Good dog, Molly! This year-old beagle sniffs out carpenter ants and termites for owner Tom Thompson, who operates Thompson Pest Control out of his Plymouth house.

"A lot of people are in disbelief

until we bring her in," Thompson said.

Molly, trained by Beacon Dogs Inc. of Annapolis, Md., begins sniffing along wood floors when Thompson tells her, "Search!"

Upon detecting the odor of termites or carpenter ants, she begins scratching the wood. "If it's a big

nest, she goes crazy," Thompson said.

The insects, which like to eat wood dampened by leaks the homeowner may not spot, can cause serious damage to a home. Thompson said a homeowner may not even

## Retiring educator will miss challenges

Things won't be the same when school opens this fall at Plymouth Township's Fiegel Elementary School. Missing will be a warm and caring teacher, Lois Santer, retiring after 22 years.

A 1956 graduate of Michigan State Normal, now Eastern Michigan Uni-

versity, Santer taught in Garden City public schools for two years before quitting to raise four children with her late husband, Tom.

She joined Plymouth-Canton Community Schools in 1975, and taught in the high schools' child care program as well as at Fiegel, where she's

## Church move prompts neighbors' complaints

Temple Baptist Church's plan to move from Redford to Plymouth Township drew more opposition from neighbors last week, and township officials put off a decision on the proposed move.

The Plymouth Township planning commission had been asked to approve the move by the church, known around Detroit for major programs at Christmas and Easter, and for scheduling concerts of touring Christian performers.

Plans call for two baseball fields, two large ponds, walking paths, benches, grassy areas, landscaping and a church that will seat 4,000 on 56 acres at the southwest corner of Ridge and North Territorial.

On May 23, more than 20 residents turned out

for a public hearing on the plan and five rose to challenge it. On Wednesday, about 100 people neighbors showed for the planning commission meeting.

Chairman Dennis Cebulski said most of the nearly 30 who addressed the commission spoke against the project, citing traffic and other activity at the planned church.

Charles Curmi, planning commissioner and township trustee, said the planning commission will now take time to study data on the development's likely impact on traffic, as that is a concern raised by several neighbors.

"There's a lot of traffic data being thrown around, but what does it mean?" said Curmi, add-

ing the township's planning consultant is being asked to study the effect on the area.

"We want to look at the (traffic) impact today, and when the area's fully developed," said Curmi.

There is some residential development near the church, and more is planned. The M-14 freeway is just west of the property.

Church officials say they plan to be a community asset, and say the public can use baseball fields and church grounds for recreation.

Cebulski said planning commissioners could rule on the church development as early as July 20, the next commission meeting.

## Signs create stir

Some candidates in the race for 35th District Judge are taking offense at others' campaign tactics:

■ Kevin Simowski and Dennis Shrewsbury question Ron Lowe's use of the slogan "criminals beware" on some of Lowe's yard signs.

■ Simowski maintains that some Lowe, Stephen Boak, Carol Levitte and Michael Gerou signs violate the sign ordinance, as the signs are larger than the ordinance specifies.

■ While at the Farmer's Market recently, Simowski said, a woman gave him a coupon for free coffee, doughnuts and lemonade at Boak's office across Kellogg Park. "What's next, kissing babies?" Simowski asked.

Also running are Maria Petito, Jacqueline George, Karen Woodside, Ed Zelmannski and Victoria Hariri; 11 in all running in an Aug. 2 primary.

The top two vote-getters will survive the primary and square off in the general election in November.

"I am sorely disappointed in the course the campaign for 35th District Court has taken thus far," Simowski wrote.

Shrewsbury, a Plymouth city commissioner, wrote to Lowe, Plymouth's city attorney, over Lowe's "criminals beware" slogan:

"It is my opinion, based upon reading the code of judicial conduct, that your lawn signs . . . are in violation of the code," Shrewsbury said.

Shrewsbury quoted a section of the code that states a judge should not "seek popularity or publicity either by exceptional severity or undue leniency" in sentencing.

"Please let me know how you intend to rectify this violation," Shrewsbury asked Lowe in the May 27 letter.

In a June 15 response, Lowe wrote, "The words 'criminals beware' are meant to communicate my general philosophy that convicted criminals should be punished . . . 'Criminals beware' simply communicates a cer-

Mr. Scott graduated from Redford High School in 1924 and from the University of Michigan in 1928. His lifelong business career included sales training for

terials to automobile dealers."

This pioneering venture, now known as Adistra Corporation, grew rapidly and in 1961 relocated to the vacant Daisy Air Rifle plant in Plymouth. Current production and warehouse operations are located in Northville, Dexter, and Southfield.

Mr. Scott was active in the Presbyterian Church and the Rotary Club. He is survived by sons, William P. Scott of Rogers City and John R. Scott of Petoskey; a daughter, Shirley J. McKeon of Plymouth; 14 grandchildren; and 25 great-grandchildren. Nellie G. Scott, his wife of 61 years, died in 1988.

## New Legion post being organized

Area veterans and members of The American Legion have joined together to start a new American Legion post in Plymouth Township.

"Over the past 48 years, Plymouth Township and the surrounding area has grown and developed quite quickly. So have the veteran population of these areas," said organizer Gary McCoy. "With this growth in mind, the Plymouth Township and surrounding area veterans not only deserve, but need, an American Legion post to associate with and call their own."

The American Legion, which celebrates its 75th anniversary this year, was founded on the principles of providing a veteran service organization full of camaraderie for its members; providing assistance to veterans, their widows and dependents through numerous American Legion programs; and a dedicated commitment to service to the community from which its members came.

"It will be in this same spirit that the new post will operate. Aware that as a new post, our initial membership and funding will be low, we will direct our attention to programs that directly benefit veterans and the community. In addition, we will make our manpower available to other organizations in the community, and of course, we will participate in patriotic observances, such as Memorial Day, Veterans Day, and Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day," added McCoy.

The new American Legion post will be named the Beasley-Zalesny American Legion Post. It is named after Morris F. Beasley, who, on Sept. 4, 1950, became missing in action and was subsequently declared dead while serving in Korea; and Harry F. Zalesny Jr., a helicopter pilot in Vietnam, who on Dec. 22, 1969 was shot down and killed while serving with the Army. Both servicemen were from the Plymouth-Canton community.

The newly forming American Legion post invites all veterans, including active duty personnel, reservists and merchant marines to join. Veterans joining the new Beasley-Zalesny Post at this time will be classified as charter members of the post.

## Fest organizers expect big crowds

Organizers anticipate larger crowds than ever before when the Third Annual Canton Liberty Fest with new and expanded activities gets underway June 24-26 in Heritage Park.

"If everything goes as expected and the weather is good, we are expecting bigger crowds," said Bob Dates of Canton Parks and Recreation Services.

The fest will kickoff at 7:30 p.m. Friday, June 24, at the park amphitheater with a free concert by Steve King and the Ditties performing oldies. "Everything else begins Saturday morning," Dates said.

Just before the concert, however, the public is invited to a special service scheduled at 5 p.m. to mark the first anniversary of the Canton Veterans Memorial dedication in Heritage Park.

"It will be the last hurrah of the

(Veterans Memorial) association," said chair John Spencer, township finance director. Responsibilities for the memorial will be given to the township.

While miniature golf won't be part of the three-day line-up, there will be a host of new and expanded activities for attendees, such as a fife and drum muster competition, a Civil War encampment, a Taste of Canton food festival, fun inflatables for kids to play on, as well as a new host — America's Most Wanted Car Club — for the popular Classic Car Show.

Saturday, the big festival day, will conclude with a fireworks show that drew about 25,000 visitors last year. This year's event will feature more fireworks and a longer show, Dates said. The show will be preceded with a performance by the 70th Division Army Band.

"We encourage those coming to the fireworks that if they want to get into the park they should arrive no later than 7 p.m." Dates said. Fireworks are expected to begin about 10 p.m. Parking is free.

In this election year, the Liberty Fest Committee has prohibited the distribution of campaign literature during the three-day event. The rule will apply to all candidates," Dates said.

Senior adults or other visitors who may have difficulty getting around Heritage Park may use a shuttle service, new this year.

Events that will entice visitors this year include a Saturday and Sunday line-up of performances at the amphitheater and gazebo; fine arts show, which is juried and includes art demonstrations; art workshops for kids, which allows them to take home projects; face painting; paddleboat rides on the park pond, concessions, a mini-

midway for kids 10 years of age and younger; Picnic in the Park, hosted by the Plymouth-Canton Drug Abuse Resistance Education board with food provided by the Outback Steakhouse; Taste of Canton, featuring area restaurants.

The Canton Chamber of Commerce will sell raffle tickets for a chance to win a four-day trip to Cancun. The chamber also will feature a new Business Expo. The Canton Historical Society will do the same for two winning raffles each for a quarter side of beef.

Community service and informational booths also will be set up. The Canton police and fire departments will display their equipment. A special rappelling demonstration is planned as is a demonstration by Canton's canine unit. The fire department will have the Children's Fire Safety House available.

## Police will crack down on seat belt law

The Plymouth Township Police want more people to buckle up and will be sending the message any way they can. As part of a campaign to encourage the motoring public to use their seat belts, officers will be enforcing the mandatory seat belt law as well as educating the public on the importance of buckling up.

Communities across the state will be involved in the campaign in an effort to increase the use of seat belts to 70 percent. Currently, 64.4 percent of the drivers in Michigan wear seat belts.

"We want the people of our

community as well as those who visit Plymouth Township to realize that using seat belts do in fact prevent injury and save lives," said Sgt. Antal.

"The old saying that accidents happen near home is true and that is why it is so important to remember to buckle up every time you drive or ride in a vehicle. As part of our campaign, the officers will be watching for drivers who do not wear their seat belts and we will have citations for those who do not wear them and small rewards for those who do."

Michigan law requires that all front seat passengers wear seat

belts, even in cars equipped with air bags.

Antal said air bags were designed to work with the seat belt, not to replace it. The law also states that infants up to one year must be in an approved child car seat. Children 1-4 years of age must be in safety belts if sitting in the back seat.

The Plymouth Township Police will be promoting the use of seat belts by installing signs to remind drivers to buckle up. We will also be available to speak at community meetings. Literature will also be available at the Plymouth Township Police Department. Area businesses are donating items to be given away to those who buckle up and think safety.



# Gray fox's arrival the talk of the neighborhood

It's no big deal to spot a squirrel, raccoon or opossum in your subdivision.

But a gray fox?

Along Gold Arbor street, just a few hundred yards north of Ann Arbor Road, some neighbors have spotted a gray fox - with three young.

Clint Stroebel first saw the fox June 10. "It's as tall as a sheltie but longer, with a big bushy tail," he explained.

"It was in our back yard and the neighbor's back yard; the pups were playing out in the flowers and the mama was watching," he said.

The appearance of the fox family has sparked discussion along the street. "It's not a red fox; it's gray - I think they're more rare," Stroebel said. They suspect the animals live to the west, in a wooded area near the Plymouth Elks hall.

Tim Payne of the state Department of Natural Resources said, "20 years ago it would be an extremely rare occurrence for a gray fox to be in southeast Michigan."

"It's an animal that is moving north and east," Payne said, adding gray foxes are now as common as red ones in this area.

On the fox's appearance in the subdivision, he said, "A lot of people think of Plymouth as residential, but if you just go outside of town . . . you've got some wild lands."

Payne said he had a chance to watch a gray fox closely last year, as one appeared outside his office

window at Seven Mile and Haggerty roads in Livonia.

He describes red foxes as "a little bit more aggressive" than red foxes. "They feed primarily on small animals, mice, rabbits; a little bit more of the vegetable matter, fruits and invertebrates than red foxes do," he said.

Payne said gray foxes pose no danger to humans, but may choose to attack a cat as prey.

While the animal may draw a comparison to a small dog, a closer look reveals it's no dog. "The tail is a giveaway," Stroebel said.

On June 11, the Austin family, which lives just north of Stroebel, got the animals on video.

"One of the fox cubs had made it over here to my back yard," Susan Austin said. The mother came over and they went across the street, she said.

The family cat was in the back yard at the time. "The cat and the fox looked at each other; they didn't do anything," she said.

"The neighbors saw them playing in the flowers like kittens or pups," Stroebel said. If people approached the pups, "They would keep a distance. The mother keeps an eye on you," he said.

Payne said because the gray fox has claws that are more hooked than the red fox, it can climb trees on an incline, which gives the animal its other name, tree fox.

"It really uses more of a wooded habitat than the red fox does," Payne said, adding a fox's young are called kits.

## Hearing planned

A public hearing on the Plymouth-Canton school budget is set for 7:30 p.m. Monday, June 27, at the E.J. McClendon Educational Center, 454 S. Harvey in Plymouth.

Board members Monday night discussed expenditures that possibly will be added to the district's \$85.8 million budget. By law, the district's 1994-95 budget must be passed by July 1.

Trustees agreed to spend up to \$300,000 on instructional materials. "It's not all we need, but it's a start," said trustee Sue Feiten. Board members also agreed to spend \$20,000 on assessment and \$37,000 on a fifth teacher for the Talented and Gifted program. Hiring more teachers and fewer para-professionals also was discussed.

The board is considering other additions to the budget. Included are expenditures to hire elementary counselors, a grant writer, marching band di-

rector, and educational aides; reduce class size; purchase curriculum center materials and equipment for the high schools' attendance office; fund transportation to the high school for the middle school orchestra; bolster the vocational education and summer school budgets; and fund the "school-within-a-school" proposed for the high schools.

Also budgeted is \$300,000 for "negotiations contingency." Recently-passed legislation that makes it illegal for teachers to strike won't be effective until March 1995.

The board hasn't yet decided whether to charge students to participate in sports and extracurricular activities.

A number of parents urged the board to hire a fifth teacher for the Talented and Gifted program. Smith Elementary School learning specialist Nancy Martinez pressed the board to hire learning specialists for the two new elementary schools opening in the fall.

## Schools look at ungraded program

A plan to merge grades K-3 and 3-5 in multilevel, ungraded classes was proposed to the board of education by Farrand Elementary School staff Monday night.

The program - funded by a grant and backed by Principal Ann Kuhn and seven Farrand teachers - would be voluntary for both students and teachers if approved by the board.

"It's a multi-age program that would be a learning community to use the best of the current research to be supportive of children and to provide them with opportunities in K-3 and 3-5," said Richard Egli, community relations director.

"It wouldn't be mandated. It would be permitted to grow based on voluntary support from both teachers and parents. There's a lot of teamwork and involvement of parents."

If adopted, the plan would be designed for a three-year period.

"If it got big enough, the district might want to set up a segment in every school or set up a program like TAG (Talented and Gifted)."

Kuhn expects there'll be more requests for enrollment than spaces available. "We will try to honor parents' requests, but we can't honor them all. We haven't committed to all parents. We've said we will do our best," she said.

Trustee Carl Battishill, a teacher in another district, said, "I would challenge teachers involved to discuss your concerns and responsibilities up front, rather than as a grievance."

Egli said the program will evolve. "It's not something we are going to do and say this is the end point. It's something where we are able to continually review what's best for the program."

Kuhn said one of the reasons for the program is to accommodate the different rates at

which students learn.

"Too often we see kids who can go far beyond where teachers are taking them. But given the structure we have, it can't be done. This provides a vehicle to take them far beyond. I see it benefiting both ends of the spectrum."

The school day would include time for journal writing, sharing, group reading, activities to apply learned concepts, reading, math, cooperative projects and review.

Board president Roland Thomas asked whether research and testing data were examined.

Teacher Deborah Greenwood said it's difficult to find effective testing instruments for young children. "We want to make sure what we are doing is good for kids. We prefer the portfolio. If we find something cheap, we will let you know."

Superintendent John Hoben said the program could lend itself to distance learning, perhaps via an interactive video

with Michigan State University, an idea he's exploring with educators there.

Parents spoke in favor of the idea.

"We endorse this," said Tom and Susan Porter. "The teachers involved have put a lot of time and effort into this."

Ron Lazzarini said "parents have been intimately involved from the beginning. We are monitoring what's going on. We have a vested interest in seeing this and hope it has a good chance to succeed."

Trustee Barbara Graham said, "The key is involvement of parents. The concept strikes me as one of the best keys we are going to have."

Trustee Sue Feiten said she hoped parents would continue to take part. "This is an interesting, exciting idea. I'll be involved."

Thomas said programs that "start at the bottom and work their way up are the most successful. I'm sure we'll have a positive result."

## New school superintendent attends first board meeting

Charles Little, who will take over as Plymouth-Canton Community Schools superintendent July 11, attended his first board meeting in the district Tuesday night.

Currently superintendent of Frontier Central Schools near Buffalo, Little sat at the board table, but didn't participate in the meeting.

Routinely, board members introduce themselves to the audience prior to each meeting. Little stated his name and said he's looking forward to becoming a resident of the community.

earned a reputation as an outstanding first-grade teacher.

"She lays the foundations, and she lays them well," said Fiegel principal Barbara Young. "We'd hoped to keep her a few more years. Lois has always been a champion for children. She's challenged us to look at what we were doing and how it was we were doing it."

September will find Santer volunteering in an elementary school, albeit many miles from here. "I'm moving back home to Newberry, in the Tahquamenon Valley in the Upper Peninsula," said Santer. "I'll be in there helping them open the elementary school."

A prime reason Santer is retiring is to spend time with her children and grandchildren. She's a big believer in being there when children are young, to help shape their minds and lives.

Daughter Laura has two young sons and is an entrepreneur in New Zealand. Daughter Amy McKaig is a lawyer in Dallas. Daughter Lisa Santer is a pediatrician at the University of Alabama, and son Kevin, father of a 6-month-old son, is an engineer who lives in Plymouth.

After biking through England

this summer with her sister, Santer plans to rent a home for three months next winter near her family in New Zealand.

"There's something really strong about appreciating your roots and your heritage. I think it brings us closer to real life," said Santer, whose parents were raised in lumber camps in the Upper Peninsula.

Santer and her husband, also active with youth, took their children for extended stays in the U.P. every summer. "The values there are different," said Santer. "In the suburbs, it's almost like being segregated. Everybody has wall-to-wall carpeting and buys the same thing, whereas up there, each home is different. You wonder what the story is. When you die, does the person with the biggest pile win?"

Santer's father and mother, whose parents homesteaded north of Newberry, had lots to be proud of. Neither went past sixth grade. "But six out of seven of us have college degrees," said Santer, who earned a second degree while her children were in school.

Santer, who also teaches parenting in Plymouth-Canton's community education program at Fiegel, shared some hard-won wisdom:

■ On parenting: "There are so many books written that parents are afraid to follow their instincts. I think it makes them hesitant, and not as free to follow common sense."

■ On poverty and low test scores: "It's not the lack of money. It's the lack of time spent with children that's doing it."

■ On high technology in the classroom: "I'd very frankly like to sell the closed circuit TV and telephone in my classroom and hire an aide so kids could have another warm body instead of a machine. Children have less and less time with their parents, they're in larger classrooms, and the teacher is more fragmented. In the early grades, children need someone to talk with them. I question whether we are losing the humanistic approach."

■ On developmental education: "Children need more one-on-one so we can take them from where they are and have them meet success."

Leaving Plymouth-Canton is bittersweet, said Santer, who one day last week was giving antiques away to relatives and friends.

"I will miss the children," she said.

## Momentum Canton playscape gains support

Plans for a volunteer-built wooden playscape in Heritage Park have gained momentum with financial support from Canton Township.

Township trustees agreed to give organizers of the Canton Community Playscape up to \$30,000 to hire an architect from the Leathers Company to work on the design for the playscape.

"Children, adults and teens take part in the design of the structure," said Canton resident Christine Donaldson, who has spearheaded the effort.

The play structures can be as small as 10,000 square feet or large as 20,000 square feet. Volunteers also raise money for the playscape, which can cost \$65,000-\$85,000. When materials are ready, volunteers put it together.

"We're getting a great community effort going here," said Canton resident Scott Lowes, representative organizer for Carpenter's District Council of Detroit and Southeastern Michigan. The carpenter's union has volunteered to help build the playscape.

Organizers have formed committees, such as public relations, volunteers and children. They will have a booth at the Liberty Fest June 25-26 where kids will be asked to suggest an official name for the playscape. Prizes, one of which will include a hand-painted shirt bearing the new name and logo, will be awarded.

Anyone who would like to join the effort is asked to call Donaldson, 397-5909, Jan Pickard, 416-9428, or Lynne Eckardt, 454-9745.

Township parks and recreation staff also will ask kids signed up in summer recreation and parks programs to develop designs for the structure.

"Canton lacks play equipment for toddlers and all children," Donaldson said, including an informal place for parents to gather with their children. "So

far, community support has been nothing but overwhelming."

Plans are to design the structure in the fall and build it in the spring or early summer with an unveiling at the 1995 annual Canton Liberty Fest.

The children's committee chaired by resident Michelle Hall said designs for the playscape will be gathered from kids. Information has been posted at area restaurants and the Friday night Rock 'N Bowl at the Super Bowl on Ford Road.

"We're also targeting the older child," Hall said. Approximately 50 kids of those who submitted their ideas will be invited to Design Day in September.

The Leathers Company has worked on similar structures in Livonia, Farmington Hills, Allen Park, Ann Arbor and Grosse Pointe. "If you follow this system very closely you will be successful," Donaldson said.

A fund-raiser for the playscape will be hosted by Fran Mintz of Jazercise 9-10:30 a.m. Saturday, July 9, in Heritage Park. All proceeds from the \$10 per person registration fee will be donated to the playscape. Before the fund-raiser, Mintz will demonstrate Jazercise at 3:30 p.m. Saturday, June 25, at the Liberty Fest.

McDonald's, Bob's of Canton, Meijer and Kroger have made donations of food and beverages for the fund-raiser.

Organizers will also have a meeting Thursday, July 21, in the south pavilion at Heritage Park near the site where the playscape is planned. "Bring a picnic, bring your families," Donaldson said.


## Summer art programs offered

spot one ant or termite, yet a whole nest can exist right under his or her feet.

While pest control firms typically return monthly to spray chemicals to head off the problem, he said using Molly cuts down on chemical use — and some customers favor that approach.

After spotting an ad in a trade magazine, Thompson looked into Beacon Dogs. In Maryland, he underwent 10 days of training himself, to learn how to use Molly, who cost \$10,000.

By a licensing agreement with the firm, Thompson is the sole

pest control businessman in a several-county area able to offer the dog-detecting service.

To demonstrate Molly's detecting ability, Thompson scatters pieces of wood and other objects along a line about 30 yards long in his backyard.

After placing just a few termites and carpenter ants in closed containers underneath a few objects, he drags a pointer along the line and Molly follows on a leash as he repeats the command, "Search!"

Even though the test run involves just a few of the insects, Molly is able to find them. She demonstrates this by scratching at the ground where the containers have been randomly placed.

"Good girl! Good girl," Thompson says, giving her a small treat each time she detects the pests, as per Molly's training.

Why a beagle, and not another breed of dog? "Hounds all have good sensory processes, they seem to have a lot bigger response," Thompson said.

By the agreement with Beacon Dogs Inc., someone from the firm comes to Thompson's home every few years to make sure the dog is still in top training.



## Wolfberg ready for his make-up

A not-so-funny thing happened to Dennis Wolfberg on the way to the forum . . . I mean Royal Oak Music Theatre for a sold-out May 4 performance. He broke his hip.

It all happened in a hotel room in Charlotte, N.C., where Wolfberg was getting ready for a performance.

"I had been booked to play for the Jewish community there," Wolfberg deadpanned. "I guess all three of them were invited."

After taking the painful spill that caused the injury, Wolfberg struggled for 25 minutes before reaching the phone.

"The one thing that was going through my mind at the time was whether the honor bar in the room had morphine in it," Wolfberg said.

Wolfberg spent a few weeks off his feet at home in Los Angeles recuperating, needless to say, before returning to the road two weekends ago in Seattle. Of course, the whole experience has provided him with a wealth of new material.

"If my pain can benefit people in some way by making them laugh, then it's all been worth it," Wolfberg said.

Ironically, if there was anything that moved Wolfberg in the direction of comedy, it was fear of pain. A native New Yorker, he was a sixth grade teacher in public school in the South Bronx for 12 years. The area was so bad even Mother Teresa referred to it as a "hellhole," Wolfberg joked. "You've seen the clips of D-Day all over television recently. Think of my teaching experience as a daily D-Day. It was relentlessly challenging. You reach some kids, and others you don't, but you give it a good try."

"By the time a lot of these kids reach the sixth grade, they're already beyond helping."

Wolfberg had five goals — he called them fantasies — when he started doing standup comedy, and he's already achieved all five. The final one was reached when Wolfberg won the Best Male Comic category at the American Comedy Awards a couple years ago.

"In no particular order, the first fantasy was to be able to travel the country and entertain people — and get paid for it," Wolfberg said. "Number two was to be able to play a place called the Westbury Music Fair, which was five minutes from the house I grew up in."

"Number three was to play Las Vegas, which years ago was the culmination of comedy club success. Number four was to do 'The Tonight Show,' and five was to win an Oscar."

The Oscar was the last one — and an unlikely one, Wolfberg admitted. But the American Comedy Awards are presented at the Shrine Theatre in Los Angeles, are televised by ABC, and have the same format.

## Ball, Burns bring blues to Frog Island

"I woke up to one of those steady tropical rains this morning," Marcia Ball related by phone from her Austin, Texas, home last week. "Now it's a sauna."

Ball knows a lot about heat, particularly the injection of it in performance. One of the premier boogie pianist/vocalists in the country, she's guaranteed to add a few degrees to the Frog Island Music Festival, the annual rite of summer set for Ypsilanti's Depot Town this weekend. Outside of Katie Webster, who Ball calls "the Godmother I'd never known before," and whose Lake Charles, La., home is 20 miles from Ball's Vinton birthplace, the list of truly incendiary female pianists is a short one. That she's in such constant demand is no surprise.

And with a new CD to promote, her first in five years, this appearance promises to be a major treat.

"It's in the can," she said of the new Rounder CD, to be entitled

"Blue House."

Expected to be out in August, there will be a few new stylistic things to grab the ear on "Blue House," but not anything too radical, she promised.

On the subject of the blues, legendary Detroit bluesman Eddie Burns, making an all-too-rare local appearance, is sure to be one of the highlights of the weekend.

As much as the blues enjoying its most substantial popularity in years, Burns is proof positive that, as with all manner of U.S. pop culture, blues is far more appreciated across the oceans. Just back from a tour that took him to Norway, Sweden, Denmark and Finland ("It was the first time I'd played Helsinki in 25 years"), he has some pretty harsh thoughts on the local blues scene that has turned its back on many of the players that put Detroit on the musical map.

"It's all rock'n'roll and rockabilly; it's a joke," he said. "I played here when they were playing blues. Now,

it's all dog-eat-dog. The people who deserve the right money aren't getting it."

The internationally renowned guitarist/vocalist knows where he speaks.

Born in Belzoni, Miss., in 1928, it was as a 20-year-old that he first came to Detroit.

Stranded in Iowa with his guitar-playing compatriot, John T. Smith ("I was a harmonica player. Wasn't no clubs to play in Waterloo, so we played on street corners and at house parties."), they met a woman, visiting a relative from Detroit. In short order, she convinced Smith that Detroit was a much more happening town, and the two of them convinced Burns of the same.

When they first hit town, Hastings Street and Black Bottom, the birthplace of the local blues scene "were already happening." Within a couple of weeks, he met John Lee Hooker, and his life was changed.

In addition to years of work with Hooker, including playing guitar on the "Let's Go Out Tonight" LP with Willie Dixon and

Fred Below as well as on Hooker's classic version of "One Bourbon, One Scotch, One Beer," (which can be found just in front of Burns' own "Jinglin' Baby" on the four-CD "Chess Blues" boxed set), Burns was an early Motown artist. He'll bring Motown session aces Joe Hunter and Frank Bryant along for the Frog Island appearance.

Burns has a relatively new disc out, too. Entitled "Detroit," it's available on the Evidence label. He also has one of the standout

cuts on the "Blues Factory, Vol. 1" compilation, entitled "Don't Let Money Change You."

He's more excited about the next project, though.

"I'm ready for one now, if I get a good deal," he said. "I've got a whole album, or I guess CD, cut now. It's quite different from what I've been doing."


After auditioning for the part, Wolfberg was in Detroit for shows at Mark Ridley's Comedy Castle, when his wife called with good news and bad news.

ment size. As of April 1994, there are Do Something funds in Newark, N.J., Boston, Mass., and Selma, Ala.



"Eleven years ago, when I was 24 years old, I decided to go into the fine jewelry business for myself because working for an established jewelry company, Charles Warren, I didn't have the opportunity to be as creative as I wanted to be. I used my credentials and experience from Warren's as the opportunity to go it alone. I've been growing steadily ever since and most of my business is with repeat customers."

Meyer decided to name her company Amalgamations, from the verb *amalgamate*, to unite or combine complementary materi-

als. That's her design style, combining precious and semi-precious stones with unique components from around the world using custom 14K gold and sterling silver, both antique and contemporary.

Meyer's creations are not faddish, but classic and fashionable. The price range is \$250 to \$3,600. Following her precise sketches, a close-knit staff of three creates one-of-a-kind necklaces and earrings using amber, garnets, turquoise, peridots, jade, tapis, pearls and onyx.

"I offer the discriminating

jewelry lover value," Meyer explained. "I'm a wholesaler in beads. I buy my own components from all over the world. The way I string them produces a fashion look, a rich look, but without the high price tag. I love to use color. I love to combine black with color."

Meyer graduated from Troy High School, taking every art class available, including metalsmithing, pottery and macrame. She said her jewelry career grew out of an appreciation for beautiful jewelry, her desire to work with her hands and the fact she was "not good at drawing or

painting."

# Compromise is needed on high ed budget bills

In dollar terms, the state House and Senate budget bills for public universities look alike — \$1.36 billion for the next fiscal year.

"There are many differences," said Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek, as he asked the Senate to reject the House version and send the bill to a conference committee.

Senators voted overwhelmingly to reject the House version. A panel of three senators and four representatives will spend the next week working out a compromise that can survive possible line-item vetoes by Gov. John Engler.

Senate Bill 986 aids 15 state universities and colleges. The universities also charge tuition, obtain federal grants and raise private contributions.

Some of the differences:

- Tuition restraint. The House asked universities not to increase resident undergraduate tuition and fees more than the rate of inflation. Engler and the Senate wanted to delete it.
- Caps on nonresident enrollments. The Legislature said its intent is that nonresident enrollments be limited to 30 percent of the total. Engler wanted to delete it.
- Moratorium on off-campus expansions. The Senate asked a one-year moratorium on ex-

pansion of off-campus academic programs by public universities. Neither Engler nor the House wanted it.

■ A "one-time" funding adjustment for universities getting less than \$3,500 per full-time equivalent student (FTE). Affected would be Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan, University of Michigan's Dearborn and Flint campuses and Grand Valley State University. Engler recommended \$8.48 million, the Senate \$8.2 million, the House \$9.3 million.

■ University inflation increases. Engler recommended 2.27 percent across the board after the "one-time" adjustment. The Senate voted 2.3 percent. The House also voted 2.3 percent but applied the adjustment to the King-Chavez-Parks aid programs for minorities.

■ Research Excellence Fund. Engler recommended dropping it, and the Senate concurred. The House appropriated \$28.5 million, same as last year.

Senate favors increasing higher ed appropriations "to the extent possible" depending on results of the next consensus revenue conference. Engler did not recommend it, and the House did not include it.

■ "Buy American." Engler recommended deleting a section that prohibits use of state funds for purchase of foreign goods when competitively priced American goods are available. Both Senate and House voted to keep it.

■ Research Excellence Fund. Engler recommended dropping it, and the Senate concurred. The House appropriated \$28.5 million, same as last year.

■ Resident tuition rates for children of economically disadvantaged parents. The Legislature expressed its intent that universities charge resident tuition rates for children whose parents transferred to Michigan because of a plant closing in another state. Engler wanted to cut it.

Both chambers agreed on:

- A 14.8 percent increase in the Indian tuition waiver program — to \$400,000. It will provide funds for 2,500 tuition waivers versus 2,375 for the current year.
- A 27 percent increase in the high school completion/tuition incentive program (TIP), to provide \$1.9 million in tuition payments for 6,750 eligible students.

Half of suburban retirees will get little help from a \$70 million tax break for pensions passed by the state House of Representatives.

"Over one-half of Michigan seniors do not have public or private pensions," said Rep. Barbara Dobb, R-Union Lake, who came 14 votes short in an effort to extend the break to those living on investment income.

Dobb, an accountant in private life, said she studied U.S. Census data before concluding that many retirees across the country have no pensions.

"Many of these individuals are small business owners or self-employed," she said, "and have not had the option of joining a pension plan. They have worked hard to secure retirement income. It is grossly unfair to cut them off from discussions as the Legislature works to exempt private pensions from taxation."

The tax cut bill, as passed and sent to the Senate, would allow seniors who have no pension exemption to deduct investment income (dividends and interest) of up to \$1,000 for individuals and \$2,000 for couples filing jointly.

Dobb's amendment would have hiked the investment income deduction to \$5,000 a couple, including capital gains as well as dividends and interest. "More than 90 percent of the (retiree) population would have been covered under this provision," she said.

emption on private pensions, or apply the tax to governmental pensions, notably those of unionized teachers.

Second, the state general fund appears to be heading for a \$400 million surplus. Lawmakers must either cut taxes or salt away the surplus in a "rainy day" fund.

One negative vote came from Rep. Don Gilmer, R-Augusta, co-chair of the House Appropriations Committee, who said the excess should have been put in the rainy day fund. "This bill is about 99 percent political and one percent policy," Gilmer said.

Altogether, the House voted \$155 million in tax cuts — \$70 million for pensioners and \$85 million for single business tax (SBT) payers.

Some adjustment is necessary because the Headlee amendment to the Michigan Constitution caps the percentage of personal incomes that may be collected by state taxes. Michigan was about to exceed that by \$180 million.

There was no shortage of ideas for using the surplus.

Gov. John Engler wanted to end the inequity of tax treatment between governmental and private pensions.

Rep. Deborah Whyman, R-Canton, proposed a bill to lower the personal income tax rate from 4.4 to 4.3 percent.

Sen. Jim Berryman, D-Adrian, suggested prefunding health benefits for the teachers retirement fund.

## Local program explores trade options in Vietnam

Those interested in learning about trade and investment opportunities in Vietnam will get a firsthand account on Tuesday and Wednesday, June 28 and 29, when Vietnam's Ambassador to the United Nations, Le Van Bang, visits the suburban Detroit area.

The Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with the Wayne State University Center for Peace and Conflict Studies is sponsoring the events, accord-

ing to Birmingham resident Lynn Partington, program organizer.

The U.S. government recently lifted its trade embargo against Vietnam, allowing the American business community to invest in that country.

On June 28 a reception for the ambassador is planned 5:30-7:30 p.m. in the Ritz-Carlton in Dearborn. Cost is \$20. The Ritz is on Southfield Road on the southeast end of the Fairlane shopping complex.

The June 29 event is at Troy's Northfield Hilton on Crooks Road. The day will begin at noon with a luncheon and address by the ambassador. That is followed by a seminar conducted by Vietnam's trade minister, Doan Van Ban. Participating on that panel will be Birmingham businessman John Lynch, president of Lynch & Associates.

Lynch frequently travels to Vietnam, acting as an intermedi-

ary for businesses that are seeking to build relationships with the Vietnamese government.

The cost of the June 29 event is \$35 for the lunch and seminar. Those only able to attend the lunch pay \$20.

The ambassador is visiting Detroit because of its long history of manufacturing expertise, according to Partington.

Vietnam, a country's whose infrastructure is in disrepair after years of war, the economic embargo and a population boom, is in need of business expertise in most areas. Health care, telecommunications, computers, auto parts, law/accounting/banking services and tourism are among those areas which have potential for success in Vietnam.

Vietnam's population now stands at more than 70 million.

## Senate OKs amendments to 'pain management' bills

# House votes to release files on post office probe

**Here's how Observer & Eccentric-area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes in the week ending June 10**

**HOUSE**

**Post Office Probe:** The House voted 399 for and two against to publicly release the files of an internal investigation into alleged criminality at the House Post Office. U.S. Attorney Eric Holder no longer objects to the release, now that he has secured an indictment of Rep. Dan Rostenkowski, D-Ill., a figure in the post office scandal that erupted two years ago.

The material, which includes the testimony of dozens of witnesses, was gathered by a House task force as a preliminary step toward a possible Ethics Committee probe

into reports of misconduct, such as drug sales and embezzlement at the post office.

Supporter Scott Klug, R-Wis., said: "Today we are finally going to open up our files and let the American public know what an absolute open sewer the House Post Office operation really was. It's shoddy, embarrassing operation . . . has already led to the indictment of nine employees of the House of Representatives and guilty pleas" in addition to the Rostenkowski indictment.

Opponent Al Swift, D-Wash., said that because witnesses had been promised anonymity, "we will break our word to some of those in this institution least able to object and protect themselves. We will do it for high-sounding reasons, or ruthless political advantage, or craven political cowardice, take your pick. But when we do it, make no mistake, we will dishonor ourselves and this grand institution."

A yes vote was to release post

**Defense Budget:** By a vote of 260 for and 158 against, the House passed a FY '95 defense budget of \$262.27 billion, up slightly over military spending in the current fiscal year. The bill (HR 4301) was sent to the Senate.

The legislation provides \$3.7 billion for building the Navy a CVN-76 nuclear-powered aircraft carrier and \$2.7 billion for strengthening theater-based defenses against incoming missiles, among other major weapons purchases. It funds a 2.6 percent military pay raise for active duty and reserve personnel, reduces active duty strength by 86,000 slots to a 1.5 million troop

level, and reduces reserve ceilings slightly to 987,000 positions.

It authorizes a \$300 million American contribution to United Nations peacekeeping operations, \$11.1 billion for environmental cleanup at military bases and \$3.6 billion to help defense-dependent industries and communities convert to a civilian economy, among thousands of other provisions.

A yes vote was to pass the FY '95 defense authorization bill. **Area representatives voting yes were:** Bob Carr, Dale Kildee, Sander Levin, William Ford. **Voting no:** Joseph Knollenberg.

**Bosnia:** By a vote of 244 for and 178 against, the House adopted an amendment to HR 4301 (above) authorizing President Clinton to send up to \$200 million in arms to Bosnian Muslims. To do so, we would have to disobey the United Nations ban on arming the former Yugoslavia, an embargo the

administration has supported. The Senate has called upon the administration to begin arming the out-gunned Muslim militia in their war against Serbs and Croats.

A yes vote was to send American arms immediately to Bosnian Muslims. **Area representatives voting yes were:** Carr, Levin, Ford. **Voting no:** Kildee, Knollenberg.

**AIDS:** The House adopted, 227 for and 192 against, an amendment giving the military, not Congress, authority to determine whether to discharge those in uniform who test positive for AIDS or have some other serious but not yet debilitating illness. The amendment continues the autonomy of each service to retain individuals who are still judged fit for duty despite their ailment. The vote headed off Armed Services Committee language in HR 4301 (above) to virtually require the discharge of AIDS-infected service personnel.

A yes vote supported a more discretionary policy toward military personnel who have the AIDS virus. **Area representatives voting yes were:** Kildee, Levin, Ford. **Voting no:** Carr, Knollenberg.

# Schoolcraft graduate eager to get down to business

Erin Sheehan-Silveira, a 35-year-old Redford mother of two young daughters, can't wait to get off of welfare and start working again. And now that she has a college degree, Silveira hopes to get back to work real soon.

Silveira began receiving Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits about four years ago, shortly after enrolling at Schoolcraft College in Livonia.

The monthly AFDC benefits, including about \$400 in checks plus another \$180 in food stamps, helped pay for food, shelter and utility bills while Silveira went to school full time.

Although AFDC benefits helped her get through four years of college, Silveira has mixed emotions about the welfare program, which was not a pleasant experience for her.

"Life didn't get much easier on ADC," Silveira said Monday during an interview in her northeast Redford Township house. "It was horrible, and I didn't want to tell anyone about it. ADC personnel made me feel like dirt, and when I wanted to get a job, they told me to go home and wait for the checks like everyone else. I think ADC recipients should work or go to school."

Silveira is not real comfortable being called an AFDC success story as her sister, Margaret Lapinski of Waterford, did in a letter to the Redford Observer. But Silveira said she is grateful for the benefits that helped her get through college.

"ADC kept us in house and

home. I've been able to live four years and go to school on the system.

"But I don't want to stay on ADC, and I'll quit on the day someone says 'you're hired,' and I have a real job to pay the bills," Silveira said. "I'm not proud about being on ADC, but I've learned I'm not less of a person because I receive welfare. I had to go on ADC to improve myself."

"I could live the rest of my life on ADC if I wanted to; I think they'd probably let me. But I want a job. I can't ever remember not working."

"I'm actively looking for full-time employment," Silveira said. "I would like to some day work for a small business as an office manager. I may even run for township office one day."

## Troubles begin

Silveira's world came crashing down around her in the late 1980s, when her marriage crumbled and she divorced her husband of five years.

Raised in Detroit, Silveira moved to Grand Rapids to live with her husband but, after the divorce, wanted to move close to her parents in Farmington Hills.

Silveira got a job in Plymouth where she worked for about a year, but was fired in August 1989. "I did my job and I did a good job, but I didn't like the way they did business and they didn't like me. I wouldn't quit because I needed the job."

But after Silveira was discharged, she couldn't find another job that would support her and the two children, Annette, 9, and Amy, 7.

"I went back to school because I didn't know what else to do to support my children," Silveira said. "I knew I wouldn't find anything without a college degree."

## Earned honors

She didn't just squeak through. Silveira has been a member of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society for academic excellence since 1991 and graduated magna cum laude Saturday from Cleary College in Ypsilanti with a bachelor's degree in business administration.

Initially, Silveira had no idea what to study. But she recalled an accounting class she enjoyed in her second or third semester at Schoolcraft College and she eventually received an associate's degree in accounting from Schoolcraft in 1992.

Silveira then enrolled at Cleary, a business-oriented college, and earned her four-year degree in just two years, she said.

"She sacrificed a lot to get her degree and it's a tremendous accomplishment for her," Silveira's father, Tom Sheehan, said. "She worked hard at her marriage, and after her divorce, she was devastated. It was hard for her to go for welfare, but I told her to bite the bullet and try going to college. We all think she did a terrific job in school and that lifted her spirits. Now, she has to make it pay off."

Silveira admits that as a homeowner she's not the typical AFDC recipient. Federal Pell grants, which are available to low-income families and don't have to be repaid, funded her college education.

Her family helped with the house payments.

She had a lot of help from family and people in the neighborhood where she lives.

In addition to her own education, Silveira has gotten involved in school programs at Keeler Elementary, where her daughters are in the second and third grades. They recently marched in Redford's annual Memorial Day parade for being named outstanding citizens at Keeler.

"I went to watch them and I cried," Silveira said.


She said her proud family is making a "big deal" over her college graduation.

"They're having a big shindig at Proud Lake. One of my sisters (Maureen Heimsath) is coming in from Texas with her family, and another sister (Eileen Scott) is coming from Ohio with her family."

Silveira also has two brothers living in Livonia.

# Hospital plans reorganization

To cut projected losses, St. Mary Hospital has launched a major reorganization which eliminates several top jobs and which brings in a new management team from Royal Oak's William Beaumont Hospital.

Sister Mary Modesta, president and chief executive officer of St. Mary Hospital, announced the restructuring of its management team in a June 1 memo to department heads.

"Changes in the health care environment continue to increase the pressure for reduced reimbursement," Modesta wrote. "These pressures have resulted in a projected loss for St. Mary Hospital for fiscal year 1994 and this has created the need for a cost-reduction initiative."

"Management restructuring is a major component of this cost-reduction initiative."

As part of the restructuring, the hospital eliminated the position of vice president. This includes

vice president of finance, vice president of nursing, and vice-president of physician recruitment.

Hospital spokeswoman Julie Sprout said most employees in the eliminated positions have been reassigned to other jobs in the St. Mary/Beaumont organization.

On July 1, the new management team from Beaumont Hospital comes on board. The new executive team includes John Graham, hospital director; Michele Chulick, associate hospital director and director of operations; and Michael DeRubeis, associate hospital director and chief financial officer.

"Our new management structure and partnership with Beaumont will position St. Mary to accomplish its goals of becoming the provider of choice for the residents of Livonia and the surrounding communities," Modesta said.

Graham, Chulick and DeRubeis join the St. Mary administra-

tive team of: Modesta; Sister Mary Renetta, executive vice-president and chief operating officer; Mitchell Salhaney, M.D., executive vice president, medical affairs; and Sister Mary Cynthia Ann, associate hospital director, mission effectiveness and community services.

To cut costs, the hospital is only doing what so many other businesses and organizations have been forced to do, Sprout said.

"Reorganization is different for every organization; we restructured our management team," Sprout said. "We're bringing in new people with fresh ideas, and we'll know more when the new team comes in. Departments may be consolidated. With health care reform on the brink of being passed, we need to wait and see what comes down."

Not getting back from insurance companies what is billed by doctors has contributed to this year's projected loss, Sprout said. "We have to absorb the differ-

ence. In a smaller hospital this becomes more difficult."

Since 1992, St. Mary Hospital has been affiliated with Beaumont Hospital. Through the affiliation, the two hospitals have done the following:

■ Established at St. Mary a department of trained and board-certified emergency medicine physicians.

■ Coordinated a St. Mary campus development program to design and construct an addition to include 10 maternity rooms, a wom-

en's center, a surgical suite, and an enhanced emergency center.

■ Strengthened Beaumont through the referral of patients for specialized procedures.

One major goal of the new management team will be to "streamline programs to avoid duplication," Sprout said.

The reorganization, Sprout said, will not affect patient care.

### Making homemade jam has never been easier

Momma never was a proponent of canning. She relied on stocking the fruit cellar with donations from Aunt Vicki, her cousin Josephine Wisner, and whatever she could pick up at the church fair.

If memory serves me correctly, the straw that broke the camel's back was in 1957 when Uncle Eddie noticed a small spot of mold where the paraffin didn't set up against a jar of momma's strawberry preserves. I can't recall who was hurt more, Uncle Eddie when momma threw the jar lid at him or momma's pride.

"Times have changed," said C.J. Hacker, National Consumer Affairs director and staff home economist for Kerr Glass Manufacturing. "Paraffin was an acceptable sealant back then, but now paraffin is no longer recommended for sealing jams and jellies because air can get in around the edges and cause spoilage."

**Canning tips**  
Hacker recommends that all jams and jellies be processed in a boiling water canner for five minutes. If you have an exceptionally large freezer or access to a deep freeze, and the day is as hot as it is long, Hacker suggests making freezer jam. It's a little known fact that canning jars and lids can be used in home freezing.

"Canning jars retain the highest quality in frozen foods, prevent drying out, mingling of odors and help preserve food value, color and texture," he said. Now is the time to "put up" a batch of Michigan strawberries to enjoy this winter.

The folks at Kerr have compiled a sheet of jam and jelly tips that's free for the asking. This information sheet explains all there is to know about "weeping" (when fruits separate), sugaring, pectin and how to test for true doneness.

One of the questions I asked, which wasn't on the information sheet, was "what's the difference between jam and jelly?"

Hacker claims the difference is "jelly is cooked to the jam stage and then cooked a bit longer until the temperature increases by eight degrees."

I made a long distance call to momma's Cousin Josephine in St. Mary's, Pa., and she agreed with Hacker.

Cousin Josephine claims the additional cooking helps make jelly sparkling and clear. When turned out onto a dish, jelly should hold its shape slightly, and have a little quiver to it.

#### Expert advice

Cousin Josephine should know as she has been the official jelly judge at the church fair every year for the past 27 years. She ended our conversation with "don't forget to tell them that a good jelly is one that you can cut with a spoon, but is still spreadable."

Making good jam or jelly has never been easier, especially with the availability of prepackaged fruit pectins which, when the directions are followed precisely, give a remarkable jelly.

Health-conscious folks who know that a good jelly is half fruit and half sugar can drastically reduce, and almost eliminate sugar, with natural fruit pectins. These are readily available wherever canning supplies are sold, and at health and natural grocery stores. Successful canners swear by a mixture of three-quarters ripe fruit to one-quarter underripe fruit for optimum results.

Pick up a box of jars, seals and lids and you're on your way! As with anything canned or preserved, always sterilize the jars first. Successful canners say the jars should be "as warm as you can stand it, and as dry as possible."

A quick glance at some freezing and canning cookbooks at the local library suggested that when making jams and jellies, you should always work in single batches, and never double the recipe.

The folks at Kerr Glass say that "any season is canning season." A copy of "the New American Cookbook" by Lilly Haxworth Wallace (Copyright 1942, Books Inc.) says that canning season starts "when gentle spring breezes brush the purple iris." Since the iris is presently in full bloom in the Janes Gang garden, this must be the time.

Momma says she can't wait for a taste from my first jar of jam. She promises to greet me at the door with a pan of piping hot biscuits.

# STRAWBERRIES are ripe for picking

■ There's no finer way to spend a morning than picking dew-sprinkled, sweet, juicy Michigan strawberries with your family.

Some things are worth waiting for. Michigan strawberries definitely fall into that category.


"The 1994 strawberry crop is shaping up to be a good one in Southeast Michigan," said Rob Long of Long Family Orchard and Farm in Commerce Township. "The cool nights that we experienced during most of May have moved the season back a bit. At our farm, I expect to start u-pick strawberries around June 20. It's a late season, but I think it will be a long season."

Other farmers I talked to agreed, and said the berries looked and tasted good. "They're real juicy," said Rose Timbers of Wiard's Orchards in Ypsilanti.

Michigan's strawberry season is short, only three to four weeks. By the middle of July they'll be gone, so get them now while you can. Prices range from \$75 cents to \$1 a pound. One quart of strawberries equals about one-and-a-half pounds.

It's fun to gather the family and head out to the berry patch. Nobody minds if you sneak a few to eat while you're picking. Always call ahead to check the availability of strawberries before

ous consideration among premium wine circles. In 1991, the renowned wine author Hugh Johnson wrote, "It is presumably a matter of a very few years before we see wines as excellent as Australia's bearing the bizarre Dutch names of lovely estates in Stellenbosch and Franschoek." The time has come, and such wines are available for your enjoyment.

And yes, they carry the "bizarre" names of Backberg, Boschendal, De Wetshof, Groot Constantia, Rust en Vrede, Vriesenhof and Weltevreden. There are new regions to learn such as Stellenbosch and Franschoek, but they are joined by Constantia, Pearl and Robertson for starters. Then, there's pinotage, South Africa's own varietal. There's a lot to learn and a host of good drinking at reasonable prices ahead for those willing to expand their wine-tasting horizons.

The coastal Cape regions of South Africa offer a plethora of advantages and nearly idyllic wine-growing conditions. It is one of the most reliable wine-growing areas in the world.

Anywhere in the world, grapes from vines grown on slopes make better wine. Slopes in the Cape region face in all directions. An eight-month

## Tasting South African wines

Over the past several months, we have sampled a significant number of South African wines. They have, in general, been very good. They are available in this market. If your retailer does not have them, ask that they be ordered for you. We are recommending our favorites, but you should try others and discover what you like.

• 1992 Boschendal Sauvignon Blanc, Paarl (\$10) has inviting grapefruit and gooseberry aromas. Its crisp, clean, fresh, lengthy flavors make it a superior complement to grilled seafood.

• 1992 Backsberg Sauvignon Blanc, Paarl (\$8.50) showcases floral and tropical fruit. This wine tastes just like it smells. Citrusy crispness matches it to seafood, especially crab.

• 1991 Boschendal Chardonnay, Paarl (\$16) is very buttery. The tastes of sweet creamy butter with oak, tropical fruit elements and a smooth creamy finish are begging to be paired with lobster tail or lobster salad.

• 1992 Neil Ellis Chardonnay, Stellenbosch (\$15) is a knockout. Fragrant, spicy oak is well integrated with generous fruit to deliver a delicious, elegant and complex palate impression. Serve it with a broiled veal chop and be pleasantly surprised.

• 1990 Springbok Pinotage (\$8) will be best appreciated by those preferring a light red wine. It's soft with berry, jammy flavors and a hint of peppery spice.

• 1990 Backsberg Pinotage (\$9.50) is a fuller, more complex version of the varietal with berry fruit and bay and mint spiciness. It's rather rustic finish complements grilled meats.

• 1989 Vriesenhof Kalista, Stellenbosch (\$16.50) is a proprietary blend of red varietals offering a black cherry, spicy, smoky and delicious melange of berry fruit, mint and toasty flavors. A very interesting, flavorful mouthful.

### EASY HOMEMADE STRAWBERRY FREEZER JAM

1 box Sure Jell Light Fruit Pectin  
3/4 cups sugar, divided  
4 cups crushed strawberries (2 quarts fully ripe strawberries)

Mix fruit pectin and 1/4 cup sugar in a small bowl. Add pectin mixture gradually to fruit, stirring vigorously. Let stand 30 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Stir remaining sugar gradually into fruit mixture until sugar is completely dissolved and no longer grainy, about 3 minutes (a few sugar crystals may remain).

Pour into clean plastic containers; cover. Let stand at room temperature 24 hours. Jam is now ready to use. Store in refrigerator or freeze extra containers. Thaw in refrigerator. Store in refrigerator up to 3 weeks or freeze up to 1 year. Makes about 6 (1 cup) containers.

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Press the dough from one package of the rolls into the bottom of a greased 9 by 13-inch pan.

In a separate bowl, mix cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Spread on dough. With a rolling pin, roll out the second package of dough to a rectangle approximately 9 by 11 inches.

Place sliced strawberries on top of cream cheese mixture. Top with rolled dough. Brush with egg white. Sprinkle top with 1 tablespoon sugar.

Bake at 325 degrees for 35 minutes. Serve warm. Makes 24 small or 16 large portions.

1 tablespoon cassis

1/2 cup club soda, or more if necessary

Thinly sliced fresh strawberries, raspberries, blueberries, peaches and plums for garnish

Fresh fruit sorbet and fresh mint leaves for garnish

Combine all ingredients except club soda and garnishes in the bowl of a food processor and pulse until mixture is well pureed.

Transfer mixture into a bowl and chill. Just before serving, stir in enough club soda to make a thick soup.

Ladle fruit soup into shallow soup plates. Garnish with little clusters of fruits, and a small scoop of fruit sorbet, and mint leaves. Serves 6 to 8.

Here are some tips for picking and storing strawberries from the North American Strawberry Growers Association

■ Large or small, every red berry is ripe, luscious and ready-to-eat. Pick all the red ones you can find in your assigned row.

■ Green berries will not ripen after picking.

■ Look under the leaves of each strawberry plant to find the berries; pinch or pull stem from plant. Be sure to leave the stem on each berry.

■ Strawberries are perishable, handle them with care.

■ Protect berries from sunlight, particularly in your car. Don't leave berries in a hot car.

■ Before storing or processing, sort berries; use the ripest ones first.

■ Place in shallow containers to prevent crushing.

■ Store immediately in the refrigerator.

■ Do not rinse or remove stems until ready to serve or process.

## Jams preserve taste of fresh berries

### BASIC STRAWBERRY JAM

8 cups strawberries  
6 cups sugar  
2 tablespoons lemon juice (optional)

Wash, drain and hull strawberries. Crush strawberries. If they are

very ripe and sweet, add lemon juice.

Place in a large non reactive (not aluminum) saucepan. Add sugar and cook slowly, stirring constantly until sugar dissolves.

Bring quickly to a boil and boil rapidly until the fruited syrup coats the back of a spoon and "slides off." Ladle into sterilized hot and dry jars to within 1/4 inch of top. Wipe

jar rim; adjust lids. Process in a boiling water bath for 5 minutes. Remove from canner and complete seals unless closures are of the self-sealing type. Makes 6 half pints.

### FASTER STRAWBERRY-RHUBARB JAM

1 quart strawberries  
3 cups diced rhubarb (about

1 1/2 pounds)  
6 cups sugar

Mash strawberries. Combine with rhubarb in a large non reactive saucepan. Add 4 cups sugar; bring to a rolling boil and boil for 4 minutes, stirring constantly. Add remaining 2 cups of sugar and boil for 4 more minutes, stirring constantly.

Ladle into sterilized jars and process in a boiling water bath for 5 minutes. Complete seal.

## Sign up for home canning classes

"If you've always wanted to learn how to home can foods, but have been afraid of doing it wrong, help is here," said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Michigan State University Extension — Oakland County.

"Canning can be fun and easy and safe — yet some people are really afraid of home canning because they do not understand how to do it safely or who they can call on for safe information," adds Treitman who directs the Food and Nutrition Hotline.

One way to rid your fear of home canning is to take a class by a trained home economist. Food

preservation classes are offered by Michigan State University Extension Oakland County.

If you enjoy a hands-on experience, a mini-food preservation canning and freezing class will take place on Saturday, July 30 at the North Office Building, 1200 N. Telegraph, Pontiac. The \$7.50 charge covers all handouts and samples. Bring an apron and learn the latest USDA methods.

If you prefer to work at home at your own pace — a seven week home food preservation correspondence class is available for \$15 to cover postage and printed materials.

frost-free growing season makes even California winemakers swoon. There's no worry about hail, the plague of Burgundy and Bordeaux; no rain at harvest, a nearly universal wine region threat, and there are very few vine diseases. Days are warm, but nights are cool — just what the vine doctor ordered. All these conditions combined have catapulted South Africa to the eighth largest wine-producing region in the world.

Only a few years ago, one might have said that the Cape's finest

wines were sherries and port-like fortified wines. This is no longer the case. There are balanced, not overtly woody chardonnays, pleasant rieslings, and crisp sauvignon blancs among the white wines. Reds produced from merlot, cabernet sauvignon, cabernet franc and shiraz are mellow and full of flavor. Aern there's pinotage!

Pinotage is a regionally developed cross between pinot noir and cinsault. Until 1925, all wine grapes grown in South Africa were imports. Pinot noir is a case in

point. This noble varietal from France's Burgundy region, and the backbone of all the great champagnes, was disease prone in the Cape region. Cinsault, from France's Rhone Valley, however, took well to the area's fertile soils, but the wine was thin and uninteresting.

By crossing the two varietals, it was hoped that the lusty growth of cinsault would combine with pinot noir's complex, rich and velvety flavors to produce both a vine and wine of promise. These

expectations have been more than fulfilled. The flavors of pinotage enhance those of grilled red meats, games, pasta with red sauce and a variety of tangy cheeses.

# Tasty barbecue dishes make 'Super Suppers'

These recipes refer to the Super Supper story that appeared on the June 13 Taste front.

## PEDRO'S CHICKEN FAJITAS

- 4 whole chicken breasts
- 1 cup red wine
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 1/4 cup light soy sauce

Bone chicken and save bones for broth (to be used in Peter's yellow rice dish). Marinate chicken overnight in wine, lemon juice and soy sauce. Grill outdoors over low heat (lowest heat setting on gas grill).

Turn chicken every five minutes, dipping it back into the marinade with every turn. Grill slowly until done, 25 to 35 minutes.

Slice thinly and serve on soft

flour tortillas with shredded lettuce, shredded low-fat cheddar cheese, diced tomatoes, diced black olives, your favorite picante sauce, and a dollop of low-fat sour cream. Serves 4.

To make chicken broth: place breast bones in 4 cups of water with 1 teaspoon salt. Bring water to boil, lower heat and cook one hour. Remove bones from broth and remove any meat clinging to bones. Remove chicken morsels for rice.

## YELLOW RICE

- 3 cups chicken broth, homemade or canned
- 1 1/2 cups Uncle Ben's (Converted) yellow rice
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1/2 large Vidalia onion

1 teaspoon ground black pepper  
2 cloves garlic, minced  
2 bay leaves  
1/4 teaspoon ground cloves  
2 flank steaks, about 1 1/2 pounds each, tenderized

In a small bowl, combine all marinade ingredients except steak.

Place each steak in a plastic bag. Divide marinade equally, pouring on steaks. Rotate bags to coat steak with marinade. Seal and marinate for 2 to 3 hours.

## CHEESE STUFFING

- 3 tablespoons butter
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion

2 tablespoons margarine, non-fat or regular

Combine all ingredients in saucepan and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to a simmer, cover and cook for 20 minutes.

Yellow rice, also called converted rice, is available at Hirt's in the Eastern Market area of Detroit.

## GRILLED AND ROASTED LEG OF LAMB

- 1 whole leg of lamb, butterflied
- 3 cups red wine
- 1/2 cup light soy sauce
- 1/4 cup finely chopped ginger
- 1 large Vidalia onion, sliced

Marinade leg of lamb overnight in wine, soy sauce, ginger, and onion. Reserve marinade, including onions.

Place metal pan of water (disposable aluminum pie pan works great) underneath the warming rack on your gas grill. Place lamb and onions on warming rack and cook with grill cover on for 2 hours at lowest heat. Check occasionally to make sure there is always water in the pan. Let the drippings collect in this pan for later use.

Remove lamb from grill and cut meat into 1/4-inch slices. Place meat and reserved marinade in a large roasting pan. Add drippings from grill. Cover and bake in oven for 30 minutes at 325 degrees. Serve on hard rolls with generous amounts of the marinated-roasted onions.

## FLORENCE STREET BARBECUED CHICKEN

- 1 whole chicken, cut into parts

and skinned (including the wings)

3 cups saturated salt water (Add 1/2 cup salt or more to 3 cups of water, stirring continuously with your hand until salt no longer dissolves, but remains granular. Water will turn milky. Process takes about 1 minute)

3 cups white vinegar

2 tablespoons juice

Barbecue Sauce of your choice

Add vinegar and lemon juice to salt water and soak chicken in this mixture for one hour. Set your gas grill to lowest setting.

Cook chicken, dipping parts into salt and vinegar solution every five minutes while turning. Grilling will take up to one hour.

At last turning, liberally cover the chicken with barbecue sauce and continue cooking until sauce is warm. Do not allow sauce to burn.

Peter makes his own barbecue sauce. He warms Delmonte Catsup in a sauceman on low heat and adds about 1/2 cup of margarine until well blended.

## MICROWAVE BAKED WHITE BEANS

- 30-40 ounces of pre-cooked white beans (2 small cans or 1 large jar)

2 large carrots, diced

1 Vidalia onion, diced

2 celery stalks, diced

1/2 red bell pepper, diced

1/4 cup light soy sauce

3 tablespoons picante sauce

1 tablespoon lemon juice

In a large casserole dish, stir carrots, onion, celery, pepper, soy sauce, picante sauce, and lemon juice. Cover and cook in microwave oven on high for 10 minutes. Add beans, mix well and microwave at 1/2 power for 30 minutes. Serve hot or cold.

## Spicy flank steak is stuffed with cheese

## CHEESE-STUFFED GRILLED MONTEREY FLANK STEAK

For the marinade:

6 tablespoons red-wine vinegar

2 tablespoons olive oil

2 teaspoons oregano leaves, crushed

1/2 teaspoons salt

1 teaspoon ground black pepper  
2 cloves garlic, minced  
2 bay leaves  
1/4 teaspoon ground cloves  
2 flank steaks, about 1 1/2 pounds each, tenderized

In a small bowl, combine all marinade ingredients except steak.

Place each steak in a plastic bag. Divide marinade equally, pouring on steaks. Rotate bags to coat steak with marinade. Seal and marinate for 2 to 3 hours.

## CHEESE STUFFING

String for tying meat

In a large skillet, melt butter. Sauté onion, zucchini and garlic for 4 minutes. Add cilantro, chili powder, cumin, salt and pepper. Stir in bread crumbs and sauté until golden. Cool.

To assemble: Remove flank steak from marinade. Divide stuffing equally between steaks. Distribute stuffing on surface of meat. Place cheese slices in a row along upper third of longest side of steak. Starting with longest side, tightly roll up steak. Use string to secure roll, tying at 1-inch intervals.

Grill over medium-hot coals for 15 minutes total, turning three times. Allow to stand for 5 minutes. Remove string, slice and serve.

# Grillers flip over lean pork burgers

It's a match made in heaven — barbecue and burger. But any relationship can use a little spice now and then, and the freshest spin on the burger scene is the pork burger.

Pork offers a leaner, tasteful alternative to the ordinary hamburger. The best choice for pork burgers is pork that is about 80 percent lean. By blending well with a wide variety of herbs and condiments, it provides the foundation for a dramatic change of pace from the everyday grind of the humdrum hamburger.

It's easiest to get ground pork from the butcher. "Ask for ground pork from the shoulder butt or picnic," said Anne Roberts, director of marketing and education for Michigan Pork Producers Association. "This will be about 80 percent lean. If you want an exceedingly lean burger, ask for pork ground from the loin."

It's also possible to grind pork at home using a food processor or meat grinder. If using a food processor, cut boneless pork into pork cubes and grind cubes using the processor blade. A few

off-on turns do the trick.

Ground pork should be treated with the same care as other ground meats: purchase only as much as you plan to use during the next day or two. Wrap and freeze meat you won't use within a couple of days.

When you're ready to cook, handle the meat as little as possible to keep it tender. "Overmixing burgers — made of any type of meat — tends to toughen them," said Roberts.

The Other Burger should be cooked to a "medium" degree of doneness. Don't overcook. Make sure the pork burger comes off the grill while still juicy. An internal temperature of 160 degrees is recommended.

It should take about 10 minutes over hot coals to cook a  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch thick pork burger, turning once.

One grilling tip — don't press your spatula down on the burger while it's on the grill. You'll lose juices and could start unwanted flames," said Roberts.

## THE BASIC OTHER BURGER

1 pound unseasoned ground pork

1 teaspoon ground black pepper  
1/4 teaspoon salt

Gently mix together ground pork and seasonings, shape into 4 burgers about  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch in thickness. Place over moderately hot coals in a kettle-style grill, lower hood and grill for 5 minutes; turn and finish grilling 4-5 minutes. Serve immediately, on sandwich

buns if desired.

**Eastern Burger (for a taste of the Orient)**

To Basic Other Burger mix, add 2 teaspoons soy sauce, 2 tablespoons dry sherry and 1 tablespoon grated ginger root.

**Veggie Burger (for a zesty, garden blend)**

To Basic Other Burger mix, add 3 drops hot pepper sauce, 1 grated carrot, and 3 tablespoons chopped parsley.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH CODE BY AMENDING CHAPTER 25 TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADOPTION, BY REFERENCE OF THE BOCA NATIONAL MECHANICAL CODE, 8TH EDITION, 1993, AS PUBLISHED BY THE BUILDING OFFICIALS AND CODE ADMINISTRATORS INTERNATIONAL, INC., AS THE MECHANICAL CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP; TO PROVIDE FOR STANDARDS GOVERNING THE DESIGN, INSTALLATION AND CONSTRUCTION OF MECHANICAL SYSTEMS; PROVIDING REASONABLE SAFEGUARDS TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY AGAINST THE HAZARDS OF INADEQUATE, DEFECTIVE OR UNSAFETY MECHANICAL SYSTEMS AND INSTALLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR PRINTED COPIES OF THE BOCA NATIONAL MECHANICAL CODE TO BE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION BY THE PUBLIC AT THE BUILDING DEPARTMENT DURING REGULAR BUSINESS HOURS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

**SECTION 1.**  
This Section amends Chapter 25 of the Charter Township of Plymouth Ordinances, as follows:

25.010 This Section adopts, by reference, the BOCA National Mechanical Code.

# Link-up with sausage

AP — Though today we tend to think of sausage as simply another meat choice, the first sausages had resourceful beginnings. They were created by Old World "wurstmachers" to make the most of every morsel of meat on a carcass.

The kind of meat used and the unique seasoning blend are what give each sausage its identity. During sausage making, sausage may be cooked, cured, smoked and dried. Or, it can be left uncooked and sold fresh. It helps to know what processing method was used for a sausage so you'll know what, if any, further cooking is needed.

■ Fresh (Uncooked): This sausage is made from fresh meat, period. Fresh bratwurst is a good example. Since fresh sausage is neither cooked nor cured, cook it thoroughly before eating.

■ Uncoked and Smoked: Made with fresh or cured meat, this sausage is smoked but not cooked. Smoked pork sausage is often sold uncooked. As the descriptive name implies, this type of sausage must be thoroughly cooked before serving.

■ Cooked: Here's a sausage made from fresh meat that is cured during processing and fully cooked. Although these sausages are ready to eat, some are heated before serving. Braunschweiger is made from cooked sausage.

■ Cooked and Smoked: These sausages are made from fresh meat that is cured, smoked and fully cooked. The all-American hot dog fits into this category. Serve these ready-to-eat sausages cold or hot.

■ Dry and Semi-dry: Ready for eating, dry and semidry sausages are made from fresh meat that is cured and dried during processing, and sometimes smoked. Most dry sausages are salamis (a category of highly seasoned sausages having a characteristic fermented flavor).

Most semidry sausages are of the summer sausage type (mildly seasoned sausage with good storage qualities). These sausages are ideal for sandwiches and eating cold.

### Choosing Sausage

Never before have there been so many different kinds of sausage available in grocery stores. You'll find fresh sausage available in the bulk, link or patty shape. Other sausages come in links, rings, chunks or slices. Brown-and-serve sausage comes in link or patty form. When selecting unwrapped sausage from the deli, make sure there are no off-odors and that the casing is dry and free of mold.

If you buy sausage in vacuum-sealed packages, check for meat that is fresh and moist. Look for a freshness date on the package and buy the sausage with the latest date.

### Storing Sausage

Be sure to check labels for storing directions. Generally, you should store sausage in airtight wrap in the refrigerator. Although some dry sausages don't need refrigeration, they should be kept in a cool place. Once a dry sausage is cut, refrigerate it. Freezing sausage may cause flavor changes. However, if necessary, you can freeze sausage for a short period of time.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH CODE BY AMENDING CHAPTER 20, BUILDING CODE, PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE BOCA NATIONAL BUILDING CODE, TWELFTH EDITION, 1993, AS PUBLISHED BY THE BUILDING OFFICIALS AND CODE ADMINISTRATORS INTERNATIONAL, INC., AS THE BUILDING CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP GOVERNING THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, REPAIR, DEMOLITION, REMOVAL, MOVING, MAINTENANCE AND USE OF ALL BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES AND TO PROVIDE FOR PRINTED COPIES OF THE BOCA NATIONAL BUILDING CODE TO BE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION BY THE PUBLIC AT THE BUILDING DEPARTMENT DURING BUSINESS HOURS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR SAVINGS CLAUSE AND PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

### SECTION 1.

This Section amends Chapter 20 of the Charter Township of Plymouth Code as follows:

20.010 Adoption of Code. The BOCA National Building Code, Twelfth Edition, 1993, is adopted by reference, with the additions, deletions, insertions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 20.020, et seq. of this Ordinance, as the Building Code of the Township.

20.020 Changes in Code. This Section provides for insertions, amendments and additions to the Code, including title, the appointment of the Building Official, the organization of the Building Department; the preparation of rules, the establishment of a fee schedule, including a Building Clean Up Bond, and provides for prosecution, violation and penalties, and punishment for unlawful continuance, and provides for existing structures.

Any person, corporation, partnership or any other legal entity who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance or any of the regulations adopted in pursuance thereof, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof may be fined not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or imprisoned not more than Ninety (90) days, or both, in the discretion of the court.

### SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.

This Section provides that if any portion of this Ordinance is found unconstitutional or void, all other portions of the Ordinance are not affected by such actions.

### SECTION 4. REPEAL.

This Section provides that all Ordinance or parts of Ordinance in conflict here-with are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

### SECTION 5. SAVINGS CLAUSE.

The repeal provided for herein shall not abrogate or affect any offense or act committed or done or any penalty or forfeiture incurred, or any pending litigation or prosecution of any right established or occurring prior to the effective date of this Ord

# Book explores 'The Cooking of the Eastern Mediterranean'

On an icy morning a few years ago, in an ancient Caucasus mountain village perched nearly two miles high above the Caspian Sea, Paula Wolfert was awakened at dawn by seven elderly women in black dresses. They greeted her with kisses, she recalls in her new book, "The Cooking of The Eastern Mediterranean," (HarperCollins Publishers; June 1, 1994; \$30/hardcover). "I can still feel the parchment-like texture of their deeply weathered cheeks," she writes, "They had come to teach us to make corn bread."

For Wolfert, unforgettable moments like this inspire her search for the authentic foods of the world's great cuisines, and her new book reounds with vivid stories of her travels, the lore of the dishes and ingredients she discovers, and the lives of the real cooks who taught her. From many points throughout a gastronomic arc of the Near East — a pent-

dental sojourns in Morocco and France, learning all the while about the expatriate life, literature, the arts — and food.

Today — five books, hundreds of articles, thousands of recipes, and untold miles later — Wolfert has been hailed by her fellow culinarians as "the Mistress of the Mediterranean."

"The Cooking of the Eastern Mediterranean" takes readers to northern Greece and the Balkans, Syria, Turkey and the Republic of Georgia. From breads, soups and small uncooked salads to extensive collections of fish, poultry and meat recipes, Wolfert brings exotic tastes and techniques into the realm of the American home cook. Four useful appendices detail the Eastern Mediterranean pantry, including the preparation of essentials like red pepper

pastes, spice mixtures, and yogurt dishes, and provides sources for special ingredients.

Here's a recipe to try.

### SKEWERED SWORDFISH

3 tablespoons strained fresh lemon juice  
2 cloves garlic, peeled and sliced  
2 tablespoons olive oil  
½ teaspoon sea salt  
Freshly ground black pepper to taste  
2 imported bay leaves, halved, or 2 pinches crumbled dried Mediterranean oregano  
¼ pound swordfish, cut into 1 ¼ -inch cubes  
Lemon wedges for garnish

In a shallow glass or porcelain dish, mix the lemon juice, garlic, oil, sea salt, pepper and bay leaves or oregano. Add the swordfish cubes and let soak for at least 1 hour.

Skewer the swordfish, alternating

with bay leaves if you are using them. Grill over hot coals, 4 inches from the flame, about 2 to 3 minutes. The cubes should be fully cooked but still moist. Serve at once with lemon wedges. Serves 2.

## Bulk up on fiber to reduce risk of health problems

Dietary fiber once called "roughage" or "bulk" improves digestion and relieves constipation. New links between fiber and health are constantly being researched. At one time fiber

was not considered as important as vitamins and minerals, but scientists are finding out differently. There is mounting evidence that increasing fiber may lower the risk of many health problems.

Why are we talking about fiber again? Primarily because we tend to be a pre-packaged, processed, no cooking, fast food society and forget the benefits of fiber. Breakfast cereal is an easy way to have fiber daily however statistics show that breakfast doesn't "happen" for a large portion of society. It's hard to eat a bowl of oatmeal in the car going to work.

Soluble and insoluble fibers are found in plants cell walls and are mainly pectins and gums. They dissolve during digestion to form a gummy, gel like material. Good sources of soluble fiber are apples, barley, cabbage, carrots, cauli-

flower, citrus fruit, corn bran, cranberries, dry beans and peas, green beans, kale, oat bran, peas, plums, potatoes, rice bran, squash and strawberries.

Water soluble fibers found in oats and dried beans absorb water and retain sugar and starch which slows their absorption in the body thus aiding a diabetic by helping regulate the body's use of sugar. When foods from plants make up a major part of the diet, people appear to be at less risk of developing heart disease, cancer of the lung, esophagus, colon or stomach. The exact reason has not been identified.

These add bulk to the diet, absorbing water and decreasing the time it takes food to move through the digestive system. This swift passage helps prevent constipation and is useful in the treatment of diverticulitis, spastic

colon and irritable bowel syndrome. Studies also indicate that diets rich in insoluble fiber may lower the risk of some types of cancer.

The trick is to include both types of fiber to help provide different health benefits. Weight control is a good example of the team work of both fibers. High fiber foods take longer to chew and if the eating is slower you will be

less likely to overeat. Slowing down the eating process gives the brain enough time to realize that the body has eaten. Fiber foods also create a feeling of fullness so you have a sense of appetite satisfaction.





## All-American left out of pro draft

Jerry Koester believes he's stuck in baseball purgatory.

The Westland John Glenn High product and center fielder the past two years with Siena Heights College was named first-team All-America in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

But what should have been welcomed news was spoiled by the fact that Koester, despite a .396 batting average during his two years with the Saints, did not receive a call from any of Major League's 28 teams during the recent three-day amateur draft.

Koester, who turned 23 on Wednesday, now finds himself with the Erie (Pa.) Sailors in the Frontier League, an eight-team Class A independent circuit filled with minor league cast-offs and Jerry Koester-types, many who hope that some Major League scout will give them a second look.

"They said I'd definitely go, and they get your hopes up. I don't think it's right. They do it to a lot of people. It's happened to other guys, too. It's eating me up."

Koester said a scout from the As-

tronics told him he'd go in the 18th round.

"He said they needed a center field-

er for their team in the Midwestern League," Jerry said.

"The Giants, Dodgers and Yankees also made calls and expressed interest.

"Somebody told me the Giants would take me in the sixth round," Koester said. "It's crazy, some of the things you hear."

Speed and arm strength certainly rank high on Koester's resume.

This year he scored a school record

74 runs and broke the Saints' mark

for stolen bases (51 in 62 attempts). As a junior he batted .413 and led the NAIA in hits with 95.

"I threw out 21 guys," he said. "I also hit more for power. I had 15 doubles, which is a lot more than I had last year. I still use all the fields and I can bunt."

The scouts, however, may look at Koester as too old (23) and too small (5 feet, 10 inches, 170 pounds). Plus, Siena Heights is a small college program.

"Last summer when I played in the Great Lakes Wooden Bat League I was in the top 10 in the league hitting," he said. "The scouts have seen me face good pitching. When we played Michigan State, I stole second and third right in a row and I hit the ball sharply."

"And if I get on a good weight pro-

gram, I think I'll still keep growing."

Koester led Siena Heights (35-34 overall) to the NAIA World Series in Des Moines, Iowa, but he pulled a groin muscle against Dallas Baptist in an 11-0 tournament-opening defeat.

He was limited to one at-bat, as a

pinch-hitter, in a 5-3 loss to Point

Loma Nazarene (Calif.), as Siena

Heights was eliminated in two

straight.

"It's a pulled, stretched muscle, it's just a little sore now," Koester said. "Right now I'm working with the trainer and going to give it about seven days off. I feel just as good right now, but I don't want to take any chances. I want to be completely healthy."

Once he is healed, Koester plans to sign a pro contract with the Sailors.

He had second thoughts, however, driving home after making the cut after a Frontier League tryout held in Chillicothe, Ohio.

"My parents let me make my own decision," said Koester, who also played two years at Henry Ford Community College. "They knew what I had to do."

Bernstein adds, "Johnny Tapia is one of the most interesting stories around in sports. He was the NABF champion and about four years ago he got heavily into drug problems. For three years he was off of boxing. I mean, he did nothing but abuse his body. Finally, he somehow got back in the tracks and clean and came back fighting. He's had three fights back and he looks better than he did before he left."

"Actually, he's so good it's scary," Bernstein concludes. "For a guy to have that much time off, and be this good ... To my way of thinking, he'll have a title shot pretty soon."
