## School chief search draws flak



The interviews with six candidates seeking to be school superintendent came to a close Saturday. However, members of a committee involved in the search are critical of the easy questions asked the candidates.

While folks on the superintendent search committee generally are pleased with the quality of applicants for the job of retiring Dr. John Hoben, a few have offered construc-

tive criticism of the way in which the search is being conducted.

Former U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, a member of the search committee, said as superintendent of one of the top 10 districts in Michigan, the Plymouth-Canton superintendent

carries considerable clout and should be a person prepared to assume a strong leadership role.

It concerns Pursell that a consultant narrowed the field from 67 to seven, with no input from the district.

"I was critical of the fact they've hired a contractor to eliminate everyone but seven applicants. There are other people we don't have a chance to look at, and I have a little problem with that."

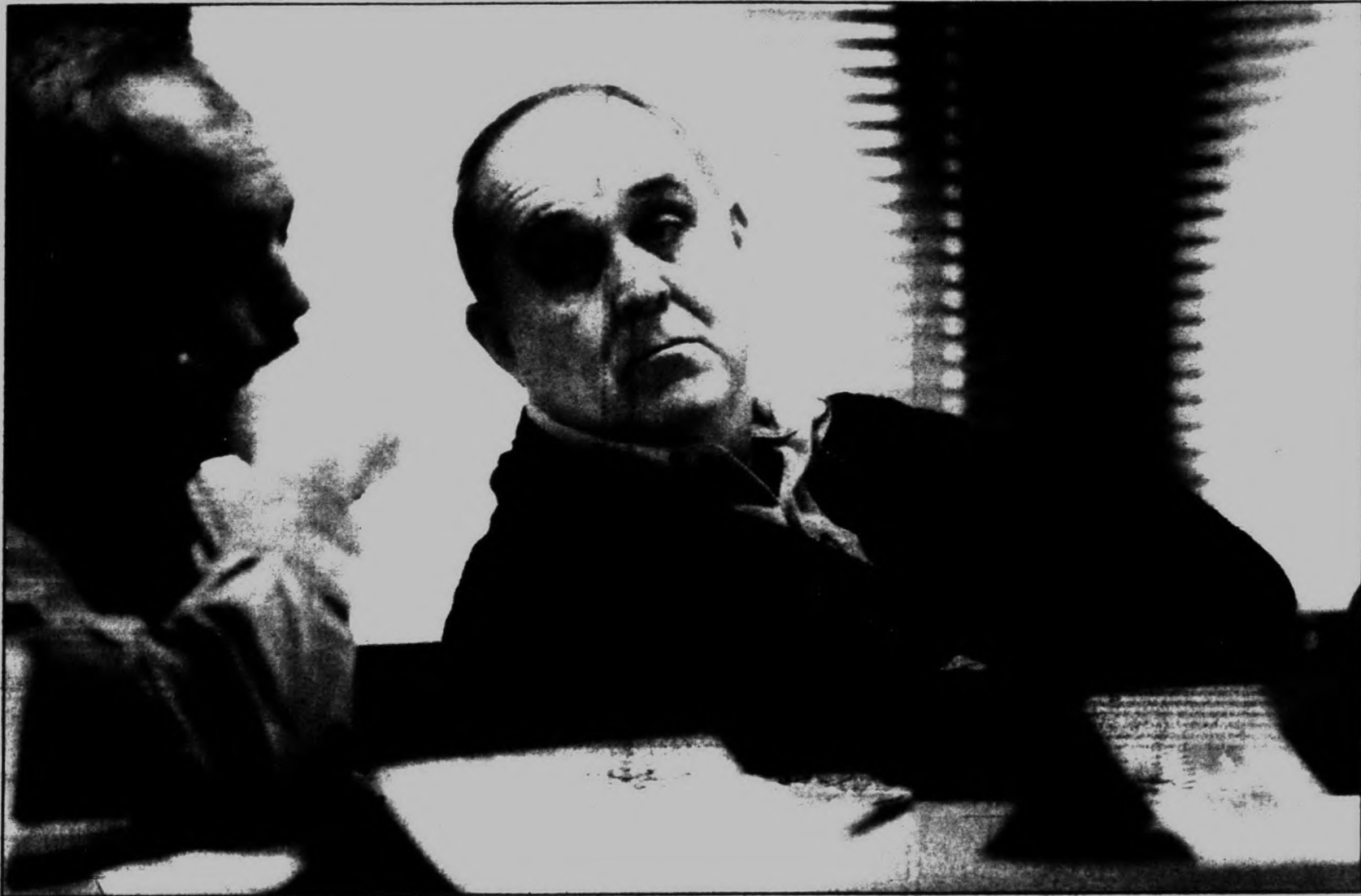
Pursell said he also questioned

why no females were chosen to be interviewed, when nine applied. "I'm depending on an outside contractor from Illinois to say they're not qualified. There was no one from inside, either."

"Someone on the board or the selection committee should look at all applicants," Pursell said.

## Fire department merger pros, cons debated

Consolidation of Plymouth and Plymouth Township fire departments is touted as the answer to costly duplication of services.

A public hearing at the Plymouth Cultural Center Wednesday night kindled discussion.

Redeployment of personnel is expected to improve communitywide re-

sponse time, and first response personnel will be quickly available regardless of railroad blockage.

There were instances in the past when the city called for mutual aid from Plymouth Township when the city couldn't send fire trucks to the Old Village area because a train had traffic stopped.

"There isn't an official date (for start-up)," said Plymouth city man-

ager Steve Walters. Officials hope it will begin this year.

The consolidated force, under a proposed 10-year contract, would consist of three operating fire-stations located at 42350 Ann Arbor Road, 41212 Wilcox and 13600 Beck Road.

Community ambulance services provided by Huron Valley Ambulance will be based at 201 Main St.

The new, consolidated fire depart-

ment would provide the same services as the individual departments, including medical first response and commercial/industrial fire inspections. All firefighters will be Plymouth Township employees.

The budget would be approved and administered by Plymouth Township with input from the city of Plymouth.

## Pilots air concerns about airport manager

Pilots at Canton Plymouth Mettetal Airport have a lot of questions about the new manager.

"I kind of resent the fact that you have a guy coming in here that doesn't have airplanes," a pilot told the airport's advisory board Thursday.

Pilots reacted to the state Aeronautics Commission's recent decision to contract with Douglas Kitzie of Kitzie Aviation to serve as airport manager and fixed base operator, which allows him to provide services, such as fuel sales.

The decision means that Dan

Malone of Emerald Aviation, who is the current FBO, is out. Malone was among the eight who submitted proposals for the position.

It appears Kitzie won't begin May 1 as originally expected. State officials are working on a four year agreement with four year renewable options over 20 years.

Pilots demanded to know how much state staff investigated Kitzie, who was not at Thursday's meeting. They also wanted to know what will happen to flight students who are now taking lessons from Malone's Emerald Aviation.

## Task force targets gang activity

Yes. Gang activity is occurring in Canton Township. "What we are seeing now is not the violence the big urban city would see. We are seeing intimidation," said Tammie Colling, Canton police community relations officer. "We're not seeing shootings yet."

Colling and Brenda Plecha, family life education manager for Family Service Detroit-Wayne County, presented the ins and

outs of gang activity in Canton for Canton Chamber of Commerce members Wednesday.

Businesses have been the target of gang graffiti symbols sprayed on buildings and other property. Subdivisions and their parks also have been targeted.

"Gangs advertise like businesses," Plecha said, adding they need to create the perception of power and influence. "How much would a billboard cost you for six weeks? They are getting it for free. Your goal as a business is to be fired as

# Finalists to get OK

Three finalists for the job of Plymouth Canton school superintendent will be identified at tonight's Board of Education meeting, set for 7:30 p.m. at the E.J. McClendon Educational Center, 454 S. Harvey in Plymouth.

The finalists will be interviewed at dinner meetings set for Monday, April 18, Wednesday, April 20, and tentatively, Monday, April 25. Preceding each of the meetings will be public receptions from 4:30-6 p.m. at the board office. Refreshments will be served.

The new superintendent will be chosen by May 16.

Dr. John Hoben, 71, is retiring June 30 after serving as superintendent for 23 years.

Interviewed last week for the job, which now pays \$116,000

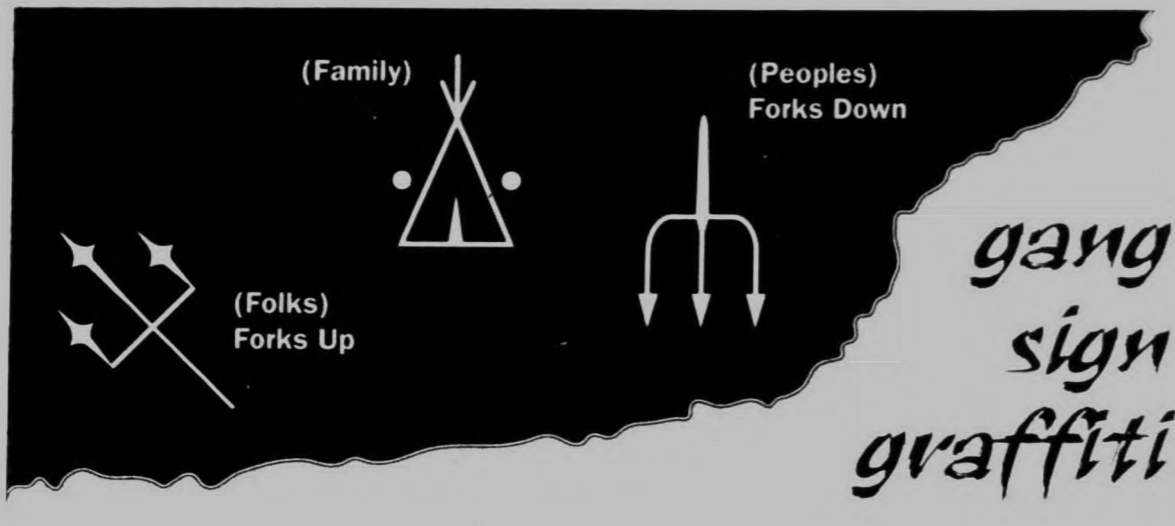
were superintendents Gene Denisar of North Kansas City, Louis Giannuzio of Marshall, Gary Hughes of Durand, Mich., Ronald Jandura of St. Cloud, Minn., Charles Little of Hamburg, N.Y., and Robert Monson of Westwood, Mass.

Ronald Nolin of Duluth, Minn., withdrew from consideration, citing family and personal reasons. "He said he felt it was going to be very difficult for him to leave that district," said trustee David Artley. "If we can find someone with that kind of dedication, I will feel very good about it."

Artley noted that the district will have "its first new superintendent in 23 years, and its first superintendent from outside the district in 27 years."

"It's going to be a major change for everyone involved. We have to make sure we pick the best possible candidate to facilitate that change with teachers, administrators, parents, kids and the community. We will have to live with the result for good or bad," he said.

Trustee Jack Farrow said the board is taking care to recognize that "some people are better at interviewing than others. It may not have anything to do with their ability to do the job."

Colling urged business leaders to call police when they find gang graffiti on their property and then remove it immediately. "When you leave those messages up you send a message that you don't care," said Plecha, a member of the Canton Plymouth Gang Task Force.

Gang activity in Canton involves children, boys and girls, as young as 12. "We are seeing it here in our middle schools," said Colling, also a member of the Canton Plymouth Gang Task Force.

The gangs, which provide acceptance, rules and protection, are actively recruiting in the area. "They recruit them with these big print promises and fine print conditions," Plecha said. The fine print includes consequences, usually violence, for breaking gang rules.

Gangs are business organizations, which trade in guns and drugs. The graffiti is used to establish a turf and to intimidate. That's a reason why Canton recently prohibited the use of spray paint and beepers by minors. Graffiti is also illegal.

"To be in a gang is not criminal. To intimidate, to destroy your property is criminal," Colling said.

The police department has developed a form which is used when businesses are plagued with graffiti, vandalism or trespassing. Police will give culprits a warning. The next time they will be arrested. "We can then take action when you are not there," Colling said.

About 1 1/2 years ago, Canton police were introduced to gang activity. "We immediately assumed it was a devil worship type thing," Colling said. "We realized right away we didn't know how to read it."

reau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, all of which have gang task forces.

"We recognized we needed to involve more than the Canton Police Department," Colling said. The task force includes area police, Plymouth-Canton schools and social service agencies.

A number of symbols, for example, a teepee or pitchfork, are used by gangs in their graffiti showing their particular gang family. "Gang members dress in a certain fashion. Gang members talk and walk in a certain fashion," Colling said. "We encourage you to call us so we can identify these kids."

# Superintendent candidates have variety of skills

## S. Gene Denisar



S. Gene Denisar

S. Gene Denisar is superintendent of North Kansas City schools, Missouri's sixth largest district, with 16,000 students. Denisar earned a doctorate in education from Indiana University and has served as a superintendent in three states. He earns \$99,785.

Denisar told the board and superintendent search committee that his enthusiasm is sky-high. "Our district passed a millage by a big margin last week. I'm on a roll," he said.

Dr. Charles Little heads up Frontier Central Schools, a district in suburban Buffalo, N.Y., with 5,050 students. He has a doctorate in education from Indiana University and earns \$92,500.

Many private schools service Buffalo, "so there's lots of competition," said Little. "We have one of the worst staff/pupil ratios at 16:1."

"We've always had tax rate increases since I've been superintendent," he added.

■ On communication: "Strong relationships are essential. If you're superintendent, you're always at work, that's communication. Every Friday, I send out a bulletin to board members. It's delivered by courier to their homes. It's important that a sense of trust be developed."

Little regularly attends PTA council meetings and meets with parochial school parents. "The public is a group of consumers. If we don't treat them as customers, we're going to go out of business."

"Sometimes I think I'm the Reggie Jackson of Frontier. I'm the stick," he said. "I've become more of a marketer and a listener. I used to be more nuts and bolts."

■ On bargaining: "I thought there can't be any place more unionized than Erie County, but I think Michigan is. You need to be issue-oriented and jointly solve problems. You can't be confrontational. I've learned that the hard way. One has only to look at the closed Bethlehem steel plant, which employed 25,000, to see an example of poor labor management relations," he said.

■ On planning: "The best decisions are made if all stakeholders are involved. Slow and steady wins the race. Schools have been undone by plans that were never finished."

■ On instruction: "I want to see people doing things cooperatively and kids working together to solve problems with technology applied in class."

■ On staff development: "If you want student outcomes, you have to be sure teachers are trained in that direction." For it to be done properly, you have to spend money.

■ On Plymouth Canton: "I didn't notice any women among the people in the superintendent's cabinet" and very few in leadership positions. "In a district this size, that's a glaring imbalance."

■ On ensuring relevance of education into the next century: "You have to anticipate. To a great degree, you're guessing. He said schools should work on teaching skills that apply to many fields, and added that teaching students how to relate to other people is an important skill."

■ On his best accomplishment: He said that in the mid 1980s when a report came out that was critical of education he formed a committee in the Marshall schools to look at making improvements. The committee came up with a list and the public approved a 2.5 mill tax increase to make those improvements.

■ On communication skills: "Some people are better talkers than listeners," he said, adding that he made a point of listening to people in the community. He also said the public only wants to be informed when it's expected to make a decision. "You have to reach out." He said he has written columns for the local newspaper as a way to do that.

■ Resolving issues with bargaining units: "I try to resolve things on an informal level. He said he has been involved in contract negotiations and added that "things do get worked out at that level."

■ Educational priorities: "I'd rather put things in the budget for kids than buy buses. Our job is to always put instruction first."

■ Reason for applying: "Plymouth Canton has a good reputation. It's a bigger challenge than Marshall. My children are out of high school and I'm ready to move anywhere."

■ Dealing with the school board: "I meet with my board once a month and communicate with them and keep them informed. He said it's critical to keep board members informed and stay in phone contact with them."

■ On communication: "I always try to communicate with my board as much as possible, verbally and in writing. I'm a take-charge person, and always consult with my board president and board members. I meet monthly with our education association president."

"I also communicate with the press and the public, and utilize bulletin boards and a 24 hour information line. Communication is the name of the game."

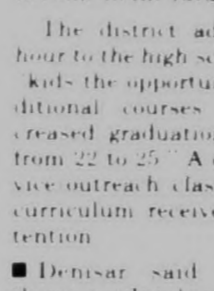

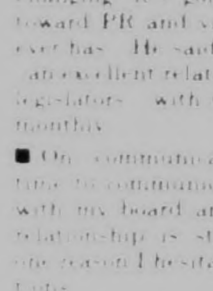

Ronald Jandura is superintendent of the 13,500 student St. Cloud, Minn., school system. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of Alabama and earns \$91,000.

During questioning by the school board, he gave the following answers:

■ On dealing with a school board: "Right now it's a stormy relationship. Their object is a new superintendent. However, things are still professional." He said he deals with the board by making himself available and holds a meeting to develop an agenda for school board meetings. "It's an open meeting. And I'm comfortable with it. Minnesota has an open meeting act that says if there are more than one school board member present, it's an open meeting."

■ On staff development: "We have programs to help good teachers become better." He said the district sets goals for professional development, but added that district school councils are also involved.

■ On communication: "I don't have a magic answer. What a school staff member says over the back fence about the district is probably more effective than what the superintendent says." He said the St. Cloud district is decentralized, with each school "creating its own informational zone." He added that he returns the telephone calls from parents before those of others. Also, he said he would try to use cable television to air school board meetings.

■ On interacting with a school board: "We hold retreats where we try to establish good, solid relationships." He said board members should have access to the school.

■ Short- and long-term planning: "Each situation is different. Each school system has a history and a culture. What works in one doesn't work in another." He said the Westwood school district de-

cidated it needed to change and he did it by visiting classrooms and listening to what people had to say. He said he changed the district by involving parents and school staff members in making decisions. "We had told parents to drop the kids off at the school door and that was it. We've changed that."

■ Keeping track of goals: "You have to monitor and set targets for ourselves. Also, you need to get reaction from the community."

■ On challenges facing schools: "It's been a question of reordering our priorities." He said the most important mission of schools is "to help kids learn how to solve problems and act morally."

■ Educational goals: "If we've taught them to solve problems and help mankind, and we've assured that the kids are doing that, we've done a good job."

■ Making education relevant: "Ask the kids. They are the consumers. There should be a place in education for the kids. They have opinions that should be tapped." He also said that high expectations should be set. "Too often we've set the ceiling too low." He said the faculty should be involved in determining what a high school diploma should mean. "We also need to ask the community to see what's relevant."

■ On communication: "You have to listen to people, but not just what the loudest shouters are saying." He said the school district doesn't have a public relations department. "It's not politically correct." He said there are newsletters edited by parents. Also, he said it's important to communicate with the 78 percent of the people in the school district who don't have children in the schools.

■ On ensuring relevance of education into the next century: "You have to anticipate. To a great degree, you're guessing. He said schools should work on teaching skills that apply to many fields, and added that teaching students how to relate to other people is an important skill."

■ On his best accomplishment: He said that in the mid 1980s when a report came out that was critical of education he formed a committee in the Marshall schools to look at making improvements. The committee came up with a list and the public approved a 2.5 mill tax increase to make those improvements.

■ On communication skills: "Some people are better talkers than listeners," he said, adding that he made a point of listening to people in the community. He also said the public only wants to be informed when it's expected to make a decision. "You have to reach out." He said he has written columns for the local newspaper as a way to do that.

■ Resolving issues with bargaining units: "I try to resolve things on an informal level. He said he has been involved in contract negotiations and added that "things do get worked out at that level."

■ Educational priorities: "I'd rather put things in the budget for kids than buy buses. Our job is to always put instruction first."

■ Reason for applying: "Plymouth Canton has a good reputation. It's a bigger challenge than Marshall. My children are out of high school and I'm ready to move anywhere."

■ Dealing with the school board: "I meet with my board once a month and communicate with them and keep them informed. He said it's critical to keep board members informed and stay in phone contact with them."

"Consultants can make mistakes. A lot of candidates may be outstanding, and we will never see or hear from them. Maybe these are the best seven, but someone on the board should at least take a look."

Pursell said he took the time to get involved because of the job's importance. The new superintendent will have the opportunity to interact with legislators, college administrators and state leaders.

If the right person is hired "we ought to have a voice in the future of education in this state," Pursell said.

Others on the committee suggested that the board ask tougher questions and seek more detailed answers.

"These questions don't go to the heart of issues the superintendent is going to address," said one committee member. "They didn't draw them out."

School board president Roland Thomas said more detailed questions will be asked of the three finalists.

The final interviews will be up to three hours long and may be "very grueling and demanding," said trustee Dave Artley.

Teachers union president Chuck Portelli said he'd like the board to ask candidates how they maintain relationships and solve problems with staff.

## Woman with cancer finds lots of support

Employees at the Meijer store in Canton will serve up fun with a charitable effort to help pay medical bills for a young woman stricken with cancer.

Gale Peters, 20, an Inkster resident, was in her first year of nursing school last year at Southern University in Baton Rouge, La., when she was stricken with severe stomach pains.

After many tests, doctors finally diagnosed Peters' illness as choriocarcinoma, a rare cancer that strikes 1 in 40,000 women. The cancer affects the liver, lungs

and kidneys. Part of the earlier problems in diagnosis stem from the fact that its conditions mimic pregnancy.

Peters has now moved back to Canton and is being treated at Hutzel Hospital in Detroit.

Sherray Peters, Gale's mother, has taken a leave from her Meijer job to care for her daughter.

"Gale had a complete physical before she went to college," Sherray said in frustration. "There's just no reason."

Now Gale is fighting the ravages of chemotherapy and has suffered severe chills that brought on convulsions.

Event organizers include Patty Sowers of Canton, an in-store trainer, and Wayne residents Rose Kaifish and Dan Gauley. Store director Jeff Ham is also in-

olved, along with Union 951 and store employees from the Westland and Belleville Meijer stores.

Some 22 store managers will be "auctioned" off at 8:30 p.m. Willing store managers will go to the highest bidding employee. That manager will then work side by side with that employee for a day, sharing the employee's workload, Ham said.

"This has created a lot of excitement in the store," Ham said.

Manpower will consist of one chief, one assistant chief, one administrative assistant, three captains, three lieutenants, 15 full-time firefighters and 55 part-time firefighters.

"The city will retain ownership of all (its) equipment, which represents a great savings," Walters said. Officials say that the level of services would remain the same under the plan. Costs would be based on a formula outlined in the contract. The city's share of operating expenses would be at least 25 percent. This formula takes into account population, state equalized value and the number of fire emergency runs.

Also, there are no layoffs planned. Staff reductions would occur by attrition.

Some disadvantages given are that the two unions will blend seniorities. Some members will be more limited in dates available for vacation selection due to the new seniority list. There will also be more competition for promotions.

Plymouth Township firefighter Paul Ray said officials were of "a totally different mind set. You're not in touch with reality. You live in Disneyland."

He said, however, that he believes consolidation can work.

The fire service will lose its identity as either city or township.

City officials say problem resolution will become more difficult with two units of government involved.

When the airport board asked Malone about his students, he responded: "Well, I'd rather not get into that. That's an ongoing business." He said he is uncertain whether classes will continue. "Otherwise, there's only one answer: It's over."

Malone tried to question Randy Collier, state Bureau of Aeronautics licensing and enforcement manager, and advisory board member John Vergonna, who served on the FBO selection panel, about the selection process. "It's come to using the FBO, sacrificing a private business for the state to get management for nothing," Malone said.

He told pilots at the meeting that bids for managing the airport

ranged from \$82,000 up to \$145,000, plus Kitzie's for \$1. "Kitzie bid \$1 for management and \$1 for the premises," Malone said.

"You had a viable, active business here that survived during the recession and difficult political times," Malone continued, faulting the state for putting him out of business. "It doesn't take much to take that (state) boot and step on me."

Pilots questioned the type of business Kitzie now has at Oakland-Pontiac Airport. He operates a maintenance business and is former FBO of National Airport in Canton, which no longer exists.

"Down the line, we've got to start supporting the FBO," said

pilot Bill Brown. "It's up to us to support him if he's a legitimate businessman and knows what he's doing."

Pilots were surprised to learn that a plan has yet to be worked out for fuel sales between the time Malone's business is finished and Kitzie comes in with a new contract.

"I don't think anyone was in a position to know that we would be without fuel for 30 days," said pilot Doug Schumard, past president of an experimental aircraft group.

Collier said he's not sure that pilots will be without fuel. But he defended the state's decision. "We didn't pick him (Kitzie) if we didn't think he would succeed."

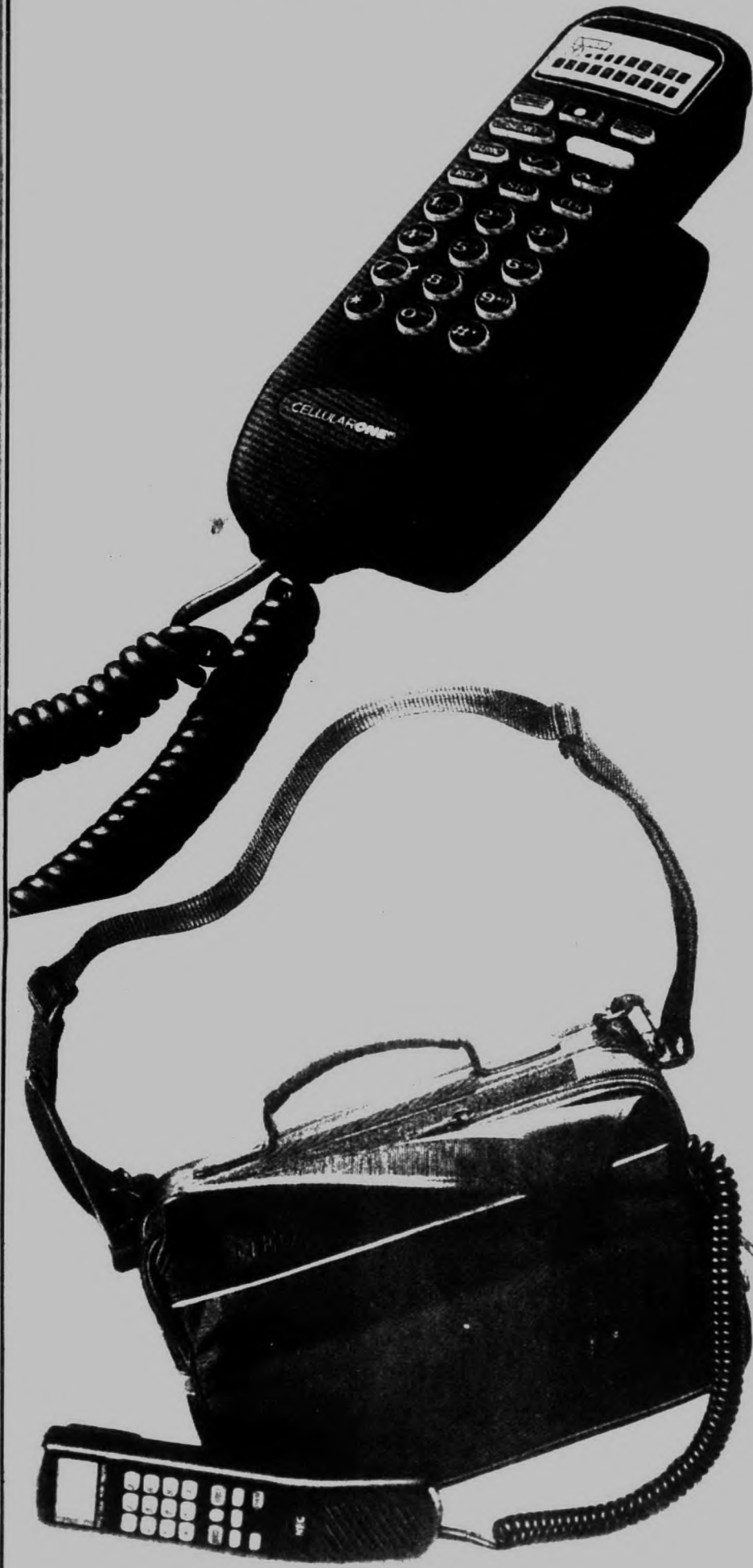

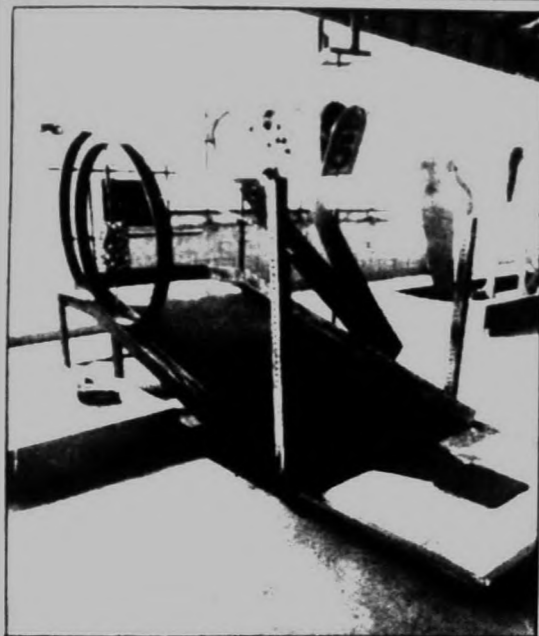

## Artists shoot for golf fans

Golf or art, which is it? Both. Whether you're looking for art or just a little fun, the Detroit Artists Market has the game for you. "Fore Art," an art installation, indoor miniature golf course, is the wildest set of holes ever played by amateurs or pros.

Imagine yourself putting through Detroit artist Toby Upton's Dodge van; beyond the satin pillows inside a harem tent between the stick-like legs of flamingos by Laurie Wade of Alpena, under the bridges of Royal Oak artists Catherine and Charles Peet's industrialized Lilliputian city complete with polluted skyscrapers and miniature bags of garbage, or into the Mad Hatter's oversized tea cups crafted by Cranbrook graduate student, Kiersten Armstrong.

Welcome to DAM's 18-hole art installation located a few doors down from the gallery at 300 Stroh River Place in Detroit. Art director Gerry Craig came up with the idea for the course designed by 22 Michigan artists after hearing about "GolfArt," an indoor miniature golf course art installation in Chicago originated by Michael O'Brien, and a similar course in New York.

"It's the most fun way to experience culture in a long time," Craig said.

Non-golfers and pros alike can compete on a level playing field. How many pros have putted through a van, or through a flock of flamingos, or around high-heel shoes speared with pencils?"

Try putting up the hill constructed by sculptor Matthew Hanna of Redford Township. If you make it up this steep incline you're sure to sink the ball in one of the three holes, right? Maybe not, Hanna said. At least he doesn't know of anyone who's sunk a ball. —vet

Looking at it, it looks like an old piece of machinery. The conceptual drawing was a lot different," Hanna said.

As far as the rest of the holes of art, Hanna agrees, the Detroit area has never seen anything like it before.

It's totally off the wall. With all the artists in volved there's great interaction and it's great for Detroit.

One of the guidelines artists had to follow when submitting proposals for individual holes was that the hole must challenge experienced players, but not frustrate novices and children. The designs enhance the concept of the hole and engage players as active participants in the game.

"There's nothing like this in miniature golf courses," said DAM board member Sergio De Giusti of Redford Township.

De Giusti, an Italian-born sculptor, created a medallion to commemorate the history-making artworks. It's for sale along with an array of other golf goodies in the Pro Shop at the back of the course. Leslie Stolaruk of Plymouth gives duffers a chance to display their passion with golf theme puzzle pins to be worn on shirts, hats or whatever.

A puzzle on the course is Susan Logan and Gary Zych's 12th hole where a superhighway dividing the suburbs and slums provides a wry commentary.

If the ball goes in the suburbs you can't get out," De Giusti said.

Artists were allocated \$500 for materials to construct holes that would be playable with putters and ball. The ball starts from a tee mat on a level surface and ends up in a sunken regulation cup. Golfers play a traditional round of golf, elements of chance were to be kept to a minimum. Most importantly, the course is wheelchair accessible. Artists designed the holes so that a player is able to putt from a wheelchair.

The cost to play 18 holes is \$5 for adults, \$4 for students/seniors, and \$3 for children younger than age 12. Proceeds benefit the Detroit Artists Market operating budget.

Founded in 1932 to promote contemporary art and provide a venue for Michigan artists to sell their work during the Great Depression, the Detroit Artists Market was originally named the

# Bugs Beddow gets his Brigade

■ Playing in bands since the mid-1970s, Bugs Beddow hasn't had time to slow down. His shows prove that he and his band haven't lost any of their spunk either.

Award-winning trombonist/flutist Bugs Beddow has been around the local music scene for a long time. That fact hit me recently when I recalled that I last wrote about him for the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers in 1979, when he was in a pop-dance band called Air Condo. The 1970 Groves High School graduate was sporting something akin to an afro back then, had just given up his job as a music teacher in the Leland Public School system near Traverse City, and had just completed recording with Mitch Ryder. He has even considered slowing down since.

He's a member of the Metro Times Monthly Detroit Jazz Hall of Fame. ("If you've voted the best three years in a row, you're automatically in. All that means is a spot of notoriety or achievement.") had a credited cameo playing the trombone in the film "Hoffa," and he just released his fourth album "Goin' Blind."

He's worked with, or opened for, everyone from B.B. King to Johnny Rivers, with stops along the way for Earl Klugh, Erta James, the Temptations, U2, Bob Green, Rahsaan Roland Kirk, Phyllis Hyman, Johnny

worked with Sly & The Family Stone, Wild Cherry ("Play That Funky Music") and a slew of other R&B and funk bands, drummer Skeeto, who is also a member of Big Sugar, has worked extensively with Aretha Franklin, bassist Tony Sully is a veteran of the Mitch Ryder band, and guitarist Bill Lympers has worked with local legends Orthelia Barnes and Norma Jean Bell.

Asked to complete his list of inspirations, Beddow offers, as a surprisingly wide assortment, from Joe Cocker, who he turns to for vocal inspiration, to trombonists Wayne Henderson (of the Crusaders), Raul DeSouza and Steve Turre. Flute heroes include jazz legends James Moody and Eric Dolphy, and Bonnie Raitt and Frank Zappa make the list, too. The man is as much of a music fan as he is a music player.

As the above lists make clear, Beddow is comfortable playing most kinds of music. Jazz was his first love, of course, but the paying dates got too few and far between to keep him happy. The R&B band was an instant hit. It's danceable, the songs are recognizable to most and the lines grow increasingly longer. The night I caught them, at Corradi's in

Troy, they played everything from ZZ Top's "Cheap Sunglasses" with the band decked out in their Ray bans to ZZ Hill guest drummer Terry Thunders' superb take on "Someone Else is Steppin' In" to the Average White Band's perfect take on "Pick Up the Pieces" to the Electric Flag's "Killing Floor," for which Beddow introduced Thunders as Buddy Miles. He's got a playful sense of humor that never rests. His take on Cocker's "You Can Leave Your Hat On" was one of the hits of the evening, as was an obscurely called "Barkin' Up The Wrong Tree." At this point, the book is 90 percent covers, though Bugs sees that dropping down to 40 percent in the relatively near future.

Though "Goin' Blind" is only available in tape form, dubbed the bootleg and described by Beddow as "not a Triple A recording" in regard to the sound quality, but "the music is good. We play well." The CD release is imminent. Where most of folks, particularly the wonderful "Yuda Man," relied on his jazz ticks, "Goin' Blind" is almost like the Beddow version of a Motown review in terms of sheer power and obvious enjoyment. From the "Peter Gunn" intro to "Take Me To The

River" (sort of like the Al Green and Talking Heads versions combined) to their take on the Beatles' "Slow Down," it's a blast. Their versions of "Talk to Your Daughter" and "Pick Up the Pieces" are first rate. Although I'm not crazy about their rendition of ZZ Top's "Cheap Sunglasses," their slow and bluesy version of "Fool For Your Stuckness" is impressive.

Bugs Beddow calls the Brigade the "Most working band in the city" and there's every reason to believe that's true after looking at their upcoming schedule: April 15-16 at Moby Dick's, 5452 Schaefer, Dearborn, (313) 581-3650, April 17 at Max & Erma's, 31205 Orchard Lake Road, Farmington Hills, (810) 855-0990, April 20-23 Stoyan's below Joe's Comedy Club, 36071 Plymouth Road, Livonia, (313) 261-0555, April 29-30 at Speakeasy Lounge, 31410 Ford Road, Garden City, (313) 425-7373. Taylor, Albert Collins—the list goes on and on. In the mid '70s he worked with Woody Herman, Stan Kenton and Max Ward Ferguson big bands and opened for Buddy Rich at P.Jazz. Last Halloween, his current band, dubbed the Brigade (they dropped the "Blues" prefix awhile ago), opened for Robert Cray with all five members dressed as Zorro.

The Brigade is the band that Beddow has been after all his life. When asked to name influences, the first name out of his mouth is the Tower of Power horns, and the Brigade have that funkified groove down cold, and for good reasons.

Saxophonist and New Orleans native Monty Montgomery, a self-proclaimed John Coltrane fanatic, has

# 'Sirens' slowly sinks in its own silliness

Sirens, according to legend, perch upon rocky cliffs and beckon sailors toward them. As their ships sink after crashing upon the rocks, the seamen are lured to a watery grave by the hypnotic women's song.

John Dugan, writer-director of the new movie "Sirens," hopes to cast a similar spell. Unfortunately, despite the best efforts of a willing cast and crew, his movie isn't clever or sly enough to draw us into the trap completely.

Hugh Grant and Tara Fitzgerald play an English reverend and

his wife who visit the country home of a controversial Australian artist in the 1960s. His "Crucified Venus," depicting a voluptuous naked woman nailed to the cross, has London in an uproar and it's up to the Rev. Tony Campion to talk him into withdrawing it from international exhibition.

They find in Norman Lindsay (Sam Neill) a playfully mocking and dedicated artist who intends to do nothing of the kind. He cites the various evils carried out in the name of organized religion, from witch burnings to the Spanish Inquisition—and doesn't see how his pictures are going to un-

travel the country's moral fabric.

During these philosophical arguments, the reverend's wife Estella finds herself first repulsed and then strangely attracted to Lindsay's trio of artist models. When they aren't posing or swimming naked, they're dressed in flamboyant costumes, eating sugary and talking about little else but sex.

While Tony considers himself broad minded and worldly, it's the prim Estella who is drawn to the rocks. The days are hot and

sunny and the constant talk about the muscular, half-blind handy man (usually shown stripped to the waist, Harlequin romance style) has her thinking Her dreams grow so vivid that she's not sure at one point whether she's been unfaithful to Tony or not.

At its best, "Sirens" is a playful summer romp for its talented cast. Likable Hugh Grant, still visible on area screens in "Remains of the Day" and "Four Weddings and a Funeral," may finally take his place as a bankable leading man. Likewise Sam Neill, practically a household name

when you add up all the people who saw him in "The Piano" and "Jurassic Park."

Norman Lindsay, as it turns out, really was an Australian artist. He died in 1969 at the age of 90 after seven decades of infuriating the public with his satirical paintings, sketches, sculptures, and novels. The filmmakers actually shot at his 40-acre estate outside Sydney, another plus.

At its worst, "Sirens" is an inherently sexist romp filmed with the subtlety of a dirty slide show.

Writer-director Dugan "flirting" keeps his tongue firmly in cheek, especially when it comes to overt use of sexual symbols. We can practically see him in a fit of adolescent snickering as another snake winds suggestively through the scenery.

"Sirens," nearing the end of a successful run at the Maple and elsewhere, proves once again that sex—or the promise of it—still sells. It's hard not to think of worthier movies that have fallen through the cracks.

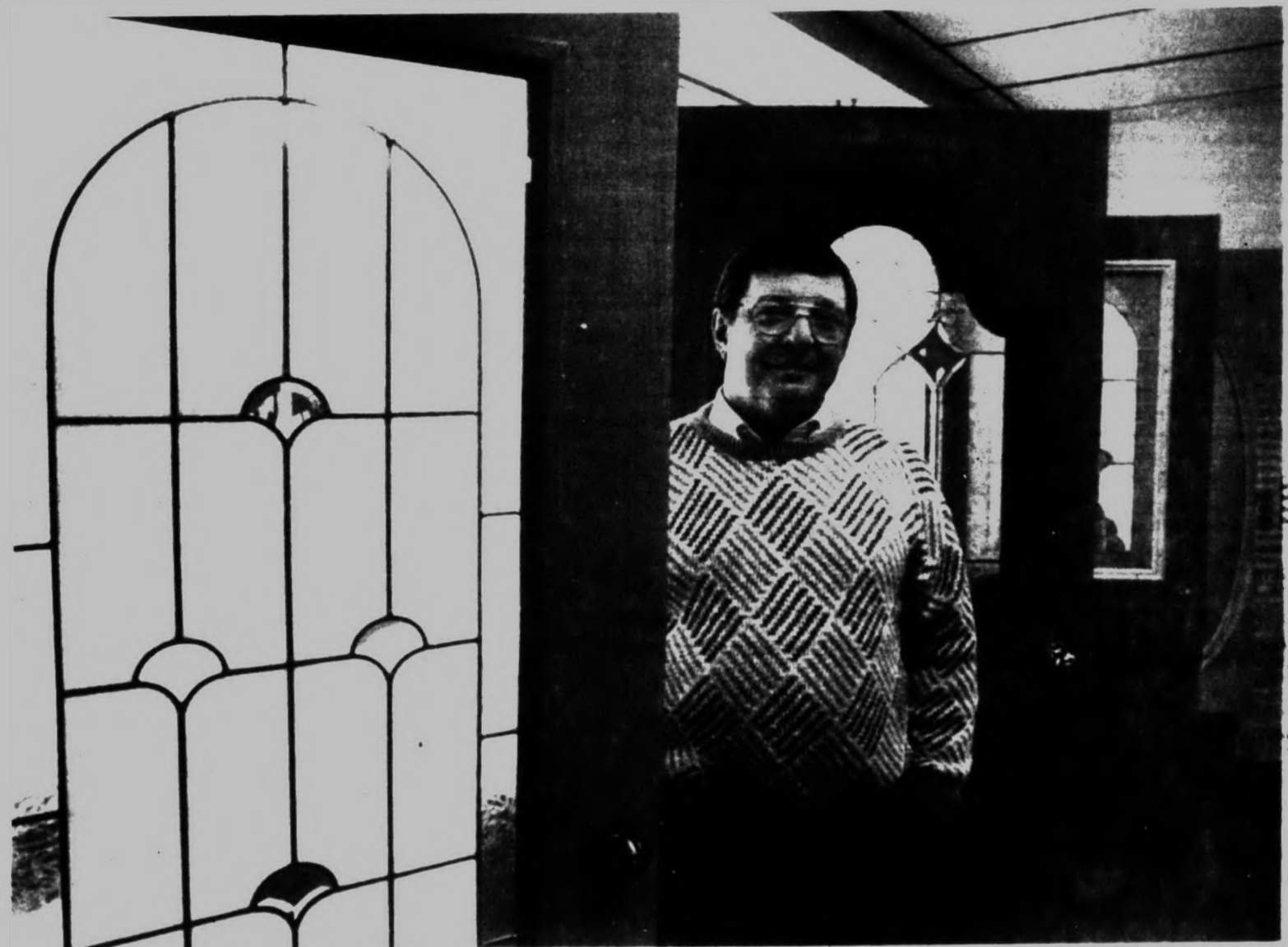

POINTS OF VIEW

Educators must understand religious viewpoints

Question: I was watching a Christian TV show the other night which had nothing good to say about public education. They attacked Outcome Based Education, the whole language versus synthetic phonics, multicultural education, site based management, AIDS education and any course that dealt with opinion as opposed to absolutes. As a school administrator, how did you deal with fundamentalist Christians who want to dictate curriculum?

Answer: Dr. Arnold Burron, Professor of Education at the University of Northern Colorado and a fundamentalist Christian, says, "Any attempt to speak for all Christians on any point of controversy may just lend credence to the adage, 'Fools rush in where angels fear to tread.' Dr. Burron conducts seminars across the United States for local chapters of Citizens for Excellence in Education (CEE) — possibly the number one watchdog of public education for "fundamentalist Christians."

As an administrator, I always believed fundamentalist Christians have a right to their beliefs and opinions as well as any group, religious or otherwise. But I also knew that Christians speak with many voices. There are Catholic Christians, Protestant Christians — just as there are different voices heard among the Jewish, Muslim — or any other identifiable

religious group.

As a school administrator, I believe one has to understand where any religious group is coming from to be able to work with them. Dr. Burron says,

"Many public educators appear to be woefully ignorant of the traditional Christian belief in supersessionism. Supersessionism is the belief in the exclusivity of Christianity that states that only through faith in Jesus Christ can salvation be attained." It's a point that always bothered me as a Christian Catholic. I mean, I believe in a hereafter, but who gets to heaven first — little Anne Frank and the six million Jews who died in the Holocaust or the Christians (mostly Catholics, a few Jews) who tended the camps?

Fundamentalist Christians, according to Dr. Burron, believe that all people have a right to practice any religion they wish — while at the same time being opposed to the teaching that all religions are the same. Nothing wrong with that belief.

I believe the curriculum problem many traditional Christians have is when an Outcome Based Objectives pop up in a course that says something like, "All students will be able to listen, share opinions, negotiate, compromise and help the group reach consensus."

Fundamental Christians would tend to believe this leads to Relativism — the belief that truth depends upon the

individuals or groups holding them — that knowledge is relative to the limited nature of the mind. In this case, fundamentalist Christian belief in a Higher Power than the human mind is really no different from the beliefs of most religious groups.

Educators get in trouble in such situations as that of the Ohio teacher who taught a consensus module. All stu-

dents in the group had to agree before closing on an issue. One student, a fundamentalist Christian, didn't agree with the group. He was the only one in the group who didn't agree and the teacher, in his infinite wisdom, gave him an E — for not agreeing! That type of situation bothered his fundamentalist Christian parents and his church leaders, as it would any reasonable parent or group.

As Gordon Allport, the great social psychologist says, "We tend to group people because it takes less effort than to deal with individuals within a group (i.e. all fundamentalist Christians are this or that)."

Dr. Alex Molnar, a professor in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction at the University of Wisconsin, in Educational Leadership (Dec. 1993) says, "Fundamentalist Christians are a diverse group, and only a minority advocate extreme right-wing political causes. Consider abortion. Only 22 percent of self-identified born again, evangelical Christians listed abortion as a major issue in the last presidential election."

Indeed, when right-wing Christian political activists viciously went after Professor James Sears of the University of South Carolina for developing a course called "Christian Fundamentalism and Public Education" — his staunchest defenders were the fundamentalist Christians who were taking

the class.

As to your question regarding how educators should deal with fundamentalist Christians — just as with any other human beings, educators should clearly explain the rationale for school curriculum, explain the goals and objectives in course description booklets and in school newsletters — the obvious!

At a higher level would be forming a Council of Church Leaders and Educators. Set up a monthly lunch during the school year. The superintendent, assistant superintendent and guest would attend. Sit at a large round table so everyone is facing each other. Any one who has an issue, education or otherwise, speaks to it.

When I was in the West Bloomfield School District, this Council of Churches luncheon model was followed. It created dialogue that stopped rumors and misunderstandings of what was going on in the school system. It was well received. And Catholic, Protestant, Jewish, Muslim and fundamentalist Christians, to me, all seemed to be brothers and sisters in the flesh. Indeed, part of one master plan.

Please note that next year, First Day of Passover will be April 15, not Orthodox Easter on April 16 and Orthodox Pascha on April 23, in 1996 they will be on April 4, April 7 and April 14, respectively.

### Downtown Rochester offers shoppers something different

Have you shopped downtown Rochester lately?

Under the direction of Robert Donohue and Barbara Khalil of the Downtown Development Authority, the town is quietly becoming a place to go to enjoy a superb lunch or dinner, coffeehouse jazz, and shopping for something artfully adorable for the home, and friendly customer service.

"And this is just the beginning," said Donohue, showing off blueprints for the Western Knitting Mill TEE Higbee Building on Water Street.

Working with the Oakland County Planning Department, Donohue has won planning commission and city council approval to renovate the historic building as the apex of a mixed use community made up of artist lofts, swank condominiums, restaurants and galleries.

"Right now, the environmental testing is going on and we are looking at various developers," he said. "Phase One of the project should begin within a year and the entire project should be complete in five to 10 years."

Donohue and Khalil, who heads up business recruitment,

see downtown Rochester as a "destination, a mecca for what's unique and service oriented."

They expect shoppers and diners from as far away as Canada and Ohio and close as Troy and Oakland Township.

To assure that the destination reaches retail maps, several trendy business ventures opened in town recently and more are on the way. American Pizza Cafe is under construction in the old D & C (dimestore) building at the corner of Main and Fourth.

"The new owners are putting \$2 million into the new restaurant," Khalil said. "We are very excited about the project. American Pizza Cafe will hopefully bring us lots of new customers."

A new tea room is also under construction on Third Street, between Main and Walnut. The Rosewood Tea House will offer tea and crumpets in a Victorian setting by late spring.

Khalil is also pleased to announce the grand openings of Antiques by Pamela, 313 Main; Penn & Paige, (fine stationery) also at 313 Main; The Forward Tee (everything for the female golfer) 255 Main; Brass & Iron Beds of Rochester (the second location for the downtown Plym-

outh owners) and Archives A D (landscape and design pieces), 114 W Third.

Still more changes occurred recently when The Ski Company moved from their Fourth Street location to triple the space in the old Hepplewhite's space on Main. The Fitting Room added several new bridal services to the space they renovated in the former Generations shop next door.

Ballen Supply on Fourth Street has become an architectural must for shoppers seeking unusual doors, mouldings and mirrors.

Paint Creek Outfitters, a fully stocked Orvis store, features specialty fly fishing equipment and artwork on University. Ivy and Evergreen creates custom floral designs in permanent and fresh materials at 206 Walnut. Nagy's Lebanese American Cuisine replaced the former Alia's on University.

The DDA has begun publishing a quarterly newsletter, "The Connection," to unify communications with its members. The number of special downtown events has been changed this year to make them "bigger and better," according to Khalil.

Rand Moorhead pointed out that as buyers, the sales staff realizes the risk the owner makes putting up money for merchandise and even staying in business.

"I bought a lot of the spring line," Moorhead said. "So you can bet I'll work extra hard to see that it sells and is a success. And because we're part of a team, that success or failure impacts all of us."

Shirmer said she's working with her accountant to come up with a way to give the employee who brings in a new corporate gift

account, 50 percent of the profit from that sale.

"I don't know what will become of my suggestion," he said. "But I know it will be debated and considered by my associates."

Shirmer said that she must be doing something right because she left for store in the hands of her team for a three-week vacation and business boomed.

"My store ran smoothly and sales were up," she said, beaming.

"Even the customers have noticed a difference here. They've been asking if we are under new management. I'm delighted that I've been able to use all of the talents of the people who work here and provide a family-type atmosphere. I don't know why I never did it before."

Moorhead said other area merchants have heard about The Mole Hole's methods and are stopping in to ask questions.

"I just tell them we are celebrating and elevating pure human experience," he said. "All people are created equal."

## Pesto! Chilled soup among reader requests

Spring must be in the air! Everyone it seems is dusting off fry pans, cleaning up grills and searching for exotic ingredients to cook up a spring shower of tastes.

John Matlethorn of Birmingham called and told me about a friend in LA who sent him a tiny jar of red pesto sauce for Christmas. He's looked everywhere for a recipe.

Fresh basil is the fundamental ingredient in true pesto, but sun-dried tomatoes gives this pesto an untraditional color and rich flavor. Toss it over some hot pasta!

### RED PESTO SAUCE

1 1/2 cups fresh basil leaves  
1/2 cup sun-dried tomatoes  
1/2 cup pine nuts  
1/2 cup olive oil  
1/2 cup Parmesan cheese  
1/2 cup salt  
1/2 cup pepper

In a food processor or blender, chop the tomatoes with the basil, garlic, Parmesan cheese, pine nuts and 1/4 cup olive oil for 10 seconds. With the motor running, add the remaining oil, salt and pepper. Stop and scrape down the bowl. Process until smooth. Makes 1 1/2 cups.

Bob and Sophia Ryman of Garden City requested a recipe for chilled plum soup from Three Village Inn in Stony Brook, which they visited last summer on a journey through upstate New York. When yours truly gets requests like these,

I drop the restaurant a personal note and sometimes the request is honored. Well Bob and Sophia, running a recipe for chilled plum soup in the middle of January didn't sound quite right so now that spring has poked its head through the door, you'll be enjoying this soup all summer long!

### PLUM SOUP

2 cups plums  
1/2 cup sugar  
1/2 cup cinnamon sticks  
1/2 cup pepper  
1/2 cup salt  
1 cup water  
1 cup heavy cream  
1/2 cup brandy  
1/2 cup wine  
1/2 cup flour  
1/2 cup cornstarch

In a large saucepan, combine the plums with their syrup, the sugar, cinnamon sticks, pepper, salt and 1 cup water. Bring to a boil, stirring.

Reduce heat, cool to room temperature and stir in heavy cream. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine the wine with the cornstarch and set aside. Stir into the plum mixture and gently bring to a simmer.

Add the lemon juice and the lemon zest and remove from the heat. In another small bowl, whisk together 1 cup of the sour cream and the brandy. Whisk 1/2 cup of the plum mixture into the sour cream mixture, then return it all to the plum mixture. Allow the soup to cool and chill, covered for at least 4 hours. Ladle the soup into small serving bowls. Top each serving with a small dollop of sour cream and a sprinkling of fresh ground cinnamon. Makes 6 cups.

Dave Kettles of Farmington who enjoys fishing and frequently returns home with pails of panfish like bass, bluegill, smelt and small perch was looking for a basic coating mix that will taste good on all the fish he pan fries and bakes.

Well I immediately called Momma who suggests that you first rinse the small fillets under cold water, shake off the excess water and roll lightly in flour. Momma says this keeps the coating on better during cooking. Then dip the fillets in a beaten egg wash and roll in coating mix. Cook in an equal amount of butter and oil (about 1 tablespoon each) over medium heat for 3 minutes on each side.

# LUNCHTIME RUSH



These days the best table and biggest dining bargain in town can be found in high school and vocational school culinary arts restaurants. From waiting on tables to preparing lunch these students are eager to please.

"Good afternoon. Would you like a booth or a table today?"

These words greet scores of discriminating diners on a daily basis at the Salem Rock Cafe, the Alpha Room, and Cafe Marquette, three of the area's best kept restaurant secrets.

But don't look for these great little eateries on your local Main Street. Instead, you'll find them tucked into corners of Plymouth Salem High School in Canton, Oakland Technical Center Southwest Campus in Wixom,

and the William D. Ford Voc Tech Center in Westland. They are the showcases for the schools' culinary arts programs.

Culinary arts programs offer rigorous and inclusive training for students planning to enter the food industry in any capacity, from waiting on tables to preparing five-star pastry presentations. Students are rotated through a series of disciplines within the two- to four-semester programs: bakery, hot foods, cold foods, pastry, dish room and dining room. Combine this training with a generous amount of communications

skills and you have graduates in demand by the finest restaurants.

But as any prospective chef worth his or her salt soon learns, a great dining experience begins with the basics.

"Water is the enemy of greens," Carrie Gary, culinary arts instructor at Plymouth Salem High School, warns her students on the morning I drop by her busy kitchen. Blemish-free hearts of Romaine lettuce lie in front of her on a spotless chrome counter. She points to the tender leaves and says, "They'll rust, they'll get limp, they'll turn brown."

Things just don't turn color in Gary's kitchen unless they're meant to. Scrupulous attention is paid to preparation. Gary, an

Joanne is a flight attendant for United Airlines and alternates monthly between domestic and international flights.

The Cures also enjoy traveling together and seeking out recipes in the many places they visit. This past Christmas they traveled to Korea.

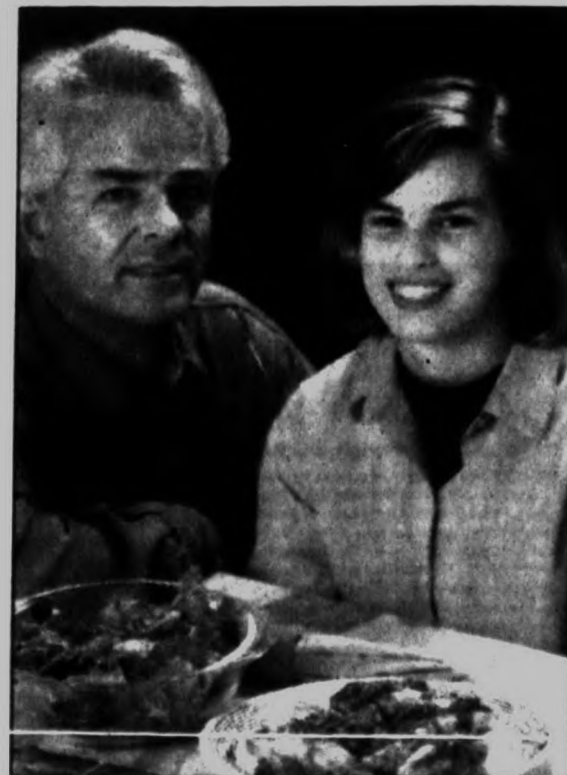
Michael Cure is advertising sales manager for Insight Magazine a national weekly.

We met after he responded to my request for "his specialty" recipes as part of the "Mrs. Doubtfire" movie promotion in December.

"I started to develop my appreciation for cooking while I worked for meals as a cook at the Alpha Gamma Delta Sorority House on the campus of Michigan State University," said Michael Cure. "I also cooked in the Army Reserves, but Joanne did the cooking after we got married. She's a very good cook. I started cooking again when it became necessary."

Like many families where both parents work, the Cures are constantly juggling schedules. It isn't easy, but for the Cures, the rewards are great.

"Enjoy your children," said Michael Cure. "Cooking together is a way to share the day's

## Student chefs stir up recipes with flair and flavor

### See related story on Taste front ORANGE ROUGHY ROULADE

4 orange roughy filets  
1 salmon filet, cut into 1-inch cubes  
2 teaspoons coriander, ground  
1/2 teaspoon fresh minced garlic  
1/4 teaspoon white pepper  
2 tablespoons good whiskey (Jim Beam, Cutty Sark, Jack Daniels)  
4 medium shrimp, peeled, veined and coarsely chopped (save shells)  
1/4 cup hazelnuts, roasted, skinned and finely chopped  
cheesecloth and twine

Set aside 2 orange roughy filets, salmon, coriander, garlic, pepper and whiskey in a bowl. Cover and let stand in refrigerator one hour. Remove salmon and orange roughy and lightly puree (separately) in a food processor. Fold pureed fish back into marinated mixture and add chopped shrimp and hazelnuts. Blend carefully to maintain a marbling effect in the roulade. Set aside.

Between two sheets of plastic

wrap lightly tap reserved orange roughy filets with meat mallet. Pat dry with paper towels. Wet a section of cheesecloth (about 16 by 16 inches) with cold water and place filets on cloth, making sure inside of filets are facing upward. Place half of orange roughy mixture on each filet and spread evenly. Roll the filets lengthwise away from you, making sure the seams of the filets are facing down. Roll cheesecloth around filets as tightly as possible. Tie each end with twine.

Poach roulade in fish fumet (see below) for 35 minutes or until internal temperature reaches 145 degrees. Remove. To serve, slice roulade in 1/2-inch slices. Yields 3 to 4 slices per serving (serves four).

**Fish fumet:** Two quarts of cold water, juice of half of lemon, 2 whole peppercorns, 4 shrimp shells, 1 clove garlic, 1 bay leaf, 2 stems of fresh dill, 1 carrot, 1 celery stalk, 1 small onion, 1/4 cup white wine and 1/2 teaspoon tarragon vinegar. Bring all ingredients to a boil and let simmer one hour prior to poaching the roulade.

1/2 cup (3 ounces) skim milk  
1/2 cup (3 ounces) fish fumet  
1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard  
salt and white pepper to taste  
Tabasco sauce to taste (not too much)  
Roux of 2 tablespoons butter or margarine and 2 tablespoons flour

Heat skim milk to 120 degrees. In separate pot melt butter or margarine over low heat and add flour. Mix together with a wire whip, making sure to beat out all the lumps. Remove from heat.

Combine skim milk and fish fumet and add to roux mixture. Cook over medium heat until thickened, stirring constantly. Add remaining ingredients. Blend and remove from heat. Spoon over arranged slices of Orange Roughy Roulade.

#### RANGER COOKIES

2 sticks butter or margarine

1 cup white sugar  
1 cup brown sugar  
2 eggs  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2 cups flour  
1 teaspoon baking soda  
1/2 teaspoon baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
2 cups oatmeal  
2 cups Rice Krispies cereal  
2 cups coconut

Cream together margarine or butter, granulated sugar and brown sugar. Add eggs and vanilla and beat until smooth.

In another bowl, mix together flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Add dry ingredients to butter mixture and mix thoroughly. Lightly mix in oatmeal, Rice Krispies and coconut.

Drop by rounded tablespoons onto a lightly greased cookie sheet. Bake at 325 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes, or until light brown. Makes 4 dozen.

### CHEF KERR'S REALLY GOOD REFRIGERATOR ROLLS

2 cups milk, scalded  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 teaspoons salt  
1/4 cup shortening  
1 tablespoon dry yeast  
1/4 cup lukewarm water  
1 teaspoon sugar (for proofing yeast)  
2 eggs  
3 1/4 cup flour (bread flour preferable)

While milk is cooling, measure sugar, salt and shortening into a mixer bowl. Add milk. Set aside. Place lukewarm water in small bowl. Sprinkle yeast and 1 teaspoon sugar over the top. Let it dissolve, stirring once or twice.

Break eggs into small bowl. Beat slightly with wire whip. Add to mixer the ingredients and continue to blend.

Change beaters to bread hook attachment. Add the flour gradually to mixer ingredients, using a very low speed. After flour is mixed in, turn mixer to medium speed and continue mixing until dough clings to the beater. Scrape down the sides of the bowl frequently while mixing. Place dough in a 9 by 13-inch

pan that has been lightly oiled. Cover and refrigerate. Next day, scale dough into 1 1/2-ounce portions. Place on greased baking sheet and proof (allow to rise) until double in size (about 45 minutes). Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 15 to 20 minutes.

instructor at Plymouth Salem since 1972, enforces one golden rule: "If you're not going to eat it, then you're not going to serve it."

The Salem Rock Cafe, recently remodeled with bright, clean Euro-styling, serves 80 to 100 guests a day. Their menu includes soups, salads, sandwiches and special-of-the-day entrees, such as stuffed baked shrimp and Caesar salad. And everything is homemade by the students, from rolls to salad dressings.

In a back corner of the kitchen, a student is mixing croissant dough in a bowl large enough to bathe in.

Gary's students unanimously chose Ranger Cookies as their favorite kitchen goody. Marissa Wolfe, 17, of Canton made them for her boyfriend on Valentine's Day. "He really liked them," she said. "They always melt into these big round things when I make them, but they're really good."

When asked what's the best thing to come out of the Alpha Room's kitchen, Chef Bob Kerr, who founded the culinary arts program at Oakland Technical Center 23 years ago, readily produces two of his competition win-

ning students: Joseph Gordon, 18, and Andrew Benear, 17, both of White Lake. Gordon recently won first place in an Oakland County food show for his crown roast of pork. "I arranged it on a 30- by 30-inch mirror with baby carrots and asparagus and baby corn on various places on the mirror," he said. Not surprisingly, Gordon intends to make his living as a chef.

Benear, who plans to go to Johnson & Wales University in Rhode Island, the Harvard of culinary arts schools, said desserts are his specialty. He makes a no-bake lemon cheesecake shaped like a bride, complete with hoop skirt and sweeping train. Kerr knows the importance appearance plays in creating a culinary experience. "It's all in the presentation," he tells his students. "If something doesn't look right I have them take it apart."

Cafe Marquette, in the William D. Ford Voc/Tech Center, has an airy, contemporary look — a blend of soft green and blue, a wall of windows overlooking an inside courtyard and splashes of colorful neon lighting everywhere. But in addition to good looks, the Cafe Marquette has great food and dedicated instructors.

Culinary arts instructor Kathy Windiate and Chefs Kris Jablonski and Ramon Herrera teach their students 70 different culinary skills. They also act as mentors to students like Brad Alt, 17, of Westland, Dominick O'Donnell, 17, of Inkster, and Sarah Peterson, 18, of Westland. Peterson, a budding pastry chef, says with conviction, "Pastries are my life."

Alt, with a bit of guidance from Herrera, created a dish named Orange Roughy Roulade, which he recently entered in the Johnson & Wales Recipe Writing Contest. When asked what makes his creation so special, Alt says, "It's really elegant and it's really good." He plans to try it out soon on a brand new girlfriend, Lucky girl.

O'Donnell, whose crowning

moment came when he was chosen for a vocational industry culinary arts competition, likes his culinary creations on the fiery side — literally. He makes a "terrific" filet mignon over which he pours heated cherry liqueur. A flick of a match and *voila*, a half pound of beef tenderloin is transformed into food for the gods and goddesses. "Just don't pour too much liqueur on," O'Donnell cautions. "I flamed my roof once before."

Orange Roughy Roulade, flaming filet mignon, butter-rich cookies — do hard-working chefs go home after a 10-hour day and really make all these wonderful dishes? Not. "The last thing I want to do when I get home is cook," Windiate said.

## PASTA SHELLS WITH BELL PEPPER SAUCE

1 pound of pasta shells  
2 cups low fat cottage cheese  
1 tablespoon non-fat milk  
1 tablespoon onion powder  
2 teaspoons Italian seasoning  
1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley  
1/4 teaspoon ground pepper  
1 teaspoon garlic powder  
Heat water for pasta in a large pot and cook for about 10 minutes on high. When tender, rinse and drain.

Reduce heat to medium high and cook, stirring constantly until you see the sauce thicken. This takes about two minutes. Sprinkle the green onion on top and serve immediately. Will serve four people, big appetites. 2

Here's a traditional Pennsylvania Dutch recipe.

## WILTED DANDELION SALAD

5 thick slices lean bacon  
1 egg  
2 tablespoons sugar  
1/2 cup half and half  
3 tablespoons vinegar  
8 cups tender dandelion greens  
Fresh ground pepper  
Cut the bacon slices into small pieces. Fry them in a large skillet over low heat until cooked but not crispy brown, about 3-5 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a small bowl, mix together the egg, sugar, cream, and vinegar until well blended. Take the bacon out of the fat and set it aside. Reduce the heat under the fat to very low. Pour in the egg mixture

and stir it around briskly so the egg don't scramble. As soon as it begins to thicken, dump in the bacon and dandelion greens. Immediately remove the skillet from the heat and toss until the greens wilt. Season to taste with pepper. Makes 8 cups.

Phyllis Messerling of Livonia called to ask about using phyllo dough any other way than brushing each layer with calorie clogging butter or margarine. Yes Phyllis, you can spray phyllo with non-stick coating sprays (ie Pam, Mazola) and use as desired. The sheets brown and crisp and the calorie count is almost nonexistent.

Doug and Gordon from Plymouth called to say their friends are going bananas over their mashed potatoes. What's their secret? Try a light sprinkling of dry ranch type dressing mix when mashing. I tried it and I loved it!

Donna Gordon of Troy was unpacking her groceries when the entire carton of eggs slipped from her

fingers and ended up well scrambled on the floor. Anyone who has ever dropped an egg on the floor knows that it's almost impossible to "pick up" but Donna said she sprinkled plain old table salt generously over the eggs and within 5 minutes, simply swept up the mess with a broom. Patricia O'Connell of Canton called to protest the high prices for bottled barbecue sauces in the grocery stores. Well Patricia, my guess is that you probably have all these goodies in your pantry so why not make up a quart and keep it in the fridge for steaks, ribs, chicken and even burgers!

## TANGY BARBECUE SAUCE

1 medium onion, chopped  
1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil  
2 tablespoons chili powder  
2 teaspoons ground cumin  
2/3 cup vinegar  
1/2 cup beer

1/4 cup bottled ketchup  
2 tablespoons Worcestershire Sauce  
2 tablespoons brown sugar  
1 teaspoon dry mustard (or 3 tablespoons prepared)  
2 cloves garlic, chopped very fine  
1/2 teaspoon Tabasco Sauce (more if you like it hotter)  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon fresh ground pepper

Cook the onion in the olive oil in a heavy saucepan for 3 minutes.

Add the chili powder and cumin and cook for 1 minute. Stir in remaining ingredients and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 15 minutes or until slightly thickened. Pour into jars, date and refrigerate.

Makes about 1 1/2 cups so double the recipe for a jar full.

Chef's Secret: Don't use an aluminum pan to make this because the vinegar and ketchup will cause the sauce to discolor.

**WAIST MANAGEMENT**

A new study says that a comparison of waist circumference to that of the hips are of ten a better index of health than the standard height weight ratio (body mass index). The new research showed that the bigger the waist in comparison with the hips, the higher the risk of death. This conclusion is based on a study of 41,837 Iowa women aged 50 to 69 years. Regardless of whether their weights were ten percent below normal or 40 percent above normal, higher waist to hip ratios meant higher death rates. In fact the thinnest people who had higher waist to hip ratios also had the highest risk of death. This is not to say that being overweight does not present a health risk by itself. What matters is where the weight is carried.

# Satisfying sandwiches require innovative engineering

For people on the go, sandwiches can be a quick and compact answer to the need for a nutritious meal. Two slices of bread provide two of the six servings of grains that health authorities recommend as a daily minimum. Add three ounces of low fat meat and as many vegetables as you can pile on, and you will build a truly healthful and satisfying sandwich.

Bread, the foundation of any good sandwich, can be a valuable source of complex carbohydrates, vitamins and minerals. It can also provide lots of dietary fiber: two slices of oat bran or whole wheat bread can provide more than six grams of fiber. Two slices of pumpernickel, multi grain, light rye, cracked wheat, oatmeal or oat meal bran provide two to three grams, and French or Italian, white or raisin bread one to two grams. A regular English muffin or bagel provides one to two grams of fiber, and hamburger and hot dog buns and pita bread provide less than one gram of fi-

ber. Croissants, however, provide minimal fiber and are loaded with fat.

Very often the spread on a sandwich contains as much fat as the filling. Mayonnaise is particularly high in fat, so spread your bread with a low fat variety or a bit of non fat yogurt, mustard or low fat salad dressing instead. These condiments are also useful in making chicken, tuna or egg salad fillings. Other low fat condiments include pickle relish, ketchup, taco sauce and salsa.

Thin cut meats from your supermarket deli are usually sliced from whole cuts of meat that have less fat than processed meats like salami and bologna. Shaved turkey or ham can make low fat sandwiches, as long as you don't pile the meat on too thick. Be careful selecting cold cuts labeled 80 to 90 percent fat free: the grams of fat per slice may be higher than you think. Choose tuna packed in water instead of oil. Make high fat peanut butter or egg salad occasional treats, un-

less the rest of your diet is very low in fat.

Cheese often contains more fat than many meats. A one ounce slice of Swiss or provolone adds about eight grams of fat. American cheese has about seven grams of fat per ounce. Instead, use reduced fat cheese; use smaller amounts of a strong flavored cheese, or grate your favorite cheese and sprinkle a small amount evenly over the bread.

The best part of upgrading the nutrition of your sandwich comes with all the good things you can add: shredded carrots, watercress, fresh spinach leaves, scallions, lettuce, pepper, tomato, chopped celery, alfalfa sprouts, cucumber, bamboo shoots or sliced onions, to name a few. Vegetables help fill you up without all the fat. They add flavor and texture to your sandwich in addition to healthful vitamins, minerals and fiber.

This delicious Curried Chicken Salad has a low fat content because it uses white meat chicken (which has less fat than dark

meat), and is mixed with reduced fat mayonnaise or non fat yogurt. It is perfect served with whole grain rolls, bread or crackers for lunch, a light supper or a weekend brunch.

## CURRIED CHICKEN SALAD

- 1 1/2 cup cooked chicken breast, coarsely chopped
- 1/4 cup celery, chopped
- 1/4 cup green grapes, sliced
- 1/4 cup minced onion
- 3 tablespoons reduced fat mayonnaise, or non fat plain yogurt
- 1/4 teaspoon curry powder
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Mix the chicken, celery, grapes and onion. Separately mix the mayonnaise or yogurt with the curry powder and pepper. Stir the dressing into the chicken mixture and serve.

Each of the four servings contains 100 to 135 calories and 2 to 6 grams of fat.

## Cook book gives flare to nutritious recipes

Eating vegetarian has become a common occurrence in most families today. Whether for health or economy, more and more people are eliminating or reducing the amount of meat in their diet.

If you're looking for more alternatives to meat, pick up a copy of the new "365 Ways to Cook Vegetarian" (HarperCollins Publishers, \$17.95). Look for it in your bookstore after April 27.

Like other books in the series, this one contains recipes that are short with easily found ingredients.

Written by Kitty Morse, author

of "The California Farm Cook Book," "365 Ways to Cook Vegetarian" has recipes featuring pasta, rice, grains, eggs, and cheese with vegetables being the stars.

### MACARONI MOUSSAKA

- 1 (5 ounce) package Cheddar macaroni and cheese
- 2 medium eggplants, peeled
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1/2 pound mushrooms, sliced
- 2 (14 1/2 ounce) cans Italian style stewed tomatoes
- 1/2 cup dry red wine
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

Preheat broiler. In a large saucepan fill with lightly salted boiling

water, cook macaroni according to package directions, about 9 minutes. Mix with sauce and seasonings and set aside.

Meanwhile, peel eggplants and cut in 1/4-inch slices horizontally. Pat dry. Set slices on a single layer on a baking sheet. With a pastry brush, paint each slice with olive oil. Broil as close to heat as possible until lightly browned, 2 to 3 minutes. Turn slices over, paint with oil, and broil until browned on second side, about 2 minutes. Set aside. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees F.

In a large frying pan, heat 1 tablespoon olive oil over medium high heat. Add mushrooms and cook until barely tender, 2 to 3 minutes. Mix mushrooms with cooked macaroni.

In a small bowl, mix 1 cup stewed tomatoes with red wine, set aside. Spoon 1/2 cup stewed tomatoes over bottom of a 10-inch square baking dish. Mix remaining tomatoes with cooked macaroni and mushrooms.

Place one-third of eggplant slices on bottom of baking dish. Cover with half of cooked macaroni mixture. Layer on half of remaining eggplant. Top with remaining macaroni. Cover with last layer of eggplant. Spoon reserved stewed tomatoes and wine on top. Sprinkle with grated Cheddar cheese. Cover tightly with foil.

Bake 50 minutes to 1 hour, until moussaka is bubbly. Serves 4.

### ASPARAGUS AND OLIVE LINGUINE

- 1 pound asparagus, trimmed and cut into 2 inch pieces
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 large Bermuda onion, very thinly sliced
- 1/4 pound Mediterranean style black olives, pitted and coarsely chopped
- 12 ounces linguine
- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese

In a large saucepan filled with boiling water, cook asparagus until just tender, about 3 minutes. Rinse under cold running water, drain well.

In a medium frying pan, heat 2 tablespoons olive oil over medium heat. Add onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until lightly browned, 8 to 10 minutes. Add olives and asparagus bits. Cook, stirring to heat through, 1 to 2 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a large pot filled with lightly salted boiling water, cook pasta until tender but still firm, 8 to 10 minutes, drain. Transfer to a serving bowl and toss with 1 tablespoon olive oil. Keep warm.

To serve, place pasta on a large serving platter. Top with asparagus and olive mixture. Serve with grated cheese on the side. Serves 4.

## CC basketball loses its luster; Baker leaving

A coach with a Catholic League background, who wanted to remain anonymous, had this to say about the basketball coaching vacancy at Redford Catholic Central:

"Who would want that job after the way they bum-rushed a guy with a track record like that out of town?"

I wonder if other qualified coaches feel the same way.

The quote was in reaction to coach Bernie Holowicki's resignation after 23 years at CC. It's obvious Holowicki wasn't wanted back despite being named the Class A coach of the year by one major newspaper after winning his seventh Catholic League championship and 15th district title.

The 62-year-old Holowicki, who still wants to remain in coaching, is the winningest active coach in the state with 612 victories.

Greg Esler, who led St. Clair Shores Lakeshore to the Class B title and an undefeated season this year, was rumored to be a possible candidate but he's likely to end up at Warren DeLaSalle if coach Tim Turner gets an unfair ax.

My hunch is Joe Charnley, the successful coach at Dearborn Divine Child and a former Holowicki assistant coach, would be CC's first choice.

But does he need the headache?

Charnley, a Plymouth resident, said before Easter vacation that he has not applied. Why should he? He's treated well at DC.

One more thing: If CC fans are hoping Charnley's best player, junior guard Dan Geoghegan, would make the move with him, think again.

Charnley would have none of that, and CC has a policy of not allowing seniors to transfer and play sports at its school.

I wonder about the administration at CC and the communication between principal the Rev. Joseph Moffatt and the coaching staff.

Moffatt hasn't returned calls from the Observer and it looks like the only way I could speak to him is if I stepped into his confessional.

Ironically, a couple weeks ago Moffatt was pictured in the Observer news section, standing next to a CC student who sold \$15,000 worth of raffle tickets.

So we know Moffatt can say "Cheese" for a photographer but not pick up a telephone and talk to a reporter.

His athletic director, Bob Santello, does a fine job and works endless hours, but he's limited under Moffatt's leadership.

Much of Santello's communication is done by passing notes to coaches.

A.J. Baker, the Redford resident who coached the Michigan Nationals Junior hockey team out of Dearborn and also runs the Metro Hockey League in Plymouth, said Friday he's heading south.

The 34-year-old Redford Union graduate has accepted an assistant coach's job at Alabama-Huntsville, a Division II college program. Baker, who leaves May 1, said he will be assistant manager of an ice rink in Huntsville, too.

Since he ran a summer league for about a decade, Baker won't feel strange going to an ice rink in the Alabama heat.

Baker believes his best way to eventually be a college head coach is to make a drastic move. Hockey is in his blood.

"If it wasn't for a sheet of ice, I'd be a counter clerk at 7-Eleven," Baker joked.

Baker said he has approached local colleges about assistant coaching jobs but hasn't gotten anywhere. The head coach at Alabama-Huntsville is Dearborn native and 1972 U.S. Olympic hockey player Doug Ross.

"It's kind of funny how it takes someone from out of state who can appreciate what you can do," said Baker, who also will be leaving his job as manager of Canfield Ice Arena in Dearborn. "You can't tell me Michigan State, Michigan, Western Michigan, Michigan Tech and Northern Michigan don't have a position for an assistant that would make it worthwhile to move there."

Baker said Plymouth resident Tom Yockey might buy the MHSL and continue running the league this summer out of the Plymouth Cultural Center.

If not, maybe Baker's mother, Edna, who served as the league secretary, can continue to run the league.

## Distance troops lift Canton hopes

Really, not all that much has changed for Plymouth Canton's boys track team.

■ Not the team's greatest strength, which again figures to be in the distance events.

■ Not the dominant relays, which produced two first-place finishes at last year's Western Lakes Activities Association meet.

■ Not the overall depth, which is still in evidence.

And hopefully the results will be much the same — another WLAA championship and a Western Division title.

"We have a solid crew back from last year's group," said coach Bob Richardson, noting 25 returnees among the 50 on the team. "Whether

we can duplicate that feat, we'll find out later."

Richardson's reference to "that feat" was the Chiefs' come-from-behind victory at the WLAA meet. Entering the final event, the 1,600-meter relay, they trailed both Northville and Farmington-Harrison. To be league champs, they would not only have to win the relay but finish at least a couple places ahead of both.

They did. Canton's Matt Demey, Marques Nelson, John Martin and Kevin Gudeth took first, Northville was sixth, Harrison ended up eighth. The Chiefs claimed the WLAA crown with 111½ points, six more than runner-up Northville.

The distance runners will be depended upon for Canton to succeed again. Last year, the Chiefs finished one-two-three at the WLAA meet in

the 800 and had three in the top eight in both the 1,600 and 3,200.

Two of the three senior co-captains are distance runners: Demey (seventh in the 400 at the WLAA) and Jeff Keith, who won the 800 at the league meet and placed second in the 1,600.

Other distance troops include senior Todd Smith (sixth in the 1,600), sophomore Ian Bedford (seventh in the 3,200), junior Casey Moothart (eighth in the 3,200), junior Brian Crocket, and junior Colin Astley.

"We're heavily relying on our distance crew to pull us through some tough spots, as they did last year," said Richardson.

There are plenty of sprinters, too, led by senior co-captain Mike Erickson. Both Mike Gurchak, a junior, and Rob Lemasters, a senior, scored in the 200 at the WLAA meet (placing seventh and eighth, respectively).

They are joined by Martin, a senior who took third at the WLAA in the 300 hurdles ("He's our go-to guy in so many areas"), juniors Ben Greanya, Dave Gay and Taka Shirai, and freshmen Dave Koshizawa and Bill Iler.

Joining Martin in the hurdle events

are senior Justin Semion, sophomore Ben Nelson and freshmen B.J. Page and Mike Zdzienko.

The field events are not so formidable. Simeon, junior Jon Gallinger, sophomore Brandt Blair, sophomore Chris Benskey and senior John Mogelnicki, a football team veteran in his first year of track, will anchor the weight events.

Mogelnicki may also be in the high jump, with Lemasters, Nelson and Page. The long jump will feature Semion, Greanya, Gurchak, Lemasters, Koshizawa and Shirai.

Although there is depth, Richardson said, "We're not as deep as last year. I don't think it will take people long to figure that out. It just depends on how we shift our people into events. We've got a half-dozen guys we can switch around."

There are some notable losses: Gudeth (2nd, 800), Justin McClary (third, 800), Nelson (sprints), Damon Collier (sprints), Dave Yack (fourth, 3,200), Eric Tomei (eighth, 110 hurdles), Tom Raven (third, discus) and Mark Koziol (seventh, high jump).

## Running events are a plus for the Rocks

Feast and famine.

OK, it's not quite that good — or bad — for Plymouth Salem's boys track team. It just seems that way.

The Rocks have a lot on the track, including three of the four members of last year's league champion 400-meter relay team. One look at the depth and talent of the runners and you'd be willing to grant them league-contender status.

But then there are the field events to consider. And it's there that Salem is lacking.

"Our strengths will be on the track," said coach Geoff Baker. "It's our field events where we'll have problems."

Last season, the Rocks were co-champions of the Western Lakes Activities Association's Lakes Division, sharing the title with Westland John Glenn and Farmington at 4-1. At the conference meet they finished fifth.

The biggest loss from last year is sprinter/hurdler Don Johnson, who qualified for the state meet in the 110-meter hurdles and placed second in the WLAA in both that and the long jump. Also gone is Derek Cudini, who was third in the WLAA in the 1,600 and 3,200; Jeff Schumacher, seventh in the shot put at the WLAA meet, and sprinter/high jumper Todd Forbes.

The returnees are impressive, however. There's senior Brian Herc, who was second last year in the 300 hurdles at the WLAA meet. And senior sprinters Adam Bakowski, Jay Casey and Marcus Zevalkink, who com-

bined with Johnson to win the 400 relay at the WLAA last season, are all back.

Also returning on the track: seniors Dan Miller (hurdles), Josh Stickney (800 and 1,600), Russ Polcyn (400, 800) and Andy Coburn (sprints).

But in field events, there are holes to fill. "We're a bit short on people," said Baker. "We're looking for people."

Rocky Johnson, a junior, leads the shot put and discus crew. Sophomore Dirk Schmiedel is best among the high jumpers, and senior Ryan Edwards tops the long jumpers.

Underclassmen whom Baker expects to contribute are sophomore Scott Pengelly, who placed sixth in the 3,200 at the Spartan Relays April 2 (he'll also run the 800 and 1,600), and in the middle distance events junior Andy McDonald and sophomore Jared Biniecki.

The key to success for Salem is simple: "If we can get some points out of Rocky and Dirk and Ryan in the field events, our other guys on the track will make up for the shortages."

And if the Rocks do get something in field events, Baker said, "I think we can challenge for the division title."

Chief division rivals are familiar ones — Farmington and John Glenn. In the conference race, there are defending champion Plymouth Canton, Northville and Farmington-Harrison.

"We're going to be good," Baker said. "If we lose, we're going to work that much harder. If we win, it will give us some promise for the rest of the season."

## Schoolcraft searching for new coach, AD

Is it worth it?

Every year, coaches and athletic administrators wrestle with that question. Does the money offered justify the time spent?

While the question is familiar to all those involved in sports management, the route to the answer is a singular one. Each man and woman must weigh the circumstances surrounding his or her individual situation and come to their own conclusion.

For a pair of Schoolcraft College administrators, the answer arrived at was the same: Time for a change.

Jack Grenan, women's basketball coach for 11 years — the head coach for the last eight — gave notice that he would not return at the end of last season. Marty Nowak, the school's athletic director for the past five years, resigned March 24.

According to Midge Carleton, assistant dean for physical science, Nowak left for reasons "both professional and personal. There was nothing specific."

"I know his job at Holmes (Middle School) was demanding. And he said he wanted to play golf."

Nowak is an administrator at Holmes. He was unavailable for comment last week.

Grenan resigned, he said, because there simply wasn't enough time. He is currently working toward his second Master's Degree, this one in counseling (his first was in education). Also, his wife, Nancy, is pregnant, with the baby due in July.

Grenan has three other children — 9, 11 and 14 years old. His son is playing basketball at St. Michael's in Livonia; Grenan will serve as an assistant coach.

"It's time to do something different," said Grenan. "I've been out SC 11 years. And it's really time to devote more time to my family."

"Something had to give between my full-time job, the baby and basketball."

When the situation is viewed like that, the answer is all too apparent. Still, Grenan's departure leaves another question. At the end of last season, he faced a near mutiny by his team. Did that prompt his resignation?

"No," he answered. "It just confirmed my decision to move on. It was time for a change. It's not a case of being burned out. It's just a case of doing something different."

Grenan's first four years as head coach at SC were very successful. His team twice won the Eastern Conference (in '86 and '88) and twice finished second (in '87 and '89). In 1988, the Lady Ocelots posted a 28-4 record.

But the team has struggled since. Last season's 12-12 mark was its best finish since '89.

The reason, Grenan said, was the additional attention other Eastern Conference schools started to give women's basketball, while SC stayed pretty much the same.

Grenan said he had a talk with SC administrators following the 1990 season, during which he told them it would be increasingly difficult to compete with the same resources while others kept upgrading their programs.

The answer he received: Play competitive basketball and make sure his players got their education so they could go on to a four-year school.

"Education was always first at Schoolcraft," Grenan said.

# Lady Crusaders sign 4 spikers

Never one to sit still, Madonna University volleyball coach Jerry Abraham is determined to top last year's 46-8 overall record and fifth place in the NAIA national tournament.

Abraham has added four new recruits to the program, while awaiting word on a fifth player.

The Lady Crusaders must replace a pair of key performers. Among those lost to graduation are first-team NAIA All-American Kari Van Duesen, a strong middle hitter, along with four-year setter and team MVP Marie Pilut.

Joining the ranks next fall for Madonna and Abraham:

- Vicki Toth, a 5-foot-10 senior from Redford Union, who committed in early March. She joins another RU product, Kelly McCausland, who stood out last fall as freshman for the Lady Crusaders.

**■ MADONNA**

Erin Gregoire, a 5-7 defensive specialist from Monroe St. Mary's Catholic Central. She was a Class B All-State honorable mention pick after leading the Kestrels to the state quarterfinals.

■ Emily Marlow, a 5-11 setter/middle hitter from Carlton Airport where she was voted all Huron League and Class B honorable mention All-State.

■ Nicole Scharrer, a 5-11 outside hitter from Davison where she was voted team MVP and All-Big 9 Conference.

Abraham said he is close to signing 5-10 Heather Steinhelper, who played last season at Ferris State. Steinhelper, who already has been given a release from the Big Rapids school, played high school volleyball at Clarkston.

The addition of Toth, who led RU to the Mega Conference

White Division co-championship, may have been Abraham's biggest recruiting coup.

Toth drew lukewarm interest after sitting out her junior year following major knee surgery.

"Vicki has a lot of good skills and potential," the Madonna coach said. "She works hard and fits into our style of play. She has good hands and can attack."

Gregoire, meanwhile, impressed the coaches with her play earlier this year in the Madonna Tournament despite playing in only four games (suffering from the flu).

"She comes from an excellent high school program and was well coached by John Jewell," Abraham said. "She's an all-around player, but we look at her as a defensive specialist. She's a primary passer and we look for her to compete as a starting setter."

Gregoire, who plans to major in elementary education, carries a 3.6 grade-point average.

Marlow, who carries a 3.7 GPA, is another top-notch student-athlete.

"We hope to train her as a setter and she could compete for the starting setter position," Abraham said. "She has a lot of potential and has the tools to make the adjustment to college volleyball because she's a versatile player."

Scharrer becomes the third player from Davison to play at Madonna. She joins junior Marci Laurencelle and sophomore Kate Dunning.

"I like her, she's a big, strong kid and a powerful hitter," said the Madonna coach. "She's a big-time blocker and has the frame of a volleyball player that could dominate in the front row. I'm confident she can step in soon and become an impact player."

And not to be outdone, Scharrer also does well in the classroom, sporting a 3.7 GPA.

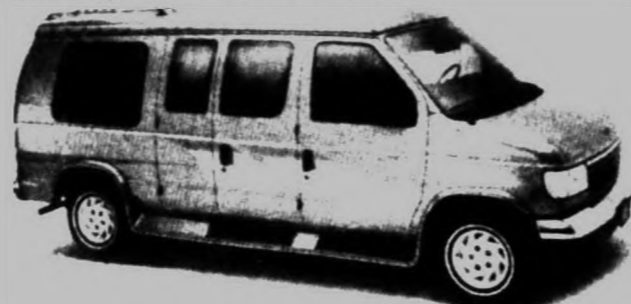

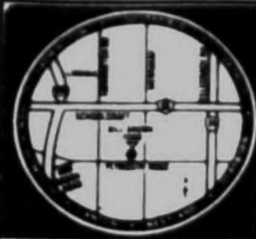

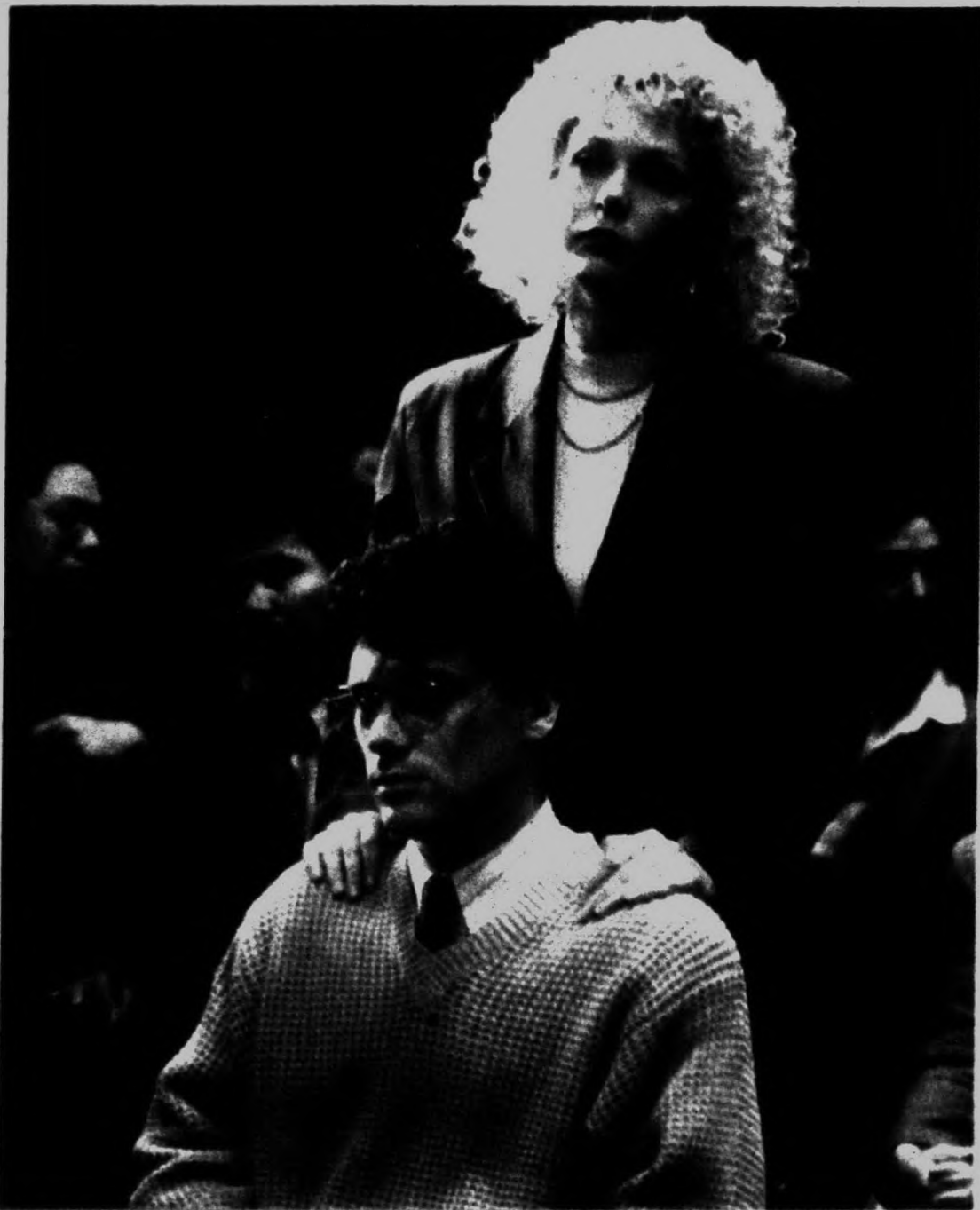

## Menendez miasma goes prime time in Fox's 'Honor'

What kind of commentary on American society is it when the best thing that can be said about a scandal-ridden, fact-based, made-for-television movie about sexual abuse, greed and premeditated murder is that it was entertaining?

Is society so jaded it must look incessantly to real-life misery for cheap thrills?

All things said and done, "Honor Thy Father and Mother: The True Story of the Menendez Murders," airing on Fox Monday, April 18, does no more to provide insight into the whys and wherefores of the Menendez murder case than three months of jury deliberations did in the real-life trial.

But at least it's entertaining.

Billy Warlock ("Baywatch") and newcomer David Beron star as the now-infamous siblings, Lyle and Erik Menendez, who murdered their parents, Jose and Kitty Menendez, on August 20, 1989.

"All I want is that this thing is entertaining," Warlock says. "Because I'll tell you, that's all we set out to do. You're not going to learn anything (from this movie) that you didn't already know."

Indeed.

Taken from trial transcripts, public records and the book "Blood Brothers" by John Johnson and Ronald L. Soble, "Honor Thy Father and Mother" begins on the night of the murders and dramatizes the events that led up to the arrests of Erick and Lyle.

Warlock and Beron do a fine job of delivering the personalities viewers of Court TV have come to expect from the Menendez brothers. Warlock especially locks on to a particular side of the angrier, more manipulative brother, Lyle.

"What I hope comes across," Warlock states, "and it was something that I don't think the script had in it, but it suggested, was that he very much admired and respected his father and wanted to follow in his father's footsteps. It just wasn't the strongest part of him."

The central question in the case, and by extension, the movie, was motive.

Did the Menendez brothers shoot their wealthy parents out of self-defense? They had threatened to go public with the sordid details of the years of sexual abuse their father made them endure, and they allegedly feared for their own safety.

Or did they just want the millions

of dollars they stood to inherit without having to wait?

The movie does make one decision clear for the viewer. James Farentino's portrayal of Jose Menendez is so horrific, so monstrous, that one feels little sympathy for the character when he gets offed.

Whether or not Farentino gives a fair or accurate representation of the Menendez patriarch is now a moot point at best, as Jose will never have a chance to defend himself.

"James made a choice," Warlock states, "and who am I to say. I don't know how Jose Menendez was. Some of the testimony I saw from his co-workers said that was exactly how he was. Then there were a few others that said, 'No, hey, he was a nice guy.'"

"We'll never know."

"I will say that James playing Jose scared the living bejeebies out of me," Warlock adds. "I mean, he's intense, man. Oh, is he intense."

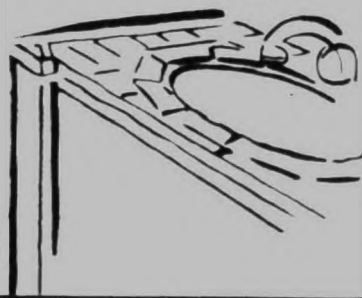

In 1964, Grant Tinker convinced Van Dyke that "My Mother the Car" was the perfect vehicle for his comedic skills. The show lasted only one season, but in the annals of comedy television, it has never been forgotten.

Other shows in which he starred include "Accidental Family," "Headmaster," "13 Queens Boulevard," and the miniseries "Fresno," alongside Carol Burnett and Dabney Coleman.

Van Dyke's feature film credits include "The Courtship of Eddie's Father," "Palm Springs Weekend," and "Run If You Can."

Currently, Van Dyke is a headliner in major showrooms in Atlantic City, N.J., and Lake Tahoe, Reno and Las Vegas, Nev.

He has received three Emmy nominations in the category of outstanding

supporting actor for his role as Luther Van Dam on "Coach."

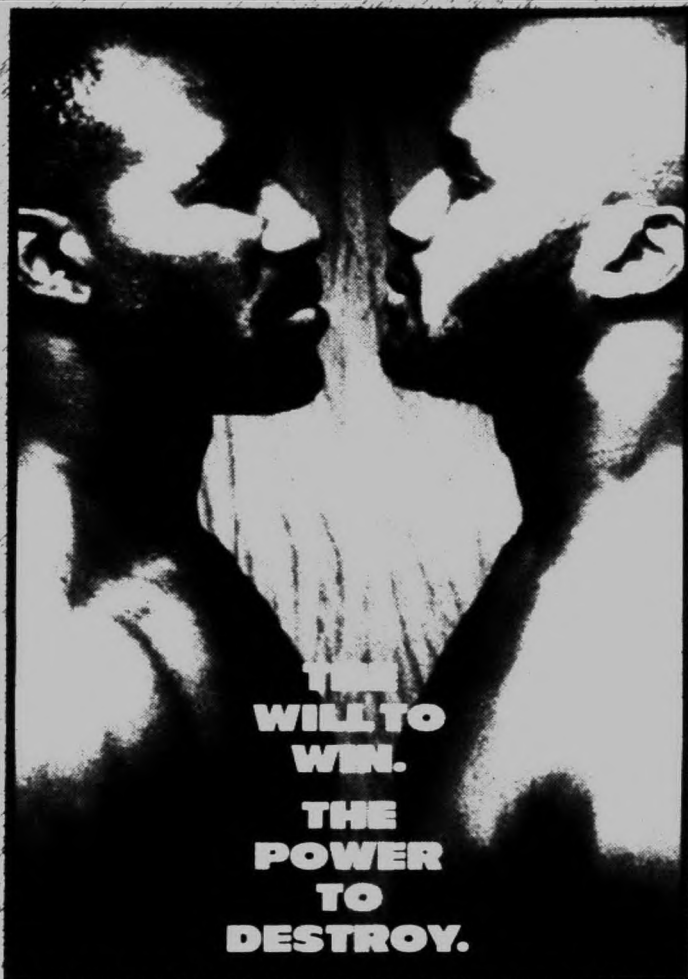
