

For Scott Lytle, the reason for competing went beyond the challenge. "Reading takes me on an adventure. Once I get started I

can't stop," he said.

The contest was not without excitement. Students on Dugan's team were tied with those from Lillian Nitz's class, and a tie-breaking question was needed.

Other students participating in the Caldecott Challenge included Matt Balla, Janelle Broadway, Jessica Carlson, Jon-Eric Cornellier, Joshua Gamble, Evan Johnson, Bill Johnston, Justin Lyles, Michelle MacPhail, Mitch Morton, Rachel Russell, and Lindsey Stiver.

Airport authority's impact on Mettetal up in the air

If a proposal to create a southeastern Michigan airport authority becomes a reality, its effect on the Canton-Plymouth Mettetal Airport Advisory Board and local control is uncertain.

"That's a good question," said Bill Gehman, Michigan Aeronautics Commission director. "I'm not sure how it would work, quite honestly. The bill doesn't address that."

The proposal to create a regional aviation authority comes from the Michigan General Aviation Committee and is expected to be submitted to the Michigan Aeronautics Commission. The proposal would have to go to the state Legislature for final approval.

The proposal, covering Wayne, Oakland, Washtenaw, Monroe, Macomb and St. Clair counties, would form an authority to plan, promote, acquire, preserve, construct, improve, enlarge, own, maintain and operate general aviation airports.

Under the proposal, member

countries would contribute no more than one-tenth of a mill in taxes for the authority's purposes, such as operating the landing, navigational and building facilities of general aviation airports.

The authority also would have the ability to issue bonds for buying, constructing, improving, enlarging or repairing general aviation airports. If a referendum is requested, an election may be held asking voters to allow bonds to be issued and showing how much might be owed by particular municipalities.

"This body, if formed, would have broad powers," said Mike Stankov, a member of the Canton-Plymouth Mettetal Airport Advisory Board, who learned of the proposal at a state aeronautics meeting. "Would this supersede the state's contract with Canton Township? This opens a can of worms."

If the state would like to take control out of local hands, such as Canton Township, Stankov said, "this would answer all their questions."

When the state bought Mettetal in 1993 for more than

\$4 million, it agreed with Canton Township on certain restrictions and on the creation of an advisory board of Plymouth Township, Plymouth and Canton Township residents.

The agreement that accompanied the state's purchase included restrictions such as no expansion of the runway beyond its existing 2,556 feet without written permission from Canton Township, a limit on the number of aircraft hangars and tie-downs, and control of aircraft size and weight.

Gehman said it is uncertain how the proposal would affect Mettetal and the advisory board.

The authority has been discussed for at least a year and was suggested by an international organization, Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association.

These people thought an authority trying to help struggling airports would be a good idea," Gehman said. He's certain the proposal will not go to the state Legislature this year. "It will probably be brought up in the next session."

Aviation funding plan debated

Canton-Plymouth Mettetal Airport Advisory Board member Mike Stankov has some questions about a state House bill that diverts sales tax money to aviation.

"I thought this money was earmarked for education," said Stankov. "Why is it being siphoned off? I'm concerned about the precedent this will set."

Bill No. 4581, which was introduced April 1, 1993, in the state House and passed this month, would take 25 percent of the general sales taxes on fuels for aircraft and the sale of new and used aircraft, and put it into the state aeronautics fund instead of the state's general fund.

The money would be used for safety, environmental preservation, infrastructure, economic

development and operation and maintenance of the Civil Air Patrol.

State Rep. Deborah Whyman of Canton, who voted in favor of the measure, said the effort has nothing to do with the increased sales tax and earmarking money for education.

"It has to do with the way the aeronautics fuel fund was earmarked," she said.

Michigan Aeronautics Commission director Bill Gehman said the bill doesn't affect education dollars. "This is not part of the March (Proposal A) election. This bill was introduced last year before all of that. The bill will just address 25 percent of the original 4 percent on sales tax."

State Rep. Jerry Vorva of Plymouth opposed the measure. "I felt this was taking education

dollars. There is already a large cluster of money in the federal aviation budget that isn't spent yet."

Such legislation, Vorva said, only diminishes the amount of the pot for education.

Gehman said the earmarked money would be used to improve airports around the state and to add to revenue used for matching federal grants. The measure wouldn't necessarily be a big boon to the Canton-Plymouth Mettetal Airport. "The dollar amount for Mettetal compared to needs around the state is small."

The measure would generate an additional \$2 million for the aeronautics fund, which represents a loss to the state general fund. The aeronautics fund receives no general fund support, according to a state House analysis.

Auction rakes in \$80,000

New Morning School's 18th annual fund-raising auction March 26 drew 500 guests and raised \$80,000 on the sale of about 500 items.

Located in Plymouth Township, New Morning is a non-profit cooperative school for kids in preschool through the eighth grade. Parental involvement is encouraged, and most New Morning parents volunteer their time.

Indeed, auction chairwoman Leslie Stolaruk of Plymouth Township reports that a core team of 10 parents worked extensively in planning the auction, while 80 others volunteered to a lesser extent. "The parents do all of the work," Stolaruk said. "We try to keep the staff out of the auction." Stolaruk's co-chairwomen were Ellen Arble of Plymouth and Jane Fry of Plymouth Township.

Auctioneer Dan Stall has been doing the New Morning auction for 10 years now. "The core of volunteers they've assembled is phenomenal," he said. "Everybody pitches in and just gives 100 percent. They're a blueprint of what dedication and commitment can result in."

The top selling item at the auction, held at Livonia's Laurel Manor, was a 1979 Catalina yacht. West Bloomfield Township residents Raquel Casey and Mary Weber bid \$6,500 for it.

A painting called "Best of Friends" was purchased for \$500 by Marti and Paul Chamberlain of Canton Township, but not until after Stolaruk and husband Jeff bid the price up to \$300. "I wanted it really bad," Stolaruk said.

Not to worry, though, because Stolaruk later was top bidder (\$400 for a day on the set of "Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman," a TV show. However, she and Jeff must pay their own airfare and lodging. "We might have been better off spending \$500 on the painting, because the trip is going to cost us a lot more," Stolaruk said.

In other bidding, Kevin Felts of Plymouth Township and Gifts was happy to hear that the 14 karat bracelet with sapphires he donated was auctioned for its appraised value of \$1,000.

Maureen Alexander of Plymouth Township was the winning bidder of a dessert a month for a year, to be prepared by New Morning parent Linda Stoecklin of Northville.

"Stoecklin brought samples of her special desserts and the bidding was keen," wrote New Morning development director Donna Williams in a press release.

Tom Vurean and Debbie Ettington of Plymouth were the winning bidders for the grandfather clock. They paid \$2,200.

All of the auctioned items were donated to New Morning, or paid for by donations.

Even the centerpieces on 60 tables, handmade by volunteer Ann Barr of Livonia, sold for \$15 each when the evening ended.

New Morning School alumni from as far away as Kansas came to help celebrate the event.

The "father of gangsta rap" Schooly D has few words for activists who give him a bad rap. He does, however, have a lot to say about his recent appearance on **Geraldo Rivera's** CNBC show with fellow rappers **Luther Campbell** and **Freddie Foxxx**.

During the hourlong impassioned segment, the trio along with MTV's **Dr. Dre** and **Ed Lover** traded harsh words with Rivera and anti-gangsta rap black activists. On the air, Rivera desperately tried to end the bickering but during commercial breaks, he did little to ease the tension instead encouraging it, Schooly D said.

"All of my valid points, they didn't want to hear. They wanted to keep the tension flowin'," he said.

It was clear what the activists' motives were, he explained, when one of them shouted that he wasn't going to be "interrupted by the likes of you." I knew exactly where he stood. It's no wonder he didn't want to be in the same room. He probably would have gotten hit."

Anyway, he said, he doesn't classify his new album "Welcome to America" as gangsta rap. He looks at it as more reality based. Lyrics like, "I killed 40 people in 30 seconds and I still got away." That's the kind of stuff that's entertainment. What I do is reality," Schooly D said during a phone conversation from his Philadelphia-area home.

On his album, he touches on violent feelings someone has toward the person who gave them the HIV virus, the inability of politicians to understand the problems of black men, and, ironically, the obscurity of talk show hosts.

"It's a very dark record. I don't think I should have watched CNN, or read the newspapers every day."

He and his seven-piece band will play St. Andrew's Hall, 431 E. Congress, Detroit, Wednesday, April 6. For more information, call (313) 961-MELT.

Possum Dixon doesn't hold back on its self-titled debut album. "I hate work. I'm a mailroom clerk. I need you to stop me from making mistakes, but you nerve me" singer/bassist **Rob Zabrecky** sings on the first track "Nerve." It's those angst-ridden twentysomething lyrics that have brought his band the attention that they've been striving for. However, sometimes Possum Dixon is lumped in with rockabilly bands — a sound that doesn't come close to describing Possum Dixon.

"Down to the shoes, we are so unrockabilly. Never have been, never will be," he said.

He attributes the misconception to two reasons: First, "Possum Dixon" makes them sound like a southern band, second, Zabrecky sometimes plays a standup bass.

The sound of Possum Dixon, which got its name from a criminal they saw on "America's Most Wanted," instead infuses abrasive guitars with mosh-friendly rhythms and Zabrecky's rough yet polished, sing-songy vocals.

"Honest" is still the best way to describe the band. The jovial Zabrecky is even blunt in discussing his feelings about the band's headlining tour which was sparsely attended.

"What we were doing was playing to no people so there were no nerves to wrack, nobody knew who we were." Since then, tour dates with the Dead Milkmen and X have created a buzz for the band.

"It beats stampin' mail."

There's one member who's shown up for gigs dressed in a white fur coat, bridal veil and diaper. A trombonist who aims for the ceiling to keep from stabbing his bandmates. Crazy? No, just Tick Weasel.

Collision insurance is one thing that Tick Weasel probably should invest in. After all, when they cram their 10 band members on the tiny wooden stage at Finney's Pub in Detroit, an accident is bound to happen.

They practice safe musicianship, however. Trombonist and Livonia Symphony member John Kachnowski plays his instrument pointing straight up to avoid stabbing vocalist/guitarist Alex Porbe or lead guitarist Terry Trout. Percussionist Ron Wright is tucked so far behind Porbe, Trout, bassist Dave Smith and keyboardist Rob Troxler that he's barely noticeable.

However, none of this tames a Tick Weasel show, Trout said.

"It probably makes it look funnier. We collide once in awhile, but accidents happen," he said with a laugh.

Despite increasing the energy level on the stage and in the audience, there aren't too many negatives to having a band that resembles a musical army. For one, Tick Weasel's horn and percussionists can make the band sound fuller.

"Well, it's really nice soundwise. There's a million things you can do. It's not always easy to fit everyone someplace, or get everyone at the same place at the same time," Trout said.

Having a line-up that you can't trust on is mentally relaxing for the band, too, he said.

"All these people have never all been there at the same time. . . . It keeps it fresh. You never know who's gonna be there," Trout said.

"Predictable" isn't one word that can be associated with any aspect of

"We want people to laugh at us when they come to a Weasel show,"

Trout said. "We hope that people stand around and point at (us)." "The costumes are a way to relieve boredom. If the music was the same, and if I was wearing the same brown suede jacket with fringe, it would get boring," said lead singer Porbe, whose band opened for the Counting Crows at St. Andrew's Hall last year.

It may be all laughs to the band, but their musicianship is serious. Trombonist Kachnowski is a six-year member of the Livonia Symphony Orchestra, while trumpeter Todd Bolton and saxophonists Marty Montgomery and Joe Cunningham are studying music at the presti-

gious Wayne State University School of Music.

"It's not all a joke obviously if you listen to the music. The music is very serious in an unserious way," Porbe said.

"A silly kind of seriousness," said keyboardist Troxler.

Sahara Blue — Hector Zazou

"Sahara Blue" testifies to the universality of art. Beginning with the poems of France's best-known poet, Arthur Rimbaud, Hector Zazou brought in artists from around the world to bring the poems to life. The music ranges from ambient to slow jazz to the house remix of the first single, "I'll Strangle You." Rimbaud's poems are spoken, chanted and sung in English, French, Spanish, Japanese, Arabic and Hebrew. The effect is a hauntingly beautiful collaboration between some of the best artists in the world.

Among the artists Zazou brought in are John Cale, a founding member of the Velvet Underground; Tim Simenon, the U.K. house pioneer known as Bomb the Bass; Gerard Depardieu, France's foremost actor; Ryuichi Sakamoto, best known for his work scoring films; and Bill Laswell, who co-wrote and produced the song "Rockit" for Herbie Hancock.

"Hunger" features John Cale's spoken word over a jazz backing track which recalls the best of the Beat Generation. "Sahara Blue (Brussels)" has the same disturbing quality as the music in "Twin Peaks."

"Sahara Blue" brings out the beauty of Rimbaud's symbolism and takes the listener to a level of feeling that is both frightening and comforting. The CD is available on Tristar Music. — Eric Darling

13 Above the Night — My Life With the Thrill Kill Kult



"Join the children of hell . . ." invites My Life With the Thrill Kill Kult on its latest release, even though all you would be doing is joining the party.

"13 Above the Night" is the second release by Interscope for the band which prefers to have it on the go. Nevertheless, this release does not cover any new ground.

The 13 tracks predominately comprises a glossy dance album full of sampling and techno feedback with its pulse rambling from guitar-based "Velvet Edge" to computer-activated "Badlife." Each track focuses on the

beat of the music leaving the lyrics a bit disguised even though it seems as if it all should be taken seriously.

With poetry such as "Kiss the mirrors that sing the blues/Heels so high, go Scorpio groove/City siren, watch her move/as she rides the spirit of taboo/ Callin' Daddy Daddy Bad-Bad, Callin' Daddy Daddy Bad" From "Disco Fleshpot" the Thrill Kill Kult is taking stabs at social dilemmas with a ghostly vengeance, but is taking the blows itself.

If nothing else, "13 Above the Night" is a fun, mindless mass of mayhem inner-woven with funky rhythms. Once heard you might as well join in, what the hell. — Kyle Green

'House of the Spirits' topples despite strong cast

The stellar cast includes Jeremy Irons, Meryl Streep, Winona Ryder, Glenn Close and Vanessa Redgrave. The director is often compared to Bergman. So where does 'House of the Spirits' go so horribly wrong?

Just about everywhere. Bille August's angst-filled melodrama about a powerful family in South America from the late 1920s through the early '70s is the height of art-house pretentiousness. And while the movie has already snowed some local critics,

to me it came off an embarrassment.

Irons heads the cast as Esteban Trueba, a driven man who takes a run-down plantation and through the sweat of local peasants, makes it among the most powerful in the country. Anxious from the constant threat of unionization, he enters politics and becomes an even bigger creep.

Now don't get me wrong. I have no problem watching unsympathetic characters on screen, but Irons, for one of the few times in his career, comes off horribly flat.

MOVIES

Chances are 'Spirits' won't bring Streep any closer to the prominence she enjoyed in 1980s. She plays Esteban's wife, Clara, who has clairvoyant powers and, after a first-hand example of her husband's abuse, refuses to speak to him directly. She uses servants to converse with him, a bizarre version of post office usually played for comedy.

But there's nothing at all humorous intended in this movie.

Even Ingmar Bergman, who Bille August tries so hard to emulate as director, got a lighter touch in later years. He took a similarly sprawling family saga like 'Fanny and Alexander' and gave it warmth and humanity amidst a background of tragedy.

This isn't August's first of tense. The success of the bleak but moving 'Pelle the Conqueror' was followed by the stiff Bergman-scripted 'The Best Intentions.' If the torch really has been passed on from the legendary Swedish filmmaker, it grows

dimmer with each successive August film.

Watching Glenn Close as Esteban's sister and housekeeper, I couldn't help but think of Cloris Leachman in those baggy parts she's often forced to play. The script attempts to deal with lesbian longings for Clara, but the stiff Victorian approach again comes off comically.

Like most of the actors in the movie, Close ages some 40 years in the span of two hours. I felt I only aged half as much while watching. Winona Ryder plays the rebellious

daughter who falls for hand some peasant rabble rouser Antonio Bandera. Their scenes take place amidst a political coup in the early '70s, when she is dragged away by the military and suffers at the hands of her lecherous half brother, her father's bastard son.

You can get away with sappy scripting overacting, even a bombastic musical score in melodrama. Emotion, after all, is the key. But here, in 'House of the Spirits,' I kept wondering if the actors weren't secretly suppressing laughter as much as I was.

'Fire in Sky' — unexpectedly good

An apparent visit to Arizona by aliens — the extraterrestrial kind as opposed to ones from Mexico — has a tremendous impact on a couple best friends in the 1993 film 'Fire in the Sky.'

The generally understated film seems to have been directed to the wrong audience. It's not a paranoid sci-fi thriller or action-adventure film. While it's certainly about UFOs and aliens, it's more importantly about the human toll a traumatic experience takes a couple working stiffs.

Based on a true story, the film opens with riders in a pickup truck, careening out of the mountains in terror. The men were part of a logging crew but when they return to town they are one person short. Led by their crew leader, played by Robert Patrick, the men agree to stick by their story. They are obviously aware that reporting their co-worker taken by a spaceship is going to be greeted

with skepticism by the authorities.

The always reliable D.B. Sweeney plays Travis Walton on whose book the film is based. Walton makes the bad choice of getting out of the truck to take a closer look at the flashing lights that leads to a nasty close encounter with aliens.

The film does a nice job of showing the relationship between the two men, the single Walton being more of a dreamer, just the kind of guy who would walk up to the UFO see what's going on. James Garner is the veteran state police investigator who is called in to help with the case after the local sheriff hears the story. Garner's cop has seen it all and doesn't believe in the alien abduction for a minute. He figures one of them must have killed the missing man. When Walton turns up five days later, naked, dehydrated,

emotionally and physically traumatized, Garner figures it's a scam to make money selling his phony abduction story.

The performances are all very good in the film. Patrick is especially good as a man whose financial and family problems are serious before his friend disappears. Being suspected of killing his best friend by people he has known all his life and pursued by the media and UFO fanatics push him to the point of cracking.

The special effects of Walton in the spaceship are interesting and well done, but it's only a small part of the film. It's a very good film, directed by Robert Lieberman, that is compelling and rather unexpected.

Parents, educators must heed different learning styles

Puzzled parents frequently ask me why their children are so different. Brothers and sisters raised by the same parents in the same house should have more in common, the parents reason. I can only lend a sympathetic ear and tell them that teachers see the same phenomenon. In fact, siblings can be so different, we educators wonder how they could possibly be from the same family.

I can't totally explain the differences. But it is a fact that children mature at different rates. It is the responsibility of parents and educators to acknowledge these differences in the children, yet keep them on course in the classroom.

With this in mind, I encourage par-

ents to take a critical look at the education that each child receives. Some children flourish in a traditional classroom, while others process information in a much different manner.

The best teachers know this. They know that students have a variety of learning styles. Accordingly, they present lessons utilizing an abundance of materials and using a variety of teaching strategies to accommodate the differences. This approach takes careful preparation on the part of the teacher and commitment on the part of the school. Flexibility is essential.

Currently, we emphasize two kinds of abilities in school: Linguistic and logical-math. Educational research, however, is identifying a number of

other kinds of intelligence. For instance, Harvard psychologist Howard Gardner claims there are seven different kinds of intelligence. Experts

like author and educator Thomas Armstrong theorize that if educators could broaden their methods of teaching, they could reach more students.

In a recent study based on research in 1,000 classrooms across the country and interviews with 27,000 students, teachers and parents, John Goodlad, former dean of the school of education at the University of California, found that students are often bored with the traditional teaching methods. In his book based on this study, Goodlad paints the picture of schools as "dull wastelands." Disenchanted students, the study found, lose interest over the years. By the time they reach high school, only 27 percent are still engaged by their lessons.

What can we do? I suggest that we not force our children into molds, but understand that each is going to learn in his or her own way. Schools need to be honest about their mission and their methods. It must be understood that not every child will respond to the same educational environment. Parents must search and match each child's needs with an appropriate school setting. With this in mind, school choice (and, by extension, school variety) takes on a compelling new view.

Oakley sold his 14,400-square-foot building on Woodward, south of Square Lake to Philip Seaver of the Seaver Title Co., next door. He promised Seaver the building would be vacant by June.

Seaver said he plans to use half the space to expand his business offices. The other half of the building will be

used for a retail or business development.

Stewart Glenn merchandise is marked 30 to 65 percent off regular price while it lasts. The lines include Pennsylvania House, Harden, Conover, Hammary, Sligh, Stuffed, Hitchcock and more.

Ray Interiors Inc. owner Bill Ray said he just wants to retire after 50 years and many long hours in the retail business. The Ray Interiors showroom is on Farmington Road south of Grand River. It was Michigan's first Drexel Heritage store.

Bicycle built for blue patrols Twelve Oaks lot

Twelve Oaks Mall has added bicycle patrol to its shopping center security force.

The 18-speed, black mountain bike is part of the Novi shopping center's new Bike Patrol Unit composed of eight security officers who will rotate riding duty with other security patrols.

While on the bike, they'll monitor the center's parking lots and assist shoppers with everything from directions to dead batteries.

It will operate during all day light hours, according to Phil Morosco, Twelve Oaks' general manager. "The young shoppers are fascinated with the idea of a security officer on a bike," he said. "Our merchants love it, too, because it brings a very personal touch to the entire center."

Mary Champine of Livonia said she knew all about buying direct from southern factories but would miss Ray Interiors for the service and large showroom. "I just loved browsing through that store, getting the feel of different pieces, taking home decorating ideas," she said. "They had a lot of unique items."

If the berries are frozen, they can be added to a yogurt or milkshake. About 1/2 cup of frozen fruit added to medium yogurt or milkshake. Remove the berries and serve it with a spoon. 3. Defrost ground meat in the refrigerator, never at room temperature. If microwave defrosting, cook immediately.

4. Keep uncooked ground meat in the refrigerator for no more than an hour to get home.

Vegetable purees add a touch of style, color and nutrition to any plate. With their smooth texture, they seem to provide a more intense vegetable flavor while serving up a good portion of sound vegetable nutrition. The versatile puree can play many roles in a meal—as a side dish, an omelet filling, a soup, an appetizer, a stuffing for other vegetables or even a sauce for pasta.

To be puréed, green vegetables such as spinach, asparagus, and broccoli should be steamed until tender so they retain as much as possible of their nutrients, color and fresh taste. Root vegetables can be boiled or steamed, but need more cooking time to soften and tame their strong flavors. Some vegetables, such as eggplant or bell peppers, are baked or broiled before they are puréed.

When a vegetable can be pierced very easily with the tip of a sharp knife, it is soft enough to puree—more tender than for serving whole and not at all crunchy. Be sure, however, not to cook it beyond this point or its flavor, color and nutritional content could be diminished.

A food processor can puree all kinds of foods at high speed and with great efficiency. Blenders are also good for making purees, but the vegetables should be processed in small batches with a few tablespoons of cooking liquid.

Once processed, many vegetable purees are heated until the ex-

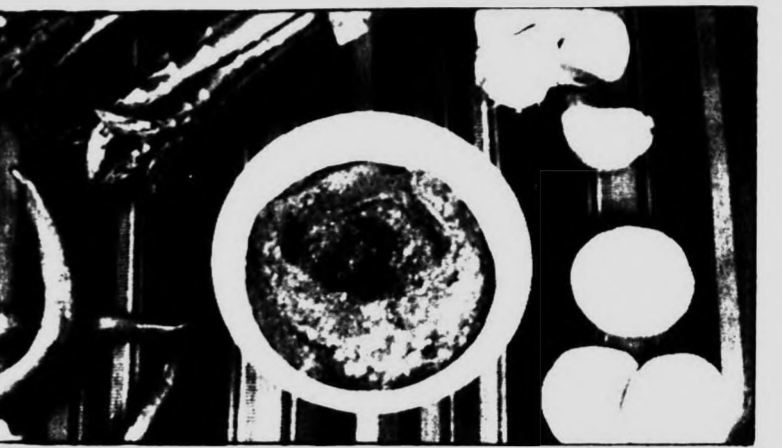

Calendar locates Easter according to moon phase

SKY WATCH

April is the first full month of spring. In addition, it locates the start of day-night time. Easter is the most distant, new moon and closest to moon of the year.

The moon was visible in the south before dawn on April 1.

The star below and to the right of the moon in that morning was Antares (in LAR) or the heart of Scorpius the scorpion. Twenty-eight days from now the moon will be located near this same area of the sky.

On the morning of the 2nd, the moon was found directly above the tail of the trapot at Sagittarius. (Sagittarius makes a much better looking trapot than arch.) The moon was at last quarter phase at 9:00 p.m. that evening, although it was not visible in the evening sky. It was seen on the morning of the 3rd to the left of the handle of the trapot.

Two events occurred on April 3, this year: the start of daylight

time and Easter. The latter date is on the 1st week of the latter season, the phase of the moon.

Daylight Saving Time began on 1st April. Daylight time, when we set our clocks forward one hour, always begins on the first Sunday in April. We do not alter the speed of Earth's rotation or the length of the day, we merely alter the day by which time is measured.

The country had no standard time zones a year ago. It even kept local time. Noon time was when the sun was due south and the shadow cast by a stick was at its shortest. Of course, local noon in Plymouth was different from noon in Detroit which was different from Lansing and so on across the state. At one time, Michigan had 37 local time zones.

Railroads were having an impossible time scheduling their arrivals and departures, so on Nov. 18, 1883, the railroad barons divided the country into four main time zones, and implemented railroad time. The creation of these "standard" time zones was viewed by the public as yet another

example of the "standard" method with humanity. In fact, the Maine people followed the advice of J. S. Adams, Governor and railroad magnate, to keep the mountains there, with a variation. However, over the matter of many years and months, and through the public squawking and standard time became the norm.

It wasn't until a year after standard time had been implemented that Congress set time in a way to be more in tune with the standard time zone, the law of 1892.

Michigan was originally in the Central Time Zone, because we are geographically closer to the Central Time zone than to the Eastern Time zone in Philadelphia. A vote of the people of Michigan placed our state in the Eastern zone, so it would share the same time with Indiana, Ohio, the east coast.

Some "unorthodox" people even into the 1900s insist that the bells to mark with night and daylight time is ignored. This results in Indiana having "Illinois" time for seven months of the year and Michigan time

for the remainder of the year. Making a religious holiday a secular one is a bad idea. But Western Christians generally agree to the calendar that is set by the Holy Land and Milwaukee.

If Michigan stayed on Eastern Standard Time, sunrise at the west of the month would be at 6:00 a.m. and sunset would occur at 7:30 p.m. On Eastern Daylight Time, sunrise is at 6:00 a.m. and sunset is at 7:30 p.m. If the way we look at it, adding up to 4 hours and 15 minutes of daylight we gain an extra hour and an extra 15 minutes of daylight. The extra 15 minutes is the extra 15 minutes of daylight that we gain in the month.

Conventionally, Easter Sunday was on April 1 this year, but next year it will fall on April 10. Determining the date of the so-called holiday is not as difficult as you may think. All you need to know is the phase of the moon and the date.

The ground rules for determining Easter were set up in the year 325 AD when the Emperor Constantine called for a Council of Nicea to determine the calendar

of the Christian church. It was decided that Easter would be observed on the first Sunday following the first full moon that occurred after the vernal equinox. The start of spring. The reason for choosing the full moon rather than the new moon was so persons making a pilgrimage to the Holy Land would travel at night by the light of the moon. Since the start of spring occurs on March 20 or 21, the earliest date that can be Easter is March 21.

But now we have to consider the inevitable exceptions to the rule.

If the first full moon to occur after the start of spring falls on a Sunday, then the following Sunday is Easter. If the full moon happens to be on the same day as the vernal equinox, then the April full moon is used. If the April full moon falls on a Sunday, the following Sunday is Easter. So all things considered, Easter can come as early as March 21

and will occur as late as April 25, which is the latest date that can be Easter. The latest date is Sunday, April 25, which is the date after the full moon that occurred on March 21.

Now we can find the date of the full moon on the morning of the 10th through 15th. The moon will be waxing in the evening and will be getting thinner. The star below and to the right of the moon on the morning of the 10th will be Saturn the planet with the beauty of a ring system. The moon will be about 18 full moons and five degrees above Mars on the 10th. Later in the year, Mars will be barely above the horizon and won't be visible. Mars will be better placed for observing later in the year.



Better days for Brodie

Plymouth Salem coach Bob Brodie would probably just as soon forget the 1993 basketball season. With his son recovering from serious neck injuries incurred in a skiing accident and his team getting upset in the Western Lakes tournament and later losing in the regional semifinals, Brodie endured an emotionally draining couple of months.

But things have improved greatly in the past week. First and foremost, after 17 days in the hospital, Joe Brodie came home on Friday.

"It's just great to have him home," Bob said. "He's improving. He'll have to go to therapy every day, but he is out of the danger zone. Now he just has to heal."

And earlier last week, the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan named Brodie the Class A Region 1 Coach of the Year.

"That's nice," he said. "To be coaching for 17 years and finally get the nod, it's a great honor. Especially coming from your peers. I owe it to the players, and the coaches I've worked with over the years."

James Eaddy of Grand Rapids-Ottawa Hills (Class A), Greg Esler of St. Clair Shores-Lakeshore (Class B), Craig Brueck of Centreville (Class C) and former Detroit Piston Harvey Martini of Atlanta (Class D) were all state coaches of the year.

Junior Kim Berres, for the second year in a row, won the all-around title at the Level 10 State Club Gymnastics Championships at the University of Michigan's Keen Arena. Gilles was the state Class A high school all-around champ.

Among the many tricks in Berres' impressive bag is a full twisting layout Tsukara on the vault, a trick made famous by Mary Lou Retton. She is the only gymnast in the state doing that vault in competition and she nailed it, 9.575, first place.

She also scored 9.9 on bars, 9.525 on balance beam and 9.4 on floor exercise for an all-around score of 37.4.

She will compete at the regionals April 17 in Lansing against the best from Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Illinois and Kentucky. The top 14 will advance to the nationals in Seattle, May 14-15.

Berres is coached by Claudia and Ed Kretschmer, Jack Eganoff and Darren Dorset out of GYM America.

Plymouth Canton graduate and former two-sport All Area standout Stacy Thompson continues to impress on the Ivy League softball diamonds. Thompson, a senior catcher at the University of Pennsylvania, was batting .421 after 17 games. She's knocked in five runs and had a .605 slugging percentage.

Thompson, a basketball and baseball standout at Canton, joined the Quakers' softball team in 1992 and won honorable mention Ivy League honors despite playing in only 15 games. Last season she hit .286 with 10 RBI.

"She's a natural athlete," said Coach Linda Carothers. "She's just a rock behind the plate." The Quakers were 7-10.

The pitching will be shared by senior Jamie Sikora and junior Jackie Nacasta.

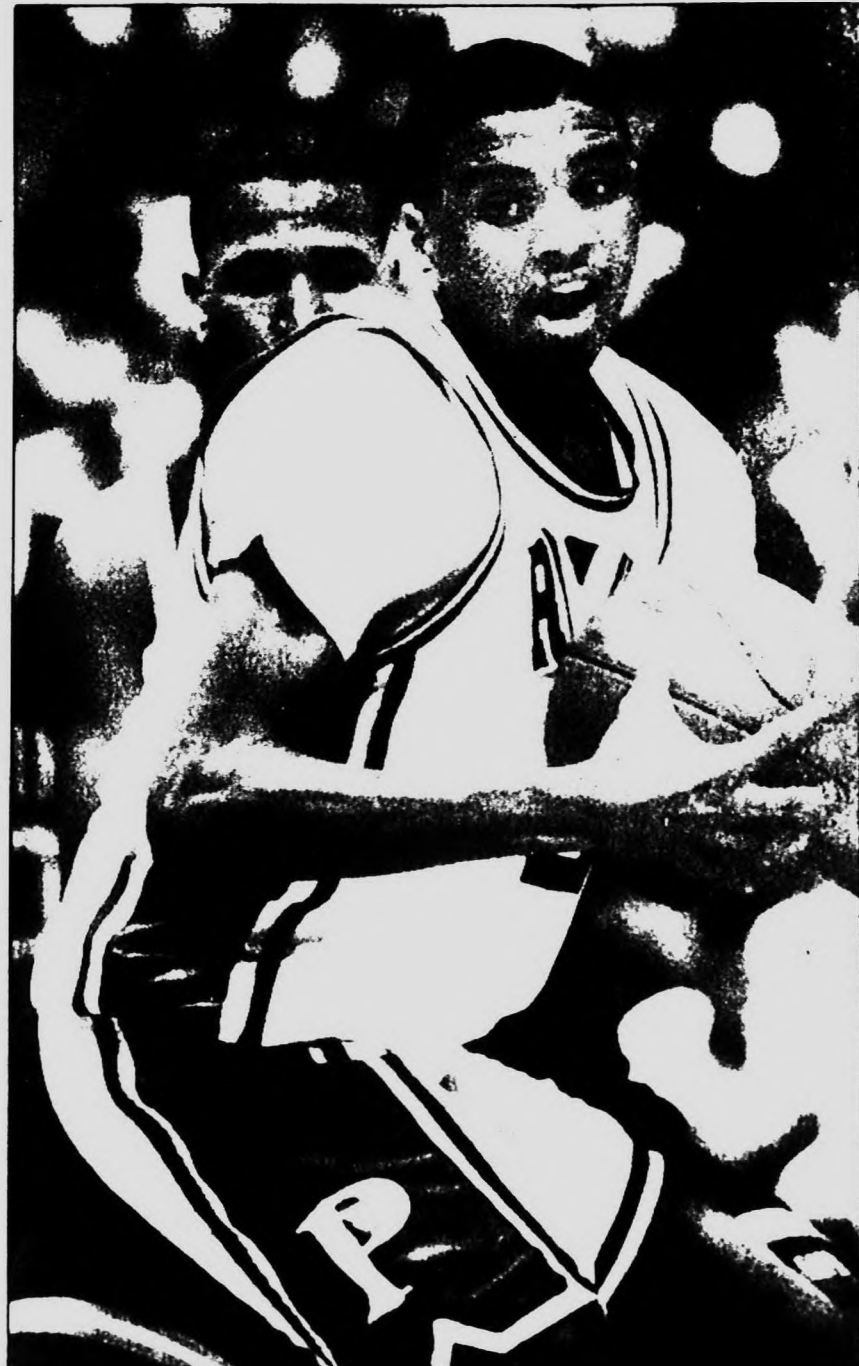
"They both have good control," Arnold said. "They don't have blazing speed, but hopefully that will come."

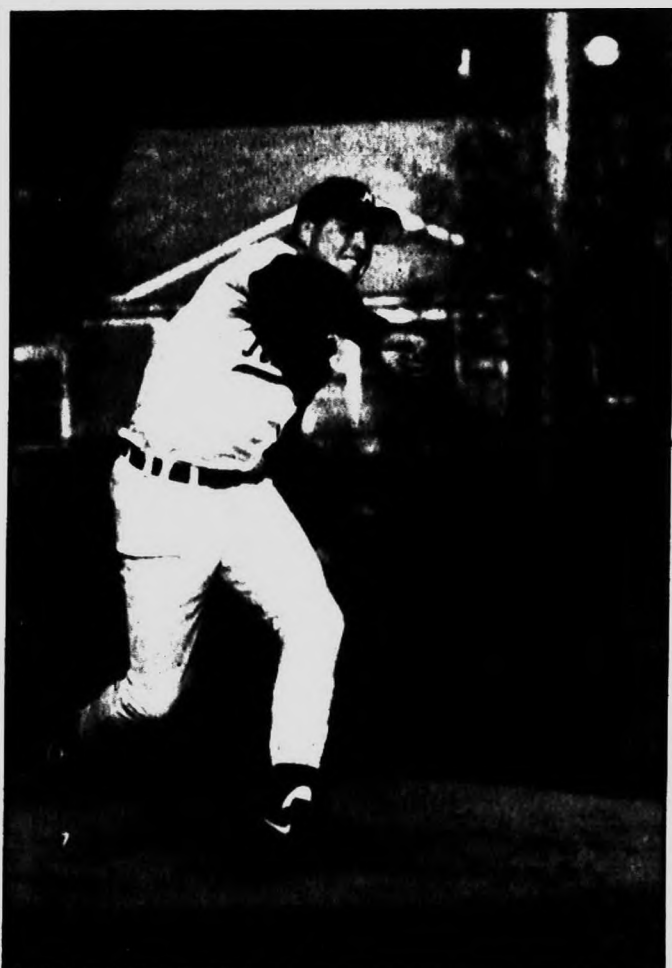

The state's third winningest coach with 612 career victories, including a state Class A championship (1976), Holowicki has enjoyed some glorious moments both on Outer Drive and Breakfast Drive.

His final team will be remembered as a club of overachievers.

But Holowicki guided the Shamrocks to an overall record of 17-6, including the Catholic League championship and a Class A district title (his 15th at CC).

"I'm walking away with my head held high," said Holowicki, a longtime elementary school physical education teacher for the

South Redford Schools. "I think I did my best and utmost."

Holowicki should be applauded for his efforts along with the rest of the All Area basketball squad, led by Westland John Glenn's in-state duo of Tony Goins and Guy Rucker.

Tony Goins, 6-foot 5 senior, Westland — One of the big reasons why Goins enjoyed his best season ever in boys' basketball.

Goins led Glenn to a 20-5 overall record and its first Class A regional title.

He averaged 22 points, 8.2 rebounds, two blocks and four assists per game.

Headed for Division II power Wayne State, Goins hit 42 percent from the field, but 46 percent from three-point range. He made 72 percent of his free throws.

He'll be very successful in college. Smith was also voted first team Class C All State by the coaches' association.

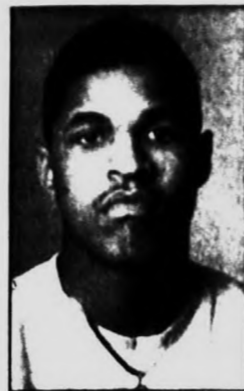

It's still early for Greg Kinnear's 'Later'

Greg Kinnear isn't just funny, he appears to be one very smart cookie as well. On Monday, Feb. 28, he stepped into Bob Costas' shoes as host of NBC's weeknight talk show "Later" without becoming the focus of laser-like attention. In fact to most network viewers he is a complete unknown.

As host of the daily clip show "Talk Soup" on cable's E! Entertainment Television, Kinnear has been available in a mere 22 million living rooms for the past two years. In 1991, he was the creator and host of the unsung summer replacement series "Best of the Worst" on Fox.

"Talk Soup" has been a great vehicle for me," Kinnear says, "in the sense that we do a little bit of everything in there. I've had the opportunity to interact with people, to do man-on-the-street, to kind of do commentary, to act, to do comedy."

"Later" has been remade to serve Kinnear's strengths. After six seasons of one-on-one interviews by Costas, the show has moved its production base from New York City to Burbank, Calif. A small studio audience has been added, comedy segments turn up regularly, and the 30-year-old host, writer and executive

producer is trying to make the transition look as effortless as possible. He speaks of his predecessor with respect but not awe.

"Bob Costas has done an excellent job at this and has really created a great niche with this show. The job is to fill the shoes of Bob, and hopefully keep the ball rolling.

"I guess one thing that I like about (Costas' version was) that sort of eclectic element that they (had) with regard to the guests. One night you might see Barry Goldwater, and the next night you'd see Steve Martin. That sort of unpredictability is something that I'd like to keep in the show."

Unlike recent mantle inheritors Jay Leno and Conan O'Brien, Kinnear is getting comfortable in his late-night seat without drawing the scrutiny of a hundred critic vivisectionists. He may even have time to settle into the job before anyone pays much heed.

More experienced than the jumpy and angular O'Brien, whose show precedes "Later" each weeknight, Kinnear is comfortable in front of a camera and can ad lib without breaking a sweat. But his true genius may lie in lying low.

Not since Bob Woodward's nocturnal meetings with White House

snitch Deep Throat during the Watergate era has anyone moved from obscurity to obscurity with more visibility than Kinnear. In a recent USA Today poll rating the popularity of talk show hosts, he somehow came in second only to the ubiquitous Howard Stern. Before signing with NBC, Kinnear was courted by both CBS (for a slot following David Letterman's "Late Show") and Fox (to replace late-night dud Chevy Chase). He picked the network post that offered a chance to improve and grow at his own pace with minimal ratings pressure - and hung onto his day job at E!, too.

Where Costas showed special interests in sports and rock 'n' roll, Kinnear claims to be passionate about "politics, comedy, actors.

"I'm somewhat of a new junkie," he says. "I grew up overseas. My father was with the American Embassy in Lebanon and after that Athens. And it just kind of opened my eyes to a whole other - the bigger picture in a lot of ways."

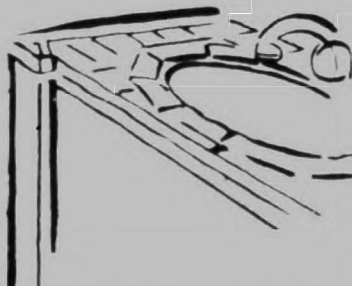

Sellecca may get no 'Second Chances' on CBS; pigeons come home to roost

Q: I am going crazy. Every Thursday night I wait for my favorite show, "Second Chances," and it's never on. What have they done with this show? I've watched it since the first time it aired. Sellecca made her series debut in "Flying High" and went on to star in "Beyond Westworld" and "The Greatest American Hero."

But it was her portrayal of a manager in the series, "Hotel," that won her praise from critics, a loyal following

and a Golden Globe nomination for best actress in a dramatic series.

Sellecca's made-for-TV movie credits include "She's Dress'd to Kill," "The Last Time," "Downpayment on Murder," "Turn Back the Clock," "Brotherhood of the Rose," "Passport to Murder" and "House of Secrets and Lies," which she also produced.

Connie is now in her eighth year as national spokeswoman for Mothers Against Drunk Driving. She lives in Los Angeles with her husband, John Tesh, and her 12-year-old son, Orit.

Last Chance To Get It Right

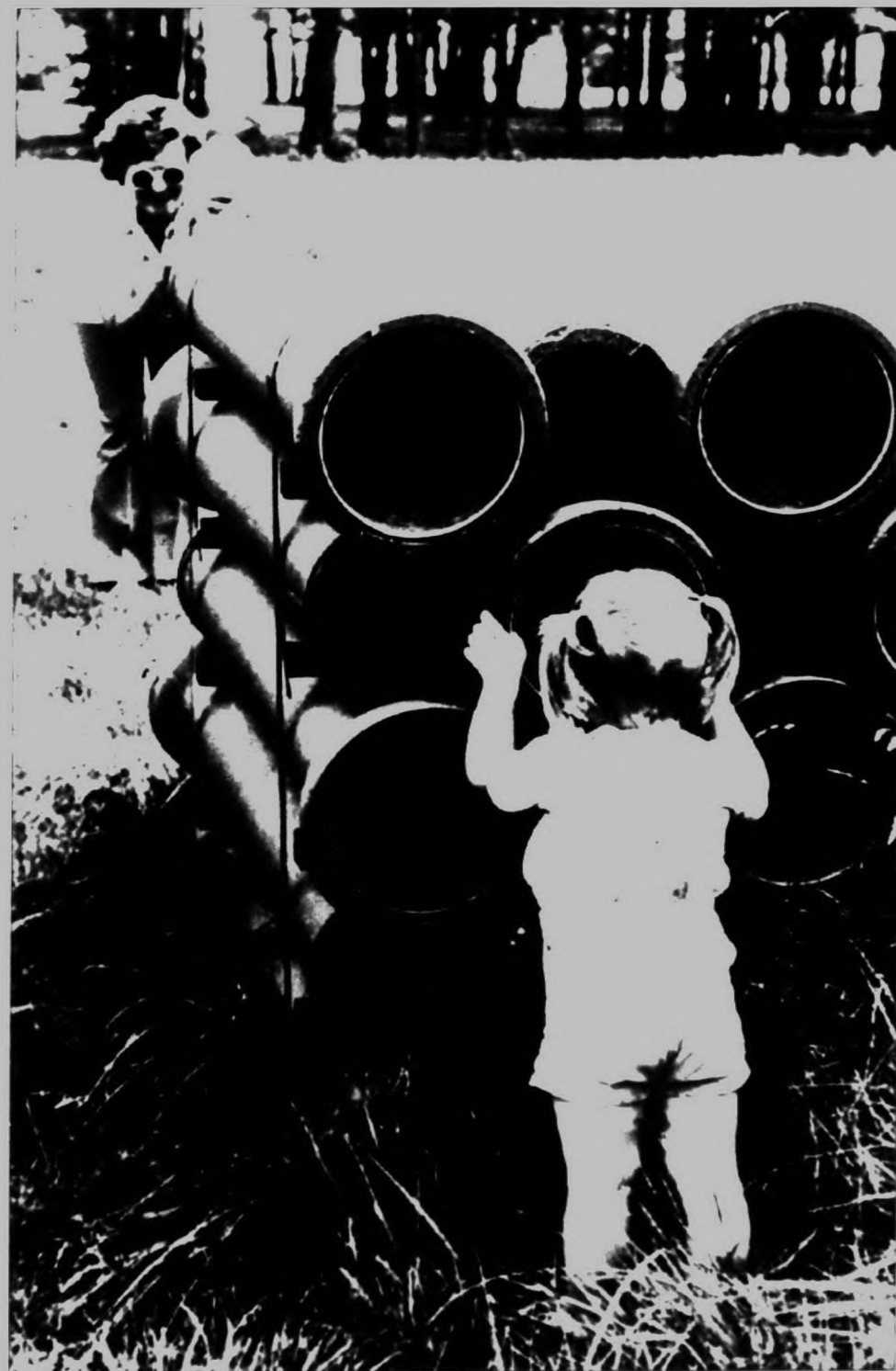
These grandchildren will forgive you for things your children still wouldn't

My grandparents lived across the field from our house. I walked to school through their yard and my grandfather, a tall, dignified man whose own children called him "Sir," would ask me if I'd had a penny today. If I hadn't, he'd give me one. "A penny could buy candy then."

I was welcome to stay with them in their big house, but my grandparents never came to our house to baby-sit. The role of a grandparent, in those days, in our family, was to accept our affectionate respect, and return it. My grandparents expected us to live up to their standards, to make them proud of us, as we were, in turn, proud to have descended from them.

Those of us who are grandparents in 1994 find that mutual respect is not automatic anymore. Today, we have to work pretty hard to earn the love, respect and even the company of our grandchildren. We buy them as much as their parents will let us buy, and sneak them a few dollars beyond that. We baby-sit on a regular, sometimes daily, and sadly often permanent basis.

Grandparenting can be as easy as taking care of the kids while a daughter goes out to work one day a week, or... not so easy, but still okay... every day, all week long. Sometimes for our generation, baby-sitting becomes a late-life commitment as too many of our sons and daughters drown in drug addiction and emotional upheaval.

Finding the Joys of Widowhood

Study shows widows more hopeful as a group than married women of same ages

"I think that if my husband were to come back today he would not recognize me or the person I've become," said Adeline McConnell, a widow of 18 years. "This is really a very good time of life for me."

McConnell's attitudes reflect some discoveries which surprised Professor Sara Staats in her recent study of widows.

"I had certainly not expected with the older widows there would be an increase of hope and quality of life with lengths of widowhood," said Staats, a Professor of Psychology at Ohio State University's Newark campus. "It is a particularly remarkable finding because the older widows had less income and education than younger marrieds or widows." Those two factors alone, widowhood aside, would lead one to expect less positive outlooks, Staats says. "When we looked at widows of 10, 20 and 30 years, we found that they were more hopeful as a group than married women of the same ages."

Staats speculates that increasing confidence with age may be one of the reasons for these unexpected findings.

"These women are survivors. So they have solved a lot of problems," she said. "And perhaps the longer they live the more they become aware of their competence, and perhaps they begin to find delight and pleasure in their independence."

New Expectations

Regardless of whether they had good, average, or bad marriages, as the length of widowhood increases they collect successes and achievements, and manage to accomplish a number of goals, she explained. And those experiences perhaps may encourage them to have positive expectations about the remaining portions of their lives.

"I've learned to do things that were out of my realm when my husband was alive..."

McConnell agrees.

"You start building your optimism with your successes," she said.

In her book "In Full Flower: Aging Women, Power, and Sexuality" historian Lois Banner writes, "...singlehood can be empowering." As widows, many women surpass expectations they previously held for themselves. For example, Phyllis Wrenick became an advanced square dancer then started an all-women's dance group.

Edith Collier took a solo trip to Cairo, Egypt. Frances Weaver writes

books including "The Girls with the Grandmother Faces", and addresses groups all over the country.

McConnell says she's doing things she never would have dreamt of before being widowed.

"I've learned to do things that were out of my realm when my husband was alive to take care of them," she said, "like using a screwdriver when necessary."

Each of the women mentioned here had to finish grieving the loss of their husbands as well as their own identities as wives before they could reinvent themselves as single women. That can take as long as five years, but most women do reach a point where they are happy with their independence.

How to Get There

If you are still adjusting to single life, try the following strategies to ease the way:

- Arrange a bright spot in each day—a chat with a friend, progress on a necessary but hated task—that you can remember with pleasure as you fall asleep at night.

- Invest some of your energy and competence in an activity a community, church, or social action program—that will make the world a better place.

- Treat yourself to the pleasure of creating something that gives you joy—a delicious meal to share with a friend, a few lines of poetry for a loved one, a pot of herbs to grace the windowsill.

- Cultivate and nurture your friendships. Add a new one now and then. One woman says "I like the young ones. In them I see the future."

- Find a wellspring of spiritual sustenance. Whether it's meditation, religious services, or a support group, be sure it restores your hope and joy when they fade. Visit your wellspring regularly even when you don't feel needy. Reserve supplies of hope and joy can be handy.

They won't remember how you and your spouse fought through the nights, while your children covered in their beds. They won't know you drank too much. The grandchild blames you for nothing. These children will not, in fact, understand why their parents blame their grandparents.

Maybe our children are right, maybe it was all our fault—but here's our new chance. Starting over with the grandchildren, we can make it right. That is, if we are willing to give up the unencumbered days of our final years to take on the responsibility of caring for this new crop of children.

When we retired, we promised ourselves—and each other—that the alarm clock life was over. We'd sleep until we waked. Our days would unfold and fold up naturally with the rising and setting sun. After a work life of 40 or 45 years, our time would be our own. After the first few weeks, though, the fantasy retirement does get kind of boring. We want to be needed. And we are needed.

There may be critics out there who see our generation lying back in the Florida sunshine, resting on pensions and Social Security. Some of us are, and why not? We earned it. But as I take our little guys out to the library and the parks and playgrounds, I meet many, many grandparents who are caring for their grandchildren every working day.

Probate courts report an increasing number of fully involved grandparents who, at 65 years old, have taken total custody of their family's little children. God bless them and God bless us all as we try to do it better the second (or us the last) time around.

Caring for parents from afar

Often one of your parents may seem scared or unsure when the other passes away. Moving your mother or father nearer to you might be your instinctive reaction. Your mother has never managed the family money before or your father has never prepared his own meal.

More importantly, your surviving parent has a health condition which requires assistance from someone. But bringing your parent home may not be the best idea. He or she already has a home with an established routine and group of friends and may not want to move. Whatever the case may be, there are ways to help care for your parents from a distance.

A growing number of agencies offer services to help elderly people remain independent in their homes. These care managers can help you decide what outside help your parents need, put you in touch with community agencies that offer free services, interview and hire home health assistants and then coordinate their work.

The number of these agencies is growing. The National Association of Professional Geriatric Care Managers, NAPGCM, reports that its membership has grown from 50 in 1986 to nearly 500 today. The profession is unregulated, but with a little research you can find the right care manager to help your family.

Find a large pool of candidates

There are a variety of organizations which can give you referrals for a care manager. The geriatric services department of most area hospitals, churches, and synagogues, or the NAPGCM can tell you how to contact its members in your area.

Make sure they are qualified

Look for someone who has a graduate degree in social work,

psychology, gerontology or nursing, along with several years' experience. The NAPGCM requires its members to be state licensed in a human resources field and have two years of supervised experience in gerontology.

Don't hire after the first meeting

Once you have a good list of candidates, meet with them and have them meet with your parents. Make sure the candidate understands your parents' lifestyles and are sensitive to their wishes and needs. Check references for the candidates you like best. Ask references if they think the care manager provided the best solutions to their parents' care needs, regardless of costs. Also ask if they feel the manager was intent on keeping their parent at home longer than necessary — the best arrangement for the manager's pocket book.

Checking out the costs

Many fees vary by location and the complexity of services required. The most typical, affordable charges range from \$40 to \$125/hour. There is often a separate fee for the first assessment — usually \$400 to \$400. The assessment includes several hours of interview and observation, and additional time to develop a care plan. Ask prospective care managers how many hours a week they estimate their services will be needed.

Comparing Alternatives

If you're not sure whether a care manager is the right route for you, and your parent to take, financially, write out a cost comparison of all alternatives. The care manager's home worth, along with prescriptions, doctor's fees, prescriptions, and household supplies, can add up. But so can an at-home retirement community, with medical services and other facilities. ❖

Now it's time for new challenges

Retirement can be the time of your life if you plan for it. Planning for retirement is no different from any other phase of life. Retirement planning requires effort as does anything worthwhile.

It is important to realize that because of the latest advances in health care and technology, people are living not only longer but they are doing so at much higher levels of activity and independence.

Stereotypes about the behavior and abilities of people over 60 years old are rapidly changing. It is becoming increasingly clear that the relationship between a person's calendar age and their biological age has very little meaning except at the extreme ends of the life-span spectrum.

This fact is becoming more evident not only within the scientific community but also among the general public. The potential energy and abilities of older individuals has been greatly underestimated.

Contrary to popular belief, the brain is an organ you can depend on in advancing age; mental ability can continue to improve during the middle and later years. But mental capacity—like physical capacity—is

closely linked to being healthy and getting exercise.

The more stimulation the brain gets, the stronger it will be. And given good health, a person can maintain their learning capacity until the day they die—which may be over 100 years old!

In my conversations with people who have been retired for 15 or 20 years I frequently hear a recurring statement regarding how they wish they would have taken more chances on unfulfilled dreams after retiring. Most of these people have had relatively good health and now realize they could have accomplished much more than they have over the last ten or fifteen years.

If I could pass on one piece of advice about retirement it would be not to underestimate your ability to accomplish life-long goals or adventures that are rewarding and challenging simply because you may have passed your sixtieth birthday.

Many people have accomplished great things in their later years. For instance, Verdi composed Othello at 73, Falstaff at 80 and a beautiful Te Deum at 85. Benjamin Franklin invented bifocals at 78. Galileo summarized his life's work at 68. Tolstoy completed a definitive treatise on art at 67, and Shaw wrote some of his greatest plays in his late 70's.

They reached these heights of greatness in light of their past accomplishments and you, too, can reach new heights in your own life if you are willing to accept new challenges. The most important challenge you can accept is to change your attitude now about aging and retirement.

Experiments conducted by Dr. Robert Kastenbaum while at the Institute of Gerontology, University of Michigan, showed that most of the psychological changes that have been associated with old age actually began years earlier and are carried over into old age. Your challenge is to rethink the plans and goals you have for retirement and not let the opportunity of life-time slip away a day at a time only later to realize that you wasted your retirement.

PREMIER PERSON

A Learning Experience

This teacher focuses on hope and exploration

Rena Amit's eyes light up when she talks about young children's capacity for learning. She delights in each individual.

"Isn't that great?" she gestures with open hands as a small boy beams a full smile.

Amit, a nursery school teacher and administrator, teaches using a developmental approach. And she's a natural.

Her love for life and learning led her to this profession, though not as one might expect.

The Scottish born educator first earned a living as a payroll clerk in London at the age of 19. There she explored Judaism and learned about the kibbutz, community organized living in Israel.

Soon her interest in the kibbutz lured her to Israel where she learned her profession as an educator.

Amit, born Gilbertina Watt in 1938 in Glasgow, was one of the few Scots on the kibbutz, but she felt a bit more at home after getting over her first trip to the apple orchard one January.

"They told me I was going tiger hunting. I was petrified," she recalls. "I only knew 2 words in Hebrew, maybe good morning and good night."

"I didn't know how to tell them I was afraid of tigers. Later I found out they were tiger beetles that had to be removed from the apple trees to save the next crop."

Unfortunately, the excursion gave Amit a pretty serious sunburn requiring medical attention.

"They weren't used to northern

ers and couldn't believe I could get a sunburn in January," she recalled. So, adjusting her schedule to accommodate her fairer skin, Amit worked the orchards from 6 a.m. until 8 a.m. and worked indoors afterwards.

After breakfast, she reported to her new job of hosing down the kindergarten rooms where she would often chat and joke with the children. It wasn't long before Amit started extensive training and began teaching.

Amit reflects about the turn of events with a lot of affection.

"My luck was the kindergarten teacher saw that I loved kids," she says.

Today, 39 years later she still carries the spark that ignited her career. She carries a treasury of stories and experiences from her twelve years of kibbutz life. It was there that she met her husband of 28 years, with similar serendipitous circumstances.

Fixed up by friends from each other's kibbutz, Abraham Amit and Rena met on a blind date.

Abraham Amit had migrated to Israel from Richmond, Michigan in 1948. He worked his way across the Mediterranean as a mechanic. After the two met, romance blossomed and the two decided to marry. Unfortunately, only religious ceremonies are recognized in Israel. As an interfaith couple, they sailed off to Cyprus, "in a smelly boat" for a civil marriage ceremony. Their kibbutz put up the money for the trip and welcomed the couple back with a celebration. Once wed, their marriage was accepted in Israel.

Their three children were born

in the late sixties and enjoyed their early years on the kibbutz. The family left Israel in 1975 for Scotland where her two sons and daughter learned to speak English with a Scottish accent, Amit says smiling.

When the Amit family moved to Oak Park, Michigan in 1979, they set down new roots. It was an adjustment at first, Amit says. She recalls visiting the produce section at the local supermarket.

"I looked at the cucumbers. They were all alike," she remembers. "smooth and unblemished. I kept looking underneath for the real one!"

She's come to feel at times, this is reflective of the American culture. Our need for conformity perhaps, or ideal images seen in advertising.

"Here you are expected to be uniform and kids are expected to be the same," she says. "I want to see cucumbers and children that are novelties."

Soon after arriving in this area Amit landed a part-time position with the Workman's Circle Nursery School. The secular Jewish program that attracts families from diverse backgrounds, is part of educational services of the local branch of Workman's Circle, Arbeter Ring in Yiddish.

The national group was founded by Jewish immigrants at the beginning of the century to promote Jewish culture and fellowship. The nursery school has developed an entity of its own, in part due to the leadership of Amit.

Her part-time position grew to full time and in 1983 she assumed the position of director of the nursery program. With the exception of a brief leave of absence last year, Amit has continued in this role to date.

"I recall when I first went to observe the school. My husband said my feet were this much off the ground," she says, gesturing widely with her hands.

She combined her experience and training in Israel and earned Early Childhood Education credentials at the University of Michigan. Dearborn born Amit describes the basis for the developmental approach to learning. In an early education classroom, the teacher is a facilitator.

"We take a child's spontaneous activity and extend it into a learning experience," Amit explains. If a

child asks why there is moisture in his yogurt container, Amit is likely to make an entire class project out of that question.

"We were attracted to the school because of Rena," says Grace Hedeemann of Pleasant Ridge whose son, Jonah, 5, and daughter, Zoe, 3, attend the nursery program.

"She is open to ideas and willing to problem solve, this is a wonderful gift from a teacher."

Amit appears relaxed and spontaneous with the children, yet she is constantly gathering and processing information in an organized fashion. She'll carefully open a tidy leather-bound binder with a zipper edge. At parent teacher conferences, Amit will often tell an anecdotal story about the child.

"I think she truly delights in being with kids," says Clare Loebel, Head Start teacher for Oak Park School District, who worked with Amit at Workman's Circle for nearly 10 years.

"She was my mentor," Loebel says. "She had a wonderful way of talking with kids. I learned that basically if you really understand how children learn and how they develop you can reach them at all

different levels."

Amit and Loebel like to find time to share lunch and conversation.

"She is not one dimensional," Loebel says. "She loves history and is always reading and studying about England and tracing her roots in Scotland."

A few summers ago, Amit returned to her native country for a short visit, but had an unexpected return last winter when her father grew ill.

Gilbert Watt, whom Amit named after, called for his youngest daughter. Then, in his 90s, he held out until her arrival and passed away a few days later.

"I always felt like I had his unconditional love," Amit says. "I felt safe and protected and loved."

"Children need to be loved unconditionally. That's the big secret," she says. "There is always hope with young children."

Amit pauses to reflect. "I've always considered myself very lucky."

She looks forward to new experiences.

"Someday I'd like to take a degree in ancient history," she pauses.

"Somewhere along the way."



Friendly competition

Sports program offers fitness, friendship...and a competitive edge

Carl Dilworth doesn't hesitate recalling his initial inspiration for creating the Master Sports Program.

"It was a selfish motive," he says. "I was tired of playing basketball against 25-year-olds."

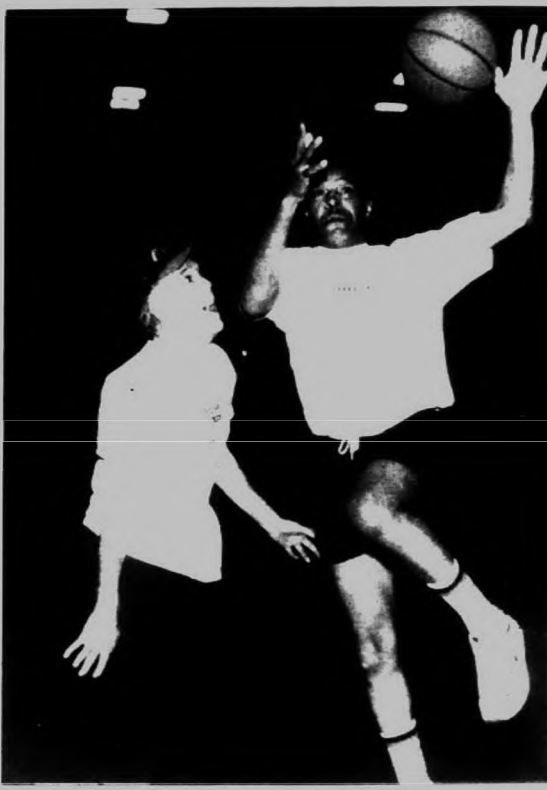
Today, six years later, he doesn't have to.

Instead, Dilworth, retired since 1987 from his position as director of community recreation for Wayne State University, plays in a 60-and-up basketball league on Tuesday nights at Patton Recreation. He also competes in senior tournaments around the world. His team won a bronze medal in the 1993 Senior World Games.

Sponsored by the Detroit Parks and Recreation, as well as by the Wellness Plan, the Master Sports Program is run by and for people who are at least 50 years old, providing fun, fitness and friendship (the explicit purpose of the organization) to more than 250 men and women — and, along the way, plenty of competition.

According to Dilworth, there are only two requirements for membership. New members must be 50 and they must have a doctor's note approving their participation in designated activities. There is no membership fee and everyone is welcome — regardless of residence or ability level.

Dilworth says, for example, that anyone can join the tennis team. If you don't know how to play, they'll teach you. Same with golf.

"We have coaches and indoor sites during the winter, then we move outdoors," he explains. And there is basketball, softball, racquetball, swimming, bowling and soccer, too. Even horse-shoes.

Not for beginners only

But if you think the Master Sports Program is designed strictly for neophytes, Carl Edwards will change your mind in a hurry.

Edwards, 67, began competing in the late 1930s in the Negro Nationals at the Brewster Projects.

As a teenager, he worked as a lifeguard for the Detroit Parks and Recreation — starting out at a dollar an hour. Most recently he's been

Mushrooming in Michigan

Northern Michigan hosts the hunt for the tasty morel

by Carole Strong

On an up-north quest for Michigan's famed morel mushrooms, searchers are literally brought to their knees. That's the latitude required for eyeballing these shy-guy fungi that frequent loamy forest floors, sometimes hiding among dainty spring wildflowers or playing peek-a-boo under dried leaf piles.

Prized for their exquisite taste, and not as yet successfully cultivated commercially, the sponge-headed recluses pop up every mid-April through May. Boyne Country, one of their favorite haunts, invites morel seekers to join in spring hunts, both organized and free-style, and enjoy a grand weekend festival in Boyne City, May 13-15.

Morel Outings

For newcomers to mushrooming, a guided foray for those treasures that have a per-pound market value of \$25 or more may be for you. Joe Breidenstein, manager of Springbrook Hills Resort in Walloon Lake, near Petoskey, is into his eighth year of offering "Morels and More" outings. April 22-24 through May 20-22. His basic weekend is priced at \$149 per person, \$135 per person for groups of six or more. Included are vacation-home accommodations for two nights, all meals, plus plenty of morel lore and schooling in prepara-

ration for the Saturday hunt led by acknowledged expert, Larry Louk.

Breidenstein's casual, fun weekends—very popular with seniors—are small and friendly, fifty people tops since that's the most that can fit into his Hills' home at mealtime. He's the chief cook and facilitator and puts on a Saturday buffet spread that smacks of morels and other good things, including Michigan wines.

Louk, originally from Royal Oak, is a 30-year pro of things outdoors, a master morel hunter and author of "The Curious Morel." Guests join him in preparing a morel quiche for Saturday's dinner-while-swapping-tales-of-the-hunt.

If you're having a great time and want more, Breidenstein offers a unique Sunday or Monday add-on or solo outing, a guided "Hunt on Horseback" into the deep woods with hoped-for virgin pickings.

Why northern Michigan for a morel experience you might ask?

"The morels found here are outstanding," Breidenstein replies. "We have the ideal soil and climate for them, heavy winter snowfalls followed by good spring rainfalls, and an abundance of wilderness land."

"Whether you go on a first hunt with an experienced friend or a pro, you'll want to do a little research on your quarry and its habitat. Check with the chamber of commerce about guides for hire and area maps of public lands."

Spotting a morel

Then study up on true morels—beware, there are false ones. The former are considered by authorities as the best and safest to eat. Shaped somewhat like a mini Christmas tree, they have cone-shaped, pitted heads in light to dark dull shades, joined directly (no overhang) to chubby, light-colored stems. Two to six inches in height, they're hollow throughout.

These are the two you'll be hunting: The early "black" that debuts in April, shorter and slimmer, with head colors in dark earthy tones turning to black, the "white" which takes over in May, its creamy tan or gray head maturing to chalky white.

On the subject of taste, there's no better connoisseur of morels than Justin Rashid, president of American Spoon Foods, in Petoskey.

"Michigan's morels are really special, with two distinct flavors," he explains. "The black, very rich,



Feasting on Morels

Celebrate spring by dining on Michigan's most precious and palatable food-stuff morel mushroom. Celebrate further if you've picked your own fresh bounty to use in these recipes from up-north and local chefs. Or pay a price at local produce counters that equals their rich taste. Another dining alternative: attend a four-course Morel Feast at namesake restaurant, Morels, A Michigan Bistro, in Birmingham, May 26—or at their sister restaurant, Sebastian's Grill, in Troy, May 27 and 28.

Simple Fixings for Morels

Clean, cut in half or slice, then pan fry (plain or floured) in butter, roll in seasoned flour, dip in egg-milk mixture followed by bread

crumbs, then saute. Prepared this way, your morels can be used as a base for cream of mushroom soup, mixed in with scrambled eggs for breakfast or as part of a stir-fry with chopped leeks or green onions and asparagus.

Morel lovers from Boyne Country:

Morel Pilaf

- 12 lb. or more morels, chopped fresh or rehydrated dried
- 12 tsp. Spice Island herb pepper
- 2 Tbs. butter
- 1 1/2 sp. salt
- 3 Tbs. olive oil
- 2 cups water (from rehydrated dried morels, if used)
- 1 small cooking onion, finely

chopped seasoned with beef stock base.

1 c long grain rice, uncooked
Saute morels in butter for 5 minutes; set aside. Heat olive oil in saucepan. Add onion, stir and cook over low heat, stirring constantly, for 3 minutes. Add herb pepper, salt, beef morel stock and morels. Cover and simmer 20 minutes or until liquid is absorbed and rice is cooked. Serves 4. (For larger quantities, saucepan simmering can be replaced with oven baking in a covered casserole at 350 F. for 1 1/2 hours.)

slightly smoky, toasty, grilled, earthy. The white easier to find and ship; milder, chickeny, buttery, less smoky." Rashid's company supplies morels to both commercial and consumer customers.

The hunt is on

On the weekend of May 13, morel mania will reach a high at the Boyne City Mushroom Festival and Hunt, Boyne City, an attractive easy-going town of restored Victorian buildings and plentiful tourist amenities (lodgings, restaurants and shops), plays host.

Chairman Kim Brown shares some of the highlights: A three-day carnival with rides, games and the usual fun foods; on Friday, 4-6 p.m., a morel program by Larry Lonik (good prep for the hunt); on Saturday afternoon, a tented Taste of Boyne City, with for-sale samples of morel goodies prepared by local restaurants plus THE main event, the 34th National Morel Mushroom Hunting Contest, sponsored by the Boyne Valley Lions.

The hunt sign-up starts on Saturday at 7:30 a.m. in Sunset Park and is expected to draw 200 to 300 entries. Fees are \$12; then, \$10 in advance. Experienced or not, all hunters are eligible.

At 9 a.m. sharp, grab your official tote collector bag and hop on the buses that whisk contenders off to a secret hunt location. For the next 90 minutes, it's you, the

woods and hopefully some morels. Be environmentally friendly and either pinch or cut the mushrooms at their base, allowing for new growth from their underground plant body.

A siren will sound to warn you when the time deadline approaches—and guide you back to the hunt base should you stray.

"We've never lost a contestant yet, although one, a winner, was 10 minutes late and suffered a 30 mushroom penalty!" Chairman Brown reassures. Winners of the first round battle it out in a second afternoon round for morel-shaped trophies.

Hunting success is often at the whim of nature, the past season's weather a big factor. The winning morel count on record is 915 in 1970; the champion in 1992, only 57.

So what if you aren't a winner. At least you'll get to keep all your morels...and you can enter a sort-of consolation Fun Morel Contest for the smallest, weirdest shape, etc. Or you can "spend" your morels at the White Rose fashion shop; one mushroom per item gives you 10 percent off.

For those who prefer mushroom hunting on a passive level, buy a spore kit at the festival and grow your own or buy fresh morels to bring home.

Clean and cut morels in half, lengthwise. Remove morel stems and chop finely. Mix with frozen peas and onions. Add butter, garlic powder, salt, pepper and soy sauce. Stuff morel heads with mixture and place on greased baking sheet. Cover with foil; bake at 450 F for 35-40 minutes. Makes about 40 appetizers.

4 oz. sliced bacon
3 whole eggs and 2 yolks
1 oz. dried morels, rehydrated
1/4 tsp. freshly grated nutmeg
2 Tbs. butter
1 tsp. lemon juice
2 Tbs. dry bread crumbs
6 oz. Swiss cheese, diced
Salt and fresh ground pepper
1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, grated

Roll pastry to a 1/8" thickness and line a 10" or 11" tart pan. Prick the bottom with a fork. Line pastry with parchment paper, fill with pie weights. Bake in preheated 425 F oven for about 15 minutes. Remove weights and paper. Bake an additional 4 minutes. Take out of oven and reduce temperature to 300 F.

Cut bacon into 1/4" slices and saute until crisp. Drain and set aside. Slice rehydrated morels and saute in butter. Add lemon juice, salt and pepper. Add bacon and Swiss cheese. Scald cream and cool. Mix eggs and yolks together and add cream. Season with salt, pepper and nutmeg. Sprinkle bread crumbs on the baked tart shell. Spread the mushroom mixture on top of them. Spoon in the egg and cream mixture. Bake until tart is barely firm to the touch. Turn off oven and leave until the tart is quite well set. Remove from the oven, sprinkle with grated Parmesan cheese and serve hot.

Lifetime gifts to minors

Think twice before shrinking your estate

A person can manage the size of their estate by transferring or "gifting" property to their minor children or grandchildren. At one time, this had a two-fold benefit. This move would reduce their federal tax liability by reducing the size of their estate, and it often shifted the income from these assets to taxpayers (minor children and grandchildren) with lower marginal tax brackets.

However, many of the income tax benefits of such arrangements have been eliminated, and the rule regarding the distribution of these assets can be inflexible. Considering these factors, it makes sense to think about making lifetime gifts.

Uniform Gift to Minors Act

There are two acts governing the transfer of assets to minors—the national Uniform Transfers to Minors Act (UTMA) and Michigan's Uniform Gifts to Minors Act (UGMA). Under both acts, a gift of any size may be made to a minor. Once the gift is given, however, the donor must give up all rights to the property.

Under the acts, a gift is not made directly to the minor, but rather to an adult or bank trust department which act as custodians for the minor, who is then referred to as the beneficial owner of the account.

A gift to a minor gives the minor what is known as indefeasible title. The gift or transfer is irrevocable; the donor may not take back the gift or transfer it, nor may the minor return the gift until he or she has reached the appropriate age. When the minor reaches this specified age, the property in the account is transferred into his or her name. Sounds great, so why don't more people use this arrangement?

When custodianship terminates

The UTMA and UGMA are almost identical, but there is one very important distinction. In states that have adopted the UTMA, the custodianship does not terminate until age 21. At this time, the person who received the transfer can do whatever they want

with the property in this account, good or bad. In states like Michigan that have adopted the UGMA, custodianship ends at the age of 18, thereby exposing these assets to the dangers of the whims of an 18-year-old. Most people are uncomfortable with such an arrangement, preferring instead to place assets in a private trust, such as a revocable living trust, where greater control can be retained by the donor.

The Kiddy Tax

If the distribution of the UGMA assets at age 18 was not enough of a disincentive to the establishment of UGMA accounts, the 1986 Tax Reform Act (TRA), which imposed what is known as a "kiddie tax", very well could be.

Under the kiddie tax, a child under the age of 14 is taxed at his or her parent's marginal income tax rate if it is higher than the child's marginal income tax rate on the child's "net unearned income" if that net unearned income is above a certain level. Net unearned income is defined as the adjusted gross income which is not attributable to "earned income" from wages, salaries or other compensation for services, reduced generally only by the minimum standard deduction amount allowable to a child who can be claimed as a dependent on his or her parents' tax return. The minimum standard deduction for 1993 was \$600. If, after deducting this amount, the net unearned income for 1993 for the minor was over \$1,200, that minor will be subject to the Kiddie Tax. This is only a brief discussion of many rules pertaining to the kiddie tax—contact your legal or tax advisor for more information.

Considering this tax and the varying limitations of the UTMA and UGMA, there is usually no income tax benefit gained by transferring funds into an UGMA which justifies the loss of control of the funds on the part of the donor.

Your financial future
A timetable to get you planning

Unfortunately, the age bracket of the late 40's is the first time many people have the luxury of contemplating their financial future.

Facing any of the following situations may sound familiar: Children in school who have expenses such as candy sales, projects, sports, dances, movies, and cars; adult children who you help with weddings, moving out and setting up their home or who are moving back in after college.

On top of that you've got housing expenses, job switches, terminations and retirements.

The chart shown below is an abbreviated sample of a handout I've been using for years to help people focus on how their financial plan is coming along—or to help them get started, because it is never too late.

As with any chart, it should only be viewed as a tool to start discussion. However, there are some fun-

damental issues that you should be focusing on:

•**Devise your estate plan** In other words, do your homework now so the probate judge won't have to. Over 70% of the people in Michigan haven't and won't plan their estates.

•**Tax-deferred savings** Start saving as much as possible into tax-deferred investment products, either at work, privately, or you may have a side consulting job that will allow you to sock away even more. Especially for widows, there is a lot of emotional confidence in having a block of money within reach, instead of being on the monthly dole.

•**Protect your nest egg** Are you investing the same way your parents did? If so, this is categorically too conservative. Just the fact that people are living longer should prod you into putting some of your money into those companies that cause the price of things to rise. This is inflation-proofing your nest egg.

•**Insure yourself** Insurance coverages are necessary. Especially if you are will have large estate taxes, be have strong emotional needs for your family, or, e haven't been prudent enough to "self-insure". A medium-sized funeral today can easily run into the thousands. Is there enough cold cash around to cover this expense and comply with your emotional family needs?

Finally, review this chart with this in mind: The laws of the land assume that you know the laws' implications. If you do nothing, through ignorance or paralyzed willful intent, the law assumes this was your conscious choice and will swallow you up like the whale did to Jonah. It really doesn't take that much effort to step forward and take control of your retirement years, so few people do. ❖

a swimming coach for the Master program since its first years of existence. During those early years, however, Edwards didn't compete.

Edwards, now retired, clearly remembers his early refusals to participate.

"I know exactly what I said: 'I don't want to go out there with those old folks,'" he recalls. "But I was surprised by the activity and competitiveness of older people."

Eventually, Edwards was persuaded to compete by another program member, Edith Glusac. A swimmer since high school, Glusac, 75, competes "in everything—golf, volleyball, Frisbee...my husband thinks I'm nuts."

According to Edwards, Glusac "has more energy than you and me put together." Glusac, proud of being selected as the first woman official in the Catholic League, says she chided Edwards on his attitude: "Don't be an old couch potato," she said. "I've got 10 years on you."

Medal Winners

So three years ago, Edwards finally relented, going to St. George, Utah and competing for

the first time in the annual World Senior Games. He returned with four golf medals. A year later, he won eight more.

"Now," Dilworth laughs, "we can't keep him away."

"Work at your personal best. It doesn't matter if you beat anybody."

But the competition is getting tougher, even for the seasoned veterans.

"Last year, the other teams were waiting for me," Edwards recalls. "I even ran into a guy I used to swim against 40 years ago."

He still brought home two gold medals, a silver and a bronze, but, Edwards admits, "I swim harder than I did when I was a kid."

All the medal winners in the program, however, are not lifelong athletes. Grace Wallace, for example, waited 45 years before picking up a golf club.

"All my life I sewed—sitting all the time," she says. "When my stom-

ach got messed up, my doctor told me to get up and do something."

Today at 82, Wallace has earned the distinction of being the oldest gold medal winner in America. She has accumulated more than 200 trophies from golf tournaments all over the world.

"I love it," she says of her favorite sport. "I wouldn't trade nothing for it."

Dilworth, Edwards, Glusac and Wallace all agree that sports is an essential element in their formula for staying healthy and happy in their golden years.

Wallace adds that she tries to eat right. Glusac maintains that it doesn't matter what activity you choose, as long as you do something.

"Go out and work at your own capacity," she advises. "Work at your personal best. It doesn't matter if you beat anybody."

Edwards' advice is the most fundamental.

"Work out every day—walk or swim—but do something," he says. "Use it or lose it."

Prescription pricing gets heat in health care reform process

The prices that prescription drug-makers charge wholesalers increased at 15.5 times the overall producer inflation rate last year, according to a recently-released Senate report.

Sen. David Pryor, D-Ark., chairman of the Senate Select Committee on Aging, said the figures show that government regulation may be needed to get "exorbitant" drug prices under control.

"This is a necessity of life," Pryor said. In the past, necessities have been regulated and licensed by the federal or state governments," he said. "The train is about to leave the station and the train is health care reform. I want to get on that train."

Pryor said he will introduce legislation this spring to give drug companies incentives to hold down prices and might include sanctions against manufacturers, such as curbing their patent protection for new drugs.

But drugmakers said government statistics demonstrate just the opposite, because the 3.1 percent inflation rate for prescription drugs at the producer level last year was the smallest increase in 20 years.

Cutting Medicare red tape on the superhighway

The Clinton administration is creating a new Medicare claims system aimed at speeding electronic billing and cutting the red tape that makes dealing with Medicare a nightmare for many seniors.

It all goes according to plan, by the end of the decade, one giant nationwide computer system will electronically pay nearly all of the one billion bills Medicare handles each year. Beneficiaries will only have to hand their Medicare cards to their doctors, hospitals, laboratories, or nursing homes to make sure their bills get paid.

Once a patient's identification number is punched into a terminal at a hospital or doctor's office, the computer will compute how much Medicare owes—electronically transfer that amount to the doctor's or hospital's bank account, cal-

culate how much an individual's medigap (supplemental insurance) policy owes and automatically bill for that.

That procedure was outlined by Shalala and Health Care Financing Administrator Bruce Vladeck, who announced a \$19 million six-year contract awarded to GTE Government Systems Corp. of Chantilly, Va., to design the new Medicare Transaction System (MTS) and phase it in from 1996 to 1998.

Currently, 79 different companies across the country—many of them giant insurers like Blue Cross-Blue Shield or Prudential—are under contract to process bills for Medicare. The firms use 14 different computer systems to process bills for Medicare's 36 million beneficiaries. The government allows many of the companies to have rules on whom to pay and what is covered that differ from region to region.

The MTS, Shalala said, will eliminate many of the current billing steps and save an estimated \$200 million a year.

Supreme Court refuses to shield disability claim reviewers

The U.S. Supreme Court has refused to shield state officials from being sued over how they evaluate Social Security disability claims by people who say their alcoholism or drug dependence prevents them from working.

The court, without comment, turned away arguments by the Justice Department and Minnesota officials that such lawsuits should not be allowed. Social Security disability benefits are paid by the federal government exclusively, but state officials are in charge of initially determining who is eligible for those benefits.

The federal Department of Health and Human Services has set up a complicated process for determining whether someone is disabled for purposes of receiving benefits under the Social Security program.

Three Minnesota residents who applied for disability benefits filed a "class action" lawsuit in 1990, contending that state officials were not adhering to the HHS process in

ruling on their claims. The three men have since received disability benefits, but their lawsuit was not over the denial of benefits. Instead, they sought to force state officials to use the same standards for claims based on alcoholism and drug dependency as are used for other disability claims.

Social Security offices often sites of violence

Hundreds of times a year, people conducting business in Social Security's field offices assault and abuse employees, fight with others waiting in line, attempt suicide or threaten to bomb the agency, according to a study of federal records obtained by the Associated Press.

The documents chronicle a year's worth of violence, and other extreme behavior in Social Security Administration's SSA network of 1,300 field offices. The records found more than 2,500 incidents of threats, assaults, vandalism, concealed and confiscated weapons, shootings and disorderly conduct in the field offices. They show that there were at least 45 bomb threats against Social Security in the fiscal year that ended September 30, 1993. In addition, a bomb exploded in the mailbox of the Yuba City, Calif., office. There have been at least two recent killings in Social Security parking lots.

Employees and guards have also been shoved, punched, scratched, stalked, spat upon and threatened with knives, scissors, AIDS-infected blood and a snake, according to the records and union officials. One worker was held hostage in Hemet, Calif.

Officials of the SSA workers' union, say violence in the field is a growing problem. But Phil Gambino, spokesman for the SSA, said he believes "it would be a major overstatement to classify SSA field offices as 'dangerous'."

"Most often, the incidents that are reported by field offices involve disruptive clients who, quite frankly, are experiencing very difficult times in their own lives—mourning the loss of a loved one or coping with a devastating disability or illness," Gambino said.

ents is the childhood image of Granny Bee, my mom's stepmother. With her floppy hair bow and high-top shoes, little Bee looks like a Victorian china doll with an attitude.

Always feisty, she became that rare sort of grandma who wore platinum blond wigs and metallic shoes studded with colored rhinestones. She was married to the hellion of a grandfather who shot at the roof of his house. I loved her flashy clothes and costume jewelry — and I adored my "step granny" just as much as I adored my other, more reserved, grandmothers.

Since Bee never had children of her own, I'll have the honor of passing her heirlooms to another generation of feists who'll appreciate them. I think of her whenever I hear the adage, "Blood isn't thicker than water." Bee knew that unconditional love, which she lavished on me during every visit, is the only glue that binds relatives to the heart.

Other childhoods are represented on my wall of fame. When I contemplate the odd-looking little ones in their ruffles and linens, I can't imag-

ine how they grew to be the great aunts and uncles and grandparents who seemed so "old" to me when I was a child. And I can't believe that all of them are buried now, in cemeteries across the Midwest.

One photograph, in particular, al-

The older I get, it seems, the more I appreciate my connection to the ancestors whose faces peer out at me from the sepia-toned photographs

ways haunts me. It shows the funeral procession for my father's uncle, Albert Gullion, a casualty of World War I who was buried in his hometown of Kirkwall, Scotland. In the photograph, young Albert's horse-drawn casket follows a bagpipe and drum corps through the narrow streets of Kirkwall. I'd rather remember Albert as he posed in another photo — as strapping and handsome as Christopher Reeve and

ready to conquer the world in his stiff cardboard collar.

More than any others in my collection, those two photographs of Albert speak of the fragility of youth, of life itself.

And there's the hand-tinted glamour shot of my mother, taken by her stepfather in the 1940s. In it she is a young woman, pausing for a moment before the big dance. Her lipstick is ruby red, her hair almost auburn.

This photograph belies my mother's incredible inner strength, the hallmark of her character. Looking at it, you wouldn't guess that her life, like the other lives in my photo gallery, would later become a complicated series of tragedies and celebrations.

American writer Gerald Johnson said "the past that influences our lives isn't the past that actually happened, but the one that we believe happened."

No matter. My old photographs and their stories weave a compelling tapestry of the pioneers who paved my way. Only for the time being, I am the curator of their legacy.

Nutrition over 50

It's still important — now more than ever

Amature person's requirement for nutrients—such as proteins, carbohydrates, vitamins, and minerals—is not very different from that of younger adults. But because of body changes and decreasing physical activity, mature people usually need fewer calories. This is also why many people gain weight more easily as they age.

A nutritious, well-balanced diet provides vitamins, minerals, and calories from protein, carbohydrate, and some fat. Such a diet must include a variety of foods from each of the major food groups: fruit and vegetables, grains, meat and poultry, and dairy products.

Reduce fat intake

Limiting the amount of fat in the diet has many advantages. It helps to prevent excess weight gain, a factor in disorders such as diabetes, heart disease, and high blood pressure which mature people are prone to. Limiting fat in your diet may also help protect against some cancers. Decreasing excessive salt intake is another good health measure.

Some older people do not eat enough food to supply the necessary nutrients. As a result, they may not get the vitamins, minerals, and calories they need to stay healthy and active. Following a doctor's advice about eating is best, especially if an illness requires changes in your diet or if you are taking medicines. Some drugs interact with certain foods; others can affect appetite or change the body's nutritional requirements.

The Major Nutrients

Protein is the basic material in all body cells including those that make up muscles, organs, skin, bones, blood, hormones, and hair. It enables growth and repair of body cells and helps the body resist disease by forming antibodies.

Many foods contain protein. The proteins in meat, fish, dairy products, and eggs contain the eight essential amino acids in proper amounts for adults. These foods are

called complete protein foods. The easiest way to get all the essential amino acids is to eat some of these foods every day. However, people who have high blood cholesterol levels should limit their use of eggs and organ meats such as liver.

Carbohydrates come in two forms — starches and sugars. Starches are present in grains, cereals, legumes, potatoes, and other vegetables, and sugars are found mainly in fruit and milk. These foods are good sources of vitamins, minerals, fiber, and calories. Sweet desserts, candy, honey, syrup, and other sugary foods should be limited since they provide calories but few other nutrients.

Breads and cereals are more nutritious if they are made from whole grains. Whole grain products include whole wheat and rye breads and crackers, whole wheat cereals, bran, oatmeal, barley, brown rice, and cornmeal.

Fats are concentrated sources of calories. Some fat is needed in the diet because it provides essential fatty acids and gives flavor to foods. However, many American diets are probably too high in fat. Low-fat foods include fish, poultry, lean meat, dry beans and peas, skim milk, yogurt, buttermilk, fruit, vegetables, and grains. Eggs and organ meat should be limited, as well as butter, cream, mayonnaise, margarine, oils, lard, salad dressings, gravies, sauces, certain prepared foods, and snack foods such as potato chips.

Vitamins and minerals are needed by the body in relatively small amounts. The fat-soluble vitamins A, D, E, and K are absorbed from various foods and are stored in the body. The water-soluble vitamins, the B's and C, generally are not stored. Minerals such as calcium, phosphorus, iron, iodine, magnesium, and zinc are also required for building body tissues and regu-



lating their functions.

Vitamins and minerals are abundant in fruit, vegetables, meat, dairy products, and whole grain or enriched breads and cereals.

Older people should pay particular attention to their need for calcium. Women past menopause may develop a disorder called osteoporosis, which thins out the bones and often leads to painful and disabling fractures. Including foods that are high in calcium in the daily diet helps to make sure the body has enough calcium to build and maintain bones. Primary sources of calcium include milk, yogurt, cheese, and other dairy products. The low-fat forms of these foods contain as much calcium as those with fat. Legumes such as beans and peas are also a good source of calcium.

Fiber

Another important part of the diet is fiber, which is present in foods that come from plants. The role of fiber is not fully known, but it can help prevent constipation. It may also help protect against certain intestinal disorders, and possibly some cancers and chronic diseases. The best way to include fiber in the diet is to eat whole grain breads and cereals with oats and plenty of vegetables and fruit.

The keys to a good diet are variety and moderation. The greater the variety, the less likely you are to develop either a deficiency or an excess of any single nutrient and the more likely you are to stay healthy or even improve your health.
